REDHAWKS OPEN SEASON WITH TRIP TO WISCONSIN

The Miami University football team opens the 2025 football season on Thursday, Aug. 28 at Camp Randall Stadium versus the Wisconsin Badgers. Opening kick is slated for 9 p.m. EST and the contest will be carried live on the Big Ten Network.

ABOUT MIAMI

- Miami football ranks first all-time in the Mid-American Conference in wins (733), conference wins (324), MAC Championships (17) and bowl wins (9). Historically, Miami's 733 career wins are third all-time among Group-of-Five programs, behind just Navy (748) and Army (739).

- Miami was 4-14 in Coach Martin's first 18 Mid-American Conference games. Since then, the RedHawks are 49-19 in their last 68 games versus schools from the MAC, the best in the conference during that span.

- Over the past two years Miami has captured 20 wins, the fourth-best two-year span in Miami history. Only the 2003-04, 1973-74 and 1974-75 squads combined for more wins (21). Only 14 teams in the nation have won more games than the RedHawks over the past two years.

- Miami has competed in five straight bowl games and has been bowl-eligible in eight of the past nine seasons. The RedHawks are coming off a 43-17 win over Colorado State in the Snoop Dogg Arizona Bowl last season.

ABOUT MIAMI CONTINUED...

- Since Oct. 15, 2016, Miami has lost back-to-back conference games just twice in that span (2017, 2022). Miami is 16-3 following a conference loss, dating back to midway through the 2016 campaign.

- Miami returns zero offensive starters from a year ago. Gone are first-team All-MAC QB Brett Gabbert, 1,000-yard rusher Keyon Mozee and Miami's top four pass catchers.

- Defensively the RedHawks return four starters, led by safeties Silas Walters (95 tackles) and Eli Blakey (89 tackles). Miami returns just 7.5 of 30 sacks and six of 13 interceptions from last season.

ABOUT CHUCK MARTIN

- Chuck Martin was named Miami head coach on Dec. 3, 2013.
- He was named a 2023 Finalist for the Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award after an 11-3 season.

- Not only was he 74-7 in six years at Grand Valley State (2004-09), he has coached in seven national championship games in the past 22 seasons.

- Martin has an all-time head coaching record of 139-74.

- He is 65-67 all-time at Miami (51-33 in MAC play) and has won more games at Miami than any other coach. The previous high was held by Randy Walker (60 wins).

- Martin is the longest tenured active coach in the MAC.

- He has twice been named the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) National Coach of the Year and has been a coordinator on both sides of the ball.

- Martin was inducted into the Hall of Fame at Grand Valley State University on Oct. 23, 2015.

ABOUT WISCONSIN

Wisconsin is coming off a 5-7 season, which included a five-game losing streak to end the year. The Badgers feature five new quarterbacks on their roster and linebacker Christian Alliegro is the top returning tackler after posting 66 stops and 3.0 tackles in 2024.

GAME 1 • AT WISCONSIN

SERIES HISTORY VERSUS WISCONSIN

This is just the second meeting between the two programs. Miami dropped a 58-0 decision to the Badgers back on Sept. 12, 2015.

BIG GAME HUNTING

Miami has downed a Power-4 program in two of the past three years, including wins over Northwestern (2022) and an overtime victory versus Cincinnati (2023). Last season the RedHawks also threatened Northwestern (Lost, 13-6) and led Notre Dame 3-0 midway through the second quarter (Lost 28-3).

FINN TO WIN

While Dequan Finn will be making his first start as a member of the RedHawks program, the seventh-year quarterback has years of experience. Throughout his career he has thrown for 7,381 yards and 66 touchdown passes. He has added 1,906 rushing yards and 27 scores on the ground in 48 career games. Most of that damage came during his time at Toledo. In 45 career games with the Rockets, Finn threw for 7,074 yards and 63 scores, while adding 1,840 yards and 25 touchdowns on the ground. He earned first-team All-MAC and was the MAC Player of the Year in 2023 and is the only player in Toledo football history to throw for over 2,000 yards and rush for 500 yards in multiple seasons (2021, 2022, 2023).

TAKE ME TO YOUR LEADER

Finn's 93 career total touchdowns (66 passing, 27 rushing) ranks first among active players in the NCAA. The next closest is Vanderbilt's Diego Pavia (80 total touchdowns).

OTHER MARTIN QBs AND THEIR FIRST STARTS

Head coach Chuck Martin has had nine different QBs make starts for him since arriving in Oxford, and many of those QBs have made impacts in their first career starts with the RedHawks, including:

Andrew Hendrix (vs. Marshall, 2014) -- 24-of-49 for 318 yards and three TDs.

Gus Ragland (vs. Kent State, 2016) -- 10-of-21 for 181 yards and two TDs

Brett Gabbert (vs. Iowa, 2019) -- 17-of-27 for 186 yards and two TDs

Aveon Smith (vs. Robert Morris) -- 14-of-22 for 155 yards and three TDs

NEW QB IN THE HOUSE

Over the past 47 games the Miami RedHawks have featured just three quarterbacks: Brett Gabbert, Aveon Smith and Henry Hesson. Besides Hesson's lone start in the 2023 Cure Bowl, Gabbert and Smith started the other 46 contests. The last quarterback to start a game for the Red and White not named Gabbert/Smith/Hesson was AJ Mayer back on Oct. 16, 2021 versus Akron.

TRACY RETURNS

Running back Kenny Tracy was lost on the second day of fall camp back in 2024, but looks to return to full health a year later. He has 749 yards rushing and five touchdowns in his career and has added 40 grabs for 360 yards and three touchdowns through the air.

A SHOW OF HANDS

Miami lost its top two pass catchers to the portal (Javon Tracy and Reggie Virgil) and another two to graduation (Cade McDonald and Kevin Davis). Kam Perry is Miami's top returning pass catcher (10-166), but is joined by a handful of new additions: Keith Reynolds (Washington), Brady Simmons (Indiana) and Deion Colzie (Notre Dame). The only other non running backs that have caught a pass with the RedHawks are Cole Weaver (2-38), Braylon Isom (1-17) and Brian Shane (1-12).

NEW-LOOK OL

Miami's OL lost one player to the transfer portal, while four others graduated. In all, those five players started a combined 166 career games for the RedHawks. Miami's 2025 offensive line will have a much different feel. Drew Terrill and Greg Smith are tops on the team with one career start apiece along the offensive line.

CAN HISTORY REPEAT ITSELF?

Over the past four years, the Miami defense has been outstanding, finishing in the top 40 nationally every year since 2021. Miami allowed 23.1 points (40th) in 2021, 21.0 (35th) in 2022, 17.8 (7th) in 2023 and 18.8 (15th) in 2024. Defensive coordinator Bill Brechin's biggest challenge will be breaking in seven new starters if he wants Miami's defense to once again be a strong point.

FROM WALK-ON TO TEAM LEADER

Silas Walters came to Miami back in 2021 as a walk-on. Prior to the 2023 season, Walters earned a scholarship, and in 2024 he finished second on the team with 95 tackles and 12 pass breakups. He also represented Miami's defense at the 2025 MAC Football Media Day in Detroit.

GAME 1 • AT WISCONSIN

THE BOOK OF ELI

Eli Blakey, despite missing the final two games of 2024, was third on the team with 89 tackles. For his efforts he was named Third-Team All-MAC and is back helping to run Miami's defense. Blakey had a career-high 18 tackles in a win over EMU last season and averaged 7.5 tackles per game prior to his injury. He has 163 career tackles with the RedHawks.

KICKER UNIVERSITY

Miami football is making a habit of producing incredible kickers. Dom Dzioban returns for his senior year after being named a semifinalist for the Lou Groza Award in 2024. He connected on 26-of-30 field goals and matched a Yager Stadium record with five field goals in the win over CMU. Prior to Dzioban, Graham Nicholson won the Lou Groza (made 27-of-28 FGs) in 2023 and from 2016-19 Sam Sloman made 48-of-61 kicks, eventually getting drafted by the LA Rams. All three kickers rank in the top-5 for percentage in Miami football history.

SEAN MCVAY JOINS CRADLE OF COACHES

Miami added a 10th bronze statue to its Cradle of Coaches in Sean McVay back in 2023. McVay, the current head coach of the Los Angeles Rams, joined Ara Parseghian, Paul Brown, Weeb Ewbank, John Harbaugh, John Pont, Carm Cozza, Bo Schembechler, Red Blaik, and Paul Dietzel in the south end of Yager Stadium.

NEW FACES NEW PLACES

The transfer portal has changed college football and Miami is no different. The RedHawks have 20 players on the team that transferred from other schools: Koy Beasley (Purdue), Mitch Bolden (Army), Jordan Brunson (Virginia Tech), Mitchell Butler (Southern Miss/Miss. Col.), Deion Colzie (Notre Dame), Luke Evans (Mississippi State), Dequan Finn (Toledo/Baylor), Bai Jobe (Kansas/Michigan State), Eric Karner (Texas A&M), Brody Kosin (Indiana), Jackson Kuwatch (Ohio State), Grant Leeper (Iowa), Kam Perry (Indiana), Keith Reynolds (Washington), James Schott (Michigan State), Eli Shereshovech IV (Wash U.), Brady Simmons (Indiana), Austin Uke (Stanford), Darion Williamson (Florida State) and Kam Wilson (Cincinnati/Louisville).

Retired Miami Numbers

#7 Ben Roethlisberger

Ben Roethlisberger took his place in Miami Football history when his jersey No. 7 was retired on October 13, 2007. Roethlisberger ended his three-year playing tenure (2001-03) as the most prolific passer in program history.

#40 Bob Hitchens

No. 40 was retired in 1973 to mark the accomplishments of tailback Bob Hitchens, who concluded his career as the most prolific runner in Miami history. At the end of his three-year tenure (1971-73), Hitchens owned Miami's season and career records for points, rushing touchdowns, rushing attempts and rushing yards.

#41 Travis Prentice

No. 41 was retired to honor Travis Prentice. Prentice ranks sixth all-time in NCAA history with 5,596 rushing yards and second in total touchdowns with 78. He continues to own four NCAA records.

#42 John Pont

Worn by halfback John Pont through three varsity football campaigns, No. 42 was retired by the Athletic Advisory Council following his senior season in 1951. Pont thus became the first athlete in Miami history to have his jersey retired.

GAME 1 • AT WISCONSIN

Miami University, known world-wide as the “Cradle of Coaches,” contributed four alumni to *Sporting News Magazine’s* 50 Greatest Coaches, dominating all other universities.

PAUL BROWN (‘30) was named as the 12th greatest coach of all time by The Sporting News (TSN). Miamians WALTER ALSTON (‘35) and BO SCHEMBECHLER (‘51) ranked 35th and 36th on the list, while ARA PARSEGHIAN (‘49) was selected as sports’ 44th greatest coach. A fifth man with Miami ties, WOODY HAYES, ranked 27th on TSN’s list. Hayes served as Miami’s football coach from 1949-50.

The August 3, 2009 publication asked a panel of 118 top coaches, media and sports administrators to choose the Top 50 list.

Altogether, only four universities contributed more than one alumnus to the list. Miami’s four alumni topped Alabama (Paul “Bear” Bryant and Bobby Bowden), Minnesota (Bud Wilkinson and Herb Brooks) and Kansas (Dean Smith and Adolph Rupp), which each had two alums ranked among the Top 50. Purdue graduate John Wooden, the famed “Wizard of Westwood”, was ranked as the No. 1 coach of all time.



PAUL BROWN

An Ohio native who was a two-year football letter winner (1928-29), **Paul Brown** is a member of Miami’s “Cradle of Coaches” and excelled as a coach at the collegiate and professional levels. Brown was head coach at Ohio State (1941-43) and led the Buckeyes to their first national title in 1942. **Brown** then served as head coach at the professional level with the Cleveland Browns (1946-62) and Cincinnati Bengals (1968-75), winning championships in the All-America Football Conference and National Football League. **Brown** was elected into the Pro Football Hall of Fame in 1967.



WALTER ALSTON

Always displaying a calm, professional demeanor, the unflappable **Walter Alston** managed the Brooklyn and Los Angeles Dodgers for 23 seasons (1954-76), winning seven National League pennants and four World Series championships. His squads would win 2,040 games during his tenure, the seventh-highest win total among major league managers. He helped to establish a “Dodger Way,” which many of his former players later used to become successful managers themselves.



BO SCHEMBECHLER

A member of Miami’s “Cradle of Coaches” and the College Football Hall of Fame, **Bo Schembechler** was a two-year letter winner (1949-50) and head coach (1963-68) with the Red and White. During his six seasons as head coach, **Schembechler** led Miami to a 40-17-3 record and back-to-back conference co-championships (1965-66). **Schembechler** then became the head coach at the University of Michigan (1969-89) and led the Wolverines to 13 Big Ten titles.



ARA PARSEGHIAN

A member of Miami’s “Cradle of Coaches” and the College Football Hall of Fame, **Ara Parseghian** was a football letter winner (1946-47) before moving to the sidelines as an assistant coach (1950) and head coach (1951-55). During his five seasons as Miami’s head coach, **Parseghian** compiled a 39-6-1 record and won back-to-back Mid-American Conference Championships (1954-55). **Parseghian** went on to coach at Northwestern (1956-63) and Notre Dame (1964-74) where he was named National Coach of the Year in 1964.



WOODY HAYES

A member of Miami’s “Cradle of Coaches” and the College Football Hall of Fame, **Woody Hayes** served as the head coach of Miami during the 1949-50 and 1950-51 seasons. In his last year as head coach he led Miami to a 9-1 record and a MAC Championship, and also led his team to a victory in the Salad Bowl. Hayes went on to coach at the Ohio State University (1951-78) where he became a fixture for the Scarlet and Grey and quickly became recognized as one of the greatest coaches of all time. At OSU he compiled a 205-61-10 record (.761) and led the Buckeyes to five national titles, 13 Big Ten championships, and four bowl victories. He is a three-time winner of the College Football Coach of the Year Award.

In his career, Chuck Martin has more than 30 years in college coaching experience, including 17 years as a head coach. He has twice been named the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) National Coach of the Year, earning the honor in 2005 and 2006, was a finalist for the Eddie Robinson National Coach of the Year in 2023 and has coached in seven national championship games. In addition to his head coaching experience, Martin

has served as a coordinator on both sides of the ball. Of those seven national championship game appearances, he has been a part of four national championship wins, with two titles under his direction as head coach/offensive coordinator and one as a defensive coordinator.

After taking over a team that had just gone 0-12 in 2013, Miami was 4-14 in Martin's first 18 conference games. From there, the rest is history. Martin and the RedHawks are 49-19 in the MAC, best in the conference since 2016. The RedHawks won the 2019 and 2023 MAC Championship and have been bowl eligible eight of the past nine seasons. Martin has coached (132) and won (65) more games than anyone in Miami history.

This was done year after year with strong recruiting classes. Miami's classes have been some of the best the school has ever seen. Over the last nine years, Miami's recruiting classes have ranked first or second seven different times. Those recruiting efforts have shown up at the highest level as well. Dating back to 2019, Miami has had a player selected in the NFL Draft three of the past six years.

Miami's turnaround began back in 2016 as Martin orchestrated something that had never been done in college football. Miami rattled off six straight wins to become the first team in college football history to begin a season 0-6 and finish 6-6. The six-game win streak also moved Miami to 6-2 in the MAC, finishing in a tie for first in the East and helped the RedHawks advance to the St. Petersburg Bowl versus Mississippi State, Miami's first bowl appearance since 2010.

Under Martin, the RedHawks have won 20 contests over the past two years, the second-best two-year output in program history, which includes an 11-win season in 2023. Not only did Miami capture its second MAC Championship that season, the RedHawks also defeated Cincinnati for the first time since 2005. This past year the RedHawks captured nine wins and went 8-1 to close the season, including a win in the Snoop Dogg Arizona Bowl.

Prior to joining Miami, Martin spent four seasons at Notre Dame, serving as the offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach (2012-13) and defensive backs/recruiting coordinator (2010-11). In 2012, he orchestrated an offense that played in the BCS National Championship game versus Alabama. In 2011, he was named one of the top 25 recruiters in the nation by ESPN.com and was named to Rivals.com's Second-Team Assistant Coach Dream Team.

In Martin's two years calling plays, Notre Dame combined to go 20-5 overall and was one of the most balanced offenses in the country, averaging 26.4 points, 170.0 rushing and 235.6 passing per game.

Prior to arriving in South Bend, Martin was head coach and offensive coordinator for Grand Valley State University from 2004-2009 and compiled a 74-7 (.914) record, including an impressive 16-4 record in the NCAA Division II Playoffs. He and the Lakers won back-to-back national championships in 2005 and 2006 and finished runner-up in 2009. He directed Grand Valley State to 48 consecutive regular-season victories and 45 straight wins in the Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (GLIAC). He also guided the Lakers to a Division II record 40-game winning streak from 2005-07. Martin produced seven Associated Press First-Team All-America players as head coach.

At GVSU, Martin's offenses averaged 35.1 points, 208 rushing and 427 total yards per game. The Lakers ranked among the top-25 nationally in total offense in five of six seasons and ranked in the top-27 in scoring offense in all but one season. In that time, his offense scored at least 30 points in 56 of 81 games and scored at least 40 points in 34 contests.

Many of those offenses were led by quarterbacks who were developed under Martin. In six years, GVSU produced four Harlon Hill finalists, given annually to the NCAA Division II Player of the Year (Cullen Finnerty in 2006 and Brad Iciek from 2007-09). In that span, Laker quarterbacks threw 184 touchdown passes and just 41 interceptions.

His offenses were not just about the quarterback. In all six seasons, he produced a 1,000-yard rusher. In four of those seasons, a running back finished as a top-10 rusher in Grand Valley State history.

Before becoming head coach, Martin served as the defensive coordinator for the Lakers in 2003, helping GVSU win a national championship. Martin's defense allowed just nine total points in the final three games of the playoff run and among the ranked top-10 nationally in scoring, rushing and total defense that season.

Martin served as the defensive backs and outside linebackers coach at GVSU from 2000-02. Prior to arriving in Allendale, Mich., Martin spent time at Eastern Michigan (1998-1999, linebackers), Millikin University (1996-97, defensive coordinator/defensive backs), Wittenberg University (1994-95, linebackers) and Mankato State University (1992-93, graduate assistant/linebackers).

While attending Millikin (1986-90), Martin was an All-American safety and was selected as a GTE Academic All-American. He doubled as an All-American place kicker, received Academic All-District honors for the Millikin baseball team and was inducted into the Millikin Hall of Fame in 2008.

He graduated in 1990 with a degree in accounting and earned his master's degree in physical education from Mankato State University in 1993.

Martin and his wife Dulcie have two children, Max and Emma.
