



Maui Jim Maui Invitational Championship Round: Team Facts

Team	Appearances	Record	Notes
Arizona	1993, 1997, 2000*, 2005, 2009, 2014*	13-6	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Three-time Pac-12 Coach of the Year Sean Miller enters his 10th season as head coach of the Wildcats, boasting an 247-74 record with the program • In his first nine seasons, Miller has guided Arizona to eight 20-win seasons and four 30-win campaigns • Arizona welcomes three highly ranked recruits to the fold this season, including Brandon Williams, Devonaire Doutrive, and Chase Jeter, a Duke transfer and former McDonald's All American • The Wildcats will make their seventh all-time Maui appearance, tied with North Carolina for the most in Tournament history
Auburn	First Appearance	0-0	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Bryce Brown and Jared Harper, the team's second- and third-leading scorers from a season ago, return after starting the entire 2017-18 season • Last season, Brown was named a First Team All-SEC performer • Boasting a 26-8 record a year ago, Auburn made its first NCAA Tournament appearance since 2003, and won the SEC Championship • Coach Bruce Pearl was an assistant coach on the 1987 Iowa team that claimed the Maui Jim Maui Invitational championship
Duke	1992*, 1997*, 2001*, 2007*, 2011*	16-0	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The Blue Devils welcome the nation's top ranked recruiting class to campus after securing four five-star prospects, including the top three overall in the Class of 2018 • Duke returns to Maui with an undefeated Tournament record; Syracuse is the only other team with an unblemished mark in Maui • Coach Mike Krzyzewski, a 12-time Coach of the Year and five-time national champion, is the NCAA's all-time leader in wins with 1,100 victories in his 43 seasons • All three Duke assistant coaches were players on Duke programs that competed in the Maui Jim Maui Invitational under Mike Krzyzewski – Chris Carrawell and Nate James with the 1997 team and Jon Scheyer with the 2007 team
Gonzaga	2002, 2005, 2009*, 2013	9-4	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The Bulldogs come to Maui on the heels of a 32-win season, their fourth 30-win campaign in the last six years • Gonzaga returns three key starters in Josh Perkins, Killian Tillie, and West Coast Conference Newcomer of the Year Zach Norvell, who were each among the team's top four scorers a season ago

			<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Coach Mark Few, who is entering his 20th season with the Bulldogs, is the nation's active coaching leader with an .819 winning percentage • Gonzaga is the only team in the nation that has reached the Sweet 16 in each of the last four seasons, which includes an appearance in the national championship game in 2017
Illinois	1987, 2000, 2007, 2012*	10-3	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Illinois welcomes back three of their top five scorers from last year's squad, Trent Frazier, Kipper Nichols and Aaron Jordan • Frazier also led the team in 3-pointers, steals, and assists last season • Five-star recruit and consensus first-team All-State selection Ayo Dosunmu is the cornerstone of the Illini's incoming recruiting class that is ranked 25th by ESPN • Coach Brad Underwood returns to the Tournament for the second time in three years, having coached Oklahoma State in 2016
Iowa State	1990	1-2	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Iowa State returns a majority of its roster, including five of its top six scorers from a season ago, to provide a solid foundation leading into the 2018-19 season • Coach Steve Prohm brings in a touted freshman class that includes four-star prospects Talen Horton-Tucker and Zion Griffin • Sophomore Lindell Wigginton, a member of the Big 12 All-Newcomer Team last season, returns to the Cyclones roster after leading the team with 16.7 points per game • Entering his fourth season with the Cyclones, and eighth overall as a head coach, Prohm boasts a career .701 winning percentage
San Diego State	1989, 2003, 2014	6-4	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Long-time assistant to Steve Fisher, Brian Dutcher led the Aztecs to 22 wins and the Mountain West tournament championship in his first season at the helm • San Diego State returns three starters from last year's team, and three of their top four scorers, including Devin Watson, Matt Mitchell and Jalen McDaniels • The Aztecs have made it to the postseason 12 times in the past 13 seasons, and return to Maui after being the runner-up in their most recent appearance in 2014 • Boast 20 or more wins in 12 of the last 13 seasons
Xavier	First Appearance	0-0	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Travis Steele enters his 11th season with the Musketeers, and first as head coach • Xavier has clinched NCAA Tournament berths in five consecutive seasons, and 16 in the past 18 seasons • Last year, Xavier won 29 games, the second most in school history, claimed the Big East title and earned its first No. 1 seed in the NCAA Tournament in school history • The Musketeers return three players that started at least 18 games during the 2017-18 season – Quentin Goodin, Naji Marshall and Tyrique Jones
