### AKRON BASKETBALL NOTES:

- Akron has won at least 21 games in 11-straight seasons under 13th-year head coach Keith Dambrot, joining the likes of Duke, Gonzaga, Kansas and Ohio State. Over the last 12 seasons, the Zips have won 278 games, most by any team in the MAC.

- The Zips finished the 2015-16 campaign as MAC Regular-Season Champions with a 26-9 overall record, including a 13-5 league mark and an undefeated 15-0 showing at James A. Rhodes Arena. Dambrot led Akron to its eighth MAC Tournament title game appearance in the last ten seasons and an unprecedented 11th-straight semifinal. The Zips' runs of consecutive title game and semifinal appearances are the longest streaks in MAC history.

- The Zips ranked No. 2 in the NCAA for 3-point FG's made per game, total 3-point FG's made, and 3-point FG's attempted. UA ranked in the NCAA's Top 100 in 20-of-32 statistical categories (346 teams), including four Top 5's: 3-pt FG per game (2nd, 11.7), 3-pt FGM (2nd, 409), 3-pt FG attempted (2nd, 1,069), and 3-pt FG defense (3rd, .294). Akron was 32nd in 3-pt FG percentage (.383).

- The Zips own a 165-23 (.878) at James A. Rhodes Arena and have been winners of 20-straight games at Rhodes Arena, dating back to the 2014-15 season.

- Since the start of the 2004-05 season, the Zips have been one of best teams in the nation when it comes to rebounding after a loss. Excluding season-ending losses, Akron is 87-32 (.731) following a loss.

**WHAT'S AHEAD**

Akron and Mercer will play for the Savannah Invitational Championship on Saturday, Nov. 26, at 7:30 p.m. at the Savannah Civic Center. Both teams have posted 3-0 records at the tournament as Mercer defeated Georgia Southern, 80-67, Radford, 58-47, and East Carolina, 70-66, while Akron defeated Radford, 88-41, Georgia Southern, 75-67, and Air Force, 84-75. Fans can follow the action on GoZips.com via Live Stats or by Zips' radio.

The Zips' radio broadcast will air on the Akron-IMG Sports Network SportsRadio 1350 AM (WARF) in Akron (flagship) with Steve French calling the action and Joe Dunn providing analysis. The pregame show starts 30 minutes prior to the contest. The free audio stream is available at SportsRadio1350.com, iHeart Radio, and TuneIn.com/Akron Zips.

**THE AKRON-MERCER SERIES**

Saturday's game marks the first meeting in program history between Akron and Mercer. However, the two teams have common opponents at the Savannah Invitational in Georgia Southern and Radford. The Zips and Bears defeated both teams. Georgia Southern held a 39-34 halftime lead over the Bears before Mercer posted a 46-28 second half ledger en route to an 80-67 win. Against Radford, Mercer won 58-47 after establishing a 27-14 first-half lead.

The Zips opened the Savannah Invitational by hosting Radford and cruising to an 88-41 victory. Akron established an early advantage and never looked back. The Zips also played host to Georgia Southern and finished with its 20th straight home victory. Akron held a 39-30 halftime advantage and held on for the eight-point win.

**SCOUTING THE BEARS**

Mercer enters the Savannah finale with a 4-1 overall record and a 3-0 start at the invitational, defeating Georgia Southern, 80-67, Radford, 58-47, and East Carolina 70-66. The Bears are led by ninth-year head coach Bob Hoffman (Oklahoma Baptist, '79), who owns a 168-114 at Mercer and 568-284 career mark, spanning 26 seasons.

The Bears own a +8.0 scoring margin, outscoring their opponents 349-309 with a 44.9 shooting percentage from the floor (123-of-274) and 35.4 effort from beyond the 3-point arc (40-of-113) with 8.0 made 3-point FG per game. Two players are scoring in double figures as Ria'n Holland leads the way with 20.8 points per game on 48.6 percent shooting (36-of-74). He is a threat from deep, knocking down 41.9 percent of his shots from beyond the arc (18-of-43) and has a team-best eight steals with 11 assists and 21 rebounds. Demetre Rivers follows with 11.8 points per game while draining 59.0 percent of his shots (23-of-39), including a 6-of-16 effort from deep.

On the glass, Mercer is led by Stephon Jelks with 5.4 boards per night with 27 total rebounds., while Desmond Ringer and Ryan Johnson closely follow with 4.8 (24) and 4.6 (23) rebounds per night, respectively.

Defensively, Mercer holds its opponents to 61.8 points per game on 35.7 percent shooting from the floor and just 29.9 percent from 3-point range. The Bears caused 61 turnovers (12.2 t/g) with 24 steals (4.8 stl/g). Mercer has a slight deficit in rebounding margin -0.2, pulling down 35.8 rebounds per game.



**The Dambrot Coaching Tree**

A key part to **Keith Dambrot's** success has come from the knowledge and expertise of his coaching staff. Comprised completely of individuals that have played for him, both at Akron and previous coaching stops, the current staff includes Zips' assistant coaches **Terry Weigand** (Tiffin, 1985-86), **Rick McFadden** (Akron, 2003-05) and **Charles Thomas** (Eastern Michigan, 1987-89), as well as director of basketball operations **Steve McNees** (Akron, 2008-11).

**Shaka Smart**, a Dambrot assistant from 2004-06, was at VCU for six seasons and led the Rams to the 2011 Final Four. Now, Smart is in his second year as head coach for Texas. **Lamont Paris** (2004-10) enters his seventh season with the Big 10 Wisconsin Badgers, while **Jeff Boals** (2006-09) left Ohio State to pursue a head coaching position at Stony Brook.

**Dambrot's Basketball Tradition**

Dambrot's blood is rich with basketball tradition. His uncle, **Irwin Dambrot**, played for the 1950 City College of New York (CCNY) squad, which is the only school to win both the NCAA Tournament and NIT in the same season. Irwin was the MVP of the NCAA Tournament that season and the No. 1 draft pick (selected seventh overall) by the New York Knicks that same year. Dambrot's father, **Sid**, starred at Duquesne during the 1952, '53 and '54 seasons. The Dukes competed in the NCAA Tournament and the NIT in '52, as well as, the NIT in the '53 and '54 campaigns.

**NCAA STATISTICAL RANKINGS...**

The Akron Zips achieved a program-best 28 NCAA RPI in 2015-16 before finishing the season with a 44 NCAA RPI and 87th on the Ken Pomeroy RPI.

The Zips ranked among the NCAA's best in several statistical categories. The Zips received 20 Top 100 ratings out of 32 categories, including four Top 5, five Top 25, and nine Top 50 ratings.

**How Hard is it to Win 20 Games?**

The Akron Zips are the only team in the MAC to have won 20-plus games in each of the last 11 seasons. In fact, only nine teams have reached 20 wins in each of the last 11 seasons. Akron, BYU, Duke, Gonzaga, Kansas, Louisville, North Carolina, Ohio State and San Diego State were the only teams on this list to crack 20 wins last season. Taking things one step further, the Zips were one of only five programs with at least 21-plus wins in each of the last 11 seasons. Akron, Duke, Gonzaga, Kansas and Ohio State were the only teams on this list to reach 21 wins last season.

On the coaching side of 20-win seasons, head coach Keith Dambrot is currently 10th among active coaches with current 20-plus game winning streaks (11). Dambrot's 11-straight 20-win seasons is the seventh-longest streak at the same program. Only one coach, Mark Few, Gonzaga (17), has posted a longer run of 20-win seasons solely at mid-major program.

**ZIPS ADVANCE TO THE SAVANNAH INVITATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP GAME**

The Akron Zips outscored Air Force 51-36 in the second half en route to an 84-75 victory at the Savannah Civic Center on Friday night. The Zips (4-1) handed the Falcons (5-1) their first loss and have won four consecutive games this season, including three straight at the Savannah Invitational. As a result, the Zips will play for the Savannah Invitational Championship tomorrow at 7:30 p.m. against Mercer.

Air Force opened the game firing on all cylinders. The Falcons knocked down four of their first six shots, including two out of three from beyond the 3-point arc for a 10-7 advantage at the first media timeout. The Falcons pushed the lead to as many as 10 points with 3:24 left in the initial half behind 11 points from Frank Toohey, shooting 4-of-8 from the floor which included a 3-of-4 effort from behind the 3-point arc.

During that span, Akron shot just 6-of-21 from the floor and 2-of-14 from deep, until freshman wing Daniel Utomi (Houston, Texas) provided a much needed spark. Utomi hit back-to-back 3-pointers to sway the game's momentum to the Zips' bench. Sophomore guard Josh Williams (Akron, Ohio) followed with a long-distance bucket, while freshman Tavian Dunn-Martin (Huntington, W.Va.) cut the Falcons' lead to three points, 35-32, with an offensive rebound and put-back.

Air Force ended the Zips' 7-0 scoring outburst with two free throws and added a layin as time expired to take a 39-33 halftime lead. During the break, 13th-year head coach Keith Dambrot rallied his troops, and the Zips were a completely different team during the final 20 minutes of play.

Senior center Isaiah Johnson (Cincinnati, Ohio) led the charge with 12 second-half points as Akron went straight to Big Dog for the first two points. Senior forward Kwan Cheatham, Jr. (Cincinnati, Ohio) followed with a triple, and the Zips' were on their way to a 19-6 run to open the half.

The run lasted seven-and-a-half minutes, as Williams buried a triple from the corner, Cheatham followed with a layup, and junior guard Noah Robotham (Las Vegas, Nev.) buried a triple at the top of the key. Next, the Zips utilized the big fella for three consecutive possessions, Johnson scored six-unanswered points, while Antino Jackson and junior wing Aaron Jackson (Gahanna, Ohio) added two points apiece from the charity stripe.

By the 12:20 mark, Akron built a 55-45 advantage before Air Force recorded its eighth point of the half. The Zips immediately regained the double-digit lead as Dunn-Martin connected from long distance. Air Force made one final attempt to regain control of the scoreboard with an 8-0 run, but the attempt was stalled by a pair of free throws from Williams, Robotham, and Antino Jackson.

Johnson led Akron's scoring efforts with 19 points on 7-of-10 shooting from the floor and a 5-of-8 showing from the free throw line. In addition, Johnson added a career-best five assists. Williams followed with 16 points, and Antino Jackson added 15 points.

**THRIVING IN A NEW ROLE**

With the loss of two starters and a third key player from the Akron's 2015-16 MAC Championship run, the Zips have inserted Isaiah Johnson and Josh Williams into the starting lineup, freeing up more minutes for junior Jimond Ivey. So far, Ivey has taken full advantage of the new role, scoring in double digits 3-of-5 games, including a career-high 15 points and a personal best 11 rebounds. In addition, he posted his first career double-double against American that included 12 points and a career-best 11 boards.

In five games, Ivey averages 21.8 minutes, 9.6 points and 6.6 rebounds per game on 58.6 percent shooting from the field. He drained 17-of-29 shots and is second on the squad with 33 rebounds, 25 defensive and eight offensive.

## BIG DOG CONTINUES TO DOMINATE THE PAINTED AREA

Last season, Isaiah Johnson was a force in the paint for the Zips, and this year, he is on pace to be even better. Big Dog has led the Zips' scoring efforts in 4-of-5 games. He is averaging a team-high 17.0 points per game while scoring in double-digits in all five contests, including a season-high 20-point performance against Georgia Southern. He posted one double-double of 14 points and 10 boards and also scored 19, 17, and 15 this season. Big Dog is shooting 66.7 percent from the floor (32-of-48), and pulled down a team-best 34 rebounds with 21 defensive boards and 13 on the offensive end. He owns a team-high 16 assists and five blocks with three steals.

## TWO ZIPS AVERAGING DOUBLE FIGURES

Two Zips are averaging double figures in scoring, while two are just a shade under a double-digit average. Senior Isaiah Johnson leads the Zips with 17.0 points per game and followed by junior Antino Jackson's 11 points a night. In addition, juniors Jimod Ivey and Noah Robotham have added 9.6 points per game.

## STREAKING ZIPS

Not only has Akron established a four-game winning streak, the Zips currently own a 20-game streak at James A. Rhodes Arena. The Zips have rattled-off three consecutive wins at Rhodes Arena over American, Radford, and Georgia Southern. The three consecutive wins at the JAR improved Akron's current home winning streak to 20 games, dating back to the 2014-15 season. Akron won the final two home games that season, and posted an unblemished 15-0 record in 2015-16 at Rhodes Arena. The Zips are 165-23 (.678) at the JAR under 13th-year head coach Keith Dambrot.

## STARTING THE SEASON OFF RIGHT

The Zips are 70-46 (.603) all-time in season openers with a 56-12 (.824) home record and 14-34 (.292) on the road. UA is 8-5 (.615) when opening the season under Dambrot, standing 5-1 (.833) at home and 3-4 (.429) on the road. In addition, the Zips own a 95-21 (.819) home opening record at Rhodes Arena and have been winners in the last 14-of-15 home opening games.

The 2015-16 Akron Zips started the season with a 3-0 winning streak and completed a 10 game winning streak. The three consecutive wins to open the season marks the best start in the Division I era of Akron men's basketball history and the 10-game streak stands as the second-best under Dambrot behind a 19-game run in 2012-13. In addition, the 13-2 start was the best opening to a season in Akron basketball's Division I era, while the Zips win over the Arkansas Razorbacks marks the fifth consecutive season the Zips posted a win over a Power Five Conference opponent.

## REBOUNDING AFTER A LOSS

Since the start of the 2004-05 season, the Zips have been one of best teams in the nation when it comes to rebounding after a loss. Excluding season-ending losses, Akron is 87-32 (.731) following a loss. In head coach **Keith Dambrot's** 13-year tenure, Akron has only posted 24 losing streaks. In fact, of those 24 losing streaks, 15 have been just two games and 18 have consisted of two or more games on the road (road/neutral site). UA has never lost more than four-straight games under Dambrot. Akron has not lost five-in-a-row since Jan. 5-19, 2002, under former head coach **Dan Hipsher**.

**MR. CHAIRMAN**

After serving three seasons on the NCAA Men's Basketball Rules Committee, Akron men's basketball head coach **Keith Dambrot** was named the new chairman of the committee, starting with the 2015-16 season. Dambrot is currently in his second season as chairman, replacing former chairman and Belmont head coach Rick Byrd, who completed his term on the rules committee in August 2015. The NCAA Men's Basketball Rules Committee is comprised of 13 coaches and administrators, who assess both current and proposed rules to promote consistency and fair play in the game. The committee meets once a year and votes on changes every other May unless there's a pressing issue about player safety.

**THE ZIPS LEBRON JAMES SHOE DEAL AND NEW LOOK**

Since June 2008, the Akron men's basketball program has been partnered with Nike under which the Zips' shoes, game uniforms, warm ups and accessories are licensed under the Nike and **LeBron James** Trademarks. The Zips are just one of two college programs in the country that are partnered with the LBJ line of Nike equipment, the other is Ohio State.

The Akron Zips men's basketball team will be sporting new uniforms in 2016-17. The new look represents a reinvigorated pride in our University, our City, and Zips Athletics. The new design for both home and away were inspired by the "Pride of the City" slogan that men's basketball will carry throughout the season. The goal is to strengthen the pride for the University of Akron within community.

The home uniforms are white with dark blue trim and accents, while the away are dark blue with white trim and accents. The "Pride of the UniverCity" uniforms display the name Akron in a prestigious old-style script font on the chest with the number(s) below. The script font and numbers are the same color as the jersey top (white/white or blue/blue) and outlined with the opposite color. The inspiration for the script writing and to use Akron on the chest stemmed from tradition and an overwhelming amount of pride for the city of Akron and its University.

The game shorts have three distinguishing marks. The right side of the shorts depicts the Zips' mascot Zippy, and her Fear the Roo head logo, while the left side dons the University's official seal. The final mark on the shorts is the notorious Z logo, which appears on the front waistband.

**AKRON DEFEATS GEORGIA SOUTHERN, 75-67, KEEPS HOME WINNING STREAK ALIVE**

The University of Akron men's basketball team defeated Georgia Southern, 75-67, to extend its home winning streak to 20 consecutive games at James A. Rhodes Arena behind the strength of perimeter shooting and defensive toughness down the stretch. Despite some early offensive struggles, the Zips found their rhythm midway through the half, shooting 48.1 percent (13-of-27) from the floor and 38.9 percent (7-of-18) from long range. Georgia Southern shot 40.7 percent (11-of-27) from the floor and a mere 27.3 percent (3-for-11) from beyond the 3-point arc.

Akron's top three scoring leaders all set season highs in points as Johnson led with 20 points and Jackson followed with 19 points, while Ivey set a new career-high with 15 points. In addition, the Zips dished-out 20 assists led by a season-best six helpers from Jackson and three each from Johnson, Ivey, and Cheatham.

For the game, Akron held a slight advantage on the glass, outrebounding Georgia Southern 35-31 with Cheatham leading the way with seven rebounds. The Zips shot 46.4 percent (26-of-56) from the floor, including a 30.6 percent (11-of-36) effort from deep.

**AKRON EXTENDS HOME STREAK TO 19 GAMES**

The University of Akron men's basketball team outscored Radford, 57-27, in the second half to pull away from the Highlanders as the Zips continue to roll at James A. Rhodes arena for its 19th straight home victory by a final score of 88-41 on Sunday night.

Twelve players touched the scoring column on the stat sheet with four Zips recording double digits in scoring, led by Isaiah Johnson's 15 points. He added a team-high seven rebounds as the Zips won the battle of the boards 36-29. Freshman wing Daniel Utomi (Houston, Texas) followed in scoring with a career-high 14 points, shooting 4-of-5 from the field, 1-of-2 from deep, and 5-of-7 from the charity stripe. Rounding out the double-digit scorers were Antino Jackson and freshman guard Tavian Dunn-Martin (Huntington, W.Va.) with 12 and 11 points, respectively.

For the game, Akron finished shooting 56.6 percent (30-of-53) from the floor, 50.0 percent (13-of-26) from behind the 3-point arc, and 71.4 percent (15-of-21) from the free throw line. The Zips caused 22 turnovers with eight steals and three blocked shots while limiting the Radford offense to 31.3 percent (15-of-48) shooting from the field and 20.0 percent (2-of-20) from long distance.

Season tickets are now on sale for the 2016-17 campaign, with ticket packages starting at \$60 for General Admission to \$810/seat for mid court.

Akron faculty and staff may purchase Upper Reserved season tickets for \$175 and Lower Reserved for \$260 plus applicable donation. The Zips also offer a family plan allowing two adults and two children season tickets for \$210.

Another option is the All-Access 10-pack available for \$100 that allows fans 10 undated vouchers which can be redeemed for 10 general admission tickets for any of Akron's ticketed sporting events.

**ZIPS ADD TWO PLAYERS IN EARLY SIGNING PERIOD**

The Akron men's basketball program added a pair of student-athletes to the 2017-18 roster during the early signing period, announced by head coach Keith Dambrot. Signing national letters of intent to play for Akron were Eric Parrish (Cypress, Texas) and Jaden Sayles (Cincinnati, Ohio).

Parrish, a 6-6, 185-pound wing, played for Cypress Springs High School in 2015-16 and will spend the 2016-17 playing for Sunrise Christian Academy in Wichita, Kan. In 30 games during his senior season, Parrish nearly averaged a double-double from the wing position, scoring 18.4 points and pulling down 8.2 rebounds per game. In addition, he added three assists, two steals, and 1.6 blocks on average per night. During his four-year high school career, Parrish eclipsed the 1,000 point scoring threshold, recording 1,132 points while earning back-to-back team MVP awards. In addition, Parrish was a two-time all-district award winner as well as a two-time academic all-district recipient.

Sayles, a 6-9, 235-pound forward, plays Sycamore High School. As a junior, Sayles led the team in scoring with 13.6 points per game while shooting at a 53.6 percent clip from the field and 71.9 percent from the charity stripe. He pulled down a team-best 4.9 rebounds per game and averaged a team-high 1.5 blocks a night. Sayles finished the season ranked sixth in scoring, third in blocked shots and 14th in rebounds for Greater Miami Conference en route to a Second-Team ALL-GMC selection.

**ZIPS SELECTED TO WIN MAC**

For the fourth consecutive year, the Akron men's basketball team was selected to win the Mid-American Conference East Division while ranking as the favorite to claim the MAC Tournament title, according to the 2016-17 MAC Preseason Men's Basketball Poll. The Zips received 15 first-place votes for 194 points, edging out Ohio, who finished second in voting with 190 points and 16 first-place votes. Buffalo (144 points, five first place vote) was picked third overall in the East followed by Kent State (116 points), Bowling Green (63 points), and Miami (49 points). Eastern Michigan is the favorite in the West Division. In addition, the Zips were selected as the favorite to claim the season finale in March. Akron received 15 votes to be crowned champions at the MAC Tournament, holding a four-vote margin over Ohio (11). Eastern Michigan earned three votes, while Buffalo and Northern Illinois each had two. Rounding out the tournament voting were Central Michigan, Kent State, and Miami with one vote apiece.

**JOHNSON NAMED TO PRESEASON ALL-MAC SQUAD**

Senior center **Isaiah Johnson** (Cincinnati, Ohio) was named to the East Division Preseason All-MAC team by the 24-member MAC News Media Panel and 12 league head coaches. In 2015-16, he played in all 35 games, making nine starts and averaging 13.6 ppg, 7.6 rpg, 1.6 apg, and 1.3 bpg. He led the Zips' offensive and rebounding efforts en route to an All-MAC First Team selection, NABC All-District First Team honor, and the MAC Sixth Man of the Year award. Furthermore, Johnson was a three-time MAC East Player of the Week recipient while being named to the MAC All-Tournament team, the South Point Classic Most Valuable Player, and collegesportsmadness.com Madness Mid-American Men's Basketball Player of the Week.

**ZIPS BASKETBALL SELECTED FOR EIGHT TELEVISION APPEARANCES**

As a result of the largest television package in Mid-American Conference history, the Akron men's basketball program enters the 2016-17 season with eight guaranteed television games on various regional and national sports networks. In addition, the Zips' current schedule allows for nine games to be selected as wildcard games for television. Six of the nine dates provide several TV opportunities that may involve a change in game dates and times and/or same date with time changes.

The MAC television package includes ESPN2, ESPNU, Fox Sports 1 (FS1), CBS Sports Network (CBSSN), American Sports Network (ASN), Buckeye Cable Sports Network (BCSN) and Time Warner Cable Sports Channel (TWCS). In addition, Akron can be seen on Fox Sports 2 (FS2) and ROOT Sports. ESPN3 broadcast are not considered when determining television appearances.

Last season, the Zips appeared in 17 televised games with an additional four games aired exclusively on ESPN3. Included in those contests were the MAC Championship (ESPN2) and National Invitation Tournament (ESPN). New to this season, CBS Sports Network agreed to air the MAC semifinal game in addition to the MAC season finale.

**UP NEXT**

The Akron Zips will return to James A. Rhodes Arena for a battle with Adrian on Wednesday, Nov. 30 at 7 p.m. Akron will look to increase its home winning streak to 21 games, while moving 13th-year head coach Keith Dambrot one step closer to becoming the all-time winningest coach in Akron basketball history.

**2016-17 TEAM NOTES**

The Zips return three starters and nine letterwinners from last season's Mid-American Conference Regular-Season Championship squad that posted a 26-9 overall record and a 13-5 mark in MAC play.

UA earned the No. 6 seed in the 2016 NIT postseason tournament. Akron's bid was the sixth in program history and fourth for 13th-year head coach Keith Dambrot (1987, 1989, 2006, 2008, 2012, 2016).

Akron tied the school record for wins in a season (26), thanks to the best start to a season in program history. The Zips won its first three games, and after two setbacks, won 10-straight contests from Nov. 27 through Jan. 8 to move to 13-2 overall. Akron recorded its second-best winning streak (10 games) under Dambrot behind a 19-game run in 2012-13. The streak helped UA receive votes in the USA Today Coaches Poll and ranked as high as No. 8 on the College Insider Mid-Major Top 25 poll while achieving a 28 NCAA RPI, lowest in school history.

The Zips ranked No. 2 in the NCAA for 3-point FG's made per game, total 3-point FG's made, and 3-point FG's attempted. UA ranked in the NCAA's Top 100 in 20-of-32 statistical categories (346 teams), including four Top 5's: 3-pt FG per game (2nd, 11.7), 3-pt FGM (2nd, 409), 3-pt FG attempted (2nd, 1,069), and 3-pt FG defense (3rd, .294). Akron was 32nd in 3-pt FG percentage (.383).

Akron set program records in 3-point FG made (409) and attempted (1,069) in a season, as well as, made (20) and attempted (43) in a game.

UA posted 21 or more wins for a 11th-straight season, joining the likes of Duke, Gonzaga, Kansas and Ohio State. Over the last 12 seasons, the Zips have won 278 games, most by any team in the MAC.

When it comes to MAC play, the Zips have been a dominate force in the league. Over the last 12 seasons, Akron has posted 141 league wins, most of any MAC program and played in eight MAC title games in the last ten years, including a MAC-record seven-straight from 2007-13.

Akron made its 11th-straight MAC Tournament Semifinal appearance in 2016, setting a new mark for the longest streak in league tournament history (since 1980) -- Miami (Ohio) 10-straight (1992-2001).

Akron owns 3-4 record against Power Five Conference opponents over the last two seasons, and has five-straight seasons with at least one win over a Power Five Conference opponent (at Mississippi State in 2011-12; vs. Penn State in 2012-13; vs. Oregon State in 2013-14; Southern California and South Carolina in 2014-15; vs. Arkansas in 2015-16)

The Zips finished the season with an unblemished 15-0 home record in 2015-16, improving to 162-23 (.876) at Rhodes Arena under Dambrot.

**2015-16 MAC CHAMPIONS**

The Zips finished the 2015-16 campaign with a 26-9 overall record, including a 13-5 league mark and an undefeated 15-0 showing at James A. Rhodes Arena. Dambrot led Akron to its eighth MAC Tournament title game appearance in the last ten seasons and an unprecedented 11th-straight semifinal. The Zips' runs of consecutive title game and semifinal appearances are the longest streaks in MAC history.

Akron earned the No. 6 seed in the 2016 National Invitation Tournament. It was Akron's sixth appearance in the NIT and fourth under Dambrot (1987, 1989, 2006, 2008, 2012, 2016). Akron tied the school record for wins in a season (26) and set program records in 3-point FG made (409) and attempted (1,069) in a season, as well as, made (20) and attempted (43) in a game.

Last year, the Zips secured the MAC Championship, No. 1 Seed in the MAC Tournament, and East Division Title on March 1, 2016 with a 91-76 win over Ohio. The Zips used a record-breaking performance from behind the 3-point arc to secure the title, knocking down 20 triples on 43 attempts, both new all-time standards. Akron captured the a regular season or tournament title in five of the last eight seasons. The Zips were regular season champs in 2012 (22-12, 13-3 MAC) and 2016 (26-9, 13-5 MAC), won the MAC Tournament in 2009 (23-13, 10-6 MAC) and 2011 (23-13, 9-7 MAC), and swept the regular-season and tournament titles in 2013 (26-7, 14-2 MAC). In addition, Akron claimed the East Division title in 2007 (26-7, 13-3 MAC). Akron tied the program's all-time record with 26 wins (1972, 2007, 2013, 2016) en route to its eighth MAC tournament title game in 10 seasons and 11th-straight semifinal appearance, both are MAC records.

Keith Dambrot's motivation for success is different than most head coaches at the Division I level. His commitment has seen the Akron basketball program grow into one of the top mid-majors in the nation. This drive doesn't stem from thoughts of career stepping stones, but from his allegiance to his hometown and alma mater.

Dambrot became the 21st head coach of Akron men's basketball on March 10, 2004. On Sept. 23, 2013, he signed a one-year contract extension to be head coach of the Zips through the 2022-23 season.

Dambrot wasted no time putting his stamp on the program and has led Akron to the postseason in nine of the last 11 seasons – participating in the NCAA Tournament in 2009, 2011 and 2013, the National Invitation Tournament in 2006, 2008, 2012, and 2016 the College Basketball Invitational (CBI) in 2010 and the CollegiateInsider.com Postseason Tournament in 2014.

His success ranks the Zips with some of the top programs in the nation. Akron is one of only five teams in the country to win at least 21 games in each of the past 11 seasons, joining the likes of Duke, Gonzaga, Kansas and Ohio State. In fact, Akron has won at least 19 games in each of Dambrot's 12 seasons, making the Zips one of 11 programs to do so since the start of the 2004-05 campaign (Duke, Gonzaga, Kansas, Louisville, Michigan State, North Carolina, Ohio State, Pittsburgh, VCU and Wisconsin).

UA leads the Mid-American Conference in overall wins since the start of the 2004-05 season (278) and is tied for 30th nationally in overall wins during that stretch.

Dambrot is one of just eight coaches to own an active streak of 11 or more consecutive seasons of 20-plus wins at the same school, and shares the sixth-longest streak of consecutive 20-win seasons with Steve Fisher (San Diego State) and Dave Rose (BYU).

Dambrot has led Akron to the MAC Tournament semifinals in 11-straight years, including eight title game appearances in the last ten seasons. The Zips' run of consecutive semifinal appearances is the longest streak in MAC history.

In his 13 seasons in charge of the program, Akron has amassed a 278-130 (.678) overall record, including a 141-61 (.698) mark in MAC play and a 162-23 (.876) tally in home games (87-14 (.861) in MAC play at home).

In 19 seasons as a collegiate head coach, he owns a 386-200 (.659) overall record. Dambrot enters the 2016-17 season in sixth place in MAC history with a .637 win percentage while coaching in the league (298-164 overall; 278-130 Akron), fourth in overall wins (298), fourth in conference wins (151) and fifth in league games winning percentage (.640, 151-85).

In 2016, Dambrot led the Zips to a 26-9 overall record and a 13-5 conference mark while capturing Akron's third Regular Season MAC Championship. UA continued its run of 11-straight seasons with 20-plus wins, while Dambrot was named 2016 MAC Coach of the Year and NABC All-District Coach of the Year.

In 2013, Dambrot was named the MAC Coach of the Year and the Red Auerbach Coach of the year, as well as a finalist for the Jim Phelan National Coach of the Year award (national COY) and the Hugh Durham Award, which recognizes the nation's top mid-major coach.

Mentoring a total of 35 All-MAC honorees, 14 MAC All-Tournament team selections, five MAC Sixth Man of the Year honors, four MAC Defensive Players of the Year, three MAC tournament MVPs and one MAC player of the year award has highlighted his time at UA.

Also during his watch, 11 players have been added to the school's 1,000-point scorers list, he coached the all-time blocked shots leader for Akron and the MAC (Zeke Marshall, 368), Akron's all-time assists leader (Dru Joyce, 503), all-time winningest player (Chris McKnight, 97 victories over a four-season span) and all-time games played leaders (Steve McNees and Nikola Cvetinovic, 141).

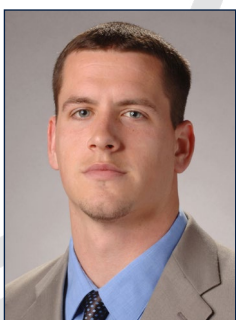

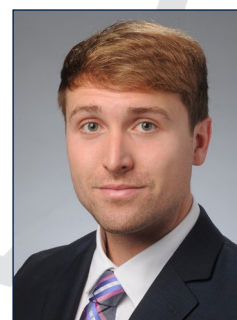

**RETURNING LETTERWINNER NOTES**

Senior forward Kwan Cheatham, Jr., started 34-of-35 games as a junior, averaging 7.2 points, 4.9 rebounds, 1.6 assists and 1.0 blocked shot per game. He posted nine double-digit scoring performances with a career-high double-double of 21 points and 12 rebounds against Ohio (March 1). He added an 18-point performance against NIU (Jan. 26) with a perfect night from the field, 5-of-5 from the floor and 4-of-4 from beyond the 3-point arc and at the charity stripe. He finished the season ranked 10th in the MAC in blocked shots. He blocked at least one shot in 21 games, including nine multi-block performances with three blocks (four times) and two blocks (five times).

Senior center Isaiah Johnson played in all 35 games, making nine starts and averaging 13.6 ppg, 7.6 rpg, 1.6 apg, and 1.3 bpg. He led the Zips' offensive and rebounding efforts and earned the MAC Sixth Man of the Year award, All-MAC First Team, and NABC All-District First Team. He was named to the MAC All-Tournament team, the South Point Classic Most Valuable Player, collegesportsmadness.com Madness Mid-American Men's Basketball Player of the Week, and was a three-time MAC East Player of the Week recipient. He recorded six double-doubles with points and rebounds, including three of the last five games. He posted double-digit scoring efforts in 25 games, 18 of the last 20, and had a stretch of 13 games-straight with 11 or more points. Johnson scored 20-plus points six times, including a career-high 24 points (twice), against South Carolina State (Dec. 30) and Kent State (Feb. 19). He ranked second in the MAC in FG percentage (.574), fourth in blocked shots (1.3, 45), seventh in rebounds (7.6, 266, and 15th in scoring (13.6).)

Junior guard Aaron Jackson appeared in 30 games, making five starts. He finished the season averaging 2.6 points and 1.4 rebounds per game. He scored in double figures three times last season, including a career high 16 points in the season home opener against Hiram (Nov. 16).

Junior guard Antino Jackson appeared in all 35 games, starting 34 games as a sophomore. He was named All-MAC Honorable Mention and was the Zips' second leading scorer, averaging 11.8 ppg, 3.5 apg, and 3.1 rpg. He finished the campaign with 25 double-digit scoring performances, including 12 in his last 16 games. Jackson set career highs in points (23, vs. Arkansas, Nov. 18), assists (8 (twice, last vs. BGSU Feb. 26), and rebounds (8 vs. Western Michigan, Jan. 8). Jackson led the team in total assists with 121 and free throw percentage (.815, 66-of-81). He ranked among the leaders in the MAC in six categories, free throw percentage (5th, .815), assists (10th, 3.5), assist to turnover ratio (11th, 1.6), 3-point FG made (13th, 1.9), steals (13th, 1.2), and scoring (26th, 11.8).

Junior guard Noah Robotham appeared in 29 games, making 28 starts. Robotham missed the first five games of the season, recovering from ACL surgery. Akron was 24-5 with his return. He finished first in assist per game (3.7, 108) and fourth in team scoring (9.7 ppg), recording double digits in 15-of-29 games. He posted a fourth-best team shooting percentage from deep (.400) and 3-pointers made (56). In the MAC, he ranked first in assist to turnover ratio (2.6) eighth in 3-point FG percentage (.400), ninth in assists (3.7), 12th in steals (1.2), and 14th in 3-point FG made (1.9, 56).

Sophomore guard Jimond Ivey appeared in 32 games and averaged 8.6 minutes, 2.6 points and 1.6 rebounds per game. He set a career highs in points (12) and rebounds (8) against Hiram (Nov. 16) and provided a spark in the Zips' home win against Kent State (March 4). Ivey scored nine points on 3-of-4 shooting (.750) from the field and free throw line.

Sophomore guard Josh Williams appeared in 34-of-35 games with four starts during his freshman campaign, averaging 6.6 ppg, 2.5 rpg, and 1.4 apg. He was named MAC Freshman of the Year and earned a spot on the 2016 MAC All-Freshman team. Williams was second on the team in 3-point FG percentage (.414) and scored in double figures seven times. He recorded three-straight games of 20+ points scored, delivering a career high 22 points in back-to-back games against Central Michigan (Feb. 6) and Northern Illinois (Feb. 13). He shot 16-of-21 (.762) from beyond the 3-point arc in that three game stretch. Williams was named MAC East Player of the Week. Williams ranked fifth in the league in 3-point FG percentage (.414).

The Zips also return two walk-on senior guards in Carlitos Anderson (5 games, 0.6 ppg, 0.6 rpg) and Mark Noble (5 games, 0.4 ppg, 0.2 rpg).

**RETURNING NON-LETTERWINNER NOTES**

Junior college transfer Craig Eubanks (Cleveland, Ohio) and redshirt freshman forward Emmanuel Olojakpoke (Houston, Texas) will make their Zips' debut this season, while redshirt freshman wing/forward Daniel Utomi (Houston, Texas) returns from an injury. In addition, walk-on Marquell McIntyre (Greensboro, N.C.) returned to the 2016-17 squad.

**NEWCOMER NOTES**

Freshman guard Tavian Dunn-Martin (Huntington, W.Va.) averaged 21.0 points and 4.0 assists per game at Huntington High School as a senior. He was named the 2015-16 Evans Award recipient, given to the state's best player. He scored a career-high 41 points and led the Highlanders to its third-straight Class AAA Championship game. Dunn-Martin won two state titles (2014 and 2015), a two-time Class AAA All-State selection (2015 and 2016) and a third-team selection in 2014.

Freshman center Michael Hughes (Liberty, Mo.) joins the Zips from Liberty North High School where he averaged 22 points and 15 rebounds as a senior. He is a three-time Suburban Middle Seven All-Conference and All-District First-Team honoree while earning District MVP as a junior and senior. He guided Liberty North to a sixth-consecutive district championship by averaging a double-double as a senior (22 ppg, 15 rpg) and a junior (14.4 ppg, 12.0 rpg). In addition, Hughes averaged 12.1 points and 8.7 rebounds per game as a sophomore.

Freshman guard Ty Dalton (Houston, Texas) joins the Akron program from the South Kent School in Kent, Conn where he helped lead the squad to the National Prep Championship. Prior to prep school, he averaged 23.0 points and 7.0 rebounds per game as a senior at Second Baptist High School in Houston. He was a two-time First Team Class AAAA All-State selection in Texas and a three-time All-District honoree.
