Michigan at the Players Era Festival

• U-M is averaging 98.0 points per game in Las Vegas, posting back-to-back wins over San Diego State (94-54) and No. 21 Auburn (102-72).

• Six Wolverines have scored in double figures in both games, marking the first time U-M has had six double-digit scorers in consecutive contests since 2013-14.

• Michigan has shot 53.8 percent from the field (69-for-128) in Vegas while holding opponents to 31.5 percent (40-for-127).

• U-M has outscored its two opponents 112-64 in the paint, powered by the interior trio of Morez Johnson Jr., Aday Mara and Yaxel Lendeborg, who have combined for 50 points on 67 percent shooting in the lane.

• The Wolverines have posted 33 second-chance points in two games, sparked by 28 offensive rebounds -- including eight from Morez Johnson Jr. alone.

• Michigan has forced 28 turnovers in Las Vegas, converting them into 41 points and tallying 19 steals, including a season-high 11 vs. San Diego State.

• Yaxel Lendeborg has led Michigan in scoring in both wins, averaging 16.0 points, 5.5 rebounds, 4.0 assists, and shooting 63 percent. Roddy Gayle Jr. is averaging 14.0 points and 5.5 rebounds in Vegas, hitting 60 percent of his shots while anchoring U-M's perimeter defense.

What Happened in Vegas: vs. #21 Auburn

• A balanced Michigan surge overpowered No. 21 Auburn as six Wolverines scored in double figures, fueling a 102-72 victory that sent U-M to the Players Era Championship game.

• Michigan blended pace, paint pressure, and defensive resolve to keep Auburn off balance all night — stacking 102 points, holding the Tigers to 36 percent shooting, and dominating the lane with a 56-32 scoring advantage.

• Yaxel Lendeborg led U-M for the fourth straight game, finishing with 17 points, five rebounds and four assists as he continued to steer the offense with veteran calm. Roddy Gayle Jr. matched him with a season-high 17 points and added a season-best six boards, while Morez Johnson Jr. powered in 15 points for his fifth double-figure performance in six outings.

What Happened in Vegas: vs. San Diego State

• A balanced, relentless Michigan attack overwhelmed San Diego State from the opening tip as six Wolverines scored in double figures, powering a 94-54 win in U-M's Players Era Festival opener.

• Michigan's defensive pressure and frontcourt force shaped the night early, producing season highs in steals (11) and second-chance points (22) while holding the Aztecs to 27 percent shooting.

• Yaxel Lendeborg led U-M posting 15 points, six rebounds and four assists, while Morez Johnson Jr. added 13 points and six boards, including four offensive rebounds that fueled Michigan's 22 second-chance points.

• Elliot Cadeau found his range from deep, knocking down 3-of-5 threes on his way to 13 points. Roddy Gayle Jr. added 11 points on 5-for-6 shooting.



2025 Players Era

Scouting Gonzaga

- Gonzaga stands at 7–0, stacking six double-digit wins with victories over Texas Southern (+55), Oklahoma (+15), Creighton (+27), at Arizona State (+12), Southern Utah (+72), Alabama(+10) and Maryland (+39).
- The Bulldogs are averaging 95.0 points per game with a +32.9 scoring margin, shooting 53 percent from the field and 34.8 percent from three.
- Defensively, they've held opponents to 35.9 percent shooting and just 24.9 percent from deep.
- Graham Ike has powered the frontcourt, averaging 17.0 points and 9.0 rebounds, while shooting 54 percent. Braden Huff has been equally efficient at 16.0 points on 67.5 percent shooting, giving Gonzaga two high-production interior options.
- On the perimeter, Mario Saint-Supéry has steadied the backcourt with 9.1 points, 5.0 assists and 1.9 steals, shooting 47 percent from three. Tyon Grant-Foster (11.9 ppg, 6.0 rpg) adds length, slashing and defensive versatility on the wing.
- Off the bench, freshman Davis Fogle and sophomore Emmanuel Innocenti have combined for 13.7 points per game, with Innocenti hitting five threes in the win over Maryland and Fogle flashing instant scoring in short bursts.

We Meet Again in Another Title Game

- Michigan captured the Bad Boy Mowers Battle 4 Atlantis title, defeating No. 8 Gonzaga, 82–64, at the Imperial Ballroom. The win capped back-to-back victories over top-10 opponents and marked U-M's first Atlantis title.
- U-M knocked down 12-of-23 threes (52.2%) and used multiple extended runs to create separation. The Wolverines held Gonzaga to 64 points and forced 13 turnovers that led to 13 points.
- Jon Teske posted 19 points, a career-high 15 rebounds and four blocks, including 13 first-half points and a buzzer-beating tip-in for a 36–25 halftime lead. Isaiah Livers added 21 points and a career-best five threes, while Xavier Simpson recorded 13 points and 13 assists, tying his own tournament record.
- After trailing 12–7, Michigan used a 10–0 run to take control and later responded to a second-half push with a 12–2 run sparked by threes from Simpson and Livers. U-M sealed the victory with a late surge featuring a Teske dunk, an Eli Brooks corner three and back-to-back triples from Livers to extend the lead to 76–57.

How the Players Era Works

- The Players Era Festival is a multi-day men's and women's college basketball showcase in Las Vegas. A significant element of the event is its focus on Name, Image, and Likeness (NIL).
- Teams played two early-round games, and their performance determined the final games schedule. Seeding is based on competitive metrics such as point differential, total points scored, and points allowed.
- These factors determine who advances and how teams are positioned for the championship game. Seeding is completed by (1) Record, (2) Head to Head (3) Plus/Minus Tiebreaker (maximum of 20 points), (4) Total Points Scored, (5) Total Points Allowed and (6) AP ranking (as of Nov. 24).
- Michigan will be part of the Players Era for the next two seasons (2025, 2026) with the option of adding a third appearance in 2027.

- U-M has 15 Big Ten championships: 1921 (tri), 1926 (quad), 1927, 1929 (co), 1948, 1964 (co), 1965, 1966, 1974 (co), 1977, 1985, 1986, 2012 (tri), 2014, and 2021

What's New

Powered by the Big Three

- Michigan's Big Three account for over 40 percent of the Wolverines' scoring output: Yaxel Lendeborg (15.3 ppg), Morez Johnson Jr. (13.5 ppg) and Aday Mara (9.7 ppg). They combine for 38.5 points per game.
- All three are shooting better than 60 percent from the field: Mara (63.4%), Johnson (64.0%) and Lendeborg (60.4%). As a group, they are shooting 62.5 percent.
- The trio has all six of U-M's double-figure rebounding games and each has recorded all six double-doubles: Mara (3), Lendeborg (2) and Johnson (1).
- They have secured 37 of U-M's 77 offensive rebounds (48.1%) and 103 of the Wolverines' 205 defensive rebounds (50.2%). They combine for 23.3 rebounds.
- The trio has 21 dunks: Mara (9), Johnson (7) and Lendeborg (5).
- The trio has 31 blocks, accounting for 88.6 percent of U-M's team total (35) -- Mara (17), Lendeborg (8) and Johnson (6).

The Century Chase

- Yaxel Lendeborg continues his pursuit of the coveted 100 double-double milestone, entering the week with 87 across his collegiate career.
- During the 2024-25 season, he led the nation with 26 double-doubles.
- After producing 40 double-doubles at Arizona Western he recorded 45 at UAB.
- So far, Lendeborg has two with the Wolverines. He recorded his first at TCU (14 points, 10 rebounds) and a second against Middle Tennessee (25 points, 12 rebounds).

Closing in on Another New Level

- With his game-high 12 rebounds against Middle Tennessee (Nov. 19), Yaxel Lendeborg recorded his 50th Division I game with 10-plus rebounds and the 100th double-figure rebounding game of his collegiate career.
- Earlier this season, he surpassed 800 Division I rebounds (now at 827)
- With five rebounds vs. Auburn (Nov. 25), Lendeborg surpassed 1,700 career rebounds (now at 1,702)
- Across his collegiate career, he has averaged more than 10+ rebounds (10.9 rpg).

Mara in the Middle

- Aday Mara, who has averages 9.7 points and 9.5 rebounds, has three double-doubles in his five games -- doubling his career total.
 - 12 points, 12 rebounds vs. Oakland (Nov. 3)
 - 18 points, 13 rebounds vs. Wake Forest (Nov. 11)
 - 10 points, 10 rebounds vs. Middle Tennessee (Nov. 19)
- Mara has grabbed 57 rebounds -- the most by a Wolverine through six contests since Jon Teske's 53 (2019-20) and Olivier Nkamhoua grabbed 46 (2023-24).
- Mara opened his U-M career with back-to-back five-block games, tying his career high -- vs. Oakland and Wake Forest. He added a career-best six assists and played a career-high 37 minutes vs. Demon Deacons.
- He is second on U-M behind Morez Johnson Jr., shooting 63.4 percent with nine of his 26 baskets being dunks.

The Invisible Impact

- In his Michigan debut, Morez Johnson Jr. scored a career-best 24 points on 10-for-11 shooting vs. Oakland, throwing down three dunks in just 20 minutes. He added 10 points and eight rebounds vs. Wake Forest, and recorded his first U-M double-double at TCU with 10 points and 12 rebounds (six offensive, six defensive).
- He is averaging 13.5 points, 6.8 rebounds and shooting a team-best 64.0 percent from the field. He adds an 85.0 percent mark at the free throw line (17-for-20).

Michigan Trends

- Michigan has opened 6-0 for the first time since 2020-21, when the Wolverines started 11-0 on their way to a Big Ten title and NCAA Elite Eight run.
- Michigan is averaging 92.5 points per game and has scored 40+ points in eight of 12 halves, highlighted by a program-record 69-point first half vs. Oakland (Nov. 3).
- The Wolverines are averaging 48.2 first-half points — a +14.7 margin — and 43.5 points in the second half.
- Four Wolverines are averaging double figures in scoring.
- U-M is producing 42.0 points in the paint, powered by the Big Three of Aday Mara, Morez Johnson Jr. and Yaxel Lendeborg.
- Michigan averages 18.2 second-chance points, sparked by 37 combined offensive rebounds from its frontcourt trio.
- U-M has recorded six straight 40-plus rebounding games, including 51 vs. Auburn and 50 boards in the overtime win over Wake Forest. Michigan is pulling down 46.2 rebounds per game, a +13.8 margin over opponents (32.4).
- The Wolverines have totaled 113 assists on 196 made field goals — a 57.6 percent assist rate — and are averaging 18.8 assists per game, led by Elliot Cadeau's 4.2 per contest.
- Defensively, Michigan ranks 14th nationally in blocks (5.8 bpg), with Aday Mara's 17 blocks placing him 22nd nationally.

Season Notables

- Michigan has two wins by 40+ points -- Oakland (121-78, +43) and San Diego State (94-54, +40)
- U-M made 19 three-pointers vs. Oakland, tying the program record for the fourth time.
- The Maize and Blue have had six straight games of 40+ rebounds, including a season-high 51 vs. Auburn
- The Wolverines had 31 assists vs. Oakland, the most since dishing out 25 in the 2025 Big Ten Tournament (Purdue, March 14, 2025).

Some Quick Things

- Lendeborg (11-for-28) and Elliot Cadeau (9-for-23) are the only Wolverines to make a three-pointer in all six games this season, combining to shoot 20-for-51 (39.2 percent).
- Cadeau has yet to miss a collegiate game, appearing in 80 straight across his three seasons at North Carolina and Michigan. Nimari Burnett continues to be a steady veteran presence in Ann Arbor, not missing a game -- or a start -- in his three-year U-M career (75 consecutive).

What's Known

The Dusty May Blueprint

- Michigan’s core principles center on reliability, confidence, passion, relationships, responsibility, humility, and a willingness to sacrifice for the team.
- Dusty May emphasizes collective excellence over individual heroics, reinforcing a team-first culture built on trust and unselfishness.
- The Wolverines operate a fast-paced, transition-driven, read-and-react system built around spacing, long-range shooting, and multiple ball-screen actions. May demands ball movement and encourages players to pass up good shots for great ones and to shoot with confidence.
- Michigan plays an active man-to-man scheme highlighted by switching on both on- and off-ball actions. U-M typically exchanges through all four perimeter spots while maintaining traditional coverages with the five. May insists on active hands, constant communication, and disruptive energy on every possession.
- With interchangeable personnel across the roster, May regularly rotates nine to 10 players, maintaining pace, pressure, and adaptability on both ends.
- Akeem Miskdeen and Drew Williamson work closely with May to coordinate the offense, while Mike Boynton Jr., Justin Joyner, and Kyle Church oversee defensive principles and adjustments. All five assistants are deeply involved in scouting: Boynton handles most scouts individually, while the Joyner/Williamson pair works together, and Church/Miskdeen form the other tandem.
- May has compiled an 88-22 record (.800) over the last four seasons. Across his previous three campaigns -- his final two at Florida Atlantic and his first at Michigan -- his teams have averaged 29 wins per season.
- Michigan’s 2025 NCAA appearance marked May’s third straight trip to the Big Dance. Before guiding U-M to its sixth consecutive Sweet 16, he led FAU to back-to-back NCAA bids (2023, 2024), highlighted by the Owls’ 2023 Final Four run.

Roster Construction

- In his first two seasons, Dusty May has rebuilt Michigan’s roster, adding 18 new players through the transfer portal, international recruiting, and prep signings.
- May has prioritized players with reputations for toughness, team-first mentality and high basketball IQ -- core tenets of his "connected culture" philosophy.
- Each class has blended experienced transfers with elite young talent, aligning with May’s philosophy of pairing maturity with long-term development.

Frontcourt Power

- Yaxel Lendeborg (6-9), Morez Johnson Jr. (6-9), Aday Mara (7-3), and Malick Kordel (7-2) give Michigan one of the tallest frontcourts in the nation.
- Lendeborg: A relentless rebounder and rim protector who led all of Division I with 26 double-doubles last season at UAB.
- Johnson Jr.: A powerful freshman presence, known for his strength, athleticism, and defensive toughness.
- Mara: A 7-foot-3 transfer from UCLA and member of Spain’s National Team, bringing elite size, passing instincts, and international experience.
- Kordel: A 7-foot-2 newcomer from Germany with a blend of mobility and upside, adding depth and future potential to the Wolverines’ interior rotation.

Backcourt Stability

- Elliot Cadeau, Roddy Gayle Jr., and LJ Cason form a steady, high-IQ backcourt that blends tempo control, scoring balance, and defensive toughness.
- Cadeau: A dynamic playmaker, he ranked among the ACC’s assist leaders at UNC (5.1 apg) while starting every game over two seasons. His vision, pace, and leadership give Michigan a true floor general to orchestrate Dusty May’s spacing-driven offense.
- Gayle Jr.: A proven Big Ten scorer, Gayle brings downhill power, shot-making, and defensive versatility. His ability to create off the dribble and thrive in physical matchups complements Cadeau’s pass-first style, creating a poised and productive backcourt duo.
- Cason: A rising sophomore with length and quickness, Cason provides energy on both ends of the floor. A confident on-ball defender and emerging scorer, he adds depth, pace, and competitiveness to the rotation.
- McKenney: The 2025 Michigan Mr. Basketball and five-star freshman arrives with advanced strength, scoring polish, and maturity beyond his years. A versatile 6-4 guard capable of creating his own shot or playing through contact, McKenney provides immediate impact potential and long-term star upside in the Wolverines’ backcourt.

Down-to-the-Wire Wolverines

- Under Dusty May, U-M has 19 games (15-4) decided by four points or fewer.
- After dropping four of the first six such contests, the Wolverines have rattled off 13 straight wins in games decided by four or fewer.
- Michigan’s 13 close-game victories in 2024-25 tied Bradley (1985-86) for the most wins by four points or fewer in a single season in NCAA history.

- Overall, Michigan has produced 32 first-round NBA Draft selections, highlighted by two No. 1 overall picks -- Cazzie Russell (1966) and Chris Webber (1993) -- along with six top-five and 19 lottery picks (Nos. 1-14).
- U-M is one of only six programs in NCAA history with multiple No. 1 overall picks. Michigan joins elite company: Duke, Kentucky, UCLA, UNLV, and Cincinnati.
- The Wolverines have had multiple first-rounders in the same draft five times: 1990: Rumeal Robinson (10), Loy Vaught (13), Terry Mills (16); 1994: Juwan Howard (5) and Jalen Rose (13); 2013: Trey Burke (9) and Tim Hardaway Jr. (24); 2014: Nik Stauskas (8), Mitch McGary (21); and 2023: Kobe Bufkin (15) and Jett Howard (20).
- U-M has had at least one player selected in seven of the last nine drafts, highlighted by recent first-rounders Franz Wagner (2021), Jett Howard (2023), Kobe Bufkin (2023), and Danny Wolf (2025).
- In July 2024, Franz Wagner signed a five-year, \$224 million rookie max extension with the Orlando Magic -- the largest contract ever signed by a former Wolverine.
- The 12 former Wolverines currently active in the NBA have combined to earn more than \$470 million in career earnings. With an additional \$422 million in guaranteed future contracts, this group is projected to surpass \$890 million in total NBA earnings.

Michigan: Year One

- In his first season in Ann Arbor, Dusty May guided Michigan to a 27-10 record, a runner-up Big Ten regular-season finish (14-6), and as the No. 3 seed, captured the program's fourth Big Ten Tournament championship.
- After earning a double-bye in the Big Ten Tournament, U-M defeated Purdue (86-68) and edged Maryland in a last-second thriller (81-80) to advance to the title game. The Wolverines then overcame an 11-point second-half deficit to defeat Wisconsin (59-53) and claim the 2025 Big Ten Tournament crown.
- May led the Maize and Blue back to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2022, where Michigan earned two opening-round victories -- over No. 12 UC San Diego (68-65) and No. 4 Texas A&M (91-79) -- to advance to the Sweet 16 for the sixth straight season. U-M's postseason run ended with a 78-65 loss to No. 1 Auburn.

The Florida Atlantic Era: The Rise

- When May was introduced as head coach at Florida Atlantic University in 2018, he inherited a program with only one winning season in the previous decade. In just six years, he transformed the Owls into a nationally recognized contender.
- In his debut season (2018-19), May guided the Owls to a 17-16 record, delivering the program's first winning campaign since 2010-11. By 2021-22, FAU had achieved four consecutive winning seasons -- a first in school history.
- The 2022-23 season became the defining breakthrough: a Division I-leading 35 wins, both Conference USA regular-season and tournament championships, and the program's first-ever NCAA Tournament appearance, which culminated in a historic trip to the Final Four.
- The momentum carried into 2023-24, as FAU spent multiple weeks ranked in the national polls, earned back-to-back NCAA Tournament bids for the first time ever, and marked its successful transition into the American Athletic Conference.
- Over six seasons (2018-24), May compiled a 126-69 record, setting school records for overall wins, postseason appearances, and national rankings -- a tenure that redefined Florida Atlantic basketball on the national stage.

The Climb: Building Experience

- May joined Billy Kennedy's staff at Murray State (2006-07) before spending two seasons at UAB (2007-09) under former Indiana head coach Mike Davis, gaining valuable insight into pace, spacing, and offensive execution.
- From 2009-11, May reunited with Kennedy at Murray State, helping the Racers capture the 2010 Ohio Valley Conference championship and earn a first-round NCAA Tournament victory -- the program's first in more than two decades.
- He followed Kennedy to Louisiana Tech (2011-15), where the Bulldogs rose to national prominence as one of the country's most efficient mid-major programs. During May's four-year tenure, Louisiana Tech produced three straight 27-plus win seasons and made back-to-back NIT appearances.
- In 2015, May moved to the Southeastern Conference, joining Mike White's staff at Florida. Over three seasons (2015-18), he helped the Gators reach multiple NCAA Tournaments, including a run to the 2017 Elite Eight, while earning a reputation as one of the SEC's sharpest offensive minds.
- That success and his growing reputation for player development and offensive creativity paved the way for May's first head coaching opportunity, when he was introduced as the head coach at Florida Atlantic University in March 2018.

Catching the Bug: How It Began

- May's coaching journey began at his alma mater, Indiana University, where he served as a student manager under legendary head coach Bob Knight from 1996-2000. During those formative years in Bloomington, he absorbed the program's principles of discipline, preparation, and attention to detail that would anchor his own coaching philosophy.
- After graduation, May transitioned into video coordination and administrative roles at both USC and Indiana, gaining valuable early experience in player development, opponent scouting, and program operations while building relationships that would shape his coaching path.
- In 2005, May earned his first full-time assistant coaching position at Eastern Michigan under former Michigan assistant Charles E. Ramsey (2005-06) -- marking his official entry into the Division I coaching ranks and the beginning of a steady climb through the profession.

Mike Boynton Jr. | Assistant Coach

- Brings two decades of collegiate coaching experience, including seven seasons as head coach. He spent eight years with Oklahoma State (2017-24) -- the final seven at the helm -- following assistant stints under Brad Underwood at Stephen F. Austin and with the Cowboys.

- Boynton is recognized for his defensive acumen, player-first leadership, and culture-driven approach, serving as Michigan's defensive coordinator under Dusty May.


