**Starters:** DePaul hosts Missouri State in a Wednesday night game at Allstate Arena to conclude a three-game run in Rosemont. Following Wednesday's action the Blue Demons don't play again until Nov. 30 when Drake visits McGrath-Phillips Arena.

Wednesday's game will be televised on FOX Sports Networks with Brandon Gaudin (play-by-play) and Stephen Bardo (analyst) handling the television duties. The broadcast can also be seen on FOX Sports Go either on desktop or mobile devices where available. DePaul's radio tandem of Zach Zaidman (play-by-play) and Jeff Blanzly (analyst) can be heard on WSCR 670 AM and online on BlueTube at www.depaulbluedemons.com. Live stats can be found on GameTracker at www.depaulbluedemons.com while in-game scoring updates and notes can be followed on Twitter at @DePaulSID.

Missouri State started its regular season with three wins including a 100-27 victory over NCAA Division III Fontbonne on Nov. 17. The Blue Demons opened the 2016-17 campaign with a 78-72 win over Robert Morris at McGrath-Phillips Arena on Nov. 13 before dropping a 66-59 decision against Rutgers at Allstate Arena. DePaul bounced back on Sunday with a 77-59 win over Milwaukee. Head coach Dave Leitao is in his fifth season at DePaul and his second since returning to the program after leading the Blue Demons three postseasons in three years from 2002-05. Overall, the 2016-17 campaign is Leitao's 11th as a head coach at the collegiate level. Missouri State is led by Paul Lusk who is in his sixth season leading the Bears.

DePaul returns to McGrath-Phillips Arena next Wednesday with a 7:30 p.m. game against Drake. The Drake game can be seen on FOX Sports Networks (The U Too in Chicago) and WSCR 670 AM.

**Noting the Blue Demons:** The men's basketball program is 1,430-965 (.597) all-time... the 82-61 win over No. 20/20 George Washington on Dec. 22, 2015 was win No. 1,425 since start of 1923-24 season... according to ESPN, DePaul's margin of victory over No. 20/20 George Washington was the largest in program history as an unranked team over a ranked opponent... the Blue Demons have knocked down at least one three-pointer in 710 straight games... DePaul's last game without a three was Feb. 16, 1993 against UAB at Allstate Arena... the Blue Demons are 337-176 (.657) all-time at Allstate Arena... DePaul is 11-2 (.846) all-time in games at McGrath-Phillips Arena... over the last five-plus seasons, DePaul is 15-2 against Chicagoland opponents (Chicago State, UIC, Loyola-Chicago, Northern Illinois, Northwestern)... in the last 10-plus seasons, the record against locals is 20-6... DePaul faces Northwestern (Dec. 3 in Evanston), UIC (Dec. 14 at McGrath-Phillips Arena) and Chicago State (Dec. 17 at Allstate Arena) this season.

**It Could Happen:** A win would make DePaul 3-1 for the sixth time in the last nine seasons... a win would also guarantee the Blue Demons a winning month of November... DePaul hosts Drake on Nov. 30 to conclude

### WHY BLUE DEMONS?

In 1900, when the first athletic team to represent DePaul University was organized, the monogram "D" was selected for the uniforms. This originated the nickname "D-men" which evolved into "Demons." The blue, which combines with Demons, signifies loyalty and was chosen in 1901 by a vote of the student body.

the first month of the regular season... Billy Garrett Jr. (1,189 points) needs 15 points to pass Ken Warzynski (1,203 points, 1967-70) for 31st place on the all-time scoring list.

**Demon Doings:** Notes following DePaul's 77-59 win against Milwaukee on Sunday:

- DePaul is 2-1 to start the season for the fifth time in the last six years.
- DePaul's lead of 21 points with 3:35 left in the second half was its largest lead in a game this season.
- Eli Cain recorded his third straight game in double-figures and third straight 20-point game to start the season.
- Billy Garrett Jr. passed Lance Williams (1,170 points, 1998-02) for 32nd place on the all-time scoring list.
- DePaul leads the all-time series, 14-1, with four straight win against the Panthers... the Blue Demons are 73-19 against the current membership of the Horizon League.

**Season-Opening Notes:** DePaul is 82-12 all-time in the first game of the season following Sunday's win against Robert Morris... the game was the start of the 94th recognized season of DePaul basketball (since 1923-24)... DePaul competed in basketball prior to the 1923-24 season, but complete season records and results are incomplete... DePaul has won nine straight season openers after a three-game losing streak in first games from 2005-08... last season saw DePaul hold off Western Michigan, 69-63, at McGrath-Phillips Arena... the Robert Morris game was the eighth all-time season opener at McGrath-Phillips Arena for the Blue Demons.

**Home-Opener Notes:** DePaul is 87-7 all-time in the first home game of the season... the Blue Demons have won 11 straight and 50 of the last 52 home openers... the last loss in the home-opening game of the season was a 75-60 defeat against Bradley on Nov. 19, 2005... last season, the Blue Demons defeated Western Michigan, 69-63, at McGrath-Phillips Arena on Nov. 14 before Sunday's win over Robert Morris.

**Garrett Joins 1K List:** DePaul senior guard Billy Garrett Jr. became the 49th player in program history to reach the 1,000-point plateau on Jan. 9, 2016 at Georgetown. Garrett currently sits in 32nd place on the all-time scoring chart and is the first 1,000-point scorer since Brandon Young on March 9, 2013.

**At the Stripe:** Throughout his career, Billy Garrett Jr. has used the free throw line like few in program history. While working his way up the career lists for free throws, free throw attempts and free throw percentage, Garrett is the only player in school history with multiple no-miss games with at least 11 free throws.

On just 12 occasions, a DePaul player has recorded an 11-for-11 effort or better from the charity stripe with Garrett holding four of those occurrences. **No other player in school history has accomplished the feat more than once.** Last season, Garrett went 12-for-12 at Georgetown on Jan. 9 and also has a 13-for-13 game and two games of 11-for-11. Mark Aguirre has the most free throws without a miss with an 18-for-18 effort against Illinois State on March 1, 1980.

In the exhibition game against Rockhurst on Nov. 4, Garrett went 14-for-14 from the free throw line en route to a team-high 26 points in the win over the Hawks. Through three regular-season games, Garrett is a perfect 13-for-13 from the line.

**Last Run in Rosemont:** DePaul is in its 37th and final season in 2016-17 at Allstate Arena in Rosemont, Ill. The Blue Demons are 337-176 (.657) all-time in Rosemont. DePaul University played its first season at the then-named Rosemont Horizon in 1980. The Blue Demons debuted in Rosemont with a 74-56 win over Gonzaga and John Stockton on Dec. 1, 1980. The first of DePaul's final 15 games in Rosemont was Nov. 17 against Rutgers in the Gavitt Tipoff Games.

DePaul's game at Allstate Arena against Chicago State on Dec. 5 was the 500th game in program history at the facility. Of the 513 games played in the arena, DePaul head coach Dave Leitao has coached in 62 games. He holds a record of 43-19 (.694) in Rosemont.

**New Home on the Horizon:** Wintrust Arena is set to host DePaul basketball starting in the 2017-18 season. The 10,387-seat arena near McCormick Place in the South Loop area of the city is a joint project between the City of Chicago, the Metropolitan Pier and Exposition Authority, and DePaul University. **DePaul Adds Two For Next Season:** DePaul head coach Dave Leitao announced on Nov. 11 that Jaylen Butz and Justin Roberts will join the program starting in the 2017-18 season. The duo completed paperwork in the November signing period that runs from Nov. 9-16, 2016.

Roberts, a 5-11 guard, is finishing his prep career at Findlay Prep and the Pilots are ranked No. 7 in the USA TODAY Super 25 preseason poll. Prior to Findlay Prep, Roberts starred at Pike High School in Indianapolis where he averaged 16.8 points, 3.7 assists and 2.2 steals per game as a junior. Rated as a four-star recruit by Scout.com and ESPN.com, he was selected to the Indiana Junior All-Star team and was a second team selection to the All-Central Indiana Super Team. Roberts played for Spice Indy Heat on the AAU circuit and averaged 11.9 points and 3.2 assists per game during play in the EYBL.

Butz is also an Indiana native playing his senior year at North Side High School in Fort Wayne. The 6-9 forward was also a member of the Indiana Junior All-Star team a year ago after averaging 15.5 points, 11.4

rebounds and 2.1 blocks per game. Butz also played for Spiece Indy Heat and averaged 7.8 points and 5.4 rebounds on the EYBL circuit. Ranked as a three-star recruit by Scout.com and 247Sports, he averaged 9.3 points, 7.8 rebounds and 2.8 blocked shots per game during his sophomore season at North Side.

**Waiting in the Wings:** Butz and Roberts join transfers Austin Grandstaff and Max Strus as newcomers to the roster next season. Grandstaff and Strus are sitting out the 2016-17 season under NCAA transfer guidelines. Grandstaff, a 6-4 guard, was ranked among the nation's top 50 players coming out of high school before playing in 10 games at Ohio State as a freshman while Strus, a 6-6 guard, scored over 1,000 points in his two seasons at Lewis University while earning NCAA Division II All-American honors.

**Preseason Picks:** Billy Garrett Jr. was selected to the Preseason All-BIG EAST Second Team as the league kicked off the 2016-17 season with media day at Madison Square Garden on Oct. 11. Defending conference champion Villanova was the unanimous pick to win the 2016-17 BIG EAST regular-season crown while the Blue Demons were slotted 10th in a vote by the league's head coaches.

Garrett was also named to the preseason second team as a sophomore and junior after winning BIG EAST Rookie of the Year honors in 2014. The three-time BIG EAST All-Academic Team member enters his senior year ranked among DePaul's all-time leaders in free throw percentage, free throws, free throw attempts, assists, three-pointers and points.

Xavier followed Villanova in the preseason poll with Creighton in third and Georgetown and Seton Hall tied for fourth. Butler was sixth following by Marquette, St. John's, Providence and DePaul. Villanova's Josh Hart was selected as the BIG EAST Preseason Player of the Year while Shamorie Ponds from St. John's was named Preseason Freshman of the Year.

**Leitao Returns to Lincoln Park:** Dave Leitao was named DePaul's head coach on March 29, 2015 and returns to Chicago following a very successful three-year stint with the Blue Demons from 2002-05. Leitao's three-year run saw three postseason appearances that included a 2004 Conference USA title and trip to the second round of the NCAA Tournament.

The New Bedford, Mass. native left DePaul following the 2004-05 season and accepted the head coach position at Virginia. With the Cavaliers, he made three postseason appearances in four seasons and was the 2007 ACC Coach of the Year.

Leitao spent the three seasons working as an assistant coach under Frank Haith at Missouri and Tulsa before returning to DePaul. Following the 2014-15 season, Leitao was ranked No. 20 in the Basketball Times list of the top 50 assistant coaches in the nation.

In his 11th career season as a collegiate head coach, Leitao holds a record of 154-152. Of the 10 full seasons as a head coach, he has led teams to six postseason tournaments including advancing to the second round of the NCAA Tournament at both DePaul (2004) and Virginia (2007). Over his four-plus seasons at DePaul, Leitao holds a record of 69-57.

**FSN Games Locally on The U Too:** Starting with the Nov. 23 game against Missouri State, the five games scheduled to be broadcast on FOX Sports Networks can be seen in the Chicago market on The U Too. Overall, The U Too will broadcast 18 BIG EAST games during the 2016-17 season.

The U Too can be found in Chicago on Digital channel 26.2/48.1 (HD), Xfinity channel 230 (HD)/248/360, RCN channel 35 and WOW channel 170. FOX Sports Networks includes regional networks across the country.

Other DePaul games on FOX Sports Networks and The U Too in addition to the Nov. 23 game against Missouri State include Nov. 30 against Drake, Dec. 6 against Lamar, Jan. 14 at Marquette and Feb. 25 against Seton Hall.

Overall, the Blue Demons will be on FS1 20 times during the regular season with three appearances on CBS Sports Network and one each on ESPNU and the Big Ten Network. The regular-season finale against Xavier on March 4 will be televised on either FOX, FS2 or FOX Sports Networks.

**On Deck:** DePaul hosts Drake on Wednesday, Nov. 30 at 7:30 p.m... the game will be played at McGrath-Phillips Arena on DePaul's Lincoln Park campus... the Blue Demons lead the series, 6-2... DePaul defeated Drake, 74-71, in Des Moines last December... Drake is 1-2 this season and plays in the Great Alaska Shootout this weekend.

### WINTRUST ARENA - FUTURE HOME OF DEPAUL BASKETBALL



✓ On May 16, 2013, Chicago Mayor Rahm Emanuel announced plans for a new 10,000-seat multipurpose events center near McCormick Place in Chicago's South Loop. The facility will be the home for DePaul basketball starting in the 2017-18 season.

✓ A nine-member panel consisting of representatives from the Metropolitan Pier and Exposition Authority (MPEA), the city of Chicago and DePaul University selected the internationally renowned architectural firm Pelli Clarke Pelli to design the McCormick Place Events Center that will include DePaul men's and women's basketball as primary tenants.

✓ The design concept features a sweeping curved roof above four transparent sides that will house DePaul men's and women's basketball along with a variety of civic, entertainment and convention events for Chicago and MPEA. The design endeavors to become

a grand "urban room," in the great Chicago tradition of buildings like the Auditorium Theatre and the Navy Pier Grand Ballroom.

✓ A groundbreaking ceremony was held on Nov. 16, 2015 for the facility as the project was started in the fall along with the 40-story, 1,200-room Marriott Marquis hotel across the street. DePaul is expected to host 25-30 events annually in the facility including graduation ceremonies, which allow each school of the university to have its ceremony under the same roof.

✓ The 10,000-seat events center is scheduled to open in the 2017-18 basketball season and will be located near McCormick Place on Cermak Road between Indiana and South Prairie Avenues. Not only will the facility serve as a home for men's and women's basketball that is close to the university's two primary campuses, it will create jobs, attract tourism and bring economic development to the planned McCormick Place entertainment district.

✓ The 10,000-seat events center is scheduled to open in the 2017-18 basketball season and will be located near McCormick Place on Cermak Road between Indiana and South Prairie Avenues. Not only will the facility serve as a home for men's and women's basketball that is close to the university's two primary campuses, it will create jobs, attract tourism and bring economic development to the planned McCormick Place entertainment district.

✓ The location is situated just three 'L' stops from DePaul's loop campus that caters to half of the DePaul

student body. The Lincoln Park campus and the remaining half of DePaul's 25,000 students is 10 'L' stops from the future home of the Blue Demons. Additionally, the South Loop location is a seven-mile trip down Chicago's Lakeshore Drive that is flanked by the city's world-famous skyline and Lake Michigan. DePaul's 80,000 alumni in the Chicagoland area will have easy access to the events center by major highways.
