THE TEN COUNT

◆ Missouri State closes out the home portion of its 2020-21 schedule this weekend when it welcomes Bradley to JQH Arena on Saturday (5 p.m.) and Sunday (3 p.m.). The Bears bring The Valley's second-longest winning streak (3) into the series and currently sit in sole possession of third place in the MVC with just five games remaining.

◆ Missouri State picked up its **1,700th** all-time win on Wednesday with the Bears 65-53 win over rival Southern Illinois. Now in its 109th college basketball season, Missouri State is **1700-1015** all-time and started the season **No. 37** on the NCAA list of winningest DI programs by victories.

◆ With their win over SIU on Wednesday, the Bears secured a winning home record for the **49th** consecutive season. MSU is **7-4** at JQH Arena this season and has finished better than .500 in every home campaign since 1971-72.

◆ **Gaige Prim** (Sr., Aurora, Colo.) has recorded a steal in **12** straight games while emerging as a defensive stalwart in the league. He leads the team in steals (20) and blocks (20), while ranking 1st in the MVC in rebounds per game (8.9) and third in defensive rebounds per game (5.6). Prim also leads the MVC in offensive rebounds per game (3.2), and ranks 5th in scoring (14.8), 5th in blocks (1.2), 6th in FG% (.589) and 7th in assists (3.3).

◆ **Isiah Mosley** (So., Columbia, Mo.) leads the MVC in scoring (**20.8** ppg) and ranks **17th** among all Division I players in that category. A Lou Henson Mid-Major Player of the Year nominee and this week's **MVC Player of the Week**, Mosley, is averaging **14.4** points in the second half alone and ranks **16th** nationally in free throws (89) and **36th** in FT% (.881).

◆ **Mosley** is also among the league's top players in several other statistical categories -- 1st in FT% (.881), 2nd in defensive rebounds (6.1), 2nd in minutes played (33.5), 5th in assists (3.4) and 6th in rebounding (6.8). He ranks as the No. 2 sophomore in scoring in the nation behind Oral Roberts' Max Abmas (21.7 ppg).

◆ Saturday's game will be the 50th game at Missouri State for coach **Dana Ford**, **Isiah Mosley** and **Ja'Monta Black**.

◆ **Jared Ridder** (Jr., Springfield, Mo.) has dropped in multiple 3-pointers **12** times this season and ranks **4th** in the MVC in 3-pointers per game (2.2). Since moving into a reserve role the last five games, Ridder has produced multiple 3-pointers 4 times (including 2 triples against SIU on Wednesday) and is 9-for-25 (.360) from beyond the arc in that span.

◆ Over the last 3 games, **Demarcus Sharp** (Jr., Charleston, Mo.) is averaging 9.0 points, 4.3 rebounds, 5.3 assists and 38.0 minutes per game. He was an NJCAA Division I All-American last season at Colby (Kan.) Community College.

◆ The Bears are coming off a +8 rebound margin in Wednesday's game against SIU, pushing MSU to a **9-1** record this year (and **30-12** under Dana Ford) when they out-rebound their opponents. The Bears rank 13th nationally in defensive rebounds per game (29.12) and lead the MVC in that category.

◆ Defensive juggernaut **Keaton Hervey** (Jr., Cedar Park, Texas) got into the scoring act in Wednesday's game, scoring a game-high/season-high **18 points** with 6 rebounds and 3 blocks vs. SIU. He has **6** double-figure scoring games this season.

◆ **Ja'Monta Black** (So., Columbia, Mo.) has scored in double figures back-to-back games, averaging **11.5** points in that span, including 13 points against SIU on Wednesday. He has also hit multiple 3-pointers in each of the last 2 games.

HEAD COACH DANA FORD

Dana Ford (Illinois State, 2006) is **44-38** (.537) in his third season as Missouri State head coach, including a 29-12 ledger at JQH Arena, 13-20 record in away games, and 2-6 mark at neutral sites. He is now **101-103** (.495) in his seventh season as a head coach. Ford is **2-3** in his career against Bradley.

With a 72-62 win at Illinois State on Feb. 7, Ford picked up his 100th career victory.

Ford was named to *ESPN's College Basketball 40 Under 40* list this season. Ford was No. 35 on the 2020-21 rankings compiled by the ESPN staff to highlight the nation's top young head and assistant college basketball coaches.

Last year, Ford engineered a solid season finish that saw the Bears go 9-9 in the MVC and upset third-seeded Indiana State in the Valley Tournament quarterfinals. MSU matched or out-rebounded 24-of-33 opponents, including nine of their last 10, to finish 25th nationally in rebound margin (6.2). The Bears also posted their second-best free throw percentage (.749) of the program's Division I era and had their highest scoring average in league games (71.6) in 10 years. The Bears also boasted two All-MVC performers for the second year in a row in Keandre Cook and **Gaige Prim**, who also earned MVC All-Newcomer Team laurels.

In his first season in Springfield in 2018-19, Ford led the Bears to a tie for third place (10-8) in The Valley with the program's first winning conference record since 2011. He guided two players -- Tulio Da Silva (first team) and Keandre Cook (third team) -- to All-MVC honors in addition to three players on the MVC All-Newcomer Team, including Newcomer of the Year Da Silva.

He was introduced as Missouri State's 18th men's basketball coach on March 22, 2018 after coaching the previous four seasons at Tennessee State. The native of Tamms, Illinois was 57-65 (.467) at Tennessee State, including a 52-39 ledger in his last three seasons in Nashville. He coached five All-OVC players and two OVC All-Newcomer Team selections during his tenure at TSU. Under his leadership, Tennessee State also doubled its home attendance average and twice earned votes in the AP Top 25 poll in 2016-17.

Ford, 36, was awarded the Ben Jobe Award in 2016 as the nation's top Division I minority coach. That same year, he was named Ohio Valley Conference Coach of the Year and NABC District 19 Coach of the Year after engineering one of the biggest turnarounds in NCAA history, swaying Tennessee State from a 5-26 record in his first season to a 20-11 mark in 2015-16.

He has served as an assistant at Tennessee State, Wichita State and Illinois State and was responsible for recruiting future NBA talents such as Robert Covington (Rockets) and Fred Van Vleet (Raptors).

SERIES HISTORY

The series between the Bears and Braves began when MSU joined The Valley for the 1990-91 season. Missouri State leads the rivalry, **39-25**. The Bears are 23-6 in Springfield (9-3 at JQH Arena) against the Braves, 13-17 in Peoria, and 3-2 at neutral sites.

Bradley swept the Bears last season, including a **91-78** win over MSU in Springfield on Jan. 15. Bradley tied an MSU opponent record with 17 3-pointers -- with seven coming in a key seven-minute stretch late in the game -- to lead the Braves to the comeback win. The improbable upset by BU followed a remarkable 33-7 run by the Bears to start the second half. Missouri State stormed back from a 16-point deficit to lead 68-58 with 9:28 to play in the game. Keandre Cook led the Bears with 22 points on 6-of-9 shooting, while **Gaige Prim** scored 13, and **Isiah Mosley** notched 12 points for his seventh-straight double-figure scoring effort.

In the rematch in Peoria (Feb. 19), Bradley scored seven of its 11 overtime points at the free throw line, including a pair from Elijah Childs with 38 seconds left to help the Braves squeak pass visiting Missouri State, 83-79, in extra time. Darrell Brown led five Bradley players in double figures with 19 points, while Missouri State's Lamont West tallied a game-high 20 points to lead the visitors. Josh Hall contributed 17 points with a team-high 9 rebounds for Missouri State, while **Prim** scored 10 with 8 boards before fouling out.

BEARS ON THE AIR

All Missouri State games will air live on the Missouri State Radio Network with Springfield flagship station KWTO (101.3 FM) providing the feed to the seven-station network and at RadioSpringfield.com.

The voice of the Bears, **Art Hains**, first began calling MSU's action in 1977 and is in his second stint and 40th season overall. He called MSU games from 1977-81 and returned to the mic in 1985. Hains celebrated his 1,000th MSU basketball broadcast on Jan. 2, 2013 and his 2,500th MSU event on Nov. 9, 2019. Former MSU great **Mike Keltner** (1970-74) provides color commentary. MSU is also 3-0 with **Tom Ladd** on the mic.

FORD REACHES WIN NO. 100

Bears head coach **Dana Ford** reached a coaching milestone on Feb. 27, 2021 when he helped guide the Bears past his alma mater, Illinois State, 72-62, at Redbird Arena. The win marked Ford's 100th as a head coach, including his time at Tennessee State. He is **44-38** (.537) in his third season at Missouri State.

PRIM STARTS NEW STREAK

After reeling off 25 straight double-figure scoring games from Jan. 26, 2020 to Jan. 27, 2021 (and in 37 of his first 40 games as a Bear), Missouri State senior **Gaige Prim** (F, Aurora, Colo.) has established himself as a consistent offensive threat in the low post. Through 17 games this season, Prim has scored in double figures 15 times with 5 20-point games and 6 double-doubles. He scored his 1,000th career point on Feb. 7 at Illinois State, including his two seasons at MSU and his freshman season at West Texas A&M.

VALLEY TRIFECTA FOR SUPER SOPH. MOSLEY

Missouri State super sophomore Isiah Mosley (G, Columbia, Mo.) earned MVC Player of the Week honors on Feb. 8, marking the third time this season he has earned that distinction. He played all but 6 minutes of Missouri State's sweep at Illinois State and averaged a team-high 21.5 points per game with 7.0 rebounds and 6.5 assists per contest. He started a pivotal 10-1 Bears run in the second half of Game 1 in Normal that took a tie game and turned it into a nine-point MSU advantage at a key juncture as part of a 19-point effort on 7-of-11 shooting. In Game 2, Mosley posted 24 points, 8 rebounds and 7 assists, including MSU's last 9 points of the contest to help the Bears win their third straight at Redbird Arena. His 3-pointer with just over 10 minutes to go erased a one-point Redbird lead and with two Mosley buckets turned it into a seven-point Bears advantage two-and-a-half minutes later.

MOSLEY EARNS VALLEY POW HONORS FOR SECOND TIME

Isiah Mosley (G, Columbia, Mo.) earned Missouri Valley Conference Player of the Week honors on Jan. 22, his second straight MVC weekly award. Mosley continued his hot streak by helping lead the Bears to a pair of road wins at Valparaiso and extending his streak of 20-point scoring games to seven in a row. Mosley finished the week averaging 29.0 points, 7.0 rebounds and 4.0 assists per game while shooting 64.7 percent from the field and a perfect 12-of-12 at the free throw line. Since MSU joined The Valley in 1990-91, Mosley is just the fifth Bear to earn MVC Player of the Week distinction in consecutive weeks, joining Tony Graves (1992-93), Danny Moore (1996-97), Kyle Weems (2010-11) and Alize Johnson (2017-18).

20-POINT SCORING STREAK FOR MOSLEY

Between Dec. 21 and Jan. 17, Isiah Mosley (So., Columbia, Mo.) reeled off 8 straight 20-point games, the longest by any Bear since 1974 and best of the program's Division I era. It also matched the second-longest 20-point streak in the MVC over the last decade.

Mosley's streak also pushed him as high as No. 2 nationally in scoring average as recently as Jan. 30.

PRIM FEATURED IN MVC SCHOLAR-ATHLETE SPOTLIGHT

Missouri State forward Gaige Prim (Sr., Aurora, Colo.) was in the MVC Scholar-Athlete Spotlight on Jan. 13 for his superior efforts in the classroom and on the court. Prim is majoring in General Studies with a 3.06 GPA. In addition to being an All-MVC performer on the court, he has been named to the MSU Athletic Director's Honor Roll in the spring and fall of 2020 and was on the MVC Honor Roll in 2020.

MVC PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONORS GO TO MOSLEY JAN. 5

Isiah Mosley (Columbia, Mo.) was named Missouri Valley Conference Player of the Week on Jan. 5 after an incredible four-game stretch to start Valley play. He reeled off four 20-point efforts in that span and rocketing to the top of the league's scoring leaders. He averaged 24.5 points per game, matched or set his career scoring high twice, and helped lead the Bears to their first 6-1 start since the 2013-14 season.

He finished the two-week period 31-of-53 (.585) from the field, 7-for-16 (.438) from 3-point distance, and 29-of-33 (.879) at the free throw line. Mosley also averaged 5.5 rebounds and 3.0 assists in that span.

Perhaps even more impressive, Mosley averaged 18.0 points per game in the second half alone during the stretch, posting a 23-point second half against Indiana State and a 22-point second half in MSU's win at UNI. Including a 26-point outing against Little Rock at the end of non-conference play, he became the first MSU player since 1995 (Johnny Murdock) to post five straight 20-point scoring games.

HOT START SETS THE PACE

The Bears 4-0 start to the 2020-21 season was their best since winning their first 6 games during the 2013-14 campaign. Likewise, MSU's 9-1 record was its best 10-game ledger since 2009-10 (12-1).

The team's 79-59 win at UNI on Dec. 27 improved the Bears all-time record to 20-11 in MVC openers and was also the Bears' largest margin of victory ever in Cedar Falls. Likewise, MSU's Jan. 2 home win over Indiana State pushed the Bears to 27-4 all-time in Missouri Valley Conference home openers, including an 11-2 ledger at JQH Arena.

PRIM TIES BLOCKED SHOT RECORD, REACHES MILESTONE AT UNI

In the Dec. 27 game at Northern Iowa, Gaige Prim (Sr., Aurora, Colo.) tied a long-standing Missouri State single-game record with 7 blocked shots. He became just the third MSU player, joining Scott Hawk (1/11/77) and Ricky Johnson (1/29/83), to achieve that impressive feat.

SUCCESS AT FIFTY

With 8 fifty-percent shooting efforts this season, the Bears are now 23-0 under Dana Ford when making at least half their shots. The Bears shot 50 percent or better in each of their first 4 games to start the season, marking the first time in 20 years (Feb. 2-16, 2000) the Bears reeled off four in a row.

MSU was 6-0 under Ford last season when shooting 50 percent and 9-0 during the 2018-19 campaign.

Including his head coaching tenure at Tennessee State, Ford's teams are now 46-5 when eclipsing 50 percent from the field.

PRIM NAMED MVC CO-PLAYER OF WEEK ON DEC. 22

Bears senior Gaige Prim (F, Aurora, Colo.) was named MVC Co-Player of the Week on Dec. 22 after he helped lead Missouri State to a 3-0 start to the season with three double-figure scoring games in less than a week. He averaged 18.7 points per game and made 21-of-27 (.778) field goals in that span while landing in the national top 10 in four statistical categories. In wins over Jewell, Northwestern State and Little Rock,

Prim averaged 6.7 rebounds, 5.7 assists and 3.4 assist-to-turnover ratio. He scored 20 points against William Jewell on 9-of-11 shooting with 6 rebounds and 8 assists. He followed that effort with a career-high 26 points in the home victory over Northwestern State, converting 9-of-12 field goals, 9 rebounds and 9 assists and coming just shy of the first triple double in Missouri State history. He then ended the week going 3-for-4 from the field and 4-for-4 at the line in limited time against Sun Belt preseason favorite Little Rock.

BEARS BREAK TEAM GPA RECORD

Missouri State men's basketball posted its highest single-semester grade-point average on record this fall, racking up a **3.03** team GPA during the recently-completed term.

The Bears will also have four players -- Raphe Ayres, Jake Branham, Melvyn Ebonkoli and Darian Scott -- on their respective Dean's Lists for the semester. Likewise, nine players who accumulated 3.0 GPA's or better for the semester were recognized on the Missouri State Athletic Director's Honor Roll.

Scott completed his undergraduate degree in Entertainment Management during the fall semester and represented the basketball Bears at last week's commencement ceremonies at JQH Arena.

DOMINATING IN THE PAINT

MSU produced **50** of its 73 points in the Dec. 16 opener against William Jewell with baskets in the paint. It marked the second time in an 11-game span MSU eclipsed 50 inside points, something the Bears had not done since Jan. 12, 2010 (at Drake). Points in the paint first appeared on NCAA box scores in 2005.

COOK SPENDS PRESEASON WITH CHARLOTTE HORNETS

Former Bears standout **Keandre Cook** was named to the Charlotte Hornets preseason training camp roster on Dec. 1. A 6-foot-5 guard from Baltimore, Md., Cook was one of 20 players on the Hornets camp roster and one of nine rookies. He played in just one game -- seeing 1:46 on the floor in the preseason finale vs. the Orlando Magic (Dec. 19). He officially joined the Hornets G-League team in Greensboro on Jan. 27.

Cook earned All-Missouri Valley Conference in both seasons at Missouri State, garnering All-MVC second-team honors in 2020 after averaging a team-best 14.9 points per game with 71 three-pointers in his senior season. He finished a two-year career at MSU with 904 points to rank 35th in program history in scoring and sixth among two-year players. He also finished 10th on MSU's career 3-pointers list with 119.

ALIZE DEPARTS RAPTORS AFTER PRESEASON

After two seasons with the Indiana Pacers of the NBA, two-time All-MVC first-teamer **Alize Johnson** signed a free agent deal with the Toronto Raptors on Nov. 27. He was ultimately waived by Toronto at the conclusion of the preseason schedule on Dec. 19. Johnson is now playing for the Raptors 905 G-League team in Mississauga, Ontario.

In two seasons with the Pacers, Johnson played in 31 games, grabbed 67 rebounds and posted 47 points with one start. He was named MVC Newcomer of the Year in 2017 and scored 982 points for Missouri State in just two seasons to rank 30th on the program's all-time list, while his 635 career rebounds ranks 6th.

AFTER THE PAUSE

The Bears started the 2020-21 season in the COVID protocol after positive tests among the Tier 1 individuals with the team just hours prior to the Nov. 27 game against Evangel canceled the opening-night contest against the cross-town foes and ultimately Missouri State's **first 5 games** of the season (Nov. 27 to Dec. 12).

PRESEASON AWARD FOR PRIM

Missouri State standout **Gaige Prim** (Sr., Aurora, Colo.) picked up preseason accolades from Missouri Valley coaches, media and information directors, earning a spot on the *Preseason All-MVC second team*. Last season, Prim earned All-MVC third-team and MVC All-Newcomer Team honors as the Valley's

SPRING AND SUMMER ACADEMIC HONORS FOR SCOTT, PRIM

Three current Bears -- **Gaige Prim** (Sr., Aurora, Colo.), **Isiah Mosley** (So., Columbia, Mo.) and **Darian Scott** (Jr., Las Vegas, Nev.) were all named to the Missouri State Athletic Director's Honor Roll for achieving a 3.0 grade-point average or better during the spring 2020 term.

Prim, a Sociology major, was also on the 2020 MVC Honor Roll and earned MSU Athletic Director's Honor Roll status in his first semester with the Bears for the fall 2019 semester.

TWO BEARS BOAST MR. SHOW-ME BASKETBALL TITLE

Sophomore **Isiah Mosley** (Columbia, Mo.) is just the fourth "Mr. Show-Me Basketball" to play at Missouri State. Named Missouri's top prep player in 2019, Mosley averaged 23.2 points per game as a senior at Columbia Rock Bridge High School where he (and fellow MSU teammate **Ja'Monta Black**) led the Bruins to a 25-3 record and Class 5 (largest) state title. The only other MSU Bears to earn the title of Mr. Show-Me Basketball are teammate **Jared Ridder** (2017), **Drew Richards** (2004) and **Spencer Laurie** (2003).

NUMBER 700 IN DIVISION I; NUMBER 1,700 ALL-TIME

MSU secured its 700th Division I win on Feb. 12, 2020 with a thrilling 97-62 win over defending MVC co-champion Drake at JQH Arena.

Likewise, the Bears picked up all-time victory No. 1,700 on Feb. 10, 2021 with a 65-53 win over Southern Illinois at JQH Arena. MSU started the 2020-21 season ranked No. 37 on the NCAA DI all-time wins list.

MOSLEY COMING OFF SOLID FRESHMAN SEASON

Despite getting snubbed on the MVC's All-Freshman Team in 2019-20, **Isiah Mosley** (G, Columbia, Mo.) scored 267 points in 2019-20, the 10th-best scoring output ever by a Bears freshman. Likewise, he became just the 18th MSU freshman to score 200 or more points in a rookie season with the best offensive output since Austin Ruder's 285 points in 2013-14. Mosley averaged 10.4 points per game in league play last winter and reeled off 8 straight double-figure scoring games from Jan. 15 to Feb. 18, 2020.

BEARS SECURE 49TH STRAIGHT WINNING HOME SEASON

With its win over SIU on Feb. 10, the Bears secured their 49th straight winning season at home. Missouri State has been over .500 in home every season since 1971-72, encompassing three home venues. Now in its 13th season at JQH Arena, Missouri State is **140-64 (.686)** all-time at "The Q" with a **7-4** mark this year.

#BEARS UNITE

Missouri State's student-athletes across all 17 intercollegiate sports will be wearing a #BearsUnite patch on their uniforms or team gear this season as a symbol of unity in the fight against injustice and discrimination. Missouri State Director of Athletics Kyle Moats, who is in his 12th year as AD, announced June 4 the implementation of a department-wide educational initiative that values inclusion of diversity, tolerance and social responsibility. Year one initiatives include: departmental training; community engagement programs; and a formal reporting procedure for discriminatory behavior of any kind.

BEARS BASKETBALL HISTORY

The Bears have an all-time record of **1700-1015 (.626)**, now in their 109th season, and are **716-498 (.590)** in their 39th Division I season. MSU is also **140-64 (.686)** in their 13th season at JQH Arena.

During the Division I era, MSU has made NCAA Tournament appearances in 1987, 1988, 1989, 1990, 1992, and 1999. With NCAA Tournament wins over Wisconsin and Tennessee, the 1999 Bears advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16 for the first time in program history. The Bears have appeared in the National Invitation Tournament nine times -- 1986, 1991, 1993, 1997, 2000, 2005, 2006, 2007 and 2011. The 1986, 1993 and 2006 squads all reached the NIT quarterfinals. MSU has also appeared in the CIT twice -- 2010 and 2014.

MSU won NAIA national championship titles in 1952 and 1953 under the late coach Bob Vanatta, while making six NAIA national tournament trips from 1939-1954. MSU also appeared in the NCAA Division II Tournament 10 times, finishing as national runners-up four times -- 1959, 1967, 1969 and 1974.

MSU has won 24 regular-season conference titles, including the 2010-11 MVC championship. The Bears have also recorded 28 seasons of 20 or more victories, including 15 in the Division I era.

MISSOURI STATE UNIVERSITY

Missouri State University is a public, comprehensive university system with a mission in public affairs, whose purpose is to develop educated persons while achieving five goals: democratizing society, incubating new ideas, imagining Missouri's future, making Missouri's future, and modeling ethical and effective behavior.

With an enrollment of **26,016** (fall 2020), MSU is the second-largest institution for higher learning in Missouri, and its identity is distinguished by its statewide mission in public affairs. This mission requires a campus-wide commitment to foster competence and responsibility in the common vocation of citizenship. GAME 1

December 16, 2020, JQH Arena, Springfield, Mo. Missouri State 73, William Jewell 64

Led by 20 points from senior Gage Prim, Missouri State turned back visiting William Jewell College, 73-64, in the season opener for the Bears.

Missouri State shot 67 percent in the second half and 52.5 percent for the game while dishing out 19 assists. Prim finished 9-of-11 from the field for a game high, while distributing 8 assists and snagging 6 rebounds.

Ja'Monta Black added a career-high 16 points and 8 rebounds for Missouri State, while Isiah Mosley added 13 points, and Jared Ridder posted 10 in his first start since 2018.

The visiting Cardinals were led Grant Stubbs' 12 points and 11 rebounds, while Jackson Golightly added 10 points.

After leading by 13 at the break, MSU came out firing on all cylinders in the second half, building its lead to 19 less than four minutes into the second stanza. Black's triple at the 16:03 mark made it a 48-29 contest, matching the Bears' biggest lead of the night.

Jewell knocked down four treys over the next six minutes to climb back within 12 with 7:59 to go, but coach Dana Ford's squad responded with a layup by Keaton Hervey and two quick baskets by Prim. Black's layup with just over three minutes remaining pushed the Bears up 73-55.

The Cardinals ended the game on a 9-0 run, including five points by Jordan Jermain in that span, to make the final score closer.

Paced by 9 rebounds from freshman Lu'Cye Patterson, the Bears out-rebounded their visitors, 41-29, with 10 second-chance points on 12 offensive caroms.

MSU was 31-of-59 (.525) from the field, 5-of-17 (.294) from long range and 6-of-11 (.545) from the foul line with 19 turnovers. The Bears also tallied 50 points in the paint.

In the first half, the Bears overcame a slow shooting start to push ahead by double figures at the midway point. Black sparked MSU's efforts with 11 points and 5 rebounds in the first 20 minutes, while Mosley's steal and dunk with two minutes left in the stanza capped an 11-0 run by the home side.

Black's layup at the 11-minute mark pushed the Bears up by double figures for the first time, 15-5, but Jewell rallied over the next four minutes, reeling off a 12-4 outburst to get within 19-17 of the lead just before MSU's final push before the intermission.

GAME 2

December 19, 2020, JQH Arena, Springfield, Mo. Missouri State 94, Northwestern State 67

Missouri State dominated the final 24 minutes of a 94-67 home victory over visiting Northwestern State, shooting 61 percent from the field in that span (22-of-36) while pushing ahead by as many as 33 points in the second half to improve to 2-0 on the season.

Senior Gage Prim led all players with a career-high 26 points, 9 rebounds and 9 assists for the Bears, coming up just shy of the program's first-ever triple-double. Prim was 9-for-12 from the field and added 4 blocked shots.

Jared Ridder also poured in a career high for Missouri State, dropping in six 3-pointers as part of an 18-point effort. Isiah Mosley also tallied 18 points for the Bears to go with 4 assists, and Keaton Hervey dropped in 10 points and 8 rebounds.

After Ridder broke up a 27-27 tie with 4:03 left in the first half, the Bears ended the opening stanza a 17-4 run. Mosley tallied 10 points in that run, including a pair of threes and a layup just before the horn to put the Bears up 44-31 at the intermission.

Missouri State extended the run in the second half with a jumper by Hervey and a pair of triples by Ridder that closed out a 25-7 outburst by the home side and made it 52-34 with 18:32 to play.

Northwestern State (1-7) was led by Carvell Teasett's 14 points off the bench that included three treys, while Trenton Massner added 10 points for the Demons.

Missouri State used another run in the second half to pull away even further, getting triples from Ridder and Ja'Monta Black to go with 8 points from Prim as part of a 16-2 stretch that pushed the Bears up 70-40 with 12:54 to go.

Nine of the 12 Bears in uniform found the scoring column, including the first-ever points by Skylar Wicks and 6 points from fellow freshman and birthday man, Raphe Ayres.

MSU finished 33-of-65 (.508) from the field to improve to 17-0 under Dana Ford when shooting 50 percent or better from the field. The Bears were also 12-of-34 (.353) from long range and 16-of-28 (.571) at the stripe.

Behind 9 boards by Prim and 8 by Hervey, the Bears owned a 44-37 advantage on the glass, while committing just 7 turnovers on the night with 21 assists.

GAME 3

December 21, 2020, JQH Arena, Springfield, Mo.
Missouri State 85, Little Rock 77

The sophomore tandem of Isiaih Mosley and Ja'Monta Black both scored career highs and helped lift Missouri State to an 85-77 win over visiting Little Rock, giving the Bears a solid win over the Sun Belt Conference preseason favorites and a 3-0 start to the season.

Black posted a career high for the second time in three games with 26 points. He was 7-of-11 from the field, all from 3-point range, to tie a JQH Arena record for long-range buckets. Mosley matched Black's 26 points, also going 7-of-11 from the field, with a game-high 8 rebounds and team-high 6 assists. The former high school teammates at Columbia Rock Bridge also combined to go 14-of-16 from the foul line.

Dana Ford's Bears led by as many as 14 points in the second half, getting triples on back-to-back possessions by Black to lead 56-42 with 12-and-a-half minutes remaining.

Little Rock then turned to 6-foot-10 big man Ruot Monyyong for inside baskets on its next three possessions before a jumper by Markquis Nowell made it 61-53.

Later, Nowell got the Trojans (4-3) within 62-56 on his second 3-pointer of the game with just over six minutes to play.

But Missouri State had an answer for the Little Rock run, going on a 9-1 outburst of its own over the next two minutes. Gaige Prim posted four points, and Black knocked down a triple to restore order and give MSU a 71-57 advantage with just under four to go.

The Trojans tried make things interesting again in the final minute with Nowell converting a rare four-point play with a minute to go that erased a double-figure MSU lead and made it 81-75. After a pair of missed Bear free throws moments later, the Trojans quickly pushed the ball up the floor where Kris Bankston scored on a put-back of a Maric miss to make it a four-point game.

But as they did all night, Black and Mosley came through in the clutch, burying two free throws apiece in the final 43 seconds to lift Missouri State to an eight-point victory and extend the team's JQH Arena win streak to seven games.

Nowell led Little Rock with 18 points and 7 assists. Monyyong, a Preseason All-Sun Belt selection who hit the game-winning jumper against the Bears last year at JQH Arena, finished with 16 points and 5 rebounds.

The Trojans, who dressed eight players, finished the last 38 seconds of the game with just four players on the floor. Three Little Rock players fouled out in the second half and one left the game with an injury in the opening period.

Despite fighting through foul trouble, Prim extended his double-figure scoring streak to 16 straight games, going 3-for-4 from the field and 4-for-4 at the stripe for 10 points

GAME 4

December 27, 2020, McLeod Center, Cedar Falls, Iowa
Missouri State 79, Northern Iowa 59

Missouri State held off a second-half surge from Northern Iowa and got a career-high 26 points from Isiaih Mosley to turn back the Panthers, 79-59, in the Missouri Valley Conference opener for both squads.

Mosley was 12-of-15 from the field and posted 22 points in the second half to help him match his career scoring best, a mark he also achieved six days earlier against Little Rock.

The Bears also got 16 points from Gaige Prim, 13 from Ja'Monta Black and 11 from Jared Ridder while shooting 51.6 percent (33-of-64) from the field. Prim also snagged a team-high 9 rebounds and tied a school record with 7 blocked shots to become the first Bear since Ricky Johnson in 1983 to achieve that feat.

The winning margin was the largest ever for the Bears in Cedar Falls against the Panthers, in a series that dates to 1983. The win also snapped UNI's 17-game winning streak at McLeod Center.

In the early going, the Bears took less than five minutes to go ahead by double figures, with Black making it 15-5 on a pair of free throws – MSU's only charity shots of the game -- at the 15:32 mark. UNI would use a 10-2 run later in the half to close its gap to 30-25. But MSU responded with back-to-back triples from Keaton Hervey and Ridder ahead of a hook shot from Prim to take their biggest lead of the opening period, 38-25, just ahead of the two-minute mark.

In the second half, Prim and Mosley kick started the Bears scoring with quick buckets in the opening minute to give the Bears a 46-32 advantage in what would be their largest lead until the final three minutes of the contest.

Just two minutes later, Northern Iowa embarked on its biggest run of the game, getting a dunk by Nate Heise and back-to back layups from Austin Phyfe to get it to 48-40. Mosley answered with a triple for the Bears to push the visitors ahead by 11, but the Panthers used an 11-0 surge over the next four-and-a-half minutes to knot the score, 51-51 at the 10:29 mark.

Just when it seemed UNI had all the momentum, it was Missouri State that answered the bell. Ridder sparked a quick 8-0 outburst with a trey and then a leaner off the glass before Black scored a trey to make it 59-51. UNI got a layup from Tywhon Pickford a minute later to make it a six-point game at the 7:48 mark, but the home side would never get any closer.

Missouri State came out of the under-eight media timeout with a critical 13-2 run in which Mosley scored 11 points and sealed the deal with a dunk to make it 72-55 with just over three minutes to play.

But the home standing Panthers held off the Bears down the stretch to earn an 85-75 victory at McLeod Center and salvage a split with MSU in the opening series of Missouri Valley Conference play.

Gaige Prim and Isiah Mosley scored 20 points apiece to lead Missouri State with Prim going 8-for-12 from the field and snagging a team-high 9 rebounds. Mosley scored 18 points in the second half and dished out 5 assists. Ja'Monta Black also pitched in 17 points for the Bears behind 5 3-pointers.

UNI was led by Austin Phyfe's 21 points while Nate Heise pitched in 15. After a forgettable start to the game saw UNI build a 37-11 lead, Missouri State finally found its footing late in the opening period and outscored the home squad 17-4 over the final seven minutes of the opening half. Black and Prim combined for 13 points on the run to make it a 41-28 game at the midway point.

As he did in Sunday's 79-59 Missouri State victory, Mosley saved his finest moments for the second half as he came storming out of the locker room with eight points in the first two-and-a-half minutes of the final stanza. Prim then joined in the party with back-to-back buckets to make it a 45-40 game with 16:08 to play.

Northern Iowa, which shot 52.5 percent for the game, then put together a 10-1 run over a key three-minute stretch to push its lead to 59-44 at the 12:31 mark.

The Bears never surrendered down the stretch, closing their deficit to single digits five times from there. Prim's put-back with 1:25 remaining made it a 78-70 game, and moments later Mosley made it 79-72 on a pair of free throws. Inside the final minute, the Bears were down 81-73 and got a second-chance possession after a video review of a tipped ball out of bounds. But Black's three ball from the left corner rimmed out with 58 seconds to go, and the Panthers corralled the rebound and ultimately won by 10.

Missouri State shot just 38.9 percent from the field (21-of-54) and was 8-of-30 (.267) from long range. After getting just two free throw attempts Sunday against the Panthers, the Bears posted a season-high 38 free throw attempts Monday, but left 13 points at the stripe in converting just 65.8 percent from there. The Bears also had just 9 turnovers in the contest.

Missouri State 84, Indiana State 74

Gaige Prim posted 22 points and snagged a season-high 11 rebounds to help lift Missouri State to an 84-74 win over visiting Indiana State.

The Bears, who shot 58.2 percent from the field, also got 23 points from Isiah Mosley in the winning cause, his fourth straight 20-point scoring effort. Keaton Hervey also pitched in 15 for MSU, and Demarcus Sharp added 10.

Missouri State never trailed in the contest and shot 71 percent (22-of-31) in the opening half to lead 50-30 at the midway point. The tandem of Prim and Mosley combined to score all of MSU's points on a key 10-0 run early in the opening period that culminated in a 22-4 lead less than eight minutes into the game. The Bears make 12 of their first 14 shots to start the contest.

The Sycamores fought back within 33-21 thanks to back-to-back treys from Cooper Neese and Jared Hankins, but the Bears responded with a 9-2 outburst of their own. Prim scored four in that sequence, Mosley hit a three, and Hervey scored a layup to restore order and make it a 42-23 game with three minutes left in the half.

The Bears were never able to regain their 20-point advantage in the second half, but had an answer for every Indiana State run. After the Sycamores closed the gap to 56-46 with 13 minutes remaining, the Bears got back-to-back triples from Ja'Monta Black and Mosley to push the home side ahead by 16.

Later in the half, Hervey and Jared Ridder hit big shots for MSU. Hervey's trey with 7:01 left ended an 8-2 ISU run and made it 75-59 at the time. Two minutes later, Ridder knocked down a deep two-pointer out of the corner to put the Bears ahead 77-60.

Prim put things on ice with 63 seconds to play, converting a missed shot by Black into a put-back to make it 84-72. MSU closed things out down the stretch and claimed its third double-figure victory over its last five games.

Tyreke Key scored 21 to lead Indiana State (3-5, 0-3) with Neese adding 19 for the Sycamores.

Mosley's scoring effort made him the first Bear since Keandre Cook (Feb. 7-20, 2018) to notch four straight 20-point games.

As a team, the Bears made 32-of-55 shots for their fifth 50-percent shooting game of the young season. MSU was also 8-of-22 (.364) from three and 12-of-15 (.800) at the line with a 36-32 rebounding advantage.

Missouri State 70, Indiana State 66

Isiah Mosley scored a career high 29 points, including 23 in the second half, to help push Missouri State to a 70-66 win over visiting Indiana State and give the Bears a weekend sweep of the Sycamores.

It was Mosley's fifth straight 20-point scoring game, making him the first Bear since 1995 to achieve that milestone. MSU also got 11 points from Keaton Hervey and 10 from Gaige Prim who finished in double figures for the 20th game in a row.

Indiana State was led by Randy Miller, Jr., who posted 17 points, while Tyreke Key added 13 points and a game-high 10 rebounds for the visitors.

The game featured a dozen lead changes, but Missouri State took the lead back for good with 6:10 to go on a 3-pointer from freshman Lu'Cye Patterson. Patterson was assigned to Key for most of the stretch run for MSU to keep ISU's top player in check. He capitalized on an open look from the right side with the game in the balance and knocked down his second field goal of the game.

Indiana State managed to tie the game twice more from there, but in the clutch Missouri State's top performers came up with big play after big play. Hervey hit a go-ahead runner at the five-minute mark, then a minute later threw down the game's only dunk to put MSU up by four at the time.

In the final two minutes, Mosley had three huge field goals, including a traditional three-point play at the 1:49 mark that gave the Bears some breathing room, 64-60. Before the clock hit the one-minute mark, the Valley's top scorer made it 66-62 with his patented floater.

Prim and Mosley then finished off the Sycamores from the stripe. Prim made both ends of a two-shot foul with 6.7 seconds to play, and Mosley's free throw with a second remaining put it out of reach and gave the Bears their final margin.

With both teams turning up the defensive pressure, the Bears shot just 43.8 percent from the field (21-of-48) and 6-of-21 (.289) from long range. MSU won the game at the stripe, where they converted 22-of-27 (.815) for their best game of the young season from the foul line.

The first half included eight lead changes, but the Bears went into the break with a 32-29 advantage behind 8 points from Ja'Monta Black. The see-saw period saw the Sycamores reel off 10 unanswered points over a three-minute stretch to take a 19-12 lead at the 11:45 mark. The Bears rallied from there and held ISU without a field goal for the next six minutes while manufacturing their own 10-0 run behind transition treys from Black and Jared Ridder to lead 24-21.

Down the stretch, Black and Mosley closed out the MSU scoring in the opening half with Black scoring in traffic and heavy contact to put the Bears up by one before Mosley made both ends of a technical free throw opportunity in the final minute to put the homes side up three at the intermission.

Isiah Mosley matched a career high with 29 points, and Gaige Prim scored 17 points with a career-high 16 rebounds to help Missouri State turn back Valparaiso, 81-68, in the first of two at the ARC.

Mosley led four Bears in double figures and finished 11-of-18 from the field with 8 rebounds and a team-high 5 assists. He became the first Bear since Winston Garland (Feb. 4-21, 1987) to record six straight 20-point scoring games.

Valpo got 21 points apiece from Donovan Clay and Ben Krikke. Krikke finished 8-of-13 from the field and 2-of-2 from long range for his career high.

Coach Dana Ford's squad used the three-ball to regain a double-figure advantage five minutes into the second half with Keaton Hervey, Demarcus Sharp and Ja'Monta Black each burying shots from downtown as part of an 11-0 run that gave the visitors a 62-48 lead with 12:32 to play.

In its first Valley game of the season, Valpo responded with a min-run of its own, whit-tling the MSU lead to nine on a triple by Clay and layup from Sheldon Edwards to make it 62-53. But the Bears answered again with a 9-0 stretch led by seven points from Mosley in that span to give the visitors their biggest lead of the day, 71-53 with eight minutes to go.

The Mosley-led run also capped a 20-5 outburst by Missouri State over a key nine-minute stretch in the second half.

Valpo's Connor Barrett ended the MSU run with five of his 11 points before the six-minute mark, but the Bears managed the clock well down the stretch and got a high-percentage dunk from Prim before the final media timeout to put things out of reach.

Black finished with 13 points with a pair of 3-pointers for Missouri State, while Hervey added 11 points with three triples.

For the game, MSU was 29-of-53 (.547) overall and 9-of-22 (.409) from bonus distance. The Bears, who turned the ball over just twice in the second half, also secured a 40-24 rebounding advantage, marking the fourth straight time MSU has outrebounded Valpo in the series.

On the afternoon, Valparaiso finished 23-of-56 (.411) from the field, 11-of-27 (.407) from long range and 11-of-19 (.579) at the stripe with seven turnovers.

In the first half, the Bears shot 70.8 percent from the field, converting 10 of their first 12 shots to lead by as many as 14 in the opening period. Hervey's second triple of the half made it a 37-23 game with 5:24 remaining in the opening period. But Valpo responded with a 14-4 outburst before the intermission, paced by 10 points from Krikke in that span, including a 3-pointer at the horn.

Missouri State 78, Valparaiso 68

Missouri State shot 54 percent from the field and led Valparaiso for the final 31 minutes en route to a 78-68 road victory, securing a Missouri Valley Conference road sweep over the Crusaders.

Isiah Mosley matched his career high, scoring 29 points for the third game in a row, including 26 in the second half, which led all players. Gaige Prim posted 16 points and snagged 10 rebounds for his third double-double in four games, and Ja'Monta Black pitched in 14 points behind three triples for the Bears.

Valparaiso got 13 points apiece from Evon Gordon and Jacob Ognacevic to pace the home side.

The Bears turned a nine-point halftime lead into a 16-point advantage just over three minutes into the second half behind a lightning-quick 8-0 run out of the locker room. Layups by Prim and Black forced a Valpo timeout just over two minutes into the final period before Mosley added four unanswered points with a transition layup and baseline jumper to make it 48-32.

Valparaiso made it a nine-point game with just over eight minutes to go on a dunk by Ognacevic, but the Bears quickly turned to Mosley who restored order with a layup to put the Bears up by 11.

With 3:37 to go, Valpo made another run at it, cutting it to 69-62 on a 3-point play by Sheldon Edwards. But the Bears quickly pushed it up the floor where Black buried the biggest shot of the afternoon, draining a deep 3-pointer to make it 72-62.

Mosley added four more points in the final minute-and-a-half, beating the shot clock buzzer twice to put the game on ice.

Missouri State shot 65.2 percent in the second half, including 13-of-16 from two-point range, to help push the Bears into sole possession of third place in the Valley standings. The Bears also finished 27-of-50 (.540) overall from the field for their seventh 50-percent shooting effort in nine games this season.

The Bears accounted for 17 assists on their 27 field goals, including 4 apiece from Black and Prim. The Bears also out-rebounded the Crusaders, 39-33, and made 17-of-22 (.773) from the foul line.

The victory marked the 40th win at Missouri State for head coach Dana Ford, who is in his third season in Springfield.

In the first half, the Bears shot 44.4 percent and got 10 points from Prim to lead 38-29 at the midway point. MSU overcame some early deficits but took the lead for good with an 8-0 run engineered by a drive by Demarcus Sharp and a pair of 3-pointers from Jared Ridder.

MSU then used a 12-4 run over a key three-minute stretch to push its advantage to 34-20 on a traditional 3-point play by Mosley with five-and-a-half minutes before the break. Valpo got 7 points from Gordon from there to get the home squad within single digits at the half.

Missouri State 94, Missouri S&T 49

Jared Ridder scored a career-high 23 points, and Missouri State never trailed, rolling to a 94-49 win over visiting Missouri S&T and pushing the Bears to their best 10-game start since 2010.

MSU also got 22 points from Isiah Mosley – his eighth straight 20-point scoring game – while Ja'Monta Black and Gaige Prim each pitched in 10 points for the home side. Ridder was 5-of-9 from 3-point range and shared team-high honors with 6 rebounds.

The Bears scored the game's first 11 points, taking less than four minutes to push ahead by double figures for the first time. The visiting Miners got the deficit down to four points twice before the 11-minute mark, first on a triple by Ryan Parker that made it 13-9 and later on a trey from Julien Smith that made it a 16-12 game at the 11:43 mark.

Smith finished with 15 points for the Miners.

Eight minutes later, Darian Scott gave MSU its biggest lead of the first half on an alley-oop dunk that made it a 37-19 contest. S&T added two more long-range bombs before the break to pull within 39-25 at the intermission.

But the second half was all Missouri State. Ridder dropped in three treys in the first two-and-a-half minutes, and before the visitors scored their first field goal of the final period, the Bears had a 65-30 advantage behind a 26-5 outburst.

With 11 minutes to go, Mosley caught fire, ripping off 10 of his 18 second-half points in a three-minute stretch. His first of two 3-pointers doubled up S&T, 76-38.

Down the stretch, the Bears got their freshmen into the act with Skylar Wicks and Elijah Bridgers scoring four and five points, respectively. Later, senior Spencer Brown and Bridgers hit back-to-back 3-pointers before the final media timeout. Bridgers' shot gave the Bears their biggest lead of the game at 47.

The win was the 10th in a row at JQH Arena for Missouri State, while shot 64.3 percent in the second half (18-for-28) and 30-of-58 (.517) for the game.

Prim extended his double-figure scoring streak to 22 games in a row, and Mosley became the first Bear to post eight straight 20-point contests since 1974.

On the evening, the Bears were 11-of-29 (.379) from 3-point distance and 23-for-32 (.719) at the foul line with a 51-32 rebounding advantage. MSU's rebounding total was its highest since snagging 56 boards on Dec. 30, 2018.

In a game of two very distinct halves, visiting Drake held MSU to just six field goals in the final 20 minutes and escaped JQH Arena with a 68-61 decision.

Roman Penn scored 15 of his game-high 20 points in the final period for the Bulldogs. Darnell Brodie added 16 points and 15 rebounds for DU.

The Bears were led by Gaige Prim with 18 points and a career-high 16 rebounds, while Isiaih Mosley posted 17 points and 10 boards. It marked the second straight game MSU had two players with double-doubles.

Missouri State built a 17-point advantage in the first half, pushing ahead 41-24 on a transition layup from Demarcus Sharp just 95 seconds before the intermission. Drake made it a 15-point game at the midway point and then grabbed the early momentum in the second half.

The Bulldogs scored the first five points of the final period and extended their run with a 16-4 outburst seven minutes in to cut their deficit to three. Mosley then got Missouri State going with back-to-back baskets to push the home side ahead 49-42 and restore order temporarily with 10 minutes to play.

Down the stretch, Drake held Missouri State without a field goal for more than 10 minutes, chipping away with six trips to the foul line and a clutch 3-pointer by Penn with three minutes remaining that gave the Bulldogs a 60-55 cushion.

By the time Mosley broke MSU's 0-for-11 stretch from the field with 33 seconds remaining, Drake had built its largest lead of the night, 64-56, and tacked on four free throws in the final 28 seconds to take the win.

Sharp finished with a career-high 13 points for MSU, which shot 60 percent in the opening half and 40.7 (24-of-59) for the game.

The Bears, who had a 10-game home court win streak snapped, made just 2-of-16 (.125) from long range, but converted 11-of-14 (.786) at the stripe with a 48-36 rebounding advantage.

Drake shot a season-low .368 (25-of-68) from the field, 4-of-14 (.286) from bonus range, and 14-for-21 (.667) at the line with just 5 turnovers and 14 points off Missouri State's 16 turns.

Missouri State used a 15-0 run late in the second half to get back in the game and had the lead with just over five minutes to go. But visiting Drake got clutch buckets down the stretch to remain among the nation's unbeaten DI programs with a 78-73 decision over the Bears.

ShanQuan Hemphill scored a game-high 24 points to lead four Drake players in double figures, while Darnell Brodie snagged 14 rebounds to help the visitors secure a 42-33 rebounding advantage.

The Bulldogs led by as many as 13 in the second half, taking a 61-48 lead after a 3-pointer by D.J. Wilkins with 11:15 remaining. The Bears then embarked on their biggest run of the season, reeling off 15 unanswered points over the next five minutes to lead for the first time, 63-61, on a layup by Gaige Prim.

Prim finished with 20 points and 14 rebounds on the night for his fourth double-double in five games, while teammate Isiaih Mosley posted 23 points and 11 rebounds for the Bears, including 21 points in the second period.

After Prim's layup put MSU ahead with 6:18 to go, Drake tied it on a bucket by Hemphill and briefly retook the lead moments later on a triple by Wilkins. Just before the five-minute mark, Mosley ripped to the basket and scored on an acrobatic shot to give Missouri State a 67-66 advantage headed in the game's final stretch.

Despite three Drake baskets over the next three minutes, the Bears stayed within striking distance late. After a steal by Jared Ridder, Prim's layup in transition with 1:41 left in the contest brought MSU back within 73-71.

However, the game was decided in the final minute. Brodie's up-and-under move around the basket gave DU a four-point cushion, and Tremell Murphy's dunk and subsequent free throw with seven seconds remaining brought Drake's bench to the floor and put the game out of reach.

The Bears overcame a sluggish start to finish 20-for-56 (.357) from the field and 5-of-18 (.278) from three. MSU got the line 32 times and made 28 free throws for a season-high .875 percentage. Missouri State turned the ball over just 10 times and snagged 7 steals.

For its part, Drake was held under 50 percent for the second time in as many games (.478) on 32-of-67 shots and 4-for-15 (.267) from long range. The Bulldogs also were 10-for-13 (.769) at the line with 10 turnovers and 3 steals. Drake also cashed its 14 offensive rebounds into 15 second-chance points while registering 50 points in the paint.

Loyola Chicago 70, Missouri State 50

In just his second start of the season, Bears junior Demarcus Sharp scored a game-high 21 points, but Missouri State could not keep pace with a hot-shooting Loyola squad, 70-50.

It marked the Bears fourth straight home loss after four games in seven days against Missouri Valley Conference frontrunners No. 25 Drake and Loyola.

Loyola was led by Cameron Krutwig's 19 points, 5 rebounds and 5 assists, while Aher Uguak added 12 points for the Ramblers to help them to their eighth straight win.

Much like Sunday's contest, the Ramblers came out gunning, knocking down their first four 3-point attempts and a hook shot by Krutwig to take a 14-2 lead before the first media timeout.

Midway through the half, Missouri State used a 6-0 run, powered by Nic Tata, to get within 20-16. However, the Ramblers got scoring from four different players in a subsequent 15-4 sequence that pushed the visitors up by 15 four minutes before the intermission.

Sharp scored Missouri State's final eight points of the opening half, but Loyola -- which shot 68.2 percent from the field in the first period -- ended the stanza on a 5-0 spurt to take a 42-26 lead into the intermission.

The second half proved to be a stalemate with the Bears holding their own against a Loyola team that finished the game with a 60.5 percent shooting effort (26-of-43). However, the home side was only able to cut into the halftime deficit once -- a dunk by Tata to open the final period.

Isiah Mosley and Sharp cut the MSU deficit to 17 two times apiece with Mosley's free throw at the 6:06 mark making it a 59-42 game. But as it did throughout the series, Loyola answered every Bears run with a dagger as Uguak and Krutwig scored down low on back-to-back possessions to push the visitors' lead back over 20.

For the game, MSU was 19-for-46 (.413) from the field and 0-of-12 from long range. It marked the first time since Jan. 7, 2011 that MSU did not make a 3-pointer. The Bears were also 12-for-16 (.750) at the foul-line and were out-rebounded by a narrow 24-23 margin.

Loyola finished 8-of-13 (.615) from long range and 10-of-13 (.769) at the line with 13 turnovers.

A pair of 3-pointers from Jared Ridder in the final four minutes and a series of key defensive stops down the stretch lifted visiting Missouri State to a 74-67 win.

Isiah Mosley led four MSU players in double figures with 19 points on 7-of-11 shooting to go with 6 assists. Ridder and Demarcus Sharp contributed 15 points apiece, while Gaige Prim pumped in a double-double with 14 points and 11 rebounds.

Ridder also finished with a game-high four 3-pointers, igniting key MSU runs with two in each half.

Even though MSU trailed for less than seven minutes on the afternoon, there were nine ties and 19 lead changes in the game. After the Redbirds cut the Bears' lead to 59-58 with 5:34 to go on a runner off the glass by Antonio Reeves, the Bears turned to Ridder who buried a three in the left corner to give the visitors a four-point cushion.

On Missouri State's next possession, Prim added a jumper to make it 64-58, before Ridder put it out of reach with a triple from the corner again, making it 67-58 with 2:29 remaining.

From there, it was a free throw contest for the Bears with five MSU players combining to go 7-of-10 at the line to seal the victory.

The Bears finished 26-of-53 (.491) from the field, 7-of-21 (.333) from bonus range and 15-for-22 (.682) at the line with just 11 turnovers.

Missouri State's win snapped a four-game skid and helped the maroon squad improve to 4-1 in MVC road games this season.

Illinois State was led by D.J. Horne with 23 points, while Reeves added 17. The Redbirds were 25-for-59 (.424) overall, 7-for-22 (.318) from long range and 10-for-14 (.714) with a 37-31 rebounding advantage.

The Redbirds converted its 11 offensive rebounds into 11 second-chance points.

In the first half, the Bears used a pair of Ridder 3-pointers and inside buckets from Nic Tata and Prim to go on an 11-2 run before the 10-minute mark and lead 22-15. MSU's biggest lead of the opening stanza was short-lived as the Redbirds burned a timeout and answered with an 8-0 outburst of their own to retake the lead just two minutes later.

There would be seven ties and 16 lead changes in all in the opening period with Prim's hook shot tying the game, 36-36, at the intermission.

Keaton Hervey scored a season-high 18 points, snagged 6 rebounds and blocked 3 shots to lead four Missouri State players in double figures as the Bears turned back visiting Southern Illinois, 65-53.

MSU capped its third straight Missouri Valley Conference win by shooting 61 percent in the second half and out-rebounding the visitors by a 35-27 margin.

Ja'Monta Black added 13 points for the Bears with Isiah Mosley pitching in 12 with a team-high 8 rebounds, and Gaige Prim stacking up 10 points and 5 assists.

Southern Illinois was led by Lance Jones with 13 points, while Dalton Banks added 12 points and a team-high 6 rebounds off the bench for the Salukis.

After MSU led by three at the intermission, Hervey helped ignite a 16-6 Missouri State run that culminated in back-to-back 3-pointers from the Bears junior. He also had a key layup in that sequence for the home side to help put things out of reach.

Black shared team 3-point honors with Hervey and Jared Ridder as the sophomore buried two huge buckets that helped swing things Missouri State's way. With SIU leading 13-12 in the first half, Black's triple pushed the Bears up by two and gave the home side a lead it would never relinquish. Later in the game, after the Salukis trimmed an 11-point Bears lead down to 42-39, Black's trey gave MSU a six-point cushion with 10:32 to go.

Down the stretch, Black proved critical at the line as well, going 5-for-5 from the stripe to finish in double figures for the second game in a row.

The Bears accounted for 34 points in the paint and finished the night 24-of-49 (.490) from the field, 6-of-19 (.316) from long range and 11-for-13 (.846) at the line with a dozen assists.

Southern Illinois finished 18-of-52 (.346) from the field, 5-for-18 (.278) from long range and 12-of-19 (.632) at the stripe with 9 turnovers.

The win secured Missouri State's 49th straight winning season at home as the Bears improved to 7-4 at JQH Arena this season with two games to play. MSU also improved to 9-1 this season when out-rebounding its opponent.

In the first half, the Bears made five of their first seven shots to lead 10-7 less than five minutes in. But both teams then went cold from the field for a stretch, combining for a 2-for-18 swing over the next eight minutes. Black's triple from the right wing calmed the choppy waters and pushed coach Dana Ford's team ahead for good.

Later in the opening period, Ridder buried a 3-pointer from the left side to push the Bears ahead 20-15, their largest lead of the half, before going into the intermission with a 24-21 advantage.

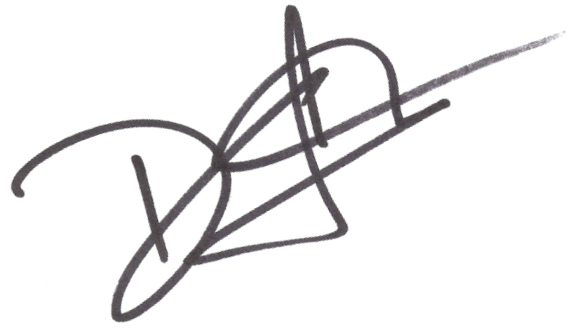

A new era for Bears men's basketball officially began on March 22, 2018 with the introduction of Dana Ford as the program's 18th head coach.

In 2019-20, Ford engineered a solid season finish that saw the Bears go 9-9 in the Missouri Valley Conference and upset third-seeded Indiana State in the MVC Tournament quarterfinals. The Bears matched or out-rebounded 24-of-33 opponents, including nine of their last 10, to finish 25th nationally in rebound margin (6.2). The Bears also posted their second-best free throw percentage (.749) of the program's Division I era and had their highest scoring average in league games (71.6) in 10 years. Despite eight losses by four points or less, MSU boasted two All-MVC performers for the second year in a row with second team selection Keandre Cook and third-teamer Gaike Prim, who also was recognized on the MVC All-Newcomer Team.

In his first season at Missouri State in 2018-19, Ford began the year as the fifth-youngest Division I coach in the nation (33) and helped guide the Bears to a third-place finish in the MVC. In addition to pushing the Bears to their first winning conference record (10-8) since the 2010-11 campaign, two MSU players earned All-MVC honors, including the 2019 MVC Newcomer of the Year, and three players on the Valley's All-Newcomer team.

Ford orchestrated one of the best turnarounds in NCAA history when he accepted the Tennessee State job in 2014-15 as the nation's youngest Division I head coach at the time. The Tigers went from a 5-26 record his first season to a 20-11 ledger in 2015-16. He earned Ohio Valley Conference Coach of the Year and NABC District 19 Coach of the Year laurels that year.

Over his last three years in Nashville, Ford has led the Tigers to a combined 52-39 record and coached five All-OVC players in addition to two players recognized on the OVC All-Newcomer Team. Under his leadership, Tennessee State also doubled its home attendance average and twice earned votes in the Associated Press Top 25 poll during the 2016-17 season.

A native of Tamms, Ill., Ford is a 2006 graduate of Illinois State University where he was a four-year letterman for the Redbirds under coaches Tom Richardson and Porter Moser from 2002-06. He was a regular starter and led ISU in steals as a senior.

He went on to successful assistant coaching stints at Winthrop and Wichita State under coach Gregg Marshall and later as associate head coach at Illinois State under coach Dan Muller. His coaching resume also includes assistant coaching stops at Chipola (Fla.) College and Tennessee State. He was an assistant for two NCAA Tournament teams at Winthrop (2006-07) and Wichita State (2011-12) as well as a NJCAA national final four run at Chipola College (2008-09). and was responsible for recruiting future NBA talents such as Robert Covington (Rockets) and Fred VanVleet



(Raptors).

Dana and his wife Christina have two daughters, Charlie Rose and latest addition Cline (born in July 2020), and three sons, Carson, Cameron and Crain. They are also the parents of another daughter, Promise, who passed in infancy in 2017.

The Fords are also the founders of the Rebound Foundation which raises funds and awareness to help renew and restore women who have experienced a life of domestic abuse. The foundation provides a stable home and fresh start to abuse victims and their children. The Rebound Foundation currently provides homes in Springfield, Mo., and Chicago, Ill.

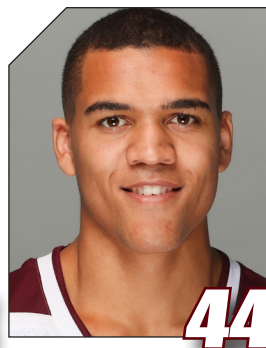
