Weekend Preview

- The Bulldogs head on the road for their final away series of the regular season
- MTU is fourth in the CCHA, five points ahead of both St. Thomas and Lake State
- The Huskies lead Ferris State by eight points as the Bulldogs currently sit in seventh place
- FSU has won five of its last seven while the Huskies are 0-3-1 since the calendar turned to February
- Michigan Tech is coming off a shootout victory over Augustana Saturday and is set for its final home series of the regular season

FSU's Last Time Out

- The Bulldogs collected two points against Lake State last weekend, winning 3-2 in overtime Friday before falling 5-3 in regulation Saturday
- Cole Burtch (2-1-3 in the series) and Caiden Gault (1-1-2) both extended their point streaks to five games
- Burtch had his first career multi-goal game Friday, including the overtime winner
- Kaleb Ergang (0-3-3) and Travis Shoudy (0-2-2) each have points in four straight games
- Noah West went 75-82 in the series, turning away 34-36 shots in Friday's win
- FSU went 3-9 on the power play and killed 8-9 LSSU opportunities
- The Bulldogs registered a season high 53 shots on goal Saturday

Scouting the Huskies

- MTU currently holds onto fourth place in the CCHA standings with a five point edge over St. Thomas and Lake State
- In February, the Huskies are 0-3-1 and are coming off a shootout victory over Augustana
- In January, Michigan Tech went 4-2
- The Huskies score 2.7 goals per game (T-3rd CCHA) and allow 2.7 (4th)
- On special teams, MTU boasts the second best power play in the league at 26% and kill at a .718 clip, second lowest in the league
- The Huskies are league average with a .509 win rate on faceoffs, 12.3 blocked shots and just under eight penalty minutes per game
- Stiven Sardarian is tied for the CCHA lead with 32 points (Malmquist, Pitlick). He also leads the team with 22 assists
- Max Koskipirtti (6-16-22) and Isaac Gordon (5-17-22) are tied for second on MTU with 22 points each
- Chase Pietila has a 7-14-21 line and rookie Elias Jansson has a 10-8-18 line with a team-best six power play goals
- Derek Mullahy leads the team with 18 starts. He is 6-9-3 with two shutouts, a 2.66 GAA and .901 save percentage
- Ryan Manzella has started eight games with a 6-2 record, 2.57 GAA and .901 save percentage
- Kasper Vaharautio is tied for the conference lead with 65 blocked shots (Magnuson)

Bulldogs vs Huskies Earlier This Year

- Michigan Tech won both meetings back in November in Big Rapids
- MTU took a 3-2 win Friday and then completed the sweep with a 3-1 win Saturday
- The Huskies went 2-6 on the power play and killed all three Bulldog opportunities
- **Gavin Best** and **Cole Burtch** with Burtch registering his first career multi-point game
- **Noah West** started Friday's game and saved 28-31 shots
- West relieved freshman **Connor McDonough** Saturday and stopped all 19 shots he faced in the final 50:23
- Max Vayrynen was 23-25 Friday and Derek Mullahy went 36-37 Saturday for the Huskies

- Michigan Tech is 32-14-3 in the all-time series, including 12-7 at home
- The Huskies are 15-2-2 in 19 games since Feb. 14, 2020
- MTU won the first ever meeting 7-4 in Big Rapids on March 5, 1982

Shoudy Named 2024-25 Team Captain

- Junior defenseman **Travis Shoudy** will wear the Captain's patch for the upcoming 2024-25 season
- Shoudy led all Bulldog defensemen in points last year while finishing third on the squad with 21 points
- The Marysville, Michigan native led the team with 17 assists in the 2023-24 season, which was fourth amongst CCHA D-men
- His assist and point totals were career-bests while the four goals tied his career high. He also sent a career-high 83 shots on goal
- Shoudy was a CCHA Scholar Athlete as a sophomore
- With Shoudy's appointment to Captain, this marks the third consecutive season a defenseman will wear the patch for Ferris State. Shoudy was preceded as Captain by Brenden MacLaren (2022-23, 2023-24) and Matt Slick (2022-23)

2024-25 Captains

- **Nico DeVita** is a senior from Bellevue, Washington and will join Shoudy as a Bulldog Captain from the blueline
- **Nick Nardecchia** will wear an A this year as a senior with 100+ games played as a Bulldog
- **Kaleb Ergang** was the Bulldogs' leading scorer among returning forwards last year and will wear an A in his senior season

CCHA Players of the Week/Month

- **Trevor Taulien** was awarded CCHA Defenseman of the Week after the season-opening weekend, leading all CCHA defensemen in goals (2) and all players nationally with 8 blocks
- **Nico DeVita** was CCHA DOTW for Week 3 with a shorthanded goal in FSU's win over Bemidji State. He also blocked a league-high eight shots in the series
- **Noah West** earned his first CCHA honors as the Goaltender of the Week for his Dec. 6 & 7 performances against Northern Michigan. He went 2-0, stopped 57-59 (.966) shots faced and earned his first collegiate assist in Friday's win
- **Travis Shoudy** was the CCHA Defenseman of the Week for Jan. 17-18 with a two assist weekend against Bowling Green. Shoudy had a helper each night and finished +3 in Saturday's win, blocking two shots along the way
- **Taulien** also collected CCHA DOTW honors for Jan. 24-25. His second award of the year came after a two-assist series against Minnesota State
- **Noah West** was the CCHA Goaltender of the Week for a second time after going 2-0 against Bemidji State Jan. 31 & Feb. 1. He led the conference with a .968 save percentage and 1.00 GAA
- **Travis Shoudy** was named the CCHA Defenseman of the Month for January. He led conference blueliners with a 4-6-10 line and finished a CCHA-best +9 across seven games.

Returning Point Leaders

- The Bulldogs will return one of their top five point producers from last season
- **Travis Shoudy** finished with the third most points (21) in the 2023-24 season and had the most assists (17) on the squad. He had the most assists and points by a Bulldog defenseman since Jake Willets had 18 helpers and 22 points during the 2019-20 season. Shoudy's 32 career points lead all Bulldog returners.
- **Kaleb Ergang** returns the second-most points from last year (15). His six goals ranked tied for fifth most on the team, and the senior projects to be amongst the team-leaders in scoring this season.
- **Emerson Goode** had a strong freshman campaign for Ferris State in 2023-24, compiling a 7-5-12 line. Eight of his 12 points came during the final two months of play, including four goals and two multi-point games.
- Senior **Zach Faremouth** had the best offensive stretch of his career during the final month of the 2023-24 season, tallying a 4-3-7 line during that time. He had a 6-5-11 line for the season, returning the fourth most points for the upcoming year.
- **Tyler Schleppe** returns for his junior season after finishing with 10 points on three goals and seven assists in 25 games last year. As a freshman two seasons ago, Schleppe had 15 points with nine goals in 36 games. The junior projects to be an offensive leader for the Bulldogs in 2024-25.

- FSU is 5-8-2 at home this year with two shootout wins
- At home, the Bulldogs average 2.46 goals per game and allow 3.27
- On the road, FSU scores 2.53 goals and gives up 3.28
- FSU's power play is 12.2% at home and 19.4% on the road
- FSU kills 73.6% of penalties at home and 66.7% on the road
- On average, 1,387 people attend FSU's home games
- The highest attended game this season was Feb. 15 against Lake State (2,031)
- The Dawgs went 5-10-2 at home last season (5-12 on the road)

Bob Daniels

Head Coach Bob Daniels begins his 33rd season behind the Bulldog Bench in 2024-25. Three seasons ago, Coach Daniels passed college hockey legends Joe Marsh (St. Lawrence) and Murray Armstrong (Denver) and is 16th all-time in NCAA Division I Men's Ice Hockey in wins as a head coach with 508, all with Ferris State.



In 2015-16, Daniels led FSU to the school's first postseason tournament championship ever as the Bulldogs claimed the WCHA Final Five Championship during a memorable postseason run. FSU advanced to the national tournament for the third time in five years while reaching the NCAA Final Eight.

Daniels guided the Bulldogs to the WCHA Regular-Season Championship in FSU's debut season in 2013-14 along with an NCAA Elite Eight appearance while earning WCHA Coach of the Year accolades and runner-up honors for National Coach of the Year.

In 2011-12, Daniels claimed CCHA and National Coach of the Year accolades for the second time in his career after leading the Bulldogs to the program's second-ever league regular-season championship and a historic first-ever trip to the Frozen Four where FSU reached the national championship game.

Ferris State placed fifth or higher four times in the final five seasons of CCHA league competition, including the 2011-12 title run.

The 2002-03 CCHA Coach of the Year Award recipient and a two-time (2007-08 and 2009-10) award finalist, Daniels attained another milestone in his distinguished coaching career by recording his 300th career win following a 4-1 decision at Bowling Green midway through the 2010-11 season. He won his 400th game as the Bulldogs' head coach in 2015-16.

BULLDOG HOCKEY COACHES

Drew Famulak - Associate Head Coach



Drew Famulak begins his 32nd season with Ferris State in 2024-25.

He was honored in 2012 with the prestigious Terry Flanagan Award by the American Hockey Coaches Association (ACHA) for his career body of work.

Famulak, who previously served as FSU's top assistant coach, was promoted to associate head coach on August 21, 2003.

Recently, in 2015-16, Famulak helped lead FSU to the school's first postseason tournament championship ever as the Bulldogs claimed the WCHA Final Five Championship during a memorable postseason run. FSU advanced to the national tournament for the third time in five years while reaching the NCAA Final Eight.

In 2011-12, Famulak helped lead the Bulldogs to the program's second-ever league regular-season championship and a historic first-ever trip to the Frozen Four where FSU reached the national championship game. Ferris State placed fifth or higher four times in the last five seasons of CCHA league competition.

In 2013-14, he helped lead the Bulldogs to the Western Collegiate Hockey Association (WCHA) Regular-Season Championship in FSU's debut season along with an NCAA Elite Eight appearance.

Along with his coaching duties, Famulak serves as the Bulldog Hockey's recruiting coordinator and through his tireless efforts, Ferris State has been able to land some of the program's top recruiting classes in the last 15 years, including Hobey Baker Hat Trick Finalist and first-team All-American Chris Kunitz.

Famulak was also instrumental in helping FSU post one of its best seasons ever at 31-10-1 overall in the program's history and securing its first-ever Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) Regular-Season title in the 2002-03 season. As a result of the success, Famulak was part of a FSU coaching staff which was recognized as the American Hockey Coaches Association's (AHCA) 2002-03 National Coaching Staff of the Year.

Success has accompanied Famulak on every hockey level, both as a student-athlete and coach. As a collegian, he played right wing for Lake Superior State's 1988 NCAA Division I championship team and also for a pair of NCAA Division III champions at the University of Wisconsin-Stevens Point. His coaching experience in the CCHA includes a two-year stint (1990-92) at Miami University in Oxford, Ohio, where he helped recruit the freshmen class for the RedHawks' 1993 CCHA champions.

Famulak has an impressive background in fundraising, scouting and recruiting at the junior hockey level. In 1992-93, he served as head coach and general manager for the Yorkton Terriers of the Saskatchewan Junior Hockey League (SJHL). At Yorkton, he coached the Terriers to a second-place finish while five of his players earned NCAA Division I scholarships.

Famulak played his junior hockey for the SJHL's Melville (Saskatchewan) Millionaires and totaled 69 points (31 goals and 38 assists) during the 1984-85 season. As a collegiate, he played right wing for Lake Superior State University's 1988 NCAA Division I championship team and also for a pair of NCAA Division III champions at the University of Wisconsin-Stevens Point. He was inducted into the Lake Superior State Athletics Hall of Fame as a member of the Lakers' 1987-88 national championship team on Oct. 22, 2005.

He received his bachelor's degree in business administration-management in 1990 from Wisconsin-Stevens Point and holds a master's degree in sports organization from Miami University (1993).

Famulak, and his wife, Cheryl, are the parents of two children - Ian and Emma. The family resides in Grand Rapids, Mich. He's a member of the American Hockey Coaches Association.

Mark Kaufman - Assistant Coach



Mark Kaufman begins his 19th consecutive season with Ferris State in 2024-25 and his 21st overall.

Kaufman, who was also an assistant at Ferris State from 1992-94 under current head coach Bob Daniels, is involved in all facets of the program with specific emphasis on coaching the defensemen, recruiting, and penalty kill.

In 2015-16, Kaufman helped lead FSU to the school's first postseason tournament championship ever as the Bulldogs claimed the WCHA Final Five Championship during a memorable postseason

run. FSU advanced to the national tournament for the third time in five years while reaching the NCAA Final Eight.

In 2011-12, Kaufman helped lead the Bulldogs to the program's second-ever league regular-season championship and a historic first-ever trip to the Frozen Four where FSU reached the national championship game.

In 2013-14, he helped lead the Bulldogs to the Western Collegiate Hockey Association (WCHA) Regular-Season Championship in FSU's debut season along with an NCAA Elite Eight appearance.

Kaufman has played a vital role in Ferris State boasting the nation's top NCAA Division I penalty-kill unit for two seasons (2009-10 and 2010-11). The Bulldogs posted a national-best .884 percentage in the 2009-10 campaign and a school-record .886 efficiency rate for the 2010-11 season.

Prior to his second stint at Ferris State, Kaufman had spent two seasons (2003-05) as head coach and general manager of the United States Hockey League's (USHL) Sioux Falls (Iowa) Stampede after serving as the director of hockey operations and head coach of the Kalamazoo (Mich.) Wings in 2000.

A native of Pittsburgh, Pa., Kaufman spent 1998-02 with the Richmond (Va.) Renegades of the East Coast Hockey League (ECHL) as the organization's head coach/director of hockey operations. He was chosen as co-coach of the 1999-00 Northern Conference All-Star Team. In the 1998-99 season, Richmond was Kelley Cup Playoff finalists and playoff champions of the Northern Conference.

Following his two seasons (1992-94) at Ferris State, Kaufman served as an assistant coach for the International Hockey League's (IHL) Kansas City (Mo.) Blades in the 1994-95 campaign. He helped the Blades become a Turner Cup Playoff finalist and win an Eastern Conference Playoff title. The following season (1995-96), Kaufman moved up to the NHL ranks with the San Jose Sharks in an assistant coaching capacity. He then spent two seasons (1996-98) as an assistant with the Kentucky Thoroughblades of the American Hockey League (AHL).

Kaufman arrived at Ferris State in Bob Daniels' first season (1992-93) as head coach and the Bulldogs went on to register a 21-16-4 overall record and competed in the Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) Championships. He then was promoted as the top assistant on Daniels' staff for the 1993-94 campaign.

Prior to Ferris, Kaufman was the general manager and head coach of the USHL's Rochester (Minn.) Mustangs where he compiled a 116-95-7 record and coached the 1989-90 team to its third Junior A national championship. He coordinated all of the scheduling, budgeting, recruiting, game staging, off-ice training, housing, fund raising and public relations at Rochester.

From 1986-88, Kaufman served as an assistant coach for U.S. International University, a former NCAA Division I independent located in San Diego, Calif. His responsibilities included monitoring the academic progress of the student-athletes, admissions, housing and the administration of financial aid.

Kaufman was head coach of the Reford (Mich.) Junior B team in 1984-85 and guided the Royals to both league and playoff championship titles. He was also an assistant coach for the USA Hockey Junior Olympic Festival in Lake Placid, N.Y. in 1992.

As a collegian, Kaufman earned a bachelor's degree in urban planning from Michigan State University in 1984. In 1987, Kaufman received his master's degree in physical education at Miami University in Oxford, Ohio. He was a graduate assistant coach for the RedHawks during the 1985-86 season.

A 1979 graduate of Central Catholic High School in Pittsburgh, Kaufman competed in ice hockey as a prepster.

The son of Eugene and Jean Kaufman of Pittsburgh, Pa., Mark is married to the former Catherine Peacock and the couple has a son (Brett). The family resides in Portage, Mich.

Kaufman holds membership in the American Hockey Coaches Association (AHCA).

Dave Cencer - Assistant Coach



Dave Cencer enters the 2024-25 season as a second year Assistant Coach for Ferris State after previously serving as the team's coordinator of athletic performance for 17 seasons.

Cencer, moved into the role before the

2023-24 season when the NCAA ruled that NCAA Division I men's ice hockey teams could have a third assistant coach.

"We're excited to move Dave into this role and he's highly-deserving to be labeled as an assistant coach," said FSU head coach Bob Daniels following Cencer's appointment. "He's been extremely important to our program for many years and will play an even greater role moving forward both in terms of on-ice coaching and recruiting."

Cencer, who will begin his 19th year as a member of the FSU coaching staff in 2024-25, has led the program's off-ice efforts as the strength and conditioning coach during his Bulldog tenure along with serving as the program's video coordinator. In his time with Ferris State Hockey, Cencer has implemented the latest in sports science technology, using First Beat Technologies to monitor heart rate, energy expenditure and recovery.

Cencer has coordinated all on-ice and off-ice strength training and conditioning for the Bulldogs. He holds a master's degree in exercise science along with certifications from the NSCA (Certified Strength and Conditioning Specialist) and USA Weightlifting.

In 2016, Cencer was named to the Michigan Advisory Board of the National Strength and Conditioning Association. He has also been a presenter for the NSCA at both state and national conferences.

In addition to his experience at Ferris State, Cencer coached the 2009-2010 season with the Stanley Cup champion Chicago Blackhawks organization.

Cencer, who is a competitive cyclist, and his wife, Anna, along with their family reside in Cadillac. He earned a bachelor's degree from Franciscan University.

Meet the Freshmen

- **Conner Brown** spent the previous two years with the Janesville Jets. Last year, he finished second on the team with 67 points and led the squad with 57 assists. In 2022-23, he had 26 points with 21 assists. His offensive talent will be a valuable asset for FSU.

- **Matt Corbet** is the son of former NHL forward Rene Corbet. Matt is a forward who spent three seasons (2020-23) with the Calgary Canucks before playing for the Grande Prairie Storm as a Captain in 2023-24. He scored 32 points in back-to-back seasons to close his junior hockey career. Penalties have been an issue - 132, 174, 150 minutes in the past three seasons, respectively, but if Corbet can stay out of the box, he could make a big impact as a freshman.

- **Logan Heroux** also has NHL bloodlines as his father, Yves Heroux, played one game for the Quebec Nordiques in 1986-87. Logan spent the previous two years with the Shreveport Mudbugs, appearing in 114 total games. He posted a 20-56-76 line, including a 3-1-4 line in 17 playoff appearances.

- **Christopher Lie** hails from Hamar, Norway. Fellow freshman Martin Lundberg is also from Norway, making them the second and third Bulldog players to ever come from Norway (the other being Martin Sellgren). Lie competed for Norway at the 2024 IIHF World Junior Championship last season along with playing 48 games for Malmo Redhawks J20. He posted a 3-13-16 line as a defenseman with only 16 penalty minutes.

- **Luke Lisko** played three seasons with the Sherwood Park Crusaders, scoring 26 goals and registering 26 assists for 52 points across 77 games. Lisko stays out of the box (24 penalty minutes in three years) and makes a positive impact on the ice (+24 with the Crusaders), showing great potential coming to Ferris State.

- **Martin Lundberg** is a goalie from Norway who also competed at the 2024 IIHF World Junior Championship. In 2023-24, he posted a 3.01 GAA and .903 save percentage for Mora IK J20 (19 appearances) with a 13-5 record. At just 19 years old, he shows a lot of promise and could be a great goaltender for Ferris State.

- **Connor McDonough** is a big (6'5", 236) goaltender from New Jersey. In two seasons with the Amarillo Wranglers, McDonough appeared in 58 games and had a 33-17-7 record with five shut-outs. Last year, he posted a 2.59 GAA and .909 save percentage in 49 outings. McDonough projects to be a staple of the Bulldog goaltending crew for years to come.

- **Jack Silich** competed for the Cranbrook Bucks the last two years, compiling 36 goals, 27 assists and 63 points in 95 games. He played with current Bulldogs Cole Burth and Connor McGrath with the Youngstown Phantoms in 2020-21, and should make an impact offensively as a freshman for the Bulldogs.

- **Kade Turner** is a defenseman who played the previous three years for the Okotoks Oilers. He served as the team's Assistant Captain in 2023-24. During his time with the Oilers, Turner compiled 19 goals, 62 assists and 81 points across 161 games. He is a strong, disciplined defenseman who should see plenty of run as a freshman.

In his final season of junior hockey in 2021-22, Best posted a 20-34-54 line as an assistant captain with the Minnesota Magicians, good for the second most points on the squad.

- **Cole Burtch** left Western Michigan and comes to the Bulldogs as a redshirt sophomore. Last year, he appeared in three games for the Broncos, recording one assist. He will be looking for his first collegiate goal during the upcoming season with Ferris State. Burtch played junior hockey with Travis Shoudy as a member of the Cedar Rapids Roughriders in the 2021-22 season and with Connor McGrath on the Youngstown Phantoms during the 2020-21 season. Incoming freshman Jack Silich also played on that Phantoms team.

- **Max Itagaki** contributed significant offensive production for two years with Army and now comes to a Ferris State team that lost four of its top five point scorers from a season ago. Itagaki posted a 6-19-25 line as a sophomore last year (second most points on Army) and led Army with a 4-29-33 line as a freshman in 2022-23. He played junior hockey with Andrew Noel in Nanaimo and the forward will look to be a key piece in the Bulldogs' offensive attack during the 2024-25 season.

- **Xavier Jean-Louis** joins the Bulldogs after two seasons on the Alaska blueline. The junior defenseman from Montreal, Quebec played with Travis Shoudy on the Austin Bruins during the 2021-22 season before appearing in 39 games across two seasons for Alaska. He has a 2-5-7 career line, and at 6'4", 209 pounds figures to be a big factor defensively for the Bulldogs.

- **Noah West** comes to Big Rapids as the projected leader between the pipes for the 2024-25 season. He appeared in 11 games over the past three seasons for UofM, posting a 4-2-1 record. In his freshman season with Robert Morris, West was the starting goaltender, finishing 9-7-0, had one shutout and a 2.66 GAA with a .915 save percentage. He was named to the Atlantic Hockey All-Rookie Team and was Second-Team All-Atlantic Hockey.
