

Missouri State University officially introduced Bobby Petrino as its new head football coach in a news conference at JQH Arena on January 16, 2020.

During his first season as head coach of Missouri State in 2020-21, coach Petrino guided the Bears to a 5-1 ledger in the Missouri Valley Football Conference and a share of the MVFC title. It marked the program's first conference championship since 1990 and ultimately earned MSU an at-large bid into the NCAA FCS playoffs, also the team's first in 30 years. The Bears finished with a final national ranking of 13 in both the STATS and AFCA national polls and earned 10 All-MVFC selections, including first-teamer and FCS Sophomore All-American DB Montrae Braswell.

For transforming the MoState program overnight into league contenders, Petrino was named MVFC Coach of the Year and finished ninth in the FCS National Coach of the Year voting, garnering two first-place votes in a stacked field of national coaching leaders.

Petrino's second season in Springfield was even more impressive than his debut. The Bears finished 14th in both the AFCA and Stats Perform final polls, while rolling to a 6-2 league record and runner-up finish in the MVFC. In addition, the Bears made a second straight appearance in the NCAA FCS Playoffs, while Petrino tied for 11th in the final voting for the Eddie Robinson Award for FCS National Coach of the Year.

The Bears boasted a dozen all-conference players in 2021 with QB Jason Shelley earning MVFC Offensive Play-

er of the Year and MVFC Newcomer of the Year laurels. Five other MoState players earned All-America distinction in 2021.

In August of 2021, ESPN named Petrino as one of the top 100 college football coaches of the last 50 years (#77).

Prior to coming to Springfield, Petrino previously served as head coach in two stints at Louisville as well as Arkansas and Western Kentucky. He compiled a 119-56 record in 14 seasons at the NCAA Division I FBS level and led those programs to 11 bowl appearances with seven teams ranked in the top 25 at season's end.

The Helena, Mont., native will begin his 34th year of collegiate coaching in the fall of 2022. He has guided his programs to top-six final rankings in the Associated Press poll three times (2004, 2006, 2011), directing some of the nation's top offensive programs along the way.

His clubs have finished in the top five nationally in scoring offense three times, while his 2004 club at Louisville led the country in scoring at 49.8 points per game. He has developed 35 NFL Draft selections during his illustrious career, including four in the first round, and Heisman Trophy winner Lamar Jackson.

His first stint at Louisville (2003-06) boasted 41 wins over a four-year span in the first head coaching assignment of his career with four bowl appearances in four seasons. Petrino directed the Cardinals to their first BIG EAST title in 2006, Louisville's second year in the league.

Petrino's 2004 campaign was one of the best in school



history, leading the Cardinals to an 11-1 record that culminated in a Conference USA title and a 44-40 Liberty Bowl win over 10th-ranked Boise State. The Cardinals led the nation in total offense (539.0) and scoring offense (49.8), scored 50 or more points seven times and set an NCAA record by scoring 55 or more points in five straight games.

He stepped away from college football in 2007 to coach the NFL's Atlanta Falcons for a season, then returned to guide the Arkansas Razorbacks for four years, from 2008-11. In Fayette-ville, Petrino's squads were 34-17 in his time there -- including a 29-10 ledger over his last three campaigns -- with three bowl appearances and an impressive 11-2 record and No. 5 final ranking in 2011.

Petrino spent the 2013 season as head coach at Western Kentucky, where he helped WKU finish 8-4 while closing the season with a four-game winning streak. The Hilltoppers also set a new school record for total offense (5,502 yards) and passing first downs (141) in a season.

His return to Louisville in 2014 was immediately successful, guiding the Cardinals to a 9-4 year out of the gates before reeling off four consecutive bowl appearances and another 9-4 campaign in 2016. In his nine total seasons in Louisville, Petrino's Cardinals were 77-35 overall and 45-24 in conference games (CUSA, Big East and ACC).

Petrino literally grew up in the

coaching profession. His father, Bob Petrino, Sr., coached at Carroll College in Helena, Mont., for 26 seasons, earning 163 victories and 15 conference titles. Petrino officially started his coaching career as a graduate assistant for his father at Carroll College in 1983

After a graduate assistant stint as quarterbacks coach at Weber State in 1984, Petrino returned to be the offensive coordinator for his father in 1985-86 at Carroll. They had the top-ranked offense in the NAIA ranks in both of his seasons, thanks in large part to the play of Bobby Petrino's younger brother, Paul, who was a four-year starter at quarterback.

He returned to Weber State as the wide receivers and tight ends coach (1987-88), then served three seasons at Idaho (1989-91), including two years at offensive coordinator. The 1990 Idaho squad defeated MSU, 41-35, in the first round of the NCAA FCS playoffs in Springfield.

From there, he took assignments at Arizona State (1992-93), Nevada (1994) and Utah State (1995-97), before drawing the offensive coordinator position at Louisville in 1998. He guided future NFL star Jake Plummer at Arizona State and engineered the nation's No. 2 passing offense (330) and total offense (500.1) at Nevada for a 9-2 squad that won a share of the Big West title. Petrino also helped Utah State set school records in total offense (468.5) and passing yards (317.5) during the 1996 season. Likewise, the 1998 Louisville team was the top-ranked NCAA FBS squad in scoring and total offense.

Petrino stepped away from the college game from 1999-2001 for three seasons with the Jacksonville Jaguars, including the offensive coordinator role in 2001.

He played college football for his father at Carroll College, twice earning NAIA All-America honors and leading the Fighting Saints to three straight Frontier Conference championships. He was named the league MVP in 1981 and 1982. He also played four years of basketball at Carroll while earning a bachelor's degree in physical education with a minor in mathematics in 1983.

Petrino and his wife Becky have four children: Kelsey, Nick, Bobby and Katie — and eight grandchildren.

Ryan Beard

Defensive Coordinator 3rd Season



Ryan Beard joined the Missouri State staff in 2020 as the Bears defensive coordinator.

He made an immediate impact on the program, helping orchestrate an MSU defensive unit that racked up a school-record 27 sacks and force 15 turnovers in an abbreviated 2020-21 campaign. Likewise, the Bears held every Missouri Valley opponent under 30 points for the first time since 1989 and claimed a share of the MVFC title for the first time since 1990.

Beard's defense boasted five all-conference players in 2020-21 and helped the Bears earn a bid to the NCAA FCS playoffs for the first time in 30 seasons.

That momentum carried forward in 2021 as Missouri State finished as runners-up in the MVFC and made another NCAA FCS Playoff appearance. Beard's defense eclipsed the club single-season sack record again (30.0) while accounting for 25 takeaways and 15 interceptions. MoState ranked ninth nationally in turnovers gained and 14th in picks.

The 2021 Bears boasted five all-conference players on the defensive side of the ball, including safeties Kyriq McDonald and Titus Wall. Wall went on to immediate success with the Calgary Stampeders of the Canadian Football League, while Bears' defensive lineman Eric Johnson was drafted by the Indianapolis Colts in the fifth round of the 2022 Draft.

He spent the 2019 season at Central Michigan as the special teams and safeties coach for head coach Jim McElwain. He joined the Central Michigan staff in February of 2019 and helped lead the Chippewas to an 8-6 campaign on a defensive secondary that created 13 interceptions.

Beard served as an assistant during the 2017-18 seasons at Louisville, starting as the defensive backs coach and in quality control before moving on to become the Cardinals' linebackers coach and their co-special teams coordinator. Among those who Beard coached at Louisville are Jaire Alexander, who was selected by the Green Bay Packers in the first round of the NFL draft; 2014 Jim Thorpe Award winner Gerod Holliman; and James Sample, a member of the Jacksonville Jaguars.

As the defensive backs coach at Western Kentucky in 2016, Beard helped lead the Hilltoppers to the Conference USA championship and a win in the Boca Raton Bowl.

As a defensive back at Western Kentucky from 2007-11, Beard was a two-time All-Sun Belt Conference selection and was named to the league's All-Freshman squad and its All-Academic team. In 2011, he earned the Western Kentucky Iron Man Award.

Beard holds two degrees from Western Kentucky: a bachelor of science in Business Management, and a master of science in Recreation and Sport Administration.

Beard is married to the former Katie Petrino. The couple have four children with son Beau and daughter Lainey, in addition to twins Jacob and Kailey born in the spring of 2022.

Nick Petrino

Offensive Coordinator 3rd Season



Nick Petrino joined the Bears coaching staff in 2020 as the team's offensive coordinator under his father and head coach, Bobby Petrino.

In his first season at MSU, Petrino's offense yielded three All-Missouri Valley Football Conference selections and one MVFC All-Newcomer Team pick. His offense averaged 310 yards per game in MVFC games in 2020-21 and helped the Bears finish 5-1 in conference play to earn a share of the Missouri Valley title with an NCAA Playoff appearance.

The Bears returned to the FCS Playoffs in 2021, racking up 436.5 yards per game (16th) and 34.2 points per game (12th), both of which ranked in the top 20 among all FCS programs. He also boasted the MVFC Offensive Player of the Year and MVFC Newcomer of the Year in QB Jason Shelley who passed for a school-record 3,347 yards and finished 10th in the Walter Payton Award voting.

Petrino spent the 2019 season as co-offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at UT Martin where he mentored the Skyhawks' second OVC Freshman of the Year in quarterback John Bachus III. A finalist for the Jerry Rice Award, given to the nation's top freshman, Bachus ranked nationally in passing yards (2,549), passing yards per completion (13.56), passing touchdowns (18) and total offense (218.1 ypg). He also was tabbed to the OVC All-Newcomer squad while notching four OVC Newcomer of the Week and a pair of OVC Player of the Week honors. The Skyhawks ranked second in the OVC in pass efficiency (144.7).

Before his tenure at UT Martin, Petrino served on the coaching staff at the University of Louisville under his father, Bobby Petrino. During his tenure at Louisville from 2015-18, the Cardinals offense exploded to set several program records behind the dynamic play of Heisman Trophy winner Lamar Jackson. Jackson totaled a school-record eight 100-yard rushing games, while setting a school record with 1,571 yards on the ground and 21 touchdowns. He nearly duplicated his award-winning performance in 2017 by totaling 45 touchdowns and accounting for 5,261 yards of total offense. The third-year coach saw Jackson improve as a passer — completing a career-high 59.1 percent of his passes and throwing for 3,660 yards and 27 scores. Jackson was later drafted 32nd overall in the 2018 NFL Draft by the Baltimore Ravens.

He spent the 2014-15 seasons as a grad assistant at Louisville, where he aided in the development of quarterbacks and wide receivers. He was also a student assistant at Western Kentucky for the 2013 season, where he assisted the quarterbacks coach and the offensive staff.

Petrino began his collegiate coaching career as a student coach at Arkansas in 2010-11, assisting with the development of the QBs as the Razorbacks finished 11-2, including a win in the 2011 Cotton Bowl.

A high school star, Petrino played quarterback at Trinity High School in St. Matthews, Ky. and helped the Shamrocks win back-to-back state titles in 2005 and 2006. He spent a semester at Georgetown (Ky.) College and eventually joined his father at Arkansas as a walk-on.

He graduated from Western Kentucky University in 2014.



AustinAppleby



Asst. Coach, Wide Receivers 3rd Season

Austin Appleby joined the Missouri State football staff in March of 2020 as the team's wide receivers coach.

Appleby's receivers were the class of the Missouri Valley Football Conerence in 2021. Newcomer Ty Scott smashed club records for receptions (66), yards (1,110) and touchdowns (8) to earn first-team all-league honors and Sophomore All-American honors. Fellow MVFC All-Newcomer Team selection Xavier Lane also stood out, racking up 56 receptions for 784 yards while claiming All-MVFC honorable mention distinction. At 14.14 yards per reception, MSU's receivers ranked eighth nationally.

In his first season in Springfield (2020-21), All-MVFC receiver Damoriea Vick, hauled in 45 passes for 596 yards. Bears' receivers also helped convert 38 percent of their third down opportunities and post 184.0 yards per game through the air against conference foes.

Appleby spent the 2019 season as an offensive analyst and quality control coach for coach Jim McElwain at Central Michigan. Prior to his stop in Mount Pleasant, Appleby spent the 2018 campaign as the quarterbacks coach and pass game coordinator at Mount Union (Ohio).

The native of North Canton, Ohio finished his college career at Florida where he became the first graduate transfer in program history to start at quarterback for the Gators. He helped lead coach McElwain's Gators to an SEC Eastern Division title his senior year and went on to earn MVP honors in the 2017 Outback Bowl victory over lowa.

He passed for 1,447 yards and 10 touchdowns in his lone season at Florida and was named to the SEC Academic Honor Roll.

Prior to coming to Gainesville, Appleby played three seasons at Purdue where he played in 16 games from 2013-15, accumulating 19 touchdown passes and 2,777 passing yards for the Boilermakers. He earned his undergraduate degree from Purdue in 2015 with a B.S. in Selling and Sales Management.

Appleby signed a professional contract with the Dallas Cowboys after his time at Florida and also spent time with the Orlando Apollos of the AAFL in 2019. He also spent part of the 2017 season as a volunteer quarterbacks coach at his alma mater.

During his high school career at North Canton Hoover, he was a finalist for the Elite 11 Quarterback Award and passed for more than 2,800 yards and 15 touchdowns in his last two prep seasons.

Kevin Elliott



Asst. Coach, Outside LBs 1st Season

Kevin Elliott joined the Missouri State football staff in 2022 after serving the previous two years at Greensboro (N.C.) College as the defensive coordinator and secondary coach.

Prior to his stint in Greensboro, Elliott enjoyed a two-year stint at Concord University where he served as the assistant head coach and defensive coordinator. During that time, Elliott's defense ranked fifth in the NCAA Division II fumble recovery rankings, while leading the Mountain East Conference. In addition, Elliott coached five All-MEC selections, including an Academic All-American.

Elliott previously served as a defensive graduate assistant at the University of Louisville under current Bears head coach Bobby Petrino. While with the Cardinals, Elliott helped bring an ACC Atlantic Division Championship to Louisville in 2016. In addition, the Cardinals also made appearances in the Citrus Bowl and the TaxSlayer Bowl. He was also on the staff that produced Heisman Trophy Winner Lamar Jackson, while also having three players named All-ACC, two NFL draft picks, and one freshman All-American. During this time, the Cardinals ranked 14th in the nation in total defense, 12th in rushing defense, 10th in third-down defense, 22nd in interceptions, and 24th in takeaways.

Before joining the Cardinals staff, Elliott spent three more seasons at Concord where he coached the secondary for three seasons and adding the title of special teams coordinator in 2015. During that time, Elliott had eight All-Conference selections, five All-Region players, and three All-Americans, while also leading the team to the NCAA Division II National Semi-Finals in 2014 and going 13-1. During that season, the Mountain Lions also won the Mountain East Conference title and the Regional Championship.

As a player at Concord, Elliott was a four-year letter winner and was named to the All-Conference team in 2012, while also serving as a team captain. That season, Elliott also finished second in the West Virginia Intercollegiate Athletic Conference with four interceptions. The year prior, Elliott and the Mountain Lions won the WVIAC title for the first time in 21 seasons, qualifying for the NCAA Division II playoffs for the first time in program history.

Elliott holds a B.S. in Physical Education and Health Pre K-Adult (2013) and a M.A. in Health Promotion (2015), both from Concord University. Elliott and his wife, Nikki, reside in Springfield.

Nelson Fishback



Asst. Coach, Tight Ends 3rd Season

Nelson Fishback joined the Missouri State staff in 2020 and serves as the Bears tight end coach.

During his first season in Springfield in 2020-21, he orchestrated a position group led by veteran Isaac Smith and transfer Ron Tiavaasue who combined for 18 pass receptions on the season, including Smith's game-winning score against Western Illinois in the MVFC opener.

In 2021, Tiavaasue led MSU's tight ends with 14 catches and a pair of TDs, while Smith capped his career with a 12-reception effort, including a clutch performance in the FCS playoffs vs. UT Martin.

Fishback served the 2019 season as wide receivers coach and special teams coordinator at Snow College in Ephraim, Utah. During his time at Snow, he was in charge of all six special team units and was pivotal in game planning, strategy and opponent scouting.

Prior to his season at Snow College, Fishback was the interim quarterbacks coach as well as an offensive and special teams graduate assistant at Louisville for the 2018 season.

Fishback previously served as an interim offensive assistant coach and worked with wide receivers coach at his alma mater Western Kentucky University from 2016-17. He was also a student assistant for the Hilltoppers for the 2016 and 2017 seasons, helping WKU to a CUSA title in 2016 and victories in the Boca Raton Bowl and Cure Bowl. The 2016 Hilltoppers were the nation's top-scoring offense at 45.5 points per game.

As a quarterback at Western Kentucky from 2013-16, Fishback was a member of one of the top-scoring offenses in the country. During the 2015 season, WKU ranked in the top 5 in the Nation in offense. Western Kentucky finished the 2015 season ranked 24th in The AP Top 25, and finished 12-2 with a win in the Miami Beach Bowl over South Florida.

Fishback holds two degrees from Western Kentucky: a B.S. in Sports Management and a Master of Science in Recreation and Sport Administration.



Ronnie Fouch



Asst. Coach, Running Backs 3rd Season

Ronnie Fouch joined the Missouri State staff in 2020 and helped engineer the resurgence of the Bears running game in his inaugural season in Springfield.

Led by MVFC All-Newcomer Team and All-MVFC honorable mention selection Celdon Manning, the Bears running game was vastly improved under Fouch in 2020-21. The unit averaged 111.6 yards per game overall (126.0 yards in league games) and accounted for 12 ground touchdowns. Jeremiah Wilson averaged 4.9 yards per carry to lead the unit, while Manning compiled 269 total yards and 4 TDs as a true freshman.

In 2021, the Bears racked up 153.7 yards per game on the ground with 23 rushing touchdowns. Kevon Latulas (625 yards) and Tobias Little (599) shouldered the load to the tune of 5.4 yards per carry.

Fouch spent the 2019 season as tight ends coach at Florida Tech University in Melbourne, Fla. He was part of a Panther offensive mastery that engineered just under 400 yards per game of total offense.

Fouch served as the quarterbacks coach for the Salt Lake Stallions from 2018-19, mentoring Josh Woodrum to a league-best 65-percent completion percentage in the Alliance of American Football.

From 2015-18, he served as the offensive quality control coach at Louisville, assisting with the special teams and quarterbacks personnel for the Cardinals. He recruited 10 states and helped mentor a number of standout players, including first-round NFL Draft pick Lamar Jackson.

Before joining the Cardinals' staff, Fouch worked as a football recruiting specialist at Georgia State University from 2013-15. He handled recruiting and player personnel after serving as the graduate assistant for the Panthers and his former coach Trent Miles. He coached two NFL wide receivers at GSU and was also instrumental in the club's national recruiting strategy.

Fouch played college football at Washington and then transferred to Indiana State where he was one of the Valley's top quarterbacks during his tenure. He started 22 games in Terre Haute, completing 322-of-544 passes for 4,316 yards and 38 touchdowns. The Sycamores were 6-5 in both of his seasons as the starter, including engineering an overtime victory against MoState in 2010. In 2011, ISU was ranked in the FCS Top 25 most of the year.

He earned an invitation to the Chicago Bear's mini-camp after earning his degree in Criminology from Indiana State in 2012.

Max Halpin



Asst. Coach, Offensive Line 3rd Season

Max Halpin joined the Missouri State football staff in February of 2021 as the squad's offensive line coach.

He made an immediate impact on the Bears front five, helping the offense rack up 310 yards per game in league play and earn a share of the Missouri Valley Football Conference title for the first time in 30 years.

In 2020-21, Halpin boasted All-MVFC second teamer Landon Bebee who excelled as one of the top guards in the league and turned in a 96 percent assignment grade as a sophomore.

In the fall of 2021, Bebee made a return appearance on the All-MVFC list, while the Bears averaged 436.5 yards and 34.2 points per game, both of which ranked in the top 16 among all FCS programs.

Halpin came to Springfield after spending the last three years at Purdue University where he assisted offensive line coach Dale Williams in all aspects of the Boilermakers offensive front.

He played for Bobby Petrino as a freshman at Western Kentucky and also played for Williams and current Purdue head coach Jeff Brohm at WKU where he was a first-team all-conference center for the Hilltoppers in 2016. The 2016 WKU front five were ranked as the No. 4 offensive line in the country, according to Pro Football Focus, and led an offense that ranked No. 1 in points per game (45.5) and No. 5 in yards per game (523.1) among all NCAA FBS schools.

Halpin spent 2012-16 at WKU and advanced from a walk-on to one of the program's most prolific players while helping the Hilltoppers win back-to-back Conference USA championships during his tenure. He was on the Rimington Trophy Watch List, awarded to college football's top center, in both 2015 and 2016, and was a nominee for the Burlsworth Trophy in 2016, given to the the best Division I player who started his career as a walk on.

Originally from Fort Mitchell, Ky., Halpin earned his degree in Business Administration from WKU in 2016 and later completed his masters in Technology Leadership and Innovation from Purdue in 2020.

He was a four-year letterwinner and three-year starter at Covington Catholic High School and earned all-state honorable mention laurels his senior season. He was also selected as the starting center for the Kentucky Best of the Bluegrass All-Star game.

Reggie Johnson



Asst. Coach, Inside LBs 3rd Season

Reggie Johnson joined the Missouri State staff in 2020 as the team's inside linebackers coach.

In his first campaign in Springfield, Johnson helped guide the Bears to a share of the MVFC championship and first NCAA FCS Playoff appearance in 30 years. He mentored All-MVFC linebacker Tylar Wiltz who posted a team-high 80 tackles in 2020-21, including 51 solo stops and 7.0 tackles for loss. Wiltz was back on the All-MVFC team in 2021 and earned third-team All-American honors from Phil Steele after racking up 106 tackles and 14.5 TFLs.

Johnson served three seasons as defensive line coach at Purdue from 2017-19 before arriving at Missouri State. His tenure with the Boilermakers netted five All-Big Ten Conference selections. He joined the Boilermakers after spending the 2016 season at Western Kentucky, where he coached the defensive ends. The Hilltoppers' primary defensive ends had 98 total stops, 22 tackles for loss and 11 sacks.

Prior to Western Kentucky, Johnson spent two seasons (2014-15) as defensive coordinator, line-backers and defensive line coach at Alabama A&M, two seasons as defensive coordinator and linebackers coach at UAB (2012-13) and four seasons as linebackers coach at Arkansas (2008-11).

Johnson also spent time with head coach Bobby Petrino previously, serving four seasons as linebackers coach (2004-07), one season as defensive line coach (2003) and two years as a graduate assistant (1997-98) at Louisville, his alma mater. Johnson had a three-year stint at Alabama A&M, where he served as special teams coordinator and defensive coach (1998-99) and inside linebackers coach (2000) and spent two seasons at UTEP as defensive ends (2001) and linebackers (2002) coach.

He has coached in 10 bowl games, including the 2005 Gator Bowl, 2006 Orange Bowl, 2010 Sugar Bowl and 2011 Cotton Bowl.

At Louisville, he helped mentor consensus All-American and Broncos draft pick Elvis Dumervil in 2003, as well as freshman and future first-round NFL Draft pick Amobi Okoye. Okoye, was the youngest player ever drafted at the age of 19 when he was selected by Houston in 2007.

He was a four-year letterman as a linebacker at Louisville from 1987-90 and played on a team that went 10-1-1 his senior year. He earned a bachelor's degree in Political Science in 1996 and a Master's degree in Education from Louisville in 1998.

Johnson and his wife, Eulice, have two children, Sydney and Jordan.



L.D. Scott



Asst. Coach, Defensive Line 3rd Season

L.D. Scott joined the Missouri State staff in 2020 after building a reputation of one of the country's top recruiters and defensive line specialists.

In 2020-21, Scott engineered a defensive front that helped set a school record for sacks (27), while racking up 65 tackles for loss. He also boasted a pair of all-conference selections in second-team picks Kevin Ellis and Eric Johnson. The tandem combined for 58 total stops, 14.0 tackles for loss and 7.5 sacks on the year.

In 2021, the Bears broke their season sack record again (30), while Johnson was drafted by the Indianapolis Colts in the fifth round. Four of Scott's linemen earned postseason honors with Ellis (first team) and Johnson (second team) earning All-MVFC distinction. Allen Love and Siale Suliafu were also named to the MVFC All-Newcomer Team.

He spent the 2014-18 seasons at Louisville, coaching the defensive line at his alma mater and developing five NFL players in his tenure. His 2014 and 2015 defensive lines both finished in the top 20 nationally against the run.

Scott was influential in the development of All-ACC performer Sheldon Rankins, who ranked in the school's top 10 for career tackles for loss and sacks and was the No. 12 overall pick by the New Orleans Saints. Louisville finished sixth in the country against the run in 2014 and 10th in total defense en route to a 9-4 mark and an appearance in the Belk Bowl.

Scott served one season as Western Kentucky's defensive ends coach for head coach Bobby Petrino in 2013-14. He worked with defensive line coach Don Dunn to craft together a lineup that saw much of its unit depart due to graduation. The new lineup held its final four conference opponents to just 105 vards per game on the ground.

Scott spent 2011 as an intern with Arkansas under Petrino working with the defensive tackles, before moving to a grad assistant role in 2012.

As a player at Louisville, Scott was a four-year letterman, putting together a 41-tackle season in his senior year of 2009. He had at least 20 tackles in each of his final three seasons and played a key role in Louisville's 2006 season, when the Cardinals went 12-1 and won the Orange Bowl.

Scott played the 2010 season in the CFL with Winnipeg before starting his coaching career as the D-line coach at Seneca High in Louisville.

Scott graduated with a degree in Communications from Louisville in 2009. He is married to the former Kelsey Petrino and the couple has four children, Brianna, Braylon, Emmett, and Anissa.

Tramain Thomas



Asst. Coach, Cornerbacks 3rd Season

Tramain Thomas joined Bobby Petrino's staff in November 2020 as the Bears defensive backs coach

During his tenure in Springfield, the Bears have established themselves as one of the best defensive secondaries in the league and secured three All-MVFC performers in All-American Montrae Braswell, Kyrig McDonald and Titus Wall.

In 2020-21, the Bears led the MVFC in defensive third-down percentage (.287) thanks in part to an exemplary secondary full of playmakers. In 2021, MoState racked up 15 interceptions to finish 14th among all FCS programs, while its 25 forced turnovers ranked the Bears No. 9 nationally.

Thomas, who was most-recently the corner-backs coach at Oklahoma Baptist, was a two-time All-Southeastern Conference defensive back at Arkansas under Petrino from 2008-11.

He also worked under Petrino at the University of Louisville where he served as a defensive quality control coach for nickelbacks and cornerbacks during the 2018 season.

He previously served two seasons coaching defensive backs as a graduate assistant at Midwestern State where he was instrumental in leading the Mustangs to a conference title in 2017, while helping the unit finish fifth nationally in red zone defense and first in the conference in scoring defense.

The Winnie, Texas, native began his coaching career as a defensive backs coach at East Chambers High School in his hometown.

A four-year letter winner at Arkansas, Thomas was named a Yahoo! Sports All-American in 2011 after finishing second on the team with 91 tackles and a team-best five interceptions. He was tabbed a second-team All-SEC selection in 2010, an honorable mention All-SEC pick in 2011, and the Most Outstanding Player in the Auto Zone Liberty Bowl. Thomas was a three-time SEC Defensive Player of the Week honoree and was on the Jim Thorpe Award watch list during the 2011 season.

Following his successful collegiate career, Thomas signed as an undrafted free agent with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers in 2012. He later played one season in the Arena Football League with the lowa Barnstormers.

Thomas is currently working on his master's degree in sport administration from Midwestern State University after graduating with his bachelor's degree in Criminology from Arkansas in 2013.

Lynn Mentzer



Dir. of Football Operations 5th Season

Lynn Mentzer joined the Missouri State staff as director of football operations in January 2018

She came to Springfield from Coastal Carolina University where she has served in a similar capacity for the Coastal football program since 2005.

Mentzer was a student office assistant when the Coastal Carolina program began in 2002 and its first season of competition in 2003. She was also a part of the program's transition from FCS to FBS competition in 2016 after a successful run of seven Big South Conference championships, six FCS playoff appearances and 10 weeks ranked No. 1.

She was awarded the game ball for a win in 2011 after taking over the equipment manager responsibilities for the last week of the season.

The native of Kenton, Ohio earned her degree in business management from Coastal Carolina in 2005.

2021 Brings Second Straight NCAA Playoff Run; Shelley Emerges as Valley's Top QB

Despite winning a share of the Missouri Valley regular-season title and making the school's first NCAA Playoff run in 30 years during the spring of 2021, Missouri State entered the (fall) 2021 season unranked and picked a distant sixth in the MVFC preseason poll.

Instead of "repeat," the theme for coach Bobby Petrino's second season became "respect." And boy did the Bears earn it quickly.

On opening night, Missouri State took its show to Stillwater, Okla., to battle the No. 22-ranked Cowboys. The visitors gave the crowd of nearly 51,000 its money's worth, outgaining OSU by a 214-120 margin in the second half to cut into a 20-3 halftime deficit. The Bears made it a 23-16 game with just over three minutes to play and had time to recover an onside kick, turn the ball over on downs, force OSU into a punt and drive into the red zone in the final 30 seconds for a potential

game-tying drive. However, MSU's efforts came up short in a 23-16 loss in Stillwater.

The Bears then reeled off three wins in a row to solidify a 3-1 start to the year. A thrilling 43-34 win over UCA in the home opener saw five touchdowns in the game's final 3 minutes, 17 seconds for the year's first win. Jason Shelley's 26-yard pass to Xavier Lane with 29 seconds to go secured the victory.

MSU followed that with a 31-23 win over South Dakota, shutting out the Coyotes in the second half to erase an early 23-14 deficit, before a dominant 41-20 victory at Illinois State in week four.

A week five setback at Youngstown State only fueled the team's motivation down the stretch as the Bears cruised to a 37-7 homecoming win over Indiana State that featured a 442-yard day by the home side.

In week seven, the Bears led 10-0 six minutes into the game and didn't trail No. 3 North Dakota State until the Bison broke up a 20-20 tie with 4:57 to go. Ultimately, MSU suffered a 27-20 loss, despite a 242-yard passing effort by Shelley.

The Bears then closed out the regular season with four straight wins, including two over ranked foes, catapulting them to an 8-3 regular-season finish and 6-2 ledger in the MVFC which was good enough for sole possession of second place. That push set MoState up for its second NCAA FCS Playoff appearance in as many years, a home game against OVC champ UT Martin.

In a playoff game that featured eight

lead changes, it seemed only fitting that the "Cardiac Bears" -- who had four fourth-quarter comebacks on the season -- had the ball in the game's deciding moments, driving into UT Martin territory for the potential go-ahead score. But with 1:03 to go, on the heels of 25-and 9-yard completions from Shelley to Lane, a tipped pass was intercepted by UT Martin's D'Carrious Stephens at his own 46, killing MSU's drive and crushing its playoff hopes.

UT Martin ran the clock out and escaped Springfield with a 32-31 win, helped by six MSU turnovers and three interceptions.

A total of 12 Missouri State players were honored as All-MVFC Team selections, the squad's most since 2004. The list included six first-team selections with Shelley named MVFC Offensive Player of the Year and Newcomer of the Year.

Shelley also finished 10th in the Walter Payton Award voting for FCS Offensive Player of the Year.

Teammates Grant Burkett (P), Jose Pizano (K), Montrae Braswell (DB/RS), Ty Scott (WR) and Tylar Wiltz (LB) each earned All-America honors from various organizations, setting a program high-water mark.

And despite a first-round playoff setback, MSU was ranked 14th in both the AFCA and Stats Perform final polls, earning the Bears the respect they sought from season's onset.

NCAA FCS First Round November 25, 1989, Springfield, Mo.

The Missouri State Bears hosted their first NCAA FCS football playoff game ever and earned the first postseason grid win in MSU history as K Chris Potthast hit a 33-yard field goal with eight seconds left in the game to beat Maine, 38-35 before a packed home crowd on an overcast but warm afternoon on the Bears' home field. QB DeAndre Smith brought the Bears back from an early 17-7 deficit with three TD runs, and QB Paul Carney ran for the Bears' final two scores after Smith went out with an injury. Both MSU passers fired with pin-point accuracy, hitting 11-of-14 aerials for the contest. Carl Smith, the nation's top rusher, led Maine as he ran for a pair of touchdowns, but the Bears held on to tie the school mark for wins in a season with 10 and advance to the NCAA quarterfinals.

Austin State Lumber-jacks scored early and often on their home field behind QB Todd Hammel to oust Missouri State from the Bears' first appearance in the NCAA FCS playoffs, 55-25. Southland Conference champion SFA was on top 13-0 after just 3:29 of the game and MSU closed to within 26-18 late in third period, but SFA got rolling again to pull away and win the game handily. Missouri State QB DeAndre Smith amassed 307 yards in total offense and helped MSU to a new passing yardage record just six days after undergoing arthroscopic knee surgery, but SFA's 613 total yards matched the most ever given up by a Missouri State team in a game. The Bears wound up the campaign with a final 10-3 season record.

Missouri State posted another 5-0 MIAA championship season in 1966 under coach Jim Mentis to earn a repeat invitation to the Mineral Water Bowl. The Bears took a 7-3 record against Adams (Colo.) State. Adams State got a scoring pass from QB Jim Attaway to HB Don Alley just before halftime and added another TD on a 19-yard run by FB Hugh Wright with seven minutes left in the last quarter. A pass from QB Tom Young to end Bill Douglass set up a one-yard plunge by FB Mike Howell for the Bears' only score late in the game as Missouri State lost, 14-8.

The Missouri State Bears couldn't handle the one-two offensive punch of the nation's top FCS rusher, TB Devon Pearce, and the leading receiver in the nation, WR Kasey Dunn, in dropping a 41-35 shootout to the Idaho Vandals in the NCAA playoffs first round. Big Sky Conference champ Idaho jumped out to a quick 14-3 lead but RB Rodney McConico scored a pair of touchdowns and helped draw closer in the game before a field goal by Richard Grote made it 35-35 on the first play of the fourth quarter. The Vandals added two more field goals in the closing minutes and finally stopped Missouri State on downs on the Idaho 45 with half a minute remaining in the game to prevail.

Springfield's Evangel University (NAIA) used Plaster Field for most home games from 1988 to 2000 and is the

only other collegiate tenant of the Bears' facility included in stadium records.

The NCAA didn't require kickoff and punt return stats until 1970, making return records incomplete on many former players, notably Bears TB Cornelius Perry (1963-65) who returned five kickoffs for TDs and had several other long runbacks in three seasons. Defensive statistics on tackles were first maintained in 1972. Complete Missouri State season stats are only available from 1956 to the present, and complete single

game stats are available only from 1972 to the present. Prior to 2002, postseason stats were listed as playoff/bowl game records, but were not included in regular season NCAA stats. From an MSU standpoint, this affects the NCAA season and career stats of people who played in the Bears' three NCAA FCS playoff games in 1989 and 1990, notably DeAndre Smith, Chris Potthast, Richard Grote, Rodney McConico, Phillip Collins, Anthony Peques, Chuck Calhoun and Brett VonWiller. Their career stats in all categories listed include stats compiled in FCS playoff games in MSU records, but in NCAA and Valley records, stats compiled in NCAA playoffs are deleted. That method of charting records was changed in 2002, and all individual and team stats compiled in FCS playoff games are now incorporated into regular season stat categories, for purposes of noting Valley and FCS game, season and career record performances,

Arthur Briggs Head Coach, 1912-33

Arthur W. Briggs was one of the pioneers of MSU intercollegiate athletics, a man who looked past the obstacles to the formation of the program at a young institution to establish a balanced and competitive program in all areas

He was the first man to serve MSU as its athletic director and held that position form 1912 until 1938. He set the tone for years to come with his belief that the athletic program should be a first-class, quality endeavor. It was under his leadership that MSU came into the reorganized Missouri Intercollegiate Athletic Association in 1924 and won MIAA all-sports honors six times in the next decade.

Briggs was also the head of the physical education department from 1913 until his death on Dec. 20, 1949.

At one time during his career at MSU, he coached every sport the school had. He guided the football Bears for more years and won more games than any other grid coach in MSU history. Briggs piloted the Bruins from 1912 through the 1933 season and had on overall record of 76 victories, 58 losses, and 11 ties in his 20 seasons at the football helm.

Coach Briggs had unbeaten seasons in football in 1914 and 1922. The school's football facility was renamed Briggs Stadium in his honor by the MSU Board of Regents in 1970.






Ray Haley Running Back, 1947-51

The standout backfield teammate of John Batten on the MIAA champion football Bears in 1951, "Wrecker" Ray Haley was then on his second conference title team for MSU.

The Springfield Senior High Product started his Bruin career in 1947 and was promptly selected to the all-conference second team at fullback. He was picked to the all-league team in 1948 and was selected the league's most valuable back as he rushed for 716 yards on 111 carries for an average of 6.45 yards a game. He scored eight touchdowns and was a mainstay on Coach Tommy O'Boyle's powerful 9-2 delegation which outscored its opposition 233-75.

The Bears and Maryville tied for the league title and MSU was selected to go on to Mo-Kan Bowl game against Emporia State. Haley scored two touchdowns in that contest as the Bears lost to the Hornets, 34-20.

The popular gridder signed a conference ban on pro baseball players but he returned in 1951 when the ban was lifted. With just a week of preparation before his first action, he teamed with Batten to help the Bears to an uphill battle for a league title tie. He finished the year with five touchdowns and two extra points and was the club's top rusher in a season finale loss to Missouri Valley. He was selected to the All-MIAA second team.






Rich Johanningmeier Tackle, 1960-63, Coach 1976-85

Rich Johanningmeier had a highlysuccessful MSU athletic career as both a player and coach, gaining All-American honors as a football lineman in his playing days and winding up with the second highest victory total on record in his years as the Bears' grid coach.

He came to MSU in 1960 and was a three-year starter for the Bears at both offensive and defensive tackle, gaining MIAA all-conference recognition as a junior and senior.

The St. Louis native was a first team Little All-American selection as a senior and was given the Virgil Cheek Athletic Achievement Award when he graduated in 1964. He was a standout on the unbeaten MSU team of 1963 as the Bears went through the regular campaign at 9-0 to capture the MIAA title and go on to the Mineral Water Bowl game. He briefly played professional football and then began a career of more than 10 years as a college assistant at American International, Vermont and UConn.

Johanningmeier returned to take over as the Bears' head coach in 1976, and, in a 10-year career, posted a mark of 58-44-5 to trail only Briggs in all-time victories among Bears' head coaches. Johanningmeier's Bears had seven winning seasons in his 10-year tenure, including the 1978 and 1979 teams were two of the most potent offensive machines in Bear grid history.






DeAndre Smith Quarterback, 1987-90

DeAndre Smith was the triggerman of a very potent triple-option offense for the best two MSU football teams of the Bears' Division I FCS era. He led the Bears to Gateway Football Conference championships and NCAA Division I-AA playoff bids 1989 and 1990 under coach Jesse Branch.

The St. Louis native quarterbacked the Bears four years, with his top exploits coming in his final two seasons. MSU finished 10-3 when Smith was a junior and got to the second round of the FCS playoffs. MSU won the league crown outright, turned back Maine in the playoff first round and lost at Stephen F. Austin in the quarterfinals. When Smith was a senior, MSU finished 9-3, losing in the playoff first round to Idaho.

He was a two-time all-league first team guarterback, was the Gateway Offensive Player of the Year as both a junior and senior, and was the Gateway Offensive Player of the Decade for the league's first 10 years of existence. Smith was a consensus I-AA All-America as a senior and started 34 of the 45 MSU games he played. He completed 281 of 493 passes for 4.080 vards and 18 touchdowns with a .570 completion mark. His 405 passing yards in 1990 at Tulsa set an MSU single-game record. He was also a prolific runner, carrying the ball 613 times for 2,276 yards and 40 more touchdowns.







With a major facelift in 2014, Robert W. Plaster Stadium once again ranks among the top FCS facilities in the country as the historic stadium enters its 82nd year as an MSU landmark in 2022.

After unveiling the stadium's new look and pregame tailgating area -- BearFest Village -- for the 2014 season, the Bears attracted a record crowd of 18,386 for its season-opening win over North Dakota on Sept. 13. The Bill O'Neill Gateway, grass berm and bronze bear on the north end of the stadium were also installed as part of the renovation.

The most obvious addition to the facility is the imense new structure on the east side of the stadium. The concrete and steel seating area offers accommodations for more than 5,000 in an area that has traditionally been the student side of the stadium. The east side addition also includes game-day locker rooms for the Bears and visiting team, concessions, restrooms, and a party deck that accommodates more than 400 students.

Aesthetics were another key part of the 2014 expansion project that pushed the playing surface to the west and closer to the main side of the stadium and press box. Likewise, the new surface installed over the summer of 2014 -- Sporturf Powerhouse 3C52H -is a two-and-a-half inch artificial turf that is attractive, functional and state-of-the-art for practice and game use by the football Bears.

Once home to multiple Missouri State athletics teams, Plaster is now used exclusively for football after years of sharing the facility.

In recent years, the stadium has also seen installation of a brand new Musco lighting system, which was brought in for the 2010 season, and the Bancorp South video scoreboard, which was added over the

summer of 2008.

The multi-million dollar scoreboard system features a high-quality video system, enhanced graphics package and live scoring and timing capabilities. The Football ProStar LED Video Display has a 4.4 trillion color-capable display; 23mm pixel spacing and 153,600 total red/green/blue LED's. The top of the scoreboard is more than three stories from the surface and extends 40 feet in width.

Between 1987 and 1991, a four-phase expansion of the facility was further enhanced with an August 1991 gift from the Robert W. Plaster Foundation. The expanded facility, formerly known as Briggs Stadium, was known as Robert W. Plaster Sports Complex from 1991 until 2014.

The late Mr. Plaster was chairman of the board of Evergreen Investments LLC. of Lebanon, Mo. The Plaster Foundation has made numerous gifts to support higher education in the Ozarks

The completion of the renovation, which nearly doubled the seating capacity of the stadium (to 16,300) coincided with the 50th anniversary of the first use of the original stadium.

Renovation was completed and inaugurated on Sept. 14, 1991. The stadium explansion included its first artificial turf in 1987, a new running track in 1988, and student bleacher seating in 1990.

Plaster now has nearly 8,500 seats in the upper deck, 24 skyboxes of 10 seats each and a 40-seat University box. A climate-controlled press box with elevator access sits at the top of the upper deck.

The ground level includes 12 racquetball and handball courts as well as recreational locker rooms and offices. On the second level, behind the skyboxes, one end of the facility includes large locker room

space and classrooms, while the other end contains the Plaster Strength Center, a 7,200-square foot intercollegiate athletics weight room. An elevator at the west entrance connects all three levels with the stadium press box level. Postgame press conferences are held in the classrooms on the suite level.

The current version of the stadium's artificial surface is the fourth carpet used at the facility but first dedicated directly to football. The first "BearTurf" was added in 1987, and was replaced in 2000, 2006 and most recently in 2014.

As part of the 1988 upgrade, the east bleachers were moved back, and the north and south walls of the stadium were relocated to accommodate the enlarged track. At the time, the east bleacher upgrades of 1990 brought an additional 2,000 seats, along with additional concession stands, restrooms, ticket booths, and a new student entrance.

Plaster Sports Complex received many enhancements in the 1970s and 1980s, including additions and improvements to seating, press box, concession and restroom facilities. A lighting system, scoreboard and electronic message center were also added for the first time during this era.

Built originally for \$60,000 as a WPA project at the corner of Grand and Kings, Plaster has served as the home to many other MSU teams over the years -- including soccer and track. Plaster Stadium has hosted numerous interscholastic and club events, including the 2016 and 2017 MSHSAA Show-Me Bowl championships, as well as MSU and Greenwood classes.

A new state-of-the-art strength and conditioning center was added to the stadium's second floor prior to the 2016 season. The 7,200-square foot facility was funded exclusively through private donations.

Arthur Briggs

The MSU football facility was known as Briggs Stadium from 1970 until 1991 in honor of MSU athletics pioneer Arthur W. Briggs. When the Missouri State Board of Gov-

ernors renamed the stadium Plaster Field in 1991, the Board voted to perpetuate the memory of Briggs by changing the name of Belmont Street, just west of the stadium, to Briggs Street; by installing a bust of Briggs at the stadium entrance; by establishing an endowed scholarship fund in his name; and by establishing



the Arthur Briggs Award, to be given annually to the top scholar-athlete on the MSU football team.

The first Missouri State athletics director, Briggs held that post from 1912 to 1938 and was physical education department head until he died in 1949. Briggs is the winningest coach in MSU football history, posting a 76-58-11 mark as field boss of the grid Bears from 1912 to 1933. Briggs guided the Bears to unbeaten state title years in 1914 at 6-0 and in 1922 at 7-0. At various times, he coached every sport MSU had, including posting a 105-32 basketball record from 1913 to 1923 in the years when the Bears dominated the "old MIAA." Mr. Briggs went into the MSU Athletics Hall of Fame in 1978 and was one of the charter inductees into the MSU Wall of Fame in 2002

Robert W. Plaster Stadium has been the home of Missouri State football since 1941. The 2022 campaign is the Bears 80th season in Plaster as MSU didn't field a football team for two seasons during World War II.

MSU football moved to its present site in 1930, ten years before the current stadium was constructed prior to World War II. Before then, the Bears practiced and played games in an area on the northwest corner of the existing campus where Freudenberger House now stands. MSU has a 222-179-12 record for 413 games in Plaster. The Bears have been perfect at home six times, and the club's longest home win streak is 20 games, compiled between 1938 and 1941.





MSU's history of producing pro football talent dates back to 1945 and extends to today with three NFL Draft selections in the last dozen years -- Clay Harbor to the Philadelphia Eagles in 2010, David Arkin to the Cowboys in 2011 and Eric Johnson to the Colts in 2022.

Harbor played seven seasons in the NFL with 114 career receptions in stints with the Eagles, Jaguars, Patriots, Lions and Saints. Meanwhile, Arkin played six seasons in the NFL with the Cowboys, Dolphins and Rams.

In 2022, Johnson was drafted as the sixth pick of the fifth round by the Colts, going as the 159th overall draft selection.

Nine additional Bears have earned undrafted free agent contracts over the last 13 seasons with Malik Earl signing with the Dallas Cowboys in 2018, Dylan Cole signing with the Houston Texans immediately after the 2017 Draft and Gannon Sinclair signing with the Arizona Cardinals in 2015. Other recent free agent signees include Anthony Grady (Jets) in 2014; 2013 addition Randy Richards (Chargers); 2011 professionals Jermaine Saffold (Browns) and Chris Douglas (Bills); and 2010 rookies Kolby Hurt (Saints) and Jake Duron (Jets).

Cole played 37 games with the Houston Texans from 2017-20, racking up 67 total tackles in that span before spending the 2021 season with the Tennessee Titans and seeing action in seven contests.

Likewise, many Bears in recent years have enjoyed extended careers in the Arena Football League and Indoor Football League (IFL), including Jake Duron, Cody Kirby and Tevan Ferguson. Steve Watson appeared in Arena Bowl XXII in 2008 for the San Jose SaberCats. A two-time All-MVFC

2000-09. He starred for MSU at tight end from 1996-99 and played in both the East-West Shrine Game and Hula Bowl after his senior season prior to being drafted by the Bengals. He operated as the Bengals' regular long snapper seven seasons with additional work at tight end.

Former Bear Jason Whittle played 11 NFL seasons from 1998-2008. He signed a free agent contract in the 2003 off-season with then-Super Bowl champion Tampa Bay after five years with the New York Giants. He returned to the Giants in 2004 and moved to the Minnesota Vikings for the 2006 campaign before joining the Bills in 2007. A standout lineman at MSU from 1994-97, Whittle signed a free agent contract with the Giants in 1998. He became the first MSU Bear to appear in the NFL title game when he saw action in the 2001 Super Bowl with the Giants.

Cornerback Darren Barnett, an all-conference performer as a junior at Missouri State in 2004, was among the Valley and NCAA leaders in interceptions, rejoined the New York Giants for a second year in 2008 after working on the Giants' developmental squad during 2007.

Adrion Smith played 12 seasons in the CFL with his last 10 seasons in Toronto. He was a four-time CFL all-star, posted 51 career interceptions and helped the Argonauts to CFL Grey Cup Championships in 1997 and 2004. He was a four-year starter at MSU from 1990-93 and the MVFC all-time leader in interceptions with 24.







SEMO 13, Bears 6 - TB Rick Attig's two touchdowns lead SEMO to win in in MIAA opener.

1974

Bears 37, Central Missouri 26 - Kent Stringer completes first 10 passes of afternoon; FB Dave Preston rambles for three Bears touchdowns in offensive burst

1975

Bears 25, Northwest Missouri 21 - Bob Blakely collects game-winning 54-yard pass from Kent Stringer with 49 seconds left.

Missouri Southern 27, Bears 13 - Lions backs Larry Barnes and Rusty Shelley combine for 228 air yards in MSU setback.

1977

Bears 26, Missouri S&T 17 - QB Mitch Ware completes 11 of his 19 passes; SE Tom Hamilton catches nine throws for 175 yards as Bears claim league victory.

1978

Bears 68, Lincoln 17 - Bears punch up school-record 636 total yards, including 474 yards rushing in rout of Blue Tigers.

Bears 27, Missouri S&T 3 - Mark Daniels runs for two touchdowns in ground battle to maintain his national scoring lead in Bears win over Miners.

1980

Bears 21, Central Missouri 14 - Mike Royle, John Gianini, Steve Newbold collect touchdowns in win over Mules

1981

UNI 20, Bears 17 - UNI gets 74-yard touchdown pass to WR Kirk Hobbs with 1:18 left in fourth quarter to avert upset from pesky Bears.

Bears 21, Central Missouri 3 - Keith Williams runs for two touchdowns in fourth quarter to break open close game as Bears get past Mules again.

1983

Southern Illinois 24, Bears 6 - Bears stay within 7-6 at half against eventual NCAA FCS national champions, but falter late in the game

Bears 29, Eastern Illinois 28 - Greg Arterburn gets touchdown run and HB Dave Cummings dives into end zone corner pylon with two-point PAT with 41 seconds left.

1985

Murray State 36, Bears 21 - Racers punch up 29 points in the span of just over six minutes of third period to overtake Missouri State halftime advantage.

1986

Eastern Illinois 34, Bears 20 - League champs prevail after upset-minded Bears lead in third quarter of league contest.

1987

Bears 31, Illinois State 15 - A 17-point MSU fourth quarter gives cushion to MSU comeback win. Ken Braden pass interception late ends Redbird upset bid.

1988

Bears 41, Eastern Illinois 21 - Phillip Collins sprints to 53-yard punt return for touchdown. Two pass interceptions by CB Craig Phillips key MSU win.

1989

Bears 42, Illinois State 7 - QBs DeAndre Smith and Paul Carney run for 216 yards, and combine to score five Bears touchdowns.

1990

Bears 35, Western Illinois 14 - Four second-half touchdowns snap 7-7 halftime tie as Bears maintain lofty national ranking.

Bears 68, Indiana State 19 - Bears punch up 27 points in first quarter and expand margin to 47-0 by halftime in rout of MVFC foes Sycamores.

1992

Bears 13, Eastern Illinois 10 - Third-quarter FG by Richard Grote snaps 10-10 halftime deadlock as Bears claim win in defensive standoff.

1993

Bears 24. Jacksonville State 7 - Bears defense stifles Gamecocks after Missouri State takes 17-0 halftime lead in non-conference battle.

Liberty 27, Bears 19 - Jeremy Hoog's 375-yard passing game is offset by Bears turnovers as visitors from Virginia pull out late decision.

1995

UNI 19, Bears 17 - UNI field goal as time expires in fourth period squelches late Missouri State touchdown pass as Panthers' capitalize on late-game pass interference penalty.

1996

Western Illinois 23. Bears 17 - Bears take 17-14 lead at half, but can't hold off Leathernecks down the stretch in costly setback.

UNI 23, Bears 22 - Bears come back from a two-touchdown deficit, but miss game-tying PAT kick with five minutes left in final period for fourth straight Homecoming loss.

Bears 45, SEMO 10 - MSU gets 271 yards, three touchdowns passing from QB Derek Jensen to blow open non-conference game with 21-point third quarter.

1999

UNI 29. Bears 17 - Panthers blow open game after a 10-10 halftime tie with 19 unanswered points in the third period in tough league decision.

Bears 27, Southern Illinois 9 - MSU blows open close game with 24 points in fourth

Indiana State 25, Bears 19 - Sycamores battle back to overcome a 19-7 deficit and beat Bears in last period. Potential MSU game-winner nullified when receiver catches pass on end line on final possession of the game.

2002

Western Kentucky 31. Bears 7 - Eventual FCS national champs roll over Bears in second

UNI 26, Bears 20 - Early interception TDs give Panthers lead Bears can't overcome.

2004

Southern Illinois 27, Bears 3 - Top-ranked Salukis steamroll Bears with bruising ground

2005

Bears 31. Indiana State 27 - Bears get game-winning touchdown on pass from QB A.J. Porter to WR Kaya Farris with 28 seconds left in see-saw conference matchup

2006

Southern Illinois 27, Bears 17: Nationally-ranked Salukis overcome an early 10-3 Bears' lead with two TDs in last five minutes of second period.

Bears 63, Indiana State 7 - Bears roll to three touchdowns in each of first three quarters as balanced ground-air attack behind QB Cody Kirby gives MSU its second league win.

2008

Baers 42, Youngstown State 28 - Bears get two rushing touchdowns and 183 total yards from quarterback Cody Kirby, while Kingjack Washington rushes for 133 yards.

2009

Illinois State 24, Bears 14 - Redbirds hold MSU scoreless in second half and amass 311 yards. Bears get 20 tackles by Antoine Wilkinson and 248 passing yards from Kirby.

Bears 31, Western Illinois 28 - Bears topple No. 18 Leathernecks, an eventual NCAA playoff team. MSU tallies 508 total yards including 165 and 130 rushing yards from Chris Douglas and Stephen Johnston, respectively

South Dakota State 43, Bears 36 (20t) - Bears miss a 35-yard field goal late in regulation and score first in overtime, only to spoil a 451-yard day in a double-overtime loss.

2012

Bears 42, Western Illinois 3 - MSU reels off its third win in a row behind three first-half TD passes by Kierra Harris and a stubborn defense that surrenders just 224 yards.

Bears 35, South Dakota State 21 - A 69-yard touchdown run by Ashton Glaser late in the fourth quarter seals MSU's first-ever win over Jackrabbits. Bears rushed for 352 yards

2014

Bears 31, South Dakota 12 - Bears rush for season-high 288 yards, including 242 yards total offense by QB Kierra Harris.

Illinois State 38, Bears 2 - Freshman Jason Randall rushes for 62 yards and snags three receptions vs. No. 4-ranked Redbirds.

Western Illinois 38, Bears 35 - Bears rally from 31-14 deficit late, but surrender gamewinning TD with 43 seconds left. Brody Lambert passes for school record 5 TD passes.

2017

Bears 59, Indiana State 20 - MSU rolls up 624 yards of total offense -- 385 by QB Peyton Huslig -- in landslide win.

Western Illinois 31, Bears 14 - Leathernecks hold MSU to 283 yards, while rolling up a season-high 563 yards of offense themselves

2019

UNI 29, Bears 6 - UNI posts 19-point second quarter after two key Bear turnovers. MSU defense allows just two third-down conversions on 14 tries vs. No. 11 Panthers.

2020-21

UCA 33. Bears 24 - Six Bears turnovers lead to 24 UCA points in only home game of the fall portion of split-season schedule. Jeremiah Wilson posts 100 yards on 13 carries.

2021

Bears 37, Indiana State 7 - Bears build 24-0 lead in first half and roll up 21 first downs and 442 total yards in an efficient performance. Jason Shelley passes for 225 yards, 3 TD's.
