FIRST AND TEN

- The **Missouri State Bears** continue their season-opening road swing with the first of two September trips to the state of North Dakota Saturday (Sept. 9) when they take on the No. 11 **North Dakota Fighting Hawks**
- The Bears and Fighting Hawks will be meeting for the second time Saturday; MSU claimed a 38-0 victory in the two clubs' previous contest in Springfield on Sept. 13, 2014—the Bears' only other regular-season meeting with a Big Sky Conference opponent
- MSU is 22-88 all-time versus ranked FCS opponents; the Bears knocked off 24th-ranked Indiana State on the road last fall and have squared off against at least four ranked foes in each of the last seven seasons
- With their 43-point outburst in last Saturday's season opener at Mizzou, the Bears not only posted their best offensive performance against an NCAA Division I FBS opponent, but also their top single-game road point total in non-conference action since the 2010 season
- Senior co-captain **Malik Earl** climbed to No. 14 on the Bears' career receiving yardage chart with his career-high 163-yard day at Mizzou; the preseason All-MVFC pick has 1,321 yards to his credit and needs just six more receiving yards to catch Cadarius Dotson (2009-12) in the No. 13 spot on the list
- Sophomore transfer **Peyton Huslig** accounted for three of the Bears' six touchdowns at Mizzou, completing 24-of-35 passes for 353 yards to earn MVFC Newcomer of the Week recognition; his yardage total represents the best ever by a Bears quarterback in his debut game, as well as the seventh-best single-game total in school history
- Senior return specialist **Deion Holliman** inched closer to the top spot on MSU's career kickoff return yardage list last weekend, hiking his career total within 28 yards of the 2,000-mark; he enters Saturday's game 474 yards shy of Tony Gilbert's 28-year-old MSU mark of 2,446 career return yards
- MSU recorded 12 'chunk' plays of 10 yards or more as an offensive unit at Mizzou, including eight in the passing game and six total gains of at least 20 yards; the Bears also logged five different scoring drives of 75 yards after recording a total of 17 such drives in their 11 games last fall
- MSU dominated the clock in Columbia Saturday, finishing with 38:16 in time of possession, marking the Bears best single-game figure of the **Dave Steckel** era; the Bears' 353 passing yards also represents their best in Steckel's 23 games as head coach
- Senior **Calan Crowder** rushed for a pair of first-quarter touchdowns, including a career-long 75-yarder, in topping the 1,500-yard mark for his career with a 124-yard afternoon at Mizzou—his fifth 100-yard rushing game as a Bear

BEARS SET TO FACE NATIONALLY-RANKED NORTH DAKOTA AS PART OF MVFC-BIG SKY CHALLENGE

Following an encouraging opening day performance against an imposing FBS foe, the **Missouri State Bears** will face another stiff test Saturday (Sept. 9) in their initial FCS matchup of the season against the No. 11 **North Dakota Fighting Hawks**. As part of the inaugural MVFC-Big Sky Challenge, the Bears and Fighting Hawks will square off in a 4 p.m. non-conference tilt at the Alerus Center in Grand Forks, N.D.

The Bears (0-1) turned in an impressive offensive performance in their season opener against Missouri this past weekend, racking up 492 yards and their best-ever single-game point total (43) against an NCAA Division I FBS opponent. Quarterback **Peyton Huslig** passed for 353 yards—the top total by a Bears QB since 2012—and accounted for three of MSU's six touchdowns in the 72-43 setback. Senior receiver **Malik Earl** and senior tailback **Calan Crowder** also enjoyed big afternoons against the Tigers. Earl hauled in a career-long 89-yard touchdown reception, after Crowder ran for a pair of first-quarter scores as part of his fifth 100-yard rushing performance as a Bear.

North Dakota (0-1) sustained a 37-16 road setback to Utah in its season opener last Thursday. The Fighting Hawks were limited to 242 yards of total offense, paced by Keaton Studsrud's 175 passing yards. On the defensive side, senior linebacker Jake Disterhaupt led the way with 14 stops.

SHOW-ME SHOWDOWN RECAP

Missouri State's season-opening 72-43 setback at Missouri last Saturday not only marked the first meeting of the two Show-Me State institutions on the gridiron in 94 years, but also provided a number of notable achievements by Bears. MSU's offense turned in a banner first-half performance, logging five different scoring drives of at least 65 yards while giving the Tigers all they could handle.

The Bears led 21-20 after one period, marking their second consecutive 21-point first quarter in a season opener. They led on five different occasions in the opening half, as the two teams combined to total 888 yards of offense over the first 30 minutes of play. Overall, the Bears amassed 494 yards of total offense and eclipsed their top single-game point total in 34 total contests against NCAA Division I FBS opponents, topping their 30-point output at UNLV in 1990—their last victory against an FBS foe.

WELCOME TO THE PARTY

Led by quarterback **Peyton Huslig's** 353-yard passing day, the Bears received significant contributions from several new faces making their Missouri State debuts last weekend in Columbia. Huslig's passing total marked the top single-game performance by an MSU signal-caller since Ashton Glaser's 357 yards vs. Murray State in 2012, while freshman safety **Titus Wall** led all defenders with nine tackles. In all, 16 Bears saw their first game action against the Tigers, including two starters (Huslig and tight end **Jordan Frazier**).

Missouri State's cause will receive a boost by an influx of talent in 2017, with 30 newcomers adorning the Bears' roster entering the regular season. Head coach **Dave Steckel** and his staff welcomed 22 freshmen, as well as eight transfers to campus at the start of fall camp. MSU expects to see an immediate impact from its decorated group of newcomers, as three true freshmen found spots on the season-opening two-deep roster. Additionally, 20 redshirt freshmen who sat out last fall are expected to contribute this season.

MSU's talented crop of newcomers will be aiming to continue a tradition of excellence displayed by Bear rookies over the last two decades. In the history of the Missouri Valley Football Conference, only Western Illinois (80) and Illinois State (79) have produced more MVFC All-Newcomer selections than the Bears, who have collected 77 such honors since the league began recognizing an all-rookie team in 1994. On this year's roster, five Bears have been listed on previous MVFC All-Newcomer squads: 2014 - **Cecil Bratton** (DL), **Calan Crowder** (RB); 2015 - **Jared Beshore** (S) and 2016 - **Coleman Clanton** (OL) and **McNeece Egbim** (LB).

SENIORS SHINE IN OPENER, TOO

The MSU newcomers weren't the only ones factoring prominently in the Bears' first game of 2017, as senior standouts **Calan Crowder** and **Malik Earl** registered big opening day performances as well. Crowder ripped off scoring runs of 75 (a career long) and 34 yards in a shootout of a first half, totaling 121 of his 124 rushing yards in the game's first 30 minutes.

Earl fueled the Bears' passing game, hauling in 163 yards—a personal best that stands and the 15th-best single-game total on record at Missouri State—to help spark MSU's best-ever offensive showing against an FBS squad. The Oklahoma City native caught eight passes overall, including a career-long 89-yard touchdown reception from **Peyton Huslig** that handed the Bears a 35-34 lead late in the first half. With his third career 100-yard receiving day, Earl moved into the Bears' top 15 for all-time receiving yardage as well, climbing to No. 14 after upping his career total to 1,321 yards. Tight end **Erik Furmanek** also notched a career high with 91 yards, as four MSU seniors combined to account for 303 of the Bears' 353 receiving yards.

HUSLIG HONORED AS VALLEY'S TOP NEWCOMER

On the heels of an impressive debut at Mizzou to open the 2017 season, Missouri State quarterback **Peyton Huslig** was named the Missouri Valley Football Conference Newcomer of the Week on Sunday.

A sophomore from Andover, Kan., Huslig turned in the best-ever debut performance by a Bear quarterback in Columbia, completing 24-of-35 passes for 353 yards while accounting for three of Missouri State's six touchdowns (2 pass/1 rush). He guided the MSU offense to touchdowns in each of its first three possessions, as the Bears converted their first five third-down tries and ran up their best-ever point total (43) against an FBS foe.

Huslig threw for 230 yards and a pair of touchdowns in the first 30 minutes of play, including an 89-yarder to **Malik Earl** that gave the Bears a one-point lead with just over five minutes to play before intermission. He added a 10-yard rushing TD in the fourth quarter, and his 353 passing yards rank as the seventh-best single-game total in the 106-year history of the MSU program.

CHUNK THIS

The Bears once again displayed their big-play capabilities in Saturday's season opener, logging 12 different offensive gains of at least 10 yards in 74 total plays. The MSU passing game clicked to notch including eight such plays, while the offense logged six gains overall of at least 20 yards. The Bears also logged five different scoring drives of 75 yards after recording a total of 17 such drives in their 11 games last fall.

Missouri State's propensity for big plays was on display throughout the 2016 season, with the Bears posting 25 offensive plays of 25 yards or more last fall. That figure easily surpassed the total of the 2015 Bears, who registered just 15 such 'chunk' gains for their entire 11-game season.

Additionally, MSU produced 17 scoring drives of 75 yards or more in 2016, as well as 15 different scoring series extending at least nine plays, up from 2015 totals of just seven and 11, respectively.

FIVE BEARS NAMED PRESEASON ALL-MVFC

Led by first-team selections **Malik Earl**, **Deion Holliman** and **Colby Isbell**, Missouri State placed five players on the Missouri Valley Football Conference Preseason Team. Additionally, **Coleman Clanton** and **McNeece Egbim** picked up honorable mention recognition from the league's coaches, media and sports information directors.

After earning second-team all-conference laurels in 2016, Earl was named a first-team wide receiver and Isbell picked up top preseason honors as a defensive lineman. Holliman, a two-time first-team All-MVFC honoree, garnered the same distinction as a return specialist. Clanton and Egbim picked up honorable mention spots on the Valley's distinguished list as an offensive lineman and linebacker, respectively.

HISTORIC HOLLIMAN

Senior **Deion Holliman** earned preseason All-America recognition after ranking among the nation's top return threats over the last two years. Holliman is the lone FCS return man to bring back both a kickoff and a punt for a touchdown in each of the last two seasons and enters Saturday's game second on the Bears' all-time lists for return TDs (4) and kickoff return yardage (1,972).

Holliman owns the top two single-season totals for return yards in MSU history. In 2015, the Camden, Ark., native paced all of FCS football in combined kick return yardage. Holliman's 1,049 kickoff return yards eclipsed Todd Speight's (Western Illinois) MVFC record, set in 2009. Last fall, Holliman logged 869 kickoff return yards, and enters his final collegiate campaign needing just 474 additional yards to match Tony Gilbert's career MSU record (2,446) for kickoff return yards.

STRENGTH OF SCHEDULE

Missouri State can once again make a valid claim as having one of the toughest schedules in the Division I FCS ranks this fall. Based on STATS' preseason FCS Poll, the Bears are slated to meet seven of the top 25 teams in the nation, in addition to their season opener against Mizzou, a perennial bowl contender in the FBS ranks.

All eight of the Bears' MVFC foes entered the season either ranked in the top 25 or receiving votes from the STATS voters. Over the last three seasons, MSU has squared off against a total of 18 ranked opponents. In fact, the Bears have played no fewer than three ranked opponents in any of the last 12 seasons. MSU has taken on a total of 38 top 25 clubs in the last seven seasons alone and brings a record of 22-88 against ranked FCS foes into the 2017 campaign.

LEADING THE SLEUTH

The Missouri State players have elected four co-captains to represent them throughout the 2017 season. Senior **Colby Isbell** and junior **Jared Beshore** will represent the defense as captain, while seniors **Malik Earl** and **Erik Furmanek** will lead the offense this fall.

EARL, FURMANEK FIRE AERIAL ATTACK

Senior tight end **Erik Furmanek** and senior receiver **Malik Earl** registered big season openers for MSU, combining for 254 of the Bears' 353 receiving yards at Mizzou. The duo returns to fuel the Bears' passing attack after emerging as legitimate offensive threats in 2016. Furmanek broke through during the second half of the season with 23 of his 27 overall receptions coming during conference play. The Belleville, Ill., native was MSU's second-leading receiver during league play, averaging just under three grabs and 23.6 yards per outing. For the season, Furmanek's 24 receptions marked the most for a Bears tight end since the 2012 season, when Matt Thayer reeled in 38 passes for 294 yards.

Earl hauled in a team-high 41 receptions for 534 yards and three touchdowns for MSU in 2016 to earn honorable mention All-MVFC recognition. He recorded 29 receptions for 407 yards in MVFC play, ranking fifth among all Valley receivers in receptions per game (4.7) and seventh in receiving yards (58.1 ypg.).

BEARS OUT TO PROVE POLLSTERS WRONG

The Missouri Valley Football Conference pollsters tabbed the Bears for ninth place in the league's annual preseason poll. North Dakota State earned the top spot with 380 total points, edging South Dakota State (379) by the narrowest of margins after picking up 21 of the 40 first-place votes. FCS national runner-up Youngstown State grabbed the No. 3 spot with 290 votes, followed by UNI (255) in the fourth position. Illinois State (246) was tabbed for the No. 5 slot and Western Illinois (188) came in sixth. South Dakota (182) and Southern Illinois (132) were slotted for seventh and eighth, while MSU (81) and Indiana State (67) rounded out the poll.

COLE EARNS SPOT ON TEXANS' 53-MAN ROSTER

Former Bear linebacker **Dylan Cole** became the most-recent Missouri State product to earn a spot on a National Football League roster this past weekend when the Houston Texans announced the free agent signee as a member of the club's initial 53-man roster.

A consensus first-team FCS All-America selection as a senior, Cole averaged 12.9 tackles per game in 2016 to lead all FCS players. The Rogersville, Mo., product recorded at least 13 tackles in nine different games as a senior, including 19 in the Bears' win over Southern Illinois. The All-MVFC first-team selection racked up 85 solo tackles, eight tackles for loss, two interceptions, four pass breakups and three forced fumbles.

Cole finished third in the 2016 Buck Buchanan Award voting as the top defensive player in the FCS ranks, played in the NFLPA Collegiate Bowl and earned CoSIDA Academic All-District honors as well as MVFC Scholar-Athlete Team laurels. He capped his career with 457 tackles in 46 games—all starts—finishing third on the Bears' career tackles chart and ninth all-time in Missouri Valley Football Conference history.

BEARS IN THE NFL

MSU's history of producing pro football talent dates back to 1945 and extends to today with two NFL Draft selections in recent years—**Clay Harbor** to the Philadelphia Eagles in 2010 and **David Arkin** to the Cowboys in 2011. Eight additional Bears have earned undrafted free agent contracts over the last seven years with **Dylan Cole** signing with the Houston Texans immediately after the 2017 Draft; **Gannon Sinclair** signing with the Arizona Cardinals in 2015; 2014 signee **Anthony Grady** (Jets); 2013 addition **Randy Richards** (Chargers); 2011 professionals **Jermaine Saffold** (Browns) and **Chris Douglas** (Bills); and 2010 rookies **Kolby Hurt** (Saints) and **Jake Duron** (Jets).

CLEARING 100K

The Bears played before a total of 134,089 fans last fall, marking the 12th consecutive season MSU topped the 125K annual attendance mark. MSU drew 50,485 fans in its five home dates at Plaster Stadium, good for the No. 27 per-game average (10,097) in the FCS ranks last year. The Bears have finished among the top 50 FCS schools in average home attendance in each of the last 22 seasons dating back to 1995.

MSU played in front of a total of 165,806 spectators in 2015, marking the fifth-highest combined home and road season attendance figure in program history. The Bears have played before more than 100,000 fans in each of the last 28 seasons, including a school-record 234,314 spectators in 2011.

MISSOURI STATE ON THE RISE

With a record Fall 2016 enrollment of 26,000, Missouri State University is the largest school in the Missouri Valley Football Conference (and the Missouri Valley Conference), as well as the second-largest institution in the state of Missouri. The Bears moved to NCAA Division I status for the 1982-83 season and joined the Missouri Valley Football Conference (formerly the Gateway Conference) in 1985 where they have been a member ever since. MSU is a member of the Missouri Valley Conference in 13 other sports—a league founded in 1907 and the second-oldest Division I conference in the nation.

Overall, Missouri State teams have made 58 NCAA Tournament appearances as a Division I institution, including 14 in women's basketball, 12 in volleyball, 10 in baseball and six in both men's basketball and softball and three in men's soccer and women's golf.

COLUMBIA, Mo. -- Despite a standout performance from an offense that totaled 492 yards, Missouri State came up on the short end of a 72-43 opening day shootout against Missouri at Faurot Field.

MSU enjoyed a strong debut from quarterback Peyton Huslig, who completed 24-of-35 passes for 353 yards—the best single-game total by a Bears quarterback in five years—and a pair of touchdown passes. Malik Earl turned in a career-high 163 receiving yards on eight catches, and Calan Crowder led the Bears' ground attack with 124 yards and two early touchdown runs.

But it would be the Tigers offense that turned the tide behind the passing of Lock, a 202-yard rushing day from Damarea Crockett and a pair of 100-yard receiving performances by Johnathan Johnson and J'Mon Moore. Lock, who set Missouri single-game records with 521 yards and seven touchdown passes, threw for four go-ahead touchdowns in the opening half, including a 28-yard strike to Johnson and a pair of scoring throws to Moore to put the Tigers in front for good.

In all, the Tiger offense piled up 815 yards of total offense and a Missouri State opponent record 35 first downs in the first meeting of the two Show-Me State institutions in varsity action since 1923.

After waiting 94 years for their chance to take on their in-state FBS rival, the Bears wasted no time in putting their offense into high gear. The two teams traded the lead a total of 11 times in the opening half, combining for 83 points and 888 yards of total offense over the first 30 minutes.

Led by Lock's 393 passing yards and five TD passes, the Tigers would average 13.0 yards per play en route to rolling up 508 yards of offense in the first half. Lock connected with Moore on a 35-yard completion to spark another quick scoring drive for the Tigers, who would use only two plays to reach the endzone this time. Crockett carried it in for an eight-yard touchdown to put MU back on top, but Crowder answered with the first of his two TD runs 23 seconds later for a 14-13 MSU edge.

Crowder, who rushed for 121 yards on eight first-half carries, broke free for another long scoring run in the closing moments of the first period. The senior's 34-yard rush gave MSU a 21-20 lead, before a 64-yard completion to Erik Furmanek set up Nick Masoner's first rushing touchdown as a Bear at the 9:16 mark of the second quarter.

After Huslig found a wide-open Earl over the middle for an 89-yard TD toss late in the first half, Lock and Moore teamed up on their second 50-yard scoring pass of the game to give MU the lead for good.

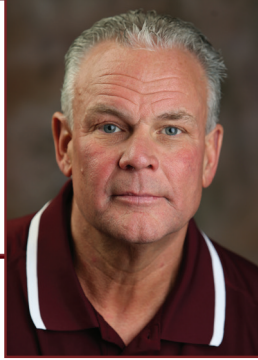

Dave Steckel

Third season at MSU



On Dec. 14, 2014, MSU Director of Athletics Kyle Moats and President Clif M. Smart III announced the hire of University of Missouri associate head coach/defensive coordinator **Dave Steckel** as Missouri State's 20th head football coach.

In his first two years leading the MSU program, Steckel and his talented staff set about the task of overhauling a young Bears squad, heavily emphasizing the fundamental aspects of the game. Capitalizing on a renewed enthusiasm surrounding the MSU program, Steckel laid the groundwork for enhancing relations with area high school coaches, engaging the community and raising the bar with his "Bear Up" mentality. The efforts paid off at the gate, as the Bears have drawn an average of 10,067 fans per game over the last two seasons.

On the field, the Bears engineered a three-win turnaround from the 2015 campaign last fall, bolting from the gate with wins in three of their first four games, including victories in their first two road contests against FCS competition.

MSU knocked off No. 24 Indiana State in Terre Haute in its 2016 Valley opener, handing the Bears their first victory over a ranked foe since Oct. 19, 2013 (vs. No. 15 South Dakota State) and the program's first win vs. a Top 25 squad on the road since an Oct. 20, 2012 decision over No. 11 Illinois State in Normal. The win also represented the largest margin of victory against a ranked road foe in the 105-year history of the program.

Individually, seven Bears garnered All-MVFC recognition, led by repeat first-teamers Dylan Cole and Deion Holliman. Cole was a unanimous first-team All-America selection and finished third in the balloting for the Buck Buchanan Award, completing his four-year MSU career as the FCS's leading tackler with an average of 12.9 stops per game. Cole became the latest Bear to receive a shot at earning an NFL roster spot in late April when Houston signed the linebacker to a free agent deal.

Steckel brings 35 years of coaching experience into the 2017 season, including 14 seasons at Mizzou, in which he helped transform the Tigers defense into one of the strongest units in the nation. He was the only defensive coach among the five finalists for the 2014 Frank Broyles Award as the nation's top assistant coach. He helped produce a total of 15 all-conference linebacker selections at MU, including a number of players who have forged professional careers in the NFL.

Under Steckel's tutelage, Missouri's defense was a driving force in the Tigers' back-to-back Southeastern Conference East Division titles in 2013 and 2014. MU led the SEC and ranked 10th nationally in sacks per game in 2014. The Tiger defense finished first or second in every major statistical category in SEC play that year en route to propelling Mizzou to its fifth conference divisional championship in eight seasons.

MU also ranked 23rd in the country in total defense and 19th in scoring defense in 2014, while the Tigers led the SEC in total defense (300.8 yds/game).

In 2013, the MU defense was fifth nationally in interceptions (20), eighth in total turnovers forced (32), and an SEC-best 2.93 sacks per game. This boosted the Tigers to a 12-win season and a Cotton Bowl victory over Oklahoma State.

Individually, "Stec" currently has 10 different Mizzou defenders playing in the NFL, including five who have garnered All-America recognition since his elevation to defensive coordinator in 2009. Most recently, Shane Ray became the second Tiger in as many years to be named SEC Defensive Player of the Year after breaking the program's single-season record for sacks (14.0) in 2014. Michael Sam earned the same honor in 2013. Aldon Smith picked up Big 12 Conference Defensive Newcomer of the Year in 2009, which helped kickstart Mizzou's reputation as "DLine U."

Overall, Steckel helped coach Missouri to 10 bowl appearances during his tenure in Columbia, including five seasons with 10 or more wins. The Tigers compiled a 112-66 (.629) overall record in his 14 seasons, while their five divisional titles since 2007 tied Alabama and Florida State for the top total in the NCAA Division I FBS ranks during that stretch.

One of the Tigers' top recruiters, Steckel helped stock Mizzou's roster with numerous standout performers while overseeing the program's recruiting efforts in the fertile prep gridiron grounds of Texas. Steckel joined Gary Pinkel's coaching staff at MU in 2001 after spending five seasons as a defensive line and linebackers coach at Rutgers University.

Prior to joining head coach Terry Shea's Rutgers staff, Steckel worked with Pinkel at Toledo for four years, highlighted by the Rockets' undefeated 1995 season that included a Mid-American Conference title and a No. 24 final ranking. He tutored six All-MAC selections as UT's defensive line coach, including Dan Williams, who was picked 11th overall by Denver in the 1993 NFL Draft.

A Fullerton, Pa., native, Steckel served as assistant head coach and offensive coordinator at Dickinson College from 1986-87 and made a stop at Lehigh before heading to Toledo. He broke into the coaching ranks with stops at Miami (Ohio), Ball State and Minnesota.

Steckel is the younger brother of longtime NFL coach Les Steckel. He served in the United States Marine Corps from 1975-78 and played four seasons as an offensive lineman at Kutztown University, where he graduated with a bachelor's degree in elementary education in 1982. Steckel also earned a master's degree from Miami (Ohio).

Steckel and his wife, Mary Beth, have a daughter, Amanda.
