TOP STORYLINES

LAST TIME OUT

- Wofford is coming off of a 76-72 loss at Georgia Tech Dec. 22. Eric Garcia led the Terriers, tying his career high with 23 points.
- Mercer is coming off of a 80-76 win at Kennesaw State Dec. 28th.

MOVING ON UP

- With Wofford's win over Coastal Carolina on Dec. 19, head coach Mike Young recorded his 237th win at Wofford. The win moved him ahead of current Wofford athletic director and former head coach Richard Johnson for second most wins in program history. Gene Alexander has the most all-time with 283 wins.
- Young also currently sits in fourth place in wins by a coach in the Southern Conference with 237 wins. He is six wins from tying Mack McCarthy (Chattanooga) and Burton Shipley (Maryland) who are tied for the second most wins.

PARTIAL TO BENJAMIN JOHNSON ARENA

- The Terriers are a perfect 4-0 in games played at Wofford's Benjamin Johnson Arena. Wofford is averaging 102 points in games played in Benjamin Johnson Arena, while holding opponents to 71.5 points in home contests. However, the Terriers are averaging only 67.8 points per game in the five road matchups at LSU, Colorado, TCU, Coastal Carolina and Georgia Tech. The 75 points Wofford scored in the win at Coastal Carolina was the most points scored away from the BenJo this season. The Terriers haven't scored below 76 points at home and have scored over 100 (117 vs. Allen, 116 vs. UVA Wise) twice.

GARCIA DISHING IT OUT

- Senior point guard Eric Garcia is averaging 5.2 assists per game, second among Southern Conference players. Garcia had a season high 10 assists against Mars Hill, one shy of his career high. Garcia recorded his first career double-double with that performance. In Wofford's last eight outings, Garcia boasts 53 assists to just 9 turnovers. His 4.3 assist to turnover ratio is first among all SoCon players and fifth in the entire NCAA. Garcia currently sits fifth in the Wofford records books with 379 career assists.

MAGEE BEING MAGEE

- Fletcher Magee finished in double digits in all 13 games this season. Magee averages a team high 16.3 points per game. His season high (27) came in Wofford's game at Coastal Carolina. Entering the game at GT where the sophomore scored just 12 points, Magee was averaging 21.75 PPG in the previous four contests.

PRESENCE IN THE LEAGUE

- Wofford leads the SoCon teams in three point percentage (42.4%) and is second in three pointers made (9.8/game).
- Wofford is tied for second in the SoCon with 17.5 assists per game, but is tops in the league with 1.4 assist/turnover ratio.
- Ryan Sawvell is fifth in field goal percentage (.579) while Eric Garcia is second in assists per game (5.2). His 4.1 assist to turnover ratio is the best in the league.
- Fletcher Magee's 16.3 PPG is fifth best of all SoCon players.
- Magee is tied for first among SoCon players with 3.2 three-pointers a game.

LAST TIME OUT

Georgia Tech 76 - Wofford 72

ATLANTA, GA. – Eric Garcia tied a career high with 23 points and Cameron Jackson recorded his first career double-double, but the Terriers fell just short against Georgia Tech, falling 76-72 on Thursday night in McCamish Pavilion. With the loss, the Terriers fall to 5-8 while Georgia Tech improve to 7-4.

Garcia's 23 points was a game high and comes after Garcia's 23 point performance on Monday at Coastal Carolina. The senior point guard went 7-10 from the field and 6-9 beyond the arc. The six made three's is a career high for the Aurora, Colo. native. Garcia also had six assists to just one turnover. Nathan Hoover finished with 17 points as he went 3-8 from beyond the arc and a perfect 6-6 from the line. Cameron Jackson earned his first career double-double as the sophomore finished with 10 points and a career high 11 rebounds.

"We just couldn't make the big shot, and that's something we normally do pretty well," said head coach Mike Young. "Georgia Tech had something to do with that. They went zone at the under four media timeout and that was a good move. That bothered us. We had some good cracks at it but that's the way things roll sometimes."

Both teams started off hot and were tied 9-9 at the first media timeout. Fletcher Magee had seven of Wofford's nine points at the media break. Wofford took a 23-20 lead and forced Georgia Tech coach Josh Pastner to call a timeout. The timeout worked as Georgia Tech went on a 9-0 run to take a 29-23 lead and force Wofford to call a timeout of its own. Wofford scored the next five to get it back within a point but the Yellow Jackets quickly scored six points to stretch the lead back out. Georgia Tech took a 38-30 lead into the locker room.

Georgia Tech scored first to start the second half and stretched the lead to 10, its largest lead of the contest. Down 40-30, Wofford went on a 9-0 run to cut the lead to one. The teams swapped baskets for the rest of the contest and though Wofford made it interesting, Georgia Tech never trailed. With 57 seconds to go in the game, Georgia Tech led 70-64 but Fletcher Magee sunk a three to make it a three point game. Quinton Stephens went to the line and made two free throws to extend the lead back to five points with 22 seconds to go.

With five seconds remaining Eric Garcia got fouled on a three point attempt to make things interesting. Garcia sunk all three to cut the lead back to two. Josh Heath sunk two free throws for Georgia Tech with five seconds to go to give the Yellow Jackets a four point lead. Cameron Jackson tipped in a missed three by Garcia with one second to go but Heath again knocked down two free throws with 0.1 seconds on the clock to help Georgia Tech hold on for the win.

Georgia Tech had five players finish in double figures capped off by 19 from senior Ben Lammers.

After shooting 33.3% from the field in the first half, Wofford shot 46.7% in the second half to finish with a percentage of 39.7% on the night. Georgia Tech shot 51.9% in the contest. Georgia Tech finished with 38 points in the paint while Wofford scored 22 and Georgia Tech outscored Wofford in fast break points 14-0. Wofford, however, outscored the Yellow Jackets 23-14 in points off the bench and 15-6 on second chance points. Both teams scored 14 points off turnovers.

LAST TIME AGAINST MERCER

Wofford 79 - Mercer 70

SPARTANBURG, S.C. – The last time Wofford and Mercer met in Spartanburg, Justin Gordon hit the game-winning 3-pointer in the final minute to lift the Terriers to a grueling 49-46 victory.

Once again, Gordon was the difference. The senior from Charlotte connected on 11-of-12 attempts on his way to a career-high 25 points, leading Wofford over Mercer, 79-70, Thursday night in Southern Conference men's basketball action at Benjamin Johnson Arena.

The Terriers shot 60 percent to build a 41-27 halftime lead, Gordon was 6-for-7 in the opening 20 minutes and did not slow down, connecting on all five of his second-half attempts.

Wofford (13-13, 9-4 SoCon) wound up needing every bit of it as Mercer (18-8, 8-5 SoCon) came all the way back to within a single point, 57-56, with just over 10 minutes remaining. Demetre Rivers was the catalyst, scoring 17 second-half points on his way to a team-high 22.

The Terriers responded with the next seven points to rebuild an eight-point lead. With Mercer hanging around down the stretch, Gordon put all doubt to rest with his 11th and final bucket of the night. It gave the Terriers a double-digit lead with only a minute to play.

The win gave Wofford sole possession of fourth place in the Southern Conference standings. The Terriers gained a game on first-place Chattanooga (11-2 SoCon), who lost to Western Carolina in Cullowhee, N.C. Wofford is just a half-game back of both ETSU (9-3 SoCon) and Furman (10-4 SoCon) for second.

The Terriers ended the night shooting 55.8 percent (29-52), outshooting Mercer who, despite a 52-percent second half, ended the game at 43.3 percent (26-60). Wofford also did what it had to do on the glass against a team that came into the night ranked No. 7 in the country with a +10.5 rebounding margin. The Terriers matched Mercer with 32 rebounds apiece. Senior C.J. Neumann grabbed a team-high seven.

Freshman Fletcher Magee scored 21 points and was 4-for-8 from 3-point range. Senior Spencer Collins scored 13 points and was 3-of-6 from downtown. Wofford ended the game 47.4 percent (9-19) from beyond the arc and held the Bears to 33.3 percent (5-15).

Mercer's Ethan Stair scored 15 points and Phillip Leonard had a dozen to join Rivers in double figures. Stephon Jelks grabbed a game-high 12 rebounds.

The Terriers scored first and did not trail for a single second all night. After setting an NCAA record with an 81-percent showing from 3-point range in Monday night's win over VMI, Wofford came out and hit its first five triples. Magee was good for three of them and Wofford raced out to a 23-9 lead. Wofford wound up shooting 6-of-8 from distance in the first half and led by as many as 15 points. A 3-pointer from Ryan Sawvell right at the end of the half made it a 14-point game at the intermission.

There were no signs of slowing down to begin the second half. The Terriers connected on their first four shot attempts, including 3-pointers by Garcia, Magee and Collins. It made Wofford 9-for-11 from range. However, Mercer kept pace and then some. The Bears scored on each of their first seven possessions and opened the half shooting 7-of-8 from the floor. Jordan Strawberry brought the game to single digits and Stair closed out an 8-0 run to make it a 52-45 game just over 5 minutes into the period.

It didn't take long for the Bears to go on another run and really make things interesting. A 3-pointer by Rivers, layup by Stair and two free throws from Lawrence Brown contributed to another 8-0 run, cutting Wofford's 15-point lead to 57-56.

The Terriers never gave it up. Magee raced down the floor for a quick bucket and converted a 3-point play to bump Wofford's lead back to four. Two free throws by Collins and a crafty layup from Neumann forced Mercer to call time facing an eight-point deficit.

Wofford's lead was never in much danger the rest of the night. Stair made it a 5-point game in the final 5 minutes, but the Terriers locked down and scored eight of the next 10 to put the game out of reach.

Now in his 15th season at the helm, Young is 236-216 (.522), including 136-109 (.555) in SoCon play ... He is just the third coach in program history to win 200 games behind current Director of Athletics **Richard Johnson** (236-230) and all-time wins leader **Gene Alexander** (283-265) ... Young became the first head coach in Wofford's Division I era (1995-96) to win 200 games when the Terriers defeated Chattanooga, 68-64, on January 5, 2015. In the 2015-16 season alone, Young jumped four spots in the rankings.

WOFFORD PICKED THIRD IN PRESEASON POLL

• At Southern Conference Basketball Media Day, Wofford was selected by both the coaches and media to finish third ... The Chattanooga Mocs have been tabbed as the favorite for the second straight season. Chattanooga received eight first place votes and 80 points. ETSU was slotted second (74 points) and received two first-place votes. Wofford edges Mercer (55) for third place with 57 points. Fletcher Magee, the 2015-16 Freshman of the Year was named to the Preseason All-Southern Conference team. Magee led the nation in free throw percentage at 92.5% and was third in the nation in three point field goal percentage at 47.9%. He led all Southern Conference freshmen in scoring, three point percentage, three pointers made and free throw shooting. Magee started 22 of 33 games played with 443 points scored (13.8 ppg), which was second on the team. He scored in double figures in 21 games.

UNSTOPPABLE IN THE BENJO

• Over the last seven seasons, the Terriers are 72-17 (.809) on their home floor of Benjamin Johnson Arena ... The Terriers hold the best home record since 2009-10 among all Southern Conference teams ... Wofford finished the 2015-16 regular season 11-2 at home, marking the fourth time in the last seven years they have won 10 or more at the BenJo ... Wofford finished the 2014-15 season 13-1 at the BenJo, setting a new program record for home wins in a season ... The previous record was 12, which happened in both the 1993-94 season (12-2) and 1991-92 season (12-0) ... The 2014-15 season also saw a new total attendance record at the BenJo of 27,030 .. The previous single-season record was 25,679 from 2001-02 ... Since the building opened in 1981, the Terriers are 323-129 (.714) at home.

2016-17 WOFFORD MEN'S BASKETBALL NOTES

THE SOCON OPENER

- This game kicks off Wofford's 20th season of Southern Conference basketball. The Terriers joined the league for the 1997-98 campaign and hold an overall record of 10-9 in league openers
- Wofford has won its last three SoCon openers, defeating UNCG last season 87-76 and Samford in Birmingham, Ala., in both 2014 and 2015.
- This is the second consecutive year the Terriers open SoCon play at home. This season marks the 10th time Wofford opened the conference season at home. The Terriers are 5-4 in the previous nine home SoCon openers.
- This is the first time Wofford has squared off with Mercer in the conference opener.

HOW WOFFORD COMPARES

- The Terriers are shooting 42.4% from three point range, fifth best in the NCAA.
- Wofford's 17.5 assists per game is 28th in the country.
- 1.39 assist to turnover ratio is 33rd among NCAA teams.
- Wofford is shooting 47.5% from the field, 55th best in the country.

MONEY FROM THE LINE

- The Terriers shot 91.7% (11-12) from the free throw line against Georgia Tech. That was the first time Wofford shot 90% or better in a contest in almost two years. The Terriers shot 92.3% (12-13) against The Citadel on Jan. 15, 2015.

GARCIA GETTING HOT

- Senior point guard Eric Garcia has three 20+ point games in his career, with two coming in the last two contests. Garcia set a new career high scoring 23 points against Coastal Carolina on Dec. 19. Garcia followed that performance up with another 23 point game at Georgia Tech three days later. Garcia set a career record against Georgia Tech in both three pointers made and three point attempts with six and nine, respectively. The only other time the senior has scored more than 20 points was at Mercer in Jan. of 2016 when he scored 21 points. Therefore, all three of his 20+ point games have come on the road.

HOOVER CONTRIBUTING OFF THE BENCH

- Freshman guard Nathan Hoover is averaging 7.5 points per game, fifth among Wofford players. Hoover scored 17 against Georgia Tech as he went 4-12 from the field and 3-8 from beyond the arc. Hoover also set a career high with six made field goals as he went a perfect 6-6 from the line.

458 STRAIGHT THREES

- Wofford has made a 3-point field goal in 458 consecutive games. The Terriers made it 400 straight at home over ETSU (Jan. 24, 2015). Wofford was last shutout Feb. 2, 2002 against VMI (0-4).

SEASON OF FIRSTS

- Wofford opened the season at LSU in the first meeting between the two programs. The Terriers matched up with Vermont in the Gulf Coast Showcase, another first time meeting. TCU was the third first time meeting for Wofford when the two met in Fort Worth on Dec. 10. Wofford fell in all three contests, losing at LSU 91-69, against Vermont 60-59 and at TCU 72-63.
- Wofford played six teams for the first time in program history last season, which included Maryland Eastern Shore (Nov. 21), Columbia (Nov. 24), Kentucky Christian (Dec. 3), Coastal Carolina (Dec. 14), Austin Peay (Dec. 22) and Harvard (Dec. 31) ... The Terriers went 2-4 in those games, defeating Maryland Eastern Shore and Kentucky Christian, while falling to Columbia, Coastal Carolina, Austin Peay and Harvard.

WINS AGAINST POWER CONFERENCES

- Wofford went 0-4 in games against Power Conference schools this season, falling at LSU, at Colorado, at TCU and at Georgia Tech. The Terriers last picked up a win over a Power 5 in the 2014-15 season. However, since Mike Young took over as head coach in 2002, the Terriers have come up with numerous wins over schools from power conferences ... These wins include Virginia Tech (2002), Auburn (2004), Cincinnati (2006), Purdue (2007), Georgia (2009), South Carolina (2009), Wake Forest (2012), Xavier (2012) and on Dec. 14, 2014 at NC State, 55-54. The win over NC State in 2014 was also the Terriers' last win over an ACC opponent.

MAGEE NAMED FRESHMAN OF THE YEAR 2015-16

- Freshman Fletcher Magee was named Southern Conference Freshman of the Year when the league office announced its postseason awards on Tuesday ... Magee leads the country in free throw percentage (92.2%) and is fourth in the country in 3-point field goal percentage (47.5%) ... He led all SoCon freshmen through the regular season in scoring (13.5 ppg), 3-point percentage (47.5%), free throw percentage (92.2%), 3-pointers made (85) and 3-pointers made per game (2.7) ... In Southern Conference games, Magee topped the league in 3-point shooting (51.9%) and free throw shooting (93.2%) ... He also led all freshmen in league games in 3-pointers made per game (3.1) and scoring (15.1 ppg) ... Magee reached double figures 21 times ...

JERRY RICHARDSON INDOOR STADIUM

- Wofford College announced in fall of 2014 its plans to build the Jerry Richardson Indoor Stadium to house a new basketball/volleyball arena, locker rooms and other facilities ... The facility will be adjacent to the north end of Gibbs Stadium, where the Terriers play football ... Wofford alumnus and trustee **Jerry Richardson** '59 (Owner/Founder of the Carolina Panthers) provided the gift to fund the 92,000-square-foot facility that will include a 3,400-seat basketball arena and a 500-seat volleyball competition venue ... The facility will replace Benjamin Johnson Arena, which will continue to be used as a first-rate facility for intramural and campus recreational activities ... Construction on the new facility begins in the fall of 2015 with the opening date slated for September 2017 ... A groundbreaking ceremony for Jerry Richardson Indoor Stadium was held Tuesday, October 20, 2015 and a Topping Out Ceremony was held in October of 2016.

LOOKING AHEAD

- Wofford signed Storm Murphy and Keva Aluma to the 2017 class. Both signed NLI's in November.
- Storm Murphy is a 5-11 guard from Middleton, Wisconsin where he has been a three year letter winner in basketball at Middleton High School, playing under coach Kevin Bavery. During his junior season, Murphy, a team captain, led his team to the region finals, averaging 18.4 points per game and 4.5 assists per game. For his outstanding efforts, he was named First Team All-Conference and was an honorable mention All-State selection. He was recognized as his team's MVP for his efforts. Murphy was also named honorable mention all-conference in his sophomore season. In just two season of play, he has totaled over 600 points and led his team to a 36-12 record. Outside of basketball, Murphy competed on the volleyball team in his freshman year. Storm played on the summer circuit for EYBL Mac Irvin Fire under Mike Irvin.
- Keva Aluma is a 6-8 forward from Salisbury, Maryland. He has been a three year letter winner at Stephen Decatur High School, playing under coach BJ Johnson. In his junior season, Aluma averaged a double-double, scoring 14 points and pulling in 12 rebounds per game, while also adding five assists. Aluma was rewarded by being named to the First Team All-Bayside Conference and the All-Region team. As a sophomore, he was named honorable mention All-Bayside Conference and All-Region after averaging 10 rebounds per game. Over his three seasons, he has helped his team to a 62-22 overall record, leading his team to the state 3A championship game. Aluma also played soccer in high school, scoring six goals to go with three assists in his freshman through junior seasons. Keva played on the summer circuit with Uncommon Bulls under Duval Simmonds.

GOLD ACADEMIC STANDARD

While getting the job done on the court, the Terriers have also been excelling in the classroom ... In the latest NCAA Graduation Success Rate report released in November, Wofford had nine of 14 teams post a score of 100. Among Southern Conference institutions, Samford had ten teams score a 100, followed by Wofford with nine and Furman with six. Ten Wofford teams ranked first or tied for first in the Southern Conference.

SMALL WORLD

- Wofford is currently the third-smallest school in NCAA Division I with an enrollment of 1,650 students ... The smallest school is Presbyterian College at 1,300 ... Fellow Southern Conference member VMI is the second-smallest at 1,559.

MIKE YOUNG

HEAD COACH • 15TH SEASON
28TH SEASON OVERALL
EMORY AND HENRY '86

Mike Young enters his 15th season as head coach and 28th season on the Wofford men's basketball staff in 2016-17. He has built the Wofford College men's basketball program into a Southern Conference powerhouse and NCAA Tournament fixture.

With Southern Conference Tournament Championships in 2010, 2011, 2014 and 2015, Wofford is one of 43 programs nationally to have reached the NCAA Tournament at least four times in the six-year span from 2010-15. The Terriers are also one of just four programs to win their conference tournament in four of those six seasons. Young's teams have totaled five postseason appearances and four 20-win campaigns in that span.

In his 14-year head coaching career at Wofford, Young boasts a record of 232-209 (.526), including 136-109 (.555) in Southern Conference play. Young's 232 wins rank fourth in Southern Conference history, as well as third in school history. Young, current Director of Athletics Richard Johnson (236) and the late Gene Alexander (283) are the only coaches in Wofford history to record over 200 wins.

A three-time SoCon Coach of the Year (2010, 2014, 2015), Young has also received national recognition as the Hugh Durham Mid-Major Coach of the Year by Collegemnsider.com. During his distinguished tenure, Young has seen many Terriers go on to play professionally. He has coached Olympian Mike Lenzy, All-American Noah Dahlman, and Academic All-American Brad Loesing. Through Young's head-coaching tenure, Wofford has accumulated 13 All-Southern Conference selections by the coaches and another 25 from the media.

Under Young's leadership, the Terriers' resume includes impressive non-conference wins over the likes of Auburn, Cincinnati, Clemson, Georgia, North Carolina State, Purdue, South Carolina, Virginia Tech, Xavier and Wake Forest. Young believes in playing the best competition. A recent Wofford non-conference schedule was ranked as the most difficult in the nation by the RPI and Sagarin Ratings.

The success Young has achieved on the court has complemented his emphasis on academics. Young's program has a 100-percent graduation rate for student-athletes who have completed their eligibility at Wofford.

One of the defining characteristics of Young's program is the family atmosphere, evidenced by current assistant coaches Tim Johnson and Kevin Giltner both of whom were the Terrier uniform. Director of Basketball Operations, Drew Gibson, is also a former Wofford student-athlete. Young has seen a total of six players remain in the program, after their playing days, as members of his staff.

The last seven seasons have seen Wofford emerge as a dominant program in the Southern Conference. This 2014-15 campaign was the best yet. The Terriers went 28-7 overall, 16-2 SoCon, en route to an outright Southern Conference Regular Season Championship, fourth SoCon Tournament Championship and fourth NCAA Tournament appearance. New program records for wins and conference wins were set, with a schedule that ranked 26th in the country in non-conference strength. The non-conference slate saw the Terriers make trips to Stanford, as well as three 2015 NCAA Sweet 16 teams in West Virginia, Duke and NC State. Wofford took a 55-54 win over the Wolfpack on December 14, 2014, which was NC State's first loss in their historic home of Reynolds Coliseum since the 1999 NIT. The Terriers won eight straight games en route to the SoCon Tournament title, including victories in 14 of their last 15 games. Young was named SoCon Coach of the Year for a third time and saw senior Karl Cochran named SoCon Player of the Year. Senior Lee Skinner was also an all-conference selection and named SoCon Tournament Most Outstanding Player. Wofford earned its highest seed in school history in the 2015 NCAA Tournament, going to Jacksonville, Florida as the No. 12 seed in the West Region to take on No. 5 seed Arkansas. The Terriers led 28-27 at the half, outbounded Arkansas 37-35 and led for over half the game before the Razorbacks edged out the Terriers, 56-53. In the season's final RPI posted by the NCAA, the Terriers checked in at No. 49.

Young's first postseason team, in 2009-10, tied a school record with a 13-game winning streak. It was part of a stretch that saw the Terriers win 22 of 24 games en route to what was then a school-record 26 victories, including a 15-3 mark in league play. The Terriers won the SoCon South Division title and the tournament championship for the first time. Wofford came back the next season with a share of the SoCon South Division title and another conference tournament championship.

Young's time at Wofford has spanned four decades and covered the Terriers moving from NCAA Division II to Division I Independent in 1995-96 and to the Southern Conference in 1997-98. He was promoted to associate head coach in August 1998. Young has been on the Wofford bench for 798 contests over the past 27 seasons.

Prior to assuming the head coaching reins at Wofford, Young was an assistant coach to current athletics director Richard Johnson. His impact as a head coach was seen immediately. In his first season in charge, Young led the Terriers to their best record in eight seasons at the Division I level and a third-place finish in the SoCon South Division after Wofford was predicted to finish sixth.

It's all about the student-athlete experience for Young. Every player means the world to him, and it's not just those 16 All-SoCon selections (Mike Lenzy, Noah Dahlman, Tim Johnson, Brad Loesing, Kevin Giltner, Tyler Berg, Ian Chadwick, Lee Nixon, Howard Wilkerson, Drew Gibson, Junior Salter, Cameron Rundles, Jamar Diggs, Karl Cochran, Lee Skinner and Spencer Collins). Chadwick (2000-01) Dahlman (2010-11), and Cochran (2014-15) have been SoCon Players of the Year, while Dahlman was the SoCon Tournament's Most Outstanding Performer in back-to-back seasons (2010, 2011).

Young's influence on incoming players has been seen with eight Terriers appearing on the All-SoCon Freshman Team (Ian Chadwick, Tyler Berg, Brad Loesing, Karl Cochran, Justin Stephens, Spencer Collins, Eric Garcia and Fletcher Magee). Chadwick (1997-98), Cochran (2011-12) and Magee (2015-16) were named SoCon Freshmen of the Year. Magee led the nation in free throw percentage (92.5 pct.) as a freshman, setting the program's new single-season record and becoming just the sixth freshman to shoot 90-percent or better in NCAA men's Div. I history (min 2.5 makes per game). Magee's freshman season also saw him rank third nationally in 3-point field goal percentage (47.9 pct.).

In 2012, each of our the program's five graduates (Drew Crowell, Kevin Giltner, Brad Loesing, Joseph Tecklenberg and Matt Steelman) were named to the Southern Conference All-Academic Team.

A native of Radford, Va., Young came to Wofford after serving as a graduate assistant for one year under Oliver Pumell at Radford University. A 1986 graduate of Emory & Henry College, he was a four-year letterman in basketball for coach Bob Johnson and the team captain his junior and senior seasons. He credits Johnson for having a major influence on his playing and coaching careers.

Upon his graduation, Young became a full-time assistant coach for two years at Emory & Henry before moving on to Radford. Another mentor in his coaching philosophies is Fletcher Arritt, longtime coach of Fork Union (Va.) Military Academy. Young played one season for him before attending Emory and Henry.

Young and his wife, Margaret, were married on Aug. 13, 1994 in her hometown of Camden, S.C. She is a 1992 Wofford graduate and a partner with PricewaterhouseCoopers LLP. The couple has a daughter, Cooper, and a son, Davis.

Wofford College announced on Nov. 17, 2014, its plans to build the Jerry Richardson Indoor Stadium to house a new basketball/volleyball arena, locker rooms and other facilities. The facility will be adjacent to the north end of Gibbs Stadium, where the Terriers play football. Wofford alumnus and trustee **Jerry Richardson '59** provided the gift to fund the 92,000-square-foot facility that will include a 3,400-seat basketball arena and a 500-seat volleyball competition venue. The facility will replace Benjamin Johnson Arena, which will continue to be used as a first-rate facility for intramural and campus recreational activities. Construction on the new facility begins in the fall of 2015 with the opening date slated for September 2017. A groundbreaking ceremony was held Tuesday, October 20, 2015.



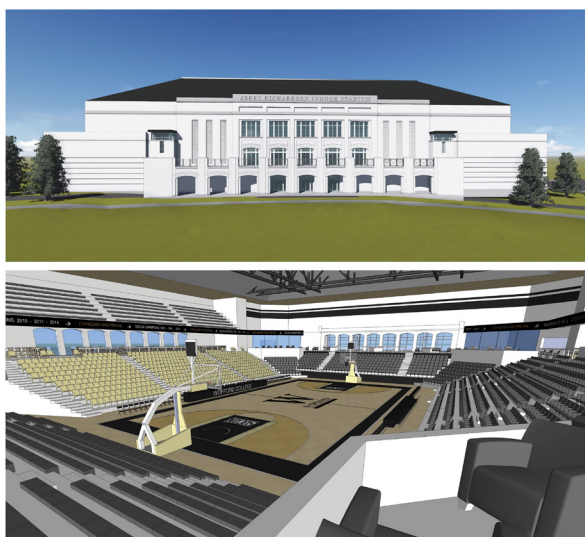

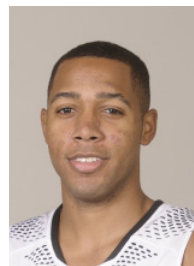
