Brad Stracke

Head Coach

▶ 14th Year

Since his hire at North Texas in December 2008, Brad Stracke has taken the Mean

Green men's golf program to heights not seen in nearly half a century.

In all but three of his seasons in Denton, Stracke has coached at least one individual to the NCAA regionals and has sent his entire team to regionals five times, while also sending three individuals – Ian Snyman, Cory Churchman and Thomas Rosenmueller – to the tournament in 2017.

Stracke, a two-time conference Coach of the Year selection, has coached an All-American (Mario Cazaubon in 2012-13), a conference golfer of the year in Ian Snyman (2018) and three individual conference champions in Carlos Ortiz (2010-11 Sun Belt Conference), Ty Spinella (2011-12 Sun Belt) and Juan Munoz (2014-15 Conference USA). He also coached the conference freshman of the year in 2010 (Cazaubon) and 2016 (Snyman), while leading his teams to 10 tournament championships, with the most recent coming in 2018 when UNT rallied from a final-day deficit to beat conference foe Rice for the Spring Break Challenge championship at the TPC Four Seasons in Las Colinas. Three of those tournament wins were of the conference championship variety – back-to-back Sun Belt tournaments in 2012 and 2013 and a C-USA tournament win in 2015.

In his 13 seasons, Stracke has had 12 players earn numerous all-conference honors.

The 2020-21 season was a rebound year for the program as the Mean Green clawed their way to the Conference USA Championship Match Play final before falling Middle Tennessee after a dramatic semifinal win over UAB in which Sean Wilcox drained two consecutive 30-foot birdie putts to extend the match and win the match in 19 holes. That came after freshman Vicente Marzilio birdied three of the final four holes to win the individual championship by one shot to become the fourth individual conference champion Stracke has coached at UNT. He went on to play in the NCAA Regional in Stillwater as an individual and tie for 21st.

Just before the COVID-19 pandemic cut the 2019-20 season short, the Mean Green had their best showing of the season and Viktor Forslund claimed the team's first individual top-10 showing of the year on his way to third-team All-Conference USA honors.

The Mean Green had a strong season in 2017-18, as they finished the year ranked No. 65 in the country for the second consecutive year and were the highest ranked C-USA team for the entirety of the season

until the final poll when conference champion Middle Tennessee finished the year at No. 63. Ian Snyman finished the year ranked 60th in the country and was named the C-USA Golfer of the Year along with earning first-team all-conference honors for the second straight year. The Spring Break Challenge title at TPC Las Colinas was Stracke's 10th in his UNT tenure. The program also showed its upward trajectory as freshmen Viktor Forslund and Vitek Novak were named to the five-man all-freshman C-USA team.

In 2016-17, UNT finished the year ranked No. 65 in the country and had an unprecedented three players earn at-large bids to the NCAA regionals in Austin, led by Snyman, who shot a final-round 67 to finish just two shots shy of advancing to the NCAA finals. Fellow sophomore Thomas Rosenmueller finished tied for 34th, and senior Cory Churchman finished tied for 54th to close out his career. Snyman earned a first-team nod on the all-conference team, while Rosenmueller and Churchman were both second-team selections.

In 2015-16, Stracke coached the Mean Green to an NCAA regional at-large bid, marking the fifth postseason appearance in his tenure and the second at-large bid. UNT won the Quail Valley Collegiate Invite – marking the seventh straight year with at least one tournament title for the program – before losing in the semifinal of the Conference USA tournament and then finishing 10th at the Tucson Regional in Arizona. Snyman was named the C-USA Freshman of the Year, while he and teammate Thomas Rosenmueller also earned second-team honors, as well as all-freshman team honors. Churchman was also a second-team selection.

The 2014-15 season showed Stracke's and his program's staying power as the Mean Green started a new chapter of their championship history with their first C-USA title, which was the 30th conference title in program history. UNT won the Jim Rivers Intercollegiate before going on to win the C-USA tournament behind Juan Munoz's individual conference championship. Stracke was named the C-USA Coach of the Year – his second coach of the year honor in three years and first as a member of C-USA. That season also saw the rise of one of Stracke's first recruits to Denton, as Carlos Ortiz won three tournaments on the Web.com Tour and was named the 2014 Web.com Player of the Year.

UNT won the second of back-to-back Sun Belt championships in the 2012-13 season and made a third straight appearance in the NCAA tournament behind a stellar year from Rodolfo Cazaubon, who became the 13th All-American in program history and the first since 1992. Cazaubon won three individual titles that season – the most in the modern

era for a UNT golfer. He also became the second player in program history to earn all-conference honors in four straight seasons. Jason Roets also earned an all-conference selection. The team broke into the top 25, which was the highest ranking that late in the season since the modern ranking system began in 1998. Stracke capped the year by winning Sun Belt Coach of the Year honors.

In 2011-12, UNT won its first conference title in Stracke's tenure and its first since 2003 and earned a second straight NCAA tournament bid – the first time UNT had earned back-to-back NCAA bids since 1974-75. Ty Spinella also captured the Sun Belt individual championship, giving the Mean Green their second straight individual champion, following Ortiz's title in the 2010-11 season. That year, UNT climbed as high as No. 3 in the country behind Ortiz and Cazaubon and the team finished in the top five in nine of 11 tournaments. The Mean Green claimed one tournament championship, winning the Waterchase in Arlington.

In 2009-10, North Texas was the only program in the country to have two freshmen selected as at-large bids to the NCAA tournament, as Ortiz and Cazaubon, who was the Sun Belt Freshman of the Year, both got invites. It was also the first time in program history to have two players earn individual bids to the

NCAA regional.

Prior to North Texas, Stracke spent three seasons as an assistant coach at Florida and was the head coach at Indian Hills Community College for nine seasons, during which time he won a NJCAA national title in 2000. At Florida, Stracke helped guide the Gators to three straight NCAA championships, highlighted by a second-place finish in 2006.

At Florida, Stracke coached six All-Americans, eight all-SEC players and a Walker Cup player. He coached 21 All-Americans at Indian Hills and led the program to its first national title and No. 1 ranking.

Stracke earned an associate degree in arts and science at Indian Hills in 1990 and a bachelor's from UAB in 1993, after a golf career with the Blazers. Stracke earned all-conference honors in 1993 before turning professional. As a pro, he was a sectional qualifier for the U.S. Open in 1995 and earned top-10 finishes in Player of the Year points in 1995 and 1996. He won the Lake Bracken Pro-Select and the Fort Dodge Pro-Am in 1996 and claimed the Bos Landen Prairie Tour event in 1997.

Zachary Wright

Assistant Coach

► First Year

Hired prior to the 2021-22 season, Wright comes to North Texas after a stint on the PGA Korn Ferry Tour and is one of the most decorated golfers in LSU men's golf history.

Wright has played in more than 60 events on the Korn Ferry Tour with a career-best finish of third at the 2021

AdventHealth Championship.

Wright graduated from LSU in 2016 and led the Tigers to their fifth NCAA Championship in 2015 by going a perfect 3-0 in match play en route to finishing his career a perfect 6-0 in match play in three straight appearances at the NCAA Championship from 2014-16. Wright was a two-time All-American and two-time All-SEC performer in his career. He was named a Second-Team All-American by both PING and Golfweek as a senior in 2016 and picked up PING Honorable Mention All-America honors as a junior in 2015. Wright won four tournament titles during his collegiate career, including the 2013 Louisiana Classics, 2016 Prestige at PGA West, 2016 Valspar Collegiate Invitational and 2016 Tiger Classic while posting a 72.81 career scoring average to tie for the No. 4 spot on LSU's career scoring charts since 1982.

Wright is originally from Phoenix and attending Pinnacle High School, and he was the No. 1 recruit in Arizona and one of the top recruits in the country in the Class of 2012 and qualified for the U.S. Amateur that same year.

A golf magazine once called the University of North Texas the “Notre Dame” of men’s golf -- for a very good reason. With 83 tournament championships, including four NCAA crowns and 30 conference titles to its credit, North Texas has earned international recognition in the sport.

In all, the Mean Green have competed in the NCAA Tournament 35 times as a team and placed in the top 10 on 16 of those occasions. The program’s long list of successes also includes seven Lone Star Conference titles, two Gulf Coast Conference championships, 13 Missouri Valley Conference titles, three Southland Conference championships, three Sun Belt Conference championships, one Big West Conference title and now one Conference USA title. In 2011 the Mean Green received its first at-large bid to the NCAA Tournament in the modern era. North Texas then captured consecutive conference titles in 2012 and 2013 for the first time since 1974-75.

North Texas sponsored its first varsity golf team in 1939, but much of the squad’s history was written after Fred Cobb, a college golf pioneer, was named head coach in 1946. He saw his efforts pay off just two years later when the Eagles went undefeated and untied in 11 matches and won three tournaments.

Cobb’s 1949 team garnered its first of four consecutive NCAA championships in 1949. The many standouts who donned the green and white during that period included Billy Maxwell, Don January, L.M. Crannell Jr., Buster Reed, Palmer Lawrence, Gene Towry, Joe Conrad, Bill Turner, Stan Mosel, A.J. Triggs and Marion Hiskey.

During Cobb’s reign, the Mean Green fashioned a 72-10-3 record. Nine of the defeats, however, came in his first two seasons at the helm.

Following Cobb’s death in 1955, Herb Ferrill took over the program. Among the team’s accomplishments during his 30 years as head coach were two runner-up finishes and two third-place finishes at the NCAA Championships and 13 Missouri Valley Conference titles.

Since the All-America team was created in 1958, a host of North Texas players have earned selection to the elite group, including Dick Whetzle, Dick Smith, Bobby Greenwood, Frank Luke, Don Wilson, Ron Folk, Jimmy Clayton, Jerry Greiner, Guy Collins, John Granger, Doug Higgins, Mike McCaffrey and Rodolfo Cazaubon in 2013. Many of them went on to enjoy professional careers.



The Mean Green's conference championship in 2013 was the second straight conference title and the first time since 1974-75 that the Mean Green has won consecutive titles, but the hardware is just one of many in the trophy case.

In all, the Mean Green have competed in the NCAA Tournament 35 times as a team and placed in the top 10 on 16 of those occasions. The program's long list of successes also includes seven Lone Star Conference titles, two Gulf Coast Conference championships, 13 Missouri Valley Conference titles, three Southland Conference championships, one Big West Conference title and three Sun Belt Conference Championships in 2003, 2012 and 2013.

Former North Texas golfer Carlos Ortiz left as one of the most decorated players in school history, and now his professional career is

showing why.

Ortiz entered 2022 ranked 33rd in the FedEx Cup rankings and 69th in the World Golf Rankings. He entered 2022 with 11 career top-10 finishes, two runner-up finishes and a third-place showing. He claimed his first career victory on the PGA Tour at the Houston Open in November 2020 and competed in the Tokyo 2020 Olympic Games for his native Mexico in Summer 2021.

He now has, as of February 2022, just more than \$7.6 million in career earnings on the PGA Tour and more than \$9 million as a professional.

In his first season on the PGA Tour, Ortiz advanced in the FedEx Cup playoffs and finished 93rd in the championship. Ortiz had one top-10 finish and nine top-25 finishes in his first year on the PGA Tour, winning \$964,137 to earn his card for the 2016 season.

Early in the 2019-20 season, Ortiz tied for fourth at the Sanderson Farms Championship and the Houston Open. He tied for second at the Mayakoba Golf Classic.

Ortiz was named the 2014 Web.com Tour Player of the Year after three wins and six top-10 finishes. Ortiz earned a full exemption and his PGA Tour card for the entire 2014-15 season.

His memorable season on the Web.com Tour saw him win the El Bosque Mexico Open in front of family and friends, the Panama Claro Open, and finally the WinCo Portland Open to cap his season off.

He claimed his first career victory on the PGA Tour at the 2019 Sanderson Farms Championship and competed in the Tokyo 2020 Olympic Games for his native Colombia in Summer 2021.

He now has, as of February 2022, just more than \$7.5 million in career earnings on the PGA Tour.

Early on in the 2019-2020 season, he won his first career PGA event when he claimed the Sanderson Farms Championship by winning a playoff and finishing at 18-under par.

As of January 2020, Munoz was ranked fourth in the FedEx Cup Standings and had \$2.06 million in earnings for the 19-20 season.

In November 2019, Munoz finished third at the RSM Classic with an 18-under-par showing.

Through January 2020, Munoz had made seven of nine cuts on the 19-20 season and was enjoying a breakout year for his young career. In his first season on the PGA Tour (2016-17), he finished tied for third at the Greenbrier Classic.

As a member of the Web.com Tour, Munoz had his most memorable season in 2018, when he finished seventh on the money list after two runner-up finishes and four additional top-10 finishes.
