

BEARS HOST SYCAMORES ON SENIOR DAY AT PLASTER STADIUM

THE GAME

The **Missouri State Bears** (1-9, 1-6 MVFC) conclude their 2019 season Saturday (Nov. 23) when they host the **Indiana State Sycamores** in a 2 p.m. (CST) contest at Robert W. Plaster Stadium.

Saturday's game will be broadcast live on **ESPN+**, with Don West and Corey Riggs describing the action. It will also be carried on the **Missouri State Radio Network**, as Tom Ladd and Dennis Heim will have the call.

- Missouri State will recognize 19 senior studentathletes as part of on-field Senior Day festivities scheduled prior to kickoff.
- With Southern Illinois' entry at No. 25 into this week's FCS Coaches Poll, the Bears will have faced off against five straight Top 25 squads entering Saturday's game; the Sycamores will represent just the third FCS opponent to enter its matchup with MSU either unranked or voteless in either major FCS poll.
- The Bears have forced a total of nine turnovers over their last three games, more than doubling their season total in takeaways in the process.
- MSU will be looking to post its first home win of the season; the Bears have dropped seven straight games at Plaster Stadium — their longest home slide as a Division I program.
- MSU also enters the game riding a seven-game November losing streak, with its last win in the month coming on Nov. 4, 2017 at Southern Illinois.
- The Bears last home win came on Sept. 29, 2018 in a 24-21 decision against Illinois State.
- Indiana State snapped a four-game skid with a 24-17 home victory over Youngstown State last Saturday, rushing for 242 yards and three touchdowns.

SERIES NOTES

- The Bears and Sycamores have met 33 previous times since 1986, with MSU holding a 20-13 edge.
- MSU is 12-4 at home against ISU, including a 59-20 win over the Sycamores in their last trip to Springfield (Oct. 28, 2017).
- MSU has won three straight contests against ISU under head coach Dave Steckel, averaging 31.0 points per victory during the streak; neither club has won four consecutive games in the series to date.
- The Bears have averaged 29.7 points per outing in the series, and have topped the 30-point mark in nine of their last 11 wins over ISU.

THE BEARS

- Led by preseason all-league selection Tyler Currie, the Bears offense brings back six starters, including quarterback Peyton Huslig, the MVFC's active leader in career passing yardage (6,156) who ranks third on the Bears' all-time lists for total offense (7,175), completions (526) and passing yardage, as well as second for passing TD's (36).
- On the defensive side of the ball, McNeece Egbim leads all Valley defenders in tackles (9.9 tpg.) during conference play, while Tyler Lovelace leads the MVFC in takeaways (3 FR, 3 INT); Egbim needs 11 tackles to match the career total of Dennis Heim in then No. 13 spot on MSU's career tackles list.
- Brendan Withrow's average of 43.1 yards per punt ranks second in the MVFC and 12th nationally.

THE SYCAMORES

- Under the direction of third-year head coach **Curt Mallory**, the Sycamores have been competitive in virtually every contest, with seven of their 10 games being decided by 10 points or less.
- ISU's defense has posted the No. 2 pass defense in not only the MVFC (155.1 ypg.), but all of FCS football as well.
- ISU's linebacker duo of Jonas Griffith and Clayton Glasco has combined for 168 tackles, 22.5 tackles for losses, 8.0 sacks and two interceptions.

LAST TIME OUT

Missouri State dropped its sixth straight MVFC game, falling to Illinois State in a 17-12 defensive battle in Normal last weekend.

- MSU's defense forced a season-high four turnovers and limited the Redbirds to 238 yards of offense.
- · Trailing by five points late in the contest, Angelo Garbutt forced a late fumble and Tyler Lovelace scooped up the loose ball to give the Bears new life at the Redbird 32 with 2:17 left on the clock.
- MSU quarterback **Peyton Huslig** guided the Bears to the ISU 3 in the final minute, but the ISU pass defense stiffened, forcing a pair of incompletions before Luther Kirk caught Huslig from behind for a nine-yard sack on fourth down, ending the threat and effectively sealing the outcome.
- James Robinson, the MVFC's leading rusher, carried the load for ISU with 155 rushing yards on 29 carries, and Brady Davis completed 8-of-11 passes for 65 yards and two first-half touchdowns before leaving the game with an apparent injury.
- ISU held the Bears to 1-of-11 conversions on third down and sacked Huslig five times, with Tuvone Clark and Zek Vandenburgh each accounting for 2.0 sacks, and Dylan Draka leading the Redbirds' with nine tackles
- Jeremiah Wilson turned in the longest scoring run by a Bear since 2017 with a 74-yard scoring burst in the
- Titus Wall led all MSU tacklers with eight stops, and Garbutt logged seven tackles and 2.0 tackles for losses to go along with his two takeaways.

SENIOR SENDOFF

NIneteen Missouri State seniors will be recognized during pregame ceremonies Saturday, including co-captains McNeece Egbim and Peyton Huslig.

In addition to Egbim (LB), Kam Carter (S), Chandler Collings (LS), Aaron Denson (WR), Austin Henderson (S), Darius Joseph (CB) and Taiwo Oluwafunmila (DE) are all three-time lettermen for the Bears. Huslig (QB) heads a list of two-year letter-winners that includes Tyler Currie (WR), Angelo Garbutt (LB) and Brendan Withrow (P). Other senior honorees are Mauricio Chio (TE), J.T. Granato (QB), Matt McClellan (DE), Matt Platko (OL), Kendall Stewart (WR), Kylin Washington (DT), Antwan Woods (WR) and Alan Worsham (RB).

HONORING NO. 20

Another member of this year's senior class, Richard Nelson, will be honored Saturday as well. Nelson was shot and killed in his hometown of Las Vegas, Nev., on Jan. 14, 2017, while attempting to intervene in an attack on his sister. Nelson, who was just 18 years old, was a tailback on the team and redshirted during his first and only season with the Bears in 2016.

The Bears have honored Nelson with his number "20" on their helmets over the past three seasons. The team also has a standing memorial to Nelson in the MSU Football facility.

THOMAS JOINS 1,000-YARD CLUB

Two weeks after fellow Bear receiver Tyler Currie became Missouri State's 21st receiver to accumulate 1,000 career receiving yards, junior wideout Lorenzo Thomas followed suit in last week's loss at Illinois State.

Thomas caught four passses for 33 yards against the Redbirds, hiking his MSU totals to 85 receptions and 1,031 yards in 31 career games for the Bears. Currie, who has collected a pass in 18 consecutive games, has snagged 89 passes for 1,074 yards in his MSU career with seven touchdowns.

GETTING DEFENSIVE

Missouri State's four takeaways at No. 7 Illinois State (Nov. 16) not only marked a season high by its defense, but its best single-game effort since forcing six Northern Arizona turnovers on Sept. 15, 2018. The Bears allowed just 3.8 yards per play and 15 total first downs while holding the Redbirds to a season-low 238 yards of total offense.

In its last three contests, MSU has forced a total of nine turnovers. Tyler Lovelace has played a direct role in six of the Bears' 16 takeaways this fall, recovering three fumbles and picking off three passes.

CAPTAIN CONSISTENCY

Senior co-captain McNeece Egbim notched a team-high 10 tackles at Southern Illinois (Nov. 9), marking his 15th career double-figure tackle game — and fifth this season. The linebacker from Rowlett, Texas, posted eight solo stops and a pair of assists against the Salukis. Egbim is averaging 9.9 tackles per game in Valley play to lead all MVFC defenders.

Egbim eclipsed 300 career tackles Oct. 26 vs. UNI and jumpted into the program's all-time top 15 in career tackles with a 10-tackle effort vs. SDSU (Nov. 2) before moving past Mike Murphy into the No. 14 spot on the list. He enters Saturday's game with 327 total tackles, which is 11 behind Dennis Heim (1974-77) in the 13th position on the chart. Egbim also sits seventh on MSU's career chart for tackles for loss (26.5) and needs two more TFL's to catch Nick Canavan (2010-13) in the sixth position on

WILSON'S WAY

Jeremiah Wilson made his first start of the season in the Bears' backfield at Illinois State (Nov. 16). The sophomore's 74-yard, first-quarter rush marked the longest rush and longest scoring run by a Bear since Calan Crowder's 75-yard TD run at Missouri on Sept. 2, 2017. In just two appearances this season, Wilson is MSU's top net rusher and averages 11.0 yards per carry.

STRENGTH OF SCHEDULE

Missouri State can once again make a valid claim as having one of the toughest schedules in the Division I FCS ranks this fall. Last Saturday's game at No. 7 Illinois State marked the Bears' fifth contest against a top 25 team this season. MSU has played at least five ranked teams in six straight seasons and the Bears have played no fewer than three ranked opponents in any of the last 15 seasons. MSU has taken on a total of 54 top 25 clubs in the last 10 seasons alone.

WITHROW EARNS MVFC HONOR

For the second time this season, Missouri State punter Brendan Withrow was named Missouri Valley Football Conference Special Teams Player of the Week on Monday following a big performance at Illinois State (Nov. 16).

The senior from Imperial, Mo., averaged 49.2 yards per attempt to help the Bears control the field position battle in the narrow 17-12 loss in Normal. He booted a gamelong 62-yarder in the second half and accounted for two 50-plus yarders on the day to push his season total to 18 punts of 50 yards or better.

Withrow is one of just three punters in the FCS to eclipse 3,000 punt yards this season and currently ranks 12th nationally with a punting average of 43.1. He earned Valley Special Teams Player of the Week and STATS FCS National Special Teams Player of the Week on Oct. 7, following his efforts in helping the Bears pick up their first win of the season at Western Illinois.

HUSLIG LEAVING HIS MARK

Peyton Huslig continues to accumulate career passing milestones as he braces for his 33rd and final start this weekend against Indiana State. The senior from Andover, Kan., became just the third MSU quarterback to top the 6,000-passing yardage marker for his career with 185 yards last Saturday at Illinois State. He moved into a tie for second place on MSU's career TD passes list the previous week at Southern Illinois (Nov. 9) with a pair of scoring passes to give him 36 for his career. Huslig also eclipsed 500 career completions in the SIU game, joining Cody Kirby (2007-10) and Jeremy Hoog (1994-97) on that elite list

MSU's third-year quarterback matched career highs with 28 completions and four passing touchdowns to help lead the Bears to a triple-overtime road win over Western Illinois (Oct. 5). Huslig finished 28-of-44 with 315 passing yards and accounted for 231 passing yards in the second half and overtime alone.

Huslig reached several statistical milestones in 2018, including topping 4,000 career passing yards, 5,000 career yards of total offense and 2,000 passing yards for the season. The dual-threat signal caller ranked seventh on the single-season total offense list (2,479) and sixth on the Bears' passing yards list (2,113).

COMEBACK CUBS

In the Bears' Oct. 5 triple-overtime win at Western Illinois, Missouri State erased an early 14-point deficit to the Leathernecks in the longest game in program history.

The Bears' comeback represented their biggest since erasing a two-touchdown margin on Oct. 29, 2016, when they trailed SIU 28-14 at Plaster Stadium, before rallying late in a 38-35 victory over the Salukis. The last time Missouri State earned a road victory after trailing by 14 or more points was Aug. 28, 2014, when MSU overcame a 24-7 deficit at Northwestern State en route to a 20-point fourth quarter and 34-27 victory.

MAROON AND WHITE SPECIAL

MSU special teams have been a consistent force during the **Dave Steckel** era, with the Bears ranking among the top five among all MVFC units in both punt average and punt return average three of the last four seasons.

The Bears have been one of the best punting units in the FCS ranks so far this fall. Missouri State senior punter **Brendan Withrow** earned his second MVFC Specail Teams Player of the Week nod on Monday. His season punting average (43.1) is currently the second-highest all-time at MSU and ranks 12th nationally. Withrow, who now has 35 punts of 50 yards or better in his career, is also on pace to become just the fifth player in program history to rack up 200 or more career punts. He enters the final game of his MSU career fifth all-time in punts (195) and fourth in punting yardage (8,129), while his career average (41.7) ranks third in MSU history.

BEARS STRONG IN NON-CON

The Bears saw their six-game home win streak versus non-conference opponents come to an end with their 35-24 setback to Kennesaw State (Sept. 21). MSU outscored its six home victims by a combined 236-66 margin since kicking off the streak with a 38-0 victory over North Dakota on Sept. 13, 2014.

Missouri State's win over Northern Arizona last September saw the Bears continue their recent non-conference surge. MSU has enjoyed a history of success in non-conference play at home since joining the Division I ranks in 1982, going 58-21 overall against non-league foes at Plaster Stadium, including a 5-1 mark in such contests under **Dave Steckel**.

Valley Football on ESPN

The Missouri Valley Football Conference will have more than 50 events on ESPN's networks during the 2019 season, Commissioner Patty Viverito has announced. The Conference will produce eight league games as part of its 2019 Game of the Week package, with each streaming live on Valley Football on ESPN. As part of the Missouri Valley Conference's media rights agreement, 10 of the Bears' 11 games in 2019 are scheduled to be broadcast, including all eight MVFC games. on the ESPN family of networks.

The league's digital initiative is available through the redesigned ESPN App and features live-event programming on both ESPN3 and ESPN+. COLE TRAIN ROLLS ALONG FOR TEXANS

Former Bear linebacker **Dylan Cole** became the mostrecent Missouri State product to earn a spot on a National Football League roster in September 2017, when the Houston Texans announced the free agent signee as a member of the club's initial 53-man roster. Now entering his third pro season with Houston, Cole appeared in 12 games for the Texans as a rookie, logging 30 tackles, one sack and a pair of interceptions, before an injury-riddled fall abbreviated his sophomore NFL campaign last fall.

A consensus first-team FCS All-America selection for the Bears, Cole averaged 12.9 tackles per game in 2016 to lead all FCS players. The Rogersville, Mo., product recorded at least 13 tackles in nine different games as a senior, including 19 in the Bears' win over SIU.

The All-MVFC first-team selection racked up 85 solo tackles, eight tackles for loss, two interceptions, four pass breakups and three forced fumbles. Cole finished third in the 2016 Buck Buchanan Award voting as the top defensive player in the FCS ranks, played in the NFLPA Collegiate Bowl and earned CoSIDA Academic All-District honors as well as MVFC Scholar-Athlete Team laurels.

BEARS IN THE NFL

MSU's history of producing pro football talent dates back to 1945 and extends to the present day with two NFL Draft selections in recent years — Clay Harbor to the Philadelphia Eagles in 2010 and David Arkin to the Cowboys in 2011.

Ten additional Bears have earned undrafted free agent contracts over the last eight years with Malik Earl joining the Cowboys in 2018; Dylan Cole signing with the Houston Texans and Riley Shantz signing with Green Bay immediately after the 2017 Draft; Gannon Sinclair signing with the Arizona Cardinals in 2015; 2014 signee Anthony Grady (Jets); 2013 addition Randy Richards (Chargers); 2011 professionals Jermaine Saffold (Browns) and Chris Douglas (Bills); and 2010 rookies Kolby Hurt (Saints) and Jake Duron (Jets).

Likewise, many Bears in recent years have enjoyed extended careers in the Arena Football League and Indoor Football League (IFL), including Duron, Cody Kirby and Tevan Ferguson. Steve Watson appeared in Arena Bowl XXII in 2008 for the San Jose SaberCats. A two-time All-MVFC standout (2003-04), Watson posted 238 tackles in 31 games at MSU and also played for the Columbus Destroyers and Tulsa Talons.

Brad St. Louis played 10 seasons with the Cincinnati Bengals from 2000-09. He starred for MSU at tight end from 1996-99 and played in both the East-West Shrine

Game and Hula Bowl after his senior season prior to being drafted by the Bengals. He operated as the Bengals' regular long snapper for seven seasons.

Former Bear Jason Whittle played 11 NFL seasons from 1998-2008. He signed a free agent contract in the 2003 off-season with then-Super Bowl champion Tampa Bay after five years with the New York Giants. He returned to the Giants in 2004 and moved to the Minnesota Vikings for the 2006 campaign before joining the Bills in 2007. A standout lineman at MSU from 1994-97, Whittle signed a free agent contract with the Giants in 1998. He became the first MSU Bear to appear in the NFL title game when he saw action in the 2001 Super Bowl with the Giants.

BEARS HONORED FOR ACADEMICS

A total of 28 Missouri State University football players were honored by the Missouri Valley Football Conference for academic excellence during the 2018 academic term.

MSU senior safety Jared Beshore earned the league's highest academic honor in the President's Council Academic Excellence Award, which requires a minimum 3.5 cumulative GPA (through the fall 2018 semester) and participation in athletics a minimum of two years. The student-athletes receiving this award must also be within 18 hours of graduation. A total of 34 players throughout the 10-team league received the honor in 2018.

Beshore also headlined a group of Missouri State players honored with the Commissioner's Academic Excellence Award, which requires a minimum GPA of 3.2 for the previous two semesters (freshmen are not eligible.). Including MSU honorees Beshore, Charles Carter, Alex Coffin, JT Granato, Brock Hughes, Peyton Huslig, Ty McDuffey, Brad Pryor, Jordan Turner, and Jordan Wilkes, a total of 173 players league-wide earned this honor. Both Beshore and Huslig were named to the MVFC All-Academic Team at the conclusion of the 2018 season.

FORMER BEAR HOLLIMAN TAKEN IN XFL DRAFT

Former Bears standout Deion Holliman was one of 85 players selected from FCS programs in the XFL Draft last month. UNI's Elijah Campbell — taken fourth among DBs by the DC Defenders — headlined a list of 12 former MVFC players drafted by teams in the upstart league.

Holliman, a three-time All-MVFC selection, was taken by the Defenders in the open round portion of the draft. He finished his MSU career in 2017 as the MVFC's all-time leader in kickoff return vardage (2,445) after totaling 493 yards on 22 returns as a senior. The Camden, Ark., product averaged 109.4 all-purpose yards per outing and rated among the top 10 punt returners in the country with a Valley-best average of 12.4 yards on his 16 returns.

LEADING THE SLEUTH

A pair of repeat selections as team captains in senior quarterback **Peyton Huslig** and senior linebacker **McNeece Egbim** will help steer the Bears during the 2019 season. Huslig and Egbim filled the same roles last fall for MSU. Additionally, junior safety **Titus Wall** was chosen by his teammates for a team captain role and will help lead the Bears defense this fall.

SEVEN BEARS EARN PRESEASON HONORS

Missouri State standouts **Tyler Currie**, **Angelo Garbutt**, **McNeece Egbim** and **Matt McClellan** were all recognized by the Missouri Valley Football Conference with Preseason All-MVFC honors, as selected by a panel of league coaches, media and communications personnel.

Currie, a native of Cordova, Tenn., earned All-MVFC honorable mention honors as a junior after sharing the team lead with 35 receptions and leading MSU with 548 yards and five receiving touchdowns.

Garbutt was a Preseason All-MVFC standout last season as well, ultimately earning All-MVFC honorable mention laurels at season's end. He was also named by Phil Steele as an All-MVFC second-team pick in 2018.

Egbim, a senior from Rowlett, Texas, was a team co-captain as a junior and earned All-MVFC honorable mention honors at linebacker. He ranked 44th nationally and sixth in the MVFC in tackles per game (8.7) after bringing down 96 ball-carriers with 9.0 tackles for loss.

McClellan, a senior from Ferguson, Mo., earned a spot on the 2018 MVFC All-Newcomer Team. He led the Bears with 10.5 tackles for loss and shared the team lead with 6.0 sacks.

Three more Bears earned preseason All-MVFC laurels from Phil Steele's annual preview. Long snapper Chandler Collins joined Currie, Egbim, Garbutt and defensive lineman Claudio Martin on the publication's list of second-team honorees, while offensive lineman Casey O'Brien picked up third-team recognition.

Additionally, Collins was one of 16 MVFC players — the most by any FCS league — to be honored by STATS with 2019 FCS Preseason All-America Football Team laurels

PACKING THEM IN

The newly-renovated Robert W. Plaster Stadium has hosted three of the top nine home crowds in Missouri State football history, as well as an overall average of nearly 10,000 fans per home contest over the last five seasons. In 2016, MSU registered its third-consecutive season drawing at least 50,000 spectators at home and ranked among the nation's top 30 FCS programs in average home attendance for the third consecutive year after the facility opened to rave reviews in 2014. The Bears drew 58,324 fans through the turnstiles in their five home games that season, an average of 11,665 per contest — good for 18th nationally. The club's net total attendance in 2014 marked its best in five-game home schedule since 1996 and the top season figure overall since 2007.

A record-drawing crowd of 18,386 witnessed Missouri State's 38-0 victory over North Dakota (Sept. 13) in its 2014 home opener. The standing-room-only crowd translated to 105 percent of the stadium's new capacity and represented the top home crowd in Bears' history, surpassing the previous 17-year-old record of 16,672, established Aug. 28, 1997 vs. Pittsburg State. The opening-night attendance also equaled the 26th-largest crowd — home or away — to see a Missouri State football game.

FLAGSTAFF, Ariz. -- A late first-half scoring surge helped Northern Arizona overcome a strong early defensive effort by Missouri State en route to a 37-23 season-opening victory over the Bears. NAU scored 17 points in the final 8:10 of the second period to snap a 3-3 tie, as wide receiver Brandon Porter accounted for two

Lumberjack scores as part of the game's critical stretch.

In all, Porter passed for a touchdown and caught two more, finishing the game with six receptions for 140 yards, while completing his lone pass of the game for a back-breaking 55-yard scoring strike. NAU quarterback Case Cookus turned in a big night as well, connecting on 18-of-29 passes for 290 yards and two TD tosses to Porter that turned a one-possession game into a 21-point NAU bulge.

The Bears' third consecutive opening-game loss overshadowed a strong second half by senior quarterback Peyton Huslig, who completed 20-of-35 passes for 289 yards and a pair of touchdowns. Huslig's prime target—fellow senior Tyler Currie—led the Bears with six catches for 89 yards and a touchdown.

Missouri State kicked off its 108th season of varsity football on a promising note, driving 62 yards deep into

NAU territory on its initial offensive possession of the campaign, and limiting the Lumberjack offense to 10 rushing yards and three first downs in the first quarter, while registering key stops on each of NAU's first four third-down attempts of the night.

But Porter led the crucial outburst by the home team, tossing a 55-yard touchdown pass before reeling in an 8-yard scoring catch in the closing seconds of the second quarter to hand NAU a 20-6 halftime lead.

After Luis Aguilar booted his second field goal of the game to put NAU in from with 8:10 left in the half, Porter took a lateral pass from Cookus and found a wide-open Stacy Chukwumezie for a long scoring toss that gave the Lumberjacks a 13-3 advantage.

Parker Lacina answered with his second successful field goal to momentarily pull the Bears (0-1) back within one score, but a series of defensive miscues by MSU would open the door for one more NAU strike. Four total penalties—including three that directly led to Lumberjack first downs—set up Cookus' eight-yard

To the leaping Porter in the endzone with just 18 ticks left on the clock.

Despite turning in a strong defensive performance in the opening period, the Bears struggled to generate sustained drives over the game's first 30 minutes. NAU shackled the MSU ground game, holding the Bears to 38 rushing yards on 24 first-half carries. The Lumberjacks permitted just 109 yards of MSU offense in the half, limiting the Bears to 3-of-11 on third-down attempts.

Huslig engineered a pair of 75-yard scoring drives late in the contest, first connecting with Damoriea Vick for 13 yards and Jordan Murray for 26 to set up a 30-yard strike to Tyler Currie late in the third period. The senior signal-caller then found DJ Frost on a 24-yard toss with just over six minutes to play in the game. But the Bears could not overcome a stout NAU run defense that yielded just 40 rushing yards on MSU's 32

carries. The Lumberjacks also limited the MSU offense to 4-of-16 third-down conversions for the game.

NEW ORLEANS — Tulane used a balanced offensive attack and a stingy defensive effort to pull away for a 58-6 non-conference victory over Missouri State at Yulman Stadium. The Green Wave scored on five of its six offensive possessions in the first half and converted each of their three takeaways into touchdowns.

The Green Wave ground game rolled up 298 rushing yards and tallied six rushing touchdowns by four different players, led by Tyjae Spears' 89 yards. Amare Jones turned in a dominant all-around night for the Tulane offense as well, totaling 169 all-purpose yards, while quarterback Justin McMillan 171 total yards in the

The Bears generated just 11 first downs and 182 yards of total offense against the Tulane defense, which permitted just two third-down conversions in 12 attempts for the game. In contrast, the Green Wave moved the chains eight times in 15 combined third and fourth-down tries and finished the night with 540 yards of total

Tulane rode a strong early performances by Jones and McMillan to establish a 24-point advantage that the Bears would never seriously threaten. McMillan completed his first seven passes for 65 yards and added 17 rushing yards on five first-quarter carries, as the Green Wave scored on its first three offensive possessions. After Jones returned the opening kickoff 60 yards to the MSU 38, Merek Glover put the first points of the night on the board via a 23-yard field goal after the Bears' defense stiffened to stop McMillan on a third-and-six try

Tulane's defense stifled the MSU offense in the early stages of the game, forcing a three-and-out on the Bears' opening possession, then registering the first of two first-half interceptions on the second drive when Larry Brooks stepped in front of a Huslig pass at the Tulane 31.

Jones would strike for two more key blows on the Green Wave's ensuing two drives. After McMillan completed three passes for a total of 39 yards to start the drive, Jones scored on a rush from three yards out to cap the 11-play, 64-yard march with 4:37 left in the first. He then broke off a 57-yard run to stretch the lead to

17-0 on the second play of the second quarter.

P.J. Hall's interception and 30-yard return to pay dirt with 11:49 left in the half made it a 24-point bulge. The Bears answered with their lone score of the half, as Damoriea Vick's 25-yard run fueled the 75-yard drive. Huslig connected with Donovan Daniels on a screen for a 37-yard gain to the Tulane 11, then hit a wide-open DJ Frost for the touchdown with 9:51 on the clock.

But the Green Wave offense responded in a big way, using a pair of big Corey Dauphine runs to set up a four-yard scoring rush by McMillan that set off a string of 34 unanswered Tulane points to close the night. After another three-play possession and a Bears punt, McMillan scampered for 15 yards and completed a 17-yard strike to Kevin LeDee before taking it in from a yard out to hand Tulane a 38-6 edge at intermission.

SEPT. 21, PLASTER STADIUM, SPRINGFIELD, MO. GAME (6) KENNESAW STATE 35 3

SPRINGFIELD, Mo. -- After being held scoreless over the game's first 27 minutes, No. 6 Kennesaw State scored on three consecutive rushes to turn the tables on Missouri State in a 35-24 non-conference decision over the Bears at Robert W. Plaster Stadium.

MISSOURI STATE24

Isaac Foster spearheaded the Owls' outburst with a pair of long scoring runs, as KSU ultimately tallied 28 unanswered points to help turn a 13-point deficit into a double-digit advantage of its own. The sophomore rushed for a career-high 183 yards and combined with Bronson Rechsteiner (221 yards) for 404 of KSU's 479 yards on the ground.

Known as a ball control offense that entered the contest averaging over 35 minutes in time of possession per game, the Owls employed a quick-strike attack to kick-start their offense against the Bears. Foster broke up the Bears' shutout bid with a 75-yard late in the second quarter, then pulled the Owls to within two points with a 67-yard run on the first play of the second half.

KSU struck again on its next offensive snap, this time using an 85-yard run by Rechsteiner to seize the lead for good. One more long run—a 64-yard gain by Rechsteiner—to start the Owls' next offensive series set up a four-yard touchdown by Shaquil Terry that put the visitors on top 28-16 with 3:31 left in the third period.

Daniel David's four-yard run with just over six minutes to play made it a three-possession game, which would ultimately prove too much for the Bears to overcome. MSU's first non-conference home loss since September 2013 also extended the Bears' overall losing streak to eight consecutive games dating back to October of last season.

Missouri State built its 13-point first-half advantage—its largest lead of the 2019 season—behind a shut-down performance from its defense, which limited the Owls to 55 yards of total offense in the opening quarter. The Bears' defensive unit held KSU scoreless until the 2:31 mark of the second period, turning back the Owls on three separate drives in which the visitors advanced the ball into MSU territory.

Claudio Martin registered the biggest blow of the opening 30 minutes for the MSU defense, stripping David at the goal line before McNeece Egbim fell on the loose football just inside the Owls 1-yard line. Two plays later, Peyton Huslig tucked the ball and found daylight in the end zone to stretch MSU's lead to 13-0 with just under three minutes to play in the half.

After absorbing Foster's first scoring jaunt that momentarily sliced the margin back to six points, Huslig and the Bears engineered a 50-yard scoring drive to regain some breathing room heading into intermission. A pair of critical KSU penalties extended the drive, and Parker Lacina's 37-yard field goal as time expired extended the lead to 16-7.

But the Owls wasted no time in reversing the course of the contest, racking up 331 rushing yards on just 15 combined carries during the second and third quarters, including 213 on their six third-period rushes. In all, KSU topped the 400-yard rushing mark for the third time in four games this season and totaled 526 yards of offense for the afternoon.

MACOMB, III. -- Peyton Huslig matched career-highs with 28 completions and four passing touchdowns, while Kendall Stewart produced two go-ahead scores to help lead Missouri State to a 37-31 triple overtime win over Western Illinois in the Missouri Valley Conference opener for both squads.

Stewart's 22-yard jet sweep in the third overtime saw the senior tiptoe down the left sideline and into the endzone for what proved to be the game-winning score. Missouri State's ensuing two-point try failed, but the Bears defense held strong.

Needing a touchdown to tie, the Leathernecks committed two penalties on their decisive drive in the third OT with MSU standout Matt McClellan coming up with two big sacks, including one on the final play of the game to end WIU's comeback hopes.

The Bears finished with a season-high 429 yards of total offense with 26 first downs and more than 33 minutes in possession, not counting the overtimes.

Missouri State's defense was also on point in the conference debut, allowing the Leathernecks just 13 first downs and four third-down conversions.

Western accounted for two of its third-down successes – one of its two fourth-down conversions – on its final possession of regulation. Down 21-14, the Leathernecks changed quarterbacks and put the game on the shoulders of junior Connor Sampson. Sampson engineered a 13-play, 74-yard scoring drive that took more than six minutes to knot the score at 21 and force overtime.

The Leathernecks' final drive of regulation was aided by an MSU personal foul in the red zone and later by a fourth-and-goal surge from the one by Max Norris.

In overtime, the Bears got the ball first and immediately capitalized with Huslig connecting with Lorenzo

Thomas for a 25-yard TD strike on the first play. Parker Lacina's extra point gave Missouri State a 28-21 lead. Huslig, who eclipsed 5,000 career passing yards in the win, posted his third-highest passing total of his career and just his third 300-yard passing game.

On Western's first overtime possession, it took the Leathernecks nine plays and a fourth-and-12 conversion, but the home side ultimately tied it up with another one-yard rush by Norris.

Both teams settled for field goals in the second OT. WIU's Nathan Erickson kicked a 45-yarder after MSU's

defense pushed the home squad back to the 28 on three previous plays, then Lacina converted a short 20-yarder to tie the game, 31-31.

Stewart's winning touchdown in the third overtime came on the second play of the drive - just after a three-

yard gain by Donovan Daniels – and got the MSU defense riled up for its final stand of the night.

Daniels finished with a team-high 33 yards on 14 carries, while Thomas collected seven Huslig passes for 92 yards and a pair of scores – the first multiple touchdown game of his career.

McNeece Egbim ignited a solid effort by Missouri State's defense, racking up 15 tackles, 13 solos and a pair of pass break-ups in the Bears' first overtime victory since 2008.

SPRINGFIELD, Mo. -- Led by four touchdown tosses from Austin Simmons, South Dakota stretched its win streak to three consecutive games with a big second quarter, as well as a shutdown defensive effort that paved the way to a 45-10 victory over Missouri State at Robert W. Plaster Stadium.

After turning the ball over on their first offensive snap of the day, the Coyotes rebounded in a big way to score on five of their next six possessions as part of a string of 45 unanswered points. Simmons, the MVFC's top passer entering the game, threw for three first-half touchdowns, including two scoring passes as part of a 24-noint outburst over the first five minutes of the second quarter that banded the visitors the lead for good

24-point outburst over the first five minutes of the second quarter that handed the visitors the lead for good. Behind Simmons' 228 passing yards, USD rolled up 428 yards of total offense through three quarters, as a balanced Coyote offense netted 220 rushing yards and 232 yards through the air for the afternoon. The Coyote defense held the Bears scoreless for nearly 45 minutes, continuing its recent resurgence by forcing four turnovers and holding the MSU offense to 248 yards for the day.

Caleb Vander Esch was the recipient of two of Simmons' TD throws, hauling in a 56-yarder to open the USD scoring, as well as a 29-yard catch in the second quarter.

The day started on a promising note for the Bears, who took advantage of a Kai Henry fumble to score on a four-yard Peyton Huslig touchdown pass to Jordan Murray five minutes into the game.

But Simmons and Vander Esch would team up to inflict the bulk of the damage on the Bears during a 71-yard drive that would pull the Coyotes even. After Vander Esch reeled in a five-yard catch to start the drive, Simmons found his junior receiver again for a 56-yard scoring pass.

After both defenses flexed their collective muscles to hold the offenses in check for the remainder of the

After both defenses flexed their collective muscles to hold the offenses in check for the remainder of the opening quarter, Simmons sparked the Coyotes once again in the closing moments of the period. His 19-yard completion to Brett Samson set up a 38-yard Mason Lorber field goal that gave USD the lead for the first time.

completion to Brett Samson set up a 38-yard Mason Lorber field goal that gave USD the lead for the first time. The Coyotes employed a quick-strike attack to find pay dirt on each of its next three series, beginning with a 57-yard bolt by Ben Klett that set up Simmons' eight-yard TD pass to Drew Greenhaw with 11:51 left on the first-half clock. USD's defense, which had allowed just six combined points in its last two games, delivered as well with three first-half takeaways. After a Bears fumble on the first play of MSU's ensuing drive, Simmons wasted no time in adding to the lead, connecting with Vander Esch on a back-breaking 29-yard throw on the next play from scrimmage for a 24-7 USD advantage.

Jack Cochrane, who recovered the first MSU fumble of the day on the previous drive, registered another

Jack Cochrane, who recovered the first MSU fumble of the day on the previous drive, registered another takeaway with an interception and 40-yard return to the MSU 4 to set up another short field for the Coyotes. USD would need just two Henry carries to push the bulge to 24 points with just over 10 minutes to play in the half.

South Dakota kept its momentum going after intermission, using lengthy drives to reach the end zone on each of its first two offensive possession of the third period.

FARGO, N.D. — Despite a strong defensive effort that saw Missouri State hold one of the nation's top offenses in check, North Dakota State locked up its 28th consecutive victory with a 22-0 blanking of the Bears at Gate City Bank Field at the Fargodome.

Led by McNecce Egbim's game-high 14 tackles, Missouri State's defense enjoyed one of its best performances of the season, holding the top-ranked Bison to a season-low point total, while forcing a season-high seven punts by the two-time defending national champions.

But a pair of early NDSU touchdowns and a stout defensive showing of their own was enough for the Bison to extend the second-longest winning streak in FCS history. Quarterback Trey Lance completed 21-of-31 passes for 225 yards, while rushing for 79 yards and the go-ahead touchdown in the first quarter.

Paced by Adam Cofield's 93 yards and two rushing touchdowns, NDSU gained 222 ground yards, while the Bison defense held the Bears' running game to just 21 yards on 20 carries for the game.

The NDSU defense set the tone for the afternoon with a dominating opening 30 minutes of play, limiting the Bears to 12 rushing yards (on nine carries) and 121 yards of total offense in the first half. Peyton Huslig started the game 8-for-11 through the air and directed the MSU offense into Bison territory on three straight possessions, but each time NDSU stood its ground to force punts and keep the Bears off the scoreboard.

Lance combined with Cofield to amass 255 yards of total offense in the opening half. NDSU's redshirt freshman signal-caller scrambled for a 21-yard touchdown run to cap the initial Bison scoring drive midway through the first period, before James Hendricks added a successful two-point conversion run to hand the home club an 8-0 lead.

Cofield provided both the initial spark and the exclamation point on an 87-yard drive early in the second quarter, breaking free for a 58-yard run after Brendan Withrow pinned NDSU at its own nine yard line with a 45-yard punt. The MSU defense appeared to come up with a critical fourth-down stop at the Bears 29, but a subsequent offsides penalty gave the Bison new life. Cofield ran for 15 yards to move NDSU inside the 10, and Kobe Johnson carried the ball to the mouth of the goal line to set up Cofield's one-yard scoring run with 9.44 left in the half.

The Bison defense would perform the heavy lifting from that point, permitting just eight total yards in the third period and 64 yards in the second half.

Cofield added a second one-yard touchdown run with just under six minutes remaining in the game to account for the only second-half points.

Huslig completed 20-of-37 passes for 164 yards, marking his fourth straight game with at least 20 completions—the longest such streak of his MSU career. Damoriea Vick reeled in six of those completions for 72 yards to lead all receivers.

SPRINGFIELD, Mo. -- Despite a second-straight standout performance from its defense, Missouri State came up on the short end of a 29-6 decision against No. 11 UNI at Robert W. Plaster Stadium. The Panthers turned a pair of special teams turnovers into nine points as part of a 19-point second-quarter surge that proved to be

the difference in the Bears' 2019 Homecoming contest.

UNI stifled the Missouri State offense, blanking the Bears through three quarters while allowing just 74 yards of offense and four first downs over the first 45 minutes of the contest.

Will McElvain passed for 238 yards to lead the Panthers offense, rushing for one touchdown and throwing for another as part of UNI's second-period outburst. The redshirt freshman quarterback connected with Valley receptions leader Isaiah Weston on a pair of long scoring passes, including a 70-yarder late in the third quarter

that stretched the margin to 29 points.

Missouri State's defense rose to the occasion against a Top 25 foe for the second week in a row, limiting the Panthers to 315 yards of total offense and 12 first downs for the game. The Bears shut down the UNI ground game, holding the Panthers to 77 yards—a season-low by an MSU opponent—and just 2-of-14 on third-down conversion attempts.

The loss marked the sixth-consecutive home loss for Missouri State, matching a program-record by the

Bears as a Division I program.

After the two defenses dominated the opening 15 minutes of play, UNI broke the scoring seal 11 seconds into the second quarter on a 49-yard Matthew Cook field goal that capped a 13-play, 50-yard drive for the Panthers. McElvain completed four consecutive passes to four different receivers, including a 12-yard toss to Suni Lane that set the Panthers up with a first down at the MSU 29.

The first of two critical special teams miscues promptly fueled another Panther scoring opportunity as a fumble on a muffed punt return gave UNI the ball at the MSU 20. Once again, the Missouri State defense responded, stopping the Panthers on third and goal to force a 22-yard Cook field goal at the 8:10 mark.

A second Bears fumble on the ensuing kickoff fueled another Panther scoring chance, with McElvain car-rying the ball in from six yards out two plays later to make it a 12-0 contest. The UNI quarterback gashed the Bears once more with just under four minutes left in the half, threading the ball through a pair of defenders to Weston for a 46-yard touchdown that gave his club a 19-0 advantage.

UNI kept the pressure on the MSU offense in the second half, holding the Bears to a single first down and

just 28 yards in the third period. After Cook drilled his third field goal of the day from 38 yards out to open the second-half scoring, McElvain's 70-yard strike to Weston with 4:12 left in the quarter made it a 29-0 game.

MSU engineered its first scoring drive in over 122 minutes of clock time spanning three games early in the

fourth quarter. Huslig complete four straight passes, including a 16-yarder to Jordan Murray and a 20-yard toss to Antwan Woods, to spark the 15-play march that spanned more than eight minutes and 90 yards.

SPRINGFIELD, Mo. -- South Dakota State used a balanced offensive attack and a shutdown effort by its defense to make a 14-point first-half lead stand in an eventual 35-14 victory over Missouri State at Róbert W. Plaster Stadium.

The fourth-ranked Jackrabbits scored the first 21 points of the afternoon and racked up 526 yards of total offense for the game, while the SDSU defense forced three turnovers, held the Bears scoreless for three quarters and permitted just 249 yards in all.

Jeremiah Wilson provided an offensive spark in his first live action of the 2019 season, rushing for 87 yards on 12 carries. The sophomore running back, who was sidelined for the first seven games of the year with a knee injury, put MSU on the board with a 57-yard scoring run early in the fourth period.

Cade Johnson hauled in five catches for 164 yards, including a back-breaking 89-yard scoring catch to help seal the outcome, while Pierre Strong and C.J. Wilson combined for 196 yards on the ground to lead

the Jacks' offense. Three SDSU passers combined for 294 yards and two touchdowns through the air, as the

Jacks handed the Bears their fourth home loss in as many games at Plaster Stadium this season.

The Jacks overcame a stout effort from the MSU defense to register a pair of scoring drives and take a 14-0 lead into intermission. The duo of quarterback Keaton Heide and receiver Adam Anderson stung the Bears with a pair of critical completions, the first of which covered the final 10 yards of SDSU's 67-yard scoring drive midway through the first quarter. After Johnson broke off a 19-yard scamper, and C.J. Wilson carried the all 17 yards to the MSU 10, Heide guided a pass through traffic to Anderson in the end zone to hand the Jacks an early 6-0 lead

Heide and Anderson teamed up again in the second period to help add to the SDSU lead, connecting for a 44-yard gain to the MSU 11. Strong rushed three times for 25 yards on the 72-yard drive, before Mikey Daniels carried it in from a yard out to cap the scoring march with just under five minutes to play in the half.

MSU's defense came through in the early stages of the contest, coming up with a stop on third-and-short

at the MSU 27, with Darius Joseph and Claudio Martin stuffing Daniel for no gain to force a punt. The Bears stopped the Jacks' offense on third down three more times in the half, and kept SDSU off the scoreboard with a key stand deep in their own territory after Manchigiah's interception and 16-yard return set his offense up at

the MSU 24 late in the second quarter.

The Jacks added to their lead with another strong defensive effort, as well as a 41-yard C.J. Wilson scoring run late in the third period, stretching the margin to 21-0.

But the Bears would answer early in the fourth, using a big play from a new face in the lineup to cut into the SDSU lead. Playing in his first game of the 2019 season, Jeremiah Wilson broke free for a 57-yard touchdown rush—the longest play from scrimmage by any Bear this season—to slice the Jacks' lead back to 14 with 13:22 to play in the contest.

CARBONDALE, III. -- Missouri State fell behind 30-0 midway through its Missouri Valley Football Conference matchup at Southern Illinois, which proved to be the difference in a 37-14 defeat at the hands of the rival

Southern Illinois racked up 395 yards of total offense in the first half – and 555 for the game – to dominate the line of scrimmage early. The Salukis scored on five-of-six first-half possessions and were solid in every

The home side, which finished with 26 first downs, wasted no time getting the scoring started. The Salukis put the first points on the board less than two minutes into the game after blocking a Bears' punt and punching it in two plays later. Kare Lyles hit Landon Lenoir from 14 yards out to make it a 6-0 game out of the gates.

Later in the opening quarter, SIU cashed in on a fourth-and-two from the MSU 34 with a 34-yard TD pass to Jacob Garrett to make it a 13-0 game. The score came on the heels of a huge third-down stop by Eric Johnson and Claudio Martin, but the Salukis turned down the short-field punt to go for it, and the gamble paid off.

Lenoir and Lyles connected again early in the second quarter to cap an impressive 87-yard scoring drive with a 15-yard scoring pass to make it a 20-0 game. Later in the second quarter, Lyles threw a 34-yard TD strike to Avante Cox before he marched the home club 73 yards on the final possession of the half to set up a 24-yard field goal by Nico Gualdoni to make it 30-0 at the break.

Missouri State's best scoring chance in the first half came late in the second quarter with Huslig and Myron

Mason helping push the Bears deep into SIU territory. Facing a fourth-and-five from the Saluki seven and down 20-0 at the time, MSU elected to attempt a 24-yard field goal, which sailed just right to keep the Bears off the scoreboard. Missouri State's 62-yard, 12-play drive was its best of the opening half.

Tyler Lovelace's third interception of the campaign set up a 10-yard scoring pass from Peyton Huslig to Lorenzo Thomas five plays later to get the Bears on the board less than five minutes into the third quarter. Later in the period, Darius Joseph's interception return to the Southern Illinois 29 gave the visitors fresh

hope. Eight plays later, the Bears faced a fourth-and-three from the nine but ultimately turned it over on downs when Huslig's pass for Damoriea Vick sailed just out of his reach.

On their final drive of the night, Huslig helped engineer a 58-yard scoring drive to find pay dirt once again. This time, a seven-yard strike to tight end Jordan Murray put the exclamation point on the 10-play march. It was the seventh career TD reception for the sophomore standout.

With the pair of second-half scoring strikes, Huslig moved into a tie for second place on Missouri State's career touchdown passing list with 36. He matched Jeremy Hoog (1994-97) and Mitch Ware (1976-79) for the No. 2 spot on the all-time MSU chart, trailing only Cody Kirby (2007-10) who passed 47 TDs in his tenure. Lyles finished 18-of-24 for 232 yards and four TD strikes, including a 13-yard pass to Cox in the fourth

quarter for SIU's final score. Lenoir caught nine passes, all in the first half, for 124 yards with Cox also scoring twice and finishing with five receptions for 67 yards.

NORMAL, III. – Fueled by a last-minute goal-line stand that capped a dominant day by its defense, No. 7 Illinois State escaped Hancock Stadium with a 17-12 victory over Missouri State.

Despite forcing a season-high four turnovers and limiting ISU to 238 yards of offense, the Bears could not overcome a pair of early Brady Davis touchdown passes and a shutdown effort by the Redbird defense in dropping their sixth-consecutive Missouri Valley Football Conference game.

The thrilling finish followed a clutch effort by MSU's defense down the stretch, as the Bears forced turnovers

on two-straight Redbird possessions late in the game. Kam Carter picked off a Jack Baltz pass to give the Bears the football at the ISU 47 with just over three minutes left in regulation, but ISU's defense would respond, stopping the MSU offense on four-consecutive plays to regain possession of the ball.

But Angelo Garbutt, who accounted for two of the Bears four takeaways, stripped James Robinson at the ISU 45, and Tyler Lovelace scooped up the loose ball to give the Bears new life at the Redbird 32 with 2:17 left on the clock. Huslig hit Damoriea Vick for a six-yard completion, then rushed for six more yards to move the first-down marker. The Bears' senior signal-caller then connected with Jordan Murray for a 12-yard gain that moved the ball to the ISU 8 with just over a minute to play.

Huslig scrambled for five yards to the Redbird 3 on first down, but the ISU pass defense stiffened, forcing a pair of incompletions to bring up fourth and goal. After rolling to his right, Huslig was caught from behind by Luther Kirk for a nine-yard sack at the 12, ending MSU's last-minute threat and effectively sealing the outcome.

ISU held the Bears to 1-of-11 conversions on third down and sacked Huslig five times, with Tuvone Clark and Zek Vandenburgh each accounting for 2.0 sacks, and Dylan Draka leading the Redbirds' with nine tackles. Illinois State opened the scoring with a 10-play, 51-yard drive midway through the first quarter, after the Redbird defense picked off Huslig for the second consecutive possession. ISU used its potent ground attack to move the ball into the red zone, with Davis and Robinson accounting for 46 rushing yards on eight combined carries to start the drive. Davis then found a wide-open Kacper Rutkiewicz in the end zone for a five-yard scor-

ing pass on a first-and-goal play-action call.

Jeremiah Wilson answered with the longest scoring run by a Bear in over two years on the next play from

Jeremiah Wilson answered with the longest scoring run by a Bear in over two years on the next play from scrimmage, breaking free for a 74-yard scoring burst.

Davis helped engineer another ISU scoring march late in the opening period, connecting with five different receivers to finish 5-of-5 for 58 yards through the air during the 76-yard drive. His 26-yard completion to Tanner Taula moved the Redbirds into MSU territory, before his eight-yard toss to Tristan Bailey on the first play of the second quarter capped the drive and handed ISU a 14-6 edge.

Led by a defense that held the Redbirds to 156 first-half yards, Missouri State capitalized on a Garbutt interception at the ISU 25 to cut into the home team's lead. Parker Lacina converted a 38-yard field goal to pull the Bears within five points as the MSU defense limited ISU a 3 second quarter varde fely offense.

HEAD COACH FIFTH SEASON AT MSU

On Dec. 14, 2014, MSU Director of Athletics Kyle Moats and President Clif M. Smart III announced the hire of former University of Missouri associate head coach and defensive coordinator Dave Steckel as Missouri State's 20th head football coach.

In his first four years leading the MSU program, Steckel and his talented staff set about the task of overhauling a young Bears squad, heavily emphasizing the fundamental aspects of the game. Capitalizing on a renewed enthusiasm surrounding the MSU program, Steckel laid the groundwork for enhancing relations with area high school coaches, engaging the community and raising the bar with his "Bear Up" mentality. The efforts paid off at the gate, as the Bears drew an average of 10,067 fans per game over the 2015-16 seasons.

Last fall, Steckel led the Bears to a 3-1 start and the program's first Top 25 ranking in four years, despite facing a difficult early schedule that included three ranked foes in the season's first month. MSU knocked off No. 20 Northern Arizona with a dominant 40-8 performance on Sept. 15, then topped No. 9 Illinois State in a 24-21 thriller two weeks later to earn the No. 24 spot in the STATS FCS poll. In all, five Bears would earn All-Missouri Valley Football Conference honors at the conclusion of the season, including tight end Jordan Murray, who became the second MSU player to garner All-America (HERO Sports Freshman team) status during Steckel's tenure. In 2017, the Bears registered dramatic signs of

improvement, particularly on the offensive side of the football. MSU's ground attack, led by dual-threat quarterback Peyton Huslig, led The Valley in rushing during league play throughout most of the Valley season. The Bears ultimately finished sixth overall in the MVFC in rushing yards per game (169.4 ypg.), posting a 32-percent increase in total rushing yards per outing from 2016.

The MSU special teams thrived once again, ranking among the Valley's top three units in kickoff return average, punt return average, punt average and field goals made per game.

On the field in 2016, the Bears engineered a three-win turnaround from the previous fall, bolting from the gate with wins in three of their first four games, including victories in their first two road contests against FCS competition.

MŠU knocked off No. 24 Indiana State in Terre Haute in its 2016 Valley opener, handing the Bears their first victory over a ranked foe since Oct. 19, 2013 (vs. No. 15 South Dakota State) and the program's first win vs. a Top 25 squad on the road since an Oct. 20, 2012 decision over No. 11 Illinois State in Normal. The win also represented the largest margin of victory against a ranked road foe in the 105-year history of the program.

Individually, seven Bears garnered All-MVFC recognition, led by repeat first-teamers Dylan Cole and Deion Holliman. Cole was a unanimous firstteam All-America selection and finished third in the balloting for the Buck Buchanan Award, completing his four-year Missouri State career as the FCS's leading tackler before signing a free agent deal with the NFL's Houston Texans in April.

Steckel brings 37 years of coaching experience into the 2019 season, including 14 seasons at Mizzou, in which he helped transform the Tigers defense into one of the strongest units in the nation. He was the only defensive coach among the five finalists for the 2014 Frank Broyles Award as the nation's top assistant coach. He helped produce a total of 15 all-conference linebacker selections at MU, including a number of players who have forged professional careers in the National Football League.

Under Steckel's tutelage, Missouri's defense was a driving force in the Tigers' back-to-back Southeastern Conference East Division titles in 2013 and 2014. MU led the SEC and ranked 10th nationally in sacks per game in 2014. The Tiger defense finished first or second in every major statistical category in SEC play last fall en route to propelling Mizzou to its fifth conference divisional championship in eight seasons.

MU also ranked 23rd in the country in total de-

fense and 19th in scoring defense in 2014, while the Tigers led the SEC in total defense (300.8 yds/game).

In 2013, the MU defense was fifth nationally in interceptions (20), eighth in total turnovers forced (32), and an SEC-best 2.93 sacks per game. This boosted the Tigers to a 12-win season and a Cotton Bowl victory over Oklahoma State.

Individually, "Stec" currently has 10 different Mizzou defenders playing in the NFL, including five who earned All-America recognition since his elevation to defensive coordinator in 2009.

Overall, Steckel helped coach Missouri to 10 bowl appearances during his tenure in Columbia, including five seasons with 10 or more wins. The Tigers compiled a 112-66 (.629) overall record in his 14 seasons, while their five divisional titles since 2007 tied Alabama and Florida State for the top total in the NCAA Division I FBS ranks during that stretch.

Steckel joined Gary Pinkel's coaching staff at

MU in 2001 after spending five seasons as a defensive line and linebackers coach at Rutgers University. With the Scarlet Knights, Steckel coached a pair of All-Big East performers, both of whom went on to play in the NFL

Prior to joining head coach Terry Shea's Rutgers staff, Steckel worked with Pinkel at Toledo for four years, highlighted by the Rockets' undefeated 1995 season that included a Mid-American Conference title and a No. 24 final ranking. He tutored six All-MAC selections as UT's defensive line coach, including Dan Williams, who was picked 11th overall by Denver in the 1993 NFL Draft.

A Fullerton, Pa., native, Steckel served as assistant head coach and offensive coordinator at Dickinson College from 1986-87 and made a stop at Lehigh before heading to Toledo. He broke into the coaching ranks with stops at Miami (Ohio), Ball State and Minnesota

Steckel is the younger brother of longtime NFL coach Les Steckel. He served in the United States Marine Corps from 1975-78 and played four seasons as an offensive lineman at Kutztown University, where he graduated with a bachelor's degree in elementary education in 1982. Steckel also earned a master's degree from Miami (Ohio).

Steckel and his wife, Mary Beth, have a daugh-
