- Missouri State will be looking for its seventh-consecutive opening day win Friday; the Bears are 24-12 in openers under head coach **Keith Guttin** and 36-19 overall in season lid-lifters
- The Bears, who return 19 letterwinner's from last year's 40-17 Missouri Valley Conference regular-season and post season tournament championship squad, were tabbed the league's preseason favorite by the MVC head coaches
- The Bears bring a 3-4 all-time record against the field into this weekend's tournament, including a 2-0 mark against host Texas State, a 1-1 ledger vs. Nevada and an 0-3 record against Utah
- MSU will be making its 14th season-opening trip to the state of Texas in the last 18 years; MSU has gone 14-7 in the Lone Star State since the start of the 2015 season and is 61-61 all-time on Texas soil
- MSU's **Ben Whetstone** will bring a career-best 13-game hit streak into 2019; the Bears' first baseman has hit .340 (18-for-53) over the course of his streak (since May 11) and has reached base safely in 21 straight contests (April 24)
- The Bears' roster features three different returners who have earned All-America recognition during their respective MSU careers, led by 2019 preseason *Collegiate Baseball* All-America picks **Drew Millas** and **Connor Sechler**
- MSU has 80 combined come-from-behind wins over the last four seasons and went 13-2 in one-run games in 2018
- The Bears have posted a 85-38 (.691) regular-season non-conference mark over the last four seasons
- MSU has outscored its opening-game opponents by a combined 53-11 margin over the course of its six-game, opening-day win streak, including a 32-4 margin in its last three such victories against Central Arkansas (12-1), Rhode Island (12-1) and Texas Southern (8-2)

LEADING OFF

The **Missouri State Bears** will open their 2019 season this weekend when they travel to San Marcos, Texas to take part in the **Texas State Tournament** at Bobcat Ballpark. The Bears will kick off their 56th season of varsity baseball Friday (Feb. 15) with a 12 p.m. game against the **Nevada Wolf Pack**, before taking on the **Utah Utes** Saturday at Noon, and the host **Texas State Bobcats** at 3 p.m. Sunday to conclude the weekend.

This weekend's action marks the first of three consecutive road trips for the Bears to open the new campaign. Following a midweek trip to Tulsa to face Oral Roberts next Tuesday (Feb. 19), MSU will travel to San Diego next weekend, where the Bears will face off against a trio of West Coast powers—including two former national champions—as part of the Tony Gwynn Legacy (Feb. 22-24), hosted jointly by San Diego State University and the University of San Diego.

SERIES HISTORIES

All seven of Missouri State's previous meetings with its three opponents have taken place in the state of Texas. The Bears have enjoyed success in their series with Texas State, winning single contests in San Marcos in their two most recent trips to TSU. MSU emerged victorious with a 3-2 win in 11 innings to open the 2013 campaign, after claiming a 12-8 slugfest from the Bobcats in their season-opening trip to TSU in 2011.

MSU will be looking to gain the upper hand in its series with Nevada Friday, as the two programs have split their only two previous meetings, both of which occurred during the 1997 season. Each of the two contests were decided by a single run, with the Wolf Pack claiming a 7-6 decision in the season opener for both clubs in Houston on Feb. 14, before the Bears returned the favor in late May as part of NCAA Regional play with a 10-9 victory in Lubbock, Texas.

The Bears are seeking their first-ever victory over Utah, which has claimed each of the previous three games in the series. Most recently, the Utes picked up a 7-3 win over MSU in Arlington, Texas, on March 9, 2014.

LIFTING THE LID

Missouri State is 24-12 in season openers under head coach **Keith Guttin** and 36-19 overall as a program in such contests. MSU is just 17-18 all-time in road/neutral field season openers, but will be looking for its seventh-straight opening day victory away from home Friday. The Bears have outscored their last three opening-day opponents by a combined 32-4 margin with matching 12-1 wins over Central Arkansas (2016) and Rhode Island (2017), before topping Texas Southern by an 8-2 count to open the 2018 campaign.

They have also rallied for victories four times during their current six-game, opening-day win streak. MSU has employed a potent offense in its openers in recent years, tallying an average of 10 runs per outing in its last five season debuts. Additionally, this weekend's action will mark the 19th consecutive year the Bears have opened on the road. MSU has swept its season-opening slate of action in two of the last four seasons, going 3-0 in Nacogdoches, Texas in 2015 prior to a 2016 three-game sweep in Conway. The Bears have started each of the last eight campaigns with at least six wins in their first 10 games, including their best-ever start (10-1) to a season in 2017.

ROAD TO SUCCESS

MSU has proven to be hard to stop on the road over the past four seasons, logging a 67-36 (.650) record in such contests. Including their 24-9 record in neutral-field games over the same stretch, the Bears have gone 91-45 (.669) away from Hammons Field since the start of the 2015 season.

The Bears went 14-8 in true road games a year ago, after logging 19 road wins in 2017 and a program-record 21 wins in 27 road contests in 2015. MSU's 0.857 win percentage on the road that year represented its best since 1978, when it posted an identical percentage with a 12-2 road mark. Coupled with their 9-3 record in neutral field contests in 2015, the Bears' total of 30 wins away from home was second only to national champion Virginia in the Division I ranks and qualified as the best in school history. The Bears also posted the longest road win streak in Division I baseball in 2015, claiming 11-straight victories from March 15 to April 25.

MILLAS, SECHLER HONORED

After earning All-America honors to spearhead the Bears' 2018 MVC title run, both **Drew Millas** and **Connor Sechler** were tabbed for 2019 preseason All-America honors by *Collegiate Baseball*. Millas posted a career year in helping the Bears to their second consecutive Valley regular-season championship last spring, posting team-best figures for batting (.321), hits (68) and RBIs (61) en route to earning first-team All-MVC and second-team All-America honors from the NCBWA. The catcher/DH recorded 18 multi-hit games and 18 multi-RBI efforts, as well as three separate four-hit games as a sophomore.

Sechler was a freshman All-America choice of both Collegiate Baseball and the NCBWA after anchoring the Bears' bullpen with eight saves and a 2.98 earned run average in 2018. The right-hander limited the opposition to a combined .208 batting average, while striking out 59 hitters in 54.1 innings over an MSU freshman-record 32 appearances.

BIG BEN RINGING LOUDLY

First baseman **Ben Whetstone** will enter the 2019 season looking to pick up right where he left off last spring. The junior brings a 13-game hit streak into the year after leading the Bears charge to the MVC Championship title. The Overland Park, Kan., native has hit .340 (18-for-53) with a pair of homers and 14 RBIs since May 11 of last year. Whetstone locked up Valley Tourney MVP honors after registering a series of crucial hits and eight total RBIs to help MSU sweep its four games in Dallas. He logged a career-best four RBIs in the Bears' opening-game win over Evansville, then produced a game-tying, two-run double in the title game against DBU.

Whetstone, who started all 57 games for the Bears at first base last season, also excelled in the field, registering a .992 fielding percentage, with just four miscues in 491 defensive chances on the year.

VALLEY FORECAST

Highlighted by three selections to the 2019 Preseason All-Missouri Valley Conference Baseball Team, Missouri State was the choice of the league's head coaches to claim its third-consecutive conference crown. Leading the Bears' contingent of three preseason All-MVC choices were returning first-team all-conference picks catcher/DH **Drew Millas** and reliever **Connor Sechler**, while reigning MVC Championship Most Outstanding Player **Ben Whetstone** also picked up a nod at first base.

The Bears, ranked as high as No. 24 in *Collegiate Baseball's* Preseason Poll, captured their third NCAA Regional berth in four seasons last spring after becoming just the second Valley school to win back-to-back regular-season titles (joining Wichita State). MSU (59 points) garnered five of the eight first-place votes to edge DBU for the top spot by just one point. The Patriots, who received two first-place votes, out-gained No. 3 Indiana State (49), which picked up the other first-place vote, while Bradley (39) rounded out the top half of the preseason poll.

TITLE TOWN

Missouri State wrapped up one of the more dominant performances in Missouri Valley Conference history with its fourth league tournament title last spring. The Bears swept the Valley Championship field for the second time in four years, logging a 10-0 shutout of Evansville, two comeback wins over Indiana State and a 10-inning, walk-off win over host DBU.

MSU, which also captured its sixth regular-season Valley title and 10th conference championship overall under the direction of Dan Callahan MVC Coach of the Year Keith Guttin, capped off an unprecedented run of success against MVC foes. The Bears went 18-3 during league play, running their two-year MVC mark to 36 wins in 40 total conference games. Coupled with their 4-0 week at the Valley Tournament, the Bears have won 43 of their 49 total contests against MVC foes over the last two seasons.

HAND THEM THE HARDWARE

Headlined by four first-team selections, a total of nine Missouri State baseball players were selected for 2018 All-Missouri Valley Conference honors by the league's head coaches, while MSU head coach **Keith Guttin** was tapped as the Dan Callahan MVC Coach of the Year for the seventh time.

Missouri State's four selections for the Valley's top postseason squad, including designated hitter **Drew Millas**, second baseman **John Privitera**, starting pitcher **Dylan Coleman** and reliever **Connor Sechler**, bring the Bears' total number of first-team All-MVC honorees to 65 since MSU joined the league in 1991. MSU also placed four players on the Valley's second team, with third baseman **Matt Brown**, shortstop **Jeremy Eierman**, outfielder **Hunter Steinmetz** and starting pitcher **Ty Buckner** earning all-conference honors. Sophomore pitcher **Logan Wiley** picked up honorable mention recognition, while Steinmetz took home an MVC All-Defensive Team honor as well.

IN RARE COMPANY

With Missouri State's 4-2 win over Indiana State at the 2018 MVC Championship, Bears head coach **Keith Guttin** moved past Jack Stallings for sole possession of the No. 20 spot on the NCAA's Division I career coaching wins list.

With a career record of 1,259-776 (.619), Guttin needs 12 more wins to catch legendary Miami coach Ron Fraser (1,271) in the 19th position on the chart. Guttin is the second-winningest coach in MVC history, while his win total ranks fifth among all active Division I head coaches entering the 2019 season, his 37th at the Bears' helm.

CARDIAC CUBS

Missouri State has made a habit of eliminating leads over the last three seasons, and its late-season hot streak last spring highlighted this trend. The Bears rallied for comeback wins in each of their final three games at the MVC Championship, as well as their NCAA Regional victory over Saint Louis, and have now totaled 80 come-from-behind victories since the start of the 2015 season.

NON-CON DOMINATION

MSU has been nearly unstoppable against non-conference competition over the last three seasons, compiling an 85-38 (.691) record in regular-season games versus non-league foes since the start of the 2015 season. The Bears, who have won 38 of their last 53 regular-season non-conference home games, outscoring their non-league opponents by a 786-494 margin at Hammons Field over the same stretch.

ONE-RUN FUN

Missouri State was proficient in one-run affairs last spring, with wins in 13 of its 15 one-run decisions. That mark represented a turnaround from the Bears' combined 9-15 record in one-run affairs over the previous two seasons. MSU claimed wins in all five of its one-run home contests last season, while also posting a 5-0 mark in one-run games in MVC play.

MSU pitching was dominant in the Bears' 15 one-run games, limiting the opposition to a .216 batting mark. **Connor Sechler** factored in eight one-run victories, posting a 5-0 mark with three saves and a 1.82 ERA in 24.2 combined innings. **Jake Lochner** was equally as effective, turning in five scoreless appearances during MSU one-run victories.

BEARS IN THE PRO RANKS

Three Missouri State baseball standouts reached contractual agreements with professional organizations after being selected in the 2018 Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft. Second-round pick **Jeremy Eierman** agreed to terms with the Oakland Athletics after the club selected the two-time All-American shortstop 70th overall in the June draft, while fellow MSU juniors **Dylan Coleman** (fourth round) and **Hunter Steinmetz** (11th round) followed suit by reaching deals with San Diego and Toronto, respectively. Eierman and Coleman became the 14th and 15th Bears to be taken in the top 10 rounds of the MLB Draft over the last decade.

Additionally, former Missouri State baseball standout **Matt Hall** became the 20th Bear to receive a call up to the big leagues last year. Hall became the fourth former Bear to earn a Major League roster spot, following **Luke Voit** and **Pierce Johnson** in 2017, and **Buddy Baumann** in 2016.

BEARS ON RADIO

Once again in 2019, Meyer Communications is slated to provide live radio coverage of all 56 Missouri State regular-season games, plus all Bears' games in the Missouri Valley Conference Tournament and any 2019 postseason play. The broadcasts can be heard primarily on **KBFL 1060 AM** and **96.9 FM** in Springfield with Art Hains, Ben Goss and Corey Riggs describing the action. An online audio stream is available through KBFL's website via RadioSpringfield.com.

BEARS ON ESPN

Missouri State University, in conjunction with SIDEARM Sports, launched a new partnership in August 2016, unveiling a reconstructed **MissouriStateBears.com**, the official MSU Athletics web site. The revamped MissouriStateBears.com will provide MSU fans with improved features and overall customer service. The new-and-improved site uses the latest technology to provide fans with a seamless, robust experience unique to Missouri State University.

In 2015, ESPN and the Missouri Valley Conference announced a 10-year extension to their current media rights agreement that will provide increased coverage of conference events across ESPN platforms through the 2023-24 academic year. Fans can keep tabs on the Bears through **The Valley on ESPN**. As part of the deal, ESPN, the MVC and its 10 member institutions will work jointly to develop in-house production capabilities at each campus that will provide significant coverage for multiple sports on ESPN+/ESPN3.



RETIRED NUMBERS



Bill Rowe

On Saturday, May 8, 2004, former head baseball coach and director of athletics **Bill Rowe** became the first person in the 48-year history of the MSU baseball program to have his number retired.

Rowe guided the baseball Bears as head coach for 19 years from the start of the program in 1964 through its final season in NCAA Division II in 1982. He led the Bears to a 394-230-1 record and four Division II College World Series appearances. Under Rowe, the Bears finished as national runners-up in 1969 and finished third nationally in 1970 (just the sixth and seventh years of the program). As athletic director, Rowe guided the Bears from

Division II to Division I and saw the Bears change leagues from the MIAA and Mid-Continent Conferences to a current membership in the Missouri Valley Conference.

The retirement ceremony for Rowe's jersey was held prior to the Bears' doubleheader against Illinois State.

The indoor practice facility at Hammons Field also bears Rowe's name as of January 30, 2010.



Ryan Howard

On Dec. 18, 2010, Missouri State retired the No. 6 jersey of former Bear and 2006 National League Most Valuable Player **Ryan Howard** at JQH Arena.

A St. Louis native who played at Missouri State from 1999-2001, Howard finished his collegiate career with 50 home runs, 183 RBIs and a .335 career average in 172 games. He was the 1999 Missouri Valley Conference Freshman of the Year and MSU's A.E. "Ted" Willis Most Valuable Player in 2000.

Since being drafted by Philadelphia in the fifth round of the 2001 draft, Howard has enjoyed a standout professional career. His long list of accomplishments as a member of

the Phillies includes 2005 National League Rookie of the Year, 2006 NL MVP, 2006 Home Run Derby champion, 2008 World Series champion, 2009 NLCS MVP and three All-Star selections.

Howard debuted with the Phillies in 2004, accumulating a career batting average of .258 with 382 homers and 1,194 RBIs in 1,572 MLB games over 13 seasons.

One of the most successful baseball coaches in Missouri Valley Conference history, **Keith Guttin** began his MSU head coaching career in 1983, and has spent the past 36 seasons building the Bears into one of the top programs in the country. Under Guttin, the Bears have won 61 percent of their games, averaging 35 victories a year and racking up 12 different 40-win seasons.

Guttin, who will enter the 2019 season fifth among active Division I head coaches in career victories, has been a part of the MSU baseball program as a player, assistant coach and head coach for 41 of the program's 55 years. He took the helm of Bears baseball at the start of the 1983 season, coinciding with the move of Missouri State athletics to Division I status. He inherited the reins of the program from its only previous head baseball coach, former Missouri State Director of Athletics Bill Rowe. Guttin ultimately helped stretch MSU's string of consecutive winning seasons to 32 in a row, easily the longest of any Missouri State athletics team. His 1,259 career wins are the most recorded by any head coach in the 111-year history of Missouri State athletics, and the Bears have finished in the top half of the conference race in all but four of his 36 seasons.

During Guttin's tenure, 125 Bears have signed professional contracts, including six first-round draft picks and 18 players who have advanced to the Major Leagues. Additionally, MSU has won 20 combined conference regular-season and tournament championships and made 11 NCAA Division I Tournament appearances, including 10 in the last 23 years.

In 2003, Guttin led the Bears to the NCAA Division I College World Series for the first time in school history, marking the only trip to Omaha by a Division I team from the state of Missouri since 1965. He has been a conference coach of the year 11 times and was selected as the American Baseball Coaches Association Division I Midwest Region Coach of the Year in both 1997 and 2003.

Guttin's pupils have produced results off the diamond as well. Missouri State baseball players have been recognized on the Valley's all-academic team 65 times since the inception of the honor in 1992. Additionally, seven Bears have garnered academic All-America honors on 12 different occasions under Guttin, including three-time selection Brian Mahaffey.

Missouri State is coming off both its third NCAA Regional appearance and MVC regular-season title in the last four seasons. In 2017, the Bears won their first 18 Valley games en route to the title, then captured their third overall NCAA Regional crown by knocking off Arkansas in the deciding game of the Fayetteville Regional. MSU saw its storybook season come to an end at the Fort Worth Super Regional, as TCU secured a fourth straight trip to Omaha with a two-game sweep of Guttin's Bears. Consensus All-America picks Jake Burger and Jeremy Eierman led a potent Bears lineup that paved the way to a 43-20 campaign, while Valley pitcher of the year Jake Fromson led a star-studded pitching staff and garnered All-America recognition of his own.

The 2015 season will go down as one of the more

memorable campaigns for Guttin, who was inducted into both the Missouri Sports Hall of Fame and Springfield Area Sports Hall of Fame during the year. He also surpassed the 1,100 career victory mark early in MSU's record-setting season en route to earning his fifth MVC Coach of the Year nod. Under Guttin's guidance, the 2015 Bears set a program record with 49 victories and were ranked as high as No. 6 (*Baseball America*) in the nation while capturing the Valley's regular-season and postseason tournament titles. MSU went on to earn its ninth NCAA Division I postseason berth, sweeping the Springfield Regional at Hammons Field to advance to its second Super Regional appearance, where the Bears came up just one win shy of punching their ticket to the College World Series.

In 2001, Guttin led the Bears to their first-ever MVC regular-season championship and, in the process, dethroned perennial league powerhouse Wichita State. The Shockers had previously won outright or shared the Valley regular season crown in the previous 14 years, but the Bears posted a 22-10 record in 2001 and beat WSU by one game in the final league standings.

While the accomplishments of Guttin's teams on the field speak volumes about the success of his program, another dream came true in April 2004 when the Bears opened a sparkling 8,000-seat stadium just four blocks north of the Missouri State campus. The Bears finished the year ninth among NCAA Division I teams in attendance, playing only a portion of their home schedule at Hammons Field.

It was merely a coincidence that the crown jewel of the Missouri State baseball program came one year after the Bears exploded onto the national college baseball radar in the College World Series. But both events show the growth of college baseball in the Ozarks and the amount of community and administrative support the program had received in the last several years. With the continued support of the MSU community, Guttin has led the Bears' efforts in numerous charitable endeavors, including the program's annual Price Cutter Celebrity Golf Classic, proceeds from which have been committed to Champion Athletes of the Ozarks in each of the last 20 years. MSU's popular First Pitch and Reunion Night has also been a positive force for both the Bears and a variety of local charitable organizations. The preseason kickoff event has benefitted entities such as the Miracle League Ball Field, Care to Learn, Boys and Girls Clubs and the Wounded Warrior Project.

The Bears have finished lower than third in the league standings just nine times since Guttin took over. Guttin directed Missouri State to six straight league titles in Mid-Continent play from 1984 through 1989. He has given MSU its first four Valley postseason tournament championships in 1996, 1997, 2015 and 2018. He was voted the MVC Coach of the Year in 1993, 2001, 2003, 2008, 2015, 2017 and 2018 and was selected the American Baseball Coaches Association Division I Midwest Region Coach of the Year in 1997 and 2003.

Guttin had two notable seasons as the Missouri State second baseman, coming from Mineral Area College. He earned MIAA all-conference honorable mention in 1977 as the Bears made their first NCAA Division II tournament appearance in seven years.

A University City native, Guttin finished his undergraduate degree at the University of Missouri-St. Louis in 1978, and earned his master's degree in 1984 at Truman State. He and his wife, Marianne, have three daughters; Lauren, Lindsey and Samantha.
