**THE SERIES**

Thursday's contest will be the 83rd meeting between the Cowboys and Jacks, the series dates back to 1951-1952 season where McNeese first defeated Stephen F Austin 83-61 in Lake Charles. SFA leads the all-time series by a 42-40 margin and has won five of the last six outings. McNeese head coach Dave Simmons is just 3-11 against the Jacks. After losing five straight, the Cowboys' claimed a big 69-54 win over SFA to start Southland Conference play 2-0 during the 2016-17 season.

McNeese is only 2-8 over the last ten meetings, being outscored by the Jacks by 145 points with the Cowboys losing by five or less only once. The Cowboys' wins were both of 10 or more points and both home games.

The most points ever scored on SFA by McNeese was 103 in a 17-point win over the Jacks during the 1998-99 season, the least amount of points allowed by the Cowboys was in a nine-point, 27-18 win during the 1959-1960 season.

- After 20 games, McNeese trails opponents on average by 1.4 points- its biggest win was by 47 points vs Ecclesia, biggest loss was by 38 points at UNT.
- The Cowboys' 85-80 win at HBU was the smallest win margin for the Cowboys this year (5 pts).
- The Cowboys have already surpassed last seasons win records with eight contests to go.
- Despite being 2nd in the league in rebounds, the Cowboys have been outrebounded in six of the last seven games.
- This season, McNeese has outscored opponents by 41 points in the first half, but have been outscored by 56 in the second half. McNeese led at the half in three of its five SLC losses.
- Against NWST, McNeese shot a season best .519 in the victory, .600 from long range. To put into perspective how the Cowboys have progressed since game one, they began the season shooting .293 and .222 respectively.
- The Cowboys have posted two 100+ point performances this year, for the first time since 2001.
- Four Cowboys have earned 20+ point performances: Kalob Ledoux, Ugochukwu, Wilson, and Greenwood; double the number of Cowboys on the 2016-17 roster.
- McNeese is experiencing serious road-woes, going 3-10 on the road this season, its only road wins were against SLC opponents. SFA is fairing just a little better than the Cowboys, going 5-5 on the road this season, 2-3 against other SLC teams.

## QUATARRIUS WILSON

- In SLC games only- he is averaging 10.8 per game, with no other athletes averaging more than 9.5.
- He is the **only** SLC player averaging 9+ rebounds per game overall, and is the only player to have 10 games with 10 or more rebounds. Only one of two who pulled down 17 rebounds against another SLC opponent (at HBU, Jan.20)
- Wilson has led the Cowboys in 16 of 20 games, including 12 of the last 13.
- He is only one of three SLC players with 8+ double-double games this season, 57th in the NCAA.
- First on the team, 10th in the Southland including all games, in field goal percentage - 52%
- Arguably one of the most underrated players in the conference.

## KALOB LEDOUX

- K. Ledoux is 9th in the SLC in overall scoring, averaging 15.6 ppg. He is 3rd in conference games only, draining an average 19.9 ppg.
- Ledoux is leading the conference for 3 pt FGs with 28- Ledoux is the only player avg. at least 3.0 per game.
- Ledoux is one of four cowboys averaging double-digits: Greenwood (12.9), Harvey (11.2), Wilson (10.4).
- He scored a career high 34 pts at NWST (Feb.3), draining 12 FGs- a feat that no Cowboy had done in 16-17. His 34 points stands as a game-high since Ledrick Eackles scored 35 against ACU on March 1, 2014.
- Ledoux has now has 15 double-digit scoring games, 12 of the last 13.

## JARREN GREENWOOD

- 2nd on the team from the free-throw line, shooting 84% sinking 71 of 85 attempts. 3rd in the Southland from the charity stripe, 11th in SLC games only (82%).
- Averaging 12.9 ppg- 2nd on the team, 18th in the Southland, 9th in SLC games only (15.9 ppg)
- Earned 41 assists on the season, most amongst the Cowboys.

## JAMES HARVEY

- Harvey is third on the team with 11.2 points per game. Shooting a team best, 39% from the arc (45-116) - ranking him 90th in the NCAA.
- In conference, he is 26th in overall scoring, 15th in SLC games only (14.7 ppg); only 228 points from the 1,000 pt club.
- 2nd in the SLC with 23 3FG made during conference play, averaig 2.9 per game.

# MCNEESE BASKETBALL

## LAST TIME OUT | MCN 75 - NWST 62

The Cowboys revived themselves with a lively performance by sophomore Kalob Ledoux, who finished with a career-high 34 points, hitting seven of eight attempts from the arc. McNeese's 75-62 win over Northwestern State completes the season sweep against the Demons.

Quatarrius Wilson pulled down 15 rebounds in addition to his 13 points for his eighth double-double of the season. Wilson was the driving force behind a Cowboy squad that out-rebounded the Demons 43-34, 25-13 in the first half.

McNeese would take an early four-point lead, behind the efforts of Jarren Greenwood and James Harvey who both drained three-pointers in the lead. The Cowboys went back and forth with the Demons until Northwestern State took their first lead of the game at 13:02 after a 9-2 run against McNeese.

Kalob Ledoux was back to his long-range ways, putting up 11 unanswered points of his own, including three from long range and a lay-up to give the Cowboys a hefty 22-13 lead. Then, with 7:42 on the clock, the Cowboys jumped out to a 32-19 lead over the Demons.

Cowboys were looking much improved from the last contest, shooting 48% from the field and 62% from the arc in the final minutes of the first half. Kalob Ledoux alone was 5-6 from three-point territory.

Both teams would fall into a scoring drought, with Northwestern breaking the four-minute drought with a two-jumpers in the paint. McNeese would still hold a 10-point lead at the 2:50 mark. Kalob Ledoux would end a would-be run by the Demons with a jumper to end the half. McNeese headed into the locker room with a 35-25 lead.

The Cowboys would lead 48-42 just before Kalob Ledoux would put up another three-pointer. Brother Jacob would follow with his second dunk of the game to give the Cowboys a nine-point 53-44 lead with nearly half way through the second half.

As the two-minute warning approached, the Cowboys held a 71-62 lead and with Northwestern State's leading scoring Ishmael Lane off the court due to fouls, McNeese was ready to close out the win.

## THE LAST TIME WE PLAYED | MCN 72 - NSU 63

LAKE CHARLES – Stephen Ugochukwu scored all 18 of his points with in a 25-minute span and Lance Potier helped spearhead a suffocating defense with 11 rebounds as McNeese stunned the four-time defending champion Stephen F. Austin Lumberjacks 69-54 here Monday night.

The win gave the Cowboys (5-8, 2-0) their first winning streak of the season with their second straight while halting SFA's 26-game Southland Conference winning streak. The Lumberjacks fell to 6-8 overall and 1-1 in conference play.

It's also the first 2-0 start to the league season for McNeese since the 2013-14 year and the first win over SFA since 2012, snapping a 5-game losing streak.

Ugochukwu played a big part of knocking off the Lumberjacks. The junior was held scoreless on 0-for-3 shooting through the first 15 minutes of the game but then sparked a flame with seven points in the final five minutes to help ignite a 14-0 run for the Cowboys as they climbed from a 7-point deficit with 6:39 to play in the half to a 27-20 lead following a Jamaya Burr layup with 1:19 to play.

McNeese led 27-23 at the half and opened up the second half on a 14-5 run to take a 43-30 lead following a couple of Ugochukwu free throws.

Meanwhile, the Lumberjacks were ice cold from the field in the second half, especially from long range where they connected on just 1 of 12 from behind the arc and that one coming at the final horn. For the game, SFA was 18 of 64 for 28 percent from the field and 5 of 26 for 19 percent from 3-point range.

Only one player scored in double-digits for SFA, that being Ivan Canete with 10 points. His 3 at the buzzer put him in that double-digit category.

McNeese shot 44 percent for the game (22 of 50) and hit 5 of 10 from 3-point range. The Cowboys also connected on 20 of 30 from the free throw line and knocked down crucial freebies when they mattered the most.

James Harvey, who continues to improve in his long range shooting after going 3 for 5, gave the Cowboys their first double-digit lead of the game with a 3 to at the 16:46 mark of the second half to make it 37-27.

SFA's Kevon Harris followed by hitting 1 of 2 free throws to but the margin to 9 points but Ugochukwu answered with a jumper to give McNeese an 11-point lead with 15:34 left and a double-digit margin that would not dip into single digits the rest of the game.

Even when SFA seemed to heat up with a 6-0 run to cut the gap to 48-38 with 8:51 to play, the Cowboys answered with a 7-1 run to widen the gap.

## Welcome to the Free-Throw Show

Junior Jarreen Greenwood is shooting 84% from the FT line so far this season, ranking him second amongst the Cowboys and 3<sup>rd</sup> in the SLC. He recently tipped the top 100 in the NCAA for his performance at the charity stripe, coming in at 66<sup>th</sup>, up 26 spots since playing at Houston Baptist. Greenwood is only one of four Cowboys in McNeese history to shoot 100% from the line in game with 10 or more attempts. Greenwood helped lead McNeese in shooting 80% or better from the FT line in 11 contests. As a team, the Cowboys are shooting nearly 73% over ten SLC games, ranking them 4<sup>th</sup> in the conference.

## Cowboys Moving Into the Record Books

Returning stars James Harvey (JR) and Stephen Ugochukwu (SR) are making a point to leave their mark on McNeese during their career. Harvey is currently in 5<sup>th</sup> place for 3-PTS made in a career (164), inching his way up the list in every contest. He is currently second on the team with 47 treys this year, shooting a solid 36% from long range. Ugochukwu is moving up the career rebound list, with 456 including his 102 boards this season.

In the 1,000 points scored club, Harvey is joined by Jarreen Greenwood (JR) in the running for 1,000 career points. Harvey currently has 778 points over 78 games, while Greenwood is just above him with 807 points in 75 games played. If Greenwood continues his pace of 12 ppg, he will reach club level in approximately 16 games.

## The Rebound Turnaround

Currently ranking first in the SLC, McNeese is averaging 39.1 rebounds per game- an increase of 5.4 rpg from the 2016-17 season. The 61 rebounds posted by McNeese vs SUNO are tied in the SLC for game-high rebounds. The Cowboys have already outrebounded nine opponents in 2017-18 so far, surpassing the same feat last season. McNeese had a hefty 31 rebounds more than SUNO for the largest margin of the season, last year- the largest was only four.

## Double Down on Wilson

The junior transfer from Mobile, Alabama is fitting in well in the blue and yellow- with eight double-double performances this year. Wilson has already surpassed last year's double-double leader (Stephen Ugochukwu, 6) and 2015-16's leader Craig McFerrin, who finished the season with seven. Desharick Guidry holds the school and conference record after earning 22 double-doubles during his senior season in 2014-15. Wilson knocked down five of his double-doubles in SLC play:

## I Like Big Blocks and I Cannot Lie

Senior forwards LaBarrius Hill and Stephen Ugochukwu are back this season, bigger and badder than last year- posting some of the biggest blocks in the Southland Conference. Between the two, they have a combined 59 blocks; Hill ranks 4<sup>th</sup> in the SLC (1.7 bpg) and Ugochukwu ranks 7<sup>th</sup> (1.5 bpg). On a national scale, Hill and Ugochukwu rank 75<sup>th</sup> and 109<sup>th</sup> respectively. As a team, the Cowboys are averaging 4.9 blocks per game, nearly two more than all opponents. McNeese put up a team high eight blocks twice this season, against UIW (12/28) and LMU (11/19).

## You Other Brothers Can't Deny

Sophomores Kalob and Jacob Ledoux are twin brothers reigning from Lafayette Christian HS. The brothers are one of 31 sets of brothers in the NCAA, and one of seven sets of twins. The Ledoux brothers share the title of twin teammates with Sean and Deion Rhea of Texas A&M-CC, who are also the youngest set of brothers in the NCAA. Uniquely enough, Jacob and Kalob are the only set of brothers who play collegiate basketball in Louisiana.

## Joe Dumars - The Pride and Joy of McNeese

Naismith Basketball Hall of Famer Joe Dumar played his college days at McNeese (1982-85) and still holds the record for most career points scored (2,607) while averaging 22.5 points in his career. He was a 4-time first team all-SLC performer. Dumars and head coach Dave Simmons were both honored as part of the 1980's Southland Conference All-Decade team.

He was the 18<sup>th</sup> pick in the first round by the Detroit Pistons of the 1985 NBA Draft and went on to play 14 seasons with the Pistons, helping the franchise win the 1989 and 1990 NBA Championships, and was voted as the 1989 NBA Finals MVP.

He was selected to the All-Star team six times and to the All-Defensive first team four times. His number 4 jersey has been retired by both McNeese and the Pistons.

## Kalob Ledoux - The

The 30 point club is reserved for special athletes, and after his career-high 34-point performance at Northwestern State- Ledoux has earned himself a spot on the list. Ledoux blew his previous career high of 26-points out of the water, hitting 7 of 8 from the arc in the 75-62 win over the Demons. Ledoux is one of only 13 in the SLC to score 30+ this season, and only one of nine to do so against an SLC opponent. His 12 FGs are tied for the second most by an SLC player in conference play this season.

## Head Coach

12th year at McNeese • 143-194 (.455)

14th year Overall • 170-223 (.460)

Now in his 12th season at the helm of the McNeese Cow-boys basketball program, head coach Dave Simmons ranks as the second-longest tenured coach in school history, following only legendary head coach Ralph Ward who spent 19 seasons at the helm from 1953-71.

Simmons will enter the 2017-18 season as the third-win-ningest coach in school history with 143 victories. He's 12 wins shy of tying Glenn Duhon for No. 2 on the list. This season will also mark his 18th with the McNeese basketball program overall as he was an assistant coach under Steve Welch in the late 80s and early 90s and was a part of the 1988-89 team that played in the program's first-ever NCAA Tournament.

He was named the ninth head coach in McNeese basketball history on Aug. 9, 2006, and since then, he's led the Cow-boys to a Southland Conference championship, two league tournament championship game appearances and two national postseason tournaments.

He's the only coach in school history to take his teams to back-to-back postseason national tournaments - 2011 NIT and 2012 CollegenInsider.com tourney. McNeese made back-to-back appearances in 2001 (NIT) and 2002 (NCAA), but under Ron Everhart and Tic Price.

A native of DeRidder, Simmons was inducted into the Louisiana Basketball Hall of Fame (LABC) in 2007 after having a stel-lar playing career at Louisiana Tech from 1977-81 where he earned All-Southland Conference and NABC All-District honors.

As a coach at McNeese, he earned SLC Coach of the Year honors in 2011 after he led the Cowboys to the league's regular season title, and was awarded the Tommy Joe Eagles Memorial Award by the LABC as the state's major college coach of the year in 2011 and 2012.

In the 2014-15 season, Simmons notched his 125th victory at McNeese on March 1 when the Cowboys defeat-ed Lamar 70-69. That win moved him past Wayne Cusic (1946-52) as the 3rd-winningest coach in school histo-ry. He led the Cowboys to the second round of the SLC Tournament. Two of his seniors – Kevin Hardy and Deshar-ick Guidry – signed professional con-tracts overseas following their senior seasons.

His coaching career at McNeese is full of memorable moments both as an assistant and head coach.

Simmons was an assistant on the staff of head coach Steve Welch from 1988-94 and helped coach the Cow-boys to their first-ever NCAA Tourna-ment appearance in 1989. He left the Cowboys after the '93-'94 season to become the head coach at Edward Wat-ers for two years. He was hired as Mc-Neese's head coach in 2006 and has led McNeese to the 2011 SLC title, the 2011 NIT where the Cowboys hosted Boston College in the first round, and the 2012 CollegenInsider.com Tourna-ment.

# MCNEESE BASKETBALL

His 2010-11 team finished 21-12 making it the first 20-win season in nine years and just the 11th in school history. The Cowboys knocked on the 20-win door the following year where the 17-win season saw four games where the Cowboys came up short by four points or less.

On Feb. 7, 2013, Simmons coached the Cowboys to a Southland Conference first when his team defeated Sam Houston State 59-58 in overtime to mark the 300th conference win for the Cowboys – the first team in league history to win 300 conference games.

He won his 100th game as McNeese's head coach on March 9, 2013 after a 91-88 double-overtime win at Nicholls in the regular season finale.

Simmons was also on the staffs at Northwestern State and Louisiana Tech when those two teams won league titles and played in the NCAA tournament, and an assistant at Delta State when it played post season.

He was an assistant coach at Louisiana Tech when the team went to the NIT Final Four and made two NCAA appearances. He was an assistant at Delta State when it won 24 games and appeared in the Division II Final Four and he

was an assistant at Northwestern State when the Demons won back-to-back league crowns, participated in the NCAA and gave the SLC a first round NCAA victory for the first time since the 1980s when the Demons, playing as a 14-seed, shocked No. 3 Iowa on a last second 3-point basket.

During a 29-year career Simmons has coached more than 20 players who have gone on to play in the professional ranks including Karl Malone of Louisiana Tech and one of the top 50 all-time greatest players to have played in the NBA.

As a player at Tech, he was the team captain and team MVP and in 1981, ranked 5th in the nation in free throw shooting (.890, 130 of 146), a Louisiana Tech school record with a minimum of 80 attempts, and a mark currently ranks No. 3 on the Southland Conference's single-season list. His .818 career free throw mark is also a Tech school record and is rated as the 2nd-highest in league history with a minimum of 300 FT made. He led the Bulldogs in scoring his senior season with 498 points and his 1,563 career points scored is ranked 12th on the school's career chart.

Simmons and his wife Elaine Marie have three children, Desmond, David and Deon.
