• Two of the most successful programs and coaches in college hockey will faceoff on Saturday night at 7:00 p.m. when Michigan (1600 wins all-time) and head coach **Red Berenson** (796 wins, No. 4 all-time) take on Boston College (1500 wins all-time) and head coach Jerry York (971 wins, No. 1 all-time). Berenson owns a 29-22-1 record in head to head meetings against York, dating back to York's tenure at Bowling Green (1979-1994). U-M closed out a seven-game home stand with a 6-1 record to improve to 8-6-0 (2-1-0-0 Big Ten). Michigan will be making its first trip to Chestnut Hill since Dec. 2, 1990 (L, 5-1). The Wolverines are 12-6 in the all-time series against BC but have only played three true road games against the Eagles and are 0-2 in Kelley Rink. Michigan's last win at BC came on Dec. 27, 1950, an 11-2 win. U-M has won four straight games in the series.

• Michigan and Boston College both lead the way with five players selected for the 2015 U.S. National Junior Team preliminary roster. Defensemen **Michael Downing** and **Zach Werenski** and forwards **JT Compher**, **Dylan Larkin** and **Tyler Motte** will face off against five future teammates from BC: Noah Hanafin, Alex Tuch, Ian McCoshen, Steve Santini and Thatcher Demko. The team will participate in the International Ice Hockey Federation World Junior Championship Dec. 26, 2014-Jan. 5, 2015, first attending a training camp Dec. 16-19 at Boston University's Walter Brown Arena, with preparations continuing at the Rogers K-Rock Centre in Kingston, Ontario, before the final 23-man roster is announced by Dec. 24.

• Michigan and Boston College have met in severable memorable NCAA Tournament contests over the years. The programs have met six times in postseason play, with the Wolverines owning a 4-2 record in those contests. They first met in a 1948 Frozen Four semifinal, with U-M earning a 6-4 overtime win over BC en route to its first national championship. In 1950 and 1954 the two teams met in the Frozen Four Third Place game, with Michigan

## THE LAST MEETING

In Michigan's season opener last year on Oct. 10, 2013 at Yost Ice Arena, Luke Moffatt scored two power-play goals, and Andrew Copp registered three points (g, 2a) to help Michigan earn a 3-1 win over No. 4 Boston College. JT Compher added two assists for the Wolverines, and goaltender Steve Racine turned away 20 of 21 shots faced.

earning victories (10-6, 7-2) in both. In the 1998 national championship game, Michigan's **Josh Langfield** scored an overtime game-winning goal to give the Wolverines a 3-2 victory and their ninth NCAA title. Three years later, BC had the upper hand with a 4-2 win in the 2001 Frozen Four semifinals en route to a national championship, Jerry York's first at BC. In 2004, BC earned a 4-3 overtime win over Michigan in the NCAA East Regional.

• Three Wolverines have recorded points in each of the last four games. **Tyler Motte** (2G, 7A) leads the group, while **Zach Hyman** (3G, 4A) increased his team-leading point total to 17 (7G, 10A), matching his career-best point total from last season. **Alex Kile** has goals in each of the last four games and six points (5G, A) in that span.

• Hyman is also well on his way to a career year, leading the team with 17 points (seven goals, 10 assists) on the season. He set a career high with 17 points (seven goals, 10 assists) in 2013-14. Hyman, **Dylan Larkin** and **Zach Werenski** are tied for the team lead with five multiple point games.

• Michigan has snapped an 0-for-12 drought on the power play in a big way over the last two games, converting on six of its last nine power play chances. Sophomore forward **Alex Kile** has been the main beneficiary, scoring three goals on the man advantage in that span to up his season total to six power play tallies. Kile leads the nation in that category along with Quinnipiac's Sam Anas. The Wolverines are now 11-for-55 (20.0%) on the man advantage this season.

• Michigan's offense came alive during a seven game home stand, as the Wolverines notched 38 goals in seven contests for an average of 5.43 goals/game. In that span, Michigan has gone from 31st in scoring offense to second in the nation (4.07 goals/game).

• Michigan has outshot or matched the opposition in shots in eight straight games after matching Ohio State with 26 shots on Dec. 5.

• Freshmen **Dylan Larkin** and **Zach Werenski** are off to fast starts for the Wolverines. Larkin leads all Big Ten freshmen with 15 points (2G, 13A) on the season, while Werenski is second among Big Ten freshmen with 12 points (3G, 9A).

• Freshman defenseman **Zach Werenski** scored in last Friday's 8-3 win over Ohio State to give Michigan defensemen a combined nine goals in 14 games this season. In 2013-14, Michigan defensemen scored eight goals in 35 games. Sophomore defenseman **Michael Downing** is tied for the lead among Big Ten defensemen with three goals on the season.

• Michigan's freshman class has had an immediate impact through 14 games this season, as a freshman has recorded a point in all but one game.

**MICHIGAN SIGNS FIVE FOR 2015-16**

The University of Michigan ice hockey team has announced the signing of five players to National Letters of Intent for the 2015-16 season. Forwards **Kyle Connor** (Shelby Township, Mich.), **Connor Murphy** (Ancaster, Ontario) and **Brendan Warren** (Carelton, Mich.) and defensemen **Nicholas Boka** (Plymouth, Mich.) and **Joseph Cecconi** (Youngstown, NY) have committed to the Wolverines beginning next season.

**Nicholas Boka:** A 6'1", 197-pound defenseman ... Currently playing with the United States National Team Development Program (USNTDP) Under-18 team... Named a "C" skater on the NHL Central Scouting Preliminary 2015 Players To Watch list ... Competed in the 2014 CCM/USA Hockey All-American Prospects Game.

**Joseph Cecconi:** A 6'2", 205-pound defenseman ... Currently playing with the Muskegon Lumberjacks of the United States Hockey League (USHL) ... Named a "B" skater on the NHL Central Scouting Preliminary 2015 Players to Watch list ... Competed in the 2014 CCM/USA Hockey All-American Prospects Game.

**Kyle Connor:** A 6'1", 182-pound forward ... Playing in his third season with the Youngstown Phantoms of the United States Hockey League (USHL) ... Set Youngstown Phantoms all-time goal-scoring record this season ... Named an "A" skater on the NHL Central Scouting Preliminary 2015 Players to Watch list ... Competed in the 2014 CCM/USA Hockey All-American Prospects Game, recording an assist.

**Connor Murphy:** A 5'9", 168-pound forward ... In his first season with the Chicago Steel of the United States Hockey League (USHL) ... Played two seasons with the Caledonia Corvairs of the Greater Ontario Junior Hockey League (GOJHL)... Murphy was named OHA GOJHL Junior B Player of the Year last season.

**Brendan Warren:** A 6'0", 191-pound forward ... Currently playing with the United States National Team Development Program (USNTDP) Under-18 team ... In 21 games, has recorded 18 points (11 goals, seven assists) ... Ranks fourth on the team in goal-scoring ... Named a "B" skater on the NHL Central Scouting Preliminary 2015 Players to Watch list ... Scored a goal in the 2014 CCM/USA Hockey All-American Prospects Game

Freshman forward **Dylan Larkin** leads the way with 15 points (2G,13A) along with defenseman **Zach Werenski** who has 12 points (3G, 9A). Forwards **Dexter Dancs** (G, 2A) and **Tony Calderone** (2G, 3A) as well as defensemen **Cutler Martin** (G, 5A) and **Sam Piazza** (A) have also had early contributions.

- Sophomore forward **Tyler Motte** was named Big Ten Second Star of the Week (Tuesday, Dec. 9). Motte had four assists against Ohio State on Friday night in an 8-3 win over the Buckeyes. Motte recorded a single-game high for assists by any Wolverine this season. The last time a Michigan player recorded four assists in a game was on Feb. 13, 2009, when **Aaron Palushaj** had a goal and four assists against Nebraska-Omaha. Motte has recorded points in four straight games with nine points overall (two goals, seven assists) during that span. Motte is the seventh U-M player to be honored with a Big Ten weekly award this season, joining **Zach Nagelvoort** (1st Star, Dec. 2), **Michael Downing** (3rd Star, Nov. 25), **Max Shuart** (1st Star, Nov. 25), **Andrew Copp** (2nd Star, Nov. 18), **Dylan Larkin** (2nd Star, Oct. 28) and **Steve Racine** (Third Star, Oct. 21).
- In last Friday's (Dec. 5) 8-3 win over Ohio

State, Michigan scored all four power-play goals in the second period to put the game out of reach. The last time Michigan scored four power-play goals in a period was on March 11, 2005, in the second period of a 10-1 win over Notre Dame at Yost Ice Arena.

- With the 8-1 win over Penn State on Nov. 22, Michigan recorded its most goals in a game at Yost Ice Arena since a 10-3 win over St. Lawrence on Oct. 13, 2011. The Wolverines scored five third-period goals in the game, the first time that Michigan has had five goals in a period since March 14, 2008, in a CCHA Quarterfinal victory (10-1) over Nebraska-Omaha at Yost Ice Arena.
- Michigan had several standout performances in an 8-4 win at UMass-Lowell on Oct. 24. Senior forward **Zach Hyman** recorded five points (3G, 2A), including a natural hat trick. Hyman's five-point night was the first for a Wolverine since **Aaron Palushaj** had five points (G, 4A) against Nebraska-Omaha on Feb. 13, 2009. Michigan recorded eight or more goals in a game for the first time since Oct. 13, 2011, when the Wolverines earned a 10-3 win over St. Lawrence at Yost Ice Arena. The eight goals are the most by a Michigan team in a road game since an 8-5 win at Notre Dame on Nov. 4, 2005. Freshman forward **Dylan Larkin** recorded four points (G, 3A), the most points by a Michigan freshman since **JT Compher** had four points (2G, 2A) against Michigan State on Jan. 24, 2014.
- Michigan was picked to finish second in the Big Ten in the preseason coaches' poll, the conference announced at Big Ten Hockey Media Day on Wednesday (Sept. 24). Minnesota was tabbed for first place.
- Junior forward **Andrew Copp** and sophomore forward **JT Compher** were unanimous selections on the Big Ten Preseason Players to Watch list. Copp earned All-Big Ten Honorable Mention honors in 2013-14, while Compher was named the 2014 Big Ten Freshman of the Year. Copp will serve as team captain for the 2014-15 season, while Compher and senior forward **Zach Hyman** will serve as alternate captains.
- Former University of Michigan ice hockey player **Wally Grant**, the program's first three-time All-American and a key member of Michigan's first national championship team in 1948, passed away Wednesday (Nov. 5) at the age of 86. A 1950 U-M graduate, Grant remained involved in the Michigan hockey program long after graduation, serving as president of the Dekers Blue Line Club while also holding membership in the Graduate "M" Club and Michigan's Victors Club. A tenacious left winger listed at 5-foot-8 and 165 pounds,

Grant played four years of varsity hockey at Michigan, missing the 1946-47 season after serving 18 months in the United States military. Michigan was 80-15-4 (.812) in Grant's four seasons at Michigan. He scored 63 goals and added 83 assists for 146 points. • Former University of Michigan ice hockey player, coach, and athletics administrator **Al Renfrew** '49, passed away on Monday (Nov. 10) at the age of 90. Renfrew, a legendary figure in program history, was a key member of Michigan's first national championship team in 1948 and coached the Wolverines to a national championship in 1964 during a 16-year career behind the bench from 1957-1973. He is the only man to win a national championship as both a player and coach in Michigan hockey history. Following his coaching career, Renfrew served as an assistant athletic director, managing the Michigan Athletics ticket office until his retirement in 1990. Renfrew was one of U-M's first elite scorers, recording 172 points (91 goals, 81 assists) during his four year career, including the 1948 national championship win over Dartmouth.

- U-M will look to add to its unparalleled history in the NCAA tournament this season ... Michigan has the most National Championships (nine), Frozen Four appearances (24), Frozen Four wins (25) and tournament appearances (35) among all D-1 hockey programs.
- Michigan head coach **Red Berenson** needs five wins to become the fourth head coach in Division I men's hockey with 800 victories. Berenson moved into fourth place on the NCAA all-time wins list with his 784th career win on Feb. 7, a 7-3 win at Penn State. Berenson passed Rick Comley, who had 783 wins at Lake Superior State, Northern Michigan, and Michigan State from 1973-2011. Berenson is 796-390-84 (.660) in 31 seasons at Michigan.

## HEAD COACH RED BERENSON



A proven winner at the collegiate and professional levels as both a player and coach, Gordon "Red" Berenson enters his 31st season as head coach of the University of Michigan ice hockey program in 2014-15.

Since taking over a struggling program in 1984, Berenson has kept the Wolverines in the upper echelon of college ice hockey. He directed Michigan to the 1996 and 1998 NCAA National Championships -- the eighth and ninth in school history.

Under Berenson, the Wolverines have qualified for the NCAA Tournament in 22 of the past 24 seasons. His run of 22 consecutive appearances from 1991-2012 marks the longest streak ever in college hockey. Over that time, Michigan reached the NCAA Frozen Four 11 times: back-to-back appearances in 1992 and 1993; four consecutive appearances in 1995, 1996, 1997 and 1998; three consecutive showings between 2001-03, 2008 and 2011. Besides 1996 and 1998 U-M also reached the national title game in 2011, losing 3-2 in overtime to Minnesota-Duluth.

Berenson has the Wolverines well-positioned to be a perennial contender in the Big Ten. He established Michigan as a power in the Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA), leading the team to first- or second-place finishes 20 times in 23 seasons from 1991-2013. Michigan captured 11 CCHA regular-season titles and nine CCHA Tournament titles. On six occasions the Maize and Blue has swept the CCHA regular season and postseason titles, last doing so in 2007-08. U-M's most improbable CCHA Tournament crown came in 2010. After placing seventh in the regular season, U-M won six straight CCHA play-off games, including two at Michigan State and a semifinal upset of top-seeded Miami, to receive an automatic bid into the NCAA Tournament. U-M's last regular season crown was in 2010-11, when it won its final six games to overtake Notre Dame.

Berenson, who has fashioned a 788-384-84 record (.661) in 30 seasons with the Wolverines, is the sixth collegiate ice hockey coach to record 700 career victories, reaching the milestone with a 4-1 win at Bowling Green on Oct. 8, 2010. Berenson's 788 victories place him fourth on the

NCAA ice hockey coaches all-time win list. He stood behind the U-M bench for the 1,000th time of his career on Feb. 22, 2008 at Michigan State.

In 2008, Berenson earned the American Hockey Coaches Association's Spencer Penrose Award as the National Coach of the Year for the first time in his tenure at Michigan. The 2007-08 U-M squad went 33-6-4, reached the NCAA Frozen Four, won the CCHA regular season and tournament championships and boasted the Hobey Baker Memorial Award winner, Kevin Porter. Berenson also earned the CCHA's Coach of the Year laurel for the second time of his career (1994).

For his outstanding service to hockey in the United States, the NHL honored Berenson and four others with the Lester Patrick Award in the fall of 2006.

Michigan ice hockey has earned its reputation for success with impressive showings against conference and national competition. From 1988-96, Michigan won nine consecutive Great Lakes Invitational championships. The Wolverines have won 15 GLI crowns - the most of any program - and have captured four of the last five titles.

In the 17 years of the College Hockey Showcase -- a Thanksgiving tournament that pits U-M and Michigan State versus Minnesota and Wisconsin -- the Maize and Blue has the highest win total (20) and the highest winning percentage (.603, 20-13-1) record against the Golden Gophers and Badgers. Since the 1990-91 season -- when U-M's 22-year streak of NCAA Tournament appearances started -- Berenson has guided the Wolverines to an impressive 103-39-7 (.715) record against non-conference, regular-season opponents. Adding to the legend of Berenson's tenure with the Michigan program is an incident from the 1999 East Regional in Worcester, Mass. In the first tournament game, U-M trailed the University of Denver 3-0 at the 17:44 mark of the second period. Berenson called a timeout which some say changed that game more than any other timeout

they had ever witnessed. When play resumed, Michigan held Denver to a single shot on goal for the remaining 22:16 of the game while scoring five goals to take the win and advance to the second round of the tournament. Before the team arrived home in Ann Arbor, calls and e-mails were pouring into the ice hockey office inquiring what coach Berenson told his players in that huddle.

Berenson is the fourth former Michigan ice hockey captain to coach the Wolverines' program, accepting the position from athletic director Don Canham in May 1984. A three-year U-M varsity letterwinner under head coach Al Renfrew, Berenson is one of the top players in Wolverine ice hockey history, earning All-America and Michigan Most Valuable Player honors in both his junior and senior seasons (1961, '62).

As a senior, Berenson led the Wolverines to a second-place finish in the Western Collegiate Hockey Association (WCHA) and third place at the NCAA National Championships. Berenson led the WCHA in scoring with 41 points (24 goals, 17 assists) in 18 games, and was named the league's MVP. Berenson completed his Wolverine career by scoring a season record 70 points (43 goals and 27 assists) in just 28 games. His 43 goals and nine hat tricks in his last season still stand as Michigan records. (Berenson scored his 43 goals in 28 games, but shares the record with Dave Debol who scored 43 goals in his 1976-77 All-American season while playing 45 games.)

Following his final Michigan contest in the 1962 NCAA Consolation Game win vs. St. Lawrence, Berenson was driven from Utica, N.Y., to Boston where he played for the Montreal Canadiens at the Boston Garden the next night. He played in nine games for Montreal in the last month of the 1961-62 season, becoming the first collegiate player to step immediately into the National Hockey League.

Berenson holds two degrees from the University of Michigan, his bachelor's degree from the School of Business Administration in 1962 and a Master of Business Administration degree in 1966. He returned to Ann Arbor from Montreal one day after the Canadiens' 1965 Stanley Cup championship parade to begin graduate classes. The commitment to education Berenson illustrated over three decades ago remains an integral part of the Wolverine ice hockey program as Michigan's graduation rate has ranked near the top of collegiate ice hockey since 1984.

Berenson played in the NHL for 17 years as a member of the Montreal Canadiens, New York Rangers, Detroit Red Wings and St. Louis Blues. He accumulated 261 goals and 397 assists in 987 games -- the most by any Michigan alumnus in the NHL -- leaving an indelible mark on league history. Berenson scored at least 20 goals in seven NHL seasons.

On Nov. 7, 1968, while playing for the St. Louis Blues in a game against the Philadelphia Flyers, Berenson scored six goals, including four over a nine-minute span. The six-goal effort was one shy of the all-time NHL record, and marked the first time since 1944 that an individual had scored six goals in an NHL game. It is a feat that has been accomplished only once since. In that game, Berenson also set the NHL records for most goals in a road game and most goals in a period (four), records which stand today. Only eight other NHL players, including the likes of Wayne Gretzky and Bryan Trottier, have scored four goals in a period.

Berenson played in the original and legendary eight-game Canada Cup series for Team Canada vs. the Soviet Union in 1972 as well as the "old-timers" rematch of the Canada Cup in 1987. In the fall of 2005 he, along with the entire 1972 Team Canada roster, was inducted into the Canadian Sports Hall of Fame. Following his retirement as a player after the 1977-78 season, Berenson remained in St. Louis as a member of the Blues' coaching staff. After serving as an assistant coach for a year and a half, he took over as head coach with 56 games remaining in the 1979-80 season and posted a 27-20-9 record. The following year, Berenson

was the NHL Coach of the Year after leading the Blues to a 45-18-17 record, the best mark in the first 28 years of the club's history.

In August 1982, Berenson joined former St. Louis Blues coach Scotty Bowman on the Buffalo Sabres staff, serving as an assistant under Bowman until accepting the head coaching job at Michigan in 1984. Berenson has not lost touch with the NHL, presenting the 1989 Coach of the Year award to Pat Burns, then coach of the Montreal Canadiens, at the NHL Awards Banquet.

Berenson is a member of the University of Michigan Athletic Hall of Honor, the Dekers Club Hall of Fame, the Michigan Sports Hall of Fame, the St. Louis Sports Hall of Fame, and the Saskatchewan Sports Hall of Fame. He was named to a select group of college ice hockey's West All-Time Forwards in the 1996 American Hockey Coaches Association College Hockey Centennial All-Time Favorites Poll in voting by fans, coaches and writers, joining Neal Broten, Brett Hull, Greg Johnson, Bill Masterson, John Matchefts, Bill Hay and Tony Hrkac. A native of Regina, Saskatchewan, Berenson and his wife, Joy, reside in Ann Arbor. They are the parents of four adult children: daughters Kelly and Sandy and sons Gordie and Rusty.

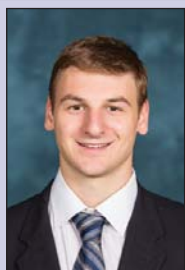
