THE RUNDOWN

HISTORIC NIGHT: The Marist Red Foxes hosted their first ever NCAA playoff game in any sport May 6 when they defeated Bryant, 10-6, in the preliminary round. A record crowd of 1,873 fans packed Tenney Stadium for the game. Freshman Gannon Morrison led the Marist offense with two goals and two assists while senior Dave Scarcello stopped 14 shots between the pipes to help the Red Foxes advance.

NATIONALLY RANKED: Marist made it into the final top 20 rankings of the season on May 4. The Red Foxes shared the no. 19 spot with Hudson Valley rival Army in the Cascade/Maverik Media Poll and slipped into the final spot in the United States Intercollegiate Lacrosse Association Poll.

MAAC CHAMPIONS: Marist clinched its first Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference title since 2005 with a 16-14 win over Quinnipiac on May 2...The two teams combined to score the most goals in a MAAC championship final in the conference's 16-year lacrosse history...Marist defeated Monmouth, 11-6, in the semifinals.

LEADING SCORER: Junior Joseph Radin scored his 48th goal of the season with 10:08 left in the second quarter of the MAAC final against Quinnipiac to become the Red Foxes' all-time leader in single season goals...Peter Cleary and Jim McCormick had each shared the record of 47 goals since 1986...Radin currently has 111 career goals for fifth place on the program's all-time list...He netted his 100th career goal in the regular season finale against Siena on April 25 and scored his 50th goal of the 2015 season in the NCAA preliminary round game against Bryant on May 6.

FAMILY AFFAIR: Radin will be going up against his cousin, Syracuse freshman redshirt attackman J.T. Forkin, in Sunday night's matchup. Radin led the MAAC in points (3.93), shots (7.86), man up goals (0.64) and goals per game (3.00) during the regular season...In seven games this season for the Orange, Forkin has picked up six points alongside a pair of ground balls and three caused turnovers.

AWARD TOUR: Scarcello was named Most Outstanding Player of the MAAC Tournament while seniors Mike Begley and Karl Kreshpane and Radin were named to the All-Tournament Team...Marist took four of the six major MAAC awards prior to the conference tournament: Faceoff Specialist of the Year (Dominic Montemurro), Offensive Player of the Year (Joseph Radin), Long Stick Midfielder of the Year (Patrick Eaker) and Coach of the Year (Keegan Wilkinson)...Eaker won his award for the third straight season, becoming only the second player in conference history to do so.

TEWAARATON WATCH: Begley was included in the first round of additions to the Tewaaraton Award Watch List on March 19...He was the first Marist player to be considered for the honor... Through Marist's first six games of the season, he was the only Red Fox to reach double digits in goals (11) and ground balls (15).

CENTURY CLUB: Marist had five players surpass 100 career points this season: Radin, senior Drew Nesmith, senior Colin Joka, Begley and sophomore J.D. Recor... Recor achieved the feat in just his 29th career game.

GOING STREAKING: Marist enters the first round of the NCAA Tournament on an nine-game winning streak that dates back to March 28. The Red Foxes have outscored opponents 123-62 during that span.

RECORD SETTING SEASON: Marist's 11 regular season wins and six conference wins tied program records set in 1986...The Red Foxes went unbeaten in MAAC play for the first time since 2004...Their only NCAA Tournament game prior to this season was a first round game at Johns Hopkins on May 14, 2005.

MAN UP OFFENSE: The Red Foxes' power play is ranked second in the nation, scoring 57.4 percent of the time (27-for-47)...Only the Denver Pioneers (60 percent; 33-for-55) have a better mark.

WHATS AT STAKE: The winner of tonight's game will play either Johns Hopkins or no. 7 Virginia in the quarterfinal round. The game will take place May 16 or 17 at Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium in Annapolis, Md., and be televised live on ESPNU.

Head Coach Keegan Wilkinson



Keegan Wilkinson was named head coach of the Marist men's lacrosse team on June 28, 2011. He had spent the four previous years as the Red Foxes' assistant coach.

Wilkinson led the Red Foxes to their best season in program history in 2015 and was named the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference Coach of the Year. Marist tied a record with 11 regular season wins and went 6-0 in MAAC play, going unbeaten for the first time since 2004. The Red Foxes made their sixth straight MAAC Tournament appearance and hosted for the second straight year. Marist took down Monmouth in the semifinal and then defeated Quinnipiac to clinch the program's first conference title in a decade.

The Red Foxes took three more of the MAAC's six major awards this season under Wilkinson: Faceoff Specialist of the Year, Offensive Player of the Year and Long

Stick Midfielder of the Year.

Wilkinson is a 2006 graduate of Saint Joseph's University, where he was a four-year starter at attack and a twoyear captain. He led Saint Joseph's in assists and points three times in his career and finished his collegiate career with 54 goals and 83 assists. He is ranked second on the school's all-time assists list and seventh in career points (137).





HISTORY & MISSION OF MARIST COLLEGE

The Marist mission is to educate men and women who have the intellect and character required for enlightened, ethical, and productive lives in the global community of the 21st century. These goals derive from the Marist Brothers, a teaching order that originated in France in 1817, settled in Poughkeepsie in 1905, and established the Marist Normal Training School in 1929. The school evolved into an independent four-year liberal arts college, receiving its charter from New York State in 1946.

The Marist Brothers' ideals of commitment to excellence in education, the importance of community, and dedication to service remain an integral part of the College's mission.



VISION STATEMENT

The Marist ideal of excellence in education is achieved through an emphasis on quality teaching and distinctive learning opportunities. At the undergraduate level, this begins with a firm foundation in the liberal arts and sciences. Through core courses and their major, students are educated to think logically and creatively, to synthesize and integrate methods and insights from a variety of disciplines, and to express their opinions both orally and in writing. Students are encouraged to consider the ethical dimensions of the subjects they study, and to become more aware of their own values and the value implications of the choices they make. They are also exposed to cultures other than their own through on-campus programs and study abroad.

Marist has a long history of serving the needs of adult learners, offering graduate and undergraduate programs that are built on a strong liberal arts foundation and meet the same high standards as Marist's traditional programs. Marist allows these students to balance their education with work and family responsibilities by offering flexible scheduling, degree completion, online programs, and satellite campuses.

Marist seeks to distinguish itself by the way it uses information technology to support teaching, learning, and scholarship. By familiarizing students with advanced technologies, Marist helps them become better prepared to be productive members of society and lifelong learners.

The Marist ideal of community is based on the belief that the College becomes a better institution through the involvement of faculty, staff, students, and alumni. Marist strives to be a diverse community, but also one united by a shared commitment to the free exchange of ideas, consideration of the opinions of others, and civility in all interactions.

Marist believes in the dignity of every human being and is committed to the principle of service. The College conducts programs for the disadvantaged, a wide variety of programs that meet community needs, and programs that broaden access to education. Students, faculty, staff, and alumni are encouraged to make service an important part of their lives.







Marist is a comprehensive institution with its 180-acre main campus in the Hudson River Valley in New York, a branch campus in Florence, Italy, extension centers throughout New York, and educational offerings around the world through its online programs. Marist is distinguished by high-quality faculty, innovative program offerings, a beautiful riverfront campus, and a technological platform that is comparable to those of the best research universities in the world.



- The Campaign for Marist, the College's first comprehensive fund-raising campaign, reached its \$150 million goal ahead of schedule and raised a total of \$158.5 million. This success has already resulted in a new academic building, new and expanded endowed scholarship funds, renovated and expanded athletic facilities, restoration of the historic Cornell Boathouse, and new endowed funding for faculty chairs and academic and research programs, among other impacts.
- Marist's most recently completed building project is a \$32 million multipurpose academic building, home to the College's renowned music program, and renovation of the Student Center, including a new and expanded dining hall and new and renovated student activity space.
- A \$75 million gift from Raymond A. Rich, one of the 20th century's leading businessmen and industrialists, has established the Raymond A. Rich Institute for Leadership Development at Marist College.
- Kiplinger's Personal Finance placed Marist 63rd in its annual rankings of the best values in private college and universities. For the 12th year in a row, Marist is one of the nation's best institutions for undergraduate education, according to The Princeton Review.
- Marist is included in "The Best 379 Colleges," the 2015 edition of The Princeton Review's annual guide.
- Marist enrolls 4,787 traditional-age undergraduate students, 543 adult undergraduate students, and 799 full- and part-time graduate students. The College offers 44 bachelor's degree programs and 12 master's degree programs including a hybrid M.A. in educational psychology and online programs leading to the M.B.A., M.P.A., M.S. in information systems, M.A. in integrated marketing communication, and M.A. in communication.
- Marist partners with Istituto Lorenzo de'Medici (LdM) to offer a four-year U.S. bachelor's degree program in Florence, Italy. The program, open to qualified students from around the world, offers degrees in the Italian language, fashion design, interior design, studio art, art history, digital media, and conservation studies. Marist-LdM also offers an M.A. in museum studies.
- Marist's longtime research partnership with the IBM Corporation has brought the College an advanced technology infrastructure unrivaled by most colleges in the country.
- Marist is one of only six colleges and universities nationwide affiliated with a presidential library, the Franklin D. Roosevelt Library, and serves as the host site of the Franklin D. Roosevelt Digital Archives (www.fdrlibrary.marist.edu).
- The Marist Institute for Public Opinion, founded in 1978, is one of the nation's premier survey research centers. MIPO joined forces with NBC News and the Wall Street Journal to launch a polling partnership which accurately predicted the results of several battle-ground states, as well as Senate and gubernatorial races, in the 2012 election.
- Marist is home to the New York State Cloud Computing & Analytics Center, which leverages a \$3 million state grant and the College's world-class IT infrastructure to greatly expand its role as a driver of economic development in the area and across the state. The CCAC provides IT services to new and growing businesses, including hardware, software, training, and consulting. It works with companies on early-stage IT projects with the goal of developing and testing ways to deploy commercial cloud computing environments. The center also provides education and training, through the cloud, in analytics and cloud computing as well as other critical areas.

RED FOXES

WHY THE RED FOXES

A 1961 meeting marked both the birth of the Marist College basketball team and the adoption of 'Red Foxes' as the official nickname and mascot. Athletic Director Brother William Murphy, decided to organize a varsity basketball team to play scheduled games against other schools and thought a nickname and logo would be appropriate.

While glancing at a sports catalog, Br. Murphy noticed a reynard, more commonly known as a red fox, on the cover of the book. He decided this fury little creature, indigenous to the Hudson Valley, was to become the mascot and logo of all Marist College teams.

The reynard comes from a great medieval cycle of stories that originated in the Low Countries, northern France and western Germany. The rarity of the word prompted Br. Murphy to choose the general term 'Red Foxes.'



THE COLLEGE SEAL

The circular monogram represents the official seal of Marist College. The date 1929 marks the year in which Marist College received its first charter as an accredited Academic Institution. The large 'M' in the center is the traditional symbol of the Marist brothers. The 12 stars, which appear about the 'M', are a scriptural symbol of the Blessed Virgin, to whom the Marist Brothers are devoted. The Latin inscription within the seal "Orare et Laborare," may be translated "to pray and to work," the original motto of the college.



THE COAT OF ARMS

The emblem pictured is the Marist College Coat of Arms. On either side of the shield stands the official College mascot, the Red Fox, chosen for its keen intelligence and ingenuity. The red and white College colors are derived from the coloration for the fox. The Red Fox is also pictured in the College ring.

In the left quadrant of the shield appears the traditional Marist bell, originally used to regulate the lives of the brothers. The Indian seen in the right-hand quadrant of the shield is taken from the seal of the town of Poughkeepsie (from the Mohegan word 'apo-keep-sinck', a safe, pleasant harbor. The lower half represents the liberal arts. The nucleus of the atom stands for the sciences, while the open book and crossed quills represents the humanities. Atop the shield is the official Marist Brothers emblem. At the bottom is a scroll with the Latin words 'Cum Optimis Litigare', which translated, means 'To strive with the best.'
























THIS IS POUGHKEEPSIE

POUGHKEEPSIE, N.Y.

Known as the Queen City of the Hudson Valley, Poughkeepsie is nestled on the east bank of the Hudson River halfway between New York City and Albany, the state capital. Founded in 1687, Poughkeepsie is the county seat of Dutchess County and home to a number of historical sites.

Located just 75 miles north of midtown Manhattan, Poughkeepsie is home to over 42,000 people and serves as a regional center of the arts, entertainment, higher education, health care, transportation, business and government. A town rich in culture and steeped in history, the inspired ideas and works of Alexander Hamilton, Matthew Vassar, Franklin D. Roosevelt and many others are alive in the spirit of Poughkeepsie situated on the scenic Hudson River.

Settled in the late 1600s by the Dutch, Poughkeepsie was first organized as a town in 1788. It was in this year that the U.S. Constitution was officially ratified there by the state of New York, as Poughkeepsie was serving at that time as the temporary state capital. In 1799, the city of Poughkeepsie was taken off the town of the same name and organized separately as a village, later to become incorporated (in 1854) as a city.

The city's name is derived from the phonetic translation of an Algonquian Indian term variously interpreted as meaning "waterfall," "pleasant harbor," or "campsite by small water." In addition to Marist College, the Town of Poughkeepsie is home to Vassar College and Dutchess Community College.

Arts and Culture in the Poughkeepsie Area

In the early to mid-20th century, famous families such as the Astors, Rogers, and Vanderbilts built seasonal retreats in the Poughkeepsie area, many of which today are open to the public as historic sites. Located in Poughkeepsie are the Locust Grove, former home of inventor Samuel F. B. Morse, and Clinton House, named for George Clinton, New York's first governor. The Bardavon 1869 Opera House is another historical attraction, and is the oldest continually running entertainment venue in New York State. Nearby Hyde Park is home to the Franklin D. Roosevelt National Historic Site, the Eleanor Roosevelt National Historic Site, and the Vanderbilt Mansion.

MAAC STORY

With 11 institutions strongly bound by the sound principles of quality and integrity in academics and excellence in athletics, the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference is in its 34th year of competition during the 2014-2015 academic year.

The MAAC was founded in 1980 by six charter members: the U.S. Military Academv Fairfield University, Fordham University, Iona College, Manhattan College and Saint Peter's College. Competition followed one year later in the fall of 1981 with members competing in the sports of men's cross country and men's soccer. On January 2, 1982, Army traveled to Iona for the first MAAC men's basketball game and the MAAC story had begun.

Current Conference members include: Canisius College, Fairfield University, Iona College, Manhattan College, Marist College, Monmouth University, Niagara University, Quinnipiac University, Rider University, Saint Peter's University, and Siena College. In addition, associate members include the University of Detroit Mercy in men's lacrosse and Jacksonville University in men's rowing; St. Francis (N.Y.) College, Villanova University, Virginia Military Institute and Wagner College are all associate members in Women's Water Polo. Drake University, Jacksonville University, Robert Morris University, Sacred Heart University, and Stetson University compete in women's rowing, while the University at Albany, University of Dayton and the University of Hartford take part in women's golf competition. Bryant University, and Sacred Heart University compete in field hockey, while Bryant University is a member in men's swimming & diving. The MAAC will support 25 sports and championships during the 2014-2015 academic year; in addition, the MAAC champion earns automatic qualification to the NCAA Championship in 16 sports.

The MAAC Basketball Championships return to the Times Union Center in Albany, N.Y. after a three-year stint in Springfield, Mass. at the MassMutual Center from 2012-2014. The 2015 MAAC Basketball Championships will mark the 16th time that Albany has hosted the championships with the most recent one being in 2010. By having an excellent working relationship with various facilities, the MAAC has been able to attract a number of NCAA Championship events. Most recently, the MAAC along with Canisius College and Niagara University successfully hosted the 2014 NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Second and Third Rounds at the First Niagara Center in Buffalo, N.Y., marking the fourth time that all three parties partnered for this same event (2004, 2007, and 2010). The MAAC and Fairfield University hosted the 2013 NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Regional at Webster Bank Arena in Bridgeport, CT. The MAAC and Rider University hosted the 2012 NCAA Rowing Championships at Lake Mercer in West Windsor, New Jersey and also co-hosted the 2011 NCAA Division I Wrestling Championships at the Wells Fargo Center in Philadelphia. The MAAC and Rider University co-hosted the 2009 NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Championship Regional at the Sovereign Bank Arena in Trenton, N.J., after recording the third highest attendance figure for the women's championship with the First and Second Rounds in 2006.

In June of 1995, the MAAC developed new opportunities for student-athletes as the conference announced the formation of the MAAC Men's and Women's Lacrosse Leagues. The men's league began competition in the spring of 1996, while the women's league commenced in the spring of 1997. Since their inception as associate sports leagues, both men's and women's lacrosse have been upgraded to full MAAC sports. The men's league currently consists of six MAAC schools - Canisius, Manhattan, Marist, Monmouth, Quinnipiac and Siena - and one associate member - the University of Detroit Mercy. The women's league features competition among nine MAAC institutions - Canisius, Fairfield, Iona, Manhattan, Marist, Monmouth, Niagara, Quinnipiac and Siena.

In the spring of 2014, the MAAC expanded the championship field to six teams in men's and women's soccer, volleyball, women's lacrosse, softball, and baseball. Additionally, the MAAC membership agreed that the highest seeded team should generally host the MAAC championship.

MAAC Associate Sports

In 2002, the MAAC added the MAAC Women's Water Polo League. The league is currently made up of three MAAC schools - Iona, Marist and Siena - as well as four associate members, St. Francis (N.Y.), Villanova, Virginia Military Institute and Wagner.

Sacred Heart began participation in MAAC Women's Rowing in the spring of 2008. Drake University joined the league for the 2010 MAAC Championship, while Robert Morris began competition in the spring of 2011. In 2012 Jacksonville University brought its men's and women's teams into MAAC Rowing, and Stetson University joined the league in 2014.

MAAC women's golf competition is comprised of five member schools — Fairfield, Monmouth, Niagara, Quinnipiac and Siena — and three associate members — the University at Albany, University of Dayton and the University of Hartford.

For the first time in league history, an associate member was added in men's swimming & diving when Bryant University joined the league in the summer of 2012.

In April of 2013 the MAAC added field hockey as a sponsored sport with competition beginning in the fall of the 2013-14 academic year between four member institutions — Monmouth University, Quinnipiac University, Rider University and Siena College. In June of 2013 the MAAC added associate members to the Field Hockey League - Bryant University and Sacred Heart University, bringing the MAAC to six teams for 2014, with Fairfield University set to join the league starting in the 2015-16 academic year.

Academics and Athletics

The MAAC prides itself on the accomplishments of its studentathletes in the classroom, as well as on the field. Mary Beth Riley, a 1991 graduate of Canisius, was the first recipient of the NCAA Woman of the Year Award. In the fall of 1998, Erin Whalen, a member of the Iona women's rowing team, was awarded one of the nation's 32 Rhodes Scholarships for academic achievement and civic leadership.

In 2014 the NCAA announced that twenty five MAAC women's sports and thirteen men's sports achieved a perfect APR score of 1,000. MAAC Women's basketball posted a conference wide APR of 992, 19 points higher than the national average of 973. The MAAC was ranked in the top quartile of the Division I members in terms of overall graduation rates.

First-class facilities are the rule with MAAC schools, as teams regularly play in top-notch arenas, such as Madison Square Garden, the Barclays Center, the MassMutual Center, the IZOD Center, First Niagara Center, Times Union Center, the Webster Bank Arena, and the Sun National Bank Center. This year, the MAAC will take the volleyball championship to Orlando, Florida at the ESPN Wide World of Sports Complex. The 2015 MAAC Men's and Women's Golf Championships will be held at Disney's Palm Golf Course.

In the past several years, a number of the MAAC schools have also enjoyed success in NCAA Championships. MAAC schools have played in a total of 83 NIT games and 81 NCAA games. In 2014, Siena College claimed the league's first basketball postseason title in its history by winning the College Basketball Invitational (CBI) title. In 2013, the MAAC had a record 6 men basketball programs participate in postseason playlona (NCAA Championship), Niagara (NIT), Canisius, Fairfield, Loyola, and Rider (CIT). Canisius and Loyola both advanced to the Quarterfinal round, while Rider reached the second round. In 2012, the MAAC had two teams advance to the NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Championship for the first time in 16 years, with Loyola earning the league's automatic bid and lona garnering an at-large bid. In 2007, the Marist women's basketball team advanced to the Sweet 16 before falling to the eventual National Champion, the University of Tennessee. The Red Foxes have recorded an additional five NCAA wins since their run in 2007.

The MAAC has also been a leader in the forefront of technology, expanding the notoriety of the league into cyberspace. In 2007, the league reached an agreement with JumpTV, Inc., now NeuLion, Inc., to design and host the MAAC web page. MAACSports.com has been a great success, providing fans with up-to-date contest results, live and on-demand video and an online merchandise store. The MAAC, in conjunction with NeuLion, launched an iPhone app in February 2011, followed by Android and iPad apps that were released during the 201112 academic year.

In September 2011, the conference announced the launch of MAAC.TV, the league's first broadband network. Eight schools - Canisius, Fairfield, Iona, Manhattan, Marist, Monmouth, Rider, and Saint Peter's - are currently part of the network, which broadcast over 400 live events in 2013-14.

In May 2014, the MAAC continued to grow its partnership with ESPN3 announcing the launch of the MAAC Branded ESPN3 Channel. All MAAC and school produced ESPN3 broadcasts will be viewable as live or archived contents for all MAAC sports. The new initiative increases the MAAC's long-term partnership with ESPN and is concurrent with the development of school based production facilities on many of the conference's member campuses.

The MAAC President for the 2014-2015 academic year is John J. Hurley, the President of Canisius College. The Vice-President is Brennan O'Donnell, the President of Manhattan College. Commissioner Rich Ensor serves as the league's Secretary/Treasurer. Joe Quinlan, Director of Athletics at Saint Peter's University, will chair the Committee on Athletic Administration, and Jamie Fogarty, Senior Associate Athletic Director/SWA at Iona College will serve as Vice Chair.
