CHALLENGING ROAD TEST WITH INDIANA STATE AWAITS BEARS SATURDAY

...... 3-8/2-6 (t-8th)

THE GAME

The Missouri State Bears will look to bounce back from their first conference loss of the season Saturday (Oct. 13), when they conclude a two-game road swing with a trip to Terre Haute, Ind., for a 1 p.m. (CDT) Missouri Valley Football Conference contest with the Indiana State Sycamores at Memorial Stadium.

Saturday's game will be broadcast live on ESPN+, with Michael Winstead and Patrick Walsh describing the action. The game will also be carried on the Missouri State Radio Network, as Art Hains and Dennis Heim will once again have the call.

- · Despite seeing their three-game win streak end with a 35-28 road loss to South Dakota last Saturday, the Bears received 68 votes in this week's STATS FCS Top 25 balloting and four votes in the AFCA Coaches Poll.
- · The Bears are yielding just 152.0 rushing yards per game during MVFC play.
- MSU has averaged 436.0 yards of total offense during league play, with Peyton Huslig topping the 200-yard passing mark in each of the Bears' two conference
- Huslig ranks second among all Valley players in total offense (329.0 ypg.) during conference play, while Damoriea Vick and Tyler Currie share the No. 3
- positon in receptions (5.5 rpg.). The Bears have averaged 455.0 yards of total offense over their last four games, while allowing just 131.5 rushing yards per outing.

SERIES NOTES

- The Bears and Sycamores have met 32 previous times since 1986, with MSU holding a 19-13 edge.
- ISU is 9-7 against the Bears in Terre Haute, but MSU claimed a 45-24 victory over the Sycamores in their last trip to Memorial Stadium in 2016.
- · Large margins have been the norm in the series recently, with four of the last five contests ending in 21-point spreads or greater.
- The Bears have averaged 29.8 points per outing in the series, and have topped the 30-point mark in nine of their last 10 wins over ISU.

THE BEARS

The Bears (3-2, 1-1 MVFC) return 36 letterwinners and 15 total starters from last year's 3-8 squad.

- MSU's defense, which welcomed back nine starters, is led by first-team preseason All-MVFC pick **Angelo** Garbutt and second-team choice Darius Joseph.
- McNeece Egbim paces the Bears with 46 tackles through the first five contests, while Matt McClellan shares the MVFC lead in sacks (6).
- MSU ranks second overall in the MVFC in both sacks and sacks allowed: the Bears defense has recorded 16 sacks on the season, while the MSU offensive line has permitted just six.
- With 374 yards of offense against USD Saturday, Peyton Huslig (3,590) moved up to ninth on the Bears' all-time list for total offense and is 23 yards behind Derek Jensen in the No. 8 position on the chart.

THE SYCAMORES

- Indiana State (2-3, 0-2 MVFC) is coming off a 54-51 overtime loss at No. 2 South Dakota State last weekend; the Sycamores trailed by 18 points entering the fourth quarter, but racked up 569 yards of total offense in the loss.
- ISU received big performances from running back Ja'Quan Keys and receiver Rontrez Morgan at SDSU; Keys rushed for 159 yards and a pair of touchdowns, while Morgan reeled in nine catches for 155 yards and two TD's.
- The Sycamores are averaging 32.4 points per outing behind a ground attack that ranks second in the MVFC (258.4 ypg.).

LAST TIME OUT

Missouri State dropped its first MVFC contest of the season with its 35-28 road setback to South Dakota in Vermillion.

- The offenses combined for 991 yards, as Austin Simmons found Levi Falck open for a 40-yard touchdown strike early in the fourth quarter to hand the Coyotes the lead for good.
- The Bears registered 478 yards of total offense, led by Peyton Huslig's big day that included 283 passing yards and a team-high 91 rushing yards; Huslig topped the 200-yard passing mark for the sixth time in his 16game career with MSU, including the second in a row.
- Tyler Currie enjoyed a career day for MSU, hauling in seven catches for 113 yards and a score.
- MSU's 283 passing yards mark the most for the Bears since their 59-20 win over Indiana State on Oct. 27, 2017
- Matt McClellan recorded a pair of sacks, while Mc-Neece Egbim's season-high 14 stops led all tacklers
- Egbim eached double digits in tackles for the second time this season and has half of the club's four 10-plus tackle efforts (Garbutt and Kam Carter).

THE JURY ON CURRIE

Junior receiver **Tyler Currie**, who had just seven receptions all last season, snagged seven passes for a career-best 113 yards and a TD at South Dakota last week. The Bears' breakthrough wideout has tallied 11 catches in MSU's last two ball games, and ranks third among all MVFC receivers in receptions per game (5.5) during league action.

MAROON AND WHITE SPECIAL

MSU special teams have been a consistent force for the Bears during the **Dave Steckel** era, with the Bears ranking among the top five among all MVFC units in both punt average and punt return average each of the last three seasons

The 2018 campaign has been no different, as Missouri State entered the week ranked fifth nationally in both net punting (41.30) and punt return defense (-0.38). Missouri State's **Brendan Withrow** ranks 31st nationally in punting average with 42.0 yards per attempt, including eight of his 23 attempts downed inside the 20. Furthermore, the Bears' kickoff return unit has averaged 24.43 yards per attempt, which is good for 24th nationally.

Last fall, MSU ranked second in punt return average (13.0), and fourth in net punt average (37.5), thanks to the leg of Withrow, who ranked 35th nationally with an average of 41.0 yards per punt. Additionally, the Bears kickoff return unit averaged 22.2 yards per return to rank third in The Valley, behind MSU all-time return leader Deion Holliman's third-consecutive All-MVFC caliber performance.

SECOND-QUARTER SURGE

The Bears continue to dominate the second quarter, having outscored their opponents by a 62-9 margin in the 15 minutes before halftime this season. Missouri State has also converted 12-of-21 third downs in the second quarter, by far the team's most productive period, which translates to a 57.1 percent success rate before the intermission

In particular, the Bears' 28 points in the second quarter against Lincoln (Sept. 6) matched the program record for offensive production in the second period, previously set on Sept. 9, 2006 vs. Southwest Baptist. The Bears posted 150 yards of total offense in the quarter to go with eight first downs and a conversion on their only third down of the period. MSU's high-scoring quarter featured three rushing TD's — two by Jason Randall — and a 27-yard fumble recovery by Darius Joseph.

LIMITED LAUNDRY

After ranking in the top 10 nationally last season in fewest penalties (7th) and fewest penalty yards (9th), the Bears have continued that trend into the 2018 campaign. Coach **Dave Steckel's** troops have committed just 4.2 penalties per game this year, which ranks seventh nationally. Additionally, the Bears' 36.6 penalty yards per game ranks eighth among all FCS squads.

SCORING IN BUNCHES

The Bears' 133 points through four games (33.25 ppg.) was the club's highest four-game scoring total since 2010. That total represented an improvement of 13.25 points per game from its 2017 total through the first four games of the season.

MSU ranks sixth in the MVFC in scoring offense, as well as sixth in rushing offense (188.2 ypg.). **Peyton Huslig** ranks fourth among all Valley players in total offense (272.4), while freshman kicker **Parker Lacina** is fifth in the league in scoring (7.0 ppg.). Additionally, Huslig and **Jason Randall** share the fifth spot in the league race for rushing touchdowns with five apiece.

KEY DOWN SHAKE DOWN

Over the course of their three-game win streak, the Bears held the opposition to a 25.6 percent conversion rate on third down. In weeks 2-4, Missouri State foes were a combined 11-for-43 on third down opportunities, allowing just three third-down conversions apiece to ranked opponents (Northern Arizona and Illinois State). Conversely, the Bears offense was 15-for-34 — 41.2 percent — on third down in that span.

JOSEPH HONORED BY VALLEY

Darius Joseph became the second Bear in as many weeks to earn MVFC Defensive Player of the Week honors on Oct. 1, when the junior cornerback was recognized as a co-recipient of the award by the league office.

The Oklahoma City native finished the game with a season-high eight total tackles and six solo stops in his 19th career start. Joseph is the third MSU player to earn Valley weekly honors this season, joining **Marquis Prophete** (Offensive Lineman of the Week on Sept. 10) and **Tyler Lovelace** (Defensive Player of the Week on Sept. 17).

DOING IT WITH DEFENSE

Missouri State forced six Northern Arizona (Sept. 15) turnovers and held the Lumberjacks to 3-of-15 on third down in the club's first home win over a ranked opponent since 2013. The six takeaways represented the most by a Bears defense since an Oct. 27, 2007 home victory over Indiana State. The defensive surge also saw MSU break up six passes and tally 5.0 tackles for loss in the rout, grabbing three interceptions and 2.0 sacks as well.

BEARS STRONG IN NON-CON

Missouri State's win over Northern Arizona saw the Bears continued a recent surge in the non-conference season. MSU has enjoyed a history of success in non-conference play at home since joining the Division I ranks in 1982, going 58-20 overall against non-league foes at Plaster.

The Bears will take a six-game home win streak versus non-conference opponents into the 2019 season, including shutout wins in two of those outings. MSU has out-scored its last six home non-league opponents by a combined 236-66 margin. The Bears have now logged at least one non-conference home win in 28 of their last 32 seasons dating back to 1987.

HUSLIG HAULS THE ROCK

After just 16 games as MSU's starting quarterback, junior **Peyton Huslig** is just 36 yards away from 4,000 career yards of total offense. He would become just the eighth Missouri State player to reach that milestone and first since Kierra Harris (2014). The Bears' signal-caller is also just 61 yards shy of 1,000 career rushing yards. He posted his sixth career 200-yard passing game (283) at South Dakota last weekend.

Huslig passed for 232 yards in the Bears' win over No. 9 Illinois State (Sept. 29). This past week, he moved into the top 10 on the Bears' career passing yardage chart (3,025), after cracking MSU's all-time top 10 for total offense (3,964) the previous week.

In addition to his 235-yard passing day against LU, Huslig rushed for 109 yards in MSU's season opener at No. 25 Oklahoma State (Aug. 30), marking his fourth career 100-yard rushing game with the Bears. Huslig accounted for 259 of MSU's 260 yards of total offense against the Cowboys and threaded two TD passes through the OSU defense. Only former Bear DeAndre Smith (1987-90), with six 100-yard rushing games, has more than Huslig from the QB position.

The Andover, Kan., product registered three 100-yard rushing games and three 200-yard passing performances last fall, making him the first MSU quarterback to accomplish that feat in the same season.

BEARS OUT TO PROVE POLLSTERS WRONG

The Missouri Valley Football Conference pollsters tabbed the Bears for ninth place in the league's annual preseason poll. North Dakota State earned the top spot with 390 total points, edging South Dakota State (340) after picking up all 39 first-place votes. FCS national runner-up UNI (270) finished third, just ahead of Youngstown State (258) in the fourth position. Illinois State (248) was tabbed for the No. 5 slot and South Dakota (206) came in sixth. Western Illinois (163) and Southern Illinois (139) were slotted for seventh and eighth, while MSU (90) and Indiana State (41) rounded out the poll.

The MVFC's preseason favorite has claimed the league crown 20 times in 32 previous seasons a poll has been conducted. Valley Football is celebrating its 34th season in 2018, with eight collective FCS national championships to its credit.

LEADING THE SLEUTH

A pair of MSU junior standouts will join two senior teammates to represent the Bears football program as team captains for the 2018 season. The quartet includes junior quarterback **Peyton Huslig**, and junior linebacker **McNeece Egbim**, along with senior offensive lineman **Jordan Turner** and senior safety **Jared Beshore**.

WELCOME TO THE PARTY

Missouri State's cause will receive a boost by an influx of talent in 2018, with 42 newcomers adorning the Bears' roster this fall. Head coach **Dave Steckel** and his staff welcomed 24 freshmen, as well as 18 transfers to campus at the start of fall camp. MSU saw an immediate impact from its decorated group of newcomers, as 18 newcomers saw game action at Oklahoma State, including starters **Mauricio Chio** and **Kylin Washington**.

MSU's talented crop of newcomers will be aiming to continue a tradition of excellence displayed by Bear rookies over the last two decades. In the history of the Missouri Valley Football Conference, only Western Illinois (82) and Illinois State (82) have produced more MVFC All-Newcomer selections than the Bears, who have collected 79 such honors.

Valley Football on ESPN

The Missouri Valley Football Conference will have more than 50 events on ESPN's networks during the 2018 season, Commissioner Patty Viverito has announced. The Conference will produce eight league games as part of its 2018 Game of the Week package, with each streaming live on Valley Football on ESPN. As part of the Missouri Valley Conference's media rights agreement with ESPN, each of the Bears' 11 games in 2018 are scheduled to be broadcast, including all eight MVFC games on ESPN3 or ESPN4.

The league's digital initiative is available through the redesigned ESPN App and features live-event programming on both ESPN3 and ESPN+. The new ESPN App gives fans a premier, all-in-one digital access point for everything ESPN offers — 1) news, scores, highlights and audio, 2) TV Everywhere' streaming video and 3) ESPN+. The league's digital endeavor is part of its 10-year agreement with ESPN which runs through the 2023-24 academic year.

SEVEN BEARS EARN PRESEASON HONORS

Missouri State standouts **Angelo Garbutt, Marquis Prophete** and **Darius Joseph** were all recognized by the Missouri Valley Football Conference with Preseason All-MVFC honors, as selected by a panel of league coaches, media and communications personnel.

Garbutt, a junior linebacker from Carrollton, Texas, was a first-team All-MVFC preseason pick, while Prophete and Joseph were second-team selections. Both Joseph, Prophete, and returning starting quarterback **Peyton Huslig**, were honorable mention All-MVFC performers in 2017

Additionally, four more Bears earned preseason All-MVFC laurels from Phil Steele's annual football preview. Prophete was the lone MSU first-team selection. Long snapper Chandler Collins joined Garbutt on the publication's list of second-team honorees, while offensive lineman Aaron Clardy, defensive back Zack Sanders and wide receiver Lorenzo Thomas joined Egbim as third-team selections.

COLE EARNS SPOT ON TEXANS ROSTER

Former Bear linebacker **Dylan Cole** became the most-recent Missouri State product to earn a spot on a National Football League roster last September, when the Houston Texans announced the free agent signee as a member of the club's initial 53-man roster. In his first season as a pro, Cole appeared in 12 games for the Texas, logging 32 tackles, 1.0 sack and a pair of interceptions.

A consensus first-team FCS All-America selection for the Bears as a senior, Cole averaged 12.9 tackles per game in 2016 to lead all FCS players. The Rogersville, Mo., product recorded at least 13 tackles in nine different games as a senior, including 19 in the Bears' win over Southern Illinois.

The All-MVFC first-team selection racked up 85 solo tackles, eight tackles for loss, two interceptions, four pass breakups and three forced fumbles. Cole finished third in the 2016 Buck Buchanan Award voting as the top defensive player in the FCS ranks, played in the NFLPA Collegiate Bowl and earned CoSIDA Academic All-District honors as well as MVFC Scholar-Athlete Team laurels. He capped his career with 457 tackles in 46 games — all starts — finishing third on the Bears' career tackles chart and ninth all-time in MVFC history.

BEARS IN THE NFL

MSU's history of producing pro football talent dates back to 1945 and extends to the present day with two NFL Draft selections in recent years — Clay Harbor to the Philadelphia Eagles in 2010 and David Arkin to the Cowboys in 2011.

Ten additional Bears have earned undrafted free agent contracts over the last eight years with Malik Earl joining the Cowboys this past spring; Dylan Cole signing with the Houston Texans and Riley Shantz signing with Green Bay immediately after the 2017 Draft; Gannon Sinclair signing with the Arizona Cardinals in 2015; 2014 signee Anthony Grady (Jets); 2013 addition Randy Richards (Chargers); 2011 professionals Jermaine Saffold (Browns) and Chris Douglas (Bills); and 2010 rookies Kolby Hurt (Saints) and Jake Duron (Jets).

Likewise, many Bears in recent years have enjoyed extended careers in the Arena Football League and Indoor Football League (IFL), including Duron, **Cody Kirby** and **Tevan Ferguson**. **Steve Watson** appeared in Arena Bowl XXII in 2008 for the San Jose SaberCats. A two-time All-MVFC standout (2003-04), Watson posted 238 tackles in 31 games at MSU and also played for the Columbus Destroyers and Tulsa Talons.

Brad St. Louis played 10 seasons with the Cincinnati Bengals from 2000-09. He starred for MSU at tight end from 1996-99 and played in both the East-West Shrine Game and Hula Bowl after his senior season prior to being drafted by the Bengals. He operated as the Bengals' regular long snapper seven seasons with additional work at tight end.

Former Bear **Jason Whittle** played 11 NFL seasons from 1998-2008. He signed a free agent contract in the 2003 off-season with then-Super Bowl champion Tampa Bay after five years with the New York Giants. He returned to the Giants in 2004 and moved to the Minnesota Vikings for the 2006 campaign before joining the Bills in 2007. A standout lineman at MSU from 1994-97, Whittle signed a free agent contract with the Giants in 1998. He became the first MSU Bear to appear in the NFL title game when he saw action in the 2001 Super Bowl with the Giants.

PACKING THEM IN

The newly-renovated Robert W. Plaster Stadium has hosted three of the top nine home crowds in Missouri State football history, as well as an overall average of nearly 10,100 fans per home contest over the last four seasons. In 2016, MSU registered its third-consecutive season drawing at least 50,000 spectators at home and ranked among the nation's top 30 FCS programs in average home attendance for the third consecutive year after the facility opened to rave reviews in 2014. The Bears drew 58,324 fans through the turnstiles in their five home games that season, an average of 11,665 per contest — good for 18th nationally. The club's net total attendance in 2014 marked its best in five-game home schedule since 1996 and the top season figure overall since 2007.

A record-drawing crowd of 18,386 witnessed Missouri State's 38-0 victory over North Dakota (Sept. 13) in its 2014 home opener. The standing-room-only crowd translated to 105 percent of the stadium's new capacity and represented the top home crowd in Bears' history, surpassing the previous 17-year-old record of 16,672, established Aug. 28, 1997 vs. Pittsburg State. The opening-night attendance also equaled the 26th-largest crowd — home or away — to see a Missouri State football game.

#INIT2WINIT

For just the fifth time since joining the Missouri Valley Conference in 1990, Missouri State captured the league's coveted All-Sports Championship Trophy in 2017-18.

The trophy standings are calculated based on how each school finishes in the league's 17 sponsored championship sports. MSU sponsors 14 of those championship sports and finished with a score of 7.895, nearly a point higher than second-place Southern Illinois (6.931). The Bears won MVC regular-season titles in men's soccer, volleyball and baseball during the 2017-18 season and also won MVC Tournament/MVC Championship Meet crowns in women's soccer, volleyball, women's swimming and diving, women's golf, women's tennis and baseball.

Last year's trophy run is Missouri State's first since winning the award in 2011-12. The Bears have also earned the MVC All-Sports Trophy in 1999-2000, 2001-02 and 2002-03. Since 1995, only three schools — Missouri State, Illinois State and former member Wichita State — have won the award.

STRENGTH OF SCHEDULE

Missouri State can once again make a valid claim as having one of the toughest schedules in the Division I FCS ranks this fall. Based on STATS' preseason FCS Poll, the Bears are slated to meet seven teams ranked among the top 25 or receiving votes in the poll, in addition to their season opener against FBS power Oklahoma State, which garnered the No. 25 spot in the preseason USA Today Coaches Poll.

Seven of the Bears' eight MVFC foes entered the season either ranked in the top 25 or receiving votes from the STATS voters. Since the start of the 2014 season, MSU has squared off against a total of 27 ranked opponents. In fact, the Bears have played no fewer than three ranked opponents in any of the last 13 seasons.

Six MVFC teams rank among the Top 25 in the FCS for toughest schedules (based on cumulative opposition) this week, including MSU at No. 21. UNI leads the league and is ranked No. 4 overall.

STILLWATER, Okla. -- Oklahoma State built an early 31-point cushion before withstanding a valiant second-half charge from Missouri State to post a 58-17 victory over the Bears at Boone Pickens Stadium. OSU (1-0), which recorded eight different scoring drives covering 67 yards or more in the contest, led 31-0

late in the first half before the Bears scored 17 of the next 24 points to cut their deficit to 21 points. Bears quarterback Peyton Huslig totaled 109 yards on the ground and threw for 150 yards and a pair of touchdowns to help spark the surge, before the No. 25 Cowboys pulled away by scoring the final 20 points of the game.

Keyed by a pair of 100-yard rushing performances and five touchdown passes from senior quarterback Taylor Cornelius, Oklahoma State amassed 732 yards of total offense in their 24th straight win in a home opener. The Cowboys scored on each of their first four offensive possessions, outgaining the Bears by a 280-9 margin in first-quarter total offense.

Justice Hill, who punctuated the early onslaught with a 92-yard rush in the closing moments of the open-ing period, registered the 15th 100-yard rushing game of his OSU career, carrying the ball 10 times for 122 yards—all in the first quarter. He was joined in the century club by LD Brown, who racked up 115 yards on the ground, including a late 77-yard scoring run.

OSU set the tone for the night on its first drive, marching 75 yards in just 2:36 behind a run game that nicked the Bears for 53 yards on seven attempts. After Cornelius connected with Hill on a 22-yard completion, then broke free for a 32-yard scamper of his own to move the Cowboys within striking distance, Hill capped

the drive with a three-yard run to make it a 7-0 game.

A pair of third-down sacks by the Cowboy defense thwarted the Bears' first two offensive possessions, and the OSU offense cashed in for two more scoring drives to stretch the margin to 17 points. Cornelius completed 4-of-5 passes for 42 total yards on a 14-play drive that ended with a 20-yard Matt Ammendola field goal with 5:25 left in the first. Next, Jalen McCleskey punctuated another long OSU drive—this one covering 70 yards in just 1:53—taking it in from five yards out on a third-and-goal attempt, after a pair of Cornelius completions to

Landon Wolf and a personal foul against the Bears moved the Cowboys into the red zone once again.

Missouri State punter Brendan Withrow provided an early highlight with his third career boot of 60 yards or more, pinning the Cowboys on their own 5-yard line with 1:22 left on the clock. But on the next play from scrimmage, Hill escaped traffic and sprinted all the way to the MSU 2 for the third-longest rush by a Bears opponent in the 107-year history of the MSU program.

Cornelius's three-yard pass to Sione Finefeuiaki on the first play of the second quarter extended the Cowboys' lead, and the senior signal-caller hooked up with Tylan Wallace at the 6:37 mark to finish off an 80-yard drive to push the margin to 31-0.

SPRINGFIELD, Mo. -- Missouri State overcame an early double-digit deficit behind a dominant second-quarter, reeling off 35 unanswered points en route to a 52-24 home-opening victory over Lincoln at Robert W. Plaster Stadium. The Bears defense paved the way to MSU's first victory of the season, putting points on the board with a fumble return for a score, while recording seven sacks and permitting just 59 rushing yards on

Peyton Huslig led the Bears' comeback, finishing his day with completions on his last 11 passing attempts as part of a 12-for-14, 235-yard performance. In all, three MSU quarterbacks combined for 330 passing yards, giving the Bears (1-1) their best single-game showing through the air since their 2017 season opener at Missouri. Additionally, the offense topped the 500-yard mark in total offense-tallying 177 yards on the ground-

and none of its eight scoring drives extended beyond the three-minute mark in duration.

McNeece Egbim led all tacklers with 10 stops, and seven different Bears recorded at least half a sack, paced by the first two sacks of Claudio Martin's MSU career.

After coughing up the football on each of their first three possessions of the day, the Bears responded in a big way to find the end zone on five straight drives to build a 25-point advantage. Lincoln (1-1) converted the three early turnovers into a 10-0 lead with 4:29 to play in the first period, but Huslig's 59-yard scoring toss to a

wide-open Nick Masoner opened the scoring floodgates for the Bears just 12 seconds later. Huslig would lead the Bears' offensive charge, starting a string of 13 overall consecutive completions for MSU signal-callers before completing his day late in the first half. The junior quarterback also gashed the Blue Tigers with his legs, capping a seven-play, 73-yard drive with a five-yard scoring run to hand the Bears their first lead of the day. Huslig completed six passes—three of which went to Aaron Denson for a total of 42 yards—on the drive, then connected with his first two throws of MSU's next possession to set up the first of two short Jason Randall TD runs

MSU's defense cashed in as well, as an Eric Johnson strip caused a Hosea Franklin fumble, and Darius Joseph scooped up the loose ball and raced 27 yards to pay dirt to push the margin to 28-10 with 7:00 to play in the half. The Bears sacked LU quarterback Henry Ogala six times for a total loss of 43 yards in the opening stanza, and allowed just 13 rushing yards on 22 attempts in the half.

Randall added his second one-yard TD run of the day to cap the first-half scoring with just under four minutes left on the clock.

Lincoln would finish the half with just 70 yards of total offense, but broke from intermission with a 77-yard

scoring drive that ended with a 15-yard pass from Ogala to Antonio Issac to stop the Bears' scoring run.

The Bears answered immediately, using a pair of long runs from Dalton Hill to set up Jeremiah Wilson's first rushing touchdown as a Bear that pushed the lead back to 25 points. Hill would finish the day as the Bears' leading rusher, carrying three times for 74 yards, in addition to completing 4-of-5 passes for 30 yards.

STILLWATER, Okla. – Missouri State rode a shutdown effort from its defense and a breakout performance from Jason Randall to extend its non-conference home win streak with a convincing 40-8 victory over No. 20 Northern Arizona at Robert W. Plaster Stadium.

Randall eclipsed a personal high with 181 rushing yards and two touchdowns on 20 carries for the second 100-yard rushing performance of his career, while the Bears defense forced six NAU turnovers and limited the Lumberjacks to 3-of-15 third-down conversions for the day. Jared Beshore led the charge for the home club with a season-best eight stops, to go along with a pair of pass break-ups and the fifth interception—one of three by the Missouri State defense—of his Bears career.

MSU's stout defensive effort included three fumbles and three interceptions for the afternoon, as the Bears

defense forced six turnovers in a single game for the first time since 2007, while holding the Lumberjack of-fense scoreless over its final 12 possessions of the contest.

In all, the Bears totaled 297 rushing yards and 441 yards of offense to improve to 2-1 for the second time under head coach Dave Steckel with their sixth consecutive non-conference home win. The victory gave the Bears their first win over a ranked opponent since a 45-24 road victory at Indiana State on Oct. 1, 2016, while

the 32-point final spread represented their second-largest margin of victory over a ranked foe.

Despite committing four first-half turnovers of their own, the Bears moved the ball at will throughout the first 30 minutes of the contest to build a 17-point halftime advantage. Behind a potent ground game that racked up 218 rushing yards on 25 carries, MSU totaled 334 yards of offense in the half, thanks in large part to a big effort by Randall. The senior matched his career-best rushing performance in just one half, carrying the ball 13 times for 139 yards and a pair of touchdowns, while quarterback Peyton Huslig added 45 rushing yards, including a late score on a fourth-and-goal try from the NAU 1 with just three seconds to play in the half. Freshman Jeremiah Wilson's 38-yard return on the opening kickoff set the tone for a dominant first-quarter performance by the Bears. MSU would need just three plays to put the first points of the game on the board, and Dandall balls for sec. 47 years described by the second to the points of the game on the board,

as Randall broke free on a 47-yard scoring run, just 1:12 into the contest.

The Bears weathered a dizzying stretch that saw the two defenses combine to force five turnovers on the next six offensive possessions, before Bridge-Gadd connected with Joe Logan on a 48-yard scoring toss to

next six offensive possessions, before Bridge-Gadd connected with Joe Logan on a 48-yard scoring toss to put NAU on the board with 13:46 to play in the half.

But the Bears put together an eight-play, 86-yard drive to swing the momentum, with Randall and Wilson breaking off runs of 28 and 27 yards, respectively. Randall's second TD—a three-yard run with 4:03 left on the clock—turned a four-point MSU lead into a 17-6 advantage. MSU's defense flexed its collective muscle once again after NAU drove to the Bears 41, forcing an incompletion on a fourth-down attempt.

After the break and stops by each defense, Stokes and the Lumberjacks endured a repeat of their first-half gaffe that led to Huslig's TD run. Withrow boomed a 53-yard punt that Stokes once again had trouble corralling at the NAU 10, and Nick Hessefort scooped up the fumble. Huslig and the Bears would need just one play to punch home the back-breaking touchdown this time, as the junior found Jordan Murray on a short pass, and the freshman tight end glided into the end zone to stretch the advantage to 30-6.

The Bears punctuated the victory with another punishing ground attack on a 72-yard drive early in the fourth quarter, using runs of 22 and 13 yards by Randall to set up another score. Donovan Daniels finished the job with a 17-yard touchdown rush for the first of his MSU career.

SPRINGFIELD, Mo. -- Missouri State answered a second-half surge from No. 9 Illinois State with 14 unanswered points and a last-second block of a game-tying field-goal attempt to finish off a 24-21 victory over the Redbirds in the Missouri Valley Football Conference opener for both clubs at Robert W. Plaster Stadium.

The Bears' second-straight victory over a ranked opponent—their first such two-game win streak since the 1989 season—came on the heels of a dominant first-half performance, followed by a big rally from the Redbirds in the third quarter. After Illinois State pulled to within three points on James Robinson's acrobatic catch and 43-yard run with 3:15 left in the game, the Redbirds manufactured one last scoring chance, only to see Eric Johnson come up with the game-clinching block on Sam Fenlason's 32-yard field goal try as the final seconds ticked away.

After being held scoreless on just 73 yards of total offense in the opening half, Illinois State scored on a pair of Brady Davis-to-Spencer Schnell scoring passes within a span of 2:40 early in the third period to put the Redbirds in front.

Missouri State responded, scoring the go-ahead touchdown on Donovan Daniels' five-yard run late in the third period, before stretching the margin to 24-14 when Jason Randall punched it home from a yard out with 7:56 left in regulation. MSU appeared to be in full command with just over five minutes left in the game, as Robinson was stopped short of the marker on a fourth-and-one call at the MSU 7, preserving the 10-point

But the Redbird defense came through with a quick stop, before Robinson took a swing pass and spun out of a tackle before beating several MSU defenders to the end zone to make it a one-possession game. The ISU defense delivered once again on the ensuing MSU drive, stopping the Bears on three successive

rushing attempts to force a Brendan Withrow punt. Robinson moved the chains with a 12-yard run on a third-and-10 call, before Davis hooked up with Schnell once again for a key 37-yard gain to the MSU 30. However, a facemask penalty on the Redbirds gave the Bears a reprieve and pushed the line of scrimmage back to the 45. With just 0:14 left on the clock, Davis found Robinson for an 18-yard completion to the Bears 15, bringing on Fenlason for a chance to even the score with four seconds to play.

But Johnson came through with the decisive block as time expired, handing the Bears a win over their highest-ranked opponent since a home decision over No. 6 UNI (also by a 24-21 score) on Oct. 8, 2005. The victory also gave Dave Steckel his first three-game win streak as MSU's head coach, and marked the first such streak for the Bears since winning four straight games five years ago (Oct. 19-Nov. 9, 2013)

In all, the MSU defense held ISU to 128 yards rushing and just 3-of-13 on third-down conversions for the afternoon. Additionally, the Bears kept Robinson--the Valley's second-leading rusher--in check with just 54 rushing yard on 13 carries. McNeece Egbim led the way, totaling nine stops, including a sack, while Darius Joseph added eight and Johnson and Matt McClellan teamed up to wreak havoc on the ISU offense. The duo combined for nine tackles, five quarterback hurries and two sacks, and Angelo Garbutt added six tackles and

VERMILLION, S.D. -- South Dakota rallied from a halftime deficit to hand No. 24 Missouri State its first MVFC setback of the season with a 35-28 decision over the Bears at the DakotaDome.

In a shootout that saw the two clubs combine for 991 yards of total offense, Austin Simmons found Levi Falck open for a 40-yard touchdown strike early in the fourth quarter to hand the Coyotes the lead for good. Despite surrendering 478 yards to the Bears offense, USD's defense slammed the door shut, allowing just one second-half MSU touchdown and coming up with a crucial goal-line stand late in the game to preserve the lead

Simmons completed 28-of-38 passes for 337 yards and the go-ahead touchdown to Falck, while USU

racked up 513 yards overall for the game in stopping the Bears' three-game win streak.

Alex Gray recorded 10 stops for USD, sharing leading tackler laurels with his twin brother, Andrew, who also forced a pair of fumbles, recorded an interception and broke up three passes for the game.

Bears quarterback Peyton Huslig accumulated 374 yards of offense, completing 21-of-42 passes for 283 yards, while rushing 18 times for 91 yards and two touchdowns. Tyler Currie enjoyed a career day for MSU, hauling in seven catches for 113 yards and a score.

The Bears took a 21-17 advantage into the locker room at halftime, seizing their first lead of the day on a Peyton Huslig-to-Antwan Woods 11-yard touchdown pass with 1:31 to play in the half. Moments earlier, Huslig connected with Damoriea Vick on a critical 22-yard toss on fourth and seven, setting the Bears up with a fresh set of downs at the USD 11.

Both offenses enjoyed productive starts to the game, combining for 566 yards in a half that featured two ties and three lead changes. South Dakota struck first with a three-yard Ben Klett run after marching 75 yards to

pay dirt in just under two minutes on its opening possession of the game.

The Bears responded immediately with a nine-play drive of their own, knotting the score at 7-7 when Huslig ran it in from 10 yards out with 9:02 to play in the opening period. After Klett put the home club back on top with a 19-yard run, Huslig and the Bears had an answer once again. This time, the junior quarterback broke free for a 32-yard scoring run that punctuated an 82-yard drive.

MSU's defense flexed its collective muscle on a key third-down stop at the Bears 2-yard line late in the half, as Angelo Garbutt and Jordan Wilkes teamed up to stuff a USD rush for a two-yard loss. Mason Lorber converted a 22-yard field goal try to put the Coyotes in the lead once again, but the Bears offense came through with another scoring drive inside the two-minute mark to swing the momentum. Huslig hooked up with Currie on a 31-yard completion to the USD 36, then found Vick deep in Coyote territory to set up Woods' go-ahead score.

HEAD COACH FOURTH SEASON AT MSU

On Dec. 14, 2014, MSU Director of Athletics Kyle Moats and President Clif M. Smart III announced the hire of former University of Missouri associate head coach and defensive coordinator **Dave Steckel** as Missouri State's 20th head football coach.

In his first three years leading the MSU program, Steckel and his talented staff set about the task of overhauling a young Bears squad, heavily emphasizing the fundamental aspects of the game. Capitalizing on a renewed enthusiasm surrounding the MSU program, Steckel laid the groundwork for enhancing relations with area high school coaches, engaging the community and raising the bar with his "Bear Up" mentality. The efforts paid off at the gate, as the Bears drew an average of 10,067 fans per game over the 2015-16 seasons.

Last year, the Bears registered dramatic signs of improvement, particularly on the offensive side of the football. MSU's ground attack, led by dual-threat quarterback Peyton Huslig, led the Missouri Valley Football Conference in rushing during league play throughout most of the Valley season. The Bears ultimately finished sixth overall in the MVFC in rushing yards per game (169.4 ypg.), posting a 32-percent increase in total rushing yards per outing from 2016.

The MSU special teams thrived once again, ranking among the Valley's top three units in kickoff return average, punt return average, punt average and field goals made per game.

On the field in 2016, the Bears engineered a

On the field in 2016, the Bears engineered a three-win turnaround from the previous fall, bolting from the gate with wins in three of their first four games, including victories in their first two road contests against FCS competition.

MSU knocked off No. 24 Indiana State in

MSU knocked off No. 24 Indiana State in Terre Haute in its 2016 Valley opener, handing the Bears their first victory over a ranked foe since Oct. 19, 2013 (vs. No. 15 South Dakota State) and the program's first win vs. a Top 25 squad on the road since an Oct. 20, 2012 decision over No. 11 Illinois State in Normal. The win also represented the largest margin of victory against a ranked road foe in the 105-year history of the program.

Individually, seven Bears garnered All-MVFC recognition, led by repeat first-teamers Dylan Cole and Deion Holliman. Cole was a unanimous first-team All-America selection and finished third in the balloting for the Buck Buchanan Award, completing his four-year Missouri State career as the FCS's leading tackler before signing a free agent deal with the NFL's Houston Texans in April.

Steckel brings 36 years of coaching experience into the 2018 season, including 14 seasons at Mizzou, in which he helped transform the Tigers defense into one of the strongest units in the nation. He was the only defensive coach among the five inalists for the 2014 Frank Broyles Award as the nation's top assistant coach. He helped produce a total of 15 all-conference linebacker selections at MU, including a number of players who have forged professional careers in the National Football League.

Under Steckel's tutelage, Missouri's defense was a driving force in the Tigers' back-to-back Southeastern Conference East Division titles in 2013 and 2014. MU led the SEC and ranked 10th nationally in sacks per game in 2014. The Tiger

defense finished first or second in every major statistical category in SEC play last fall en route to propelling Mizzou to its fifth conference divisional championship in eight seasons.

MU also ranked 23rd in the country in total defense and 19th in scoring defense in 2014, while the Tigers led the SEC in total defense (300.8 yds/

In 2013, the MU defense was fifth nationally in interceptions (20), eighth in total turnovers forced (32), and an SEC-best 2.93 sacks per game. This boosted the Tigers to a 12-win season and a Cotton Bowl victory over Oklahoma State.

Individually, "Stec" currently has 10 different Mizzou defenders playing in the NFL, including five who have garnered All-America recognition since his elevation to defensive coordinator in 2009. Most recently, Shane Ray became the second Tiger in as many years to be named SEC Defensive Player of the Year after breaking the program's single-season record for sacks (14.0) in 2014. Michael Sam earned the same honor in 2013. Aldon Smith picked up Big 12 Conference Defensive Newcomer of the Year in 2009, which helped kickstart Mizzou's reputation as "DLine U."

Overall, Steckel helped coach Missouri to 10 bowl appearances during his tenure in Columbia, including five seasons with 10 or more wins. The Tigers compiled a 112-66 (.629) overall record in his 14 seasons, while their five divisional titles since 2007 tied Alabama and Florida State for the top total in the NCAA Division I FBS ranks during that stretch.

One of the Tigers' top recruiters, Steckel helped stock Mizzou's roster with numerous standout performers while overseeing the program's recruiting efforts in the fertile prep gridiron grounds of Texas. Steckel joined Gary Pinkel's coaching staff at MU in 2001 after spending five seasons as a defensive line and linebackers coach at Rutgers University.

With the Scarlet Knights, Steckel coached a pair of All-Big East performers, both of whom went on to play in the NFL. He also served as one of Rutgers' primary recruiters, inking 14 players in his first three seasons.

Prior to joining head coach Terry Shea's Rutgers staff, Steckel worked with Pinkel at Toledo for four years, highlighted by the Rockets' undefeated 1995 season that included a Mid-American Conference title and a No. 24 final ranking. He tutored six All-MAC selections as UT's defensive line coach, including Dan Williams, who was picked 11th overall by Denver in the 1993 NFL Draft.

A Fullerton, Pa., native, Steckel served as assistant head coach and offensive coordinator at Dickinson College from 1986-87 and made a stop at Lehigh before heading to Toledo. He broke into the coaching ranks with stops at Miami (Ohio), Ball State and Minnesota.

Steckel is the younger brother of longtime NFL coach Les Steckel. He served in the United States Marine Corps from 1975-78 and played four seasons as an offensive lineman at Kutztown University, where he graduated with a bachelor's degree in elementary education in 1982. Steckel also earned a master's degree from Miami (Ohio).

Steckel and his wife, Mary Beth, have a daughter, Amanda.
