Played first NHL game on defence at age 43. His second game was in the playoffs on April 2, 1928 as a 44-year-old emergency goaltender for the last two periods of the 1928 Stanley Cup playoffs, backstopping the Rangers to victory in Game 2 against the Montreal Maroons. Won Stanley Cup in 1928.

Sam Rothschild, Left Wing, McGill (1915-18)

Played 101 games over four seasons in NHL with New York Rangers (1927-28), Pittsburgh Pirates (1927-28), Montréal Maroons (1924-27)

Russ Blinco, Centre, McGill (1925-28) & Bishop's (1928-31)

*Played 268 games over six seasons in NHL with Montreal Maroons (1933-38) & Chicago (1938-39). **NHL rookie of the year** and won Stanley Cup with Maroons (1934-35)*

Nels Crutchfield, Defence / Forward, McGill (1930-34)

Played 41 games over one season in NHL with Montreal Canadiens (1934-35)

Jack McGill, Left Wing, McGill (1930-34)

Played 134 games over three seasons in NHL with Montreal Canadiens (1934-37)

Johnny Peirson, Right Wing, McGill (1945-46)

Played 545 games over 11 seasons in NHL with Boston Bruins (1946-58)

Jack Gelineau, Goaltender, McGill (1945-49)
