The Title Game

- Michigan is making its eighth national title game appearance after winning its seventh straight national semifinal.
- U-M punched its ticket the 2026 national title game with wins over No. 16 Howard (101-80), No. 9 Saint Louis (95-72), No. 4 Alabama (90-77), No. 6 Tennessee (95-62) and No. 1 Arizona (91-73).
- The Wolverines are seeking their second national championship, having won the 1989 title in Seattle with an overtime victory against Seton Hall.
- Michigan is playing in its third national title game since 2013, tied for the second-most in the nation, with North Carolina behind only UConn's four.
- Head coach Dusty May is coaching in his first national championship game.

Some NCAA Notables

- Michigan has 90+ points, 25+ field goals, 15+ assists and 10+ three-pointers in all five NCAA Tournament games.
- U-M is the eighth team to win five NCAA Tournament games by double digits entering the national title game; six of the previous seven went on to win the championship, including UConn (2023, 2024) and Villanova (2018).
- Michigan's 18-point win over No. 1 seed Arizona (91-73) is the largest margin of victory ever between No. 1 seeds. It also marked the first 18+ point loss by a No. 1 seed since UMBC's 74-54 (+20) win over Virginia in 2018.
- Six Wolverines are averaging double figures in the NCAA Tournament, with a seventh at 8.8 points per game. Yaxel Lendeborg leads at 19.0 points per game.
- Lendeborg is the first Wolverine with three straight 20-point NCAA Tournament games since Juwan Howard had four in a row in 1994. He is the fourth Wolverine to do it, joining Glen Rice (6; 1989), Howard, and Cazzie Russell (3; 1965).
- Elliot Cadeau has five straight games with seven-plus assists and two straight of 10 helpers. His 43 assists (13 turnovers) are the second most by a Wolverine in the NCAA Tournament, trailing only Rumeal Robinson (56; 1989).
- Cadeau's two 10-assist games vs. Tennessee and Arizona give him two in this NCAA Tournament, matching Gary Grant (2) for second most in program history. Robinson holds the record with three.
- Cadeau recorded the program's first NCAA Tournament point-assist double-double since Derrick Walton Jr.'s 26-point, 11-assist effort vs. Louisville in 2017. It also marks just the second such double-double in a Final Four, joining Rumeal Robinson's 23-point, 10-assist performance in 1989.
- With 43 assists in the NCAA Tournament, Elliot Cadeau has set his new single-season record with 232 total assists.

- Michigan secured the outright 2026 Big Ten regular-season title, its first since 2020-21.
- The Wolverines won the championship by four games and finished 19-1 in conference play, setting both program and Big Ten records for league victories in a season. The 19 wins are the most ever by a Big Ten team.
- Along the way to its record 19 conference wins, Michigan went 10-0 on the road, marking the first time in 50 years a Big Ten team finished unbeaten in conference road games. The last to do so was Indiana, which went 9-0 during the 1975-76 season.
- Michigan fact: U-M legendary duo Cazzie Russell and Bill Buntin helped lead the Wolverines to three straight Big Ten titles in 1964, 1965 and 1966.

Who is Michigan?

The Leaders & Best

- U-M is built on reliability, confidence, passion, relationships, responsibility, humility, and a shared willingness to sacrifice for the greater good of the team.
- Dusty May emphasizes collective excellence over individual accolades, fostering a team-first culture rooted in trust, accountability, and unselfish play.
- Offensively, the Wolverines play at a fast pace with an emphasis on transition opportunities and a read-and-react system. The attack is driven by spacing, long-range shooting, and multiple ball-screen actions. Ball movement is non-negotiable, with players encouraged to pass up good shots for great ones and to shoot decisively and confidently.
- Defensively, Michigan employs an active man-to-man scheme highlighted by frequent switching on both on- and off-ball actions. The Wolverines typically exchange all four perimeter positions while maintaining traditional coverage with the five. Constant communication, active hands, and disruptive energy are demanded on every possession.
- Staff collaboration is central to the program's identity. Akeem Miskdeen and Drew Williamson work closely with May in coordinating the offense, while Mike Boynton Jr., Justin Joyner, and Kyle Church oversee defensive principles, game-to-game adjustments, and player development.
- Scouting responsibilities are shared across the staff: Boynton handles most scouts individually, the Joyner/Williamson tandem collaborates on assignments, and Church and Miskdeen form the third scouting pair -- ensuring comprehensive preparation and attention to detail.

Roster Construction

- In his first two seasons, head coach Dusty May has aggressively rebuilt Michigan's roster, adding 18 new players through a combination of the transfer portal, international recruiting, and prep signings.
- Roster philosophy centers on toughness, basketball IQ, and a team-first mindset -- cornerstones of May's "connected culture" built on trust, accountability, and shared purpose.
- Each recruiting cycle has intentionally blended experienced transfers with elite young talent, aligning with May's belief in pairing maturity and immediate impact with long-term development.

The Frontcourt

- With Yaxel Lendeborg (6-9), Morez Johnson Jr. (6-9), Aday Mara (7-3), and Malick Kordel (7-2), Michigan features one of the tallest and most physically imposing frontcourts in the nation, combining size, strength, mobility, and versatility.
- Lendeborg is a relentless rebounder and interior anchor who led all of Division I with 26 double-doubles last season at UAB, pairing physicality with consistent production on both ends of the floor.
- Johnson Jr. provides a powerful freshman presence, bringing strength, athleticism, and defensive toughness that translate immediately in the paint and on the glass.
- Mara, a 7-foot-3 transfer from UCLA and member of Spain's National Team, adds elite size, advanced passing instincts, and high-level international experience to Michigan's interior attack.
- Kordel is a 7-foot-2 newcomer from Germany whose combination of mobility and long-term upside adds depth and developmental potential to the Wolverines' frontcourt rotation.

The Backcourt

- Elliot Cadeau, Roddy Gayle Jr., LJ Cason and Trey McKenney form a steady, high-IQ backcourt, blending tempo control, scoring balance, and defensive toughness while anchoring Michigan's perimeter rotation.
- Cadeau is a dynamic playmaker who ranked among the ACC's assist leaders at North Carolina (5.1 apg) while starting every game over two seasons. His vision, pace, and command of the offense give Michigan a true floor general to orchestrate Dusty May's system.
- Gayle Jr. brings proven scoring ability, downhill power, and defensive versatility. A physical guard who can create off the dribble or knock down shots from the perimeter, he thrives in contact and adds experience to the backcourt.
- Cason, a rising sophomore with length and quickness, supplies energy on both ends of the floor. A confident on-ball defender and emerging scorer, he adds pace, competitiveness, and depth to the rotation.
- McKenney, the 2025 Michigan Mr. Basketball and a five-star freshman, arrives with advanced strength, scoring polish, and maturity beyond his years. The versatile 6-foot-4 guard can create his own shot, score through contact, and impact the game immediately at both guard spots.

Broadcasting the Wolverines

The Finale: Michigan & UConn

- Michigan and UConn are even all-time at 2-2, including a 1-1 split on neutral floors, with UConn winning the most recent matchup in the Battle 4 Atlantis in 2015 (74-60). The programs also met in home-and-home series during the 2008-09 and 2009-10 seasons.
- The series dates to 1939, when Michigan earned a 62-45 win in White Plains, N.Y. Despite four meetings, the teams have never faced off as ranked foes, though UConn was ranked in three of those games.
- Dusty May brings Final Four experience on both sides of this matchup, leading FAU in 2023 and Michigan in 2026, while UConn also reached the Final Four in both seasons.
- UConn's Elite Eight leading scorer, Tarris Reed Jr., is a former Wolverine, playing 66 games at Michigan with 404 points, 362 rebounds, and 77 blocks before his breakout run with the Huskies.

How Michigan Advanced to the Title Game

- Michigan raced past No. 1 seed Arizona, 91-73, to reach its third national championship game since 2013, leading wire-to-wire by as many as 30 while hitting 12 three-pointers (44.4%) and holding Arizona to 36.6 percent shooting and 35.3 percent from three.
- Aday Mara led five Wolverines in double figures with a career-high 26 points and nine rebounds, while Trey McKenney (16), Elliot Cadeau (13), Yaxel Lendeborg (11) and Morez Johnson Jr. (10) followed.
- Cadeau posted a 13-point, 10-assist double-double, the ninth double-double (point-assist) in U-M NCAA Tournament history and the third in a Final Four; Rumeal Robinson had two in 1989.
- Michigan rolled past No. 6 seed Tennessee, 95-62, to reach its ninth Final Four and third since 2013.
- U-M used a 21-0 first-half run -- part of a 27-4 surge -- to build a 48-26 halftime lead, holding Tennessee to 10 points over the final 11 minutes.
- Midwest Region MOP Lendeborg led with 27 points, seven rebounds, four assists and two blocks, recording his third straight 20+ point game, while 10 Wolverines scored; Johnson Jr. (12), Mara (11) and McKenney (10) also reached double figures.
- In the Sweet 16, Michigan rallied past Alabama, 90-77, behind Lendeborg's 23 points and 12 rebounds, with Cadeau (17), McKenney (17) and Roddy Gayle Jr. (16) adding balance.
- Michigan broke the game open with a pair of 8-0 runs, holding Alabama to two field goals over an 11-shot stretch and 28 second-half points.
- Michigan opened with 196 points in Buffalo, defeating Howard Bison men's basketball (101-80) and Saint Louis Billikens men's basketball (95-72).
- Against Saint Louis, Lendeborg scored 25 and all five starters reached double figures as U-M pulled away with a decisive second-half run, holding the Billikens to two field goals over eight minutes.
- Michigan shot a program NCAA Tournament record 67.2 percent against Howard, led by Johnson Jr.'s 21 points (8-for-8) and 10 rebounds; Mara added 19 points, seven rebounds, six assists and three blocks as U-M used runs of 12-1 and 21-3 to pull away.

Michigan & the Final Four

- U-M has reached its ninth Final Four, including three appearances over its last 10 NCAA Tournaments.
- The Wolverines earned their fourth No. 1 seed in program history in the 2026 Midwest Region, joining the 1985 (Southeast), 1993 (West) and 2021 (East) teams.
- Five coaches have led Michigan to the Final Four: Dave Strack (1964, 1965), Johnny Orr (1976), Steve Fisher (1989, 1992, 1993), John Beilein (2013, 2018) and Dusty May (2026).

Michigan & the Elite Eight

Michigan & the Sweet 16

- The Sweet 16 appearance gave Dusty May his third second weekend trip in the last four seasons, after guiding Florida Atlantic to the 2023 Final Four and Michigan to the Sweet 16 last season.

The Conference Accolades Pour In

- Yaxel Lendeborg was named Big Ten Player of the Year. He was a unanimous Player of the Year selection by the Big Ten media. Lendeborg is the first Wolverine to earn the honor since Trey Burke (2013) and Nik Stauskas (2014). Overall, it marked Michigan's ninth Player of the Year honor in program history.
- Lendeborg also became the 28th Wolverine to earn All-Big Ten first team honors by the coaches and media, marking the program's 41st selection by the coaches and 42nd by the media.
- Aday Mara was named Big Ten Defensive Player of the Year while adding third team All-Big Ten honors from both the coaches and media. He is just the second Wolverine ever to win the award and the first since Gary Grant (1986, 1987).
- Morez Johnson Jr. earned All-Big Ten second team (media) and third team (coaches) honors. Elliot Cadeau received All-Big Ten honorable mention (media), Trey McKenney was selected to the All-Freshman Team (14th Wolverine honoree) and Will Tschetter was named U-M's Big Ten Sportsmanship Award recipient.
- Lendeborg, Mara and Johnson were named to the Big Ten All-Defensive Team. The trio matches Michigan's previous all-time total of All-Defensive Team honorees (Ekpe Udoh (2008), Jordan Morgan (2013), Xavier Simpson (2019)).

A New Big Ten Standard

- Winnings its final 15 games, Michigan set a program, and Big Ten, record with 19 conference wins. U-M finished 19-1 to win the league by four games.
- U-M is the first Big Ten team to reach 19 league wins since the conference moved to a 20-game schedule in 2018-19.
- The Wolverines' 19 record-setting wins surpassed Indiana's back-to-back 18-win seasons in 1974-75 (18-0) and 1975-76 (18-0) for the conference record.
- Adding to the 19-win record, U-M's 71-68 win at Iowa (March 5) helped the Wolverines finish 10-0 in Big Ten road games, becoming the first team in 50 years to go unbeaten in conference road play.
- The last Big Ten team to finish undefeated in conference road games was Indiana, which went 9-0 in back-to-back seasons (1974-75 and 1975-76).

Recapping the Big Ten Tournament

- Michigan earned the No. 1 seed for the fourth time and its first triple bye as the tournament expanded to include all 18 teams and an extra day of play.
- In the quarterfinal, Michigan defeated No. 8 seed Ohio State, 71-67. Aday Mara led the Wolverines with 17 points on 7-for-9 shooting with seven rebounds and two blocks, while Elliot Cadeau added 15 points and seven assists. Michigan closed holding the Buckeyes to one field goal over their final nine attempts.
- In the semifinal, Big Ten Player of the Year Yaxel Lendeborg drilled a three-pointer with 0.3 seconds remaining to lift Michigan to a 68-65 victory over No. 5 seed Wisconsin. Lendeborg finished with 12 points and five rebounds, while Mara added 16 points, eight rebounds and five blocks and Cadeau scored 15 points.
- In the championship game, No. 3-ranked Michigan fell to No. 18 Purdue, 80-72. Lendeborg led the Wolverines with 20 points and four three-pointers, while Mara added 14 points and Cadeau recorded a double-double with 10 points and 10 assists. The teams were tied 38-38 at halftime before Purdue opened the second half shooting 11-for-13 to take control.

Michigan: Year One

- In his first season in Ann Arbor, Dusty May guided Michigan to a 27-10 record, a runner-up Big Ten regular-season finish (14-6), and as the No. 3 seed, captured the program's fourth Big Ten Tournament championship.
- After earning a double-bye in the Big Ten Tournament, U-M defeated Purdue (86-68) and edged Maryland in a last-second thriller (81-80) to advance to the title game. The Wolverines then overcame an 11-point second-half deficit to defeat Wisconsin (59-53) and claim the 2025 Big Ten Tournament crown.
- May led the Maize and Blue back to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2022, where Michigan earned two opening-round victories -- over No. 12 UC San Diego (68-65) and No. 4 Texas A&M (91-79) -- to advance to the Sweet 16 for the sixth straight tournament.

The Florida Atlantic Era: The Rise

- When May was introduced as head coach at Florida Atlantic in 2018, he inherited a program with only one winning season in the previous decade. In six years, he transformed the Owls into a nationally recognized contender.
- In his debut season (2018-19), May guided the Owls to a 17-16 record, delivering the program's first winning campaign since 2010-11. By 2021-22, FAU had achieved four consecutive winning seasons -- a first in school history.
- The 2022-23 season became the defining breakthrough: a Division I-leading 35 wins, both Conference USA regular-season and tournament championships, and the program's first-ever NCAA Tournament appearance, which culminated in a historic trip to the Final Four.
- The momentum carried into 2023-24, as FAU spent multiple weeks ranked in the national polls, earned back-to-back NCAA Tournament bids for the first time ever, and marked its successful transition into the American Conference.
- Over six seasons (2018-24), May compiled a 126-69 record, setting school records for overall wins, postseason appearances, and national rankings -- a tenure that redefined Florida Atlantic basketball on the national stage.

The Climb: Building Experience

- May joined Billy Kennedy's staff at Murray State (2006-07) before spending two seasons at UAB (2007-09) under former Indiana head coach Mike Davis, gaining valuable insight into pace, spacing, and offensive execution.
- From 2009-11, May reunited with Kennedy at Murray State, helping the Racers capture the 2010 Ohio Valley Conference championship and earn a first-round NCAA Tournament victory -- the program's first in more than two decades.
- He followed Kennedy to Louisiana Tech (2011-15), where the Bulldogs rose to national prominence as one of the country's most efficient mid-major programs. During May's four-year tenure, Louisiana Tech produced three straight 27-plus win seasons and made back-to-back NIT appearances.
- In 2015, May moved to the Southeastern Conference, joining Mike White's staff at Florida. Over three seasons (2015-18), he helped the Gators reach multiple NCAA Tournaments, including a run to the 2017 Elite Eight, while earning a reputation as one of the SEC's sharpest offensive minds.
- That success and his growing reputation for player development and offensive creativity paved the way for May's first head coaching opportunity, when he was introduced as the head coach at Florida Atlantic University in March 2018.

Catching the Bug: How It Began

- May's coaching journey began at his alma mater, Indiana University, where he served as a student manager under legendary head coach Bob Knight from 1996-2000. During those formative years in Bloomington, he absorbed the program's principles of discipline, preparation, and attention to detail that would anchor his own coaching philosophy.
- After graduation, May transitioned into video coordination and administrative roles at both USC and Indiana, gaining valuable early experience in player development, opponent scouting, and program operations while building relationships that would shape his coaching path.
- In 2005, May earned his first full-time assistant coaching position at Eastern Michigan under former Michigan assistant Charles E. Ramsey (2005-06) -- marking his official entry into the Division I coaching ranks and the beginning of a steady climb through the profession.

- Williamson had coaching stops at Old Dominion and Virginia State, where he built a reputation for his leadership, guard development, and defensive instruction.
- A Virginia Beach native, Williamson was an All-CAA guard at Old Dominion, known for his on-court toughness and leadership qualities he now channels into developing Michigan's backcourt and overall team culture.

Michigan >> ProBlue

- U-M's 78 all-time draft selections ranks second among Big Ten programs (behind Indiana, 86) and is top-10 nationally in Draft picks.
- Since 2011, U-M has had 18 players drafted, including 12 first-rounders and four lottery picks -- the most among Big Ten programs during that span.
- Overall, Michigan has produced 32 first-round NBA Draft selections, highlighted by two No. 1 overall picks -- Cazzie Russell (1966) and Chris Webber (1993) -- along with six top-five and 19 lottery picks (Nos. 1-14).
- U-M is one of only six programs in NCAA history with multiple No. 1 overall picks. Michigan joins elite company: Duke, Kentucky, UCLA, UNLV, and Cincinnati.
- The Wolverines have had multiple first-rounders in the same draft five times: 1990: Rumeal Robinson (10), Loy Vaught (13), Terry Mills (16); 1994: Juwan Howard (5) and Jalen Rose (13); 2013: Trey Burke (9) and Tim Hardaway Jr. (24); 2014: Nik Stauskas (8), Mitch McGary (21); and 2023: Kobe Bufkin (15) and Jett Howard (20).
- U-M has had at least one player selected in seven of the last nine drafts, highlighted by recent first-rounders Franz Wagner (2021), Jett Howard (2023), Kobe Bufkin (2023), and Danny Wolf (2025).
- In 2024, Franz Wagner signed a five-year, \$224 million rookie max extension with the Orlando Magic -- the largest contract ever signed by a former Wolverine.
- The 12 former Wolverines currently active in the NBA have combined to earn more than \$470 million in career earnings. With an additional \$422 million in guaranteed future contracts, this group is projected to surpass \$890 million in total NBA earnings.

Basketball Hall of Fame Wolverines

- **Cazzie Russell** (Class of 2011): U-M's first No. 1 overall pick (1966) and 1966 National Player of the Year; later an NBA All-Star and 1970 champion with the Knicks.
- **Rudy Tomjanovich** (Class of 2020): Five-time NBA All-Star turned two-time championship coach with Houston ('94, '95); one of Michigan's all-time great scorers.
- **Chris Webber** (Class of 2021): No. 1 pick in 1993, five-time All-Star and 1994 Rookie of the Year; the dynamic centerpiece of the iconic Fab Five.

NBA Champion Wolverines

- **Robert Harrison**, Minneapolis Lakers (1950, 1952, 1953): Three-time champion and one of the first Wolverines to play in the NBA.
- **Cazzie Russell**, New York Knicks (1970): Helped deliver the Knicks' first championship in franchise history.
- **Mike McGee**, L.A. Lakers (1982, 1985): Two-time "Showtime" champion alongside Magic Johnson and Kareem Abdul-Jabbar.
- **Rudy Tomjanovich (HC)**, Houston Rockets (1994, 1995): Guided Hakeem Olajuwon's Rockets to back-to-back titles as head coach.
- **Glen Rice**, L.A. Lakers (2000): Starting forward and key perimeter scorer on the first Kobe-Shaq title team.
- **Juwan Howard**, Miami Heat (2012, 2013): Closed his 19-year playing career with two titles alongside LeBron James and Dwyane Wade.
- **Jordan Poole**, Golden State Warriors (2022): Became the youngest Wolverine NBA champion, helping Warriors' secure their fourth championship in eight years.
