## COWBOYS VS COWBOYS IN FIRST EVER MEETING

- The McNeese Cowboys will battle against the Oklahoma State Cowboys for the first time ever on Saturday in Boone Pickens Stadium.
- The two schools have met in several other sports but never on the gridiron.
- This will also mark the first time the Cowboys will be facing off against another Cowboy program.
- Saturday's game will be the sixth meeting against a team from the Big 12 Conference. The Cowboys are 0-5 overall against the Power 5 league.

## LOTS OF FIRSTS IN SATURDAY'S WIN OVER SOUTHERN

- First year head coach Sterlin Gilbert picked up the victory in his first career game as a college head coach.
- A Total of 21 players saw their first action as a McNeese Cowboys in Saturday's 34-28 win over Southern.
- Of those 21 players, eight got their first career start (OL Demarcus Thomas, OL Calvin Barkat, WR Davion Curtis, TE Jacob Logan, LB Kody Fulp, LB Carlos Scott, LB Kordell Williams, S Andre Sam).
- Junior WR Trevor Begue caught two touchdown passes in the game, marking his first multi-TD game of his career.
- Sophomore RB J'Cobi Skinner scored his first career touchdown on a 1-yard run in the game's first score of the night.
- Junior transfer RB Elijah Mack scored his first touchdown as a Cowboy with a 3-yard, fourth quarter score.
- Freshman kicker Noah Anderson connected on his first career FG and PAT, hitting 2 of 3 field goals and making all four PATs for a total of 10 points.
- LB's Kordell Williams and Carlos Scott along with DL Steven Conerly each recorded their first career sacks... Conerly with a full while Williams and Scott a half sack each.

## LAST TIME OUT

• McNeese won its eighth straight game when opening up the season at home and 15th consecutive win in its home opener.

• The 20,437 that witnessed McNeese beat Southern 34-28 set a new Cowboy Stadium record since official attendances began keeping count in 1991. The previous record was 20,300 against Grambling back in the 2002 season.

## WINNING WAYS

• McNeese has produced a winning season for 14 consecutive years, ranking as the fourth-longest streak among active FCS teams.

• The Cowboys have compiled a 106-52 (.671) record during the winning season streak with four Southland Conference titles and five FCS playoff appearances.

• The Cowboys have won 7 or more games four out of the last seven seasons and have recorded 10 wins twice (2013, 2015) during that stretch.

• Since 2000, McNeese has produced 8 or more wins nine times.

## VS. THE BIG 12 CONFERENCE

• Saturday's game will be the 6th meeting for the Cowboys against a member of the Big 12 Conference and are 0-5 heading into the contest.

• The last time McNeese played a Big 12 member was in 2011 when the Cowboys visited dropped a 42-24 contest at Kansas.

• McNeese has played three programs who were Big 12 members at the time - Missouri (2010, L 50-6), Nebraska (2002, L 38-14), and Texas A&M (2001, L 38-24).

## RABORN NAMED SLC, LOUISIANA POW

• Junior McNeese punter Bailey Raborn has been named this week's Southland Conference and Louisiana Special Teams Player of the Week for his performance against Southern this past Saturday.

• The Lafayette native also garnered STATS national player of the week honorable mention honors.

• Raborn averaged 45.5 yards per punt on six kicks, had three go for over 50 yards with the longest being 56, and two downed inside the 20 yard line, one of those being at the 1.

• His high, hangtime kicks also resulted in three Southern muffed punts, two of which the Cowboys recovered and scored TDs on the ensuing possession.

## MCNEESE VS. FBS

• McNeese has compiled an 8-25-1 all-time record against FBS members dating back to the 1982 season, the Cowboys' first season at the FCS level.

• The Cowboys have won 2 of their last 5 games against FBS members, and nearly a third win after dropping a 31-24 heart-breaker at Nebraska to open the 2014 season. In that game, Nebraska running back Ameer Abdullah took a screen pass and broke numerous tackles and scored on a 50-plus yard play to break a 24-24 tie with just over a minute to play in the game.

• McNeese opened up the 2012 season with a 27-21 win at Middle Tennessee then a year later to open the 2013 season, the Cowboys stunned South Florida 53-21 in what is still the most points and widest margin of victory by an FCS team over a BCS school. South Florida was a member of the now defunct Big East at the time.

• The Cowboys were scheduled to open the 2015 season at LSU but constant downpours and lightning forced the game to be canceled.

• McNeese fell 30-3 to BYU last season in its last game against an FBS member.

## LIVINGS LOOKING TO MAKE HISTORY

- Senior defensive end Chris Livings will get a shot to make history this season with his eyes set on the school's all-time sacks record.
- Livings will enter Saturday's game ranked fourth all-time with 21.5 sacks, needing 9.5 more to match the record held by Bryan Smith (2004-07) and 10 more to break the mark.
- Livings recorded eight sacks in 2018 to match a season-best for him (2016).
- In addition, the Lake Charles native has recorded 32 tackles for loss and is now ranked 10th all-time.
- Livings had a sack in Saturday's opener against Southern.

## NEW REGIME, NEW SIDELINE

- For the first time ever in Cowboy Stadium, the McNeese football squad will possess the "home" sideline (press box side).
- Since playing in Cowboy Stadium with its construction in 1965, the Cowboys have always used the "visitor" sideline as their side.
- First-year head coach made the decision to switch for the 2019 year to have the Cowboys now on the press box side.
- The coaching staff will also take on a new look for the exception of running backs coach Landon Hoefler, who was the lone holdover from last year's staff.

## ALL-CONFERENCE COWBOYS

- Three McNeese Cowboys were named to the 2019 Preseason All-SLC team - defensive end Chris Livings, cornerback Colby Burton, and offensive lineman Grant Burguillos.
- In 2018, Burguillos earned All-SLC and All-Louisiana second team post-season honors after starting in all 11 games. He played a team-high 674 snaps and allowed just two sacks all

season.

- Burton, a 2018 All-SLC 1st team selection and All-Louisiana 2nd team member, started all 11 games last season and tied for the team lead with two pass interceptions to go along with 31 tackles and eight passes defended.
- Livings, a 2018 second team All-SLC and All-Louisiana selection, ranked second on the team with eight sacks to go along with 10.5 tackles for a loss.

## COWBOY GRADUATES

- McNeese has six players in this year's squad that have already received their bachelor's degree: DL Marval Bourgeois, DL Jonta Jones, DE Chris Livings, OL Blaise Scriber, WR Rhashid Bonnette, LB Justin Jackson.

## POKES PICKED 6TH IN POLL

- McNeese was picked for a sixth place finish by the league head coaches and sports information directors, something that is uncharted waters for the Cowboys.
- Nicholls, the 2018 Southland Conference champions, have been picked to repeat.

**MCNEESE IN THE POLLS**

- McNeese is receiving votes in both the STATS and AFCA Coaches polls for the second straight week.
- The Cowboys ranked in the top 25 all last season, reaching as high as No. 6 after starting out to a 5-1 mark. But a 1-4 record to end the season dropped the Cowboys out of the poll in the final ranking of the year and snapping a streak of 19 straight weeks of being listed.

- The Cowboys will return home for their final non-conference game when they host Alcorn State on Sept. 14.

**THIS IS McNEESE - A WINNING TRADITION**

- McNeese has a great tradition of football and is celebrating its 76th year of action this season.
- The Cowboys have won a Southland Conference record 14 league titles and have made 16 playoff appearances, also a league record.
- Played in the 1997 and 2002 FCS national championship games, falling to a Jim Tressel-coached Youngstown State team, 10-9, in 1997 and fell 34-14 to Western Kentucky in 2002.
- Prior to moving to the FCS division after the 1981 season, McNeese appeared in three Independence Bowl games, winning the very first Indy Bowl in 1976 by a 20-16 score over Tulsa. The Cowboys played in the 1979 Independence Bowl, falling 31-7 to a Syracuse team that featured Art Monk, and the 1980 bowl, losing 16-14 to Southern Mississippi.
- Former McNeese All-American defensive back Leonard Smith was a first round draft pick by the St. Louis Cardinals in the 1984 NFL Draft. He was the 17th overall selection, the highest ever from the Southland Conference which was later matched by Northwestern State running back John Stephens in the mid-80s.
- Smith signed with the Buffalo Bills and played in two Super Bowls. He was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame in 2014 and the Louisiana Sports Hall of Fame in 2015.
- Former Texas A&M legendary coach R.C. Slocum played tight end for McNeese from 1964-67. He was inducted in the College Football Hall of Fame in 2012.
- McNeese President Dr. Daryl Burckel was an All-American linebacker for the Cowboys from 1977-80 and played in the 1979 and 1980 Independence Bowl games.
- 7 Southland Conference titles in the 2000s (2001, 2002, 2003, 2006, 2007, 2009, 2015)
- The first program in conference history to win three straight titles (2001-03)
- 14 straight winning seasons ranking as the fourth-longest active streak in the FCS.
- 21 winning seasons out of the last 22 years.
- 26 winning seasons since 1990 (29 years) with nine of those with 10-wins or more.
- School record 13 wins in 1995 and 2002.
- Ranked No. 1 in the national polls in 1995 and 2002.
- Ranked in the Top 25 in 78 of the last 110 weeks dating back to the 2010 season.
- Ranked No. 2 in the nation at the end of the 2015 season before falling in the playoffs.
- From Sept. 7, 2013 to Oct. 15, 2016, ranked in the top 25 every week (44 straight weeks) and spent 23 of those weeks in the Top 10.
- Two former Cowboy players were in NFL camps this fall - linebacker B.J. Blunt (Washington Redskins) and WR/KR Diontae Spencer (Pittsburgh Steelers). Blunt wrapped up an all-American career in 2018 and was named to five different all-America teams, including first team accolades for AP, AFCA, STATS and Walter Camp, and third team for Hero Sports.

## INJURY REPORT

- Preseason first team all-conference CB Colby Burton suffered a lower leg injury early in the game against Southern. He will miss the rest of the season but will be able to take a redshirt and return in 2020.

## D-LINE LOOKING TO DOMINATE

- McNeese returns three full time starters and two others with starting experience from last year's team.
- Senior Jonta Jones, junior Cody Roscoe and senior Marval Bourgeois started every game they appeared while Chris Livings missed a few games due to injury but started in those he played. Also, Tyrique Gibson started in three contests.
- With those five, the Cowboys recorded 14 sacks and 27 tackles for a loss.
- Add in Camron Peterson and CJ Semien, two that saw a significant amount of playing time, the line racked up 28 tackles for a loss and 15.5 sacks.
- The line added some power during the summer with the addition of Fresno State transfer Damien DeGruy.

## 'BACKERS TO BELIEVE IN

- The Cowboys will have a new look at the linebacker position where McNeese is expected to line up four backers in formation.
- It'll be an entire new starting crew with the departure of BJ Blunt and Christian Jacobs to graduation.
- Looking to take over the top role is transfer Kody Fulp who played for Cowboys' DC Jim Gush at Navarro JC.
- Junior Darius Daniels (12 tackles, 1 sack, 1 TFL) is expected to get his first collegiate start at the WLB spot, and sophomore Kordell Williams (9 tackles, 1 TFL) is penciled in to make his first start as well.
- Graduate transfer Justin Jackson is expected to provide a spark after earning all-American honors at Angelo State.
- Newcomer Carlos Scott, another mid-year transfer from Navarro JC, is also listed in a starting role on the depth chart. He recorded 50 tackles last season in earning all-SWJCFC honors.

## ORGERON READY TO LEAD

- Junior quarterback Cody Orgeron was born for this moment even if he didn't start playing organized football until his senior year in high school.
- Orgeron was named the team's starter after spring practice and has continued to improve on his skills with impressive offseason work.
- The son of LSU head coach Ed Orgeron, Cody started three games last season and led the Cowboys to an upset win over Central Arkansas in his very first start when he completed 13 of 21 passes for 135 yards, rushed for 16 yards with a touchdown and even caught a pass for 11 yards.

## HERE'S THE CATCH

- Junior WR Cyron Sutton had a breakout year in 2018, leading the Cowboys in both receptions (41) and yards (609).
- The Cowboys also return junior Trevor Begue, who tied for second on the team with 23 catches, and sophomore Nate Briscoe (6 catches for 105 yards).
- McNeese added some talent with transfers Rhashid Bonnette (Louisiana Tech) and Davion Curtis (Tyler JC by way of Univ. of Texas). Bonnette was an All-Conference USA player at La. Tech while Curtis saw some action as a freshman at Texas before transferring to Tyler JC.
- Parker Orgeron, twin brother of Cody, retired from playing football and will concentrate on earning his degree and start a career in coaching.

## KEEP ON RUNNING

- McNeese returns second-leading rusher from a year ago in Justin Pratt (93-320, TD).
- J'Cobi Skinner, who is expected to return kicks for the Cowboys this season, only carried the ball three times last season but is expected to see a ton more this year.
- McNeese added transfer Elijah Mack (South Florida) and D'Andre Hicks (Appalachian State) both who have different skill sets. Mack is more of a power runner while Hicks can bob-and-weave and break things open with his speed.

## HEAD COACH STERLIN GILBERT

**ANGELO STATE, 2002 • FIRST SEASON (1-0)**

Sterlin Gilbert, former offensive coordinator at the University of South Florida, was named the 16th head football coach for the McNeese Cowboys on Dec. 5, 2018.

Having spent the previous two seasons at USF under head coach Charlie Strong, Gilbert guided the Bulls' offense to a top 25 ranking in eight NCAA statistical categories in his first season, including sixth in total offense (513.0 ypg), eighth in rushing (264.1 ypg) and 10th in scoring (38.3 ppg).

The Bulls went 10-2, defeated Texas Tech in the Birmingham Bowl and finished ranked No. 21 in the AP poll. Quarterback Quinton Flowers ranked in the top 30 in six NCAA statistics, including ninth in total offense (332.4 ypg) and 27th in passing touchdowns with a USF record 27. Flowers, a second team all-conference pick and one of four USF offensive players to earn all-conference honors, tied the USF season passing record (2,911) while rushing for 1,078 yards and accounting for 36 total touchdowns. Flowers' 605 total yards and 503 passing yards at UCF (11/24/17) set USF records and were tabbed as the College Football Performance of the Year by Athlon Sports. Meanwhile, receiver Marquez Valdes-Scantling set a USF record with 879 receiving yards as the Bulls set program records for yards per game (513.0 ypg), plays (1,001), first downs (309) and fewest turnovers (14) while totaling 6,156 yards, the second-most in program history.

In 2018, the Bulls averaged 444.2 ypg of total offense, 31.5 points per game, 202.5 rushing yards per game and 241.7 passing per game en route to a 7-5 record and a spot in the Dec. 20 Gasparilla Bowl against Marshall. USF won its first seven games and was ranked in the top 20 in the national polls while possessing one of the nation's top offenses through the first half of the season.

Gilbert's Texas offense ranked 17th in the nation and second in the Big 12 in rushing (293.3 ypg) and was 16th nationally and fifth in the Big 12 in total offense (491.3 ypg). Running back D'Onta Foreman became the 28th player in FBS history to rush for over 2,000 yards in a season, running for over 100 yards in all 11 games he played and ranking first in the nation in rushing yards per game (184.4 ypg), second in total rushing yards (2,028 yards) and third in all-purpose yards (191.18 ypg). Foreman earned first team All-America honors and was named the 2016 Doak Walker Award winner and the 2016 Big 12 Conference Offensive Player of the Year. Freshman quarterback Shane Buechele earned honorable mention as the conference's Offensive Freshman of the Year.

In 2015, Gilbert led a Tulsa offense that ranked 11th in the nation in passing (333.2 ypg), 13th in total offense (507.4 ypg) and 21st in scoring (37.2 ppg). First-team all-conference wide receiver Keyarris Garrett ranked second in the country in receiving yards (1,451) and receiving yards per game (120.9 ypg) and tied for ninth in receptions (88). Quarterback Dane Evans ranked seventh in the country in passing (329.8 ypg) and 25th in efficiency (151.3).

In 2014, Gilbert served as co-offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Bowling Green. The Falcons gained 432.9 total yards per game (41st NCAA), while averaging 173.0 yards on the ground and 259.9 yards passing. The production came without starting QB Matt Johnson, who was injured and would a year later earn 2015 Mid-American Conference Offensive Player of the Year honors. Gilbert mentored backup QB James Knapke to 3,173 passing yards, the seventh-best mark in program history, despite his only having 10 previous collegiate passing attempts. Wide receiver Roger Lewis recorded 1,093 receiving yards and earned first-team All-MAC honors. BGSU running backs combined for 2,192 yards and 26 TDs as the Falcons finished the season with a victory over South Alabama in the 2014 Camellia Bowl.

During the 2012-13 seasons, Gilbert served as the offensive coordinator at Eastern Illinois, where in his second year he was named 2013 FootballScoop FCS Coordinator of the Year. The Panthers led the nation in total offense (589.5 ypg) and scoring (48.2 ppg), while ranking second with 372.4 passing yards, and 20th with 217.1 rushing yards per game, leading to a 12-2 record and an Ohio Valley Conference Championship.

Under the guidance of Gilbert, QB Jimmy Garoppolo was named the 2013 Walter Payton Award winner, the FCS equivalent of the Heisman Trophy, given to the nation's best player. Garoppolo led the nation and ranked second in FCS single-season history with 5,050 passing yards, while ranking second in

the nation and fourth in FCS history with 53 passing TDs. He was also third in the country in passing efficiency (168.3) and was chosen as OVC Offensive Player of the Year.

During his two seasons with Gilbert, Garoppolo passed for 8,873 yards and 84 TDs. He finished his career seventh in FCS history with 13,156 passing yards, and sixth with 118 passing TDs. He went on to become a second-round draft choice by the New England Patriots in the 2014 NFL Draft.

In addition to Garoppolo, five other players were named 2013 first-team All-OVC, representing each position group with running back, wide receiver, tight end and offensive line. Three more players were named to the second team.

Two-time consensus first-team All-American WR Erik Lora led the nation in receptions with 123, which tied for second in FCS history, only behind his own record of 136 in the previous season. He was also second in TD receptions with 19 (tied for sixth all-time in FCS), and third in receiving yards with 1,544 (16th all-time in FCS). He finished his career second in FCS history with 332 receptions, and 12th with 4,006 yards.

Fellow WR Adam Drake was just behind Lora with 85 receptions for 1,305 yards (fifth in the nation) and 13 TDs (eighth in the nation) and earned second-team All-OVC honors. Both went on to sign free agent

contracts with NFL teams.

The running backs came up 12 yards short of a pair of 1,000-yard rushers, including first-teamer Shepard Little with 1,551 yards (seventh in the nation) and 15 TDs, and second-teamer Taylor Duncan with 988 yards and 10 TDs. Tight end Jeff LePak (51-723-8), OT Dominic Pagliara and OG Collin Seibert accounted for the other members of the OVC first team and were selected third-team All-America, while offensive linemen Nick Borre made the second team, and Jimmy Lowery was on the All-Newcomer Team.

In his first season at EIU, Gilbert directed a Panthers offense that ranked sixth in the nation in passing (334.9 ypg), seventh in total offense (470.9 ypg) and eighth in scoring (36.5 ppg). The offense set several school records at the time, including touchdown passes with 34. That year, Garoppolo was seventh in the nation in total offense (318.5 ypg), while Lora set the FCS record for receptions (136) and led the nation in receiving yards with (1,664/sixth all-time in FCS) en route to being named OVC Offensive Player of the Year. Seibert joined him on the all-conference first team, while RB Jake Walker rushed for 1,133 yards and 12 TDs and made the second team, along with TE Sam Hendricks and C Kevin Kapellas.

A former standout Texas high school quarterback and coach, Gilbert enjoyed a successful career as a high school coach. He was head coach at his alma mater, San Angelo Lake View (TX) High School, from 2008-10 and earned West Texas High School Coach of the Year honors in 2008. He was also a highly successful offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Temple (TX) High School (2011) and Abilene Cooper High School (2006-07).

He began his coaching career as an assistant coach at Springtown (TX) High School (2003-04) before moving for one season to serve as a graduate assistant at the University of Houston.
