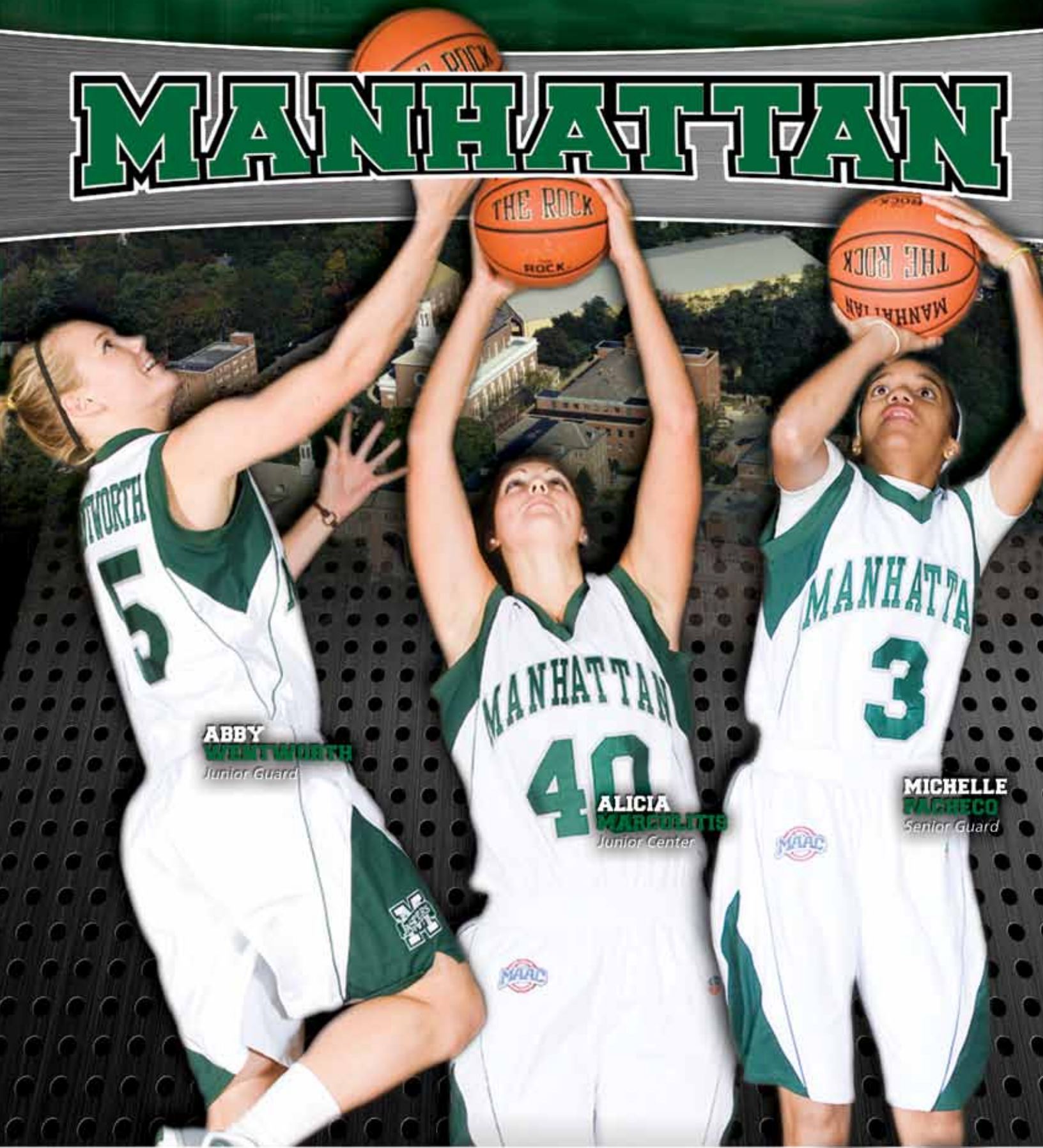

DIRECTIONS TO DRADDY GYMNASIUM

Home of Jasper Basketball

FROM SOUTH:

Triborough Bridge — Follow signs to Major Deegan Expressway (I-87) North, and proceed to the Van Cortlandt Park South Exit. Bear right and go back over the Expressway toward Broadway. Make a right at Broadway. At second traffic light, turn left onto Manhattan College Parkway. Make another left and follow campus road to Draddy Gymnasium.

Henry Hudson Parkway — Take Exit 20, W. 239th St. This puts you on Henry Hudson Parkway Service Road. At stop sign, bear left through intersection (past monument). Bear right at fork (before overpass) onto Manhattan College Parkway. Go left to Draddy Gymnasium parking lot.

FROM NORTH:

Saw Mill River Parkway to Henry Hudson Parkway. Take Exit 21, W. 246th St., straight on the Henry Hudson Parkway Service Road. At 239th St. (second traffic light), turn left, then again (around monument). Bear right at fork (before overpass) onto Manhattan College Parkway. Go left to Draddy Gymnasium parking lot.

New York State Thruway South (I-87) connects with the Major Deegan to Van Cortlandt Park South Exit. Turn right at top of ramp then right onto Broadway. At second traffic light, turn left onto Manhattan College Parkway. Make another left and follow campus road to Draddy Gymnasium.

FROM EAST:

Bronx Whitestone or Throgs Neck Bridge to Cross Bronx Expressway South (I-95). Take Major Deegan Expressway North (I-87) to Van Cortlandt Park South Exit. Bear right, going back over the Expressway, and make a right onto Broadway. At second traffic light, turn left onto Manhattan College Parkway. Make another left and follow campus road to Draddy Gymnasium.

FROM WEST:

George Washington Bridge—Follow signs to Henry Hudson Parkway northbound (for automobiles only; otherwise take Major Deegan Expressway northbound). Take Exit 20, W. 239th St. This puts you on Henry Hudson Parkway Service Road. At stop sign bear left through intersection (past monument). Bear right at fork (before overpass) onto Manhattan College Parkway. Make another left and follow road to Draddy Gymnasium.

*Note: Buses and trucks must follow directions using Major Deegan Expressway. Commercial vehicles are not allowed on Henry Hudson Parkway.

The Manhattan College women's basketball media guide is intended to enhance your coverage during the 2009-2010 season. This guide will answer most questions concerning the Jaspers basketball program. WORKING CREDENTIALS

Requests for working credentials should be made no later than two days prior to the game. The director of sports information reserves the right to deny requests made past that time. Passes may be mailed if the request is received early enough.

Press row is located on the sideline opposite the team benches. Working media are asked not to sit at the scorer's table unless designated to do so by the director of sports information.

Photographers are asked to remain along the baseline and must display their credentials. Photographers not displaying credentials will be asked to leave the court area.

Preference will be given to working press and photographers covering the game. Media representatives are asked to display their credentials at all times.

Media covering the visiting team should pass credential requests along to the visiting institution's director of sports information who will then forward all credential requests to the Manhattan College Sports Information Office.

GAME SERVICES

Game notes, statistics and a game program will be provided to the working media prior to each contest. Box scores and a detailed play-by-play will be available at halftime and 15 minutes after the game.

TELEPHONES, INTERNET AND FAX MACHINE

The media work room will be equipped with outside telephone lines, wireless internet and electrical outlets. One fax machine will also be available for use after the game. Please forward all post game technical requests to the director of sports information prior to the game.

INTERVIEW POLICY

All discussion with Coach Olenowski and student-athletes should be channeled through the sports information office at 718-862-7709. Olenowski and players will be available weekly on Monday upon request 48 hours in advance. Media interviews will be held in the Manhattan College Sports Information Office Room 508 in Draddy Gymnasium. Players and coaches will also be available upon request before and after scheduled practice times. Interviews will not be given the day of the game until after the game. Interviews with student-athletes will not be scheduled during study hall or class time.

SEASON PREVIEW

2009-10 SEASON OUTLOOK

A new era begins for the Manhattan College women's basketball team in 2009-10, as **John Olenowski** takes over as head coach. The owner of a 330-39 record in 14 seasons at Morris Catholic High School in Denville, N.J., Olenowski had a 70-28 record during three seasons as head coach at Pace University in the mid-'80s. He inherits a program that finished 10-20 overall and 7-11 in Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference (MAAC) play last season.

While the Lady Jaspers lost only three players from that squad, this Manhattan team is still relatively green, as 10 of the 13 players on the roster are either freshmen or sophomores. However, all nine returning players saw valuable minutes last season, and Manhattan returns four starters from the 2008-09 team.

"Most would call our youth a weakness," Olenowski said, "but our talent and enthusiasm will make up for our inexperience. The returning veterans have stepped up tremendously, and have been great at teaching the younger players the system, which everyone is really learning together."

BACKCOURT

Three returning starters—senior **Michelle Pacheco**, junior **Abby Wentworth** and sophomore **Alyssa Herrington**—anchor Manhattan's backcourt. Pacheco, one of the team captains, had her best season in 2008-09. She played in all 30 games, making 20 starts at point guard, and

led the Lady Jaspers with 105 assists. Pacheco also finished third on the team in scoring last season, averaging 8.6 points per game. An excellent floor leader, Olenowski expects her to be a key ingredient on both the offensive and defensive ends. Wentworth, Manhattan's other captain, is the most versatile player on the team. She can play the 1, 2 or 3 and is a great defender. Also a very good shooter, Wentworth showed flashes of that offensive ability last season, including a 25-point effort in a win at Niagara. Herrington is coming off a highly successful freshman campaign in which she earned a place on the MAAC All-Rookie Team. A deadly three-point shooter, she led the MAAC with 73 treys last season, one shy of the school record. Herrington averaged 9.8 points per game in 2008-09 and is Manhattan's top returning scorer.

Sophomores **Laura Rivera**, **Schyanne Halfkenny** and **Kerri White**, as well as freshman **Ondya Morgan** also figure to be in the mix for playing time. Rivera improved greatly as the season wore on last year, and she started the final nine games at point guard. She improved her outside shooting during the offseason, which should add a nice complement to her already tough defense. Halfkenny saw limited action as a freshman, but figures to be a key contributor in Olenowski's system. An instant scorer and great rebounder, she is also becoming a very tough defender. Like Rivera, White's playing time increased as the season went on in



2008-09. She is an outstanding three-point shooter who possesses great court vision and leadership ability. Morgan, a point guard from Rahway, N.J., has worked hard to learn the system and is a good ball handler.

"The guards are definitely one of this program's strong points, and are the focus of our attack right now," Olenowski said. "I believe in pushing the ball up the floor as often and quickly as possible and intend to get everybody involved. We have enough scorers that there are options on the attack, and we won't find ourselves in the situation where we have to rely on one person."

FRONTCOURT

The Lady Jaspers lost Second Team All-MAAC center Kelly Regan, the team's leading scorer and rebounder last season, to graduation, but have a trio of talented returning post players ready to step in and fill that void. Sophomore **Lindsey Loutsenhizer** was a MAAC All-Rookie selection last season and is Manhattan's top returning rebounder (6.4 rpg). She also finished fifth on the team in scoring (7.7 ppg) and has unlimited range. Loutsenhizer has developed quick, effective post



moves that should make her a scoring threat from both the inside and the outside. Sophomore **Nadia Peters** is without a doubt one of the squad's most improved players. Always a great defender and rebounder, she has become very comfortable scoring inside and is a tremendous athlete. Junior **Alicia Marculitis**, the only true center on the roster, worked extremely hard to improve her game this summer, and Olenowski is counting on her to be a big piece of the puzzle in the middle. Marculitis has developed an inside power game to go with her great outside shooting.

Freshmen **Toni-Ann Lawrence**, **Karita Brown** and **Maggie Blair** round out the Manhattan frontcourt. Lawrence, who attended Elmont High School on Long Island, runs the floor well and is the Lady Jaspers' best transition player. She is a tough rebounder and can score both inside and outside. A native of Sterling, Va., Brown is a strong inside player with good power moves who has impressed the coaching staff with her rebounding ability. Blair was named New York State Class B MVP after leading Briarcliff High School to the 2008 New York State Class B championship. A smart, fundamentally



sound player, she possesses a good outside shot and has learned to become an effective inside player.

"As a unit, this group of frontcourt players improves by leaps and bounds on a daily basis," Olenowski said. "This is a group of tough, talented individuals who can guard and score both inside and out. Our system offers a lot of different dimensions, which will give us plenty of options to emphasize our strengths at both ends of the floor."

SCHEDULE

The Lady Jaspers kick off the season on Nov. 13 with a home game against St. Francis (NY). Two days later, Manhattan hits the road for the first time to take on a Virginia squad that reached the second round of the 2009 NCAA Tournament. Virginia is one of three NCAA Tournament teams that Manhattan will face during non-conference play. The Lady Jaspers also visit Northeast Conference champion Sacred Heart, a team they beat last season, on Nov. 28, and America East champion Vermont on Dec. 5. Manhattan

concludes non-conference play at Draddy Gymnasium on Dec. 22 with its annual showdown against local rival Fordham.

"We have a competitive, well-rounded non-conference schedule," Olenowski said. "We're preparing to be as successful as we can with an immediate goal to get to the upper echelon of the MAAC. Realistically, with the exception of a few powerhouse teams, I think this conference is wide open."

For the first time since 1998-99, Manhattan doesn't play a single MAAC game before the New Year. The Lady Jaspers' final 18 regular season games are MAAC contests, starting with a Jan. 3 matchup against Rider. Manhattan's matchup at Loyola on Jan. 15 will be nationally televised by ESPNU, and the Lady Jaspers will host their annual "Pink Zone" game against Niagara on Feb. 13. Manhattan plays its final three regular season games at home, including a matchup with four-time defending MAAC champion Marist in the regular season finale on Feb. 28. The MAAC Tournament returns to the Times Union Center in Albany, N.Y., from March 4-7.

HEAD COACH • SAINT LEO '78 • FIRST SEASON • 4TH SEASON OVERALL (70-28)



John Olenowski was named the seventh head coach in program history on April 15, 2009. A 19-year coaching veteran, he has enjoyed tremendous success as a head coach at both the collegiate and high school levels.

A 1978 graduate of Saint Leo College, Olenowski began his coaching career at Morris Catholic High School in Denville, N.J., in 1979. Over 14 seasons (1979-82, 1995-2006), he guided the Crusaders to a 330-39 (.894) record and three New Jersey State Interscholastic Athletic Association (NJSIAA) State Championships. During Olenowski's tenure, Morris Catholic also won 10 Colonial Hills Conference Championships, six Morris County Championships and seven NJSIAA Sectional Championships. Morris Catholic also made a pair of appearances in the New Jersey Tournament of Champions, reaching the semifinals in 2003.

He also served as Morris Catholic's athletic director from 2003-06 and was in charge of Major Gift Giving. Olenowski was inducted into the Morris

Catholic High School Hall of Fame in 1987 and the NJSIAA Hall of Fame in 2005. In 2007, he was presented with the NJSIAA Outstanding Coaching Achievement Award.

In 1982, Olenowski left Morris Catholic to take over the women's basketball program at Pace University. Over three seasons at the helm, Olenowski led the Setters to a 70-28 (.714) overall record, and the team increased its win total each season.

After guiding Pace to a school record 17 wins during his first season, Olenowski's 1983-84 squad went 25-5 (.833) and won the Empire State Conference regular season and tournament titles. He further built upon that success, leading Pace to the best season in program history in 1984-85. That season, the Setters went 28-3 (.903), won the Empire State Conference regular season and tournament championships for the second straight season, and claimed the NCAA Division II East Regional title. Pace was ranked as high as No. 3 in the nation during the 1984-85 campaign.

While at Pace, Olenowski won a pair of Empire State Conference Coach of the Year honors (1983-84, 1984-85). He mentored eight 1,000-point scorers, including All-Americans Tracey Jackson and Jennifer DiMaggio, Pace's all-time leading scorer (2,125) and rebounder (1,254). In addition, his teams boasted a 100 percent graduation rate.

Olenowski returned to the collegiate ranks in 2007-08 as an assistant coach at MAAC rival Saint Peter's. The Peahens posted a 19-12 record that season, their first winning campaign in five years. Most recently, Olenowski was an assistant coach at Long Island University during the 2008-09 season.

Olenowski and his wife, Kathleen, have two daughters: Megan, a graduate of Ithaca College, and Caitlin, who attends the Fashion Institute of Technology.

Sonia Burke enters her seventh season as an assistant coach on the Lady Jaspers' staff. She is responsible for NCAA compliance, scouting and tape breakdown of opponents, coordinating the team's managers and practice players, supervising the Lady Jaspers' efforts in the training room and recruiting, along with the on-court coaching of post players, with an emphasis on defense.

She came to Manhattan in 2003-04 after a stint as an assistant coach at St. Francis (PA). While at St. Francis, Burke helped the Red Flash capture the 2002-03

Northeast Conference regular season and conference tournament titles, along with an automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament. Her responsibilities included coordinating junior college recruiting, video scouting, film exchange and video highlights. Burke played at Spring Hill College in Alabama and led the Badgers to a pair of Gulf Coast Conference championships and two consecutive NAIA Tournaments appearances. She graduated with a bachelor's degree in management and a minor in managerial accounting in 2001.

Christine Catalanotto enters her second season as an assistant women's basketball coach at Manhattan College. Catalanotto came to Riverdale after serving as a graduate assistant coach at Wagner College. With the Lady Jaspers, she is responsible for monitoring the team's academics, tape exchange, and community service initiatives, including the annual basketball camp. She also assists with recruiting and scouting.

During her latest coaching stint at Wagner, Catalanotto's duties included coordinating film exchange, monitoring student-athlete academic progress and scouting opponents. She was responsible for the development

Kristen Piscadlo joins the Manhattan College staff this season after two years as an assistant coach at Brown. She is responsible for all equipment and meals, while also serving as the team's travel coordinator and assisting in all other aspects of the program.

Piscadlo is a 2006 of Mulhenberg College and is the Mules' all-time leader with 424 career assists. She also holds Mulhenberg's

single-season assists record and ranks second all-time with 197 career steals.

METRO ATLANTIC ATHLETIC CONFERENCE

With 10 institutions strongly bound by the sound principles of quality and integrity in academics and excellence in athletics, the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference is in its 29th year of competition during the 2009-2010 academic year.

The MAAC was founded in 1980 by six charter members: the U.S. Military Academy, Fairfield University, Fordham University, Iona College, Manhattan College and Saint Peter's College. Competition followed one year later in the fall of 1981 with members competing in the sports of men's cross country and men's soccer. On January 2, 1982, Army traveled to Iona for the first MAAC men's basketball game and the MAAC story had begun.

Today, Conference members include: Canisius College, Fairfield University, Iona College, Loyola University Maryland, Manhattan College, Marist College, Niagara University, Rider University, Saint Peter's College, and Siena College. In addition, associate members the University of Detroit Mercy, Mount St. Mary's University, Saint Joseph's University, Virginia Military Institute and Wagner College compete in men's lacrosse. St. Francis (N.Y.) College, Villanova University and Wagner College are all associate members of the MAAC Women's Water Polo League. Drake University and Sacred Heart University compete in women's rowing, while the University at Albany, Boston University and the University of Hartford begin competition in women's golf this season. The MAAC will support 24 sports and championships during the 2009-2010 academic year.

The MAAC Basketball Championships return to the Times Union Center in Albany, New York, for 2010, with Bridgeport's Arena at Harbor Yard preparing to host the 2011 championship. By having an excellent working relationship with various facilities, the MAAC has been able to attract a number of NCAA Championship events. Most recently, the MAAC, Canisius College and Niagara University successfully hosted the 2004 and 2007 NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Championship First and Second Rounds at the HSBC Arena in Buffalo, New York. All three parties will host that event again in 2010. The MAAC and Rider University co-hosted the 2009 NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Championship Regional at the Sovereign Bank Arena in Trenton, N.J., after recording the third highest attendance figure for the women's championship with the First and Second Rounds in 2006.

MAAC ASSOCIATE SPORTS

In June of 1995, the MAAC continued to develop opportunities for student-athletes as the conference announced the formation of the MAAC Men's and Women's Lacrosse Leagues. The men's league began competition in the spring of 1996, while the women's league commenced in the spring of 1997. The men's league consists of four MAAC schools -- Canisius, Manhattan, Marist, and Siena -- and five associate members -- Detroit Mercy, Mount St. Mary's, Saint Joseph's, Virginia Military Institute and Wagner. The women's league consists of MAAC institutions Canisius, Fairfield, Iona, Manhattan, Marist, Niagara and Siena.

In 2002, the MAAC added the MAAC Women's Water Polo League. The league is made up of three MAAC schools -- Iona, Marist and Siena -- as well as three associate members, St. Francis (N.Y.), Villanova and Wagner.

Sacred Heart started participating in MAAC Women's Rowing in the spring of 2008. Drake University will also join the league for the 2010 MAAC Championship.



In the summer of 2009, the MAAC added three associate members -- Albany, Boston University and Hartford -- to women's golf, with the programs starting competition against MAAC members Fairfield, Niagara and Siena in 2009-2010.

ACADEMICS AND ATHLETICS

The MAAC prides itself on the accomplishments of its student-athletes in the classroom, as well as on the field. Mary Beth Riley, a 1991 graduate of Canisius, was the first recipient of the NCAA Woman of the Year Award. In the fall of 1998, Erin Whalen, a member of the Iona women's rowing team, was awarded one of the nation's 32 Rhodes Scholarships

for academic achievement and civic leadership. Jose Vargas, a Loyola student, was also awarded a Rhodes Scholarship in 1999.

First-class facilities are the rule with MAAC schools, as teams regularly play in top-notch arenas, such as Madison Square Garden, the IZOD Center, HSBC Arena, Times Union Center, the Arena at Harbor Yard and Sovereign Bank Arena. The other MAAC championships boast their share of outstanding locales as well, such as the fabled Van Cortlandt Park in the Bronx, where the cross country championships are contested, and Waterfront Park in Trenton, home of the 2008 and 2009 MAAC Baseball Championship. This year, the MAAC will take its women's soccer championship to Orlando, Florida, where it will conduct its post-season championships at Disney's Wide World of Sports Complex. In 2010, the MAAC Volleyball Championship will be at Walt Disney World. The MAAC Men's and Women's Golf Championships will be held at Celebration Golf Club, located in Celebration, Florida, for the second consecutive year.

In the past several years, a number of the MAAC schools have also enjoyed success in NCAA Championships. MAAC schools have made a total of 74 NIT appearances and 43 NCAA appearances. In addition, Rider represented the league last season in the CollegiateInsider.com Postseason Tournament. The MAAC currently possesses 13 automatic bids to NCAA Championships in men's and women's basketball, baseball, softball, men's and women's soccer, volleyball, men's golf, men's and women's tennis, men's and women's lacrosse, and women's water polo. In 2007, the Marist women's basketball team advanced to the Sweet 16 before falling to the eventual National Champion, the University of Tennessee. Last fall, the Iona men's cross country team earned a second-place finish for the second straight year at the NCAA Division I Cross Country Championships. Canisius softball, Manhattan track, Manhattan and Marist baseball and Loyola soccer and lacrosse have also flourished on the national stage.

The MAAC has also been a leader in the forefront of technology, expanding the notoriety of the league into cyberspace. In 2007, the league reached an agreement with JumpTV, Inc. to sponsor the MAAC web page. Launched in November 1999, www.maacsports.com has been a great success, providing fans with up-to-date contest results, multimedia content and an online merchandise store.

The MAAC President for the 2009-2010 academic year is Rev. Brian F. Linnane, S.J., the President of Loyola University Maryland. The Vice-President is Rev. Jeffrey von Arx, S.J., the President of Fairfield University. Bob Byrnes, Director of Athletics at Manhattan College, will chair the Committee on Athletic Administration, and Elizabeth Donohue, Assistant Athletic Director/Senior Woman Administrator at Marist College will serve as Vice Chair.

MAAC PRESEASON

MARIST VOTED TEAM TO BEAT IN 2009-10 SEASON

EDISON, N.J. – Marist College, which won its fourth consecutive MAAC Championship and advanced to its fifth NCAA Tournament in six years last season, is the league's choice to earn the 2009-10 conference title, according to the MAAC Preseason Coaches' Poll.

The Red Foxes return four of their starting five from last season, highlighted by two-time Player of the Year Rachele Fitz and Third Team All-MAAC selection Erica Allenspach. Head Coach Brian Giorgis has a lot of weapons at his disposal, including returning starters junior guard Élise Caron and junior center Maria Laterza, 2007-08 Sixth Player of the Year Lynzee Johnson, and Brandy Gang, a member of last season's All-Rookie team.

Iona College is expected to present the biggest threat to Marist's perch atop the MAAC standings. The Gaels, led by eighth-year head coach Tony Bozzella, have a wealth of talent, including All-MAAC First Team member Thazina Cook, All-MAAC Third Team choice Anda Ivkovic, and Kristina Ford, the reigning MAAC Rookie of the Year. Also returning for the Gaels is 2007-08 All-MAAC selection Anna McLean, who sat out last season.

Canisius College, led by The Rock MAAC Coach of the Year Terry Zeh, won 24 games last season and made a WNIT appearance for the first time in school history. Zeh will rely on the returning backcourt duo of Brittané Russell and Micayla Drysdale as the Golden Griffins take aim at their second MAAC Championship in the last five years. Sixth Player of the Year Ellie Radke and All-Rookie team member Stephanie MacDonald will also be integral to the Griffs' success.

Rider University heads into the 2009-10 season with loftier expectations than in previous years after a much improved campaign a year ago. Third-year head coach Lynn Milligan led the Broncs to their second highest league win total all-time (7) and their most overall victories (10) since the 1999-00 team. She will count on All-MAAC selections Tammy Meyers and Sarah Homan, and returning starters Amanda Sepulveda and Cintella Spotwood to continue the improvement in Lawrenceville.

Saint Peter's College will be shooting for its league-record eighth MAAC Championship and first since 2002. To do so, the Peahens will need increased production from junior forward Charlene Riddick and senior guards Natasha Morris and Alena Ali.

Fairfield University, Loyola University, Siena College, Manhattan College, and Niagara University, who make up the remaining five picks, are all capable of making a run at the MAAC Championship.

HALL OF FAME

The Manhattan College Athletic Hall of Fame was established in 1979 as a method of honoring the finest Manhattan College athletes of all-time. Among the 197 members in the Hall of Fame, 11 were members of the Lady Jaspers' women's basketball program.

MARIANNE REILLY '82 (Inducted 1992)

Manhattan's first female inducted into the Hall of Fame. First Lady Jaspers basketball player to score 1,000 points, she finished her career with 1,305 points and 860 rebounds. As a junior, led the team to its first-ever winning season (17-12), averaging 15 points and nine rebounds.

LISA TOSCANO '79 (Inducted 1994)

One of the Manhattan College's true pioneers of women's athletics. Four-year captain and co-founder of the women's varsity basketball program. Also helped establish the softball program. Competed in volleyball and was one of the first female members of the crew team. Long-time athletic trainer for Manhattan's men's and women's teams.

SHEILA TIGHE '84 (Inducted 1995)

Scored 2,412 career points, the highest total ever compiled by a Manhattan College basketball player, male or female. Established eight Lady Jaspers records, including most points in one game (45), most field goals in a game (18) and most career steals (310). All-American selection in 1984. Former Northeast Player of the Year. Two-time Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference Player of the Year.

STACEY JACK EDWARDS '87 (Inducted 1997)

Graduated second on the Lady Jaspers' all-time list with 1,665 points and 833 career rebounds. Ranked among the nation's top 10 with a free throw percentage of .850 in 1986. Earned All-Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference honors that season. Earned MAAC All-Academic Team honors three times. Academic All-American as a senior.

SUSAN NANGLE NOE '96 (Inducted 2002)

Two-time captain of women's basketball team. Became third Lady Jasper to score 1,000 points and is currently ranked seventh on the all-time scoring list with 1,198 career points. Named to several All-Conference and All-Academic teams.

BRIDGET ROBESON '88 (Inducted 2002)

Four-year starter on women's basketball team. Led Lady Jaspers to first MAAC Championship and first NCAA Tournament berth in 1987. Fifth Lady Jasper to score 1,000 points. Currently ranked 12th all-time with 1,145 career points.

DONNA SEYBOLD '90 (Inducted 2003)

Helped lead Manhattan to two MAAC Tournament championships and two NCAA Tournament bids, including the school's first in 1987. Seventh on the Manhattan all-time scoring list with 1,214 points. As a senior in 1990, named MAAC Tournament MVP and Metropolitan Player of the Year as a co-captain.

LEIGH ANN WALKER FINLEY '91 (Inducted 2004)

A four-year starter on the women's basketball team. Helped lead the Lady Jaspers to the MAAC Championship in 1990 and graduated as the school's all-time leading rebounder and as the seventh women's basketball player to eclipse the 1,000-point barrier. A tenacious rebounder who led the team in that category all four years. Was a Second Team All-MAAC selection her senior season. First Lady Jasper to receive MAAC All-Rookie honors.

CARI-LYNN PIOTROWSKI '92 (Inducted 2005)

Tallied 1,187 points and pulled down 688 rebounds, numbers that rank her ninth and eighth in those categories, respectively, on the all-time Manhattan College list. A two-time preseason All-MAAC selection. Was named to the MAAC All-Tournament Team in both 1990 and 1991, helping lead the Lady Jaspers to the MAAC Tournament title and NCAA Tournament berth in 1990. A team co-captain her senior season. Her tenacity on both ends of the court made her an invaluable teammate.

KATHY SOLANO, Coach (Inducted 2006)

The first coach of the women's basketball team to be inducted into Manhattan's Hall of Fame. In her nine seasons at the helm of the Lady Jaspers (1983-84 to 1991-92), she compiled a 138-121 record. She finished her time at Manhattan as the program's all-time leader in wins, and still remains so. She led the Lady Jaspers to two MAAC Championships in 1987 and 1990.

GINA SOMMA '96 (Inducted 2006)

Finished her four-year career (1992-96) with 1,838 points, which puts her third on Manhattan's all-time career scoring list. She is the single-season record holder for points scored, points per game, steals, free throws made, and free throws attempted. She is fifth on the all-time list in rebounds, second in steals, and second in points per game with 16.7.

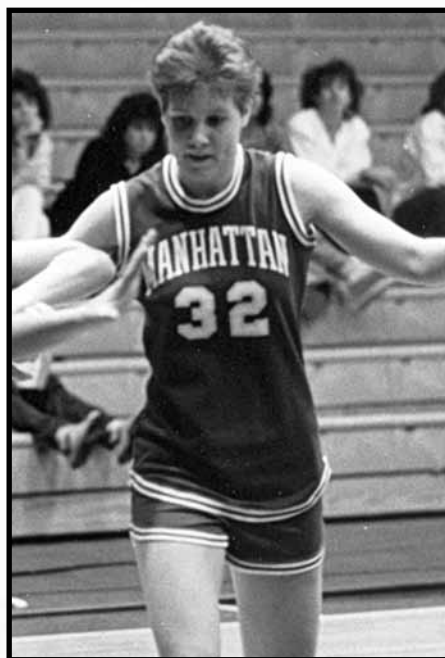

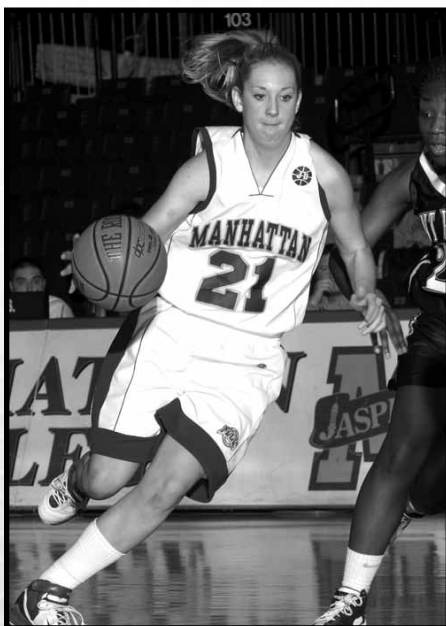

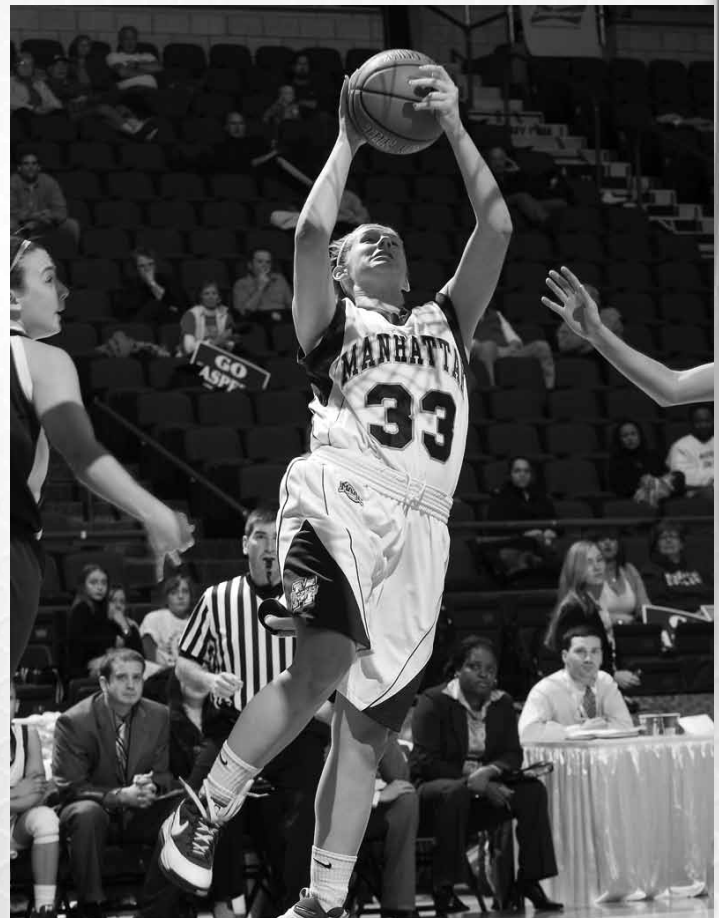

THE MISSION OF MANHATTAN COLLEGE

Manhattan College, overlooking Van Cortlandt Park in Riverdale, is an independent Catholic institution of higher learning which embraces qualified men and women of all faiths, races and ethnic backgrounds. Established in 1853, the College is founded upon the Lasallian tradition of excellence in teaching, respect for individual dignity, and commitment to social justice inspired by the innovator of modern pedagogy, John Baptist de La Salle.

The mission of Manhattan College is to provide a contemporary, person-centered educational experience characterized by high academic standards, reflection on faith, values and ethics, and life-long career preparation. This is achieved in two ways: by offering students programs which integrate a broad liberal education with concentration in specific disciplines in the arts and sciences or with professional preparation in business, education and engineering; and by nurturing a caring, pluralistic campus community. The learning experience at Manhattan College is enriched by cooperative programs with other institutions, by postgraduate professional programs and by capitalizing on its location on the edge of the cultural center and global marketplace that is New York City.

HISTORICAL NOTE

In May 1853, five Christian Brothers moved their small Canal Street school to what was then known as Manhattanville, a section of New York City at 131st Street and Broadway. The Brothers brought with them more than their furniture and their students. They were the bearers of a long educational tradition, going back to 17th century France and their founder, John Baptist De La Salle, designated by the Catholic Church as the Patron Saint of Teachers. He formed a community of religious Brothers who, unlike priests, would devote themselves as teachers to work for the wellbeing of the children of the artisans and the underprivileged. In the process he created a new type of school system that would transform teaching school into a profession and a vocation. The Brothers were urged to go beyond rote memory to "touch the hearts" of the students. Practical subjects were taught that would lead to a useful role in society; religion was taught to impart a commitment to Christian ethics.

Between 1853 and 1863, the school changed rapidly, adding college-level courses in 1859 and first using the name Manhattan College in 1861. It was chartered by the Board of Regents on April 2, 1863 and the first catalog stated its goals — to afford young people the means of acquiring the highest grade of education attained in the best American universities or colleges. While classical languages were thoroughly studied, prominence was given to higher mathematics and natural sciences, thus combining the advantages of a first-class College and Polytechnic Institute. Manhattan College was an unusual institution. Its sponsoring Board of Trustees combined both secular independent members and representatives of the Brothers of the Christian Schools. It also combined excellence in the traditional liberal arts and sciences and excellence in professional and technical education in a single collegiate institution. As the school grew, new quarters were needed.

MANHATTAN COLLEGE

The cornerstone of the "New Manhattan" was laid in 1922 on property bordered by the Hudson River and Van Cortlandt Park, its present location. The addition of new buildings and student residences has enlarged and enhanced the campus significantly. From this accessible site, the college is able to offer access to the cultural, educational, business and entertainment opportunities of New York City as well as a self-contained suburban campus environment.

Today Manhattan College identifies itself as a Catholic College in the Lasallian tradition. That tradition has continued to characterize the special educational experience offered by the College over its long history. Its constant focus has been the education of the disadvantaged. Manhattan has an enviable record in this regard, albeit engaged in the field of higher education. From its beginning, the College has paid particular attention to educating first-generation college students, and was an early proponent of access to disadvantaged and minority students, establishing special scholarship funds as early as 1938. That still holds true today for the impressive percentage of the student body that come from ethnic minorities. So many of our graduates who later on achieved great things in their careers remember that they might have had to leave school were it not for Manhattan's financial assistance. The College continues to realize the objectives stated in its first catalog by maintaining a full range of programs in the liberal arts and sciences joined with professional programs in engineering, business, science and education. The quality of the undergraduate programs has been demonstrated by its record as one of the nation's leading undergraduate sources of doctorates in the arts, sciences, engineering and education, and it is recognized by the establishment of chapters of such prestigious honor societies as Phi Beta Kappa, Sigma Xi, and Tau Beta Pi. Manhattan participates in the Consortium of Liberal Arts Colleges, an organization of the nation's leading research colleges, and in the New York Cluster of seven colleges and universities supported by the Pew Charitable Trusts for undergraduate science education (Barnard, Colgate, Cornell, Hamilton, Manhattan, St. Lawrence and Union).

Over the years, an evolution has taken place in faculty representation. The predominantly Christian Brothers faculty has been replaced by predominantly lay teachers, and includes both men and women. The College became coeducational and accepted its first women undergraduate students in 1973. Prior to that date, Manhattan had established a Cooperative Program with the neighboring College of Mount Saint Vincent, which permitted cross-registration and the merging of academic departments. Currently, women number 46% of the full-time undergraduate student body.

With the opening of Horan Hall (formerly East Hill) in 1990, the College is able to maintain an even balance between residential and commuting students, and foresees an even greater percentage of residential students over the next years. Currently, the College has a student body of approximately 3,000: 2,600 undergraduates and 400 graduate students. The student-faculty ratio is thirteen to one.

DR. BRENNAN O'DONNELL

PRESIDENT



Dr. Brennan O'Donnell is the 19th president of Manhattan College, having assumed the responsibilities of the position July 1, 2009.

Dr. O'Donnell comes to Manhattan from Fordham College at Rose Hill, Fordham University's oldest and largest school. As dean of Fordham College, he was the chief academic officer of a College of Arts and Sciences enrolling about 3,200 students under a faculty of more than 200.

Before coming to New York, Dr. O'Donnell spent 17 years at Loyola College in Maryland (now Loyola University Maryland), where he served as a professor of English and, from 1999-2004, as director of the university-wide Honors Program. An active scholar, his teaching and research interests focus mainly upon poetry, especially of the British Romantic period, and on religion and literature, particularly contemporary American Catholic writers. He has authored two books on the poetry of William Wordsworth and co-edited *The Work of Andre Dubus*, a collection of essays published as a double issue of *Religion and the Arts*. In addition, Dr. O'Donnell has published articles, essays and reviews in some of the leading journals in his field. At Manhattan, he will continue to hold a faculty appointment, as he had at Fordham and Loyola, as professor of English.

As the first president of the College not to be a member of the Brothers of the Christian Schools, Dr. O'Donnell is treading new ground at Manhattan College. He has experience in such transitions, however, as he was also the first layperson to serve as dean of Fordham College at Rose Hill. His publications and lectures demonstrate a keen engagement in issues of faith and education, specifically Catholic higher education. From 1994-2000, he served as editor of the national magazine *Conversations on Jesuit Higher Education*, and he was a member of the National Seminar on Jesuit Higher Education from 1993-2000. In addition, he has served as a board member for the Lilly Fellows Program and for Collegium, a consortium of Catholic universities that strives to strengthen faculty understanding of and participation in the mission of Catholic higher education.

A native of Pennsylvania's Wyoming Valley, Dr. O'Donnell earned his B.A. with highest distinction and Honors in English at The Pennsylvania State University in 1981, where he was inducted into Phi Beta Kappa. He earned an M.A. and a Ph.D. at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill in English and American Literature and Language. He is the recipient of numerous fellowships, grants, awards and honors.

Dr. O'Donnell is married to Angela O'Donnell (formerly Alaimo), a poet and writer who teaches at Fordham, where she serves as associate director of the Francis and Ann Curran Center for American Catholic Studies. The couple has three sons: Charles (a graduate of Saint John's University, Minnesota, and a teacher in the St. Paul, Minnesota, public schools), Patrick (a 2009 graduate of Columbia University, currently pursuing graduate studies in philosophy in Leuven, Belgium), and Will (a senior English major at Fordham).

ROBERT J.

BYRNES '68

DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS



A 1968 Manhattan graduate, Byrnes is now in his 22nd year as the College's director of athletics.

Since he arrived back in Riverdale in May of 1988, Byrnes has presided over a renaissance period in Manhattan College athletics. The men's and women's basketball programs have earned eight NCAA Tournament bids during his tenure. In addition to eight NCAA appearances (four women, four men), the Jaspers have made five post-season and four pre-season NIT appearances. Women's soccer and men's and women's lacrosse began competition at the Division I level under Byrnes, and 14 different teams have won conference championships (men's and women's cross country, men's and women's indoor track, men's and women's outdoor track, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's lacrosse, men's tennis, baseball, softball and volleyball). In addition, to date, 24 Manhattan student-athletes have received All-America honors for both their athletic and academic achievements.

Before returning to Manhattan, Byrnes spent 13 years with the Morrison-Knudsen Company, one of the largest engineering and construction firms in the nation. A native of Garrison, New York, Byrnes earned his undergraduate degree in physical education with a minor in biology. He also holds an M.B.A from City University in Seattle, Washington.

Byrnes' Manhattan College athletic career included service to the Jaspers' club football squad, where he served as a captain and performed as both a defensive tackle and offensive end. He was an assistant coach in 1969 and helped lead the Jaspers to a 6-2 season. Upon graduation, Byrnes began a teaching and coaching career at Queen of Peace High School in North Arlington, New Jersey. He also served as the school's director of athletics from 1970 to 1973. Under his coaching leadership, Queen of Peace registered state tournament appearances in baseball and basketball, and captured the Parochial "B" State Championship in football (1972).

In addition to his responsibilities at Manhattan, Byrnes also served as president of the Metropolitan Intercollegiate Basketball Association, the committee that makes the selections for the annual National Invitation Tournament (NIT) from 1997-1999. Currently, he is the chair of the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference (MAAC) men's basketball committee and the committee on athletic administration. He is also a member of the ECAC Officials Negotiating Committee and the 1999-00 NCAA Championship Cabinet.

Byrnes resides in Croton-on-Hudon, N.Y., along with his wife Rosemary. He is the father of five children: Bob, Carolyn (Manhattan, '97), Brian (Manhattan, '99), Darren, and Brigid.

SPORTS MEDICINE



Sports medicine is an integral part of every collegiate athletics program. Manhattan College employs three certified athletic trainers who work tirelessly to assist student-athletes. While Manhattan's athletic trainers are essential in the treatment of injuries, even greater value comes from their ability to prevent injuries and ensure that Jasper student-athletes are competing in a safe and healthy environment. In addition to preventing and treating injuries, athletic trainers provide injury rehabilitation, nutritional supervision, strength and conditioning, drug and alcohol education, and general personal health advisement.

Manhattan's sports medicine staff is aided by a wide range of equipment for the prevention of injuries and the rehabilitation and conditioning of student-athletes.

The sports medicine staff is supported by a network of highly qualified medical and counseling professionals practicing in the New York Metropolitan area.

The Manhattan College Sports Medicine Department features four taping stations, four treatment tables, three combo/ultrasound stim units, two stationary bikes, two whirlpools, one Jobst Extremity Pump, one upper cycle UBE, one hydrocollator unit, one ice machine, one weighted pulley station, one rebounder, one variable percussor, one cold channel laser, and various sized medicine balls.

& THE JOHN "DOC" JOHNSON ATHLETIC TRAINING CENTER

The John "Doc" Johnson Athletic Training Center was dedicated after the 2002-03 academic year to one of the most recognizable personalities in the history of the College, upon his retirement after over 56 years of dedicated service to Manhattan College.

A long-time trainer of the New York Giants of the National Football League in addition to his duties in Riverdale, Johnson was conferred with the Diploma of Benefactor by the Brothers of the Christian Schools in 1983 and was elected to the Manhattan College Hall of Fame in 1982. In 1990, "Doc" was given the Distinguished Service Award by the Manhattan College physical education department. In 1997, he was given a Lifetime Achievement Award by the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference, and in 1998, the American College of Sports Medicine gave him a similar award. The National Invitational Tournament/Metropolitan Basketball Writers Association honored him in 2000 with its Distinguished Service Award.

WHAT IS A JASPER?



The unique nickname of Manhattan College's athletic teams, the Jaspers, comes from one of the College's most memorable figures, Brother Jasper of Mary, F.S.C., who served at the College in the late 19th century.

One of the greatest achievements of Brother Jasper was that he brought the then little-known sport of baseball to Manhattan College and became the team's first coach. Since Brother was also the Prefect of Discipline, he supervised the student fans at Manhattan College baseball games while also directing the team itself.

During one particularly warm and humid day when Manhattan College was playing a semi-pro baseball team called the Metropolitans, Brother Jasper noticed the Manhattan students were becoming restless and edgy as Manhattan came to bat in the seventh inning of a close game. To relieve the tension, Brother Jasper called time-out and told the students to stand up and stretch for a few minutes until the game resumed.

Since the College annually played the New York Giants in the late 1880's and into the 1890's at the old Polo Grounds, the Manhattan College practice of the "seventh inning stretch" spread into the major leagues, where it has now become a time-honored custom practiced by millions of fans annually.
