BEARS WELCOME LUMBERJACKS TO PLASTER FOR BIG SKY/MVFC CHALLENGE

THE GAME

After securing their first victory of the 2018 season last week, the **Missouri State Bears** will continue their three-game home stand Saturday (Sept. 15) with a 2 p.m. non-conference contest against the 20th-ranked **Northern Arizona Lumberjacks** at Robert W. Plaster Stadium.

Saturday's game is part of the Big Sky-MVFC Challenge Series, which is in its second season. The contest will be broadcast live on **ESPN3**, with Don West and Corey Riggs describing the action. The game will also be carried on the Missouri State Radio Network, as Art Hains and Dennis Heim will once again have the call.

- Missouri State holds an all-time mark of 213-168-12 (.557) at Plaster Stadium.
- The MVFC holds an 8-5 all-time edge in the Big Sky-MVFC Challenge Series, including a 3-2 record this season.
- The home club has won each of the five contests in this year's Big Sky-MVFC Challenge.
- NAU enters the week ranked No. 20 in the STATS FCS Top 25 and No. 22 in the AFCA Coaches Top 25; MSU is 22-94 all-time versus ranked FCS opponents, including a 6-13 mark in such games against non-conference opponents; the Bears have squared off against at least four ranked foes in each of the last eight seasons.
- After turning in his fourth 100-yard rushing game as a Bear in MSU's season-opener at Oklahoma State, **Peyton Huslig** logged another milestone performance last week vs. Lincoln to help the Bears top the 500-yard mark for total offense, finishing with 235 yards passing for his fourth 200-yard passing effort as a Bear; Huslig has either rushed for 100 yards or passed for 200 in eight of his 13 career starts.
- **Jason Randall** rushed for two touchdowns in last week's win over Lincoln, marking his third multi-TD effort as a Bear; he has scored at least one touchdown in five of MSU's last six games overall, dating back to Oct. 28, 2017 vs. Indiana State.

SERIES NOTES

- The Bears and Lumberjacks will be meeting for the first time Saturday.
- Additionally, the game will mark MSU's first against any opponent from the state of Arizona.
- MSU has gone 1-3 in its history against the Big Sky Conference, with the most-recent meeting coming

last Sept. 13, with a 34-0 setback at North Dakota, which was in its final season as a Big Sky member; the Bears knocked off UND by a 38-0 score at Plaster on Sept. 13, 2014, for their lone win against a Big Sky opponent, after losing home dates with Cal State Northridge in 1998, and Idaho in the opening round of the 1990 FCS playoffs.

THE BEARS

- The Bears (1-1) return 36 letterwinners and 15 total starters from last year's 3-8 squad.
- MSU's defense, which welcomed back nine starters, is led by first-team preseason All-MVFC pick **Angelo Garbutt** and second-team choice **Darius Joseph**.
- **McNeece Egbim** and **Kevin Ellis** share the team lead with 16 tackles through the first two contests, while **Skyler Hulse** leads the MVFC in both TFL's (5.0) and sacks (1.5).
- Quarterback **Peyton Huslig**'s average of 252.0 yards of total offense per game is the fourth-best among all MVFC players.
- Preseason all-conference lineman **Marquis Prophete** earned MVFC Offensive Lineman of the Week honors Monday.

THE LUMBERJACKS

- NAU knocked off FBS foe UTEP in a 30-10 season-opening affair on Sept. 1, before falling at home to No. 5 Eastern Washington Saturday in its Big Sky opener.
- The Lumberjacks (1-1) are led by All-American quarterback Case Cookus; the junior left Saturday's game against Eastern Washington due to injury, however.
- Junior linebacker Taylor Powell (17 tackles) leads an NAU defense that has surrendered an average of 399.5 yards of offense per outing to date.

WELCOME TO THE PARTY

Missouri State's cause will receive a boost by an influx of talent in 2018, with 42 newcomers adorning the Bears' roster this fall. Head coach **Dave Steckel** and his staff welcomed 24 freshmen, as well as 18 transfers to campus at the start of fall camp. MSU saw an immediate impact from its decorated group of newcomers, as 18 newcomers saw game action at Oklahoma State, including starters **Mauricio Chio** and **Kylin Washington**.

MSU's talented crop of newcomers will be aiming to continue a tradition of excellence displayed by Bear rookies over the last two decades. In the history of the Missouri Valley Football Conference, only Western Illinois (82) and Illinois State (82) have produced more MVFC All-Newcomer selections than the Bears, who have collected 79 such honors since the league began recognizing an all-rookie team in 1994. On this year's roster, five Bears have been listed on previous MVFC All-Newcomer squads: 2015 - **Jared Beshore** (S); 2016 - **Coleman Clanton** (OL) and **McNeece Egbim** (LB), and 2017 - **Peyton Huslig** (QB) and **Angelo Garbutt** (LB).

SEVEN BEARS EARN PRESEASON HONORS

Missouri State standouts **Angelo Garbutt**, **Marquis Prophete** and **Darius Joseph** were all recognized by the Missouri Valley Football Conference with Preseason All-MVFC honors, as selected by a panel of league coaches, media and communications personnel.

Garbutt, a junior linebacker from Carrollton, Texas, was a first-team All-MVFC preseason pick, while Prophete and Joseph were second-team selections. Both Joseph, Prophete, and returning starting quarterback **Peyton Huslig**, were honorable mention All-MVFC performers in 2017.

Garbutt, an Iowa transfer who received Honorable Mention All-MVFC recognition at linebacker in his first season at MSU a year ago, ranked sixth overall in the MVFC with a team-leading 85 tackles. Prophete will take a streak of 27 consecutive starts on the Bears' offensive line into his senior campaign after helping engineer an offensive turnaround in 2017. Joseph was a stalwart in the Bears' secondary, making 10 starts at cornerback and totaling 54 tackles to lead all MSU defensive backs.

Additionally, four more Bears earned preseason All-MVFC laurels from Phil Steele's annual football preview. Prophete was the lone MSU first-team selection. Long snapper **Chandler Collins** joined Garbutt on the publication's list of second-team honorees, while offensive lineman **Aaron Clardy**, defensive back **Zack Sanders** and wide receiver **Lorenzo Thomas** joined Egbim as third-team selections.

STRENGTH OF SCHEDULE

Missouri State can once again make a valid claim as having one of the toughest schedules in the Division I FCS ranks this fall. Based on STATS' preseason FCS Poll, the Bears are slated to meet seven teams ranked among the top 25 or receiving votes in the poll, in addition to their season opener against FBS power Oklahoma State, which garnered the No. 25 spot in the preseason USA Today Coaches Poll.

Seven of the Bears' eight MVFC foes entered the season either ranked in the top 25 or receiving votes from the STATS voters. Since the start of the 2014 season, MSU has squared off against a total of 25 ranked opponents. In fact, the Bears have played no fewer than three ranked opponents in any of the last 13 seasons. MSU has taken on a total of 45 top 25 clubs in the last eight seasons alone and brings a record of 22-94 against ranked FCS foes into this week's action.

BEARS OUT TO PROVE POLLSTERS WRONG

The Missouri Valley Football Conference pollsters tabbed the Bears for ninth place in the league's annual preseason poll. North Dakota State earned the top spot with 390 total points, edging South Dakota State (340) after picking up all 39 first-place votes. FCS national runner-up UNI (270) finished third, just ahead of Youngstown State (258) in the fourth position. Illinois State (248) was tabbed for the No. 5 slot and South Dakota (206) came in sixth. Western Illinois (163) and Southern Illinois (139) were slotted for seventh and eighth, while MSU (90) and Indiana State (41) rounded out the poll.

The MVFC's preseason favorite has claimed the league crown 20 times in 32 previous seasons a poll has been conducted. Valley Football is celebrating its 34th season in 2018, with eight collective FCS national championships to its credit.

The Missouri Valley Football Conference will have more than 50 events on ESPN's networks during the 2018 season. Commissioner Patty Viverito has announced. The Conference will produce eight league games as part of its 2018 Game of the Week package, with each streaming live on **Valley Football on ESPN**. As part of the Missouri Valley Conference's media rights agreement with ESPN, each of the Bears' 11 games in 2018 are scheduled to be broadcast, including all eight MVFC games on ESPN3 or ESPN+.

The league's digital initiative is available through the redesigned ESPN App and features live-event programming on both ESPN3 and ESPN+. The new ESPN App gives fans a premier, all-in-one digital access point for everything ESPN offers -- 1) news, scores, highlights and audio, 2) "TV Everywhere" streaming video and 3) ESPN+. The league's digital endeavor is part of its 10-year agreement with ESPN which runs through the 2023-24 academic year.

CHUNK THIS

Missouri State's propensity for big plays was on display throughout the 2017 season, with the Bears logging 40 offensive plays of 30 yards or more last fall. That figure easily surpassed the total of the 2016 Bears, who registered just 25 'chunk' gains of at least 25 yards for their entire 11-game season. Furthermore, 18 of those gains went for more than 40 yards, including nine rushes and nine passes.

Additionally, MSU produced 16 scoring drives of 75 yards or more, as well as 11 different scoring series extending at least nine plays.

COLE EARNS SPOT ON TEXANS ROSTER

Former Bear linebacker **Dylan Cole** became the most-recent Missouri State product to earn a spot on a National Football League roster last September, when the Houston Texans announced the free agent signee as a member of the club's initial 53-man roster. In his first season as a pro, Cole appeared in 12 games for the Texas, logging 32 tackles, 1.0 sack and a pair of interceptions.

A consensus first-team FCS All-America selection for the Bears as a senior, Cole averaged 12.9 tackles per game in 2016 to lead all FCS players. The Rogersville, Mo., product recorded at least 13 tackles in nine different games as a senior, including 19 in the Bears' win over Southern Illinois.

The All-MVFC first-team selection racked up 85 solo tackles, eight tackles for loss, two interceptions, four pass breakups and three forced fumbles. Cole finished third in the 2016 Buck Buchanan Award voting as the top defensive player in the FCS ranks, played in the NFLPA Collegiate Bowl and earned CoSIDA Academic All-District honors as well as MVFC Scholar-Athlete Team laurels. He capped his career with 457 tackles in 46 games — all starts — finishing third on the Bears' career tackles chart and ninth all-time in MVFC history.

Anthony Grady (Jets); 2013 addition **Randy Richards** (Chargers); 2011 professionals **Jermaine Saffold** (Browns) and **Chris Douglas** (Bills); and 2010 rookies **Kolby Hurt** (Saints) and **Jake Duron** (Jets).

Likewise, many Bears in recent years have enjoyed extended careers in the Arena Football League and Indoor Football League (IFL), including Duron, **Cody Kirby** and **Tevan Ferguson**. **Steve Watson** appeared in Arena Bowl XXII in 2008 for the San Jose SaberCats. A two-time All-MVFC standout (2003-04), Watson posted 238 tackles in 31 games at MSU and also played for the Columbus Destroyers and Tulsa Talons.

Brad St. Louis played 10 seasons with the Cincinnati Bengals from 2000-09. He starred for MSU at tight end from 1996-99 and played in both the East-West Shrine Game and Hula Bowl after his senior season prior to being drafted by the Bengals. He operated as the Bengals' regular long snapper seven seasons with additional work at tight end.

Former Bear **Jason Whittle** played 11 NFL seasons from 1998-2008. He signed a free agent contract in the 2003 off-season with then-Super Bowl champion Tampa Bay after five years with the New York Giants. He returned to the Giants in 2004 and moved to the Minnesota Vikings for the 2006 campaign before joining the Bills in 2007. A standout lineman at MSU from 1994-97, Whittle signed a free agent contract with the Giants in 1998. He became the first MSU Bear to appear in the NFL title game when he saw action in the 2001 Super Bowl with the Giants.

PACKING THEM IN

The newly-renovated Robert W. Plaster Stadium has hosted three of the top nine home crowds in Missouri State football history, as well as an overall average of nearly 10,100 fans per home contest over the last four seasons. In 2016, MSU registered its third-consecutive season drawing at least 50,000 spectators at home and ranked among the nation's top 30 FCS programs in average home attendance for the third consecutive year after the facility opened to rave reviews in 2014. The Bears drew 58,324 fans through the turnstiles in their five home games that season, an average of 11,665 per contest — good for 18th nationally. The club's net total attendance in 2014 marked its best in five-game home schedule since 1996 and the top season figure overall since 2007.

A record-drawing crowd of 18,386 witnessed Missouri State's 38-0 victory over North Dakota (Sept. 13) in its 2014 home opener. The standing-room-only crowd translated to 105 percent of the stadium's new capacity and represented the top home crowd in Bears' history, surpassing the previous 17-year-old record of 16,672, established Aug. 28, 1997 vs. Pittsburg State. The opening-night attendance also equaled the 26th-largest crowd — home or away — to see a Missouri State football game.

CLEARING 100K

The Bears played before a total of 140,867 fans last fall, marking the 14th consecutive season MSU topped the 125K annual attendance mark. MSU drew 41,973 fans in its five home dates at Plaster Stadium this season, after ranking 27th nationally in per-game average in the FCS ranks last year. The Bears have finished among the top 50 FCS schools in average home attendance in each of the last 23 seasons dating back to 1995.

MSU played in front of a total of 165,806 spectators in 2015, marking the fifth-highest combined home and road season attendance figure in program history. The Bears have played before more than 100,000 fans in each of the last 30 seasons, including a school-record 234,314 spectators in 2011.

MISSOURI STATE ON THE RISE

With a record Fall 2017 enrollment of 26,216, Missouri State University is the largest school in the Missouri Valley Football Conference (and the Missouri Valley Conference), as well as the second-largest institution in the state of Missouri. The Bears moved to NCAA Division I status for the 1982-83 season and joined the Missouri Valley Football Conference (formerly the Gateway Conference) in 1985 where they have been a member ever since. MSU is a member of the Missouri Valley Conference in 13 other sports—a league founded in 1907 and the second-oldest Division I conference in the nation.

Overall, Missouri State teams have made 64 NCAA Tournament appearances as a Division I institution, including 14 in women's basketball, 13 in volleyball, 11 in baseball, six in both men's basketball and softball, four in women's golf and three in men's soccer.

MISSOURI STATE GAME-BY-GAME SUMMARIES

STILLWATER, Okla. -- Oklahoma State built an early 31-point cushion before withstanding a valiant second-half charge from Missouri State to post a 58-17 victory over the Bears at Boone Pickens Stadium.

OSU (1-0), which recorded eight different scoring drives covering 67 yards or more in the contest, led 31-0 late in the first half before the Bears scored 17 of the next 24 points to cut their deficit to 21 points. Bears quarterback Peyton Huslig totaled 109 yards on the ground and threw for 150 yards and a pair of touchdowns to help spark the surge, before the No. 25 Cowboys pulled away by scoring the final 20 points of the game.

Keyed by a pair of 100-yard rushing performances and five touchdown passes from senior quarterback Taylor Cornelius, Oklahoma State amassed 732 yards of total offense in their 24th straight win in a home opener. The Cowboys scored on each of their first four offensive possessions, outgaining the Bears by a 280-9 margin in first-quarter total offense.

Justice Hill, who punctuated the early onslaught with a 92-yard rush in the closing moments of the opening period, registered the 15th 100-yard rushing game of his OSU career, carrying the ball 10 times for 122 yards—all in the first quarter. He was joined in the century club by LD Brown, who racked up 115 yards on the ground, including a late 77-yard scoring run.

OSU set the tone for the night on its first drive, marching 75 yards in just 2:36 behind a run game that nicked the Bears for 53 yards on seven attempts. After Cornelius connected with Hill on a 22-yard completion, then broke free for a 32-yard scamper of his own to move the Cowboys within striking distance, Hill capped the drive with a three-yard run to make it a 7-0 game.

A pair of third-down sacks by the Cowboy defense thwarted the Bears' first two offensive possessions, and the OSU offense cashed in for two more scoring drives to stretch the margin to 17 points. Cornelius completed 4-of-5 passes for 42 total yards on a 14-play drive that ended with a 20-yard Matt Ammendola field goal with 5:25 left in the first. Next, Jalen McCleskey punctuated another long OSU drive—this one covering 70 yards in just 1:53—taking it in from five yards out on a third-and-goal attempt, after a pair of Cornelius completions to Landon Wolf and a personal foul against the Bears moved the Cowboys into the red zone once again.

Missouri State punter Brendan Withrow provided an early highlight with his third career boot of 60 yards or more, pinning the Cowboys on their own 5-yard line with 1:22 left on the clock. But on the next play from scrimmage, Hill escaped traffic and sprinted all the way to the MSU 2 for the third-longest rush by a Bears opponent in the 107-year history of the MSU program.

Cornelius' three-yard pass to Sione Finefeuiaki on the first play of the second quarter extended the Cowboys' lead, and the senior signal-caller hooked up with Tylan Wallace at the 6:37 mark to finish off an 80-yard drive to push the margin to 31-0.

SPRINGFIELD, Mo. -- Missouri State overcame an early double-digit deficit behind a dominant second-quarter, reeling off 35 unanswered points en route to a 52-24 home-opening victory over Lincoln at Robert W. Plaster Stadium. The Bears defense paved the way to MSU's first victory of the season, putting points on the board with a fumble return for a score, while recording seven sacks and permitting just 59 rushing yards on the day.

Peyton Huslig led the Bears' comeback, finishing his day with completions on his last 11 passing attempts as part of a 12-for-14, 235-yard performance. In all, three MSU quarterbacks combined for 330 passing yards, giving the Bears (1-1) their best single-game showing through the air since their 2017 season opener at Missouri. Additionally, the offense topped the 500-yard mark in total offense—tallying 177 yards on the ground—and none of its eight scoring drives extended beyond the three-minute mark in duration.

McNeece Egbin led all tacklers with 10 stops, and seven different Bears recorded at least half a sack, paced by the first two sacks of Claudio Martin's MSU career.

After coughing up the football on each of their first three possessions of the day, the Bears responded in a big way to find the end zone on five straight drives to build a 25-point advantage. Lincoln (1-1) converted the three early turnovers into a 10-0 lead with 4:29 to play in the first period, but Huslig's 59-yard scoring toss to wide-open Nick Masoner opened the scoring floodgates for the Bears just 12 seconds later.

Huslig would lead the Bears' offensive charge, starting a string of 13 overall consecutive completions for MSU signal-callers before completing his day late in the first half. The junior quarterback also gashed the Blue Tigers with his legs, capping a seven-play, 73-yard drive with a five-yard scoring run to hand the Bears their first lead of the day. Huslig completed six passes—three of which went to Aaron Denson for a total of 42 yards—on the drive, then connected with his first two throws of MSU's next possession to set up the first of two short Jason Randall TD runs.

MSU's defense cashed in as well, as an Eric Johnson strip caused a Hosea Franklin fumble, and Darius Joseph scooped up the loose ball and raced 27 yards to pay dirt to push the margin to 28-10 with 7:00 to play in the half. The Bears sacked LU quarterback Henry Ogala six times for a total loss of 43 yards in the opening stanza, and allowed just 13 rushing yards on 22 attempts in the half.

Randall added his second one-yard TD run of the day to cap the first-half scoring with just under four minutes left on the clock.

Lincoln would finish the half with just 70 yards of total offense, but broke from intermission with a 77-yard scoring drive that ended with a 15-yard pass from Ogala to Antonio Issac to stop the Bears' scoring run.

The Bears answered immediately, using a pair of long runs from Dalton Hill to set up Jeremiah Wilson's first rushing touchdown as a Bear that pushed the lead back to 25 points. Hill would finish the day as the Bears' leading rusher, carrying three times for 74 yards, in addition to completing 4-of-5 passes for 30 yards.

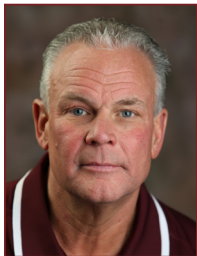

**DAVE
STECKEL****HEAD COACH
FOURTH SEASON AT MSU**

On Dec. 14, 2014, MSU Director of Athletics Kyle Moats and President Clif M. Smart III announced the hire of former University of Missouri associate head coach and defensive coordinator **Dave Steckel** as Missouri State's 20th head football coach.

In his first three years leading the MSU program, Steckel and his talented staff set about the task of overhauling a young Bears squad, heavily emphasizing the fundamental aspects of the game. Capitalizing on a renewed enthusiasm surrounding the MSU program, Steckel laid the groundwork for enhancing relations with area high school coaches, engaging the community and raising the bar with his "Bear Up" mentality. The efforts paid off at the gate, as the Bears drew an average of 10,067 fans per game over the 2015-16 seasons.

Last year, the Bears registered dramatic signs of improvement, particularly on the offensive side of the football. MSU's ground attack, led by dual-threat quarterback Peyton Huslig, led the Missouri Valley Football Conference in rushing during league play throughout most of the Valley season. The Bears ultimately finished sixth overall in the MVFC in rushing yards per game (169.4 ypg.), posting a 32-percent increase in total rushing yards per outing from 2016.

The MSU special teams thrived once again, ranking among the Valley's top three units in kickoff return average, punt return average, punt average and field goals made per game.

On the field in 2016, the Bears engineered a three-win turnaround from the previous fall, bolting from the gate with wins in three of their first four games, including victories in their first two road contests against FCS competition.

MSU knocked off No. 24 Indiana State in Terre Haute in its 2016 Valley opener, handing the Bears their first victory over a ranked foe since Oct. 19, 2013 (vs. No. 15 South Dakota State) and the program's first win vs. a Top 25 squad on the road since an Oct. 20, 2012 decision over No. 11 Illinois State in Normal. The win also represented the largest margin of victory against a ranked road foe in the 105-year history of the program.

Individually, seven Bears garnered All-MVFC recognition, led by repeat first-teamers Dylan Cole and Deion Holliman. Cole was a unanimous first-team All-America selection and finished third in the balloting for the Buck Buchanan Award, completing his four-year Missouri State career as the FCS's leading tackler before signing a free agent deal with the NFL's Houston Texans in April.

Steckel brings 36 years of coaching experience into the 2018 season, including 14 seasons at Mizzou, in which he helped transform the Tigers defense into one of the strongest units in the nation. He was the only defensive coach among the five finalists for the 2014 Frank Broyles Award as the nation's top assistant coach. He helped produce a total of 15 all-conference linebacker selections at MU, including a number of players who have forged professional careers in the National Football League.

Under Steckel's tutelage, Missouri's defense was a driving force in the Tigers' back-to-back Southeastern Conference East Division titles in 2013 and 2014. MU led the SEC and ranked 10th nationally in sacks per game in 2014. The Tiger

defense finished first or second in every major statistical category in SEC play last fall en route to propelling Mizzou to its fifth conference divisional championship in eight seasons.

MU also ranked 23rd in the country in total defense and 19th in scoring defense in 2014, while the Tigers led the SEC in total defense (300.8 yds/game).

In 2013, the MU defense was fifth nationally in interceptions (20), eighth in total turnovers forced (32), and an SEC-best 2.93 sacks per game. This boosted the Tigers to a 12-win season and a Cotton Bowl victory over Oklahoma State.

Individually, "Stec" currently has 10 different Mizzou defenders playing in the NFL, including five who have garnered All-America recognition since his elevation to defensive coordinator in 2009. Most recently, Shane Ray became the second Tiger in as many years to be named SEC Defensive Player of the Year after breaking the program's single-season record for sacks (14.0) in 2014. Michael Sam earned the same honor in 2013. Aldon Smith picked up Big 12 Conference Defensive Newcomer of the Year in 2009, which helped kickstart Mizzou's reputation as "DLine U."

Overall, Steckel helped coach Missouri to 10 bowl appearances during his tenure in Columbia, including five seasons with 10 or more wins. The Tigers compiled a 112-66 (.629) overall record in his 14 seasons, while their five divisional titles since 2007 tied Alabama and Florida State for the top total in the NCAA Division I FBS ranks during that stretch.

One of the Tigers' top recruiters, Steckel helped stock Mizzou's roster with numerous standout performers while overseeing the program's recruiting efforts in the fertile prep gridiron grounds of Texas. Steckel joined Gary Pinkel's coaching staff at MU in 2001 after spending five seasons as a defensive line and linebackers coach at Rutgers University.

With the Scarlet Knights, Steckel coached a pair of All-Big East performers, both of whom went on to play in the NFL. He also served as one of Rutgers' primary recruiters, inking 14 players in his first three seasons.

Prior to joining head coach Terry Shea's Rutgers staff, Steckel worked with Pinkel at Toledo for four years, highlighted by the Rockets' undefeated 1995 season that included a Mid-American Conference title and a No. 24 final ranking. He tutored six All-MAC selections as UT's defensive line coach, including Dan Williams, who was picked 11th overall by Denver in the 1993 NFL Draft.

A Fullerton, Pa., native, Steckel served as assistant head coach and offensive coordinator at Dickinson College from 1986-87 and made a stop at Lehigh before heading to Toledo. He broke into the coaching ranks with stops at Miami (Ohio), Ball State and Minnesota.

Steckel is the younger brother of longtime NFL coach Les Steckel. He served in the United States Marine Corps from 1975-78 and played four seasons as an offensive lineman at Kutztown University, where he graduated with a bachelor's degree in elementary education in 1982. Steckel also earned a master's degree from Miami (Ohio).

Steckel and his wife, Mary Beth, have a daughter, Amanda.
