

### REDHAWKS TRAVEL TO BUFFALO FOR CRUCIAL MAC EAST CONTEST

With both the Miami University RedHawks and the Buffalo Bulls picking up wins last week, Tuesday's contest could play a major role in deciding the MAC East. The crucial division tilt begins Tuesday, Nov. 10 at 8 p.m.

### **TELEVISION**

The matchup with Buffalo will be carried live on ESPN. Matt Barrie will handle play-by-play duties, while Mike Golic Jr. will serve as the color analyst. Paul Carcaterra will be on the sideline.

### **RADIO**

In its second year of its partnership with Van Wagner, the Miami Sports Network continues its coverage of Miami Football with a group of affiliates blanketing most of Southwest Ohio and Southeast Indiana. ### **FIRST AND TEN**

- Miami football ranks first all-time in the Mid-American Conference in wins (699), conference wins (300), MAC Championships (16) and bowl wins (7). The RedHawks also captured the 2019 MAC Championship with a 26-21 win over Central Michigan.
- Although Miami was 4-26 in Coach Martin's first 30 Mid-American Conference games, the RedHawks are 24-8 in the last 32 games versus schools from the MAC, the best record in the conference during that span.
- The RedHawks clinched the MAC East Division Championship with a 6-2 record in 2019. This was the third time in four years the RedHawks finished the regular season with a 6-2 conference record.
- Martin, in his seventh year leading the RedHawks, has had many of the same coordinators in the previous six seasons. Eric Koehler and George Barnett, both in their seventh years with Miami, handle the offense and Spence Nowinsky (third year) and John Hauser (seventh year) manage the defense.
- Since 2014, Miami Athletics has added nearly \$40 million in facilities for the football program. The Dauch Indoor Sports Center was opened in 2015 and the Athletic Performance Center was added in early 2017. Both facilities are located in the north end zone of Yager Stadium.
- Miami was 5-0 last season in one-score games and has won eight-straight one-score games dating back to the 2018 campaign. This includes last week's 38-31 win over Ball State.
- The RedHawks had a lead in every game last year. In games they lost, they led lowa (7-3), Cincinnati (10-0), Ohio State (5-0), Western Michigan (6-0), Ball State (24-7) and Louisiana (7-0). In fact, Miami has had a lead in 23-straight games. The last time Miami trailed for an entire game was Sept. 15, 2018, at Minnesota.
- Miami competed in the 2020 LendingTree Bowl, its third bowl eligible season in the last four years. From 2006-15, Miami was bowl eligible just twice.
- Miami's defense has forced a turnover in 28 of its last 39 games and is 18-10 in contests when it forces a turnover. The RedHawks' defense has also recorded a sack in 30 of its last 39 games.

### **ABOUT CHUCK MARTIN**

- Head coach Chuck Martin, who earned that title on Dec. 3, 2013, brings an impressive resume to Oxford, Ohio.
- Not only was he 74-7 in six years at Grand Valley State (2004-09), he has coached in seven national championship games in the past 18 seasons. Martin has an all-time head coaching record of 104-52.
- He has twice been named the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) National Coach of the Year and has been a coordinator on both sides of the ball.
- Martin was inducted into the Hall of Fame at Grand Valley State University on Oct. 23, 2015.

### **RedHawk Media Policies For 2020**

#### Credentials

- All media members must request credentials each week. No season credentials will be provided to the media. Requests can be made here and must be made 72 hours in advance <u>HERE</u>
- Credentials can be picked up at the Northwest Gate of Yager Stadium.

#### **Press Box Access/Seating Capacity**

- Access to the press box will be limited to selected media, game operations staff, and communications staff.
- Seating in the media area will be assigned, partitioned off and six feet apart.
- Only individuals with an assigned seat will be allowed in the press box (no standing allowed).
- NFL scouts will be provided a credential, but not access to the press box. Scouts will be asked to sit in the West stands.
- Everyone in the media area must always wear face coverings (other than eating or drinking) with the exception of PA announcers.

#### Parking

• All media will park in either the M Lot or the DISC Lot (NW Corner of Yager Stadium). Access to this lot will be off of road 732.

#### **Media Services**

- Pre-game boxed meal/bottled water for media and game-day workers only.
- •The Miami press box will be "Green" in 2020. Game notes and programs will be available online only. A select number of flip cards will be available.

#### **Field Access/Photo Services**

- No photo or video media will be permitted on the field. All shooting must be done from the stands.
- No other media/scouts will be allowed in the field area.
- Face coverings must be worn at all times in the stands area.
- Photographers will not be allowed in the press box. Their working location is located in the Guest Services room, located near the press box elevator, room 112. Wired internet will be provided.
- No media access will be allowed in the team bench area.

### **Post-game Interviews**

- Following the conclusion of each game, the home Athletic Communications staff will be responsible for coordinating a postgame press conference via Zoom Video. A link will be sent to the media the day of the game.
- The visiting postgame Zoom locker room will be located in room 202 of Yager Stadium.
- $\bullet$  Face coverings must be worn at all times by those filming/working in the recording area.

After falling behind 14-3, the Miami football team's defense turned in a dominant performance in a 34-20 victory over Buffalo. The RedHawks picked up four turnovers, returning one for a score, to win their MAC opener for the third-straight season.

Miami's defense ultimately forced four turnovers on the day to help the team prevail despite Buffalo's 398-265 advantage in total yardage. Bester paced the RedHawks on the ground with a career-best 24 carries for 107 yards and a touchdown. McWood paced the defense with nine tackles, a pair of quarterback hurries and a forced and recovered fumble.

### **QUICK HITS - MIAMI BEATS BALL STATE, 38-31**

- QB Brett Gabbert was injured early in the second quarter and was replaced by AJ Mayer. Mayer's last completion was his senior year of high school (nearly three years ago). Mayer came in and completed 16-of-24 passes for 212 yards and three touchdowns as the RedHawks erased a 21-10 deficit.
- Jack Sorenson caught seven passes for 139 yards and Jack Coldiron had two touchdowns, his first two touchdowns of his Miami career.
- Miami recorded five sacks in the win over Ball State. Lonnie Phelps had two, Mike Brown added one and Dominique Robinson also had two sacks. Robinson, who played wide receiver for Miami last season, recorded a sack on his first career defensive snap.
- Down its top two running backs, the RedHawks still managed 134 yards on the ground. Davion Johnson led the way with 58 yards, while Zach Kahn added 42 yards and two touchdowns.

#### FORMER WALKONS SET UP GAME WINNING TOUCHDOWN

Both Ryan McWood and Zach Kahn began their careers at Miami as walkons and both played a major role in last week's win. With under a minute to go, McWood intercepted a pass (his first career INT) and returned it to the Ball State 6-yard line. Three plays later, Kahn scored the game-winning 2-yard touchdown with 10 seconds to play in the contest.

### **ABOUT BUFFALO**

Buffalo is coming off a 49-30 victory over Northern Illinois last Wednesday. In the win, the Bulls forced five turnovers and scored three defensive touchdowns, while running back Jaret Patterson rushed for 137 yards and two scores.

### **SERIES VS. BUFFALO**

Miami is 15-7 all-time versus the Bulls which includes a 34-20 win last season in Oxford, Ohio. Miami is 6-4 all time at Buffalo, but lost a 51-42 contest in New York back in 2018.

### **HOME COOKING**

Miami finished a perfect 5-0 at home during the 2019 season and has won nine straight at Yager Stadium. Miami's last home loss was on Sept. 29, 2018. In all, it has been 773 days since Miami's last loss at home.

### **BOUNCE BACK**

Since early in the 2016 season Miami has lost back-to-back MAC games just once in that span. In fact, Miami is now 7-1 following a MAC loss under Martin, dating back to Oct. 15, 2016.

### **RED HOT**

Miami's redzone offense has been downright amazing over the three years. Last week versus Ball State the RedHawks were 6-of-7 inside the 20-yardline, which included five touchdowns. Last season the RedHawks were 40-of-46 inside the redzone and in 2018, Miami was 42-of-43. In all, Miami is 88-of-96 (91.7%) in redzone scoring over the past 27 games. It's even better in MAC play. In Miami's last 18 MAC games, the RedHawks are 64-of-69 (92.8%) inside the redzone.

### **MARTIN VS. THE MAC SINCE 2016**

Miami is 24-8 versus MAC opponents over its last 32 games, best in the conference in that span. WMU is 22-9, followed by NIU (20-11), Ohio (20-11) and Toledo (20-11). In that span, Miami has outscored its opponents 936-699.

### IT'S GOOD TO BE BACK

When the MAC announced that football would be moving to the spring in early August, NFL hopefuls, Tommy Doyle, Danny Godlevske and Manny Rugamba all declared for the NFL Draft. All three have now elected to return to Miami for their final season. Rugamba was last year's MAC Championship Defensive Player of the Game, while Doyle (first-team All-MAC in 2019) and Godlevske (third-team All-MAC) have combined for 65 starts along the offensive line.

### **GABBERT BEGINS YEAR TWO UNDER CENTER**

When Miami opened the 2019 season at Iowa, Brett Gabbert became the first true freshman quarterback to open the season as the starter in Miami football history. The younger brother of NFL quarterback, Blaine Gabbert, started all 14 games last season, throwing for 2,411 yards and 11 touchdowns. For his efforts, he was named the Mid-American Conference Freshman of the Year, just the third RedHawk in school history to accomplish this feat. Gabbert joins Ben Roethlisberger (2001) and Deland McCullough (1992) on this small list.

### **DEEP BURNER**

Big things come in small packages. Last year James Burns only caught 20 passes, but compiled 506 receiving yards, a 25.3 yard average, tops in the nation among freshmen wide receivers. In all, eight of his 20 catches went for over 35 yards in length.

#### OFFENSIVE LINE A STRENGTH

Heading into the 2020 season, Miami has one of the most veteran offensive lines in the nation. Overall, Miami's offensive line has started a combined 92 games. Danny Godlevske leads the bunch with 37 starts, followed by Tommy Doyle (28), Caleb Shaffer (10), Rusty Feth (7), David Redding (4), Pete Nank (3) and Bennett Clark (3).

### **JACK OF ALL TRADES**

Jack Sorenson battled injuries for most of the 2019 season, but when his team needed him most the now-senior came through in a big way. The wide receiver had 18 catches in his last two games of the 2019 season. Sorenson had eight catches for 123 yards and a touchdown in the MAC Championship game (was named Offensive MVP) and 10 catches (career-high) for 107 yards in the LendingTree Bowl. He opened 2020 with seven grabs for 139 yards in a win over Ball State.

### PACED BY PACE

Ivan Pace matched an NCAA record with six sacks in a 20-17 win over Akron. His 6.0 sacks in a single game are tied for the most in NCAA history, with Elvis Dumervil (Louisville in 2005) and Ameer Ismail (Western Michigan in 2006). Pace recorded those 6.0 sacks while playing in just 18 defensive snaps. Miami's 12.0 sacks as a team versus Akron were the fifth-most in NCAA history for a single game. The last time a team recorded at least 12.0 sacks in a game was Utah State in 2012.

### FROM ZERO TO HERO

Many times, walk-ons rarely get noticed. That is not true with Ryan McWood. McWood began his career at Miami as walk-ons, but is now a vital cog in Miami's defense. McWood led the team with 99 tackles during the 2019 season and had 14 tackles in the 2020 season opener, also tops on the team.

### IF YOU BUILD IT...

Miami's Athletic Director, David Sayler continues to add facilities for the department. The two newest football installments can be seen just north of Yager Stadium. The new David and Anita Dauch Indoor Sports Center (DISC) opened in February of 2015 and features a full-length 120-yard field and four sprint lanes.

Between Yager Stadium and the DISC is the Athletic Performance Center. The APC provides much-needed upgrades to Miami Football's locker room and offices while also hosting a state-of-the-art medical and athletic training facility that serves all Miami's student-athletes.

**#7** Ben Roethlisberger

Ben Roethlisberger took his place in Miami Football history when his jersey No. 7 was retired on October 13, 2007. Roethlisberger ended his three-year playing tenure (2001-03) as the most prolific passer in program history.

**#40** Bob Hitchens

No. 40 was retired in 1973 to mark the accomplishments of tailback Bob Hitchens, who concluded his career as the most prolific runner in Miami history. At the end of his three-year tenure (1971-73), Hitchens owned Miami's season and career records for points, rushing touchdowns, rushing attempts and rushing yards.

**#41** Travis Prentice

No. 41 was retired to honor Travis Prentice. Prentice ranks sixth all-time in NCAA history with 5,596 rushing yards and second in total touchdowns with 78. He continues to own four NCAA records.

#**42** John Pont

Worn by halfback John Pont through three varsity football campaigns, No. 42 was retired by the Athletic Advisory Council following his senior season in 1951. Pont thus became the first athlete in Miami history to have his jersey retired.

Miami University, known world-wide as the "Cradle of Coaches," contributed four alumni to Sporting News Magazine's 50 Greatest Coaches, dominating all other universities.

PAUL BROWN ('30) was named as the 12th greatest coach of all time by The Sporting News (TSN). Miamians WALTER ALSTON ('35) and BO SCHEMBECHLER ('51) ranked 35th and 36th on the list, while ARA PARSEGHIAN (`49) was selected as sports' 44th greatest coach. A fifth man with Miami ties, WOODY HAYES, ranked 27th on TSN's list. Hayes served as Miami's football coach from 1949-50.

The August 3, 2009 publication asked a panel of 118 top coaches, media and sports administrators to choose the Top 50 list.

Altogether, only four universities contributed more than one alumnus to the list. Miami's four alumni topped Alabama (Paul "Bear" Bryant and Bobby Bowden), Minnesota (Bud Wilkinson and Herb Brooks) and Kansas (Dean Smith and Adolph Rupp), which each had two alums ranked among the Top 50. Purdue graduate John Wooden, the famed "Wizard of Westwood", was ranked as the No. 1 coach of all time.



Paul Brown

An Ohio native who was a two-year football letter winner (1928-29), Paul Brown is a member of Miami's "Cradle of Coaches" and excelled as a coach at the collegiate and professional levels. Brown was head coach at Ohio State (1941-43) and led the Buckeyes to their first national title in 1942. Brown then served as head coach at the professional level with the Cleveland Browns (1946-62) and Cincinnati Bengals (1968-75), winning championships in the All-America Football Conference and National Football League. Brown was elected into the Pro Football Hall of Fame in 1967, and the current home stadium of the Bengals bears his name.



Walter Alston

Always displaying a calm, professional demeanor, the unflappable Walter Alston managed the Brooklyn and Los Angeles Dodgers for 23 seasons (1954-76), winning seven National League pennants and four World Series championships. His squads would win 2,040 games during his tenure, the seventh-highest win total among major league managers. He helped to establish a "Dodger Way," which many of his former players later used to become successful managers themselves.



Bo Schembechler

A member of Miami's "Cradle of Coaches" and the College Football Hall of Fame, Bo Schembechler was a two-year letter winner (1949-50) and head coach (1963-68) with the Red and White. During his six seasons as head coach, Schembechler led Miami to a 40-17-3 record and back-to-back conference co-championships (1965-66). Schembechler then became the head coach at the University of Michigan (1969-89) and led the Wolverines to 13 Big Ten titles.



Ara Parseghian

A member of Miami's "Cradle of Coaches" and the College Football Hall of Fame, Ara Parseghian was a football letter winner (1946-47) before moving to the sidelines as an assistant coach (1950) and head coach (1951-55). During his five seasons as Miami's head coach, Parseghian compiled a 39-6-1 record and won back-to-back Mid-American Conference Championships (1954-55). Parseghian went on to coach at Northwestern (1956-63) and Notre Dame (1964-74) where he was named National Coach of the Year in



WOODY HAYES

A member of Miami's "Cradle of Coaches" and the College Football Hall of Fame, Woody Hayes served as the head coach of Miami during the 1949-50 and 1950-51 seasons. In his last year as head coach he led the RedHawks to a 9-1 record and a MAC Championship, and also led his team to a victory in the Salad Bowl. Hayes went on to coach at the Ohio State University (1951-78) where he became a fixture for the Scarlet and Grey and quickly became recognized as one of the greatest coaches of all time. At OSU he compiled a 205-61-10 record (.761) and led the Buckeyes to five national titles, 13 Big Ten championships, and four bowl victories. He is a three-time winner of the College Football Coach of the Year Award.

In his career, Chuck Martin has more than 20 years in college coaching experience, including 10 years as a head coach. He has twice been named the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) National Coach

of the Year, earning the honor in 2005 and 2006, and has coached in seven national championship games in the past 16 seasons. In addition to his head coaching experience, Martin has served as a coordinator on both sides of the ball. Of those seven national championship game appearances, he has been a part of four national championship wins, with two titles under his direction as head coach/offensive coordinator and one as a defensive coordinator.

This past season Martin engineered a magnificent turn-around. After beginning the season 1-3 the RedHawks went on to win seven of its final nine contest, including a 26-21 win over Central Michigan in the 2019 Mid-American Conference Championship. It was Miami's first championship since 2010.

Miami had just gone 0-12 the year prior to Martin's arrival and many believed the roster was one of the worst in the Mid-American Conference. In three years, Martin's vision of returning Miami football to greatness is in full swing and many believe the RedHawks have already arrived.

While rebuilding the roster from the ground up, Miami took its lumps in 2014 and 2015, going just 2-10 and 3-9. 2016 did not start out much better as Miami lost its first six games of the season, but that is when things changed.

Martin would orchestrate something that had never been done in college football. Miami rattled off six straight wins to become the first team in college football history to begin a season 0-6 and finish 6-6. The six-game win streak also moved Miami to 6-2 in the MAC, finishing in a tie for first in the East and helped the RedHawks advance to the St. Petersburg Bowl versus Mississippi State, Miami's first bowl appearance since 2010.

Prior to joining Miami, Martin spent four seasons at Notre Dame, serving as the offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach (2012-13) and defensive backs/ recruiting coordinator (2010-11). In 2012, he orchestrated an offense that played in the BCS National Championship game versus Alabama. In 2011, he was named one of the top 25 recruiters in the nation by ESPN.com and was named to Rivals.com's Second-Team Assistant Coach Dream Team.

In Martin's two years calling plays, Notre Dame combined to go 20-5 overall and was one of the most balanced offenses in the country, averaging 26.4 points, 170.0 rushing and 235.6 passing per game.

Prior to arriving in South Bend, Martin was head coach and offensive coordinator for Grand Valley State University from 2004-2009 and compiled a 74-7 (.914) record, including an impressive 16-4 record in the NCAA Division II Playoffs. He and the Lakers won back-to-back national championships in 2005 and 2006 and finished runner-up in 2009. He directed Grand Valley State to 48 consecutive regular-season victories and 45 straight wins in the Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (GLIAC). He also guided the Lakers to a Division II record 40-game winning streak from 2005-07. Martin produced seven Associated Press First-Team All-America players as head coach.

At GVSU, Martin's offenses averaged 35.1 points, 208 rushing and 427 total yards per game. The Lakers ranked among the top-25 nationally in total offense in five of six seasons and ranked in the top-27 in scoring offense in all but one season. In that time, his offense scored at least 30 points in 56 of 81 games and scored at least 40 points in 34 contests.

Many of those offenses were led by quarterbacks who were developed under Martin. In six years, GVSU produced four Harlon Hill finalists, given annually to the NCAA Division II Player of the Year (Cullen Finnerty in 2006 and Brad Iciek

from 2007-09). In that span, Laker quarterbacks threw 184 touchdown passes and just 41 interceptions.

His offenses were not just about the quarterback. In all six seasons, he produced a 1,000-yard rusher. In four of those seasons, a running back finished as a top-10 rusher in Grand Valley State history.

Before becoming head coach, Martin served as the defensive coordinator for the Lakers in 2003, helping GVSU win a national championship. Martin's defense allowed just nine total points in the final three games of the playoff run and among the ranked top-10 nationally in scoring, rushing and total defense that season.

Martin served as the defensive backs and outside linebackers coach at GVSU from 2000-02. Prior to arriving in Allendale, Mich., Martin spent time at Eastern Michigan (1998-1999, linebackers), Millikin University (1996-97, defensive coordinator/defensive backs), Wittenberg University (1994-95, linebackers) and Mankato State University (1992-93, graduate assistant/linebackers).

While attending Millikin (1986-90), Martin was an All-American safety and was selected as a GTE Academic All-American. He doubled as an All-American place kicker, received Academic All-District honors for the Millikin baseball team and was inducted into the Millikin Hall of Fame in 2008.

He graduated in 1990 with a degree in accounting and earned his master's degree in physical education from Mankato State University in 1993.

Martin and his wife Dulcie have two children, Max and Emma.

The Miami RedHawks began their season on a high note and scored four critical touchdowns in the second half as the RedHawks (1-0, 1-0 Mid-American) defeated Ball State, 38-31, at Yager Stadium on Wednesday evening. The win, which gave Miami the Red Bird Trophy, was also the 300th MAC win in team history.

The second half proved to be pivotal for the RedHawks in the season opener, with four touchdowns for 28 points to erase a 21-10 deficit to the Cardinals. Miami finished with 418 total yards in the victory. AJ Mayer finished the contest 16-of-24 for 211 yards with three touchdowns, including two passes to redshirt freshman Jack Coldiron. This game included milestones for the pair, with Mayer throwing his first touchdown pass and Coldiron scoring his first touchdown with his first career catch.
