- Missouri State leads the Missouri Valley Conference in team earned run average (2.30), with eight different hurlers posting ERAs of 3.00 or lower for the season to date
- Bears pitchers have yielded a minuscule .206 opponent batting average, which represents an 80-point improvement from its first eight games of the 2019 season, when the opposition hit .286 against MSU hurlers
- Keith Guttin** ranks fourth on the NCAA's Division I wins list for active coaches and 19th all-time with 1,283 victories for his 38-year career; he needs 17 wins to catch Fresno State's Bob Bennett in the 18th spot on the chart
- Logan Wiley** has yet to allow a run in 15.0 innings, extending his personal scoreless streak to 16.2 consecutive innings dating back to May 21, 2019
- Rice has won each of the previous five meetings in the series, including NCAA postseason wins in 1997 (twice) and 2003; the Owls edged the Bears in Omaha to open the 2003 CWS en route to their lone national title
- MSU rates third in the Valley in double plays turned (7) and fourth in team fielding (.976)
- Ben Whetstone** cracked another MSU career list over the weekend, moving into 10th on the Bears' all-time double plays chart (96); the first baseman also ranks second in career fielding (.992) and 10th in putouts (943)
- The trio of **Hayden Juenger**, **Forrest Barnes** and **Trey Ziegenbein** anchors a Bears bullpen that has posted a 1.32 ERA and .174 opponent average against to date; Juenger leads the MVC with his three saves, while Ziegenbein is third in pitching appearances (5) and fourth in opponent batting (.143)
- Grant Wood** brings an eight-game hit streak into Friday's game, as well as a club-best .367 batting mark; the junior infielder ranks sixth in the Valley in hitting and third in hits (11)

LEADING OFF

The **Missouri State Bears** will look to build some early-season momentum this weekend in Houston, where they will take on the **Rice Owls** in a three-game, non-conference series at Reckling Park. The Bears and Owls will open the set with a 6:30 p.m. contest Friday (Feb. 28), before playing single games Saturday (2 p.m.) and Sunday (1 p.m.) afternoon.

Missouri State (4-4) bounced back from three-straight losses with a 6-3 come-from-behind road victory over Oral Roberts on Tuesday. The Bears erased a 2-0 deficit to level their record at four wins and four losses, ultimately seizing control on a **Grant Wood** three-run homer in the ninth.

Rice (0-7) is coming off a 9-2 loss at Texas State Wednesday and enters Friday's game in search of its first victory of the season. The Owls were swept in each of their first two week-end series of the year against Texas and UC Irvine.

SERIES HISTORY

This weekend's action will mark the first meeting of the Bears and Owls since 2005, when Rice claimed an 8-2, season-opening win over MSU in the Coca-Cola Classic at Reckling Park. Rice has emerged victorious in all five of the two clubs' previous games in the series, which has included three NCAA postseason meetings. Most recently, the Owls bested MSU by a 4-2 score in Omaha (June 14, 2003) to open the 2003 College World Series, which Rice ultimately won for its first NCAA national title. The Owls also got the better of the Bears at the 1997 NCAA Central Regional in Lubbock, Texas, nipping MSU by a 5-2 score in the opening game (May 22, 1997), then routing the Bears 25-6 in the deciding game (May 25, 1997) of the meet after MSU battled back to win a pair of elimination games against Texas Tech and Nevada.

WILEY IN COMMAND

Senior right-hander **Logan Wiley** turned in yet another standout performance on the hill for MSU last Friday, holding Belmont to five hits in 8.0 shutout frames. The Springfield, Mo., native, who allowed three hits over 7.0 innings in a 1-0 season-opening win at UCA on Feb. 14 to earn MVC Pitcher of the Week recognition, extended his personal scoreless streak to 16.2 consecutive innings, dating back to last May 21 vs. Valparaiso at the MVC Championship. He has also registered wins in each of his last six decisions and now has seven quality starts in his last eight outings (since April 19, 2019), over which he has gone 5-0 with a 1.71 ERA.

WOOD WORK PAYING DIVIDENDS

Bears junior transfer **Grant Wood** has wasted no time in establishing himself as one of the key bats in the MSU lineup. The Jefferson City, Mo., product belted the go-ahead three-run home run in the top of the ninth inning of Tuesday's 6-3 win at ORU for his first round-tripper as a Bear. Wood also drove in the tying run in the fifth inning and finished the afternoon with four RBIs – the first four of his MSU career.

Wood leads the team and ranks sixth in the Valley with his .367 batting average, while his on-base percentage (.429), slugging percentage (.533), total bases (16) and hits (11) totals rank among the top 10 hitters in the conference. Wood has started his Missouri State career with hits in each of the Bears' first eight contests, including three different multi-hit efforts, while posting a perfect 1.000 fielding percentage (in 16 defensive chances) on the MSU infield.

PITCHING IN

The depth and talent present on the Missouri State pitching staff has been on full display through the first eight games of the season. The Bears currently lead the MVC with both their 2.30 team ERA and 18 earned runs allowed, while their .206 batting average against ranks second in the circuit.

In contrast to the 2019 season, the Bears posted a 7.04 team ERA, permitted a .286 opponent batting mark and allowed 54 earned runs through their first eight games. Even without the services of projected No. 1 starter **Ty Buckner** due to injury, MSU has employed 10 different pitchers this season, with all but two registering a 3.00 ERA or better to date. **Logan Wiley** leads the Valley with a perfect ERA through a league-best 15.0 innings to date, while his 14 strikeouts rank fifth in the conference. The Bears' bullpen has been stingy as well, with six different hurlers combining to post a 1.32 ERA and a .174 opponent average.

DOING IT WITH DEFENSE

Missouri State's mound corps has benefited from a strong collective effort from its defense to start the new season. Through their first eight games, the Bears have recorded a .976 team fielding percentage, which is good for the fourth-best mark in the Valley. MSU has committed just seven errors in 297 total defensive chances, marking a vast improvement from its defensive performance over the first eight games of the 2019 season. The Bears committed 13 miscues to log just a .955 team fielding percentage a year ago.

CARDIAC CUBS

The Bears posted their second comeback victory of the season Tuesday in Tulsa, following last Thursday's 4-1 win at Austin Peay, in which they overcame an early one-run lead. MSU has made the comeback rally an art form in accumulating the most overall victories over a four-year period (170) in program history from 2015-18. Since the start of the 2015 season, the Bears have rallied for a victory on 92 separate occasions, including 21 times in 2018, which represented 52.5 percent of their overall season win total (40).

BEARS DUO TABBED PRESEASON ALL-MVC

Returning all-conference outfielders **Jack Duffy** and **Dakota Kotowski** led the Bears' contingent on the Missouri Valley Conference's preseason team.

A three-year starter in the Bears' outfield, Duffy batted .341 in MVC play and a team-leading .305 overall to garner a second-team All-MVC selection in 2019. The Kansas City, Mo., product recorded 17 multi-hit performances, including a career-best four-hit effort vs. New Orleans on April 20, and reached base safely in all 21 Valley contests. An MVC Scholar-Athlete Team selection for the second year in a row last spring, Duffy brought a 12-game hit streak into the 2020 season after logging a blistering stretch drive at the plate, hitting .409 over the Bears' final 10 games last year.

Kotowski, a *Collegiate Baseball* Freshman All-America choice last spring, became the ninth MSU player to be honored as the Valley's Freshman of the Year. He finished his rookie campaign with 12 home runs and a .576 slugging percentage to lead the Bears en route to earning first-team All-MVC recognition. The Channahon, Ill., native ranked second overall in the MVC in home runs and third in slugging percentage and rated among the top 15 MVC hitters in batting, slugging, on-base percentage, home runs, RBI, total bases and walks during league play. Kotowski's home run total ranks third on MSU's freshman chart, trailing only former big leaguers Ryan Howard (19 in 1999) and Jason Hart (15 in 1996). Additionally, he became the 42nd Missouri State baseball player to garner All-America status.

ROAD TO SUCCESS

MSU has proven to be hard to stop on the road over the past five seasons, logging a 78-59 (.569) record in such contests. Including their 26-14 record in neutral-field games over the same stretch, the Bears have gone 104-73 (.588) away from Hammons Field since the start of the 2015 season. The Bears went 14-8 in true road games in 2018, after logging 19 road wins in 2017 and a program-record 21 wins in 27 road contests in 2015. MSU's 0.857 win percentage on the road that year represented its best since 1978, when it posted an identical percentage with a 12-2 road mark. Coupled with their 9-3 record in neutral field contests in 2015, the Bears' total of 30 wins away from home was second only to national champion Virginia in the Division I ranks. The Bears also posted the longest road win streak in Division I baseball in 2015, claiming 11-straight victories from March 15 to April 25.

VALLEY FORECAST

Highlighted by a pair of selections to the 2020 Preseason All-Missouri Valley Conference Baseball Team, Missouri State was tabbed second in the Valley's annual preseason poll in a vote of the conference's head coaches. MSU will welcome back eight position starters and 10 total pitchers from last year's squad, including six veterans who have earned all-conference honors during their respective careers. The Bears will be looking to bounce back from a 20-36 campaign in 2019 and a sixth-place MVC finish – just their seventh second-division finish in 28 Valley seasons.

Defending Valley co-champion DBU garnered five of the eight first-place votes and finished with 61 points overall to claim the top spot in the poll. The Patriots edged the Bears (51 points), who received one first-place vote, while Illinois State (49) and Indiana State (40) rounded out the top half of the preseason poll. Bradley (38) and Evansville (21) finished fifth and sixth, respectively, while Southern Illinois (18) and Valparaiso (10) were slotted into the final two positions in the poll.

WELCOME MAT

The Bears received significant contributions from a host of newcomers to claim their opening series from Central Arkansas. Junior transfer **Grant Wood** led MSU with a .455 batting mark and a .538 on-base percentage, while also registering a perfect weekend in the field, handling all 11 of his defensive chances at third base. Freshmen **Drake Baldwin** and **Greg Ziegler** also enjoyed strong showings in their initial series with the Bears. Baldwin turned in a 2-for-4 day in the opener, then sparked MSU's go-ahead, three-run rally in game two with a seventh-inning home run. Ziegler delivered a double and a home run in the series finale.

On the mound, **Hayden Minton** turned in a memorable mound effort in game two, holding UCA to one run on two hits, while fanning four and issuing three walks in his 6.0 innings of work in his collegiate debut. Sophomore right-hander **Trey Ziegenbein** also chipped in to help MSU claim each of the first two games, totaling three strikeouts in a combined 2.2 scoreless innings of relief.

LIFTING THE LID

Thanks to 7.0 shutout innings from **Logan Wiley**, the Bears notched their first opening day shutout in 50 years with their 1-0 win over Central Arkansas on Feb. 14. The Bears are now 25-13 in season openers under head coach **Keith Guttin** and 37-20 overall as a program in such contests. MSU has also gone a combined 18-7 on opening weekend since 2013. MSU has started seven of the last eight campaigns with at least six wins in its first 10 games (failing to do so only in 2019), including their best-ever start (10-1) to a season in 2017.

DAK LEADING THE PACK

Sophomore outfielder **Dakota Kotowski** played a pivotal role in a pair of Missouri State victories over Central Arkansas, hitting .417 for the week with a home run and four RBIs. Kotowski drove home go-ahead tallies in all three contests, including the lone run in MSU's 1-0 victory in Friday's season opener. He also homered in game two of the series, logging his second-straight two-hit effort and driving in two runs on the day. The Channahon, Ill., product capped his weekend with a run scoring single — his third two-out, RBI hit of the series — to stake the Bears to an early lead in Sunday's finale.

IN RARE COMPANY

With Missouri State's 6-1 win over New Orleans on April 19, 2019, Bears head coach **Keith Guttin** moved past legendary Miami coach Ron Fraser (1,271) to climb to the 19th position on the NCAA's Division I career coaching wins list.

With a career record of 1,283-816 (.611), Guttin now needs 17 more victories to match the career total of Fresno State's Bob Bennett (1,300) in the No. 18 spot on the chart. Guttin is the second-winningest coach in MVC history, while his win total ranks fourth among all active Division I head coaches entering the 2020 season, his 38th at the Bears' helm.

NON-CON DOMINATION

MSU has been nearly unstoppable against non-conference competition over the last five seasons, compiling an 98-66 (.598) record in regular-season games versus non-league foes since the start of the 2015 season. The Bears have won 42 of their last 64 regular-season non-conference home games, outscoring their non-league opponents by a 856-575 margin at Hammons Field over the same stretch.

BEARS IN THE PRO RANKS

Two Missouri State baseball standouts reached contractual agreements with professional organizations following the conclusion of the season. With seventh-round pick **Drew Millas** going to the Oakland Athletics as the 224th overall selection, the Bears closed the decade with their 16th player selection in the first 11 rounds of the Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft since 2010. MSU senior left-hander **Davis Schwab** was also picked in the draft, going in the 37th round (the 1,117th overall selection) to the Atlanta Braves.

Additionally, former Missouri State baseball standout **Matt Hall** became the 20th Bear to receive a call up to the big leagues in 2018. Hall became the fourth former Bear to earn a Major League roster spot in the last four years, following **Luke Voit** and **Pierce Johnson** in 2017 and **Buddy Baumann** in 2016. Overall, the Bears have produced 146 players who have gone on to sign professional contracts over their 56 years as a varsity program, including 127 during **Keith Guttin's** 37-year tenure as head coach.

BEARS ON RADIO

Once again in 2020, Meyer Communications is slated to provide live radio coverage of all 56 Missouri State regular-season games, plus all Bears' games in the Missouri Valley Conference Tournament and any 2020 postseason play. The broadcasts can be heard primarily on **KBFL 1060 AM** and **96.9 FM** in Springfield with Art Hains, Ben Goss and Corey Riggs describing the action. An online audio stream is available through KBFL's website via RadioSpringfield.com.

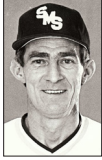

RETIRED NUMBERS



Bill Rowe

On Saturday, May 8, 2004, former head baseball coach and director of athletics **Bill Rowe** became the first person in the 48-year history of the MSU baseball program to have his number retired.

Rowe guided the baseball Bears as head coach for 19 years from the start of the program in 1964 through its final season in NCAA Division II in 1982. He led the Bears to a 394-230-1 record and four Division II College World Series appearances. Under Rowe, the Bears finished as national runners-up in 1969 and finished third nationally in 1970 (just the sixth and seventh years of the program). As athletic director, Rowe guided the Bears from

Division II to Division I and saw the Bears change leagues from the MIAA and Mid-Continent Conferences to a current membership in the Missouri Valley Conference.

The retirement ceremony for Rowe's jersey was held prior to the Bears' doubleheader against Illinois State.

The indoor practice facility at Hammons Field also bears Rowe's name as of January 30, 2010.



Ryan Howard

On Dec. 18, 2010, Missouri State retired the No. 6 jersey of former Bear and 2006 National League Most Valuable Player **Ryan Howard** at JQH Arena.

A St. Louis native who played at Missouri State from 1999-2001, Howard finished his collegiate career with 50 home runs, 183 RBIs and a .335 career average in 172 games. He was the 1999 Missouri Valley Conference Freshman of the Year and MSU's A.E. "Ted" Willis Most Valuable Player in 2000.

Since being drafted by Philadelphia in the fifth round of the 2001 draft, Howard has enjoyed a standout professional career. His long list of accomplishments as a member of

the Phillies includes 2005 National League Rookie of the Year, 2006 NL MVP, 2006 Home Run Derby champion, 2008 World Series champion, 2009 NLCS MVP and three All-Star selections.

Howard debuted with the Phillies in 2004, accumulating a career batting average of .258 with 382 homers and 1,194 RBIs in 1,572 MLB games over 13 seasons.

KEITH GUTTIN Head Coach

38th Season
Alma mater: UMSL (1978)

One of the most successful baseball coaches in Missouri Valley Conference history, **Keith Guttin** began his MSU head coaching career in 1983, and has spent the past 37 seasons building the Bears into one of the top programs in the country. Under Guttin, the Bears have won 61 percent of their games, averaging 35 victories a year and racking up 12 different 40-win seasons.

Guttin, who entered the 2020 season fourth among active Division I head coaches in career victories, has been a part of the MSU baseball program as a player, assistant coach and head coach for 43 of the program's 57 years. He took the helm of Bears baseball at the start of the 1983 season, coinciding with the move of Missouri State athletics to Division I status. He inherited the reins of the program from its only previous head baseball coach, former Missouri State Director of Athletics Bill Rowe. Guttin ultimately helped stretch MSU's string of consecutive winning seasons to 32 in a row, easily the longest of any Missouri State athletics team. His 1,283 career wins are the most recorded by any head coach in the 112-year history of Missouri State athletics, and the Bears have finished in the top half of the conference race in all but five of his 37 seasons.

During Guttin's tenure, 127 Bears have signed professional contracts, including six first-round draft picks and 18 players who have advanced to the Major Leagues. Additionally, MSU has won 20 combined conference regular-season and tournament championships and made 11 NCAA Division I Tournament appearances, including 10 in the last two decades.

In 2003, Guttin led the Bears to the NCAA Division I College World Series for the first time in school history, marking the only trip to Omaha by a Division I team from the state of Missouri since 1965. He has been a conference coach of the year 11 times and was selected as the American Baseball Coaches Association Division I Midwest Region Coach of the Year in both 1997 and 2003.

Guttin's pupils have produced results off the diamond as well. Missouri State baseball players have been recognized on the Valley's all-academic team 66 times since the inception of the honor in 1992. Additionally, seven Bears have garnered academic All-America honors on 12 different occasions under Guttin, including three-time selection Brian Mahaffey.

Missouri State is coming off a successful stretch that has seen the Bears claim three MVC regular-season titles in the last five seasons. In 2018, Guttin picked up his second consecutive MVC Coach of the Year honor after leading the Bears to their 12th 40-win campaign, as MSU swept the MVC regular-season and post-season tournament crowns for just the second time in school history. The previous spring, the Bears won their first 18 Valley games en route to the title, then captured their third overall NCAA Regional crown by knocking off Arkansas in the deciding game of the Fayetteville Regional. MSU saw its storybook season come to an end at the Fort Worth Super Regional, as TCU secured a fourth straight trip to Omaha with a two-game sweep of Guttin's Bears. Consensus All-America picks Jake Burger and Jeremy Eierman led

a potent Bears lineup that paved the way to a 43-20 campaign, while Valley pitcher of the year Jake Fromson led a star-studded pitching staff and garnered All-America recognition of his own.

The 2015 season will go down as one of the more memorable campaigns for Guttin, who was inducted into both the Missouri Sports Hall of Fame and Springfield Area Sports Hall of Fame during the year. He also surpassed the 1,100 career victory mark early in MSU's record-setting season en route to earning his fifth MVC Coach of the Year nod. Under Guttin's guidance, the 2015 Bears set a program record with 49 victories and were ranked as high as No. 6 (*Baseball America*) in the nation while capturing the Valley's regular-season and postseason tournament titles. MSU went on to earn its ninth NCAA Division I postseason berth, sweeping the Springfield Regional at Hammons Field to advance to its second Super Regional appearance, where the Bears came up just one win shy of punching their ticket to the College World Series.

In 2001, Guttin led the Bears to their first-ever MVC regular-season championship and, in the process, dethroned perennial league powerhouse Wichita State. The Shockers had previously won outright or shared the Valley regular season crown in the previous 14 years, but the Bears posted a 22-10 record in 2001 and bested WSU by one game for the MVC crown.

While the accomplishments of Guttin's teams on the field speak volumes about the success of his program, another dream came true in April 2004 when the Bears opened a sparkling 8,000-seat stadium just four blocks north of the Missouri State campus. It was merely a coincidence that the crown jewel of the Missouri State baseball program came one year after the Bears exploded onto the national college baseball radar in the College World Series. But both events show the growth of college baseball in the Ozarks and the amount of community and administrative support the program had received in the last several years. With the continued support of the MSU community, Guttin has led the Bears' efforts in numerous charitable endeavors, including the program's annual Price Cutter Celebrity Golf Classic, proceeds from which have been committed to Champion Athletes of the Ozarks in each of the last 20 years. MSU's popular First Pitch and Reunion Night has also been a positive force for both the Bears and a variety of local charitable organizations. The preseason kickoff event has benefitted entities such as the Miracle League Ball Field, Care to Learn, Boys and Girls Clubs and the Wounded Warrior Project.

The Bears have finished lower than third in the league standings just 10 times since Guttin took over. Guttin directed Missouri State to six straight league titles in Mid-Continent play from 1984 through 1989. He has given MSU its first four Valley postseason tournament championships in 1996, 1997, 2015 and 2018. He was voted the MVC Coach of the Year in 1993, 2001, 2003, 2008, 2015, 2017 and 2018 and was selected the American Baseball Coaches Association Division I Midwest Region Coach of the Year in 1997 and 2003.

Guttin had two notable seasons as the Missouri State second baseman, coming from Mineral Area College. He earned MIAA all-conference honorable mention in 1977 as the Bears made their first NCAA Division II tournament appearance in seven years.

A University City native, Guttin finished his undergraduate degree at the University of Missouri-St. Louis in 1978, and earned his master's degree in 1984 at Truman State. He and his wife, Marianne, have three daughters, Lauren, Lindsey and Samantha, and one grandson, Bradley.

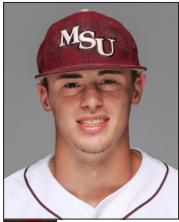
