### REDHAWKS HEAD TO WEST VIRGINIA TO BATTLE CONFERENCE FOE

**MARSHALL:** The Miami baseball team was riding high after sweeping its Mid-American Conference series last weekend against Buffalo, but was brought down to earth this week by Wright State and Cincinnati. The RedHawks, however, are confident going into this weekend's series carrying a 7-5 MAC record and 58-21 all-time record against the Thundering Herd.

Last season the Red and White took three-of-four games at home against Marshall. In its three victories Miami outscored Marshall by a 31-9 count. The lone loss, however, was a 15-0 drubbing by the Thundering Herd. Head Coach Tracy Smith has had success in his six-year tenure against Marshall, winning 11 contests while only dropping five. This could be an opportunity for the RedHawks to move up in the conference standings, as Marshall is 4-7 in the East Division, and next week's opponent Ohio is 2-9.

## Miami University, Please

When referring to Miami, please use Miami University, Miami University (Ohio) or Miami (Ohio) University as a first reference to our institution. Please do not use Miami of Ohio, University of Miami of Ohio, etc. Also, in 1997, the University began using its new nickname, the RedHawks. It is one word with a capital H. Thank you.

**RECENT REDHAWK ACTION:** The RedHawks were dealt two crushing blows this week by Wright State and Cincinnati. Miami lost its first extra-inning contest of the season when Wright State hit a three-run home run in the top of the 11th inning to win 10-7 on Tuesday. One day later at UC's Johnny Bench Field, where the RedHawks won 11-5 earlier this season, the Bearcats drilled Miami for 18 runs and a dominating victory.

Prior to this week's two losses the Red and White swept its first conference series since last year at home against Akron (May 5-7). The RedHawks used wins of 9-8, 9-3, 11-3 and 14-3 to send the Buffalo Bulls home packing with four losses. The four victories not only launched the RedHawks into third place in the MAC East Division, but also ended a six-of-seven game losing streak.

**SCOUTING THE THUNDERING HERD:** After opening their 2002 campaign with five losses the Thundering Herd proceeded to win 13 of their next 25 contests. Trouble has struck Marshall for a second time this season in the form of another five-game losing streak. Last weekend the Thundering Herd were swept in a four-game MAC series by Bowling Green, getting outscored 40-25. Their most recent losing streak was extended to five games when Dayton blasted Marshall 14-4 on Wednesday, April 24 in Dayton, Ohio.

The road hasn't yielded much fun for the Thundering Herd who maintain a 1-14 record away from Huntington, W.Va. Things at home have been different though for Marshall, which has won 10 contests at its friendly confines while losing six.

With a 9.13 team earned run average the Thundering Herd have been forced to put up major runs on the scoreboard in order to win, and that is just what they have done in their 13 victories. Marshall is averaging 10.1 runs per game when it wins and a paltry 5.2 runs per game in its 22 losses.

Providing much of this offense are five individuals who are all batting above the .300 mark. Senior Matt White boasts the teams best average at .341, and also paces the Thundering Herd with 11 doubles and 30 RBI. Four batters are clustered together in between .313-.317. Senior Ryan Kobbe (.317), senior David Colangelo (.317), freshman Greg Hiller (.314) and sophomore Mike Koitsopoulos (.313) are Marshall's next four batting leaders. Hiller is tied for the team lead with seven dingers.

Even with its high ERA Marshall has one hurler who has been getting plenty of work, 21 appearances, in sophomore righthander Chris Meadows. Meadows leads the MAC in appearances and is Marshall's most reliable pitcher with a 5.85 ERA. The MAC's East Division Pitcher of the Week on Feb. 25, Meadows posts a perfect 2-0 record.

**LIVESTATS NOW AVAILABLE:** All home Miami baseball games are available now on the internet via [www.MURedHawks.com](http://www.MURedHawks.com). The gamecast is very similar to what ESPN.com and CBS.Sportsline.com run on their websites. The Red and White play home next on May 3-5 when intrastate rival Ohio comes to McKie Field at Hayden Park.

**HOW THEY STACK UP AGAINST EACH OTHER:** Miami junior **Mike Galloway (St. Thomas, Ontario/Central Michigan)** fell into sixth in the conference in batting average (.400) after a recent slump. He does, however, retain the conference lead in runs scored (43). He also is ranked in the MAC's top ten for home runs (t-6th), hits (3rd), triples (t-5th), RBI (4th), total bases (5th), on-base percentage (5th) and slugging percentage (9th).

Junior **Chris Leonard** (Columbus, Ohio/St. Francis DeSales) is one of two RedHawk hurlers in the league's leaders with a 3.67 ERA, putting him sixth in the MAC. Ranked 14th in the conference with a 4.95 ERA is senior **Russ Bayer** (Naperville, Ill./Naperville North).

Miami's defense also has been a surprise as the infield is tied for second in the league with 35 double plays. Kent State has turned 39 DPs.

**HEAD COACH TRACY SMITH:** In his sixth year at Miami, Smith has reached the Mid-American Conference Tournament finals four times and claimed the 2000 championship to earn a trip to the NCAA Tournament. Smith, who was named the 2000 Ohio College Coach of the Year, has amassed a 189-147 (.562) career record and a Mid-American Conference regular-season record of 93-67 (.581). He is only the fourth baseball coach in school history to register 150 wins, which occurred with Miami's 3-1 win at Buffalo on April 13, 2001.

During Smith's era in Oxford, Miami players have been named to the all-MAC First Team eight times, and three also were named to last year's all-tournament team. In addition, 15 student-athletes have been recognized as academic all-MAC selections, including 2001 Verizon academic all-American Luke Reinhart. Last year, right fielder Jason Knoedler added another notch to Smith's belt by being named a second-team all-American.

**COOK-IE CRUNCH:** Junior **David Cook (Columbus, Ohio/St. Francis DeSales)** has been on a tear for the RedHawks in the last six games hitting at a .440 clip (11-25). During this stretch he has hit two doubles and had a career day at Cincinnati with two home runs. It was his first career multi-homer game. His two home runs at UC move him into a tie for the RedHawk lead with Galloway, each with eight dingers.

**EDGINTON FINDS HIS SWING:** Posting even better numbers than Cook over the last six games has been sophomore **Ryan Edginton (Chester Springs, Pa./Arizona State)**. In 21 at-bats Edginton has connected 11 times for a .524 batting average. Five of his 11 hits have been doubles while two have been triples. He has been perfect on the basepaths swiping two bags, and has not committed an error in 11 chances at his right field position. His six-game hitting streak is the RedHawk's longest entering this weekend's trip to Marshall.

**TOO MUCH TO BAYER FOR OPPONENTS:** Senior hurler **Russ Bayer** has been a stud on the hill for Miami this season. With a 6-1 record Bayer brings his career total to 27 victories. His 27 wins place him in a tie for second all-time at Miami with Nate Tekavec (1998-00). Bayer also ranks in the top ten of several other categories in Miami's history including innings pitched (7th), strikeouts (9th) and games (8th). Even more impressive is that his 27 victories put him in a tie for ninth all-time in the MAC.

**KIENINGER MAKING AN APPEARANCE:** Senior **Billy Kieninger** (Xenia, Ohio/Xenia) has appeared in 14 out of 38 games for the RedHawks, the most of any Miami pitcher. He has posted a 3-3 record in these 14 games, but more importantly has accumulated 63 career appearances to move into a tie for fourth all time at Miami.

**BAD CONNECTION AT THE DISH:** Through 38 games the RedHawks have made that long walk back to the dugout 290 times. At their current pace of 7.63 strikeouts per game the RedHawks will surpass last season's mark of 398 by 60 (458).

Miami also has not been very good at avoiding the double play, hitting into 29 of them compared to last year's mark of 25.

**HOMEWARD BOUND:** Juniors **Mike Galloway** and **David Cook**, and sophomore **Josh Widlansky (Coral Springs, Fla./Travella)** have hit the ball when it counts this season, leading the RedHawks with .442, .404 and .421 batting averages with runners in scoring position, respectively. Galloway has plated 30 of his team-leading 40 RBI with runners in scoring position, while Cook has accounted for 29 of his 35 RBI with RISP.

Widlansky made noise early in the season with a game-winning walk-off grand slam against Georgia State, but has been even more important as Miami's best pinch hitter. In 12 pinch-hit at-bats Widlansky has connected four times (.333).

**LUCKY SEVEN NOT SO LUCKY FOR SLONE:** Freshman **John Slone** went two-for-three at Indiana on April 9 to extend his hitting streak to seven games, but the streak came at a cost. In his fourth plate appearance Slone drew a base on balls but was hit on the hand during the at-bat. The result was an unfavorable one for the RedHawks as Slone's left-hand pinky was broken. His time out of the lineup is undisclosed, but he could see time in the designated hitter slot.

**ARMED AND READY BEHIND THE PLATE:** Miami's trio of catchers have been stingy on would-be basestealers this season, throwing out one runner for every 1.4 successful swipes (19-45). Freshman **Nolan McCue** (Chicago, Ill./De La Salle) has gunned down 83.3 percent (10-12) of runners that have attempted to steal against his arm to lead the RedHawk backstops. **John Slone** has allowed 15 thefts on 18 attempts, while freshman **Kurt Weigle** (West Lafayette, Ind./Benton Central) has thrown out 40.0 percent (4-10) of basestealers against him.

**DON'T CALL IT A COMEBACK:** The Miami bullpen has been solid this season when it has a lead entering the seventh inning. The RedHawks are 12-0 when entering the seventh inning and 14-0 when leading after eight innings are complete. This past week seniors **Billy Kieninger** and **Shawn Landis** (Pleasant Hills, Ohio/Dayton) both recorded their first saves of the season for Miami.

Both Kieninger and Landis are scheduled to make their second starts of the season this weekend against Marshall.

**GALLOWAY EARNS FIRST PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONORS FOR MIAMI:**

Junior first baseman **Mike Galloway** was named the Mid-American Conference's East Division Player of the Week after leading the Miami University baseball team in several offensive categories during the team's spring break trip to Boca Raton, Fla. The award is both the RedHawks' and Galloway's first of the 2002 season.

The junior transfer led the RedHawks with a .464 (13-for-28) batting average, 11 RBI and eight runs scored in seven games in Florida. He opened the week with a five-RBI performance against Monmouth, which included crossing the plate three times in Miami's 16-1 rain-shortened victory against the Hawks. The next day against Radford, Galloway went 4-for-5 with a double and a triple, finishing just a home run short of hitting for the cycle. In the seven games, Galloway had four multi-hit games as well as three multi-run and multi-RBI contests.

Galloway's bat was a crucial component of the RedHawks' 12-7 victory over Kansas State on March 14, going 3-for-6 with three RBI. The two most important Galloway RBI were the two that came courtesy of a two-run shot in the sixth inning which put the Red and White on top for good, 8-7. Until an 0-for-3 performance against Florida Atlantic, Galloway had registered a hit in 10 straight contests for Miami.

**LEONARD EARNS PRESEASON HONOR:** Junior left-handed pitcher **Chris Leonard** was selected by the *Collegiate Baseball* newspaper as a member of the 2002 Louisville Slugger third-team pre-season all-America team. This is the second pre-season honor garnered by the junior southpaw.

Last season with the RedHawks, Leonard led the team with an 11-3 record and was fourth in the Mid-American Conference with a 3.36 ERA in 17 appearances. Twice during the 2001 campaign Leonard was named the East Division Pitcher of the Week. He broke Miami's single-season record for innings pitched with 112.2 and tied the single-season record of 11 wins.

**LEONARD NAMED CAPE COD BASEBALL LEAGUE PITCHER OF THE YEAR:**

Leonard added to his resume this summer when he led the Cape League Baseball League with a 6-0 record and a paltry 0.98 earned run average. In 55 innings pitched, the lefty struck out 64 and walked only 11, resulting

in a 5.8/1 K/BB ratio. On July 8, Leonard was named the Cape's Pitcher of the Week after fanning 15 Falmouth hitters and walking none in a complete game victory. His ERA that week was 0.38. He wrapped up the summer by leading the Gatemen to the CCBL championship and was named the Cape Cod Baseball League Pitcher of the Year.

Also on the Wareham Gatemen were senior left-hander **Russ Bayer** and junior first basemen **Mike Galloway**.

**A MAJOR TRANSFER-ANCE OF OFFENSE:** Lost from last season's RedHawk team is 74.6 percent of its run production and 59 of its 73 dingers. However, Miami has received a pleasant boost at the plate in transfers Mike Galloway and Ryan Edginton.

A likely candidate for the starting job at first base, Galloway comes to the RedHawks after two solid seasons with MAC foe Central Michigan. In 2000, Galloway was named a freshman all-American after batting .345 with 11 roundtrippers and a team-high 47 RBI. Edginton, a redshirt transfer from Arizona State, has been swinging the lumber with confidence throughout preseason and is Miami's starting right fielder.

**REDHAWKS TABBED TO FINISH SECOND IN MAC EAST:** The Mid-American Conference released its 2002 Baseball Preseason Coaches' Poll on Feb. 12 with the Miami baseball team seated second in the East Division behind last year's champion, Kent State. After a 35-25 season in 2001 and a MAC championship game appearance, the RedHawks received 75 points and three first-place votes.

Ball State was head-and-shoulders above the competition in the West Division, receiving 12 of 13 first-place votes and 77 points. The Cardinals also received the majority of votes for winning the MAC Tournament, with eight. Miami garnered two votes to win the MAC Tournament while Kent State and Central Michigan raked in one vote each.

announced in November the early signing of seven incoming freshmen to National Letters of Intent for the 2003 season. The early signees are comprised of five pitchers and two position players.

Wes Ireton, a 6-foot-4, 195-pound pitcher signs with the RedHawks after a decorated career at New Castle Chrysler High School in New Castle, Ind. He was rated as one of the "top prospects" in Indiana by *Team One Baseball*. A rightie on the mound, Ireton also was selected to the White Sox Area Code Team two consecutive years. Last season he was Indiana's "Top Junior."

One of the two left-handed pitchers among the new signees is Sam Shorts, a 6-foot-1, 185-pound southpaw from Glenbard East High School in Glen Ellyn, Ill. As a junior, Shorts was a Team One participant and led his team in earned run average last season.

A native of Granville, Ohio, Matt Long signs with the RedHawks after another solid season at Granville High School. A 6-foot-5, 195-pound right-hander, Long has accumulated a 17-9 record over three years at Granville. He has pitched 133.2 innings, striking out 188 batters while only allowing 69 free passes. Last season as a junior, Long was named to the all-Ohio Division III and all-Region second-teams.

Coach Smith's second left-handed pitcher of the bunch, 6-foot-4, 200-pound Graham Taylor, commits after being named a first-team all-star in the Cincinnati Fall League. Taylor competes for Dixie Heights High School in Villa Hills, Ky., where he was named MVP of the 9th Region tournament as a junior. He carries an 8-3 career record and an impressive 1.41 ERA into his final season.

Matt Raguse, a transfer from St. Louis Community College, rounds out the pitchers in the early signee group. A 6-foot-3, 180-pound right-handed thrower at STLCC, Raguse finished his first season with a 3.30 ERA and 5-3 record. Prior to committing to Miami, Raguse had been drafted by the Arizona Diamondbacks in the 43rd round of the Major League Baseball Entry Draft.

Geoff Orr, a 6-foot-1, 170-pound shortstop for Carl Sandburg High School in Orland Park, Ill., is one of two position players to commit to the Red and White. During the 2001 season, Orr set a school record for stolen bases with 24 and also was selected by Team One as the Top Rated Shortstop in Illinois. In addition to setting a school record, Orr batted .456 and knocked in 33 runs to lead his team.

Rounding out Coach Smith's early signees is second basemen Will Reynolds from Brownsburg, Ind. At 5-foot-11 and 165-pounds, Reynolds led his team with 49 RBI and seven home runs while batting from both sides of the plate. Reynolds was an all-Metro West selection and first-team all-state selection at second base.

"We felt going into the signing period that we had to sign pitching and athletes, and we feel we have done that," said Smith. "All of these guys were high-profile recruits, and all come to us with lofty credentials. It is going to be fun coaching these kids over the next few years."
