### ALL-TIME SERIES

• Mercer and La Salle will meet for the first time on Thursday evening.

• The Explorers will be facing a Southern Conference foe for the first time since defeating Chattanooga, 71-65, in the Dr. Pepper Classic in Tennessee on Dec. 30, 2003.

• La Salle is 4-1 all-time against current members of the SoCon, including a 3-0 record against Furman.

• The lone loss came to Western Carolina on Dec. 11, 1981 at the Cougar Classic in Utah.

• The Explorers are playing in the state of Georgia for the first time since 1988.

### NEWS & NOTES

• The La Salle men's basketball team treks to Georgia for a non-conference tilt at Mercer on Thursday evening. The contest will be aired regionally on American Sports Network.

• The Explorers are looking to build on an 84-80 victory over Florida Gulf Coast on Dec. 17.

• Redshirt junior B.J. Johnson led the way with 35 points, including 28 in the second half, as La Salle came back from a six-point deficit with 7:35 left to come away with the win.

• Senior Jordan Price was the only other player to reach double figures in scoring for the Explorers with 16 points, while also adding four rebounds and four assists.

• Junior Amar Stukes had another exemplary performance taking care of the basketball, recording six assists against just one turnover in 35 minutes of action.

• The Explorers shot 54.2 percent from the floor in the second half to help overcome FGCU going 12-for-24 from three-point range (6-11 in 2nd half).

• Redshirt junior Demetrius Henry also played a key role defensively, blocking three shots in his 26 minutes of action.

• Stukes leads the Atlantic 10 in assist-to-turnover ratio at 2.7 and is rated just outside the top 50 nationally (T-54th).

• As a team, the Explorers are averaging a league-leading 82.7 points per game with Johnson pacing the team at 19.9 per outing.

• La Salle is also tops in the A10 in field goal percentage (.478), three-point field goal percentage (.391), assist-to-turnover ratio (1.4) and is second in assists (15.8).

**DR. JOHN GIANNINI**  
**North Central '84**  
**13th season at La Salle**  
**28th season as Head Coach**

Record breaking success and consistent winning. Those two phrases can sum up the career of La Salle head coach Dr. John Giannini, who enters his 13th season at the school in 2016-17. Giannini is La Salle's all-time winningest coach in Atlantic 10 play and has produced the program's only winning A-10 records since joining the league in 1995-96. He is also the winningest coach in the University of Maine's history. When he left Rowan University, Giannini was the winningest active NCAA Division III head coach.

In 2012-13, Giannini guided the Explorers to a NCAA Tournament Sweet 16 appearance with three wins in five days and a #24 national ranking in the final USA Today/Coaches Poll. La Salle's 24 wins were the seventh most in the program's rich 82-year history and the most since 1990. The Blue and Gold knocked off three nationally-ranked teams during the 2012-13 season, including #9/9 Butler, #19/16 VCU and #12/14 Kansas State. A program-record 11 Atlantic 10 wins tied for third in the nation's seventh-best conference. Giannini was named the Big 5 Coach of the Year in 2013 after leading the Explorers to a share of the Big 5 title. In 2011-12, Giannini led La Salle to its first postseason appearance in 20 years with an appearance in the NIT. The 21 wins were the most in 22 years.

The recent back-to-back 20-win seasons, however, have not been the only success for the Explorers during Giannini's tenure. After accepting what most observers believed would be a major rebuilding job, Giannini's Explorers have finished in the top half of the Atlantic 10 five of the past nine years. This established a new level of consistent success for a program that previously had experienced no winning A-10 records since joining the highly-regarded league.

Academic success is also a major emphasis of Giannini's coaching philosophy. La Salle's Yves Mekongo was a two-time Academic All-American and 2010 NACDA I-AAA Scholar Athlete of the Year. Steve Weingarten also earned Academic All-District recognition in 2009-10. Mekongo and Weingarten were also the A-10 Student-Athletes of the Year in 2010 and 2011, respectively, and this past year current redshirt junior Amar Stukes was named Big 5 Scholar-Athlete of the Year. The team's APR (Academic Progress Rate) has improved each season and is ranked in the top 10% nationally.

Giannini is involved in many leadership activities. He has served as a member of the board of trustees at his alma mater, North Central College, and served on the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) Congress and on the NABC Committee for Recruiting Rules and Access. At Rowan University, he was a member of the faculty senate. He authored Court Sense: Winning Basketball's Mental Game, published by Human Kinetics in 2008 and published articles for academic research journals and practical coaching publications. He has also taught courses at the University of Maine and Rowan University.

Giannini was introduced as the 18th head coach in the history of Explorer men's basketball on August 23, 2004. "John Giannini has earned respect as a coach and as a person wherever he has been," said former La Salle President Brother Michael J. McGinniss, F.S.C., Ph.D. "He recognizes, and believes in, the prominent place that values and academics have at La Salle."

He came to Philadelphia after an impressive eight year run at the University of Maine where he built the Black Bears into a perennial force in the America East Conference. During his tenure, Giannini compiled the best record of any coach in UMaine history. His teams made five trips to the America East semifinals or better in his final six seasons and made appearances in the AEC's championship in game two of his last three seasons in Orono. Giannini's two 20-win campaigns are the only two on record in program history.

Giannini's knack for winning began much closer to the Philadelphia area, however, having spent seven seasons as head coach at Rowan University in nearby Glassboro, N.J. During his run as the Profs head coach, he amassed a 168-38 record and a Division III National Championship in 1996 with a team that went 28-4. He left Rowan with the best winning percentage in the nation (.814) among all active NCAA coaches. He was inducted into the Rowan Sports Hall of Fame in 2004.

Before becoming the head coach at Rowan, Giannini served on Lou Henson's staff at the University of Illinois from 1987-89. In his two seasons as a graduate assistant, the Illini made two trips to the NCAA Tournament including a Final Four appearance in 1989 with a team that went 31-5 in the regular season. He also assisted at Parkland Community College (Champaign, Ill.) and North Texas.

The Chicago, Ill. native (Fenwick High) earned his bachelor of arts degree in psychology from North Central College (Naperville, Ill.) in 1984 and his master of science degree in physical education with a specialization in sports psychology from North Texas in 1986. "Dr. John" also earned a Ph.D. in kinesiology with a specialization in sports psychology from Illinois in 1992. Giannini was a two-time all-conference player at North Central and remains sixth on the school's all-time rebounding list. He is the all-time leader in games played and his 21 rebounds in a game remain fifth in program history.

He resides in Mullica Hill, N.J. with his wife Donna and daughters Brianna and Jamie.

## SCOUTING MERCER

- Mercer stands at 5-6 overall after suffering a narrow 76-74 loss to Auburn on Dec. 18.
- The Bears led by a point with 1.4 seconds remaining when TJ Dunans hit a buzzer-beating fadeaway three-pointer to give the Eagles the victory.
- Ria'n Holland scored five points in the final 11 seconds to give Mercer the one-point lead late, and finished the game with a team-high 24 points.
- Holland leads the team in scoring at 18.3 points per game while Demetre Rivers is averaging 12.5 ppg.
- Jordan Strawberry, the son of former Major League Baseball star Darryl, is third on the team in scoring and leads the squad with 47 assists.

## JOHNSON EXPLODES FOR 35 VS. FGCU

- Redshirt junior B.J. Johnson led the Explorers to a hard-fought 84-80 win over Florida Gulf Coast on Dec. 17.
- Johnson picked up Atlantic 10 Player of the Week honors after scoring a career-high 35 points, including 28 in the second half.
- The 30-point outburst was the first time an Explorer had scored 30+ points in a game since Jordan Price had 36 against Duquesne in last year's Atlantic 10 Tournament.
- On the year, Johnson is ranked in the Atlantic 10's top 10 in scoring (19.9 ppg), field goal percentage (.537), free throw percentage (.870) and three-point shooting (.460)
- Previously, he was named the Atlantic 10's Co-Player of the Week with St. Bonaventure guard Jaylen Adams on Dec. 5.
- The award was the first for an Explorer since 2/16/15, as Jordan Price picked up the honor.

## GEORGIA ON HIS MIND

- Senior Jordan Price will see a lot of familiar faces in the stands on Thursday at Mercer.
- Price grew up less than 90 miles from Mercer's campus in Decatur, Ga., and starred for Southwest DeKalb High School from 2010-12.
- During his two years at SW DeKalb, Price led the Panthers to 46 wins and an appearance in the Class 4A state championship game.
- At La Salle, Price moved into 28th place on the school's all-time scoring list with his 16 points against FGCU on Dec. 17.
- The redshirt senior struggled from the field (5-13), but did add four assists and four rebounds as he battled foul trouble throughout.
- His 16 points give him 1,323 for his La Salle career, 33 points shy of 27th (Kurt Kanaskie, 1976-80).
- Price was projected by SportsIllustrated.com to be the fourth-leading scorer in the country in 2016-17.

## VALUING THE BALL

- The Explorers have done a tremendous job taking care of the basketball so far in 2016-17.
- On the year, La Salle has recorded 142 assists against 101 turnovers for a ratio of 1.41.
- The ratio ranks 29th in the country, and the Explorers are in a virtual tie with Kansas and USC at 1.41.
- Individually, sophomore guard Pookie Powell has 25 assists against just six turnovers (4.2 ratio) and junior guard Amar Stukes has 41 assists and 15 turnovers (2.7).
- Powell's 4.2 assist-to-turnover ratio would rank ninth nationally if he had the prerequisite number of assists per game, while Stukes is tied for 53rd in the nation in the category.

## FROM WAY DOWNTOWN

- The Explorers have used the three-point weapon to their advantage in 2016-17.
- La Salle has connected on 81 three-pointers through nine games and are converting at a .391 clip, tops in the league.
- Against Drexel on Nov. 27, La Salle went 7-for-11 from deep in the first half, then continued with a 6-for-10 performance in the second.
- The 13 three-point field goals were the most in a single game by the Explorers since hitting 13 against Saint Joseph's on Feb. 13, 2016.
- The 61.9 percent shooting was the highest percentage for the team in a game with 10 or more makes since making 10 of 16 attempts (62.5%) in a 76-64 win over Saint Joseph's on Feb. 16, 2013.

## CLE FOR THREE

- Senior Cleon Roberts has been one of the keys to La Salle's impressive shooting this year.
- After not attempting a three-pointer in the season opener at Temple, Roberts has made at least two from deep in six of the nine games this year.
- Against Drexel, Roberts matched a career high with six three-pointers and scored 22 points in an 89-78 win.
- Roberts hit his first six three's against Drexel, extending his streak to 10 straight makes.
- On the year, Roberts is hitting 61.3 percent (19-31) from deep to lead the A10 and would lead the country if he met the minimum requirements of makes per game.
- The Miami native also scored his 1,000th collegiate point (including Georgia Southern) with his first three-point make in the first half.



## CANNON HAS JERSEY RETIRED

- La Salle retired the famed No. 20 jersey of Larry Cannon in a ceremony at the game against Villanova on Dec. 6.
- A second team All-American as a senior in 1968-69, Cannon led the Explorers to a 23-1 record and a No. 2 final ranking behind national champion UCLA and future Hall of Famer Lew Alcindor (Kareem Abdul-Jabbar).
- Despite playing just three seasons in an era without a shot clock, the local product from Lincoln High School scored 1,430 points to rank fourth upon graduation and led the team in assists as both a junior and senior.
- A three-time First Team All-Big 5 selection, Cannon was drafted fifth overall by the Chicago Bulls in the 1969 National Basketball Association (NBA) Draft and was also a first-round selection of the Miami Floridians of the American Basketball Association (ABA).
- In 1973, Cannon became the first La Salle men's basketball player to be enshrined into the Big 5 Hall of Fame, and was later inducted into La Salle's Hall of Athletes in 1977.

## POOKIE SCORES CAREER HIGH VS. 'NOVA

- Redshirt sophomore Pookie Powell put together his best scoring performance of the season against No. 1 Villanova on Tuesday.
- Powell shot 10-of-17 from the field, including 7-for-12 in the second half en route to 27 points.
- His step-back three with 2:22 remaining cut a 10-point deficit to seven and his layup later in the half pulled the Explorers to within 79-75.
- Powell has been extremely efficient with the basketball all season and has a 4.2:1 assist-to-turnover ratio to rank 9th nationally.

## FAMILY TIES FOR JOHNSON

- After spending two seasons in upstate N.Y. at Syracuse, redshirt junior B.J. Johnson returns home to play in front of family and friends in his native Philadelphia this year.
- Johnson also joins a program that his father, Bobby, was a part of from 1986-90.
- The elder Johnson scored 878 career points and helped the Explorers to three NCAA Tournament appearances.
- Johnson played at Lower Merion School and helped the Aces to a Class AAAA state championship as a senior.
- In his final high school game, he had 22 points and 11 rebounds to snap Chester's string of 78 consecutive wins over in-state opponents.

## SIMMONS HONORED

- La Salle's Lionel Simmons was inducted into the National Collegiate Basketball Hall of Fame on Nov. 18.
- The Naismith, Wooden, AP and NABC National College Player of the Year in 1990, as well as a consensus first-team All-American, Simmons became the only player in NCAA history to score more than 3,000 points and notch more than 1,100 rebounds.

- While leading the Explorers to three straight NCAA Tournament appearances (1988-90) and earning three MAAC Player of the Year awards, he set the NCAA record for most consecutive games with double-figure scoring (115).
- Joining Simmons in the National Collegiate Basketball Hall of Fame Class of 2016 were former DePaul standout Mark Aguirre, Kansas State's Bob Boozer, Illinois State alum and current NBA broadcaster Doug Collins, UCLA alum Jamaal Wilkes, Georgia standout Dominique Wilkins and former coaches Hugh Durham and Mike Montgomery.

## GOOD WORK BY AMAR

- Redshirt junior Amar Stukes was named a nominee for the 2017 Allstate NABC Good Works Team, it was announced on Wednesday.
- This esteemed award honors an outstanding group of student-athletes who represent the sport's finest in the areas of community service and leadership among their peers.
- In addition to leading the Explorers in assists this season on the court, Stukes has excelled in the classroom and in the community.
- He was named 2016 Big 5 Scholar Athlete of the Year, maintains a 3.35 GPA as an accounting major and is on pace to graduate in May.
- Additionally, Stukes has volunteered his time to feed the homeless at Sunday Breakfast Rescue Mission in Philadelphia and has participated in teamwork discussions with third graders in Philadelphia public schools.
- A total of 181 men's basketball players were nominated for the award nationally.

## NEW EXPLORERS FOR 2017-18

- Head coach Dr. John Giannini announced the signing of three student-athletes to National Letters of Intent on Monday.
- Miles Brookins (Cypress, Calif.), Jamir Moultrie (Bowie, Md.) and Dajour Joseph (Fort Lauderdale, Fla.) are set to join the Explorers in the fall of 2017.
- Brookins is a 6-10 forward/center who plays his high school basketball at Mater Dei High School in Santa Ana, Calif. Brookins helped the Monarchs to a 27-5 mark as a junior and a No. 21 ranking nationally according to the USA Today Super 25 Boys Basketball Rankings.
- Moultrie is a 6-1 guard from Maryland who is a four-star recruit and the 11th-best player in the state according to ESPN.com. Last season at Bishop McNamara, Moultrie scored 18.6 points per game and was named Third Team All-Met by the Washington Post.
- Joseph is a 6-6 wing that currently attends Combine Academy in Charlotte, N.C. Last season at Boyd Anderson in Florida, Joseph missed all but four games due to injury.

## RESTED AND READY TO GO

- Redshirt juniors B.J. Johnson (Syracuse) and Demetrius Henry (South Carolina), along with redshirt sophomore Pookie Powell (Memphis) were able to practice with their teammates all

of last season and are cleared to play their first game with the Explorers on Friday.

- Henry started 48 contests for the Gamecocks over two seasons, registering 12 points and grabbing eight rebounds against Tennessee.
- The 6-7 Johnson played in 25 contests in 2014-15 with the Orange, and scored a team-high 19 points in a road win at No. 9 Notre Dame.
- Powell was a member of Memphis' squad for one season, starting 11 games in the backcourt as a freshman and ranking second on the team in assists.

## PATRIOT WEEK AT GOLA

- La Salle took on two of the better teams in the Patriot League over a four-day stretch from Nov. 30 - Dec. 3 and came away with two wins.
- Against preseason favorite Lehigh, senior Jordan Price had 26 points to lead the Explorers to an 89-81 win.
- Three days later, La Salle used an impressive defensive performance in the second half against Bucknell.
- The Bison shot just 39.1 percent from the field after intermission as the Explorers ran away with an 83-73 win.

## COMEBACK FALLS JUST SHORT AT TEMPLE

- Playing against a Big 5 opponent to start the season for the first time in program history, La Salle forced overtime against Temple before falling by a score of 97-92 on Nov. 11.
- The contest was the first overtime game against a Big 5 team since the Explorers edged Villanova, 77-74, on Nov. 25, 2012.
- Senior Jordan Price helped La Salle erase a 10-point deficit, hitting a 3 from 30 feet with less than 10 seconds remaining to force overtime.

## GETTING IT DONE IN THE CLASSROOM

- For the second consecutive season, a La Salle men's basketball student-athlete has won top academic honors from the Big 5.
- Redshirt junior Amar Stukes was named Big 5 Scholar-Athlete of the Year, joining teammate Hank Davis as a member of the exclusive club.
- An accounting major, Stukes maintains a 3.35 GPA and is on pace to graduate in the spring with his bachelor's degree.
- On the court, Stukes started 28 games in the backcourt, ranking third in the A-10 in assist to turnover ratio (2.4:1).

## WHY ARE WE THE EXPLORERS?

- La Salle University's nickname - the Explorers - was announced by the Collegian in March 1932 as the winning entry to a student contest.
- However, in the fall of 1931, a Baltimore sportswriter covering the La Salle/St. John's (Md.) football game erroneously alluded to La Salle as being named for French explorer La Salle, not St. John Baptist de La Salle.
- Were the two events related? We'll never know for sure.

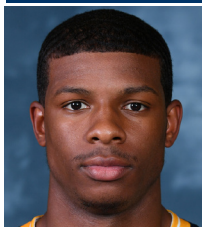
