REDHAWKS LOOK TO MAKE IT FOUR STRAIGHT VERSUS EMU

The Miami University football team puts its three-game win streak on the line Saturday, Oct. 18 versus Eastern Michigan. Opening kick is slated for 12 p.m. and will be carried live on ESPN+.

ABOUT MIAMI

- Miami football ranks first all-time in the Mid-American Conference in wins (736), conference wins (326), MAC Championships (17) and bowl wins (9). Historically, Miami's 736 career wins are third all-time among Group-of-Five programs, behind just Navy (752) and Army (742).
- Miami was 4-14 in Coach Martin's first 18 Mid-American Conference games. Since then, the RedHawks are 51-19 in their last 70 games versus schools from the MAC, the best in the conference during that span.
- The RedHawks have now won nine-straight MAC regular season contests, dating back to Oct. 12, 2024 and are 18-2 in their last 20 MAC games.
- Miami has competed in five straight bowl games and has been bowl-eligible in eight of the past nine seasons. The RedHawks are coming off a 43-17 win over Colorado State in the Snoop Dogg Arizona Bowl last season.
- Since Oct. 15, 2016, Miami has lost back-to-back conference games just twice in that span (2017, 2022). Miami is 16-3 following a conference loss, dating back to midway through the 2016 campaign.

ABOUT EASTERN MICHIGAN

Eastern Michigan comes into Yager Stadium at 2-5 overall and 1-2 in MAC contests. Offensively, they average 23.7 points and 365.9 yards per game, which is fourth-best in the conference. Defensively, they rank 11th in scoring defense (32.0) and 12th in total defense (452.9).

SERIES HISTORY VERSUS EASTERN MICHIGAN

Saturday will be the 27th meeting between the two programs with the Red-Hawks holding an 20-6 advantage. Miami is 10-3 all-time at home versus the Eagles inside Yager Stadium.

LAST MEETING WITH THE EAGLES

Brett Gabbert threw four touchdowns for Miami back on Oct. 12, 2024 in a 38-14 victory over Eastern Michigan at Rynearson Stadium. Miami's defense added a pair of turnovers and held EMU to 18.4 points under its season average. Eli Blakey posted a career-high 18 tackles, while Corban Hondru added 16 stops.

MYAAMIA TRIBE JERSEYS

Miami football will wear special helmets/jerseys versus Eastern Michigan as Miami and the Myaamia Tribe continue to foster a great relationship. Over the past several years at Miami University, the Athletics department has developed a strong partnership with the Myaamia Center, another outcome of more than a 50-year relationship between the Miami Tribe of Oklahoma and Miami University. The partnership began with education within Miami athletics and grew as they began to use the Myaamia Heritage Logo (MHL), a design released in 2017 that visually represents the relationship between the Miami Tribe and Miami University.

AKRON RECAP

Miami downed Akron 20-7 last Saturday afternoon for its third-straight victory. Dequan Finn threw for 203 yards and added 65 on the ground for the RedHawks, while Miami's defense forced one turnover, registered 3.0 sacks and held the Zips to 273 yards of total offense.

MARTIN MOVING UP

The win over Akron moved head coach Chuck Martin into a tie for fifth in MAC history with 53 career conference wins. A win over Eastern Michigan would tie Bob Pruett (Marshall) with 54 MAC wins, fourth-best in MAC history.

PUTTING THE ZIP IN ZIPS

Akron's fourth-quarter score snapped a streak of seven-consecutive shutout quarters versus Miami's defense. Miami shut out Akron 19-0 back in 2023. Miami has now beaten Akron in eight-straight contests.

DEFENSE BACK TO ITS OLD TRICKS

Miami's defense ranked seventh nationally, allowing 17.8 points per game in 2023. In 2024, the RedHawks were 15th, allowing 18.8 points per contest. After a rocky start, allowing 103 points (34.3/game) in the first three contests, Miami has surrendered just 21 points (7.0/game) over the past three games. Miami shut out Lindenwood, gave up 14 points versus NIU and didn't allow a score until the fourth quarter versus Akron.

SPECIAL, SPECIAL TEAMS

Miami is one of two schools (James Madison) this season to record a kick return for a touchdown and block multiple punts. In fact, Miami is the only school in the country to have a special teams unit that has scored via the kick return (100-yards by Keith Reynolds vs. UNLV), punt block (Jermaine Agee 8-yard return vs. Lindenwood) and safety (blocked punt by Agee through the back of the end zone).

LIGHTS, 'KAM'ERA, ACTION

Kam Perry currently averages 29.7 yards per reception, which ranks first in the country. After posting just 10 catches for 166 yards last season, the junior has already recorded three 100-yard games this season. He had 108 yards at Rutgers, 122 versus UNLV and 122 against Lindenwood.

MAGIC TRICK

Adam Trick currently ranks 10th nationally with 5.5 sacks and has already surpassed his career best (4.5), set last season. He posted 2.0 sacks at Wisconsin and has recorded sacks in each of the past three contests versus Lindenwood (1.0), NIU (1.0) and Akron (1.5). Trick and the RedHawks have 22 sacks this season (3.2/game), 10th-best nationally.

BEEN HERE BEFORE

The 0-3 start for the RedHawks was nothing new. Mostly due to an extremely tough non-conference schedule, Miami has started nine of the past 11 seasons (not including 2020 when Miami only played three games) with a 1-3 record (or worse). Below is a break down of starts and finishes for Miami football over recent years.

THE BOOK OF ELI

Eli Blakey has a 213 tackles in his career, tops on the team. Last season he posted a career-high 89 tackles and currently leads the squad with 18 stops this season.

FINN TO WIN

While Dequan Finn has made just five career starts as a member of the RedHawks, the seventh-year quarterback does not lack experience.

- Throughout his career he has thrown for 8,228 yards and 70 touchdown passes in 53 career games.
- He has added 2,181 rushing yards and 28 scores on the ground.
- Most of that damage came during his time at Toledo. In 45 career games with the Rockets, Finn threw for 7,074 yards and 63 scores, while adding 1,840 yards and 25 touchdowns on the ground.
- He earned first-team All-MAC and was the MAC Player of the Year in 2023 and is the only player in Toledo football history to throw for over 2,000 yards and rush for 500 yards in multiple seasons (2021, 2022, 2023).
- Finn's 98 career total touchdowns (70 passing, 28 rushing) ranks second among active players in the NCAA.
- In his career he has combined for 10,405 yards in 1,514 total plays.

NEW-LOOK OFFENSIVE LINE

Miami's OL lost one player to the transfer portal, while four others graduated following the 2024 season. In all, those five players started a combined 166 career games for the RedHawks. Miami's 2025 offensive line will have a much different feel. Eric Smith, Kris Manu, Austin Uke and Greg Smith Jr. all made their first collegiate start in the season opener at Wisconsin, while Drew Terrill started his second career game. In all, Miami's offensive line has started a combined 31 games.

FROM WALK-ON TO TEAM LEADER

Silas Walters came to Miami back in 2021 as a walk-on. Prior to the 2023 season, Walters earned a scholarship, and in 2024 he finished second on the team with 95 tackles and 12 pass breakups. He also represented Miami's defense at the 2025 MAC Football Media Day in Detroit.

SEAN MCVAY JOINS CRADLE OF COACHES

Miami added a 10th bronze statue to its Cradle of Coaches in Sean McVay back in 2023. McVay, the current head coach of the Los Angeles Rams, joined Ara Parseghian, Paul Brown, Weeb Ewbank, John Harbaugh, John Pont, Carm Cozza, Bo Schembechler, Red Blaik, and Paul Dietzel in the south end of Yager Stadium.

NEW FACES NEW PLACES

The transfer portal has changed college football and Miami is no different. The RedHawks have 19 players on the team that transferred from other schools: Koy Beasley (Purdue), Mitch Bolden (Army), Jordan Brunson (Virginia Tech), Mitchell Butler (Southern Miss/Miss. Col.), Deion Colzie (Notre Dame), Luke Evans (Mississippi State), Dequan Finn (Toledo/Baylor), Bai Jobe (Kansas/Michigan State), Eric Karner (Texas A&M), Brody Kosin (Indiana), Jackson Kuwatch (Ohio State), Grant Leeper (Iowa), Kam Perry (Indiana), Keith Reynolds (Washington), James Schott (Michigan State), Eli Shereshovech IV (Wash U.), Brady Simmons (Indiana), Austin Uke (Stanford), Darion Williamson (Florida State) and Kam Wilson (Cincinnati/Louisville).

GRADUATING CHAMPIONS

Before Miami even takes the field in 2024, 15 different RedHawks will have already earned their Miami degree: Eli Blakey, Jordan Brunson, Deion Colzie, Dom Dzioban, Dequan Finn, Henry Hesson, Corban Hondru, Oscar McWood, Brian Shane, Kenny Tracy, Austin Uke, Marcus White, Nasir Washington, Darion Williamson and Kam Wilson.

Retired Miami Numbers

#7 Ben Roethlisberger

Ben Roethlisberger took his place in Miami Football history when his jersey No. 7 was retired on October 13, 2007. Roethlisberger ended his three-year playing tenure (2001-03) as the most prolific passer in program history.

#40 Bob Hitchens

No. 40 was retired in 1973 to mark the accomplishments of tailback Bob Hitchens, who concluded his career as the most prolific runner in Miami history. At the end of his three-year tenure (1971-73), Hitchens owned Miami's season and career records for points, rushing touchdowns, rushing attempts and rushing yards.

#41 Travis Prentice

No. 41 was retired to honor Travis Prentice. Prentice ranks sixth all-time in NCAA history with 5,596 rushing yards and second in total touchdowns with 78. He continues to own four NCAA records.

#42 John Pont

Worn by halfback John Pont through three varsity football campaigns, No. 42 was retired by the Athletic Advisory Council following his senior season in 1951. Pont thus became the first athlete in Miami history to have his jersey retired.

Miami University, known world-wide as the "Cradle of Coaches," contributed four alumni to Sporting News Magazine's 50 Greatest Coaches, dominating all other universities.

PAUL BROWN ('30) was named as the 12th greatest coach of all time by The Sporting News (TSN). Miamians WALTER ALSTON ('35) and BO SCHEMBECHLER ('51) ranked 35th and 36th on the list, while ARA PARSEGHIAN (`49) was selected as sports' 44th greatest coach. A fifth man with Miami ties, WOODY HAYES, ranked 27th on TSN's list. Hayes served as Miami's football coach from 1949-50.

The August 3, 2009 publication asked a panel of 118 top coaches, media and sports administrators to choose the Top 50 list.

Altogether, only four universities contributed more than one alumnus to the list. Miami's four alumni topped Alabama (Paul "Bear" Bryant and Bobby Bowden), Minnesota (Bud Wilkinson and Herb Brooks) and Kansas (Dean Smith and Adolph Rupp), which each had two alums ranked among the Top 50. Purdue graduate John Wooden, the famed "Wizard of Westwood", was ranked as the No. 1 coach of all time.



An Ohio native who was a two-year football letter winner (1928-29), Paul Brown is a member of Miami's "Cradle of Coaches" and excelled as a coach at the collegiate and professional levels. Brown was head coach at Ohio State (1941-43) and led the Buckeyes to their first national title in 1942. Brown then served as head coach at the professional level with the Cleveland Browns (1946-62) and Cincinnati Bengals (1968-75), winning championships in the All-America Football Conference and National Football League. **Brown** was elected into the Pro Football Hall of Fame in 1967.



Always displaying a calm, professional demeanor, the unflappable Walter **Alston** managed the Brooklyn and Los Angeles Dodgers for 23 seasons (1954-76), winning seven National League pennants and four World Series championships. His squads would win 2,040 games during his tenure, the seventh-highest win total among major league managers. He helped to establish a "Dodger Way," which many of his former players later used to become successful managers themselves.

A member of Miami's "Cradle of Coaches" and the College Football Hall of Fame, Bo Schembechler was a two-year letter winner (1949-50) and head coach (1963-68) with the Red and White. During his six seasons as head coach, Schembechler led Miami to a 40-17-3 record and back-to-back conference co-championships (1965-66). Schembechler then became the head coach at the University of Michigan (1969-89) and led the Wolverines to 13 Big Ten titles.


A member of Miami's "Cradle of Coaches" and the College Football Hall of Fame, Ara Parseghian was a football letter winner (1946-47) before moving to the sidelines as an assistant coach (1950) and head coach (1951-55). During his five seasons as Miami's head coach, Parseghian compiled a 39-6-1 record and won back-to-back Mid-American Conference Championships (1954-55). Parseghian went on to coach at Northwestern (1956-63) and Notre Dame (1964-74) where he was named National Coach of the Year in



A member of Miami's "Cradle of Coaches" and the College Football Hall of Fame, Woody Hayes served as the head coach of Miami during the 1949-50 and 1950-51 seasons. In his last year as head coach he led Miami to a 9-1 record and a MAC Championship, and also led his team to a victory in the Salad Bowl. Hayes went on to coach at the Ohio State University (1951-78) where he became a fixture for the Scarlet and Grey and quickly became recognized as one of the greatest coaches of all time. At OSU he compiled a 205-61-10 record (.761) and led the Buckeyes to five national titles, 13 Big Ten championships, and four bowl victories. He is a threetime winner of the College Football Coach of the Year Award.

In his career, Chuck Martin has more than 30 years in college coaching experience, including 17 years as a head coach. He has twice been named the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) National Coach of the Year, earning the honor in 2005 and 2006, was a finalist for the Eddie Robinson National Coach of the Year in 2023 and has coached in seven national championship games. In addition to his head coaching experience, Martin

has served as a coordinator on both sides of the ball. Of those seven national championship game appearances, he has been a part of four national championship wins, with two titles under his direction as head coach/offensive coordinator and one as a defensive coordinator.

After taking over a team that had just gone 0-12 in 2013, Miami was 4-14 in Martin's first 18 conference games. From there, the rest is history. Martin and the RedHawks are 49-19 in the MAC, best in the conference since 2016. The RedHawks won the 2019 and 2023 MAC Championship and have been bowl eligible eight of the past nine seasons. Martin has coached (132) and won (65) more games than anyone in Miami history.

This was done year after year with strong recruiting classes. Miami's classes have been some of the best the school has ever seen. Over the last nine years, Miami's recruiting classes have ranked first or second seven different times. Those recruiting efforts have shown up at the highest level as well. Dating back to 2019, Miami has had a player selected in the NFL Draft three of the past six years.

Miami's turnaround began back in 2016 as Martin orchestrated something that had never been done in college football. Miami rattled off six straight wins to become the first team in college football history to begin a season 0-6 and finish 6-6. The six-game win streak also moved Miami to 6-2 in the MAC, finishing in a tie for first in the East and helped the RedHawks advance to the St. Petersburg Bowl versus Mississippi State, Miami's first bowl appearance since 2010.

Under Martin, the RedHawks have won 20 contests over the past two years, the second-best two-year output in program history, which includes an 11-win season in 2023. Not only did Miami capture its second MAC Championship that season, the RedHawks also defeated Cincinnati for the first time since 2005. This past year the RedHawks captured nine wins and went 8-1 to close the season, including a win in the Snoop Dogg Arizona Bowl.

Prior to joining Miami, Martin spent four seasons at Notre Dame, serving as the offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach (2012-13) and defensive backs/recruiting coordinator (2010-11). In 2012, he orchestrated an offense that played in the BCS National Championship game versus Alabama. In 2011, he was named one of the top 25 recruiters in the nation by ESPN.com and was named to Rivals.com's Second-Team Assistant Coach Dream Team.

In Martin's two years calling plays, Notre Dame combined to go 20-5 overall and was one of the most balanced offenses in the country, averaging 26.4 points, 170.0 rushing and 235.6 passing per game.

Prior to arriving in South Bend, Martin was head coach and offensive coordinator for Grand Valley State University from 2004-2009 and compiled a 74-7 (.914) record, including an impressive 16-4 record in the NCAA Division II Playoffs. He and the Lakers won back-to-back national championships in 2005 and 2006 and finished runner-up in 2009. He directed Grand Valley State to 48 consecutive regular-season victories and 45 straight wins in the Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (GLIAC). He also guided the Lakers to a Division II record 40-game winning streak from 2005-07. Martin produced seven Associated Press First-Team All-America players as head coach.

At GVSU, Martin's offenses averaged 35.1 points, 208 rushing and 427 total yards per game. The Lakers ranked among the top-25 nationally in total offense in five of six seasons and ranked in the top-27 in scoring offense in all but one season. In that time, his offense scored at least 30 points in 56 of 81 games and scored at least 40 points in 34 contests.

Many of those offenses were led by quarterbacks who were developed under Martin. In six years, GVSU produced four Harlon Hill finalists, given annually to the NCAA Division II Player of the Year (Cullen Finnerty in 2006 and Brad Iciek from 2007-09). In that span, Laker quarterbacks threw 184 touchdown passes and just 41 interceptions.

His offenses were not just about the quarterback. In all six seasons, he produced a 1,000-yard rusher. In four of those seasons, a running back finished as a top-10 rusher in Grand Valley State history.

Before becoming head coach, Martin served as the defensive coordinator for the Lakers in 2003, helping GVSU win a national championship. Martin's defense allowed just nine total points in the final three games of the playoff run and among the ranked top-10 nationally in scoring, rushing and total defense that season.

Martin served as the defensive backs and outside linebackers coach at GVSU from 2000-02. Prior to arriving in Allendale, Mich., Martin spent time at Eastern Michigan (1998-1999, linebackers), Millikin University (1996-97, defensive coordinator/defensive backs), Wittenberg University (1994-95, linebackers) and Mankato State University (1992-93, graduate assistant/linebackers).

While attending Millikin (1986-90), Martin was an All-American safety and was selected as a GTE Academic All-American. He doubled as an All-American place kicker, received Academic All-District honors for the Millikin baseball team and was inducted into the Millikin Hall of Fame in 2008.

He graduated in 1990 with a degree in accounting and earned his master's degree in physical education from Mankato State University in 1993.

Martin and his wife Dulcie have two children, Max and Emma.
