SETTING THE STAGE

Indiana State Basketball takes to the road in Missouri Valley Conference play on Saturday, December 31 at Noon (ET) as they travel to Missouri State in a game that will be regionally televised on the MVC TV Network. The Sycamores look for their third true road win of the year as they attempt to even their overall and conference records. Missouri State is 10-4, 1-0 MVC after winning their Valley opener on Wednesday night at Northern Iowa.

QUICK HITS

- Indiana State is 77-9 when holding teams to 63 points or less under seventh-year head coach Greg Lansing (and 18-0 when limiting teams to 53 or less).
- Indiana State has earned 63 close victories (five points or less) since 2005. Under Greg Lansing, the Sycamores are 37-23 in close games.
- Greg Lansing is just the sixth head coach in the history of the program to record at least 100 victories at the helm of the Sycamores. He needs five more to tie John Longfellow for fifth on the ISU all-time victories list.
- Sophomore Brenton Scott owns 166 trifectas in his career which is third-best in the history of the program. In the Valparaiso game he moved past Eddie Bird for third on the all-time list.
- Junior Matt Van Scyoc has scored over 1,000 career collegiate points as he tallied 807 in two prior seasons at The Citadel plus 371 with the Sycamores. He now has 1,183 career points scored during his career with the two institutions.
- The Sycamores opened the season with back-to-back overtime games. It is the first time Indiana State has played consecutive overtime games since the 1986-87 season. Of the Sycamores' first 13 games, eight have been decided by one possession or in overtime, including three of the last four victories.
- Indiana State head coach Greg Lansing owns a school record five victories over nationally-ranked teams during his tenure, a new standard set on December 7 in the win over No. 15 Butler.
- The Sycamores own a 52-40 record in "bounce-back" games under seventh-year head coach Greg Lansing following a loss.
- Indiana State head coach Greg Lansing led the Sycamores for the 200th time against Missouri-St. Louis. He is one of just four head coaches at Indiana State to coach at least 200 games. Duane Klueh, Royce Waltman and Gordon Stauffer are the others.

The Indiana State Head Coach

Indiana State head coach Greg Lansing (South Dakota, 1990) is 115-95 (.548) overall in his seventh season as a head coach. He is 60-49 all-time in MVC games, including a 41-14 mark at home and a 19-35 record on the road. During his career, he is 67-24 in all home games, 32-53 on the road, 16-18 in neutral court contests and 37-23 in games decided by five points or less. Lansing is 7-6 against Missouri State and is 1-5 against the Bears on the road. With the Trees, Lansing is 9-8 in overtime games and 77-9 when holding teams to 63 points or less. Lansing led the Sycamores to the post-season in each of his first four seasons at the helm (2011 NCAA, 2012 CIT, 2013, 2014 NIT). Lansing is the second head coach to lead the Sycamores to the NCAA Tournament in their rookie campaign in the history of the program, with the other being Bill Hodges leading ISU to a 33-1 record and a Final Four appearance in the 1979 NCAA Tournament. Lansing was just the 14th rookie head coach in the history of the MVC to lead his team to 20 victories during their debut season. Lansing holds the school record for most victories over a nationally-ranked team (five) in the history of the program. Lansing is currently sixth on the Indiana State all-time coaching victories list and needs five more to tie John Longfellow for fifth.

Indiana State is currently in its 121st season of college basketball at the school. The Sycamores are 1,462-1,262 all-time on the hardwood.

Everett Clemons With Most Assists In A Game Since 2014

Indiana State senior guard Everett Clemons posted a career-high 11 assists in the Sycamores' near-miss in the Missouri Valley Conference opener on December 28 against Wichita State. It was the most assists in a single-game by a Sycamore since Jake Odum posted 10 at home against Missouri State in 2014. For the game, the Sycamores recorded 17 assists on 22 made field goals.

Jordan Barnes Sparks Sycamores To EIU Second Half Comeback

Indiana State freshman Jordan Barnes provided a spark in the second half to help the Sycamores to a thrilling 88-85 double overtime victory over Eastern Illinois. Barnes scored 11 points to go with a career-high six assists and five rebounds in the win. A 3-pointer from Barnes mid-way through the second half sparked a run which helped stake the Sycamores to an eight point lead after trailing by as many as 13 points. He came back in the Valley opener against Wichita State to hit a pair of late game 3-pointers, including a rare 4-point play.

- Make it 11 consecutive seasons with at least a 1-1 start to Missouri Valley Conference play. A

streak that has been alive since an 0-2 start in 2005-06.

- Snap a four-game losing skid in Springfield dating back to a 59-46 win on February 22, 2012.

Close Game Alert!

Games involving Indiana State so far this season have, for the most part, come down to the wire. Eight of the first 13 games have been decided by just one possession or have entered overtime. The Sycamores opened the season with back-to-back overtime games. It is the first time Indiana State has played consecutive overtime games since the 1986-87 season when they dropped extra time decisions against Saint Louis and Eastern Illinois. It is the fifth time in school history the program has played back-to-back overtime games and the first time it has happened in the first two games of the year. ISU began the year with road games against Northern Illinois and Ball State -- both of which went an extra five minutes. For the season, Indiana State is 2-1 in overtime games, including an 88-85 victory in double overtime on December 21 against Eastern Illinois.

Sycamores Own Third-Best Record In MVC Play Over Last Six Seasons

In seven seasons under the direction of head coach Greg Lansing, the Sycamores have amassed a total of 60 Missouri Valley Conference victories. Those 60 MVC wins by coach Lansing are second-most in the history of the program as he trails only Royce Waltman who won 69 league games during his tenure. Additionally, the 60 MVC victories for the Sycamores since the 2010-11 campaign ranks third-best among current conference members. Wichita State's 94 leads the league while Indiana State has 60 and Northern Iowa is second with 67. The next closest program behind the Sycamores in Evansville which owns 55 victories while Illinois State owns 53.

Sycamores Tally School Record Fifth Victory Over Nationally-Ranked Team Under Lansing

Indiana State ended a skid of nine losses to nationally-ranked teams when No. 15/16 Butler fell inside Hulman Center on December 7 by the score of 72-71. Coach Lansing has led the Sycamores to a school-record five victories against nationally-ranked teams during his time at the helm of the program. He passed Bill Hodges (head coach of the Dream Team in 1978-79) and Royce Waltman (head coach of the Sycamores during back-to-back NCAA Tourney trips in 2000 & 2001) for the most in program history with the win over Butler. It was just the second victory for the Sycamores under Lansing at home against a nationally-ranked team and the first overall since a win at No. 21 Notre Dame in 2013.

Sycamores Have Had Success In Bounce Back Games Under Head Coach Greg Lansing

In the last seven seasons, the Sycamores have been known as a team with the ability to bounce back from defeat. Since the 2010-11 campaign, the Sycamores are 52-40 in a game which follows a loss. Indiana State last rebounded from a loss at Valparaiso to down Eastern Illinois by the score of 88-85 in double overtime.

Scott's 3-Point Shooting Moving Up ISU Career Ranks; Reaches 1,000 Career Points

Indiana State junior Brenton Scott is continuing to make his mark on the Sycamore Basketball Record Book in regards to 3-point shooting and points scored. Through 76 career games he has hit 166 3-pointers which ranks third-best all-time and is 49 behind Jordan Printy (2008-12) for second place. He has attempted 424 3-pointers in his career which ranks fourth and needs seven more attempts to move past Eddie Bird (1987-91) for third place. Scott also has scored 1,068 points in his career and is the 38th member of the Indiana State Basketball 1,000 Point Club. Scott also is the 13th member of the club (34.2 percent) either coached or recruited by current head coach Greg Lansing, the most members that one coach can claim as one of their pupils in the illustrious club. Scott currently ranks 34th at the school all-time in career scoring.

Brenton Scott Near The Top Of The MVC In Scoring

Brenton Scott scored a team-high 25 points in the 72-71 victory over Butler, including a free throw with 1.5 seconds remaining to secure the victory. He has reached double figures scoring in all 12 games so far this season and has eclipsed the 20-point mark a team-best five times this year. Through 13 games, Scott is averaging 19.2 points per game which is second in the Missouri Valley Conference.

Missouri Valley Weekly Awards

Sycamore Success Inside Hulman Center Under Greg Lansing

The Sycamores are 67-24 (.736) inside Hulman Center under seventh-year head coach Greg Lansing. The Sycamores have won 57 of their last 77 home games. Additionally, the Sycamores have won 41 of their last 55 MVC games at home. The Sycamores were 10-4 at home last season. Indiana State owns a win in their last meeting with every MVC opponent at home with the exception of Wichita State and Southern Illinois. The longest stretch of consecutive home victories is against Illinois State which has now reached nine. Indiana State is 4-2 this season at home.

Oh So Close! Everett Clemons Nearly Posts Triple-Double At Ball State

Indiana State senior guard Everett Clemons scored 11 points and pulled down 10 rebounds to record the Sycamores' first double-double of the season as part of the overtime win over Ball State. He also posted a career-best nine assists (of the team's 13) and narrowly missed his first career triple-double and the first by a Sycamore since Jake Odum did it in the 2011 Old Spice Classic (now Advocare Invitational). There have been just two triple-doubles in the MVC era with Odum owning one as well as Larry Bird in 1979. Currently, Clemons is averaging 5.2 rebounds per game which is 14th-best in the league while he is third the MVC with a 4.9 assists per game average.

63 Is The Magic Number

The Sycamores win by the score of 62-61 on December 3 at Utah State was ISU's third this season in which they held an opponent to 63 points or less and earned the victory. Under seventh-year head coach Greg Lansing, the Sycamores are 77-9 when allowing less than 63 points to the opposition (including a 18-0 mark when holding teams to 53 or less).

Good Starter On The Battery

Indiana State's starting five outscored the opposition's top five twice this season and earned the win. Under seventh-year head coach Greg Lansing, the Sycamores are 72-22 when the ISU starting five scores more than their opponent's starters after doing so in the win over Northern Illinois on November 30.

Brenton Scott Named To Preseason All-MVC First Team

Indiana State junior Brenton Scott was named to the Preseason All-MVC First Team as announced by the league office on October 25. Scott, who is the only returning first or second team all-conference selection from last season, picked up his first ever all-conference honor last year after being named The Valley's Freshman Of The Year in 2015. The Sycamores have had at least one all-conference selection in each of the last nine years which is the third-longest active streak among the current membership of the MVC.

Sycamores Picked To Finish Sixth In Missouri Valley Conference Race

Indiana State was picked to finish sixth in the Missouri Valley Conference according to a preseason poll of league head coaches, sports information directors and a media panel. Defending league champion Wichita State was also picked to win the league. The Sycamores are coming a 15-17 record last year and a sixth place finish in the MVC race. Indiana State reached the semifinals of Arch Madness of the fourth time in the last six years last season.

Brandon Murphy An MVC Scholar-Athlete Selection

Indiana State sophomore Brandon Murphy carries a 3.25 GPA in Communications and was named to the MVC Scholar-Athlete Team as an honorable mention selection. Murphy averaged 4.9 points and 4.2 rebounds per game. In MVC contests, Murphy averaged 5.3 rebounds per game to rank 12th in the league. He pulled down 2.0 offensive rebounds per game to rank third while his 2.4 offensive rebounds per MVC game was second in the conference rankings. Murphy posted his first career double figure scoring output with 10 points in a home court victory over Wyoming. He tallied a career-high 12 rebounds in an overtime contest at Missouri State.

Greg Lansing Selected For Induction Into Iowa High School Basketball Hall Of Fame

Indiana State head coach Greg Lansing was inducted into the Iowa High School Athletic Association Basketball Hall of Fame as part of their 2016 class. Lansing and the other selected inductees were honored individually at halftime of the Iowa Class 4A State Championship Game at Wells Fargo Arena in Des Moines on March 12. The IHSAA Basketball Hall of Fame is the highest honor the Iowa High School Board of Control can bestow on a high school coach or former player. Lansing graduated from Harlan High School in 1986, where he was coached by his father Dave, who was inducted into the IHSAA Basketball Hall of Fame in 1999 as a coach. The Lansing father/son combination of Dave and Greg are just the 10th father/son duo to both be inducted into the Hall of Fame since 1969.

The Last Time Out ...

TERRE HAUTE, Ind. -- Indiana State battled Wichita State down to the final moments but the visiting Shockers earned a hard fought 80-72 victory in the Missouri Valley Conference opener for both clubs inside Hulman Center.

The Sycamores fell to 6-7, 0-1 MVC while Wichita State improved to 11-3, 1-0 MVC.

Brenton Scott led the way with 14 points and added seven rebounds while Matt Van Scyoc tallied 11 points as he hit a trio of 3-pointers. Off the bench, freshman Jordan Barnes made a splash in his Valley debut as he tallied 10 points, hit three 3-pointers and added four-point play. Senior Everett Clemons tallied five points but had a career-best 11 assists and led the team with eight rebounds.

One of the deciding factors in the game, Wichita State owned a 47-30 edge on the glass, including a 16-7 advantage on offensive rebounds. The Shockers scored 19 second chance points in the the game. The Sycamores shared the ball the well with 17 assists on 22 made field goals. Indiana State hit 22-of-56 shots (39.3 percent) while Wichita State made 29-of-61 (47.5 percent).

The Shockers scored on their opening possession, but Van Scyoc countered with a 3-pointer for the quick lead. Indiana State enjoyed an early 8-0 run which began with an unconventional 3-point play by Clemons as he made the first free throw, missed the second, but grabbed his own rebound and laid it in for the 10-09 lead. The run was extended by a triple from Donovan Franklin and then a pair of Franklin charity tosses with 13:07 on the clock for a 15-9 lead. Wichita State countered with six in a row to tie the game, before Niels Bunschoten connected on a 3-pointer for the 18-15 lead with 10:51 remaining.

Wichita State would take a 25-20 lead, but the Sycamores got back-to-back jumpers from Bunschoten and Emondre Rickman as well as a Scott free throw to knot the game at 25. Darral Willis, Jr., converted a conventional 3-point play with 4:05 remaining for the 32-26 lead before a jumper from Laqarious Paige got the Sycamores within 32-30 with just over three and half to go. After Willis scored again for Wichita State, Paige hit a 3-pointer and then Franklin scored inside for the 35-34 Sycamore lead. Van Scyoc hit a 3-pointer with 46 seconds remaining to tie the game at 38 heading into the locker room. Franklin led the way for the Sycamores in the first half with seven points.

The Shockers scored the first three points of the second half before Scott and Clemons scored back-to-back for the 42-41 lead. A 10-1 Shocker run staked them to a 58-47 lead with 12:30 to go on a lay-up from Markis McDuffie. Scott ended the string with a 3-pointer at the 11:45 mark before two free throws from Willis, Jr., gave the Shockers a 60-50 lead with just under 10 minutes remaining. 3-pointers from Van Scyoc and Barnes whittled the Wichita State lead down to 62-58 as the clock ticked under the eight minute mark. After the Shockers took a 67-60 lead, Barnes converted the rare four-point play with 4:28 to go and ISU was within 67-64.

Another 3-pointer from Barnes answered a dunk by McDuffie as ISU was down just 69-67 with 3:42 remaining. The two teams traded free throws before a lay-up by Willis, Jr., and then a 3-pointer from McDuffie reestablished a 76-69 lead for the Shockers with 1:25 remainin. Scott hit a pair of free throws with 42 seconds on the clock to get within 76-72, but four charity tosses from the Shockers closed out to 80-72 Wichita State victory.

Darral Willis, Jr., posted a double-double with 25 points and 10 rebounds while Markis McDuffie added 22 points.

Seventh Season

Greg Lansing is in his seventh season as the head basketball coach at Indiana State. He previously spent eight seasons with the program as an assistant coach, including three as associate head coach.

Lansing (South Dakota, 1990) is 115-95 (.548) at the helm of the Sycamore basketball program. He owns a mark of 60-49 in MVC games, including a 41-14 record

at home. During his career, he is 67-24 in all home games with 32 road victories to his credit and is 37-23 in games decided by five points or less. Lansing is 8-5 in the MVC Tournament, with four of those victories coming as the lower seeded team. Indiana State's game at Iowa in the 2014 NIT was Lansing's 100th as Indiana State head coach. His 115 career victories rank sixth on ISU's all-time win list.

He is the second head coach to lead the Sycamores to the NCAA Tournament in their rookie campaign in the history of the program, with the other being Bill Hodges leading ISU to a 33-1 record and a Final Four appearance in the 1979 NCAA Tournament. Lansing was just the 14th rookie head coach in the history of the MVC to lead his team to 20 victories during their debut season.

With a 23-win campaign in 2013-14, the Sycamores reached the 17-victory mark for the fifth consecutive season and notched five consecutive winning seasons for the first time in over 40 years under Lansing's leadership.

Lansing's 60 career Missouri Valley Conference victories rank second in program history to Royce Waltman's school record of 69. Over the last six years, the Sycamores' 60 league victories are third most among the current membership.

Under Lansing, the Sycamores have earned a school record five victories over nationally-ranked teams. ISU won at No. 14 Wichita State (in 2013) -- its best-victory over a nationally-ranked team on the road since 1999 and downed No. 13 Creighton (2013) at home, the highest ranked team to fall to Indiana State inside Hulman Center since joining the MVC. The Sycamores also have won at Vanderbilt (2012) and Notre Dame (2013) under Lansing while those opponents were ranked in the Top 25. Most recently, the Sycamore beat No. 15 Butler in Hulman Center on December 7, 2016 to set a new school standard.

In 2014-15, the Sycamores entered the season with a roster that featured seven newcomers. Despite a slow start in non-conference play, Lansing led the Sycamores to an 11-7 mark in the Missouri Valley Conference and earned the No. 3 seed at Arch Madness. Indiana State has earned at least the No. 3 seed at the conference tournament in three of Lansing's six seasons as head coach.

In 2015-16, Devonte Brown and Brenton Scott were each named to the All-MVC Second Team while Everett Clemons took a spot on the MVC All-Newcomer squad. Brandon Murphy was selected as a Missouri Valley Conference Scholar-Athlete. The Sycamores advanced to the MVC Tournament semifinals for the fourth time under Lansing with a win over Illinois State as the sixth seed.

Lansing was inducted into the Iowa High School Basketball Hall of Fame in March of 2016. He and his father Dave are just the 10th father/son combination to be inducted into that Hall of Fame.

He saw several Sycamores earn postseason recognition from the league office in 2015. Devonte Brown was named the league's Most Improved Player and was tabbed to the All-MVC Second Team. Brenton Scott picked up the program's third-ever MVC Freshman of the Year honor while Tre' Bennett was selected to the All-Bench Team. Justin Gant and Jake Kitchell were each First Team selections as MVC Scholar-Athletes.

In 2012-13, Indiana State finished 18-15 and advanced to the semifinals of the MVC Tournament on the strength of a 51-50 victory over Evansville. In 2013-14, the Sycamores finished with a 23-11 mark and reached the second MVC Tournament Championship game in four seasons under Lansing. The Sycamores played in the National Invitation Tournament (NIT) in 2013 & 2014 and reached the postseason five consecutive seasons, including in each of the first four years with Lansing at the helm.

In 2013-14, the Sycamores finished in the Top 5 nationally for most true road victories with nine. Included in that total was a road victory over nationally-ranked Notre Dame, giving the program at least one victory over a nationally-ranked opponent in each of Lansing's first four seasons as head coach.

Jake Odum was a repeat selection on the All-MVC First Team and became the first player in the history of the Missouri Valley Conference to record at least 500 career assists and 500 career made free throws. Odum finished as the school's record holder for career free throws made and attempted. He also wrapped up his career as the school's fifth all-time leading scorer and was in the Top 4 in both assists and steals. Odum also was named to the NABC All-District Team and was a Mid-Major All-American for the second consecutive season.

Kristian Smith earned his second consecutive nod on the MVC All-Bench Team and was selected as the league's Sixth Man Of The Year. Manny Arop added an honorable mention all-conference selection while Justin Gant and Lucas Eitel were each named to the MVC Scholar-Athlete Team.

Indiana State's three victories over the RPI Top 50 were tied for the most of any one in the Missouri Valley Conference in 2012-13. Creighton, the league's tournament and regular season champion also owned three. Indiana State owned a victory in the Diamond Head Classic against ACC Champion Miami and also took down Ole Miss to finish third in the event while Jake Odum was named to the All-Tournament Team.

Odum also became the first Sycamore to appear on the All-Missouri Valley Conference First Team since 2001 and just the sixth all-time. Freshman Khristian Smith was a member of the MVC All-Bench Team while Lucas Eitel and Justin Gant were named Second Team MVC Scholar-Athletes. Additionally, Odum was named to the 2013 Lou Henson All-America Team as well as the 2013 NABC All-District 16 First Team.

The Sycamores are 63-22 (.741) inside Hulman Center under Lansing. Additionally, the Sycamores are 74-9 with Lansing as head coach when allowing less than 63 points to the opposition (including a 17-0 mark when holding teams to 53 or less).

Indiana State did not allow a made 3-pointer at Illinois State on January 23, 2013 as the Redbirds went 0-for-13 from long range on their home court and snapped a string of over 400 games with one which dated back to 1999. It marked the second time during the 2012-13 season that the Sycamores did not allow a trey in a game as nationally-ranked Miami went 0-of-15 on December 25, 2012 in the consolation game of the Diamond Head Classic.

In 2011-12, the Sycamores finished the year with an 18-15 record and advanced to the CollegelInsiders.com Postseason Tournament. Jake Odum was one of just four players nationally to average at least 10 points, five rebounds and 4.5 assists per game during his sophomore season and was a Second Team All-Missouri Valley Conference selection as well as Second Team All-District selection as announced by the National Association of Basketball Coaches.

The Sycamores downed No. 25 nationally-ranked Vanderbilt on the road and finished third at the Old Spice Classic – the best-ever finish by a MVC team in the event.

Lansing burst onto the scene as a rookie head coach with the Sycamore basketball program in 2010-11 as he became just the second-ever Indiana State head coach to lead the team to the NCAA Tournament in his first season. He led the team to a 20-14 record, becoming just the 14th head coach in the history of the Missouri Valley Conference to lead a team to 20 or more victories in their first year at the helm.

ISU reached the NCAA Tournament and took on Syracuse in Cleveland, Ohio based on the program's third-ever MVC Tournament Championship won at the Scottrade Center in St. Louis, Mo. ISU raced to the title with victories over No. 6 Evansville, No. 2 Wichita State and No. 1 Missouri State in the Championship Game as the Sycamores entered as the No. 3 seed in the tournament. Freshman Jake Odum was named to the MVC All-Tournament Team.

Odum was named a CollegelInsider.com Mid Major Freshman All-American and was named an All-MVC Honorable Mention selection as well as a member of the MVC All-Freshman, All-Newcomer and All-Defense Team. Carl Richard was also named to the All-MVC's Honorable Mention squad. ISU took two thrilling buzzer beating victories over league foes Missouri State and Creighton during the regular season at Hulman Center. The buzzer beater over Creighton by Richard was voted the No. 2 play of the weekend by ESPN's SportsCenter.

In 2009-10 the Sycamores overcame a ton of adversity to still put together its best season in nearly a decade under the professional leadership of the ISU coaching staff. Despite only having its full complement of student-athletes for just 28 minutes of the rough and tumble Missouri Valley Conference slate, the Sycamores still recorded its first winning season since 2001 as they finished 17-15. ISU also finished the year with a 9-9 record in league play, bolstering the Sycamores out of the MVC Opening Round at the State Farm Missouri Valley Conference Tournament by securing the league's No. 6 seed after finishing in a tie for fifth in the standings.

Starting guard Jake Kelly suffered a season ending knee injury with 12 minutes left in the conference opener at Southern Illinois and subsequently also lost Dwayne Lathan and Harry Marshall for extended periods over the course of the year.

Marshall, who was the heart and soul of the team, led the MVC in scoring in league contests with a 16.0 ppg average. Marshall was tabbed Second Team All-MVC and was named to the MVC's All-Defensive Team after turning in shutdown performances against most of the league's all-conference opposition. Running a well-rounded program, the Sycamores also two representatives on the MVC's Scholar Athlete Team as both Jordan Printy and Aaron Carter took those plaudits.

The payoff for the Sycamores continued as ISU reached postseason play for the first since 2001 when they accepted a bid to the 2010 College Basketball Invitational, appearing in a road contest at Saint Louis.

Lansing has been a key recruiter for many talented student-athletes. Lansing has also been a major part of the several all-conference accolades for several players, including Harry Marshall and Jay Tunnell, who took All-MVC honors following the 2008-09 campaign.

During each year of Lansing's tenure, the Sycamores have participated in the Coaches Vs. Cancer Suits and Sneakers Challenge. For each of the last three years, Lansing has led a successful challenge to the state's lawmakers to wear sneakers with their suits during that same time frame as part of the program to promote cancer awareness. Through an invitation from State Representative Bob Heaton, who played for ISU on the 1978-79 team which advanced to the NCAA Final Four, ISU head coach Greg Lansing has visited the State House leaders to participate in the challenge.

Lansing returned to Indiana State after a seven-year stint with the Iowa Hawkeyes. During Lansing's seven years as assistant coach at Iowa, the Hawkeyes went 135-92, received three NCAA Tournament invitations, three NIT appearances and won a pair of Big Ten tournament titles, the first of which came on four wins in four games making Iowa the first team in the Big Ten to accomplish such a feat. In 2005-06, Iowa earned a 25-9 record, the second-most wins in school history, the first undefeated (17-0) home record in the school's history and a No. 3 seed in the NCAA Tournament. Iowa earned seven All-Big Ten selections, 17 Academic All-Big Ten selections and four Academic All-Americans. Lansing coached four of the last five Big Ten rebounding champions, three straight conference leaders in blocked shots and, the league's 2005-06 defensive player of the year. Three of his student-athletes reached the NBA and two from the 2005-06 team were invited to NBA camps.

In Lansing's final two seasons of his first stint at Indiana State, the Sycamores posted back-to-back winning campaigns for the first time since 1979 and 1980. When the Sycamores posted a 16-11 record in 1998 it marked the first winning season for Indiana State since 1980. Indiana State advanced to the NCAA Tournament in both 2000 and 2001.

Prior to joining the staff at Indiana State, Lansing was the head basketball coach at Roosevelt High School in Des Moines, Iowa. Roosevelt had not had a winning season in 12 years before Lansing's initial season. The Roughriders went on to have back-to-back winning seasons under Greg's direction.

Lansing earned a Bachelor of Science degree from the University of South Dakota in 1990 and a master's degree in counseling from USD in 1992. As a member of the Coyote basketball team Lansing helped South Dakota reach the NCAA Division II Tournament during his junior and senior seasons, the first NCAA invitation for USD since 1954. He was twice named the South Dakota Defensive Player of the Year. Greg is currently ranked among the leaders in career assists at USD. Following his playing career, Lansing served as a graduate assistant coach at South Dakota for two seasons. In 1992-93 he was a full-time assistant.

Greg's father, Dave Lansing, coached high school basketball for 33 years in Iowa. Dave Lansing was inducted into the Iowa High School Athletic Association Coaches Hall of Fame during the 1999 Iowa boys state basketball tournament. Lansing's dad, his mother, Diane, his sister, Angela, and his nephew, Jordan, live in West Des Moines. His brother, Steve, is the head basketball coach at Faribault High School (Minn.), where he was named Regional Coach of the Year in 2004.
