FIRST AND TEN

- Miami football ranks first all-time in the Mid-American Conference in wins (718), conference wins (312), MAC Championships (16) and bowl wins (8).
- Historically, Miami's 718 career wins, ranks third all-time among Group-of-Five programs, behind just Navy (735) and Army (722).
- Miami was 4-14 in Coach Martin's first 18 Mid-American Conference games. Since then, the RedHawks are 36-16 in their last 52 games versus schools from the MAC, the best record in the conference during that span.
- Miami has now had a .500 or better conference record in six of the last seven seasons, dating back to 2016. The RedHawks also captured the 2019 MAC Championship game and were a two-point conversion away versus Kent State from playing in the 2021 MACC.
- Martin, in his 10th year leading the RedHawks, has a new look on offense in 2023. Offensive Coordinator Pat Welsh returns for his 10th year with Martin, but his first as offensive coordinator. Defensively, Bill Brechin begins year two as the defensive coordinator (10th year at Miami). Special Teams Coordinator Jacob Bronowski is in his second year with the Red and White.
- Miami is 14-8 in one-score games, dating back to the 2018 campaign.
- After competing in the 2022 Bahamas Bowl, the RedHawks have now been bowl eligible six of the last seven seasons. From 2006-15, Miami was bowl eligible just twice.
- The RedHawks have picked up Power-5 victories in two straight years, downing Cincinnati (31-24) this season and Northwestern (17-14) a year ago.
- A win on Saturday would be Miami's first 3-0 MAC start since 2010.

ABOUT CHUCK MARTIN

- Head coach Chuck Martin, who earned that title on Dec. 3, 2013, brings an impressive resume to Oxford, Ohio.
- Not only was he 74-7 in six years at Grand Valley State (2004-09), he has coached in seven national championship games in the past 20 seasons. Martin has an all-time head coaching record of 124-67.
- He has twice been named the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) National Coach of the Year and has been a coordinator on both sides of the ball.
- Martin was inducted into the Hall of Fame at Grand Valley State University on Oct. 23, 2015.

ABOUT WESTERN MICHIGAN

Western Michigan is 2-4 on the season and 1-1 in conference play. Quarterback Hayden Wolf, a transfer from Old Dominion, made his first career start for the Broncos last week versus Mississippi State and threw for 262 yards and three scores in the 42-28 loss. Defensive back Tate Hallock is tops on the team with 46 tackles and two interceptions.

SERIES VS. BRONCOS

The RedHawks lead the all-time series 37-24-1 and own a winning record in Kalamazoo (15-14). The Broncos have captured the last eight meetings between the programs.

LAST MEETING

Western Michigan held off the RedHawks 16-10 last October to snap the second-longest home win streak in Miami program history (16 games). Brett Gabbert threw for 222 yards to lead the RedHawks, who had not lost at Yager Stadium since September 2018 (also vs. WMU), a span of 1,484 days.

MEMORABLE MEETING

Robert Jencks knocked home a 22-yard field goal with 4:10 left in the fourth quarter to give Miami a come-from-behind 15-14 victory over WMU in its 1960 home opener. The Red and White trailed 14-6 in the final period before rallying to defeat the Broncos for the 14th consecutive time. With the win, Miami improved to 13-0 all-time in MAC openers.

REDHAWKS BLANK BGSU 27-0

The Miami University football team defeated Bowling Green 27-0 last Saturday to remain unbeaten in Mid-American Conference play. The RedHawks posted their first shutout since 2007 and extended their longest winning streak in 20 years to five games. Brett Gabbert completed 83% of his passes (15-18), throwing for 170 yards and two scores, and averaged better than five yards per carry. Miami held Bowling Green to 135 yards of total offense (63 rushing, 72 passing).

TIDBITS FROM BGSU CONTEST

- Gabbert moved into third place in program history with his 57th career touchdown pass, passing Gus Ragland (56).
- Graham Nicholson's 52-yard field goal was the longest of his career and the sixth-longest in school history.
- Matt Salopek made seven tackles, including the 300th of his career.
- Ty Wise's interception was the first of his career.
- Four different RedHawks recorded sacks: Wise, Brian Ugwu, Corey Suttle, and Caiden Woullard.
- Miami converted 9 of 14 third downs (64.3%) and controlled the ball for nearly 40 of the game's 60 minutes (39:29 to 20:31).

BEND BUT DON'T BREAK

At times, Miami's defense has surrendered yards between the 20's, but once the opposition gets to the red zone, the RedHawks have turned them away. In 18 trips inside Miami's 20-yard line, the RedHawks have allowed just six touchdowns.

BEST OF BOTH WORLDS

Both Miami's offense and defense rank near the top of every statistical category among the 12 MAC programs. Offensively, Miami ranks second in scoring (31.2), third in total offense (385.5), second in rushing (174.0) and fourth in passing (211.5). On the defensive side, Miami ranks second in scoring allowed (18.8), third in total defense (338.2) and rushing (126.8) and sixth in passing (211.3).

MONSTERS OF THE MAC

As good as the numbers are above, Miami's defense has been downright frightening in conference play. Through two games, Miami ranks first in scoring (1.5), total defense (170.5), rushing (49.5), sacks (5.5), third down conversions (17.4%), time of possession (34:52) and is second in passing defense (121.0).

147 MINUTES AND COUNTING...

Miami enters Saturday's contest, having not allowed a touchdown in the last 147:15, and has surrendered just three points over the past two games combined. The last time Miami went back-to-back games without allowing a touchdown was on Oct. 11 and Oct. 18, 2003 (beat Buffalo 59-3 and Ball State 49-3). Miami has not allowed a touchdown since early in the third quarter versus Delaware State on Sept. 23.

BOUNCE BACK

Since early in the 2016 season Miami has lost back-to-back MAC games just twice in that span. In fact, Miami is now 13-2 following a MAC loss under Martin, dating back to Oct. 15, 2016.

FIVE THINGS TO KNOW ABOUT NO. 5 BRETT GABBERT

- Younger brother of NFL quarterback, Blaine Gabbert.
- Gabbert was named the 2019 MAC Freshman of the Year, joining Ben Roethlisberger (2001) and Deland McCullough (1992) as the only other RedHawks to capture this award.
- When Miami opened the 2019 season at Iowa, Gabbert became the first true freshman quarterback to open the season as the starter in Miami football history.
- Is responsible for 60 touchdowns (55 passing, 5 rushing) in his Miami career.
- Ranks third in program history with 7,491 passing yards and is sixth in completion percentage (.589) and third in passing touchdowns (57).

HE'S GOT LEGS AND HE KNOWS HOW TO USE THEM

With nearly 7,500 career passing yards, it would be easy to forget the impact Brett Gabbert's rushing ability plays in the Miami offense. The junior has 449 career rushing yards to go along five touchdowns. This season he recorded a career-high 75 yards rushing in the win over Cincinnati and was second on the team with 47 yards rushing last week in the victory over Bowling Green.

"GAGE"ING INTEREST

Coming from a smaller school (Southeast Louisiana), Gage Larvadain did not receive much interest from the major programs, something Miami is thankful for. In his debut with the RedHawks, Larvadain had a game-high eight grabs for 80 yards versus the Hurricanes. He followed that up with eight catches for 273 yards and three scores versus UMass and had a 79-yard touchdown on the opening play versus Cincinnati. Despite missing the past two games, Larvadain currently ranks 26th in the nation with 438 receiving yards.

BOMBS AWAY

Through six games, the Miami offense is averaging 16.3 yards per completion, which ranks fifth in the country. On the season, Brett Gabbert has 1,232 yards passing on just 77 completions and nine different receivers are averaging over 14.0 yards per catch.

Retired Miami Numbers

#7 Ben Roethlisberger

Ben Roethlisberger took his place in Miami Football history when his jersey No. 7 was retired on October 13, 2007. Roethlisberger ended his three-year playing tenure (2001-03) as the most prolific passer in program history.

#40 Bob Hitchens

No. 40 was retired in 1973 to mark the accomplishments of tailback Bob Hitchens, who concluded his career as the most prolific runner in Miami history. At the end of his three-year tenure (1971-73), Hitchens owned Miami's season and career records for points, rushing touchdowns, rushing attempts and rushing yards.

#41 Travis Prentice

No. 41 was retired to honor Travis Prentice. Prentice ranks sixth all-time in NCAA history with 5,596 rushing yards and second in total touchdowns with 78. He continues to own four NCAA records.

#42 John Pont

Worn by halfback John Pont through three varsity football campaigns, No. 42 was retired by the Athletic Advisory Council following his senior season in 1951. Pont thus became the first athlete in Miami history to have his jersey retired.

TRENCH WARFARE

Miami's offensive line had two major holes to fill along the offensive line after losing both Rusty Feth and Caleb Shaffer to the transfer portal. Combined, those two started 69 games, dating back to 2019. Miami still has plenty of experience in 2023. Reid Holskey has started each of the last 32 games for the Red and White, followed by Will Jados (16), Sam Vaughan (15), Kolby Borders (15), Ben Jackson (7) and John Young (6).

TACKLING MACHINE

Linebacker Matt Salopek has 302 career tackles and has surpassed 100 stops in each of the past two years. With 100 tackles (has 54 currently) in 2023 he would become the first Miami player to secure 100-plus tackles in three-straight seasons since Matt Pusateri did the same from 2002-04.

NOTHING BUT NET

Placekicker Graham Nicholson has been perfect in 2023, connecting on 11-of-11 field goals and all 19 of his extra points. In his career, he is 44-of-54 (81.5%) on field goals, including a game-winner last season at Northwestern. He also drilled a career-long 52-yarder in the win over BGSU.

SPECIAL, SPECIAL TEAMS

Graham Nicholson leads the MAC with 11 made field goals and he is the only kicker in the conference that has yet to miss a kick. Punter Alec Bevelhimer leads the MAC with a 47.1 yard average and Gage Larvadain is second in the league with an 11.0 punt return average. Through six weeks of action, Miami has captured MAC East Special Teams Player of the Week four times.

NEW-FACES NEW PLACES

The transfer portal has changed college football and Miami is no different. The RedHawks have 20 players on the team that transferred from other schools: Rashad Amos (South Carolina), Jordan Brunson (Virginia Tech), Jeremiah Caldwell (Louisville), Michael Dowell (Michigan State), William Hardrick (Mississippi State), Maddox Kopp (Colorado), Jackson Kuwatch (Ohio State), Gage Larvadain (Southeastern Louisiana), Miles Marshall (Indiana), Cade McDonald (Michigan State), Yahsyn McKee (Mercer), Keyon Mozee (Kansas State), Jalen Peterson (Indianapolis), Corey Suttle (Iowa State), Brian Ugwu (Rutgers), Joe Wilkins Jr. (Notre Dame), Cameron Williams (Indiana), Jayden Williams (Southern California), Ty Wise (Indiana) and John Young (Kentucky).

BROTHERLY LOVE

Miami's Kenny Tracy has been with the RedHawks since the 2020 season, while his brother Javon Tracy, redshirted in 2022 after competing in two games.

SEAN MCVAY JOINS CRADLE OF COACHES

This summer Miami added a 10th bronze statue to its Cradle of Coaches in Sean McVay. McVay, the current head coach of the Los Angeles Rams, joined Ara Parseghian, Paul Brown, Weeb Ewbank, John Harbaugh, John Pont, Carm Cozza, Bo Schembechler, Red Blaik, and Paul Dietzel in the south end of Yager Stadium.

GRADUATING CHAMPIONS

Before Miami even takes the field in 2023, 12 different RedHawks have already completed their undergraduate degree: Brendan Beattie, Jack Coldiron, Michael Dowell, Austin Ertl, Brett Gabbert, Ben Jackson, Miles Marshall, Cade McDonald, Camden Rogers, Matt Salopek, Sam Vaughan and Joe Wilkins Jr.

GAME 7 • AT WESTERN MICHIGAN

Miami University, known world-wide as the “Cradle of Coaches,” contributed four alumni to *Sporting News Magazine’s* 50 Greatest Coaches, dominating all other universities.

PAUL BROWN (‘30) was named as the 12th greatest coach of all time by The Sporting News (TSN). Miamians WALTER ALSTON (‘35) and BO SCHEMBECHLER (‘51) ranked 35th and 36th on the list, while ARA PARSEGHIAN (‘49) was selected as sports’ 44th greatest coach. A fifth man with Miami ties, WOODY HAYES, ranked 27th on TSN’s list. Hayes served as Miami’s football coach from 1949-50.

The August 3, 2009 publication asked a panel of 118 top coaches, media and sports administrators to choose the Top 50 list.

Altogether, only four universities contributed more than one alumnus to the list. Miami’s four alumni topped Alabama (Paul “Bear” Bryant and Bobby Bowden), Minnesota (Bud Wilkinson and Herb Brooks) and Kansas (Dean Smith and Adolph Rupp), which each had two alums ranked among the Top 50. Purdue graduate John Wooden, the famed “Wizard of Westwood”, was ranked as the No. 1 coach of all time.



PAUL BROWN

An Ohio native who was a two-year football letter winner (1928-29), **Paul Brown** is a member of Miami’s “Cradle of Coaches” and excelled as a coach at the collegiate and professional levels. Brown was head coach at Ohio State (1941-43) and led the Buckeyes to their first national title in 1942. **Brown** then served as head coach at the professional level with the Cleveland Browns (1946-62) and Cincinnati Bengals (1968-75), winning championships in the All-America Football Conference and National Football League. **Brown** was elected into the Pro Football Hall of Fame in 1967.



WALTER ALSTON

Always displaying a calm, professional demeanor, the unflappable **Walter Alston** managed the Brooklyn and Los Angeles Dodgers for 23 seasons (1954-76), winning seven National League pennants and four World Series championships. His squads would win 2,040 games during his tenure, the seventh-highest win total among major league managers. He helped to establish a “Dodger Way,” which many of his former players later used to become successful managers themselves.



BO SCHEMBECHLER

A member of Miami’s “Cradle of Coaches” and the College Football Hall of Fame, **Bo Schembechler** was a two-year letter winner (1949-50) and head coach (1963-68) with the Red and White. During his six seasons as head coach, **Schembechler** led Miami to a 40-17-3 record and back-to-back conference co-championships (1965-66). **Schembechler** then became the head coach at the University of Michigan (1969-89) and led the Wolverines to 13 Big Ten titles.



ARA PARSEGHIAN

A member of Miami’s “Cradle of Coaches” and the College Football Hall of Fame, **Ara Parseghian** was a football letter winner (1946-47) before moving to the sidelines as an assistant coach (1950) and head coach (1951-55). During his five seasons as Miami’s head coach, **Parseghian** compiled a 39-6-1 record and won back-to-back Mid-American Conference Championships (1954-55). **Parseghian** went on to coach at Northwestern (1956-63) and Notre Dame (1964-74) where he was named National Coach of the Year in 1964.



WOODY HAYES

A member of Miami’s “Cradle of Coaches” and the College Football Hall of Fame, **Woody Hayes** served as the head coach of Miami during the 1949-50 and 1950-51 seasons. In his last year as head coach he led Miami to a 9-1 record and a MAC Championship, and also led his team to a victory in the Salad Bowl. Hayes went on to coach at the Ohio State University (1951-78) where he became a fixture for the Scarlet and Grey and quickly became recognized as one of the greatest coaches of all time. At OSU he compiled a 205-61-10 record (.761) and led the Buckeyes to five national titles, 13 Big Ten championships, and four bowl victories. He is a three-time winner of the College Football Coach of the Year Award.

In his career, Chuck Martin has more than 30 years in college coaching experience, including 15 years as a head coach. He has twice been named the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) National Coach of the Year, earning the honor in 2005 and 2006, and has coached in seven national championship games. In addition to his head coaching experience, Martin has served as a coordinator on both sides of the ball. Of those seven national championship game appearances, he has been a part of four national championship wins, with two titles under his direction as head coach/offensive coordinator and one as a defensive coordinator.

After taking over a team that had just gone 0-12, Miami was 4-18 in Martin's first 22 conference games. From there, the rest is history. Martin and the RedHawks are 34-16 in the MAC, best in the conference since 2016. The RedHawks won the 2019 MAC Championship with a 26-21 win over Central Michigan and advanced to the LendingTree Bowl. Miami has now been bowl eligible in six of the last seven years, including a trip to the Bahamas Bowl in 2022.

This was done year after year with strong recruiting classes. Miami's classes have been some of the best the school has ever seen. Over the last eight years, Miami's recruiting classes have ranked first each of the past two years (2021, 2022), second (2020), second (2019), sixth (2018), second (2017), second (2016) and third (2015) in the MAC. Those recruiting efforts have shown up at the highest level as well. Dating back to 2019, Miami has had a player selected in the NFL Draft three of the past four years.

Miami's turnaround began back in 2016 as Martin orchestrated something that had never been done in college football. Miami rattled off six straight wins to become the first team in college football history to begin a season 0-6 and finish 6-6. The six-game win streak also moved Miami to 6-2 in the MAC, finishing in a tie for first in the East and helped the RedHawks advance to the St. Petersburg Bowl versus Mississippi State, Miami's first bowl appearance since 2010.

Prior to joining Miami, Martin spent four seasons at Notre Dame, serving as the offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach (2012-13) and defensive backs/recruiting coordinator (2010-11). In 2012, he orchestrated an offense that played in the BCS National Championship game versus Alabama. In 2011, he was named one of the top 25 recruiters in the nation by ESPN.com and was named to Rivals.com's Second-Team Assistant Coach Dream Team.

In Martin's two years calling plays, Notre Dame combined to go 20-5 overall and was one of the most balanced offenses in the country, averaging 26.4 points, 170.0 rushing and 235.6 passing per game.

Prior to arriving in South Bend, Martin was head coach and offensive coordinator for Grand Valley State University from 2004-2009 and compiled a 74-7 (.914) record, including an impressive 16-4 record in the NCAA Division II Playoffs. He and the Lakers won back-to-back national championships in 2005 and 2006 and finished runner-up in 2009. He directed Grand Valley State to 48 consecutive regular-season victories and 45 straight wins in the Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (GLIAC). He also guided the Lakers to a Division II record 40-game winning streak from 2005-07. Martin produced seven Associated Press First-Team All-America players as head coach.

At GVSU, Martin's offenses averaged 35.1 points, 208 rushing and 427 total yards per game. The Lakers ranked among the top-25 nationally in total offense in five of six seasons and ranked in the top-27 in scoring offense in all but one season. In that time, his offense scored at least 30 points in 56 of 81 games and scored at least 40 points in 34 contests.

Many of those offenses were led by quarterbacks who were developed under

Martin. In six years, GVSU produced four Harlon Hill finalists, given annually to the NCAA Division II Player of the Year (Cullen Finnerty in 2006 and Brad Iciek from 2007-09). In that span, Laker quarterbacks threw 184 touchdown passes and just 41 interceptions.

His offenses were not just about the quarterback. In all six seasons, he produced a 1,000-yard rusher. In four of those seasons, a running back finished as a top-10 rusher in Grand Valley State history.

Before becoming head coach, Martin served as the defensive coordinator for the Lakers in 2003, helping GVSU win a national championship. Martin's defense allowed just nine total points in the final three games of the playoff run and among the ranked top-10 nationally in scoring, rushing and total defense that season.

Martin served as the defensive backs and outside linebackers coach at GVSU from 2000-02. Prior to arriving in Allendale, Mich., Martin spent time at Eastern Michigan (1998-1999, linebackers), Millikin University (1996-97, defensive coordinator/defensive backs), Wittenberg University (1994-95, linebackers) and Mankato State University (1992-93, graduate assistant/linebackers).

While attending Millikin (1986-90), Martin was an All-American safety and was selected as a GTE Academic All-American. He doubled as an All-American place kicker, received Academic All-District honors for the Millikin baseball team and was inducted into the Millikin Hall of Fame in 2008.

He graduated in 1990 with a degree in accounting and earned his master's degree in physical education from Mankato State University in 1993.

Martin and his wife Dulcie have two children, Max and Emma.
