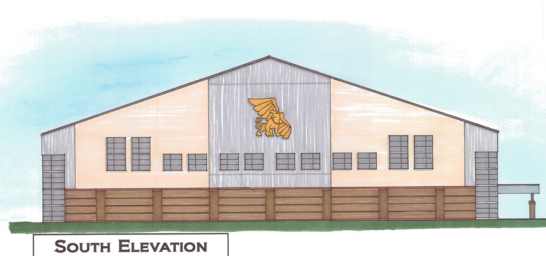
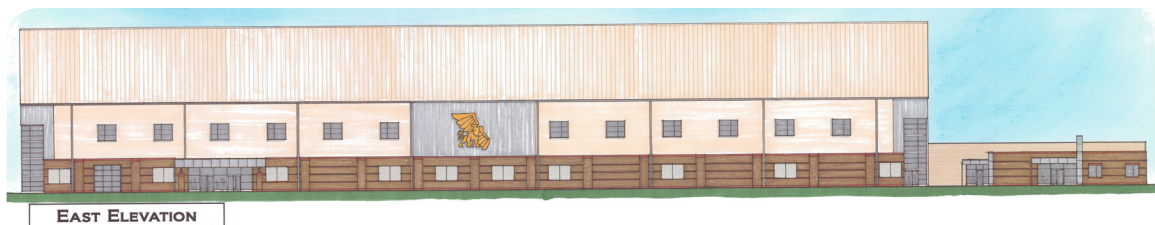


A NEW FACILITY

June 29, 2009 is a day that will forever be remembered in Missouri Western and the City of St. Joseph's history as ground broke on a new \$10.3 million indoor practice facility that will serve as the new summer training camp home of the Kansas City Chiefs and house new office space, locker room, training room, weight room and meeting rooms for Griffon Athletics as well as many recreational opportunities for the St. Joseph community.



The facility floor plan as shown above includes a full size artificial football surface, 13 coaches offices, meeting rooms, a theater-style lecture hall, new locker room for the Griffon football team, weight room, training room and equipment storage space. The field will run north/south with the support building located on the north end of the facility.



These views show the exterior of the facility from the east and south side. Construction on the 118,000 square-foot facility is set for completion on July 5, 2010. On June 18, 2009, Missouri Western and Kansas City Chiefs officials reached an agreement to make MWSU the new home of the Chiefs summer training camp. The camp, which has been held in River Falls, Wisconsin the last 19 years, lasts for three weeks annually and traditionally runs from the end of July until the third week of August. The camp will be in St. Joseph for at least five years with a series of five, one-year renewable options to follow. The 2009 Missouri Western soccer media guide has been developed to assist all media types with coverage of the Griffons. Please look over the following paragraphs to become familiar with Western media policies.

CREDENTIALS

Members of the local, regional and national media are encouraged to attend all Griffon home games at Spratt Stadium. Please direct all press credential requests to Trevor Berneking, Sports Information Director. Space is limited on the Press Box Level at Spratt Stadium and requests close to kickoff run the risk of not being granted. Please submit all requests at least 48 hours prior to game time. Credentials can be picked up at the will call table in front of Spratt Stadium. Parking is on a first-come, first-served basis in the parking area. Lot H located in front of the Baker Family Fitness Center is reserved for MWSU beat writers and radio members as well as the MWSU Stadium Club. That lot is closed to the general public and media attending only one game.

RADIO BROADCASTS

Spratt Stadium is equipped with enough phone lines for three radio broadcasts, two of which are already reserved for Western and opponent broadcasts. Those wishing to broadcast football games should request a phone line well in advance of the game in order to ensure a spot.

PHOTO POLICY

Photographers are welcome to shoot Western soccer games, but only after receiving consent from the Assistant AD - External Relations or the Sports Information Director. On-the-field shooting is also welcome, but must be taken behind the NCAA-mandated 12-foot line.

INTERVIEW POLICY

With five minutes left to go in the game, a member of the MWSU media relations staff will solicit working press for names of players to be interviewed. Following the game, requested players will be brought to the working media area on the third floor of the Spratt Stadium press box. The locker room is off limits to everyone except players and coaches. Practices are open to the public and players and coaches are available after the team has been dismissed. Interviews should be scheduled through the SID office or Head Coach Jeff Hansen.

USE OF LOGO

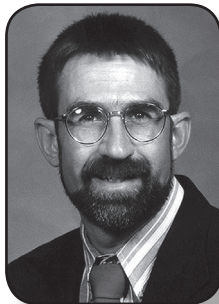
The Missouri Western State University Athletics Department has been approved to use a distinct colored version of the institutional logo. The athletic teams are referred to as the Griffons, both the male and female teams. Unacceptable references are "Golden Griffons", or "Lady Griffons." When referring to the institution, acceptable uses include the following: "Missouri Western State University," "Missouri Western," "MWSU" and "Western." Permission for use must be granted by the Director of Athletics.

NOTICE: The NCAA has strict regulations on Western's advertising/sponsoring for any athletic event (i.e., high schools). These regulations apply to ALL college departments, NOT just Athletics. Before participating in any athletics-related advertising, please contact the Athletics Department for clarification and information.

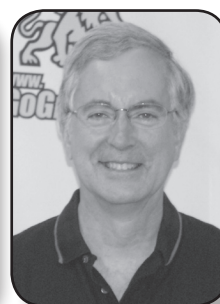

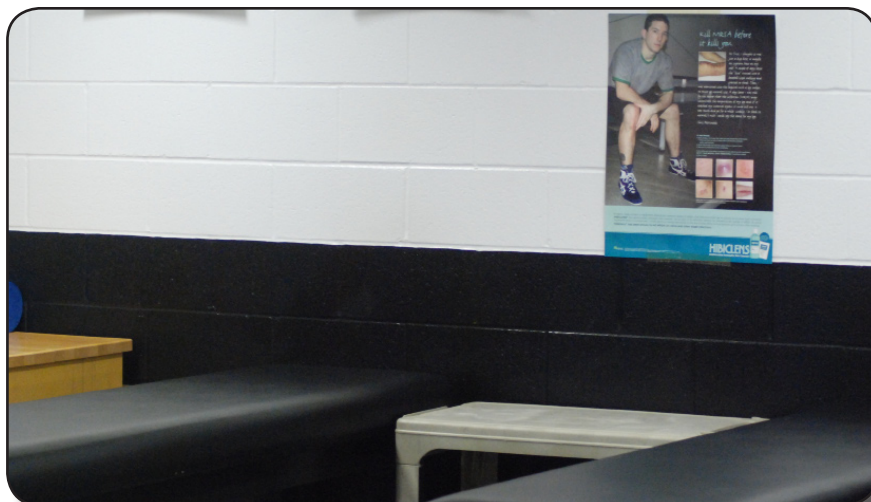

and ambulance service, physical therapy services and other such medical services that are necessary for a NCAA Intercollegiate Athletics program.

Dr. Alderson has served as a team physician at Missouri Western for six years and has a rich history of service to both Western and the St. Joseph Community.

Gary Hazelrigg continues to be the Sports Medicine Coordinator for Heartland Regional Medical Center and coordinates services to Western. Hazelrigg has previous ties to Western Athletics, serving as an assistant professor and head athletic trainer for the university during the infancy of the Athletics Department.

On campus, the Griffon Sports Medicine Program is led by Head Athletic Trainer Myron Unzicker ATC, Assistant Athletic Trainer Kate Esely ATC and Athletic Training and Rehabilitation Coordinator Becky Johnson ATC. Together, the Sports Medicine Team has over 50 years of athletic training expertise and provides services to more than 230 Griffon student-athletes in 10 sports.



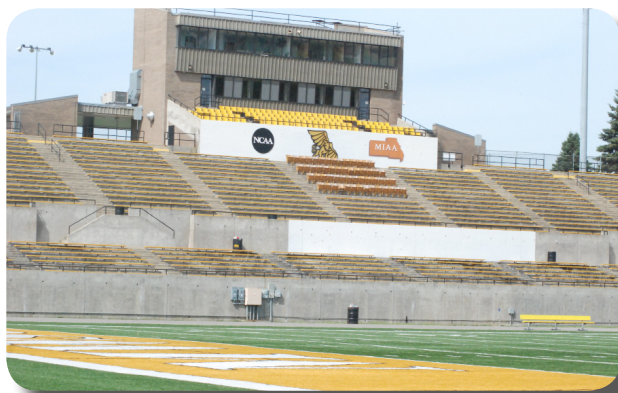


One of the most exciting changes in Western Athletics history took place at Spratt Stadium over the summer of 2006, as the natural grass playing surface was removed and a state-of-the-art synthetic playing surface called ProGrass was installed. ProGrass is one of the best artificial playing surfaces available on the market today. The artificial surface looks and feels like natural grass, but is much tougher and can stand the wear and tear that Spratt Stadium calls for. The surface gives Western one of the newer playing surfaces in the Midwest and more practice options for the Griffons, having both an artificial surface and a natural surface to practice on.

Spratt Stadium commences its 31st season of operation in 2009. The stadium has been home to Missouri Western football since 1979, when the Griffons opened the facility with a 44-0 victory against Dana (Neb.) College. The stadium is named in memory of avid Missouri Western supporter Elliot "Bub" Spratt. Spratt Stadium's initial cost of construction was \$850,000. Lights were added to the facility six years later. The Griffons played their first night game at Spratt on September 4, 1985, defeating the University of Missouri-Rolla 24-15.



The facility, which will seat 7,500 fans following the visitor side renovation set for completion in September of this year, can also accommodate spacious hillside seating. In addition to football, Spratt Stadium is the home of Western women's soccer, the Wendy's High School Football Jamboree and formerly was the host the Missouri State High School Eight Man Championship.



Prior to occupying Spratt Stadium, Missouri Western played its home soccer games at Riverside Soccer fields, a city-owned facility in on the east end of St. Joseph.

In 2010, the Spratt Stadium complex will become the new home of the Kansas City Chiefs. The team will hold their summer training camp on the MWSU campus next July which will be part of a five-year agreement.





The Baker Family Fitness Center will house the Griffon football offices, football locker room, meeting rooms, athletic weight facilities and athletic training room for one more season until the team moves into the new indoor facility in July of 2010.

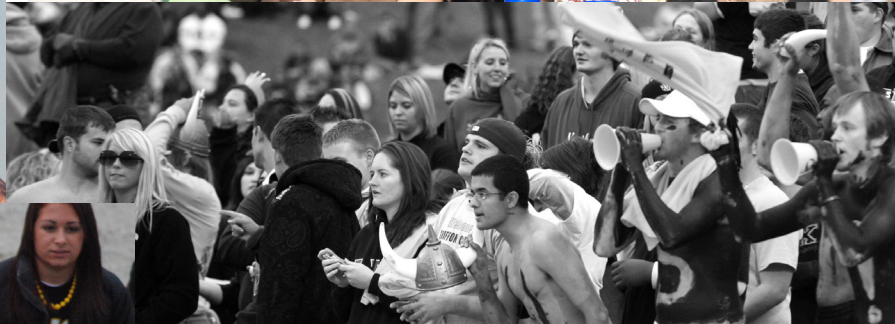
The facility is named in honor of longtime MWSU supporter Jack Baker and The Baker Family Trust. Mr. Baker and The Baker Family Trust have been supporting Missouri Western in numerous endeavors throughout the years and are excellent examples of how community support works for the University.

In December 1993, 67% of the students who voted in a campus-wide election supported an increase in fees for a \$1.5 million facility improvement package. One portion of this project was a 12,000 square-foot facility which would house a 4,000 square-foot fitness center, an exercise physiology lab, the football locker room, football offices and multipurpose space.

After only 10 months of construction the facility was completed on time and opened in September 1994.

Two years ago, the fitness center underwent an expansion project, providing more space for Nautilus equipment and other exercise equipment to help offset the needs of the more than 4,500 users.







Missouri Western State University is a learning community focused on students as individuals and as members of society. The institution offers students at all stages of life the opportunity to achieve excellence in the classroom and beyond, as they prepare to be leaders in their work and in their communities.

Western demonstrates a strong commitment to the educational, economic, cultural and social development of the people it serves. The university sets the standard for excellence in student development and community leadership.

Founded as St. Joseph Junior College in 1915, Western was transformed into a four-year institution in 1969 and became a full member of the State of Missouri system in 1977. It was designated a university in 2005. Enrollment is approximately 5,500 with more than 180 faculty members.

The student-centered, high-quality instruction focuses on experience-based learning and community service. Every classroom and public meeting room on campus is equipped with presentation technology.

The university provides a blend of traditional liberal arts and career-oriented degree programs, offering one-year certificates, two-year associate degrees, preprofessional transfer programs and four-year baccalaureate degrees and professional master's degrees.

Western's College of Professional Studies, College of Liberal Arts and Sciences and Craig School of Business offer baccalaureate degrees in the fields of art, biology, business, chemistry, communication, computer science, criminal justice, economics, education, engineering technology, English, French, government, history, interdisciplinary studies, mathematics, music, nursing, physical education, psychology, recreation, social work and Spanish as well as master of applied science and master of applied arts degree.

The Western Institute offers applied learning, business training, applied research support and lifelong learning opportunities for the region. In addition, groups throughout the nation utilize Western's facilities for conferences and seminars.

The institution is accredited by the North Central Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Institutions of Higher Education. Program accreditations include the Accreditation Board for Engineering and Technology, American Bar Association, American Chemical Society, American Health Information Management Association, Commission on Accreditation in Physical Therapy Education, Commission on Collegiate Nursing Education, Council on Social Work Education, National Accrediting Agency for Clinical Laboratory Science, National Association of Schools of Music and National Council for Accreditation of Teacher Education.

The campus, comprising more than 700 acres, contains six residence halls, a residential commons building and 12 major campus buildings including eight academic buildings, a student union, a fitness center, a conference center and a learning resource center. The campus has a large nature study area, a nature trail and nine ponds.





Western Facts and Figures

* According to a recent economic impact report conducted by Western, the university had a financial impact of \$183.5 million on the region last year. Western's economic impact increased \$22.6 million since the last study in 2005.

* Missouri residents comprise 92% of the university's students, and about 4,400 of the total enrollment are from the 10-county region.

* With 550 employees, Western is St. Joseph's 11th largest employer.

* Western offers opportunities for applied learning not always found in other colleges and universities. Last year, 89% of Western graduates had participated in applied learning opportunities through internships, practicums, research projects, or study abroad.

* Last year, 800 area high school students enrolled in dual credit courses.

* Western is engaged in several community partnerships, including the Institute for Industrial and Applied Life Sciences, Another Smart Move initiative, Northwest Missouri Regional Healthcare Workforce Development Group, and many with the St. Joseph School District.

* The Western Institute was established in 2004 and serves as an invaluable resource for the country, coordinating the continuing education programs and conference and meeting facilities. Last year, the Institute

hosted 17,000 visitors across the community for conferences.

* Last year, over 7,300 elementary and secondary students participated in camps, workshops and competitions on campus.

* Students have high-speed internet ports in every residence hall room and access to computer labs 24 hours a day.

* The Christopher S. "Kit" Bond Science and Technology Incubator opened on Western's campus in 2008 and has four tenants. The 25,000 sq. ft. incubator provides custom-outfitted space and support for entrepreneurs in the early stages of commercial development.

* In the last year, Western departments received grants and external funding totaling almost \$1.7 million. The grants fund projects such as incubator lab equipment, a youth computer camp, and training for writing teachers.

* Remington Hall, an approximately 60,000 sq. ft. addition to Agenstein Hall, will be completed in December 2009. Agenstein Hall, which houses the science and mathematics departments, will be renovated the following year.

* More than 900 new students participated in a day of service in St. Joseph, Mo., during their orientation to Western. The students served several local organizations.

* Western was named to the President's Higher Education Community Service Honor Roll. This distinction from the highest levels of government recognizes Western's leadership in helping to build a culture of service and civic engagement.

* In the past year, Western students provided more than 100,000 hours of service to schools, organizations and businesses through unpaid practica and internships.



Academic Advisement

Each Western student has their own academic advisor within their department of study. Your advisor will put you in the best position to graduate as well as line up valuable applied learning and research opportunities. In addition, the Western Athletics Department has its own compliance and academic coordinator who serves as a direct liaison between the student-athlete and academic faculty to ensure each athlete has the resources they need to succeed.

Center for Academic Support

The Center for Academic Support provides one-on-one and small group tutoring for most courses on campus. Located on the northeast corner of the library building, the center consists of group study spaces and a large open area for students to receive tutoring or work independently. The center also offers free tutoring in math, writing, specific courses, reading and study skills. In addition to these services, students have access to online assistance, Supplemental Instruction (SI), and workshops sponsored by the center.

Athletics Mentor Program

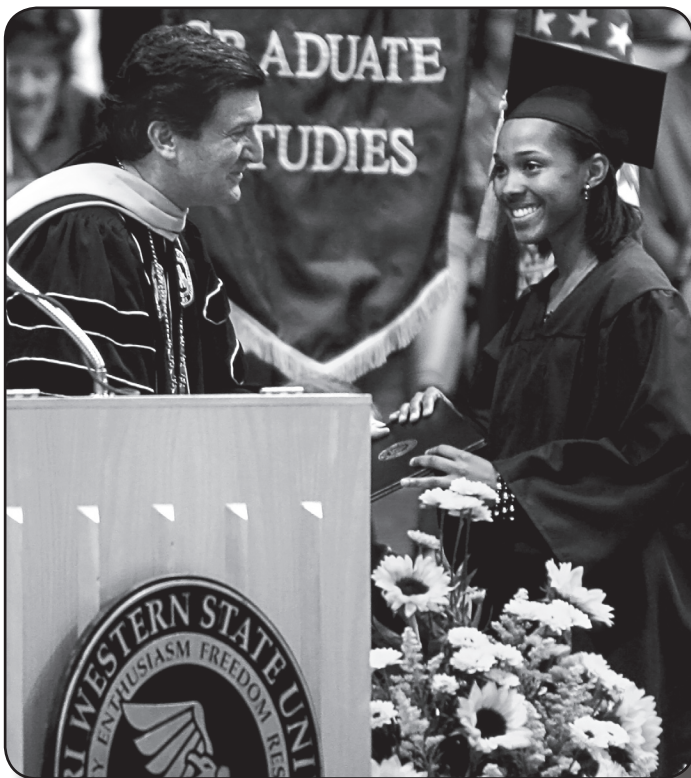
Student-athletes that need additional academic support participate in the athletics mentoring program. The program, which is facilitated through the Center for Academic Support, provides each athlete with a mentor who provides one-on-one attention on all facets of college life.

Academic Support





Missouri Western student-athletes get involved with the community in many ways. During the 2008-09 academic year, Griffon soccer players were involved in many endeavors including: Athlete Reading Week at Skaith Elementary School, Camp Quality, The Mayors Thanksgiving Dinner and United Way Profit in Education.

The Student-Athlete Advisory Committee takes part in several service projects throughout the year including "Griffs Giving Gifts" and "Night Out on the Griffs."



The soccer team also takes time in the fall at the St. Joseph Hy-Vee signing autographs and helping sack groceries while promoting the upcoming season.





The St. Joseph Civic Arena is a 3,800-seat multi-purpose arena in St. Joseph, Missouri. It is used mainly to host indoor sporting events, such as basketball and arena football. It has hosted two American Professional Football League franchises, the St. Joseph Explorers in 2003 and the St. Joseph Storm in 2005. It has also hosted the NCAA Women's Division II Basketball Championship in 2003 and 2004 and will host again in 2010 and 2011.



Heritage Park Softball Complex is the ultimate in softball tournament venues. It features four fields measuring 300', with the fifth field measuring 250'. All fields feature championship level MUSCO lighting systems, scoreboards, and adequate seating. The complex boasts a concession pavilion, children's play area, adequate parking, and much more. Missouri Western State University and the city of St. Joseph will host the 2010 NCAA Division II Softball Championships.

Tour of Missouri

For the first time since its inaugural year (2007), the 2009 Tour will route east to west, starting in St. Louis and finishing in Kansas City. The past two years, the race routed west to east, starting in Kansas City and finishing in St. Louis.

The race will be contested over seven days and seven stages. There will be two circuit races (St. Louis, Kansas City), one individual time trial (Sedalia), and four point to point road races (Ste. Genevieve to Cape Girardeau; Farmington to Rolla; St. James to Jefferson City; Chillicothe to St. Joseph). The overall mileage for the course is expected to be more than 600 miles.

The event drew more than 435,000 spectators in 2008.

The event is sanctioned by USA Cycling, the national federation for cycling in the United States, and the Union Cycliste Internationale, the international governing body for the sport of cycling.

USA's Heartland Clinic Women's Classic Every year St. Joseph, Mo. hosts the Heartland Clinic USA Women's Tennis Classic. In conjunction with the classic is a celebrity tennis tournament with proceeds going to a local charity.

St. Joseph, Missouri is located in the Heartland of the United States, at the crossroads of Interstate 29 and Missouri Highway 36. Meet the Griffons





Jeff Hansen begins his fourth season as the head women's soccer coach at Missouri Western in 2009. This past season Jenna Weis became the second Griffon to earn MIAA Defensive Player of the week. Weis was also an All-MIAA selection a year ago.

In 2007 Hansen became the Griffons all-time winningest coach and led his team to its best record in its three year existence at 4-15. Hansen coached two MIAA players in 2007 and had four student-athletes named to the MIAA Commissioner's Academic Honor Roll. Goalkeeper Shaylynn Milbourn became the first Griffon soccer player to be named MIAA Player of the Week on Monday, October 15, 2007.

Hansen came to Missouri Western after a 2-year stint at Central Missouri State as the assistant women's soccer coach. Hansen also has previous collegiate coaching experience at Missouri Southern State University where he was also a student-athlete. While at UCM, Hansen helped turn a Jennies program around in a short period of time. UCM went 4-12-1 in 2004 and 11-8-1 in the 2005 season with Hansen's help.

Hansen recruited the Jennies' top three scorers on the 2005 team, including two first-team, All-Mid-America Intercollegiate Athletics Association selections and one honorable mention All-MIAA pick. Hansen also assisted the UCM Sports Information Department as well as assisted in the game management operations for basketball, volleyball and baseball.

Hansen was a student-athlete for the Missouri Southern men's soccer program from 2000-02 and moved into a student-assistant position following the completion of his eligibility. Hansen was then named the interim head coach for both the Southern men's and women's soccer programs during the spring semester of 2003, working with training and conditioning as well as on field coaching of both teams during the spring competition.

After MSSU, Hansen was the assistant coach at the varsity level for the Thomas Jefferson Independent Day School in Joplin, Missouri prior to moving to UCM as the assistant coach. Hansen holds a bachelor of science degree in education from Missouri Southern State University and will complete his master's degree in Sports Administration from Central Missouri State University.

The Mid-America Intercollegiate Athletics Association (MIAA), an 11-member conference of NCAA Division II institutions in Missouri, Kansas and Nebraska, was first organized in 1912 as the Missouri Intercollegiate Athletic Association.

Over the past 96 years, the MIAA has gained the reputation of being one of the top NCAA Division II conferences in the nation. MIAA student-athletes have won 12 NCAA team championships and, since 1964, 153 individual national titles. The MIAA currently conducts championships in eight sports for men and eight for women.

For the men, champions are crowned in football, cross country, basketball, indoor and outdoor track & field, baseball, tennis and golf. The women compete for titles in volleyball, cross country, soccer, basketball, indoor and outdoor track & field, softball, golf and tennis.

The MIAA turned a new page on July 1, 1992, when the NCAA Division II conference changed its name from the Missouri Intercollegiate Athletic Association to the Mid-America Intercollegiate Athletics Association.

The decision to make the change originated in 1989, when Pittsburg State University and Washburn University became the first schools outside the state of Missouri to gain membership in the MIAA.

The conference was first organized in 1912 with 14 member institutions. Of those original members, the University of Central Missouri, Truman State University, and Northwest Missouri State University still remain a part of the MIAA.

The first change in membership came in 1924, when the MIAA reorganized to include only the five regional Missouri state colleges: Central, Truman (at the time known as Northeast Missouri State), Northwest, Southeast Missouri State University and Southwest Missouri State University (now Missouri State).

Over the next 56 years, three schools joined the membership: the Missouri School of Mines (later the University of Missouri-Rolla) in 1935, Lincoln University in 1970, and the University of Missouri-St. Louis in 1980.

The 1980s brought the biggest changes in the conference. In 1981, Southwest Missouri State University opted to move to NCAA Division I and the MIAA appointed its first full-time commissioner, Ken Jones, in July.

He would be in the position for 16 years, retiring in 1997. Former Gulf South and Metro commissioner Ralph McFillen succeeded Jones, serving 10 years before his retirement in 2007. Jim Johnson succeeded McFillen in July of that year.

Southwest Baptist University brought membership back to eight schools in 1986, before the major expansion of the conference in 1989. Pittsburg State, Washburn, Missouri Southern State College (now University) and Missouri Western State College (now University) °© formerly members of the Central States Intercollegiate Conference °© began competition in the 1989-90 season.

Southeast Missouri State left the MIAA following the 1990-91 season to move on to NCAA Division I, and was replaced by Emporia State University in the 1991-92 season.

In August 1991, Judy Willson was hired as the MIAA's first full-time sports information director. She left in 1994, and was succeeded by Matt Newbery, who worked in that roll until this past summer when the MIAA's newest staff member Kellen Coleman was hired as Assistant to the Commissioner for Media Relations. A third full-time staff member was added in 2005, as former Emporia State track and field athlete Natasha Oakes was hired as the assistant to the commissioner for compliance. Larry House joined the staff in August 2007 as coordinator of external affairs.

The current membership of the MIAA is at 11 schools, with the departure of Missouri-St. Louis in 1996 and Missouri-Rolla in 2005, the forfeiture of membership by Lincoln in 1999 and the addition of Fort Hays State University in 2006 and the University of Nebraska-Omaha in 2008. Lincoln will rejoin the league next season.

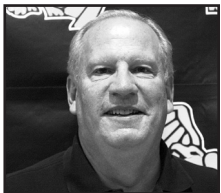

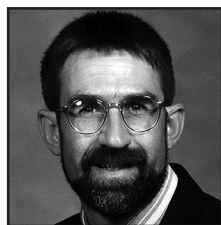

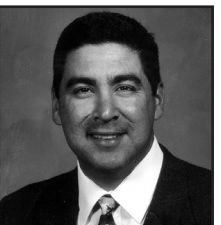

President Dr. Robert A. Vartabedian

Dr. Robert Vartabedian became the fourth president since 1969 beginning his tenure on July 1, 2008. Dr. Vartabedian succeeds Dr. James Scanlon, who officially retired June 30, 2008, after serving as president for seven years.

Dr. Vartabedian served as vice president for academic affairs at Eastern New Mexico University (ENMU) in Portales, N.M., since 2005. In that role, he was chief academic officer for a university with a total enrollment of about 9,500. He oversaw re-accreditation efforts in six departments. The university's 2007 evaluation by the Higher Learning Commission/North Central Association was accepted without any deficiencies and was showcased as a model application.

Dr. Vartabedian was dean of the College of Arts and Sciences at Western Carolina University in Cullowhee, N.C. from 1999 to 2005, serving eight months as interim vice chancellor for academic affairs in 2004. As dean, he oversaw 14 academic departments and four centers. As interim vice chancellor, he was the chief administrator for all academic programs for the 8,400 students enrolled.

Both ENMU and Western Carolina created several new academic programs under Dr. Vartabedian's leadership. He has overseen building renovation projects at ENMU for science, technology and music and five major building projects at

Western Carolina totaling \$60 million, including a \$30 million Fine and Performing Arts Center.

Community involvement has been a hallmark of Dr. Vartabedian's career. He created the ENMU "Peanut Project" as a way to forge a partnership with the local peanut industry while providing students with hands-on experience in a marketing campaign. He also recently directed a faculty showcase theatre production of Mitch Albom's "And the Winner Is," with proceeds benefiting ENMU scholarships and the Portales Main Street Project.

Dr. Vartabedian graduated magna cum laude with a bachelor of arts in speech communication from California State University, Fresno, Calif. in 1974. He received a master of arts in speech communication from Wichita State University, and a doctorate in communication from the University of Oklahoma. He and his wife, Dr. Laurel Vartabedian, have two children: Rob, and daughter-in-law, Audrey, of Amarillo, Texas and Sarah, of Austin, Texas.

Since coming to Western, Dr. Vartabedian has taken on a campus beautification initiative, including two new pond fountains and building and entrance signage. He was also one of the campus team members to secure the Kansas City Chiefs training camp at Western beginning in summer 2010, and a new indoor sports and recreation facility that is currently under construction.



Athletics Director David Williams

Dave Williams became Athletics Director in March 2008. He is a graduate of Augustana College in Rock Island, Ill., with a degree in education. He earned a master's degree in educational administration from North Dakota State University, Fargo. Williams was an assistant basketball coach at North Dakota State and later served as the top assistant basketball coach at University of Wisconsin-Parkside. In addition, Williams was the head men's golf coach at Parkside prior to accepting the

Athletics Director position at Parkside in January of 2001.

In August of 2006, Williams was elected as president of the Division II Athletics Directors Association (DII ADA) for 2006-07.

Williams has hit the ground running at Missouri Western, with many facility improvements on the horizon including; improvements to the visitor side Spratt Stadium, an indoor training facility and a new spring sports complex which will include new baseball and softball fields. Williams was also on the team that secured the Kansas City Chiefs summer training camp at Western.

During his tenure at Parkside, Ranger athletics enjoyed a plethora of successes. Under Williams' administration, 12 of 15 Ranger sports qualified for NCAA post-season appearances. Parkside teams won 10 Great Lakes Valley Conference (14 institutions) championships in six different sports. Numerous All-Americans and Academic All-Americans emerged. In fact, the grade point average of the Parkside student-athletes has been consistently higher than the student body at

large. Parkside student-athletes routinely exceed the 3.0 GPA mark each semester.

Facility improvements during Williams' reign were prominent. The Sports and Activities Center saw a facelift in the form of new state-of-the-art scoreboards and the first videoboard in the region. The baseball and softball fields received new scoreboards in the spring of 2007, and in 2006, the baseball field saw new dugouts sprout. Oberbruner Field, home of Ranger baseball, has seats from the former Milwaukee County Stadium, which housed the Green Bay Packers and Milwaukee Brewers for decades. A new outfield fence was also erected under Williams' administration.

Williams lured a number of high-profile events to the Parkside campus including the NCAA Division I fencing national championship and the NCAA Division II national wrestling championship. The NAIA national cross country championship is a staple on Parkside's cross country course as is the Footlocker Regional Championships. In addition, Parkside has hosted a multitude of conference and regional championships in several sports.

Williams and his wife, Suzanne, live in St. Joseph with their children Cooper, Carter, and Caden.



Trevor Berneking **Sports Information Director**

Trevor Berneking enters his third year as Western's Sports Information Director after serving as a graduate assistant at Northern State University in Aberdeen, SD. Trevor is originally from Grand Marais, Minn., where he graduated from Cook County High School in 2000.

Berneking played football at the University of Minnesota, Crookston, for four years where he was a two-year captain and an NSIC All-Conference selection as a defensive lineman. Following his playing career, he served as a student assistant for one year.

Berneking graduated in December 2004 with a bachelor's degree in sport and recreation management and business management with an emphasis in marketing. Berneking also received a minor in coaching. He received his master's in the spring of 2007 in physical education, health and coaching.

Berneking is currently a member of the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA). He is also on the Health Physical Education and Recreation (HPER) Advisory Board.



David Lau **Development/Special Events**

David Lau came to Missouri Western in 1999 as an assistant baseball coach and administrator. In 2003 he made the switch to full-time administrator as the Athletic Development and Special Events Coordinator. Now in his 10th year at Missouri Western, Lau has established himself as one of the most successful development officers in the MIAA and NCAA Division II, raising more

than \$300,000 annually.

In 2003, Lau created the Missouri Western Celebrity Golf Classic. This golf tournament, now in its seventh year, has raised more than \$400,000 to help support Missouri Western Athletics and the YWCA Shelter for Abused and Homeless Women and Children.

A native of St. Joseph, Mo., Lau is a 1989 graduate of Missouri Western where he played three years of baseball for the Griffons. After his junior season in 1986, he signed a minor league contract with the New York Mets. He spent three seasons with the Mets before returning to St. Joseph to complete his undergraduate degree at Western. Dave was inducted into the Missouri Western Athletics Hall of Fame in 2008.

Currently, Lau serves on the Missouri Western Alumni Board of Directors, Missouri Western Development Council, the Development Ad-hoc Committee and is an active member of the St. Joseph Area Chamber of Commerce.



Patsy Smith **Associate Director of Athletics/SWA**

Patsy Smith serves as the Associate Director of Athletics and the Senior Woman Administrator. She began her career at Missouri Western in the fall of 1990 as a student-athlete in the sport of tennis. Smith graduated cum laude with a BSBA in accounting in 1995.

In 1994, Smith became the Head Women's Tennis Coach and coached the first-ever tennis team to the NCAA Tournament in 1998. That same year, she became the first Athletics Business Manager at Missouri Western. Since that time, she has served in the roles of Compliance and Academics, Director of Finance, Assistant Athletics Director and her current role as Associate AD and SWA.

Smith has served on the NCAA Regional Advisory Committee for tennis and the NCAA Regional Advisory Committee for women's basketball. She is the liaison for the AD/SWA Committee to the women's basketball coaches and a member of the MIAA Budget Committee and the MIAA Championships & Officiating Committee.

Smith was reappointed as a member of the NCAA Division II Championships Committee in the Spring of 2008. Smith's term of service has been extended through Sept. 1, 2012.

In the St. Joseph community, Smith is a board member at the YWCA, a member of their Finance Committee, and Co-Chaired the Women of Excellence Luncheon.

Smith is married to Missouri Western Head Men's Basketball Coach Tom Smith. She has two daughters, both Western graduates, and she and Coach Smith have 11 grandchildren.



Brett Esely **Assistant AD/External Relations**

Brett Esely was promoted to Assistant Athletics Director – External Relations on July 1, 2007. Esely's responsibilities include overseeing the Sports Information Office and media relations, marketing, advertising, public relations, event management, ticketing and being the liaison to the Gold Coat Club for current and prospective members. Esely also serves as the color analyst with Bob Orf on 680 KFEQ for away men's basketball broadcasts and select away football broadcasts as well as play-by-play voice for away women's basketball broadcasts. In addition to his duties within the department, Esely begins the third year of a four-year term as a member of the NCAA Division II Men's Golf National Committee.

For his work with the 2009 MIAA Spring TitleFest, he was recognized as the conferences inaugural "Volunteer of the Year".
