THE SERIES

- Michigan heads east to face off against the Penn State University Nittany Lions for the team's first Big Ten road series of the year. Last year, the teams split each series with U-M winning on both Fridays before PSU struck back to win the second tilts. All four of the meetings last season were two-goal contests.
- The teams have faced off 46 times since Penn State ascended to the highest level of collegiate hockey, and Michigan maintains a 28-17-1 advantage all-time.
- In 21 games at Pegula Ice Arena, the teams have split with a 10-10-1 record.
- Last week, Penn State hosted Wisconsin in State College and lost a pair to the Badgers.

WOLVERINE BITES

- Coming off a bye week, Michigan resumes play for their sixth series with a 7-2-1 record.
- Head Coach Brandon Naurato is in his third season behind the bench for his alma mater. A 2009 graduate, Naurato posted the most wins (26) of any first-year Michigan HC before becoming the first to post back-to-back 20-win campaigns to kick off his tenure. In his two seasons at the helm, Coach Naurato has continued a legacy of excellence by guiding the Wolverines to back-to-back NCAA tournament and Frozen Four appearances. Naurato earned his 50th win as a head coach with a win over Minnesota State to start the year.
- The forward corps is led by junior centerman T.J. Hughes (6A), the active scoring leader for U-M with 90 career points in 90 games as a Wolverine. Youth is pervasive throughout the lineup, including freshman Michael Hage (5G/4A) atop the stat sheet with nine points in nine games as well as sophomore Evan Werner (5G/3A) who is currently riding a four-game goal streak and leads the team with a +7 rating. Garrett Schifsky (5G/3A) also flew out the gates, including a hat trick at ASU that was fueled by a two-SHG performance, while Jackson Hallum (5G/1A) is the fourth Wolverine forward to reach five goals.
- On defense, the experienced graduate transfer Tim Lovell (2A) has been acclimating to life as a Wolverine -- through 129 collegiate games, the dynamic defender has notched 81 points off 12 goals and 69 assists. Senior Ethan Edwards (1G/3A) has played big minutes while contributing to the offense; junior Tyler Duke (2G) has also scored a pair. Freshman Dakota Rheaume-Mullen (2A), a mainstay, leads the squad with 15 blocked shots.
- Between the pipes, Michigan has split duties between fifth-year Logan Stein and freshman Cameron Korpi. Both have started out on the right skate with winning records through five games apiece. Stein leads the way thus far with a 1.59 goals against average and .934 save percentage along with the team's lone shutout of the early going.

SCOUTING THE NITTANY LIONS

- PSU enters on a four-game skid with a 4-5 record after being swept by Wisconsin. The Nittany Lions are led up front by sophomore Aiden Fink (4G/8A) with 12 points in addition to his classmate Reese Laubach (4G/3A) and veteran Danny Dzhaniyev (4G/4A). Freshman Charlie Cerrato (3G/4A) has also acclimated quickly with seven points.
- On the blue line, Simon Mack (1G/7A) paces the group offensively with eight points while Jarod Crespo leads the team with 19 blocked shots. Freshman Cade Christenson has also been impactful, second on the team in on-ice rating (+6) only to Mack (+7).
- In net, transfer Arseni Sergeev has been strong between the pipes. The junior has accrued a 4-4 record along with a 2.3 goals against average and a .906 save percentage.
- PSU's penalty kill unit has been exceptional this season; the Nittany Lions have now killed off 37 of 40 (92.5%) opposing power play chances through nine games. They're also outstanding in the faceoff dot, as they enter the weekend with a 55.9% win rate.
- Longtime coach Guy Gadowsky has been at the helm of the Penn State program since they made the jump to varsity. This is Gadowsky's 25th overall year as a D1 head coach.

LOOK AROUND THE LEAGUE

- This weekend, #4 Minnesota heads to South Bend for two games against Notre Dame.
- #2 Michigan State played an exhibition in Plymouth on Thursday against the US NTDP U-18 team, helping to raise funds for U-M Assistant Coach Matt Deschamps' wife (Kelly) in her courageous battle against cancer.
- The conference's two teams in red, Ohio State and Wisconsin, are on a bye this week.

RIVETING RECAP

Two weeks ago when we last saw the Michigan icers, U-M welcomed Notre Dame to Yost to open up Big Ten play in advance of the bye week. The Wolverines continued their recent run of dominance over the Irish by sweeping the visitors, 2-1 in OT and 4-2 in maize to secure the sweep on Saturday.

LUCK OF THE WOLVERINES

In clinching the recent sweep over Notre Dame, Michigan won its seventh straight game over the Fighting Irish. The active win streak is the longest for either team in the series since Michigan won eight in a row between Dec. 3, 2004 and Dec. 8, 2006.

STAR-WORTHY

Following the impressive road sweep at Agganis, Michigan skaters were honored with the conference's First and Second Stars of the Week. Evan Werner clinched First Star honors with a two-goal, one-assist game on Friday night before adding another goal on Saturday. Jackson Hallum locked up Second Star by leading the calvary for Saturday's OT win. He netted a hat trick, including the game-winning goal in three-on-three overtime. The following week, Werner was Michigan's lone representative in the weekly awards as the league's Third Star of the Week coming off another strong weekend. The sophomore forward now has goals in four straight games.

IT'S ABOUT STEIN

Graduate senior goaltender Logan Stein has thrived in net through five games. On the road at Arizona State, the Georgia native stopped 35 of 36 shots that he faced in a 4-1 win to notch his first victory as a Wolverine. He followed up that performance by shutting out St. Cloud State at home on Oct. 18 for his first career NCAA shutout. On the road against #5 BU, Stein allowed just one goal to move to 3-1 before handing the baton to Cameron Korpi who finished off the two-game non-conference sweep. Last weekend, Stein stopped 18 of 19 shots in over 62 minutes of play to backstop U-M to a win.

PRETTY SLICK-SKY

Sophomore sniper Garrett Schifsky has already racked up three SHG, including two in the win at Arizona State as part of a hat trick effort, the first multi-SHG game for a Wolverine since Jack Johnson in 2007 in another hat trick performance.

LEADERS & BEST

When the 2024-25 season began, there were an NCAA-best 27 Michigan alums on NHL rosters while at least five more Wolverines stood one step away in the AHL. With Seamus Casey and Rutger McGroarty's recent debuts for the New Jersey and Pittsburgh

PRESEASON PONTIFICATION

Freshman forward Michael Hage was named to the preseason All-CHN Rookie Team by College Hockey News while TJ Hughes and Jacob Truscott were the team's lone preseason all-conference representatives as All-B1G second team honorees.

HOME COMING

Graduate senior Tim Lovell arrived in Ann Arbor as a critical addition out of the transfer portal after three strong seasons in Tempe with the Sun Devils. The Massachusetts native and second-highest active scorer among NCAA defenders with 81 points enjoyed a warm welcome from the ASU crowd while notching his first points as a Wolverine.

HOW 'BOUT HAGE?

• Michael Hage has quickly made Ann Arbor home. The freshman phenom posted two points in each game vs. Minn. St. to lead U-M with four points through the first weekend of play -- the first freshman to start his career with back-to-back multi-point games since fellow Steel alum Adam Fantilli notched multiple points in his first three as a Wolverine.

• Hage began his career with a five-game point streak out the gate as a collegian. He now leads the team with nine points off five goals and four assists after he buried the OT GWG on Friday night against Notre Dame to clinch the 2-1 win.

CASH KORP

Towering netminder Cameron Korpi has started five games, and the freshman has shown promising signs while going 3-1-1. Korpi turned aside 24 of 25 shots that he faced to backstop the Wolverines to a 4-1 win over Minnesota State in his debut before traveling to Arizona State and making a career-high 28 saves while settling for a tie. In Boston, Korpi stepped into the blue paint to backstop U-M to a 5-4 OT win over a hungry Terrier team before he was introduced to Big Ten action with his first league start at home vs. Notre Dame, a 4-2 win.

GOT OUR GUY

Junior forward TJ Hughes decided to return for his third year of play despite having the option to sign professional contracts in two successive offseasons. Hughes looks to lead the team in a prominent role as the team's top center and continue his scoring ways. With 90 career points, the Ontarian pivot should join the Century Club in the coming weeks.

YOUNG BLOOD

Highly-touted defender Dakota Rheäume-Mullen will skate for the Wolverines this season as the youngest player in the Big Ten and third-youngest in all of college hockey after spending two years with the US National Team Development Program. The late '06 skater will be eligible for the 2025 NHL Draft following his freshman campaign -- he recorded his first point at ASU and currently leads the Wolverines with 15 blocked shots after adding another assist to his record in the road sweep over Boston University.

NHL FACTORY

- Last season, an NCAA-best 30 Michigan alums skated in the NHL. This year, we began the season with an NCAA-leading 27 representatives on opening day rosters.

- Three of the NHL's six captains that played college hockey are Michigan alumni, (Dylan Larkin - DET, Quinn Hughes - VAN, Jacob Trouba - NYR)

- Rutger McGroarty & Seamus Casey made the "big," so U-M's NHLer count stands at 118.

• Two U-M alums were 2024 NHL All-Stars: Quinn Hughes & Kyle Connor.

• Hughes, the Norris Trophy winner, was the NHL's highest-scoring defenseman with 16 goals & 70 assists for 86 points. He was also the highest-scoring NCAA alum in the league and has set the record for most points in a season by a Canucks D in three-straight seasons.

- Last week, Connor became the seventh Wolverine to record 500 points in the NHL with a three-point showing here in his backyard against the Red Wings.

ONE TOWN IN TEXAS

• Sophomore Evan Werner joined U-M after transferring from Colorado College, and the forward had his coming out party in Boston this past weekend as he stacked up four points in a pair of wins. He is the first Texan to lace up for the Wolverines since forward Chris Brown, who played three years in Ann Arbor (2009-12) after graduating from the US National Team

Development Program. Werner and Brown even share the same hometown, a suburb near Dallas called Flower Mound that's over 1,100 miles from Ann Arbor.

- Skating in all 37 games last season as a freshman for CC, Werner played a major role for a resurgent CC program in a strong conference (NCHC). The diminutive skater put up 19 points off of six goals and 13 assists; his speed has helped him seamlessly fit into the lineup.
- Werner does have experience playing with Wolverines, after being teammates in the USHL with Tanner Rowe (Omaha) and Cameron Korpi (Tri-City).

EARLY APTITUDE

By earning a split against Minnesota State to open the season, U-M made it 10 seasons in a row without beginning 0-2. The last group to drop their first two games was the 2014-15 team captained by Andrew Copp (C), Zach Hyman (A), and JT Compher (A).

EXTRA SPECIAL

- This year's power-play unit looks to regain its form from last season, when the Wolverines led college hockey with 50 power-play goals and a 33.6% success rate. This year's rendition has struggled to exert their will offensively, going 5-for-34 (14.7%) on the power play, while simultaneously starting 30-for-35 (85.7%) on the PK against high-octane, talented opponents.
- The most successful PP in program history was the 1979-80 team that finished the year at a 35.8% clip (power-play tracking began in 1970-71). In NCAA history, the best power play on record belongs to Clarkson from 1977 when they went 89-of-210 (42.3%).

CATCHING UP IN THE CREASE

Michigan has a pair of newcomers in the goaltending room, with Logan Stein transferring in as a graduate student following a career in Big Rapids with Ferris State as well as Michigander Cameron Korpi starting school as a freshman after several years of development in the USHL. The duo have shared the blue paint by splitting duties through the first four weekends of the season, with Stein, the first ever Wolverine from the state of Georgia, shining early on.

DOMINANCE IN THE DOT

- Last year's team finished with a 52.8% win rate in the faceoff dot, the best figure for a Michigan squad since 2014-15 (53.1%). That strong play carried through the offseason and into the first six weeks of the year, as U-M has won 53.1% of draws.
- Returning centerman TJ Hughes led U-M in the dot last season with a 58.9% (403 of 684) win rate while senior Mark Estapa was also strong, winning 53.4% (213 of 399). So far, the duo are clipping at 60.8% and 54.2%, respectively.

NO NEW FRIENDS

Michigan finished last year's non-conference slate with a 7-2-1 mark, and three of the five (PC, UMass, SCSU) ended the year in the top 20. This year's group includes a trio of NCHC opponents (Arizona State, St. Cloud State, Western Michigan) in addition to a strong CCHA foe and the recent road sweep of Boston University. With two games against WMU left to play, Michigan's non-conference record stands at 5-2-1.

WHO'S IN CHARGE?

The captaincy will remain on the blue line for a second year, as Jacob Truscott continues his reign. He is just the ninth player in program history to captain the team in multiple years and the first since Luke Glendening ('12). Ethan Edwards begins his second year as an alternate captain while junior forward TJ Hughes has officially joined the leadership group along with Philippe Lapointe who was named an alternate prior to the season opener in October.

TRUSTY TRUSCOTT

The Michigander, Truscott, entered his fifth season of competition with 132 career games played with the Wolverines under his belt. The left-handed defender began the year with the fourth-best active plus/minus (on-ice rating) in all of college hockey at +47.

GENUINE DRAFT

Michigan has a first-round draft pick on this year's team (Michael Hage), one of just 16 in all of college hockey. This marks the eighth straight year that U-M has a first-rounder on the roster. In total, eight Michigan skaters have been selected in the NHL Draft, 11th-most in the NCAA.

NAURATO NAMED NUMBER 10

• Head Coach Brandon Naurato is the 10th head coach in the history of the University of Michigan hockey program. In his first campaign as the interim bench boss, Naurato led U-M through a campaign of unbelievable off-ice adversity to claim a B1G tournament championship, a No. 1 seed in the NCAA tournament, and a Frozen Four bid while finishing 26-12-3 (.671).

• The 26 wins were the most for a first-year head coach in U-M history. Nar was also the first HC to begin with back-to-back 20-win seasons, NCAA tournament births, and Frozen Four appearances. In total, his record behind the bench is 56-29-7 (.647) through 92 games. In recognition of his quick success, especially in the month of March, Naurato was named a finalist for the Spencer Penrose Award for the second-straight season.

• As a first-year head coach, Naurato led Michigan to a 3-0 start after getting the top job in the offseason. He was the first U-M head coach to start with three wins since Joseph Barss and the inaugural 1922-23 team debuted with wins in their first three games vs. Wisconsin.

BUFFERED BY EXPERIENCE

Michigan has just two seniors (Ethan Edwards & Mark Estapa) on the roster, but the duo are sandwiched by six-man groups of graduate students (Andrew Albano, Thomas Daskas, Philippe Lapointe, Tim Lovell, Logan Stein, & Jacob Truscott) and juniors (Kienan Draper, Tyler Duke, Josh Eernisse, Luca Fantilli, Jackson Hallum, & TJ Hughes). This is a group with extensive experience in both conference and national tournaments up and down the lineup. Only Minnesota and Omaha have fewer seniors (1) than the Wolverines.

THE CATHEDRAL OF COLLEGE HOCKEY

Yost is tied with Hobey Baker Rink (Princeton) as the 2nd-oldest arena in D1 hockey, trailing only Northeastern's Matthews Arena. *Yost did not serve as a rink until 1973

CENTENARIAN STYLE

• Michigan hockey recently celebrated the 100th anniversary of its first game (Jan. 12, 1923 vs. Wisconsin) under inaugural Head Coach Joseph Barss. Over the past century of intercollegiate competition, U-M has gone 1807-1150-176 (.604) through 3,133 all-time games.

• Michigan has the second most national championships (9) in college hockey as well as the most NCAA tournament appearances (41). The Wolverines stand alone with the most Frozen Four appearances (28) in college hockey, including three straight bids.

• U-M made 22 consecutive NCAA tournaments under Red Berenson from 1991-2012, a record that looks to last as no other team has reached more than 15 straight tournneys.

• As a WIHL, MCHL, WCHA, CCHA, and B1G conference member, U-M has won 19 regular-season championships and 12 tournament titles for 31 overall conference crowns.

FOND MEMORIES

• Michigan accounted for half of last year's first team All-B1G lineup, with forwards Rutger McGroarty and Gavin Brindley being joined by star blueliner Seamus Casey. U-M's three first-teamers mark the most for the University since 2016, when four Wolverines closed out an explosive season by earning first team honors.

• Replicating their regular season honors, the three first-team honorees were also named to the Big Ten's All-Tournament team alongside three Spartans. McGroarty and Casey repeated, having also earned All-Tournament honors in last season's victorious run.

• TJ Hughes is the only one of seven Wolverines to earn all-conference honors last season and choose to return, as he received an Honorable Mention. Rising sophomore Garrett Schifsky was also rewarded for a strong campaign with a spot on the conference's all-freshman team.

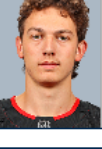
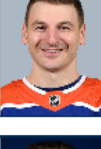
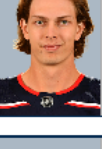
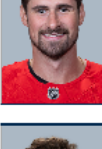
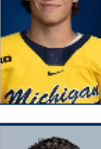
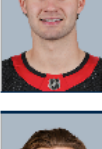
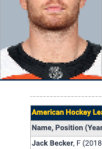
FOOTBALL FRIENDS

By defeating Washington in January's CFP National Championship, the U-M football program won its 12th national championship. Seven of those titles have come since the varsity hockey program was established. In the last century, on-ice success for the hockey team has seemed to correlate with its counterparts on the gridiron:

• Just under a year after Dr. Joseph Barss helped establish the varsity hockey program, Coach Fielding Yost's 1923 footballers won the program's sixth national title by going 8-0.

• Fritz Crisler guided U-M to a 10-0 record and a national championship in 1947, his final season as coach. The next year, ex-letterwinner Bennie Oosterbaan led Michigan to a 9-0 mark and a second-straight championship. Between those title-winning campaigns was the 1948 national hockey championship, the first of its kind, won at the Broadmoor Hotel in Colorado Springs by legendary coach Vic Heyliger's icers.

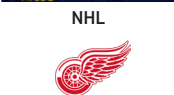

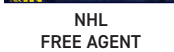
