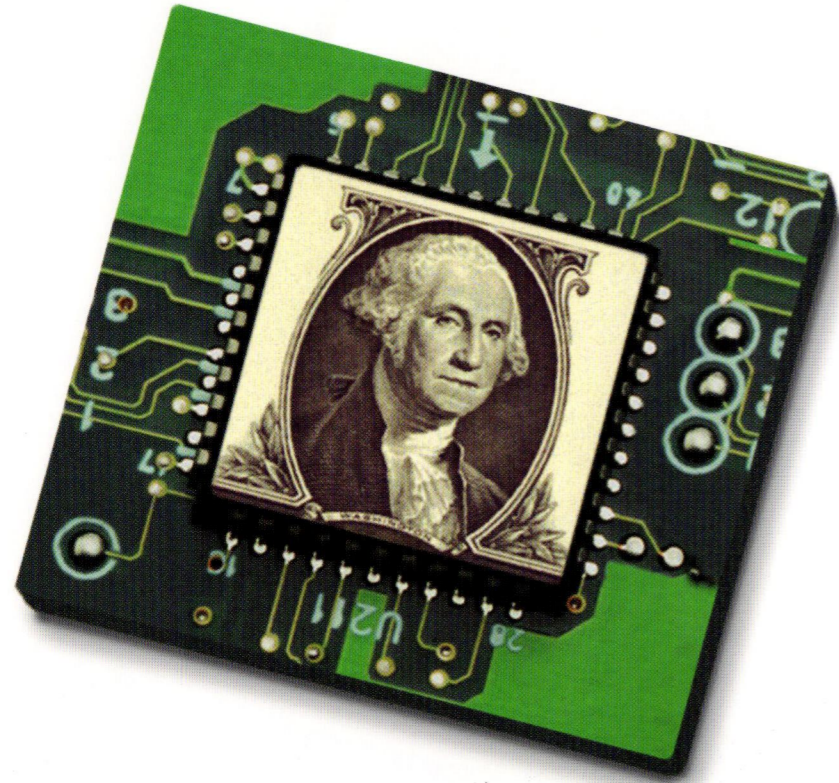

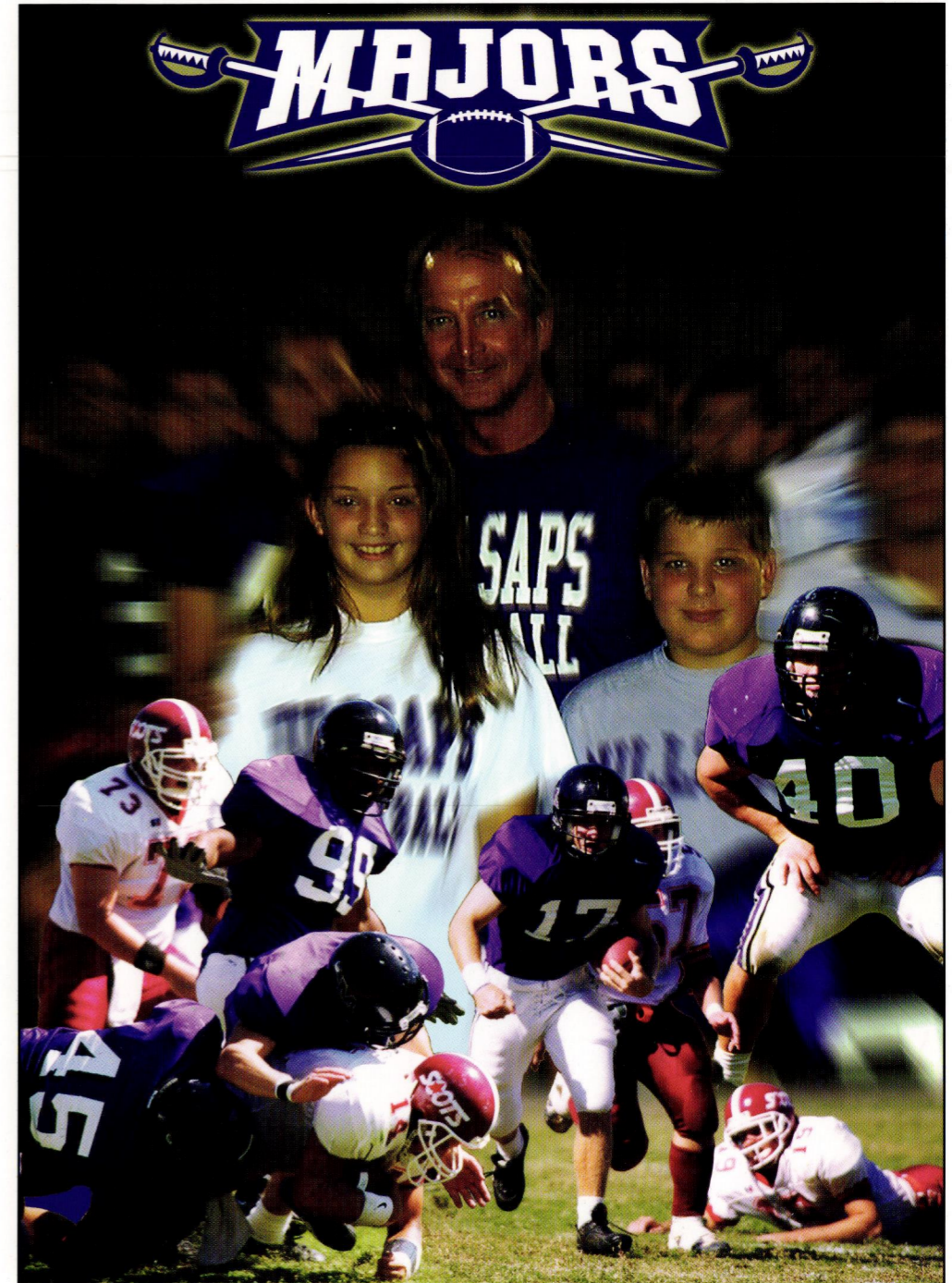

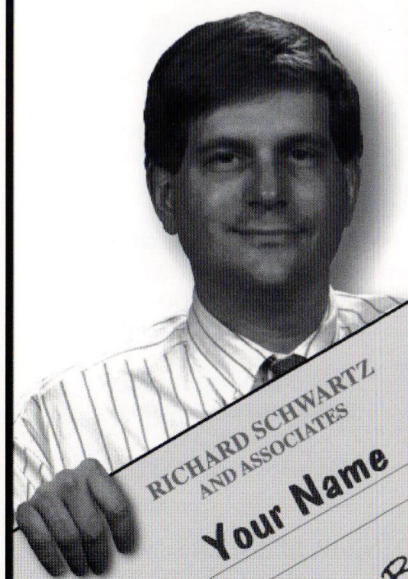

PRESIDENT'S WELCOME

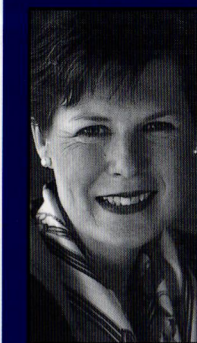

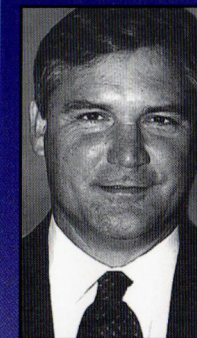

Millsaps College has a tradition of academic excellence dating from its founding in 1890 by Major Reuben Webster Millsaps. Located in Jackson, Mississippi's capital city, and affiliated with the United Methodist Church, Millsaps is consistently ranked as one of the nation's top liberal arts schools.

For more than a century, the rolling hills and oak-shaded hollows of the 100-acre campus have been home to a distinguished community of students and faculty united in their pursuit of excellence.

Millsaps is one of only four liberal arts colleges in the nation with both a Phi Beta Kappa chapter and accreditation of its undergraduate and graduate business school programs by the American Assembly of Collegiate Schools of Business. *U.S. News & World Report* ranked Millsaps as the third "Best Value" among national liberal arts colleges, and *Kiplinger's Personal Finance Magazine* ranked Millsaps 69th among all U.S. private colleges.

The Millsaps faculty, recognized as leaders in their academic disciplines, are dedicated teachers and mentors, as well as scholars. More than ninety percent of them have a doctorate or terminal degree in their field.

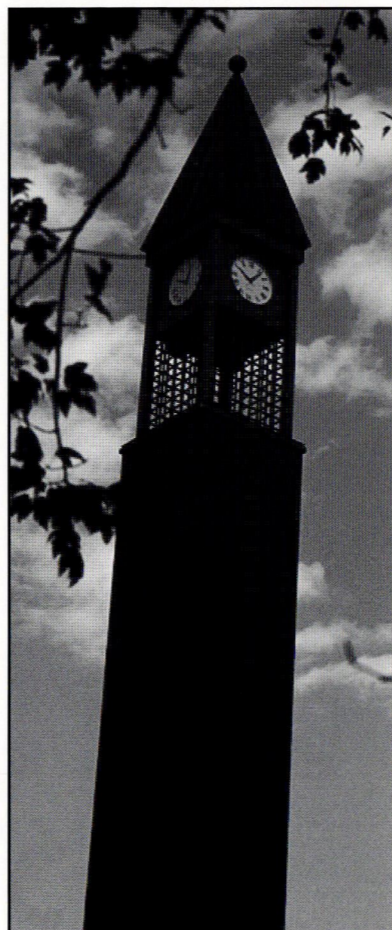
Millsaps' 1,400 student body represents 30 states and eight foreign countries. Sixty-eight percent of the students come from the top quarter of their graduating class and forty percent are from the top ten percent of their class. More than two-thirds of Millsaps graduates eventually continue their education in graduate or professional schools. Of particular interest to

non-traditional students is the nationally recognized Adult Degree Program that gives students an opportunity to earn degrees through a combination of traditional courses and independent, directed study.

Along with a very unique interdisciplinary program in the humanities and sciences, Millsaps offers opportunities for study abroad, Ford Foundation Teaching Fellows, and Honors Program, internships available as early as the freshman year, and research opportunities provided by the Howard Hughes Medical Institute.

The oak leaf, representing the military insignia of major, is incorporated as part of the school athletic logo. Tyler is married to Dale and they have three sons, Breck, Cam and Drew.

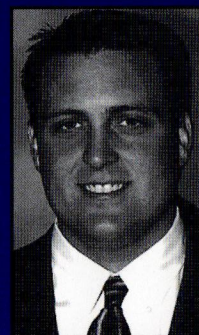

OFFENSIVE COORDINATOR

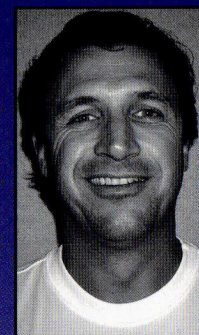

JOHN BOND
QUARTERBACKS

Mississippi State legend and former all-America quarterback John Bond joins the Millsaps staff for his first season as the Majors' quarterbacks coach. A native of Valdosta, GA, and a 1995 graduate of Mississippi State, Bond enjoyed a record-breaking career with the Bulldogs from 1980-83. He still stands third on the Mississippi State all-time passing yardage list (4,621 yards) and ranks sixth among the school's career rushing leaders (2,280). He is the only player in Southeastern Conference history to rush for more than 2,000 yards and pass for more than 4,000 yards. Bond was named first-team freshman all-America by The Sporting News to start his collegiate career and led the Bulldogs to a pair of post-season bowl berths during his tenure. He directed State to the 1980 Sun Bowl against Nebraska and led the Bulldogs to victory in the 1981 Hall of Fame Bowl vs. Kansas. Following his MSU career, Bond played one season for the Saskatchewan Rough Riders in the Canadian Football League and was selected by the Cleveland Browns in the third round of the 1986 supplemental draft.



The NCAA—Common Ground of College Athletics

It was the flying wedge, football's major offense in 1905 that spurred the formation of the NCAA in December 1905. Numerous sport-related injuries and deaths had prompted many institutions to discontinue the sport. Others were urging that football be reformed or abolished completely from intercollegiate athletics.

So in 1905, President Theodore Roosevelt summoned college athletics leaders to two White House conferences to encourage such reforms. The Intercollegiate Athletic Association of the United States was officially constituted on March 31, 1906. There were 62 charter members.

In 1910, it took its present name of the National Collegiate Athletic Association and, for several years, served primarily as a discussion group and rules-making body.

Now, more than 1,200 colleges, universities, conferences and related organizations count on the NCAA to be the organization through which they speak. It is a voluntary association devoted to the sound administration of intercollegiate athletics.

Through the NCAA, member institutions consider an athletics problem that has crossed regional or conference lines and has become national in scope. The Association, through its members, strives to maintain intercollegiate athletics as an integral part of the educational program and the athletes as an integral part of the student body. The NCAA also stands for good conduct in intercollegiate athletics and serves as the colleges' national athletics accreditation agency.

The organization and its members recognize that creating an equitable college environment for its student-athletes is among their highest priorities. Working together to enact rules, policies, procedures and organizational goals, its members strive for the common goal of academic integrity for their programs.

Just as integrity is key for the academic process, it is also a component in the competition among NCAA institutions. The NCAA and its staff is charged with enforcing the rules and regulations that the institutions vote and impose on themselves.

While enforcement proceedings involving member schools seem to grab most of the headlines, they represent only a small part of the NCAA's total program.

The NCAA administered its first national championship in 1921—the National Collegiate Track and Field Championships. Today, the NCAA administers 81 champi-

onships in 22 sports for its member institutions, involving more than 24,000 men and women student-athletes. There are 24 championships on the Division I level, 23 on the Division II level and 24 for Division III members, along with 10 sports that have National Collegiate Championships for which all divisions are eligible.

Beyond its annual championships, the NCAA also places a high priority on honoring its members and student-athletes, evident in its honors program and postgraduate scholarships program. The honors program recognizes accomplishments of current and former outstanding student-athletes, while the postgraduate scholarship program annually honors 154 high-ranking college student-athletes who are in their last year of intercollegiate competition by providing them scholarships of \$5,000 each. The NCAA also recognizes the need to assist its members in career development in collegiate athletics and has addressed this area through its women's and ethnic minority enhancement programs.

The NCAA Hall of Champions opened in the fall of 1990. It presents a photographic and video salute to intercollegiate athletics both past and present in a 12,000-square foot facility at the Association's national office building. Visitors to the hall are treated to specially prepared multimedia presentations in a spacious and modern theater and can feel the excitement of center court at the Final Four and the kickoff of college football games in uniquely designed photo displays.

The NCAA's members form a diverse group ranging from large state institutions to small, privately funded colleges. Their common goal, however, is the same—working for the advancement and achievement of the student-athlete and for the common good of higher education.

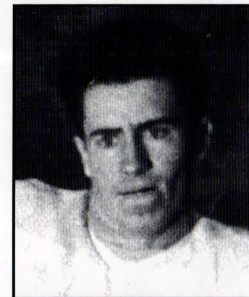

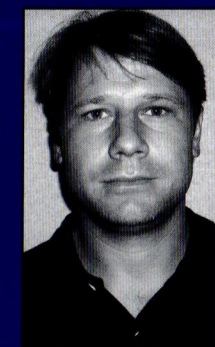


FOOTBALL ASSISTANT COACHES

Barry also played defensive back at Delta State University. Barry's coaching experience includes a stint at Madison-Ridgeland Academy where he coached the defensive secondary.

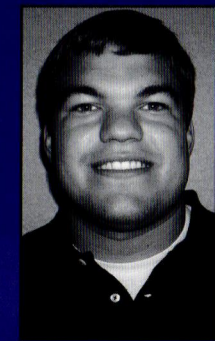

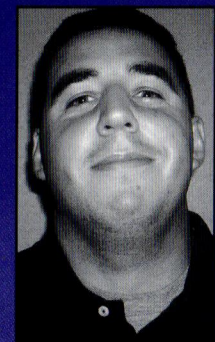

TOM ROBERTS OFFENSIVE LINE

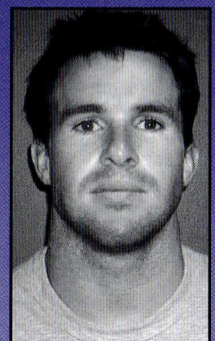

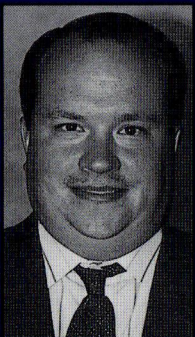

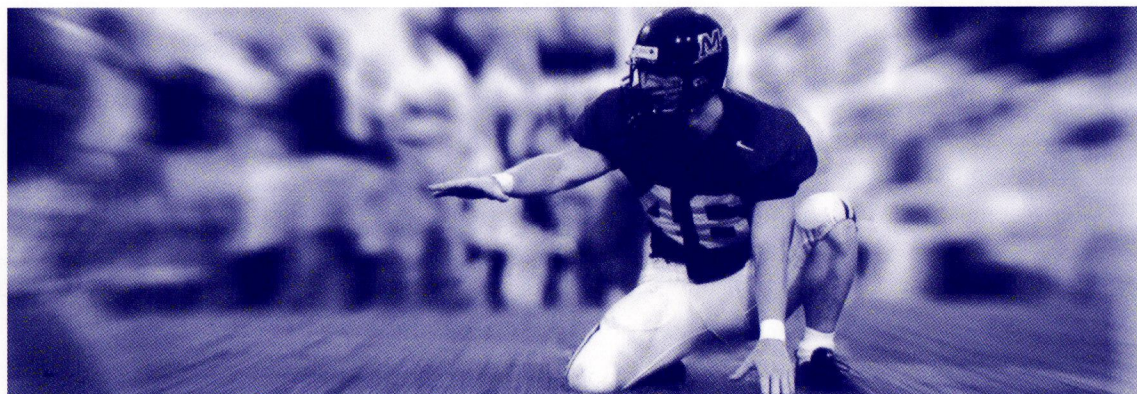
THE MAJOR

Since 1910, when Millsaps College re-instated intercollegiate athletics on campus, its athletic teams have worn the nickname "Majors" in honor of the school's founder Major Rueben Webster Millsaps. Although officially named the Majors, Millsaps athletic teams were often referred to as "Methodists" in early contests against state rivals Mississippi College, Belhaven College and William Carey College. 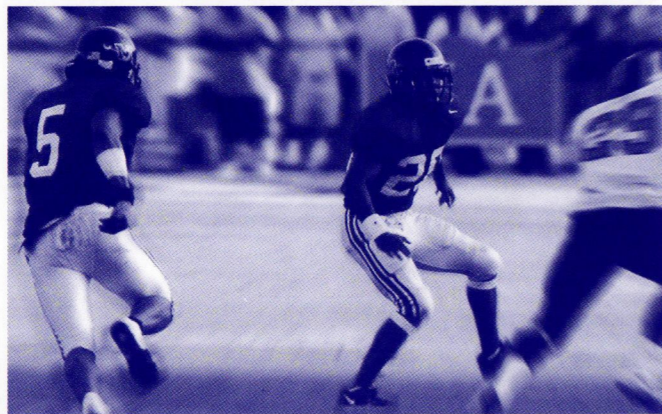
Alumni Field

Since 1920, when Millsaps College re-instated intercollegiate football, Alumni Field has served as the home of the Majors. In the 80 year history of the football program, Alumni Field has played host to two SCAC Championship games, one undefeated season, one NCAA Division III playoff team, and 14 Millsaps All-Americans. During the 1997 season, Millsaps saw the largest increase in NCAA Division III attendance. The Majors averaged just around 3,000 fans per game last season, ranking among the top twenty percent in NCAA Division III for attendance. The field is natural grass and nestled between several hills that allow students and fans the opportunity to relax while watching a Majors game. In 1998, lights were added to Alumni Field to allow for the first home night game on the Millsaps Campus in over 50 years.

NCAA DIVISION III - NATIONAL AWARDS

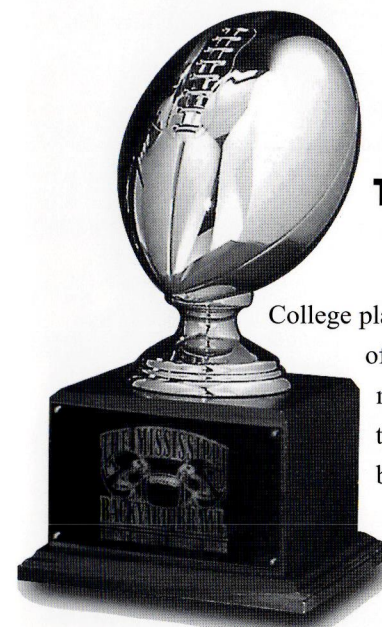
THE GAGLIARDI TROPHY

Presented annually by the J-Club of Saint John's University, Collegeville, Minnesota; the Gagliardi Trophy is awarded to the most outstanding football player in NCAA Division III.

The award program seeks to recognize the best player while at the same time mirror the Division III philosophy of the well-rounded student/athlete. Recipients of the Gagliardi Trophy must exhibit excellence in football, academics and community service. Nominations will be submitted by the presidents of the 229 participating NCAA Division III colleges. The recipient is announced in conjunction with the Amos Alonzo Stagg Bowl, the Division III National Championship game, in December.

The trophy is named after John Gagliardi, legendary coach of Saint John's University. Gagliardi has over 325 wins in college football, more than any other Division III football coach.

Sponsored by Jostens, Minneapolis, Minnesota, the trophy design features a sculpture of John Gagliardi and a player in a classic one-on-one sideline consultation.



THE BACKYARD BRAWL TROPHY

September 2, 2000, marked the first time in 41 years that Millsaps College and Mississippi College played each other on the football field. The longstanding rivalry was ended in 1959 because of violent riots among patrons of both schools. Before the series was ended, the two schools maintained one of the most heated rivalries in the Deep South for forty years. Now, thanks to the Salvation Army and the Mississippi Sports Council, the Majors and the Choctaws battle each other again. This beautiful gold trophy is presented to the winning team.

THE MELBERGER AWARD

Presented annually by the Downtown Wilkes-Barre Touchdown Club, Wilkes-Barre, Pennsylvania; the Melberger Award is awarded to the Outstanding Division III football player in the country.

The award program seeks to recognize the dedication and determination of the athlete who plays for the love of the game. He is, in every sense, a true student-athlete. In addition to the trophy, a contribution is made to the General Scholarship Fund of the recipients school. The Melberger Award is selected by a national media panel of 63. Three finalists are selected to attend the Club's Annual Awards Banquet where the Melberger Award winner is announced.

The trophy is named in honor of Clifford K. Melberger, President and CEO of Diversified Information Technologies, Inc. A star running back and outstanding performer on the gridiron for the Bucknell Bisons from 1957-1960, Melberger is an active community leader and volunteer.

The trophy is a replica of an old-style leather football helmet crafted of anthracite coal. In addition to the Melberger Award, the Wilkes-Barre Touchdown Club also presents the John J. Chwalek National Championship Trophy to the NCAA Division III National Football Champions.
