**THIS AFTERNOON'S TILT:** Marist (1-3) plays its second of five straight home games today against Sacred Heart (3-0) today at 1 p.m. at Tenney Stadium at Leonidoff Field. This weekend is Family Weekend at Marist.

**ON THE AIR:** This afternoon's game will air live on WKIP 1450 AM, with Ed Weir providing the play-by-play and Geoff Brault handling the color analysis. The broadcast will also be available online at GoRedFoxes.com free of charge through Stretch Internet. The pregame show starts at 12:45 p.m. EDT.

**LAST TIME OUT:** The Red Foxes suffered a 21-14 home loss to Wagner on Sept. 19. Senior running back **Obozua Ehikioya** scored both of Marist's touchdowns. Sophomore linebacker **John Van Aman** led the Red Foxes with 11 tackles. Marist held the ball for just 7:39 of the second half, and Wagner's Rodney Davis scored the winning touchdown on a five-yard run with six seconds remaining.

**WHO THEY'RE PLAYING:** Marist's 2008 schedule includes four opponents from the Patriot League (Lafayette, Bucknell, Fordham, Georgetown), three Northeast Conference foes (St. Francis (Pa.), Wagner, Sacred Heart), two games against Pioneer League teams (San Diego, Davidson) and two contests against FCS independents (Bryant, Iona). The Red Foxes will play six home games at Tenney Stadium at Leonidoff Field, including a span of five straight starting with tonight's game.

**THIS YEAR'S CAPTAINS:** The Red Foxes have five captains on this year's squad, all of whom are seniors: linebacker **Nick Andre**, right guard **Jake Dembow**, running back **Obozua Ehikioya**, fullback **Ray Fiumefreddo** and center **Neil Walsh**.

# MEET THE HEAD COACH



**Jim Parady**  
17th Season  
Career Record: 86-80-1  
Maine/1983

Jim Parady is in his 17th season as the head football coach at Marist College, extending his run as the longest tenured coach in the varsity program's 31-year history. Parady is already the winningest coach with 85 victories and has made Marist a force to be reckoned with both at the Football Championship Subdivision, formerly known as I-AA, level. During his tenure, Parady has coached conference championship teams and has had student-athletes excel both on and off of the playing field.

During his first 16 seasons as the Red Foxes' head coach, Parady has posted an 85-77-1 record, including nine seasons of winning football. The Red Foxes have won the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference Football League championship three times.

In 2007, Marist had perhaps its most historical season in program history. The team moved into its beautiful new home - Tenney Stadium at Leonidoff Field - and played its first game there on Oct. 6, 2007 against Duquesne. After a rough start to the season, the Red Foxes rebounded to win their last two games and earn a share of the MAAC title for the second straight year, enabling Parady to earn MAAC Coach of the Year honors. On Feb. 28, 2008, a press conference was held to announce that Marist was joining the Pioneer Football League, effective in the 2009 season.

A native of Nashua, N.H., Parady attended the University of Maine, earning a bachelor's degree in education in 1983. He was a four-year member of the football team as a quarterback and earned two varsity letters during his career. Parady and his wife, Kristen, reside in Poughkeepsie with their two children, Sarah Jane and Brett Kenneth.

**INSIDE THE SERIES:** This is the seventh all-time meeting between the Red Foxes and the Pioneers, with the series tied at three apiece. The home team has prevailed each of the last two seasons, with Sacred Heart earning a 41-34 victory.

**LONG HOMESTAND:** Today's game marks the second of five consecutive home games the Red Foxes will play at Tenney Stadium at Leonidoff Field this season over a span of six weeks in September and October. The streak of five straight home games tied a program record initially set in the 1987 campaign.

**NEC TOUR:** Today's game marks the last of three consecutive meetings against Northeast Conference opponents, as Marist defeated Saint Francis (Pa.) on Sept. 13 and fell to Wagner on Sept. 19.

**LET THERE BE ATMOSPHERE:** Today's game will mark the second of four tailgates before Marist home games that will be held the Marist Athletics Department in conjunction with Clear Channel Radio of the Hudson Valley. Tonight's tailgate will be hosted by Joe Daily of 92.1 Lite FM. Today's game is also part of Family Weekend at Marist.

**BO SEARCHING FOR RECORDS:** Running back **Obozua Ehikioya** continues to close on some program records.

Ehikioya also needs two touchdowns to break the all-time school record (currently held by J.J. Allen) in that category. He needs 403 yards to break the school's all-time Football Championship Subdivision rushing record (currently held by Jovan Rhodes), and 978 yards to break the program's all-time rushing record (currently held by Don D'Aiuto).

**DAY KINDER THAN NIGHT:** Going back to last year, the Red Foxes have won their last three games played in the daytime, but have lost their last four played at night.

**CUTTING DOWN THE POINTS:** The Marist defense has allowed fewer points in every game this season. After giving up 40 at San Diego (Aug. 29), the Red Foxes permitted 28 against Lafayette (Sept. 6), 22 against Saint Francis (Pa.) (Sept., 13) and 21 against Wagner (Sept. 19).

**UPHILL CLIMB:** Dating back to the start of the 2007 season, Marist has scored first in a game just twice, covering a span of 15 games. The Red Foxes scored first against Wagner on Sept. 19, marking the first time they got on the scoreboard first since their Oct. 11, 2007 win over La Salle.

**THIRD DOWN WOES:** On the season, Marist has converted 16 of its 42 third-down conversions (38 percent). Meanwhile, the opposition has converted 31 of its 56 attempts on third down (55 percent).

**STRUGGLES ON FOURTH DOWN:** Marist is 0-for-7 on fourth-down conversions this year, while the opposition in 4-for-6.

### LAMACCHIA MAKES LEAP:

Junior **James LaMacchia**, who entered this season with four career catches for 31 yards, is Marist's leading receiver with 14 receptions and 169 receiving yards. He caught his first career touchdown on Sept. 13 at Saint Francis (Pa.), the lone touchdown the Red Foxes have thrown for so far this season.

**FIRST FRIDAY:** The Sept. 19 game against Wagner marked the first Friday night home game in Marist's Division I history. The Red Foxes' last Friday night home game was an Oct. 2, 1987 contest against FDU-Madison which Marist lost 10-0.

## LET THERE BE FIREWORKS:

Following Marist's Sept. 19 game against Wagner, there was a fireworks display. It was the first time in program history the Red Foxes will have postgame fireworks following a home football game.

## LAST MINUTE SCORE:

In Wagner's 21-14 victory over the Red Foxes on Sept. 19, the Seahawks' Rodney Davis scored the winning touchdown on a five-yard run with six seconds remaining. It marked the first time Marist gave up a game-winning score in the final minute of play since Oct. 4, 1997 in a 27-24 loss to Duquesne. The Dukes scored the winning touchdown with seven seconds remaining in that contest.

**0-3 AVOIDED:** With its win at Saint Francis (Pa.) last week, Marist avoided an 0-3 start. Under **Jim Parady**, Marist has only started 0-3 twice (2007, 2001). The Red Foxes have had just five 0-3 starts in program history, as Marist also lost its first three games in 1978, 1979 and 1987.

**MAJOR COMEBACK:** By erasing a 13-point deficit to win at Saint Francis (Pa.) on Sept. 13, the Red Foxes won despite entering the fourth quarter trailing by at least 10 points for the first time since a Nov. 11, 2000 win at La Salle. The Red Foxes won 13-12 despite trailing 12-0 entering the final period.

## DEBOWSKI'S FIRST TD PASS:

Quarterback **Chris Debowski** threw his first touchdown pass as a Red Fox on Sept. 13 at Saint Francis (Pa.). Debowski accounted for 233 yards of offense (154 passing, 79 rushing) against the Red Flash.

## THREE AND OUT TIMES

**THREE:** Against Saint Francis (Pa.) on Sept. 13, the Marist defense forced a three-and-out on all three of the Red Flash's fourth-quarter drives.

**LEADING TACKLERS:** Three Red Foxes (sophomore line-backer **John Van Aman**, junior safety **Nic Zivic** and junior line-backer **Kurt Steubing**) tied for the team lead with 12 tackles apiece against Lafayette on Sept. 6. Four Red Foxes had at least 10 tackles in the game, as junior linebacker **Kevin Foley** also registered 11.

**NO FLAGS:** In its loss to Lafayette on Sept. 6, Marist went the entire game penalty-free. The last time the Red Foxes had gone a whole game without penalty prior to that was on Oct. 24, 1998 at Wagner. Marist played 97 games in that time.

## PAULY'S STRONG DAY PUNTING:

Sophomore **Kevin Pauly** punted for the first time in his career against Lafayette on Sept. 6, and made the most of it. In rainy, windy conditions, Pauly averaged 47.8 yards on his five punts. He had a long of 55 and one attempt downed inside the 20.

**EARLY OPENER:** Marist's opener at San Diego on Aug. 29 marked the first time Marist has played a game in August in its 31 years as a varsity program. Prior to this season, the earliest date Marist had started a season in its varsity history was Sept. 1 (1990 and 2007).

**STREAK STANDS AT SIX:** Marist has now lost its last five season openers. The last time the Red Foxes won in their opening game came in 2002, a 38-27 home triumph over Sacred Heart.

**WHAT'S BACK?:** The Red Foxes return 13 starters and 67 letterwinners from last season's team.

**BACKS ARE BACK:** With running backs **Keith Mitchell, Ray Fiumefreddo, Greg Whipple** and **Bob Abbatiello** also returning, the Red Foxes are bringing back players who accounted for 73.4% of their rushing yards last season.

**WHO'S UNDER CENTER?** None of the five quarterbacks listed on the Marist roster have taken a snap in a game for the Red Foxes entering this season. Sophomore **Mike Pepe** and junior **John Schaeffer** are returners. The three new faces are junior **Chris Debowski**, a transfer from Orange Coast College, and true freshmen **Michael Gentile** and **Tommy Reilly**.

**NEW LOOK AT WIDE RECEIVER:** Marist lost its first- and third-

leading receivers in terms of catches in yards with the departures of **Tim Keegan** and **Daniel Dulac**. Keegan and Dulac also combined to haul in 11 of Marist's 12 touchdown passes last season.

**SAME NAMES UP FRONT ... :** The Red Foxes return four starting offensive linemen (**Jason Tillery, Neil Walsh, Danny Angelastro, Jake Dembow**) from last year's team. Marist's only loss on the offensive line was left tackle **Dan Cooper**, who was named a Second Team Football Championship Subdivision Mid-Major All-American last season.

**... BUT DIFFERENT PLACES:** Even though Marist is returning four starters on the offensive line, some positions have shifted up front. **Danny Angelastro** has moved from right guard to left tackle to replace **Dan Cooper**. The new right guard is **Jake Dembow**, who slides over from right tackle. **Kevin Ulrich**, who is making the switch from the defensive line, has earned the starting spot at right tackle. Left guard **Jason Tillery** and center **Neil Walsh** remain in their same positions from last season.

**RELIABILITY:** Left guard **Jason Tillery** and right guard **Jake Dembow** have started every game of their careers. Both are seniors.

**SOMETHING FAMILIAR, SOMETHING NEW:** Of the Red Foxes' four tight ends, two (**Robert**

**Spano, Chris Ortner**) are returning to the position, and two (**Jack Scanlon, Kiely Nagle**) have converted from other positions. Scanlon switched from quarterback this past spring, and Nagle came over from the offensive line in camp. Spano led all Marist tight ends with 15 receptions for 177 yards last season.

**CHANGES ON THE D-LINE:** The Marist defensive line also features several players who have converted from other positions. Nose tackles **Jason DuBois** and **Terrence Turner** spent the past two seasons playing tight end and offensive line, respectively. DuBois started last season's opener at tight end for the Red Foxes. Defensive ends **Brock Flynn** and **Josh Peterson** have seen playing time at linebacker earlier in their Marist careers.
