STORY LINES

■ The Mercer University football team begins a stretch of five-straight conference games Saturday when the Bears travel to Campbell for a 4 p.m. matchup with the Camels at Barker-Lane Stadium.

■ The Camels are looking to secure their second home victory in five attempts this season, while Mercer is in search of its first road victory after playing six of seven games at home to start the season.

■ After opening the year with six of their first seven games at home, the Bears suddenly face back-to-back road contests in the state of North Carolina against teams with a combined record of 1-13.

home, the Bears boast the most home wins of any NCAA Division I FBS or FCS team in the country. Six FBS programs and four FCS teams are 5-0 at home.

■ Mercer is one of 19 FCS programs in the country with one loss or less. All but four of those teams are ranked in the latest FCS Coaches Poll.

■ Currently averaging 8,876 fans per game through six home games, Mercer is on pace to record the largest single-season attendance average of any team in the PFL over the last five years. Morehead State's mark of 6,166 fans per game for five contests in 2011 leads the league over the last five seasons.

the top two rushing offenses in the Pioneer Football League, as Mercer's 273.4 yards per game leads the league and ranks fifth in the country, while Campbell's 271.7 is second in the conference.

■ With both offenses relying on the run, Mercer's rush defense that ranks No. 2 in the nation at 80.1 yards per game will have the edge, as Campbell gives up 192.1 yards per game on the ground.

■ The Camels rank No. 10 in the conference in red zone defense, allowing 28 scores in 31 chances, including 24 touchdowns. Mercer red zone offense, which ranks fourth in the league, has scored on 30 of its 33 trips inside the 20 yard line, including 22 touchdowns.

TRACKING THE CAMPBELL CAMELS

In its sixth season of competition since reinstating the football program, Campbell's only winning season came in 2011 with a record of 6-5.

The Camels are 1-2 when scoring more than 40 points this season and the Campbell defense gives up 40.6 points per game to rank 11th out of 12 teams in the PFL.

Campbell has been exceptional on special teams and leads the Pioneer Football League in net yards per punt at 37.4, and punt return average at 13.8.

The Campbell punt return attack is led by Jordan Hildreth, whose 15.9 yards per return leads the team and garnered the junior National Punt Returner of the Week honors on Oct. 13 by College Football Performance Awards.

MERCER TEAM NOTES

- Mercer's fourth down conversion percentage of .900 (9-10) ranks third in the country behind Lehigh at .909 (10-11) and Coastal Carolina at 1.000 (5-5).
- Payton Usher leads all freshmen in the country with 101.0 rushing yards per game. He has four games of 100+ yards and is averaging 6.9 yards per carry in 2013.
- To go along with the longest pass play in the country this season, John Russ is second in the nation in passing yards per completion at 16.69. He trails only Keiran McDonagh of Portland State at 17.58 yards per completion.

USHER NAMED TO WATCH LIST FOR JERRY RICE AWARD

In the midst of a remarkable season through the first five weeks of his inaugural collegiate campaign, redshirt freshman Payton Usher has been named to a watch list for the Jerry Rice Award as the top freshman in the country at the FCS level. On Oct. 9, The Sports Network announced its initial 20-player watch list for the 2013 Rice Award. Named for the legendary wide receiver, who played in the FCS (then Division I-AA) at Mississippi Valley State, the Rice Award will be voted on by a national panel of sports information and media relations directors, broadcasters, writers and other dignitaries following the regular season.

#PRIMETIMEAVANT EARNS PFL DEFENSIVE WEEKLY HONORS

Alex Avant's national attention for his interception return was only a glimpse into his performance against Drake. The sophomore recorded 11 tackles and captured PFL Defensive Player of the Week honors. He becomes the third Mercer athlete to win a PFL weekly award after JT Palmer (Offense) and Josh Shutter (Special Teams) were honored by the league office following the opening week.

MERCER DUO EARNS PFL PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONORS

After leading the Mercer football team back to the field for the first time in 72 years with a dramatic victory over Reinhardt Saturday evening, the duo of sophomore JT Palmer and senior Josh Shutter were recognized with weekly honors from the Pioneer Football League. Palmer was named the league's Offensive Player of the Week, while Josh Shutter earned Co-Special Teams Player of the Week. "This is a great honor being the first Pioneer League game for us to bring home a pair of weekly awards, said head coach Bobby Lamb. "These two guys had a huge impact on the game and certainly deserve these awards."

COAST TO COAST

While the Bears will only play four road games in 2013, they will cover plenty of miles along the way, including traveling over 3,200 miles in coast-to-coast road trips to San Diego and New York. Mercer will travel just over 700 combined miles to its remaining two road games in North Carolina.

BEARS TO GET PLENTY OF HOME COOKING IN 2013

The Mercer University football team will have eight chances to play in front of its home crowd in 2013, making them one of just nine Division I FBS or FCS football teams to play eight home games. The Bears are the only FCS school in the country to play eight games at home, while Virginia, North Carolina State, Kansas State, Illinois, Indiana, Nebraska, Auburn and Texas A&M are the only FBS programs to play eight home contests in 2013. In stark contrast, three FCS teams will play eight road games in 2013, as Monmouth, Morgan State and Austin Peay will log plenty of miles to complete their 2013 slate.

MERCER PICKED 11TH IN PFL PRESEASON POLL

San Diego received five of the 12 first place votes and was picked to win the PFL crown with 111 points, edging second place Butler by a single point.

Jacksonville and Drake finished tied for third with 99 points, while Dayton rounded out the top five.

Mercer is slated to battle three of the top four teams in the preseason poll, including a road matchup with preseason favorite San Diego on Oct. 5, one of just four contests away from home for the Bears.

The PFL enters its 21st season in 2013, with the regular season title race leading to the league's first automatic qualification into the NCAA FCS Championship.

Bears Make Headlines Across the Country

Alex Avant's interception return for a touchdown to give Mercer a 17-0 lead on Drake made national headlines and earned the top play on ESPN SportsCenter's Top 10. The highlight was also featured on Yahoo Sports and garnered 30,000 views on You Tube in less than 48 hours.

#PrimeTimeAvant's Explanation of the Play

"Well we did a corner blitz and the quarterback checked the pass because he saw me blitzing so I knew I had to jump right once he threw it. So I jumped up, tipped it, it bounced off another linebacker and then the ball fell in my hands and I just tried to score. I caught it and then I went left and then remembered I was probably about to just go out of bounds and I was like I might as well go ahead and try to score. I guess somehow I ended up in the end zone."

Bobby Lamb's Analysis of the Play

"That needs to be sent to SportsCenter. That was a heck of a play. Even our team on the sideline was sitting there just looking at him thinking the play is over and were getting ready to call a play and I'm thinking we're on the 30, the 35, and all of a sudden he spins out of there and keeps running. Obviously there was a big lineman waiting down there for him but he was athletic enough to get the ball in the end zone. That was a heck of a play."

BEARS SELECT SIX TEAM CAPTAINS

The 108-member squad selected three offensive players and three defensive players to lead the team into its first season of football in 72 years. **Offensive Captains:** John Russ (QB), Caleb Brown (RB), Kirby Southard (OL) **Defensive Captains:** Tosin Aguebor (LB), Corey Lockett (LB), Kelly Brooks (DE) "In my opinion, being a captain is one of the most prestigious titles you can receive because it is voted on by your peers," said Lamb. "With a team full of underclassmen, I thought it was imperative to get as many captains as we could. All of these selections are quality young men and our leadership is in good hands for 2013."

MERCER TO BATTLE GEORGIA TECH IN 2016 SEASON OPENER

The Bears continue to build for the future, reaching an agreement to play Georgia Tech in the fall of 2016. The 12th all-time meeting between the Bears and Yellow Jackets is set for Sept. 3, 2016 at Bobby Dodd Stadium at Historic Grant Field in downtown Atlanta. Mercer will be entering its fourth season of football in 2016 and third season of play in the Southern Conference, when the Bears make the trek up Interstate 75 to renew a rivalry that dates back 121 years. "It will be a big day for us in 2016 to travel to Georgia Tech and test our team against one of the premier programs in the ACC," said head coach Bobby Lamb. "Hopefully this is a stepping stone of things to come and we can continue to add Division I FBS programs to our schedule during the course of the next 10 years or so." As one of the fixtures for football excellence in the State of Georgia and the Atlantic Coast Conference, the Yellow Jackets have captured four National Championships and made 16 consecutive bowl appearances. Georgia Tech's first football game in school history came against Mercer, a game the Bears came out on top 12-6 in 1892.

BEARS CONTINUE TRACK OF ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE

The Mercer football team continued a trend of academic success in the 2013 spring semester, registering a cumulative 3.07 Grade Point Average during the term, while 48 student-athletes surpassed a 3.0 GPA. Mercer's academic efforts fall in line with an impressive standard set during the 2012 fall semester, in which 57 student-athletes booked GPAs north of 3.0, while the team's aggregate total reflected a 3.16 GPA. "When our student-athletes step on campus they understand they represent not only Mercer football, but the established tradition of academic excellence at Mercer University," head coach Bobby Lamb said. "The statistics affirm our commitment to developing winners on and off the field."

After a 70-year hiatus Mercer University named Georgia native Bobby Lamb as its 19th head football coach in program history beginning July 1, 2011.

Born in Augusta, Ga., and raised in Commerce, Ga., Lamb joined the Mercer coaching ranks after nine successful seasons as head coach at Furman University and a 29-year overall relationship with the Paladins' football program as a player, assistant coach and head coach.

"Bobby Lamb embodies the goals and direction we set for the reinstatement of football at Mercer University," said President William D. Underwood. "His track record in recruiting and coaching young men who are serious student-athletes is well established. He brings the kind of integrity and character that will mold young men into leaders."

Lamb's Furman teams posted outstanding academic credentials. In the seven seasons since the NCAA instituted the Academic Progress Rate (APR) monitoring system – which tracks eligibility, retention and graduation – Furman's program produced the highest APR scores among Southern Conference schools. Likewise, Furman football had the SoCon's top results on the NCAA's Graduation Success Rate (GSR) with a score of 97 percent in 2009-10.

During his tenure guiding Furman's program, Lamb had a 67-40 record (.626) as its head coach. He led the Paladins to winning records in eight of his nine seasons and made four trips to the NCAA I-AA (now Football Championship Series) playoffs, reaching the quarterfinals in 2004 and the semifinals in 2005. His 2004 squad won the SoCon championship and Lamb was tabbed as the league's Coach of the Year. He also produced three runner-up, two third-place and two fourth-place SoCon finishes during his tenure. Lamb's Paladins achieved national rankings of No. 5 in 2004 and No. 3 in 2005.

Including his 16 seasons as an assistant coach – where he spent the majority of his time as the passing game coordinator and working with quarterbacks – Lamb's Furman teams compiled a composite record of 193-105-3 (.646) in 25 seasons. When you factor in Lamb's four seasons as a quarterback for the Paladins from 1982 to 1985, when Furman was 39-10-1, his aggregate won-loss record jumps to .667. In 29 seasons on the collegiate gridiron, Lamb has only been involved with three below .500 campaigns.

As a player at Furman, Lamb was a part of three SoCon championship teams and three NCAA I-AA playoff berths. As a senior, he was the SoCon Player of the Year, the NCAA I-AA passing efficiency national leader and led the Paladins to an NCAA I-AA national runner-up finish. He is also a member of Furman's Athletics Hall of Fame.

"I have been very impressed with President Underwood and Athletic Director Jim Cole and the vision and leadership they are providing at Mercer," said Lamb of his decision to come to the Macon institution. "One of the qualities that most attracted me to Mercer was their emphasis on the true student-athlete. I have spent the past 29 years at an institution with very similar expectations."

"God has provided this tremendous opportunity for me to assist in the reinstatement of football at Mercer. I look forward to leading Mercer football to the top."

Lamb is a 1982 graduate of Commerce (Ga.) High School and went on to earn his B.A. in health and exercise science from Furman in 1987. He also earned his M.Ed. degree from Furman in health and exercise science in 1992.

Lamb, who was born on Christmas Eve in 1962, is married to Allyson Acker. The couple has two children: a daughter, Sallie (20), and a son, Taylor (18).

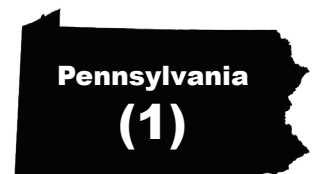

HISTORICAL TIMELINE

1892 - Mercer plays its first-ever collegiate football game versus the University of Georgia in January of 1892. It is the first-ever collegiate football game in the state of Georgia, as well as one of the first to be played in the Deep South.

1892 - In the fall of 1892, Mercer takes on Georgia Tech in the first-ever game of the Yellow Jackets' storied football history and defeats Tech 12-6 at Macon's Central City Park.

1906 - Mercer hires its first "paid" football coach: E.E. Tarr.

1912 - Mercer ties Florida 0-0 to shut out the Gators for the fifth time in as many meetings between the schools.

1925 - The new Centennial Stadium, built at a cost of \$100,000 and later called Porter Stadium, is dedicated. The stadium was located on the property now occupied by the Hilton Garden Inn near the main campus entrance.

1933 - A crowd of 8,340 at Porter Stadium shells out between \$1.10 - \$2.25 each for a Homecoming Day game ticket to see Georgia narrowly edge Mercer 13-12 in what was regarded as one of the most thrilling games played in the Bears-Bulldogs rivalry.

1937 - Mercer scores its largest margin of victory with a 77-0 win over Georgia Teachers College.

1941 - After a decision is made to disband football following the 1941 season, Mercer plays its final game: a 40-13 loss to Chattanooga.

2007-08 - President Underwood holds a series of campus forums to receive input from students, faculty and staff about the prospect of resuming competition in intercollegiate football.

2008-09 - A Football Task Force composed of Mercer trustees, faculty, staff and Mercer Athletic Foundation members is appointed by President Underwood. The task force holds several meetings throughout the year to study the feasibility of resuming competition in intercollegiate football.

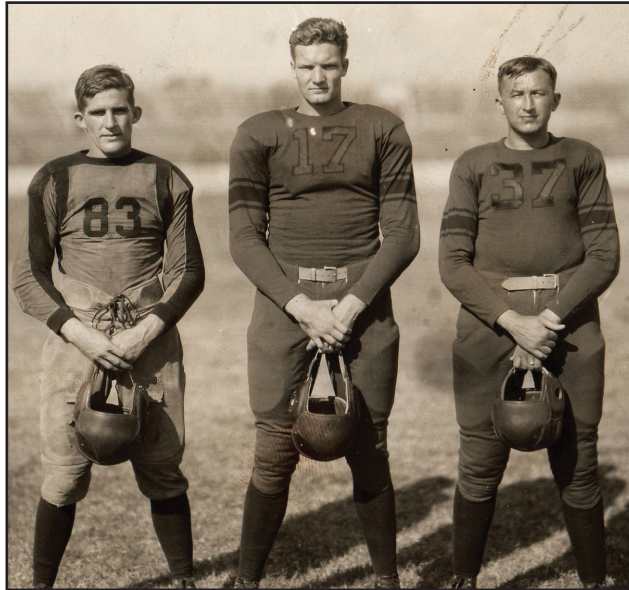
Nov. 19, 2010 - Mercer announces that its Board of Trustees has voted to reinstate football as an NCAA Division I non-scholarship intercollegiate sport beginning with the

2013 season and announces that it is seeking membership in the Pioneer Football League.

Jan. 20, 2011 - Bobby Lamb is introduced as Mercer's 19th head football coach.

June 13, 2011 - Mercer announces Pioneer Football League Conference affiliation.

Nov. 11, 2011 - Mercer breaks ground and unveils plans for its new football and lacrosse complex.



Feb. 3, 2012 - Mercer head coach Bobby Lamb receives first signing day recruits.

Feb. 27, 2012 - Mercer holds open tryout for all students on campus.

March 7, 2012 - Mercer head coach Bobby Lamb announces Grant Cain and Justin Brown as members of his coaching staff.

April 21, 2012 - Mercer announces preliminary sales of the 2013 season ticket package at the annual "Big Bear Event."

July 2, 2012 - Mercer head coach Bobby Lamb adds four more coaches to his staff in Mike Kolakowski, Casey Vogt, Mitch Doolittle and Carter Barfield.

July 5, 2012 - Synthetic turf is laid at the newly named William H. Anderson II Family Field.

Aug. 27, 2012 - Mercer holds first official practice for the first time in over 70 years as 104 players take the field.

April 13, 2013 - Over 4,000 spectators on hand for inaugural spring game.

May 30, 2013 - Mercer announces transition to scholarship football and move to the historic Southern Conference beginning in the fall of 2014.

Aug. 12, 2013 - Mercer announces it will open the 2016 season against Georgia Tech at Bobby Dodd Stadium at Historic Grant Field in downtown Atlanta, marking the first FBS opponent on the schedule.

MERCER FOOTBALL HISTORICAL NOTES

- Mercer's first football game was against the University of Georgia in Athens in January 1892. The fans who attended the game witnessed not only the first college football game in Georgia, but also one of the first in the Deep South.
- The choice of the bear as Mercer's mascot is said to have been prompted by a University of Georgia football player. In that first football game between the two schools, one of the Georgia players saw a Mercer player burst through the line of scrimmage and exclaimed, "Whence cometh that bear?"
- Mercer won its first football game in the fall of 1892 against Georgia Tech in the Yellow Jackets' first-ever college football game. The Bears defeated Tech 12-6 in a contest played at Macon's Central City Park.
- Several names synonymous with football in Georgia are Mercer alumni: Wally Butts, one of the University of Georgia's legendary head coaches; Dr. S.V. Sanford, for whom Sanford Stadium in Athens is named; Wright Bazemore, one of the most successful high school football coaches in the state; and Bill Yost, whose life story was featured in the popular movie, "Remember the Titans."
- Mercer shut out the Florida Gators each of the first five times the universities met with the Bears winning the first four (12-0, 6-0, 24-0, 13-0) and the teams tying in 1912 (0-0).
- The feature attraction for the 1925 Mercer team was dedicating the new Centennial Stadium, later called Porter Stadium, which was built at a cost of \$100,000. The stadium was located on property now occupied by a Hilton Garden Inn.
- One of the most thrilling Mercer-Georgia games was played in Macon in 1933 before 8,340 fans. Ticket prices were \$2.25, \$1.65 and \$1.10 for the Homecoming Day game that the Bulldogs narrowly won 13-12.
- The largest margin of victory for the Bears was in 1937, when they shut out Georgia Teachers College 77-0.
- Mercer's last football game was played in 1941 against Chattanooga, a 40-13 loss for the Bears.

GAME HIGHLIGHTS
