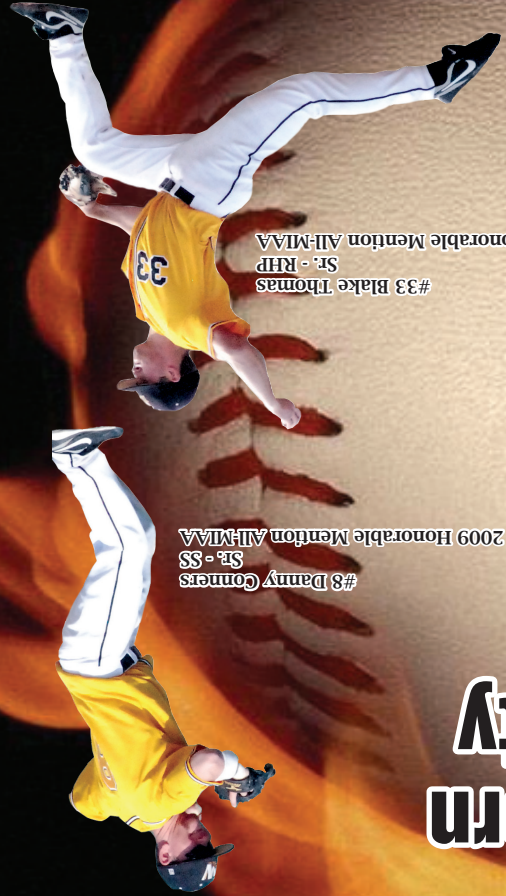

The Mid-America Intercollegiate Athletics Association, an 11-member conference of NCAA Division II institutions in Missouri, Kansas and Nebraska, was first organized in 1912 as the Missouri Intercollegiate Athletic Association.

Over the past 95 years, the MIAA has gained the reputation of being one of the top NCAA Division II conferences in the nation. MIAA student-athletes have won 12 NCAA team championships and, since 1964, 153 individual national titles. The MIAA currently conducts championships in eight sports for men and eight for women.

For the men, champions are crowned in football, cross country, basketball, indoor and outdoor track & field, baseball, tennis and golf. The women compete for titles in volleyball, cross country, soccer, basketball, indoor and outdoor track and field, softball, golf and tennis.

The current membership of the MIAA is at 11 schools, with the departure of Missouri-St. Louis in 1996 and Missouri-Rolla in 2005, the forfeiture of membership by Lincoln in 1999 and the addition of Fort Hays State University in 2006 and the University of Nebraska-Omaha in 2008.

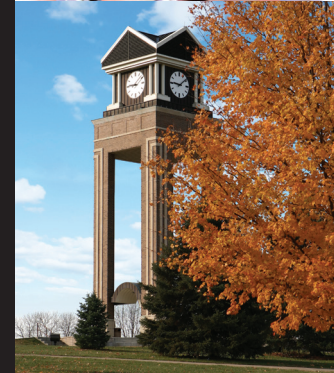
Academics

Missouri Western State University is a learning community focused on students as individuals and as members of society. Western offers students at all stages of life the opportunity to achieve excellence in the classroom and beyond, especially through applied learning, as they prepare to be leaders in their work and in their communities. As a leader itself, Western is committed to the educational, economic, cultural, and social development of the people and the region that it serves through applied research and professional and voluntary service.

Western offers over 100 majors and 41 minors through its College of Liberal Arts and Sciences, College of Professional Studies, Steven L. Craig School of Business, and School of Graduate Studies. The undergraduate enrollment is 5,665 and the average class size is 25. Western became a university in 2005 and has been growing ever since. Western operates on a semester system. Fifteen credit hours is a normal class load and a minimum of 124 credit hours are required to complete a bachelor's degree.

Missouri Western State University Points of Pride

- The 60,000 sq. ft. Remington Hall opened in January 2010 and the renovation of Agenstein Hall began. Completion of the project will nearly double the current space for Western's math and sciences departments.
- Computer science students earned first place in a web development competition at a national conference two years in a row. They also garnered a second, third and fourth place in other competitions at the conference.
- In the past year, students provided more than 100,000 hours in service to schools, organizations and businesses through unpaid internships, student teaching and clinicals.
- A student research team published their results in the Journal of Biological Engineering in 2009 and it is the most accessed article at the journal's internet site. A research team's 2008 article in the same publication was the second most accessed article at the site.
- Last year, of the 21 students who applied for admission to health professions schools, 19 were accepted. Over the past five years, 49 of 58 students have gained admission. These figures surpass the national average.
- More than 900 incoming freshmen participated in a day of service in the community as part of their orientation.
- A professor in Western's Steven L. Craig School of Business was awarded Best Research Poster at a national conference held at the Mayo Clinic in Rochester, Minn.





Head Coach - Charles "Buzz" Verduzco (11th Season)

Overall Record: 280-222 - MIAA Record: 180-143

Charles "Buzz" Verduzco begins his 11th season at the helm of the Missouri Western baseball team in 2010. In 2009 the Griffons finished with a 34-22 overall record and were 22-16 in the MIAA which helped them finish in fifth place in the league standings. The 34 victories was the most for Verduzco as the Griffons won their last eight games. Verduzco coached three All-MIAA first team selections (Troy Landi, AJ Huttenlocker and Andy Hebrard). Verduzco has led the Griffons to eight straight winning seasons which is the most in school history.

In 2008 the Griffons went 25-24 overall and 22-14 in the MIAA making it Western's seventh season in a row with a winning record. The Griffons made their fourth conference tournament appearance in its last six seasons and won 14 of its last 17 games to end the regular season. Coach Verduzco coached the Griffons first ever NCAA Division II All-American in third baseman Adam Carolan as he was named to the 2008 NCBWA Division II Honorable Mention All-America Team.

In 2007 the Griffons went 28-23 overall and 21-14 in the MIAA making it their sixth season in a row with a winning record. Coach Verduzco also accumulated his 200th win as a head coach in 2007 against Arkansas Tech on March 11th, 2007 with a 10-2 victory.

In 2006 the Griffons qualified for their first ever appearance in the NCAA Division II national tournament in school history under Verduzco. "Buzz" led the Griffons to a 31-25 overall record, marking the third straight season under Verduzco that the Griffons had won 30 or more games. The Griffons were the No. 6 seed in the Central Region. The highlight for Western at the national tournament was a 16-8 win over MIAA rival Central Missouri State. In 2006, the Griffons finished the season at 21-9 in the MIAA and were the No. 3 seed in the MIAA Postseason Tournament. The last eight years the Griffons have averaged nearly 30 wins per season while making the MIAA tournament four out of the last eight years with their first ever appearance in 2003.

In 2005, the Griffons made their second appearance in the Mid-America Intercollegiate Athletics Association Postseason Tournament and won 33 games for the second straight year, going 33-22 and finishing 3rd in the MIAA standings.

In 2004, Verduzco led the Griffons to a 33-18 overall record and pushed the program to four straight winning seasons for the first time since 1978-80. In 2003, Western went 29-22 overall and advanced to the MIAA postseason championship.

A native of Stockton, California, Verduzco came to Western from Washington State University where he was an assistant for the Cougar program for over 10 seasons. He served as the Cougars' hitting and outfield coach as well as the primary recruiting coordinator. Verduzco also directed the Cougar baseball camps and was the coordinator of alumni relations for the NCAA Division I program. Verduzco earned a bachelor's degree in Psychology from Washington State in 1985. Verduzco played and coached under legendary coach "Bobo" Brayton at Washington State.

Verduzco has previous coaching experience at the University of Nevada from 1987-90, working with the outfielders and hitters and assisted in recruiting and fund-raising. Verduzco earned a master's degree in Physical Education while at Nevada. In addition to coaching the Wolfpack, Verduzco was the head coach of Athletics in Action West Coast team in 1989. His St. Albert (Alberta) Tigers 1993 summer league team won the league's zone championship. Verduzco became just the second head baseball coach in Missouri Western history on June 30, 1999, replacing long-time Griffon mentor Doug Minnis who had started the program in 1970.

Verduzco has coached many Griffons who have made their mark in the Western record book. Justin Coffman set the single season hit (79) and RBI (59) records at Western in 2005. During the same year, Ryan Zenn set the MWSU single season record for doubles with 22, breaking the mark of 21 doubles set by another Verduzco and All-MIAA player Brooks Barkley, who set the record in 2002. Barkley also set the mark for highest batting average in a season as he hit .422 with 65 hits in 154 at bats. Verduzco's first team in 2000 set the MWSU single season record with 61 sacrifice bunts while the 2002 Griffon squad set the MWSU record for team batting average with a .338 mark. Troy Gustafson was an academic All-American under Verduzco in 2002. Adam Carolan was the Griffons first All-American selection in 2008. Troy Landi holds numerous records as a Griffon as he is first in career at bats (756), runs scored (193), hits (253) and stolen bases (91). He finished second in doubles (40), homeruns (22) and third in triples (14) and runs batted in (111). He finished his career with a .335 batting average which ranks him 9th. Landi played in 207 games while starting 201 during his career. Landi also holds single season records in homeruns (14-2009), stolen bases (30-2007, 2009) and second in runs scored with 62 (2009). AJ Huttenlocker also set the single season record for wins with 11 in 2008.

Since the 2001 season Verduzco has coached 32 players that have been named to the MIAA Commissioner's Academic Honor Roll. He has coached 51 All-MIAA conference selections, which includes first, second and honorable mention teams. Finally, he has coached five All-Central Region players. Verduzco and his wife, Tracy, have three children: Sara, Samantha and Chas and reside in St. Joseph.



Assistant Coach: Brandon Freeborn (6th Season)

Pitching Coach/Recruiting Coordinator

Brandon Freeborn from Lee's Summit, Mo. became a member of the Griffons baseball team in the fall of 2001. Freeborn played four years for the Griffons where he was named to the MIAA Commissioner's Academic Honor Roll twice.

Freeborn was an outfielder and a closer while on the Missouri Western Baseball team. In his four-year career at Western, Freeborn played in 66 games with 34 starts and finished his career with a .346 batting average. Freeborn had 45 hits in 130 at bats with 8 doubles, 1 triple and 28 RBIs. Freeborn appeared in 24 games as a pitcher compiling a 3-1 record in 37.2 innings of work as a Griffon. Freeborn struck out 26 batters and had an ERA of less than four.

Freeborn is entering his sixth year as an assistant coach under coach Verduzco. Freeborn has spent the last nine seasons with the Griffons. Freeborn is the pitching coach at Missouri Western and is the recruiting coordinator. While being the pitching coach at Missouri Western, Freeborn has coached ten All-MIAA selections including AJ Huttenlocker who was drafted in the 44th round by the Oakland Athletics on June 11, 2009. Freeborn holds a

degree in Physical Education and Teaching from Missouri Western. Brandon and his wife, Lindsay, were married in October 2007 and reside in Kansas City, Mo.

Since 2005, Freeborn has helped his pitching staff achieve a 5.27 ERA in 2,040.1 innings of work. Last season his staff finished 4th in the MIAA with a 4.41 ERA in 412.2 innings. The highest finish for his staff was in 2008 when they posted a 4.79 ERA which put them 2nd in the MIAA.

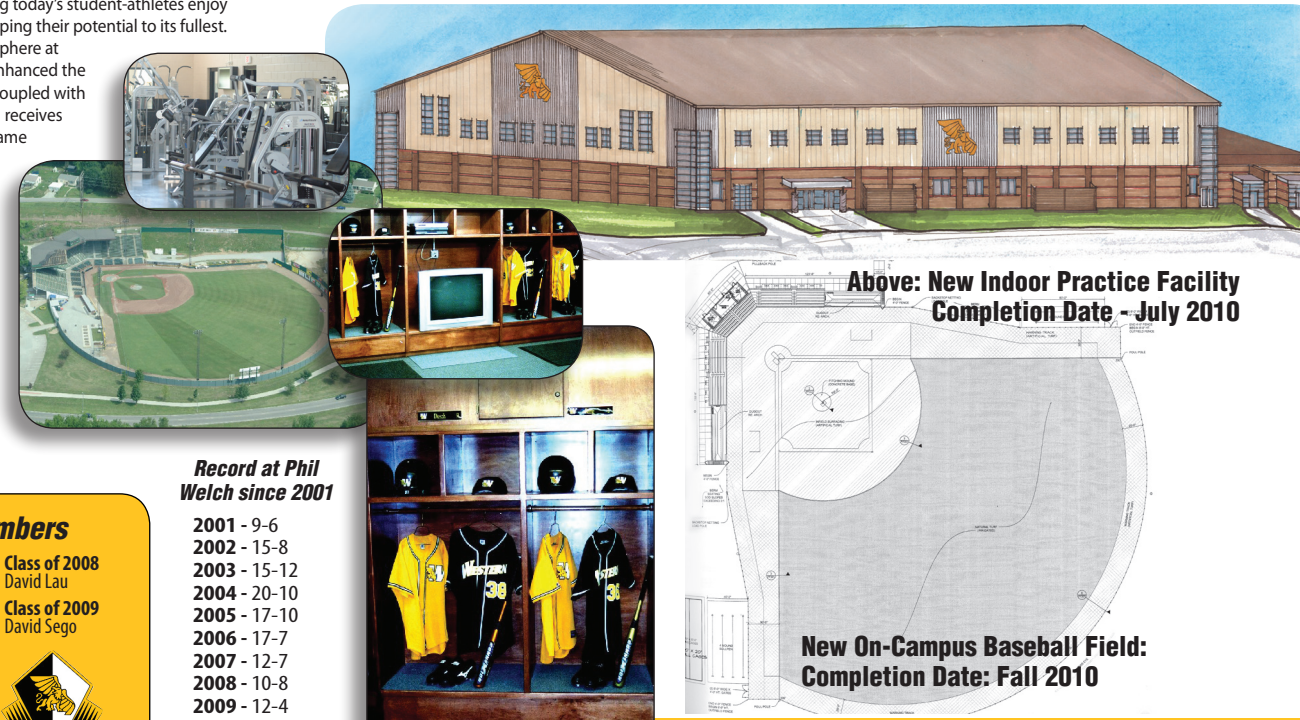
