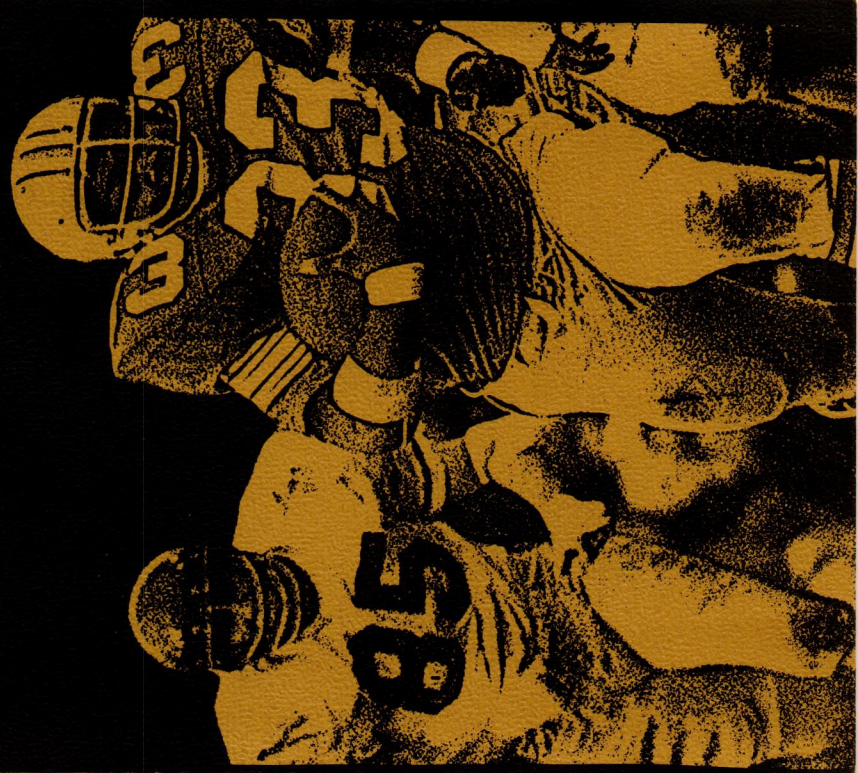

**DR. JAMES A. (JIM) MONTGOMERY** is in his sixteenth year as a member of the Majors' coaching staff and his thirteenth as Director of Athletics. Montgomery received his A.B. in English and Physical Education from Birmingham Southern College (1953), his M.A. in Physical Education (1956), and Ed.D. in Physical Education (1960) from George Peabody College in Nashville, Tennessee. In the Spring of 1961 he assumed the duties of Director of Athletics in addition to those of Chairman of the Department of Physical Education.



**HARPER DAVIS** is beginning his eleventh season as Football Coach at Millsaps College. One of Mississippi State University's all-time great half-backs, Davis earned a B.S. in Physical Education and Mathematics there in 1949 and later returned to receive a Master of Education degree. After playing in the College All Star Football game in Chicago in 1949, Davis played four years of professional football with the Chicago Bears and the Green Bay Packers. Davis served three years as varsity backfield coach at Mississippi State University, one year as head coach at Lee High School in Columbus, and four years as head man at West Point High School. Davis, a Methodist, is married and has three children.



**TOMMY LAVERNE RANAGER** is in his eleventh year as Assistant Football coach at Millsaps College. Ranager was graduated from Meridian High School and earned a B.S. in Physical Education at Mississippi State University in 1963. He was a three letter winner in football and was named a second team All S.E.C. guard his senior year. Ranager served one year as line coach and track coach at Hazlehurst High School before assuming similar duties at Millsaps. He is married and has two children and is a member of the Baptist Church.
