B1G No. 2 MICHIGAN WOLVERINES vs B1G No. 7 MICHIGAN STATE SPARTANS
BIG TEN QUARTERFINAL (BEST-OF-THREE SERIES)

WOLVERINE BITES

- Michigan is 25-9-1 after being swept on the road at Notre Dame to close the regular season.
- U-M checks in at No. 5 in the USCHO and No. 4 in the USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine polls.
- As the B1G's two-seed, Michigan would host a one-game semifinal next week if they advance.
- **Matty Beniers** sits atop the U-M stat sheet with 37 points (17g, 20a) and a B1G-leading nine power-play goals. Behind him is **Brendan Brisson** (17g, 16a) with 33 points and a team-leading five game-winning tallies. Freshman blueliner **Luke Hughes** is the nation's top-scoring defenseman with 16 goals and 32 points. **Kent Johnson** enters the weekend with 30 points (6g, 24a) while last season's leading scorer, **Thomas Bordeleau** sits at 28 (9g, 19a) along with a stellar 57.1% track record in faceoffs. Sophomore stalwart **Owen Power** returns from Olympic play to anchor the blue line with 27 points (3g, 24a). Freshman **Mackie Samoskevich** (7g, 17a) has been excellent in the second half of the season to sit at 24 points in his first year, while fifth-year **Michael Pastujov** (9g, 13a) has posted a career-best 22 points.
- Power leads the Wolverines with 40 blocked shots while captain **Nick Blankenburg** is second with 39. Blankenburg has also set career-highs offensively with 13 goals and 22 points.
- Sophomore **Erik Portillo** has started every game in net for the Wolverines this year. He has a 25-9-1 record including three shutouts, a .926 save percentage, and a 2.14 goals against average. The Swedish stalwart is currently third in the NCAA with 932 saves and second with 25 wins. He was recently named as 1 of 11 semifinalists for the Mike Richter Award.

SCOUTING THE SPARTANS

- Coach Danton Cole's Spartans finished the regular season in seventh place with 17 points.
- MSU was outscored 87-51 in 24 B1G games, but snapped a 13-game losing streak in its last game versus Penn State.
- Senior forward Mitchell Lewandowski paces the offense as a point-per-game player, but missed significant time due to injury. He is set to return this weekend. MSU's leading scorer is Jesse Tucker with a pair of goals and a team-leading 22 assists for 24 points. Erik Middendorf has a team-high 12 goals.
- Dennis Cesana has seven goals and eight assists for 15 points on the blue line while Nash Nienhuis has 13 and David Gucciardi, 11. Cesana and Cole Krygier each have 50 blocked shots.

• MSU has utilized both Drew DeRidder & Pierce Charleson in net. DeRidder leads the duo with a 2.77 goals against average and a .924 save percentage with a 9-13-1 record.

SUPER SCORER

Matty Beniers is the B1G scoring champion, finishing conference play with 27 points. He is the fourth Wolverine to earn the crown, joining Zach Hyman (2015), Kyle Connor (2016) and Cooper Marody (2018). Michigan leads the league in scoring champions - the only school with more than two. He had 10 multiple-point games, two more than the next best player in the conference.

NINE TIMES?

Michigan has earned the B1G First Star of the Week nine out of 19 times this season. The last time the Wolverines had nine B1G First Stars was in 2015-16, en route to winning the B1G Tournament title.

BREAKING RECORDS

Luke Hughes set a new program record for goals by a freshman defenseman on Friday (Feb. 18) vs. Ohio State and now sits at 16 goals on the year. Hughes' 32 points also have him tied with Jack Johnson's 2005-06 campaign for most-ever by a freshman blueliner. Hughes recently put together a five-game goal streak with 10 points.

DEFENSEMEN ARE DIALED

Prior to leaving for the Olympics, Owen Power led all defensemen in points with 26 in 23 games. Luke Hughes has since taken that role, leading NCAA defenders in scoring at 32 points (tied with QU's Zach Metsa for lead). He also paces all defensemen in goals with 16.

DUEL IN THE D

U-M secured the "Iron D" for the fifth consecutive time after MSU claimed the trophy in its first year of existence (2016-17). With the 7-3 win at Detroit's Little Caesars Arena, the Wolverines secured a four-game regular-season series sweep against their rivals from MSU. Michigan has now won nine of the last 10 games vs. the Spartans.

BEIJING BLUE

- Brendan Brisson notched the game-winning goal for USA in each of its first two games.
- Matty Beniers scored and added an assist while leading all US forwards in time on ice, averaging 19:39, while winning 50.91 percent of his face offs
- Strauss Mann backstopped USA to a 4-2 win against Canada (its first in 12 years) in a 35-save performance, then stopped 34 shots in a stellar Quarterfinal against Slovakia
- Steven Kampf, U-M's oldest alum in Beijing, was an alternate captain for USA. He scored and added three assists to be a point-per-game player through four contests
- Owen Power led Canada in ice time at 21:38/gm. Added an assist & a team-high 10 SOG
- Kent Johnson led Canada in group-stage scoring with five points (1g, 4a) and was +4

IS THAT GOOD?

After a stellar run of play through January, Matty Beniers was named as one of three co-players of the month for all of NCAA hockey by the Hockey Commissioner's Association.

TROPHY SEASON, VOL. II-III

Michigan claimed the Mariucci/Renfrew Trophy in January after Michigan and Minnesota completed their four-game series. U-M earned the trophy for the first time since 2018-19, with seven points to Minnesota's five. U-M also claimed the IceBreaker trophy in October after beating UMD and Minn. St. before defending the Iron D against MSU.

HEY, SHORTY

Michigan has tallied six short-handed goals this season. In Detroit against MSU, the team recorded two shorties in a single game for the first time since Feb. 2013 when Derek DeBlois and Andrew Copp each notched one against Notre Dame. While killing a major penalty in the second period of this year's Duel in the D (2/11), Jimmy Lambert/Thomas Bordeleau each scored a short-handed goal, just 1:26 apart.

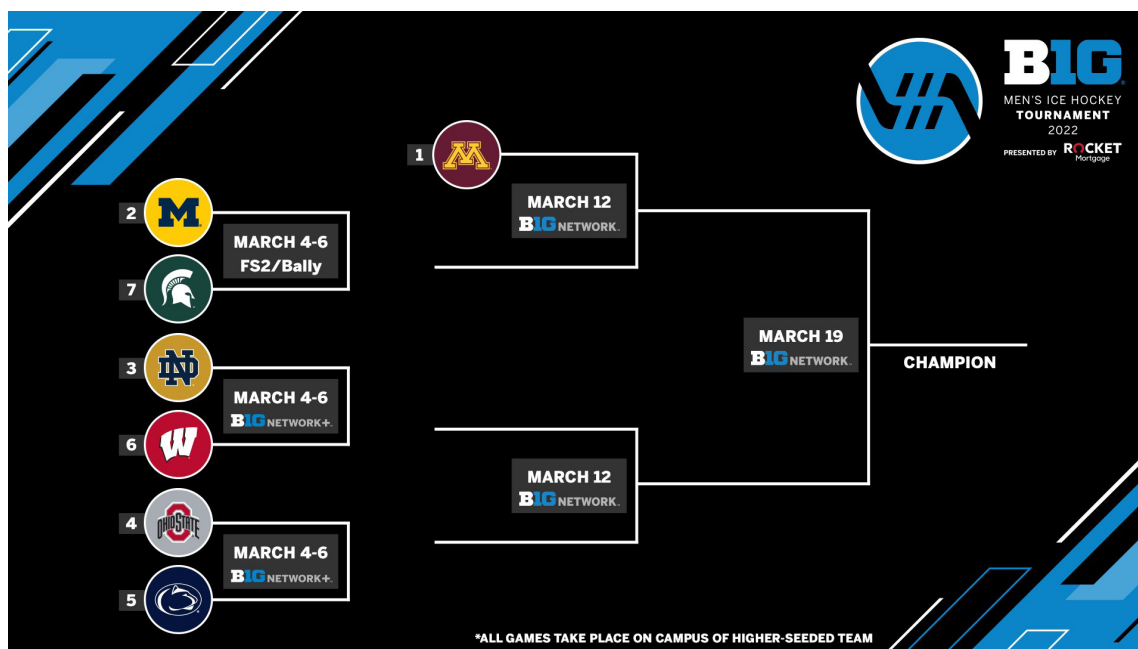

NOTES

PREMIUM PORTILLO

- Erik Portillo is one of 11 goaltenders named as a 2022 Mike Richter Award semifinalist. Portillo is currently third in the nation in saves (932) as well as trailing just Minnesota State's Dryden McKay with 25 wins on the season. Portillo has started 35 games for U-M while posting a 2.14 goals against average and a .926 save percentage.
- Portillo recorded his third career shutout last month against Ohio State. The Swede pushed aside all 30 OSU shots that he faced to earn his third blank slate of the year.
- Portillo, who has started every game in net this year for Michigan, set a new career-high in saves on Jan. 15 against Penn State. The netminder stopped 44 of the 47 shots that he faced en route to a 4-3 win, smashing his previous high of 36 saves that he'd notched twice earlier in the season (vs. ND, at OSU).
- Portillo has stopped both penalty shots that he's faced this season. Ethen Frank (WMU) was denied first, while Justin Misiak of Michigan Tech was also denied in OT.

APPLE PICKER

Florida Panthers' first-round pick Mackie Samoskevich recorded his first multi-point game versus Notre Dame on Nov. 20 with three assists on U-M's four goals. At Wisconsin, Mackie scored and added two assists for his second three-point game before repeating the feat last week vs. Michigan State to sit at seven goals and 17 assists for 24 points.

POWER UP

Michigan has the sixth-ranked power-play unit in the nation, converting on 25.2 percent of its opportunities. The Wolverines have tallied 32 power-play goals on their 127 chances, with sophomore sniper Matty Beniers leading the way for the Wolverines at nine PPGs.

MORE GOALS

Michigan has the nation's third-ranked scoring offense, averaging 3.86 goals per game. The Wolverines are also fourth-best in scoring margin at +1.60 goals/gm.

KILLED IT

U-M's PK unit killed off 27 straight penalties before losing in OT for Minnesota. The streak, including two majors, was the program's longest since Jan/Feb. 2003 (37 straight). Currently the unit is 83.7 percent, ranked third in the B1G and 15th nationally.

STARRING LUKE HUGHES

Luke Hughes was named the B1G Hockey First Star of the Game two weeks in a row after a six-point performance vs. Michigan State and a three-goal weekend vs. Ohio State.

DOUBLE TROUBLE

With defensemen Luke Hughes at 16 goals and Nick Blankenburg at 13, it marks the first time since 2005-06 that two Michigan defensemen have reached double digits in goals (Matt Hunwick - 11 goals, Jack Johnson - 10 goals).

HELPING HAND

Kent Johnson has a team-best 24 assists this season. At 0.96 assists per game, he ranks fourth in the nation. The sophomore has recorded 42 helpers in 51 career games played for the Wolverines. KJ has also scored 15 goals for 57 total points.

SEASON'S SWEEPING

- Michigan's sweep of Penn State at Yost in January completed the four-game season series sweep over the Nittany Lions. The 4-0 record marked U-M's first season sweep of a B1G foe since the 2014-15 season when they stymied Wisconsin. Last week, Michigan doubled the feat by putting the finishing touches on a second conference season sweep: Michigan State.
- This is the first time that Michigan has posted two season sweeps over B1G opponents since joining the league in 2013-14.

FIRST THINGS FIRST

Matty Beniers was named the Big Ten's First Star of the Week after recording back-to-back two-point games (one goal, one assist per night) against Penn State. It was Beniers' third time being named First Star this season; U-M leads with nine honorees so far.

NOTES

CROWN: CLAIMED

Michigan hosted the defending national champions, UMass, to start the second half. Much of Coach Carvel's tenth-ranked squad was on the roster last season when the team defeated St. Cloud State, 5-0, in the 2021 Frozen Four to claim the school's first NCAA ice hockey championship. This year's Wolverines battled to claim a pair of wins (4-1, 4-2), earning the sweep to bolster their positioning in the Pairwise rankings.

STARRING ROLES

- Michigan took two of the three Big Ten Stars of the Week to start 2022 (Jan. 11) Brendan Brisson was named Second Star and Erik Portillo earned Third Star honors.
- Brisson had a five-point weekend (three goals, two assists) as U-M swept UMass. He scored the first goal on back-to-back nights and finished +5. On Saturday (Jan. 8), he scored 1:14 into the game and followed up with the primary assist on the game-winner along with a second goal. The VGK pick then had a point on each of U-M's first two goals on Sunday (Jan. 9), scoring the first and assisting on the second.
- Erik Portillo turned aside 56 shots to backstop the sweep. The Sabres pick stopped 28 shots in a 4-1 win on Saturday (Jan. 8) while picking up his second assist of the year, before making another 28 saves on Sunday (Jan. 9) in a 4-2 win.

IT'S BEEN 67 YEARS

Michigan's scoreless tie against Michigan Tech on December 29th made history. Before the 0-0 game with the Huskies, it had been 67 years and ten months since the Michigan hockey program had recorded a scoreless draw, with the last occurrence coming on the road on Feb. 19, 1954 vs. Michigan State when Dwight D. Eisenhower was President.

WORLD JUNIORS' BLUE CREW

- The 2022 World Junior Ice Hockey Championship was cut short due to COVID-19.
- Owen Power became the first defenseman in Canada history to net a hat trick, as he tallied three goals in his opening game. Teammate Kent Johnson scored as well.
- Matty Beniers, Luke Hughes and Mackie Samoskevich were on USA, with Beniers an alternate captain. Samoskevich scored and Beniers had an assist in USA's lone WJC game.

STAR FOR PASTUJOV

Michael Pastujov was named the Big Ten First Star of the Week for the week ending Dec. 5. He is the fourth Wolverine to earn the top billing on the weekly awards this season. Pastujov recorded his first career hat trick on Saturday (Dec. 4) in a 6-2 win over No. 11 Minnesota. Pasta's feat was all the more impressive because it was a natural hat trick; the senior scored Michigan's second, third, and fourth goals. Pastujov's status as U-M's active leading goal-scorer is still intact, with 33 career tallies.

STAYING CLASS-Y

In December, Nick Blankenburg was named a top-20 candidate for the Senior CLASS Award. In February, 10 finalists will be determined with a fan votes coupled with votes from coach and media will determine the winner - announced at the Frozen Four. Michigan has had two finalists: Kevin Porter in 2008 and Sam Piazza in 2018.

"THIS IS BLANKENBURG'S TOUR"

Captain Nick Blankenburg had a five-point weekend against Niagara, doubling his season point total with a pair of multi-point games. In recognition of Blanks' play, the Big Ten named him the First Star of the Week, Michigan's fifth of the season. He sits in second place in the Michigan records book for goals scored by a senior defenseman, trailing only Alex Roberts (1989-90) who had 14.

HALF A HUNDO

Blankenburg's three goals and two assists versus Niagara brought him to 50 career points for Michigan, a feat he achieved in 107 games. Sophomore sensation Kent Johnson also hit the 50-point threshold with a multi-point weekend vs. Niagara, his 42nd career game. Classmate Matty Beniers reached 50 points against UMass, his 46th career game. Brendan Brisson joined the 50-point club against Penn State, his 49th career game.

LET'S GO STREAKING

- In Oct/Nov, Owen Power recorded points in eight straight with 2G and 11A for 13pts.
- Matty Beniers notched three consecutive two-goal games (Nov. 5-11) followed by a one goal, three-assist performance. Prior to Beniers, the last Wolverine to have 3+ multiple-goal games was Tyler Motte in 2015-16, who had a hat trick vs. OSU followed by three straight two-goal outings.

HOT START

Freshman defenseman Luke Hughes started his career with a six-game point-scoring streak, notching at least one point in the first six games of the year. He has had two three-point games (2-1-3) versus Michigan and Penn State. Hughes leads all defensemen nationwide in goal-scoring (with 16) as well as scoring (with 32 points in 34 games).

SOPHOMORE SURGE

- Owen Power has eclipsed his season point total from last season. He had 16 points in 2020-21 playing in 26 games. In the first 12 games this year, he totaled 18 points.
- Matty Beniers surpassed his goal total from last year in just 16 games. In 24 games as a freshman, he had 10 goals. This year, it took him just 16 games to pass the mark.

DA DA DA, DA DA DA

Michigan has made ESPN's SportsCenter Top 10 Plays three times this season. The latest was a two-save series by Erik Portillo in a win at Penn State on Nov. 11.

ICE BREAKER CHAMPS

- At the Ice Breaker, U-M faced off against Minnesota-Duluth for the first time since the 2011 National Championship, as well as last season's canceled NCAA tournament game. After falling behind in the first period, Luke Hughes netted a power-play goal to tie the game at 1-1 with less than one minute remaining in the opening frame. U-M would score the next four to earn a 5-1 win and set up a showdown against #1 Minnesota State.
- On Saturday, Michigan scored twice at even strength in the third period to finish off a come-from-behind 3-2 win over the Mavericks and secure the Ice Breaker trophy.

BACK-TO-BACK

For each of the season's first two weeks, Brendan Brisson was honored as the BIG's First Star. After setting the standard as week one's honoree, Brisson repeated by potting the game-winning goal in each contest at the Ice Breaker. The forward added an assist in Michigan's comeback win over Minnesota State for a three-point weekend.

SHOOTER'S TOUR

Nick Blankenburg scored his first career game-winning goal on Oct. 23, a 3x3 OT goal in a 3-2 win at Western Michigan. The senior captain now has 23 career goals for U-M.

NOTES

MAKE IT 3,000

This year's season opener marked the 3,000th game in Michigan Hockey history. The Wolverines were the second program to reach the 3,000-game mark, joining Minnesota. U-M celebrated the feat in style with a 6-1 win over Lake Superior State.

WEEK ONE'S PAIR OF STARS

- In the first week of B1G honors, Brendan Brisson was named First Star of the Week. He had a five-point weekend as U-M opened the season with a sweep of Lake Superior State.
- Owen Power captured the Second Star of the Week after recording his first four-point game in Michigan's 6-1 win over LSSU on 10/8. He assisted on the first three U-M goals before netting his first. In game two, he added another assist for a five-point weekend.

POLL POSITION

Earlier this season, Michigan received its first #1 ranking in a decade, as the team was at the top of both the USCHO and USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine polls. In fact, the announcement came exactly 10 years and 1 day after the last time the Maize & Blue sat in pole position.

PRESEASON PICKS

Michigan was selected to finish second in the Big Ten Preseason Coaches Poll. Thomas Bordeleau and Owen Power were named Preseason First-Team All-B1G, while Kent Johnson and Matty Beniers were named second-team selections.

DID YOU FEEL THAT DRAFT?

Michigan has seven first-round draft picks on the roster this year, the most ever by a collegiate hockey team in history. 13 of 28 players have been selected in the NHL Draft, across all rounds.

HISTORY MADE

- Michigan made history at the 2021 NHL Draft with four of the top five picks. Owen Power was the first overall selection, with Matty Beniers second, Luke Hughes fourth and Kent Johnson fifth. Mackie Samoskevich also went in the first round at No. 24.
- Power is the first-ever Michigan player selected with the first overall pick in the NHL Draft.
- The defenseman is also just the sixth Wolverine to ever be picked No. 1 in their respective draft, joining Tom Harmon (NFL, 1941), Elmer Madar (NFL, 1947), Cazzie Russell (NBA, 1966), Chris Webber (NBA, 1993) and Jake Long (NFL, 2008).
- Power is the fourth college player selected No. 1 overall in the Draft (Joe Murphy, Michigan State in 1986; Rick DiPietro, Boston University in 2000; Erik Johnson, Minnesota in 2006).
- Power and Beniers became the first pair of NCAA teammates to be selected with the first two picks in the NHL Draft. When Seattle picked Beniers, Michigan became the first NCAA program to have a player drafted by all 32 NHL franchises.
- The selections of Power, Beniers and Johnson made Michigan the first school to have three current players taken in the first round in a single draft.
- The five Wolverines selected Friday night set a new standard, as Michigan became the only school to have five players/recruits selected in the first round of one draft.

O CAPTAIN MY CAPTAIN

Nick Blankenburg will serve as team captain after spending a year as an alternate. Jimmy Lambert, Nolan Moyle, Michael Pastujov and Matty Beniers will be this year's alternates.

IN YOUR LIVING ROOM

- Michigan will be featured at least 16 times on national television.
- Online, the U-M at Notre Dame series on Feb. 25-26 will be streamed on Peacock.
- Every game on BTN can be streamed nationwide via the web, smartphones, tablets and connected devices on the FOX Sports app. B1G+ will stream all games broadcast on Bally Sports Regional Networks, in addition to all other non-televvised games in Big Ten arenas.
- Big Ten Network also will broadcast both semifinals and the 2022 Big Ten Tournament championship game in March, while the NCAA Championship will be on ESPN.

2021's GOLDEN BOYS

Matty Beniers and Brendan Brisson both won a gold medal with Team USA at the World Junior Championship in 2021, captained by then Wolverine Cam York. Beniers earned another medal, a bronze, as a member of Team USA at the World Championships in May. Owen Power captured gold with Hockey Canada at the World Championship. It marked the first time in Michigan Hockey history that two players earned medals as members of separate teams.

THE CATHEDRAL OF COLLEGE HOCKEY

Yost* is tied with Hobey Baker Rink (Princeton) as the second oldest arena in college hockey, trailing only Northeastern's Matthews Arena. *did not serve as a rink until 1973.

CURRENT STREAKS

COACH MEL PEARSON

Mel Pearson enters his fifth season with the Wolverines for the 2021-22 season after being named the ninth head coach in University of Michigan hockey history on April 24, 2017.

During his first season he led the team to a 22-15-3 record, and a Frozen Four birth. The Wolverines only suffered losses to three teams following the annual Great Lakes Invitational, which concluded January 2, 2018. Michigan won its last five regular season games in regulation before heading off to the Big Ten Tournament. Pearson guided his team to a quick two game sweep in the first round against Wisconsin, before falling in overtime in the semifinals. He then led the Wolverines to an NCAA Northeast Regional Championship, defeating Northeastern and Boston University to return Michigan to the Frozen Four for a record 25th time.

The following year while posting a 13-16-7 record, Quinn Hughes was a first-team All-America and a finalist for the Hobey Baker trophy. Hughes was one of three that signed entry-level NHL contracts at the conclusion of the season, signing with Vancouver, while Josh Norris inked with Ottawa and Joe Cecconi with Dallas.

Though the 2019-20 season ended abruptly due to the COVID-19 pandemic, he had Michigan poised to go on a run in both the B1G and NCAA Tournaments. The Wolverines were ranked No. 17 in the nation and No. 14 in the Pairwise with an 18-14-4 record. As the No. 3 seed in the B1G tournament, the Wolverines had posted back-to-back shutouts over Michigan State and were set to play Ohio State in the semifinals. The Wolverines went undefeated on the road from January on with a 6-0-2 record to move from last place in the B1G standings (seven points) into a three-way tie for second place. Michigan's scoring offense moved from 44th in the nation to 9th in the second half, improving from 2.16 goals per game to 3.36 gpg. Pearson was a finalist for the Big Ten Coach of the Year, had seven players named to the all-conference teams and the Wolverines had a finalist in every major award. Strauss Mann took home Michigan's first ever Big Ten Goaltender of the Year honor and was also a finalist for the Mike Richter Award. Mann also became just the third Wolverine to earn Academic All-America honors, Michigan's first since Zach Hyman in 2011.

COVID-19 halted another season in 2020-21 as Michigan earned its 38th bid the NCAA Tournament. Set to play Minnesota-Duluth in the Fargo Regional, the season was called on the day of the game. The Wolverines made their 38th NCAA appearance - tying an NCAA record for the most all-time. Michigan's high flying offense, averaging 3.50 gpg, ranked eighth nationally while the defense limited opponents to just 1.96 gpg, fourth best nationally. Freshman Thomas Bordeleau was named the Tim Taylor Rookie of the Year after capturing B1G Rookie of the Year. Bordeleau along with the other nine members of the freshman class accounted for 49.2 percent of the team's scoring (126 of 256 points). Cam York was named the B1G Defensive Player of the Year and signed with Philadelphia following the season, becoming the 101st Wolverine to play in the NHL.

It was an unprecedented draft for Michigan in 2021, as the Maize & Blue took four of the top five selections. Owen Power became the first Wolverine in program history to go first overall, to Buffalo, followed by Matty Beniers becoming the first ever draft selection of the Seattle Kraken at No. 2. Incoming defenseman Luke Hughes followed at No. 4 by New Jersey and Kent Johnson at No. 5 to Columbus. Incoming forward Mackie Samoskevich went later in round 1 for a total of 5 first-round picks for Michigan.

Pearson returned to Ann Arbor following an impressive six-year stint as head coach at Michigan Tech. There, he led the Huskies to two NCAA Tournament appearances in the last three years while winning a WCHA regular-season title and a WCHA Championship in that span. Pearson registered a 118-92-29 overall record, including a 75-34-14 mark over the past three seasons. Under Pearson's leadership, the Huskies finished the 2016-17 season ranked in the top 20 for a third consecutive year, all of them featuring 20-win campaigns. Pearson also earned two WCHA Coach of the Year honors in his time at Michigan Tech, which claimed the program's first-ever No. 1 national ranking on Nov. 17, 2014.

Pearson served as a U-M assistant coach from 1988-89 through 1998-99 and as associate head coach from 1999-2000 through 2010-11. He played an integral role in developing the Michigan program into one of the most successful in the country. During his tenure, the Wolverines posted a 667-243-71 record while capturing 11 Central Collegiate Hockey Association regular-season titles, nine CCHA Tournament crowns, two NCAA championships (1996 and 1998), and making 11 NCAA Frozen Four appearances.

Pearson assisted head coach Red Berenson with on-ice coaching and performed many of the program's administrative functions. He was also heavily involved in the Wolverines' recruiting efforts, helping Michigan land the core of its 1996 and 1998 NCAA champion teams.

After he helped Michigan to the 1999-2000 CCHA regular-season championship, Pearson was awarded the Terry Flanagan Award by the American Hockey Coaches' Association, which honors an assistant coach's career body of work. Pearson also served as a coach with the 1996 United States World Junior Championship team, and helped the Americans to a silver medal, the country's second-best finish at the event.

Perhaps destined to coach with the Wolverines, Pearson's prep (Willard Ikola) and college (John MacInnes) mentors earned varsity letters as goaltenders at Michigan. Pearson was a standout high school player for Ikola (1952-54) at Edina East (Minn.) High School, while playing his collegiate career out at Michigan Tech University under MacInnes (1946-50), one of college hockey's legendary coaches.

As a collegian (1977-81), Pearson collected 56 points (21-35-56) in 97 games, helping Michigan Tech to a third-place finish at the 1981 NCAA Championship. Ironically, Pearson's most "famous" goal was scored against the Wolverines in the championship game of the 1979 Great Lakes Invitational. He broke a 4-4 tie at 2:28 of the third overtime to give the Huskies the GLI title. The game still stands as longest in the 43-year history of the tournament.
