DR. HARRISON KELLER
UNIVERSITY PRESIDENT
NOTRE DAME

Dr. Harrison Keller became the 17th president of the University of North Texas in August 2024, bringing with him a deep commitment to advancing student success and elevating UNT's rich tradition of academic and research excellence at the national level.

Dr. Keller is known as an innovator and leader in state educational budget and policy, university administration, fundraising, and building coalitions among higher education institutions, school districts, and policymakers to expand opportunity through education. Most recently, Dr. Keller served as Commissioner of Higher Education and chief executive officer for the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board, providing statewide leadership and coordination of higher education budget and policy for the world's eighth largest economy. Under his visionary leadership, the Coordinating Board advanced policy and programs to improve college readiness and student success — especially for low-income and first-generation college students.

Prior to serving as Commissioner, Dr. Keller held numerous leadership roles at the University of Texas at Austin, serving as Deputy to the President for Strategy and Policy, Vice Provost for Higher Education Policy and Research, and Executive Director of the Center for Teaching and Learning. Earlier in his career, Dr. Keller was a legislative aide in the Texas Senate and Texas House of Representatives, Director of Research for the Texas House, and Senior Education Advisor for the Speaker of the Texas House. He has taught at UT Austin, Georgetown University, and St. Edward's University.

A sixth-generation Texan, Dr. Keller earned a bachelor's degree from the University of Notre Dame and a master's and Ph.D. in philosophy from Georgetown University. From 2005 to 2015, he served as an intelligence officer in the U.S. Navy Reserve. He and his wife, Gena Nivens Keller, have three children.

Dr. Christy Crutsinger returned to her faculty position in fall of 2019 after serving in central administration for over a decade. In her role as Vice Provost for Academic Affairs she was responsible for the development and implementation of academic policy, evaluation of research centers and institutes, and major student success initiatives including the launch of the Academic Success Center. Previous to this appointment, Crutsinger served as the Vice Provost for Faculty Success where she developed and launched the innovative hub for faculty, focusing on professional development across the career pipeline. A few noteworthy accomplishments include the development of the Chair Academy, the Leadership Fellows program, the Faculty Mentoring Grant Program, and the signature UNT Foundation Salute to Faculty Excellence awards program and event.

Crutsinger holds a faculty appointment as Professor in UNT's Department of Merchandising & Digital Retailing. She served as associate dean of the School of Merchandising & Hospitality Management from 2006-2010 and as chair of the Merchandising Department from 1998-2006. Under her leadership, the department received the American Textile Manufacturer Institute (ATMI) 2000 Award for Excellence for exemplary and innovative programs including the nation's first 100% web-based graduate merchandising degree.

Her research focuses on consumer motivations and influences on shopping patterns including studies on shoplifting, Internet use, service expectations, and employee behaviors. Most recently, her work has investigated the impact of work experiences and expectations on career intentions of university students and faculty. In 2017, Crutsinger was invited to deliver the keynote address, "The Consumer Experience Trend: Redefining Industries and Talent," at the International Summit Forum for Fashion, Technology and Talent at Zhejiang Sci-Tech University in China. Leveraging her years in academic administration, her scholarly work focuses on career and professional development. She teaches courses in the Social Psychology of Dress and Appearance, Talent Development, and Leadership Theory.

Crutsinger currently serves as UNT's Faculty Athletic Representative for NCAA Division I-A intercollegiate sports and has been a member of the UNT Athletic Council for over 15 years.

VICE PRESIDENT / DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS

INTRODUCTION

Jared Mosley was named UNT Vice President and Director of Athletics on December 10, 2022, by President Neal Smatresk. He is tasked with the overall leadership of UNT Athletics and its more than 300 student-athletes.

During the 2023-24 year, UNT enjoyed a strong first season in the American Athletic Conference with six teams reaching postseason competition. Women's basketball won the Mean Green's first AAC championship as UNT teams finished with a combined record over .500 for a program-best seventh straight season.

In the classroom, UNT student-athletes posted a record GPA with a 3.284 overall in the Spring 2024 semester. The department also increased membership in the Mean Green Scholarship Fund to a record 1,750 donors as of May 2024.

In his first year in the role, the women's golf program won its third consecutive Conference USA championship, the track and field program had three NCAA qualifiers - its most in 30 years, and the men's basketball program won its first National Invitation Tournament Championship. Mosley also oversaw the hiring of five head coaches during the year (Eric Morris, Football; Ross Hodge, Men's Basketball; Jason Burton, Women's Basketball; Luke Calcaterra, Men's Golf; and Amanda Stone, Women's Tennis).

In 2023, Mosley spearheaded a new 15-year naming rights agreement for DATCU Stadium and guided the department through a transition to The American. Additionally, Mean Green student-athletes recorded their best-ever cumulative GPA during the Fall 2023 semester.

A native of Lockney, Texas, Mosley is the 15th director of athletics in UNT history. He previously served as UNT Athletics' Associate Vice President and Chief Operating Officer for more than six years from September 2016 to December 2022. In that role, he assisted Baker with financial, operational, and administrative issues. He also was tasked with developing strategic initiatives and providing oversight for human resources issues as well as facilities and event management, student services, marketing, promotions, and strategic communications.

He served as sport program administrator for both men's and women's basketball while assisting with football and handling scheduling for the football program. In his time at UNT, seven programs (men's cross country, volleyball, women's soccer, football, men's basketball, women's golf and softball) combined to win 17 conference or division championships, and the overall athletic department's winning percentage in the last year was the best in the modern era.

Mosley came to North Texas from the Texas Sports Hall of Fame, where he held the title of Chief Executive Officer and President from 2014-16.

Prior to that appointment, Mosley served as Director of Athletics for 10 years at Abilene Christian University from 2004-14, where he increased the athletics fundraising more than 650 percent up to more than \$1.7 million in his final year. Mosley oversaw more than \$30 million in facilities construction and renovations while leading the Wildcats through the first year of their Division I transition. He also secured the lead gift for an on-campus football stadium.

Mosley, who has more than 20 years' experience in athletics administration and leadership, also worked as Associate Athletic Director at ACU from 2001-03.

He earned a pair of degrees from ACU with a Bachelor of Science degree in 2000 and a master's in education administration in 2003. Mosley was inducted into the ACU Sports Hall of Fame in 2015 after a successful basketball career, where he finished as the 11th-leading scorer and the eighth-leading rebounder in school history.

Mosley and his wife Trish have three children, Jaden, Jaxon, and Blair.

LUKE CALCATERA

HEAD COACH • 3RD SEASON
ARKANSAS TECH, '07

Luke Calcatera was hired as the men's golf coach on June 7, 2023, after he led North Alabama to a resurgent season in the 2022-23 season and spent the previous decade building Arkansas Tech into a perennial national powerhouse.

The 2024-25 season was Calcatera's second at the helm in Denton. He led the program to its highest finish at a conference championship since 2021 with a third-place finish at the American Conference Championships. The Mean Green vaulted up the leaderboard on the final day with a round of 277, which marked the UNT's best round at a conference tournament in program history.

Calcatera coached true freshman Blake Keen to All-American Conference accolades following a fourth-place finish at the conference championship. Keen and fellow freshman Alex Huang combined for nine top-20 placements and four top-10 showings showcasing major potential for the coming years.

In his first season, Calcatera led his squad to some new program records, including low 18-hole score (268) and low 54-hole score (823) at the White Sands Bahamas Invitational. He guided UNT to a fifth-place finish at the American Conference Championship, where Tucker Allen earned runner-up honors in his final collegiate event. The team also won its host event, the North Texas Intercollegiate at Maridoe Golf Club, marking the Mean Green's first tournament win since 2018.

Prior to UNT, the Keller, Texas, native took over a UNA program making the transition to Division I, and in his lone season led the Lions to a 75-spot improvement in the Golfstat rankings, a conference-best three tournament wins and the program's first victory over a top-20 opponent.

Calcatera's success at his alma mater, Arkansas Tech, included 10 straight NCAA Regional appearances, six trips to the NCAA Championship Tournament, five teams advancing to NCAA finals match play, and the 2021 NCAA Division II Men's Golf National Championship.

The 2021 Division II National Coach of the Year, two-time Arnold Palmer Cup Head Coach Finalist, six-time Great American Conference Coach of the Year and three-time Central Region Coach of the Year, Calcatera is also known as a relentless recruiter. He previously signed Texas natives that earned four All-America awards, an Arnold Palmer Cup finalist honor and back-to-back conference individual champions.

Under Calcatera, Arkansas Tech is the only Division II institution in history to reach the match-play rounds at five straight NCAA Championships (2017-19, 21-22). He led his teams to two conference titles and 32 total tournament wins in his final 10 seasons. The individual honors earned by his players during that time include more than 30 all-conference selections, six conference Freshman of the Year honorees, four Conference Player of the Year award winners, along with seven All-Americans in the last four seasons.

Calcatera was promoted to Director of Golf at Arkansas Tech in 2020 and he also became the head coach of the ATU women's golf team. He led the ATU women to an NCAA Regional title and they advanced to NCAA match play. His first female recruit also won GAC Freshman of the Year honors.

Cory Churchman was hired as the men's golf assistant coach prior to the 2022-23 season.

In his three completed seasons on staff, Churchman has overseen five all-conference players and a trio of top five team finishes at the conference tournament.

During the 2025 season, he helped with the development of true freshmen Blake Keen and Alex Huang, who combined for nine top-20 placements and four top-10 finishes on the season. Both golfers placed inside the top 10 at the American Conference Championships with Keen earning all-conference accolades for his fourth-place finish.

He also coached Tucker Allen to a pair of all-conference honors as a junior and senior. Allen placed second at the American Championships in 2024 and was one of three Mean Green golfers to earn All-CUSA honors in 2023. The 2023 season saw Vicente Marzilio put together a First Team All-CUSA campaign, which ended with a berth to the NCAA Regionals.

Churchman, a native of Abilene, Texas, played his college golf at UNT, before graduating Cum Laude in 2017 with a bachelor's degree in Finance. He was a team captain as a junior and played in all but one event for the Mean Green during his four years in Denton.

While at UNT, he was selected All-Conference USA Second Team in 2016 and 2017 and was named to the conference all-tournament team in 2015 and 2017, when he was the individual runner-up at the conference championship. He helped lead the Mean Green to a team conference championship in 2015 and was a NCAA Regional qualifier in 2015 and 2017, when he earned at-large individual bids.

In 2017, he was honored as UNT's Men's Student-Athlete of the Year and was also selected as the team MVP. As a senior, he was selected as a Cleveland/Srixon All-American Scholar.

Following his standout collegiate career, Churchman finished second at first stage of Korn Ferry Tour Qualifying School, shooting 26-under par and he made it through the first stage of Q-school three straight years (2017-19). In 2018, he played professionally on the Mackenzie Tour, and in 2019 he finished second on the APT money list while winning Bravado Wireless Real Okie Championship. He was the runner-up at the 2020 Texas State Open and had four other runner-up finishes. In 2021, he Monday-qualified for the Chitimacha Louisiana Open on the Korn Ferry Tour.

He and his wife, Maddie, have four children, Sophie, Fisher, Noa and Truett.

NORTH TEXAS EXES ON THE PRO TOUR



CARLOS ORTIZ

LIV GOLF
NORTH TEXAS '13

Former North Texas golfer Carlos Ortiz left as one of the most decorated players in school history, and now his professional career is showing why.

Ortiz recently completed his fourth season in the LIV Golf League, finishing eighth in the final individual standings for the 2025 campaign. The 2025 season was the best of his LIV Golf tenure as he recorded six top-10 finishes in 13 appearances.

After multiple close calls during his first two seasons, Ortiz finally broke through adding his name to the roster of winners with his maiden victory at the Golf Club of Houston in Texas, during the 2024 season.

Texas also played host to his first and only win on the PGA Tour when Ortiz triumphed at the 2020 Houston Open, at the same time becoming the first Mexican golfer to win a PGA Tour title in 42 years.

Ortiz has followed up his success in LIV on the largest stages the game of golf has to offer. He represented Mexico at the 2024 Paris Olympics, securing 26th place. It was his second Olympic Games following on from a T42 at Tokyo 2020. Ortiz continued to impress in 2025 when he finished T4 at the U.S. Open at historically difficult Oakmont. It was the best major finish of his career.

The former UNT star moved to LIV in 2022 after six full seasons on the PGA Tour. During that time, Ortiz collected one win, four top-three finishes and 12 top-10 finishes, while earning over \$7 million in career earnings.

Ortiz was named the 2014 Web.com Tour (now known as the Korn Ferry Tour) Player of the Year after three wins and six top-10 finishes. Ortiz earned a full exemption and his PGA Tour card for the entire 2014-15 season, effectively kickstarting his professional career.



JUAN SEBASTIAN MUNOZ

LIV GOLF
NORTH TEXAS '15

Former North Texas golfer Juan Sebastian Munoz left as one of the most decorated players in school history, and now his professional career is showing why.

A native of Bogota, Colombia, Munoz returned to South America to play on the PGA Tour Latinoamerica Developmental Series after turning professional in 2015. Following a pair of wins on the tour, Munoz earned his place on the Web.com (Now Korn Ferry) Tour for the rest of 2016 which resulted in him earning his PGA Tour Card for the 2017 season.

In his first season on the PGA Tour in 2017, Munoz had a top-10 finish and a top-25 finish, while earning \$563,900 in winnings.

Early on in the 2019-2020 season, he won his first career PGA event when he claimed the Sanderson Farms Championship by winning a playoff and finishing at 18-under par.

Munoz made golf history in the 2021-22 season when he became the first PGA Tour player to shoot a 60 or better twice in the same season. The fun started in November's RSM Classic at Sea Island, Georgia, where Muñoz opened with a 60 to lead the tournament at 10-under going into day two. He eventually finished third with an overall score of 264 after four rounds (18-under total). The following May he was at it again, this time at the AT&T Byron Nelson. Muñoz was the overnight leader at TPC Craig Ranch after shooting an opening round 60.

Following 135 PGA Tour events, Munoz decided to make the move to LIV Golf in 2023 to team up with Ortiz on Torque GC. Muñoz showed strong consistency in 2024 with 11 finishes in the top half of the leaderboard from 13 events.

In 2025, Muñoz broke through for his first win on the LIV Golf League, winning in Indianapolis in a dramatic playoff against Jon Rahm. He once again made golf history, firing a first-round 59, becoming the first player in professional golf history to post a round of 59 with a double bogey.





NORTH TEXAS EXES ON THE PRO TOUR

**KORN FERRY TOUR
NORTH TEXAS '08**

Former Mean Green golf standout Anthony Broussard played on the Adams Golf Pro Tour Series for seven years after turning pro in 2009.

Broussard posted the best season of his career in 2014 where he was named the Tour's Player of the Year after collecting seven top-10 finishes.

He earned full-time status on the Korn Ferry Tour for the 2016 season.

In 2014, Broussard won the Texas State Open and finished third at a sectional meet in Houston to qualify for the U.S. Open. He made his major debut at the U.S. Open, but missed the cut finishing 10-over at Pinehurst No. 2.



RODOLFO CAZaubON

**KORN FERRY TOUR/PGA LATINOAMERICA
NORTH TEXAS '13**

Former Mean Green golf standout Rodolfo Cazaubon made quite a splash on the PGA Tour Latinoamerica in 2015 as he was the Order of Merit Winner (money leader) and earned a full exemption onto the Web.com

(now Korn Ferry) Tour for 2016. By capturing the Order of Merit, he secured the Roberto De Vincenzo Award as PGA Tour Latinoamérica's 2015 Player of the Year.

Cazaubon, in 16 events, was the money winner with earnings of \$129,203 and had the lowest stroke average in the season at 69.76.

He won three events in 2015, the most among all players on the Tour.

Over the course of his career, Cazaubon made over 40 starts on the Korn Ferry Tour and recorded three top-25 finishes. He tallied seven starts on the PGA Tour, which included a third-place finish at the Puerto Rico Open where he shot an 11-under 277.

Cazaubon earned the right to represent Mexico at the 2016 Rio Olympic Games. He finished T30 at one-under-par after sinking a long eagle putt on the 18th green to conclude his tournament.
