THE TEN COUNT

- ◆ Missouri State kicks off Homecoming week and wraps a three-game home stand Tuesday when the Bears host Arkansas State at 7 p.m. (ESPN+) in a key, early-season non-conference matchup. The Bears have averaged a 33.5 scoring margin and 19.0 rebound margin through their first two games to begin the season and will meet longtime rival A-State for the first time since 2019.
- ◆ The Bears have had double-doubles from two different players in their first two games with **Michael Osei-Bonsu** posting 22 points and a career-high 14 rebounds vs. Missouri Southern and **Darrion Sutton** notching 18 points and 11 rebounds (both career highs) against Northwestern Oklahoma State.
- ◆ MSU head coach **Cuonzo Martin** is **53-19** (.729) all-time at Great Southern Bank Arena, and his teams are a combined **165-44** (.788) when his clubs score 70 or more points.
- ◆ MSU's **60** points in the paint against Northwestern Oklahoma State on Saturday shattered the club record of 54, set vs. Illinois State on 2/5/20. Points in the paint first appeared on NCAA box scores in 2005.
- ◆ Missouri State is **14-2** all-time at home against A-State and **3-0** at Great Southern Bank Arena with previous meetings in the facility in 2008, 2010 and 2019. The Red Wolves are also 0-2 at GSB against neutral-site opponents (Pacific and Pepperdine) as part of the 2010 Preseason NIT.
- ◆ The Bears broke two arena records in Saturday's win over NWOSU with **32** assists and **41** field goals. The assist record marked the most helpers by a Bears team since racking up 33 assists vs. Troy on 12/11/04 at Hammons Student Center.
- ◆ Returning starter **Zaxton King** (So., Lawrence, Kan.) posted his first double-figure scoring game of the year in Saturday's win over NWOSU. King logged 12 points with a pair of threes and 4 rebounds. He has now scored in double figures 12 times in his collegiate career and started all **34** games in that span.
- ◆ Dating back to his time at Truman State, **Kobi Williams** (Jr., St. Louis, Mo.) has now hit a 3-pointer in **16** straight games, including 3 against Mo. Southern and 2 against Northwestern Oklahoma. He was 7-for-12 from 3-point range in MSU's exhibition win over Maryville (10/31/25) as part of a 30-point effort in his unofficial debut.
- ◆ Freshman point guard **Trey Williams Jr.** (Centralia, Ill.) has quietly put together impressive efforts in MSU's first two ball games, collecting double figures in scoring twice with **10** points and **5** rebounds in a team-high 33 minutes on the floor vs. Missouri Southern and **11** points with **4** assists and **3** triples vs. Northwestern Okla.
- ◆ MSU had six players scoring double figures against Northwestern Oklahoma, the squad's most since logging seven players with 10 or more points against William Woods at home on 12/30/18.

HEAD COACH CUONZO MARTIN

After an extensive national search, Missouri State University announced Cuonzo Martin as its men's basketball head coach on March 27, 2024. The man who orchestrated Missouri State's only MVC regular-season championship run during his first tenure in Springfield originally coached at Missouri State from 2008 to 2011.

Martin has a **275-221** (.554) career record in his 16th seasons as a Division I head coach with experience at MSU, Tennessee, California and Missouri. His teams have made 9 postseason appearances in that span, including 4 trips to the NCAA Tournament, 4 appearances in the NIT, and a CIT title with the Bears in 2010.

Coach Martin is **72-64** (.529) in his fifth season (and second stint) at Missouri State, including **53-19** at home, 14-39 on the road and 5-6 at neutral sites.

Martin also boasts 59 college graduates during his career with stints at MoState, Tennessee (2011-14), California (2014-17) and Missouri (2017-22).

A native of East St. Louis, Ill., Martin was a star player at Purdue from 1991-95 for coach Gene Keady and then played four years professionally. He was on the coaching staff at Purdue for eight years under Keady and Matt Painter before accepting his first head coaching position at MSU on March 26, 2008.

In Martin's first stint in Springfield (2008-11), he was named Missouri State's 16th head coach in time for the program's 100th anniversary season and its inaugural campaign at Great Southern Bank Arena. In his second season (2009-10), Martin guided MoState to a 24-12 overall ledger, a 19-2 home record, and an impressive run to the CIT Postseason Tournament title.

His third season at MSU (2010-11) was one of the program's most memorable, as the Bears finished 26-9 overall on the way to its first-ever MVC regular-season title with a 15-3 league record. The Bears fell to Indiana State in the finals of the MVC Tournament in St. Louis and capped an unforgettable campaign by advancing to the second round of the NIT. Martin was named 2011 MVC Coach of the Year and recipient of the Ben Jobe Award as the nation's top minority head coach. The Bears were 35-3 at home over Martin's final two seasons.

Martin's return to MoState in 2024-25 featured a roster packed with 15 newcomers for the Bears' final season in the Missouri Valley. MSU's 9-23 overall record was not a fair representation of the club's season performance which included 14 single-digit losses -- which was tied for the fourth-most in the nation.

BEARS ON THE AIR

All Missouri State games air live on the Bears Radio Network with Springfield flagship station KWTO (93.3 FM) providing the feed to the five-station network and online at The Varsity Network and RadioSpringfield.com.

For the fourth straight season, Missouri State Director of Broadcasting **Corey Riggs** will coordinate play-by-play duties for the Bears Radio Network. Bears basketball legend **Mike Keltner** (1970-74) will provide color commentary for all broadcasts this season.

THE SERIES

In a rivalry that dates back to 1950, the Bears lead the all-time series 23-10. MSU is 3-0 all-time at GSB Arena against A-State and 14-2 in all home games against the Red Wolves. The Bears are also 7-8 in Jonesboro and 2-0 at neutral sites against the Sun Belt squad.

In the most-recent game (12/11/19), Missouri State got a game-high 17 points from Keandre Cook and 13 from fellow senior Lamont West to turn back visiting Arkansas State, 75-53. The Bears shot a season-high 56.8 percent from the field and had an answer to a pair of second-half runs by the Red Wolves for their second-straight 20-point victory. A-State was led by Canberk Kus with 16 points, including two of his team's three triples.

20-20 VISION IN OPENER

Missouri State boasted two 20-point scorers in its win over Missouri Southern in the club's season opener (11/4/25) with **Michael Osei-Bonsu** posting a game-high **22** points and newcomer **Keith Palek III** scoring **21** for the home side. It marked the first time since 1/11/25 (at Southern Illinois) that MSU had a pair of 20-point scorers in the same game with **Zaxton King** (23) and Vincent Brady (24) holding the honors last season in Carbondale.

Osei-Bonsu also rang up a career-high **14** rebounds in the contest to give him his 9th career double-double as a Bear. The returning senior starter was also the game leader in assists (5) and blocks (3) to finish out a memorable opening-night victory in fashion. **Osei-Bonsu** and **Palek** also combined for **9** assists with just one turnover.

BEARS ON THE BOARDS

MoState's **53** rebounds in the season opener against Missouri Southern exceeded any single-game total from all of last season and marked the club's most since snagging 53 caroms in a double-overtime win at Drake (1/24/24). The Bears followed up that effort with **52** boards against Northwestern Oklahoma State four days later.

PRESEASON POLL UNKIND TO BEARS

In Missouri State's inaugural season in Conference USA, the league's coaches socked it to the new kids on the block, picking them to finish 12th in the league with a dozen teams. Liberty captured 11 of the 12 first-place votes to earn the label as preseason CUSA favorites with Kennesaw State earning the other top vote and the No. 2 position. New Mexico State, Middle Tennessee, LA Tech and Western Kentucky rounded out the top six positions.

A FEW FROM DIVISION II

Among Missouri State's 11 newcomers this season are three transfers from NCAA Division II programs, including guards **Kobi Williams** (Jr., Truman State) and **Tyrique Brooks** (So., Missouri Southern); and forward **Keith Palek III** (Sr., California Pa.). The trio compiled the following statistics in 2024-25:

MARTIN'S TEAMS IN NCAA TOP 25

EXHIBITION SUMMARY

Led by 30 points from **Kobi Williams**, Missouri State shot 48 percent from the field and knocked down 13 threes to dispatch visiting Maryville University, 92-67, on October 31 in the Bears' only official exhibition game of the preseason. Williams, a transfer from Truman State, was 7-of-12 from 3-point range and 9-of-15 overall to lead four MSU players in double figures. Seniors **Michael Osei-Bonsu** (13) and **Logan Epes** (11) also posted double digits in the scoring column with **Keith Palek III** adding 13 as well.

Palek and Osei-Bonsu shared the team lead with six rebounds apiece.

BEARS BASKETBALL HISTORY

The Bears have an all-time record of **1773-1082 (.621)**, now in their 114th season; a **788-564 (.583)** ledger in their 44th Division I season; and a **0-0** mark in their inaugural campaign in Conference USA. MSU is also **182-85 (.685)** in its 18th season at Great Southern Bank Arena.

During the Division I era, MSU has made NCAA Tournament appearances in 1987, 1988, 1989, 1990, 1992, and 1999. With NCAA Tournament wins over Wisconsin and Tennessee, the 1999 Bears advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16 for the first time in program history. The Bears have appeared in the National Invitation Tournament 10 times -- 1986, 1991, 1993, 1997, 2000, 2005, 2006, 2007, 2011 and 2022. The 1986, 1993 and 2006 squads all reached the NIT quarterfinals. MSU has also appeared in the CIT twice -- 2010 (champions) and 2014.

MSU won NAIA national championship titles in 1952 and 1953 under the late coach Bob Vanatta, while making six NAIA national tournament trips from 1939-1954. MSU also appeared in the NCAA Division II Tournament 10 times, finishing as national runners-up four times -- 1959, 1967, 1969 and 1974.

MSU has won 24 regular-season conference titles, including the 2010-11 MVC championship. The Bears have also recorded 28 seasons of 20 or more victories, including 15 in the Division I era.

After an extensive national search, Missouri State University announced Cuonzo Martin as its next men's basketball head coach on March 27, 2024. The man who orchestrated Missouri State's only Missouri Valley Conference regular-season championship run during his first tenure in Springfield from 2008 to 2011 returned to the program in 2024-25.

Now in the second year of his second tenure at MoState -- and fifth season overall with the Bears -- Martin begins the 2025-26 season with a 273-221 (.553) career record in 15 seasons as a Division I head coach at MSU, Tennessee, California and Missouri. His teams have made nine postseason appearances in that span, including four trips to the NCAA Tournament, four appearances in the NIT, and a CIT title with the Bears in 2010. Martin also led the Bears to a 2011 Missouri Valley Conference regular-season championship and boasts 56 college graduates during his head coaching career.

Martin's Bears teams have combined for a total record of 70-64 (.522) in his previous five seasons at Missouri State.

A native of East St. Louis, Ill., Martin was a star player at Purdue from 1991-95 for coach Gene Keady and then played four years professionally. He was on the coaching staff at Purdue for eight years under Keady and Matt Painter before accepting his first head coaching position at Missouri State on March 26, 2008.

In Martin's first stint in Springfield (2008-11), he was named Missouri State's 16th head coach in time for the program's 100th anniversary year and the inaugural season of Great Southern Bank Arena in 2008-09. In his second season (2009-10), Martin guided MoState to a 24-12 overall ledger, a 19-2 home record, and an impressive run to the CollegeInsider.com Postseason Tournament title.

His third season at MSU in 2010-11 was one of the program's most memorable, as the Bears finished 26-9 overall on the way to the program's first-ever MVC regular-season title with a 15-3 league record. The Bears fell to Indiana State in the finals of the MVC Tournament in St. Louis and capped an unforgettable campaign by advancing to the second round of the National Invitation Tournament. Martin was named 2011 MVC Coach of the Year, making him the only MSU sideline boss to receive that honor, as well as claiming the 2011 Ben Jobe Award as the nation's top minority head coach. Over Martin's last two seasons in Springfield, the Bears were 36-3 at home and did not lose a non-conference home game during that span.

Martin made three head coaching stops after initially leaving Springfield with stints at Tennessee (2011-14), California (2014-17) and Missouri (2017-22).

In three seasons at Tennessee, Martin guided the Volunteers to a 63-41 (.606) overall record with three postseason appearances and three finishes in the top five in the SEC Standings. The Vols finished second in

the SEC in Martin's first season in Knoxville after being picked 11th in the SEC preseason poll. After back-to-back NIT appearances in his first two years as the Volunteers head coach, Martin led Tennessee to a 24-13 record in 2013-14 with an NCAA Sweet 16 trip and a No. 23 national ranking in the season-ending USA Today coaches poll. In the process, Tennessee matched the fourth-best win total in school history. After earning a berth in the NCAA's First Four, the Martin-led Volunteers captured victories over Iowa, UMass and Mercer to equal the most NCAA Tournament wins in program history.

At Cal, Martin led the Golden Bears to a 21-13 mark and NIT appearance in his final season, guiding the 2016-17 squad into the Associated Press Top 25 in the season's second poll while receiving votes in nearly every USA Today coaches poll that year. His squad boasted four All-Pac-12 players, including first-team selection Ivan Rabb. His 2015-16 club went 23-11 and tied for third in the Pac-12 en route to a No. 4 seed in the NCAA Tournament, the highest in program history. The Golden Bears parlayed a consensus top 10 recruiting class into an 18-0 record at Haas Pavilion as part of a school-record 27-game home win streak over Martin's last two campaigns in Berkeley with Cal leading the Pac-12 in both scoring defense (67.3 ppg) and field-goal percentage defense (.396) in year two. Martin was 62-39 (.614) during his three-year tenure at Cal.

At Missouri (2017-22), Martin took over a program that had won just 27 games in the previous three seasons. The Tigers went from eight wins before his arrival to 20 victories in Martin's first season at the helm (2017-18). His Columbia debut

season marked Martin's seventh 20-win season in a 10-season stretch and made him the 59th head coach in NCAA Tournament history to lead three different programs to the Big Dance. He later led the Tigers to a second NCAA Tournament run in 2021 as Mizzou spent 11 consecutive weeks in the AP Top 25, reaching as high as No. 10 nationally. The Tigers finished the season with three wins over Top 10 teams and seven Quad 1 victories. He was 78-77 (.503) in his five seasons in Columbia.

"Zo's" long-anticipated return to Missouri State in 2024-25 saw a complete overhaul of the Bears' roster with 15 newcomers on hand. The Bears finished 9-23 overall but 14 of MSU's losses were by less than 10 points, including nine games within two possessions and five games by three points or less. The club's 14 single-digit losses tied for the fourth-most in the nation. Martin's son, Chase, joined the Bears as a post-grad transfer from Purdue and was the squad's only MVC award winner, claiming a spot on the MVC Scholar-Athlete Team.

Martin also has experience as a coach with USA Basketball, serving on the USA Junior National Team staff at the 2011 FISU World University games in China.

As a student-athlete, Martin was a 1995 first-team All-Big Ten selection at Purdue when he averaged 18.4 ppg and sank 91 3-pointers. He graduated as one of the program's all-time leaders in 3-pointers (179) and among the Boilermakers' career scoring leaders (1,666). Playing under Keady and alongside All-American Glenn Robinson, Martin led Purdue to a pair of Big Ten titles and to a 90-37 four-year record. The Boilermakers went to the postseason each season with Martin, reaching the Elite Eight of the 1994 NCAA Tournament.

Following his collegiate playing career, Martin was selected by the Atlanta Hawks with the 57th

overall pick of the 1995 NBA Draft. He played professionally for four years with the NBA's Hawks, Milwaukee Bucks and Vancouver Grizzlies. In 1997, Martin was the leading scorer for Felize Scandone in Italy. He then returned to his alma mater where he earned his bachelor's degree in restaurant, hotel, institutional and tourism management from Purdue in 2000, and served one season as an assistant on the staff at West Lafayette High School. After earning his

degree, Martin joined Gene Keady's Purdue staff for the 2000-01 season as an assistant, and remained with the Boilermaker program when Painter took over as head coach. He served as the Boilermaker's associate during the 2007-08 season before taking the Missouri State post the following season. In his eight-year tenure at Purdue, he mentored several all-conference standouts, including All-American forward Robbie Hummel.

Martin has also served on the NABC Board of Directors, the NCAA Oversight Committee and the SEC's Council on Racial Equity and Social Justice.

He and his wife, Roberta, have two sons, Joshua and Chase, and a daughter, Addison.

Chase was a member of the 2024 NCAA national runner-up team at Purdue and is a graduate assistant on this year's Missouri State staff.



EXHIBITION GAME

Oct. 31, 2025, Great Southern Bank Arena, Springfield Missouri State 92, Maryville 67

Led by 30 points from Kobi Williams, Missouri State shot 48 percent from the field and knocked down 13 threes to dispatch visiting Maryville University, 92-67, in the Bears' only official exhibition game of the preseason.

Williams, a transfer from Truman State, was 7-of-12 from 3-point range and 9-of-15 overall to lead four MSU players in double figures. Seniors Michael Osei-Bonsu (13) and Logan Epes (11) also posted double digits in the scoring column with Keith Palek III adding 13 as well.

Palek and Osei-Bonsu shared the team lead with six rebounds apiece, with five other maroons snagging five caroms apiece. The Bears held a 52-38 rebounding advantage and racked up 20 second-chance points off 18 offensive boards.

Ten of the dozen players who saw action for Coach Cuonzo Martin's squad found the scoring column and all 12 snagged at least one rebound.

Missouri State finished 31-of-64 (.484) overall from the field, 13-of-33 (.394) from long range and 17-for-27 (.630) at the free throw line with 23 assists, 12 steals and 7 blocks.

Maryville was led by Evan Palmquist with 19 points, while Henry Sanchez Perez scored 13, including four consecutive 3-pointers midway through the second half.

In the first half, the Bears got 16 points from Kobi Williams to push ahead to a 48-24 advantage at the midway point.

After a slow start out of the gates, Williams broke the ice with MSU's first points of the night with a corner three, the first of four he would hit in the opening half. Maryville kept things close until the 9:20 mark when the Bears stretched a 20-13 lead into a 36-13 advantage with an impressive 16-0 surge.

Williams picked up where he left off to start the second half, knocking down three triples and 12 of the Bears' first 14 points of the period to extend the lead to 62-33 coming out of the under-16 timeout.

That would be the Missouri State's largest lead of the night with an 8-2 mini-run by Maryville trimming the visitors' deficit to 67-44 at the 11-minute mark. Later, Sanchez Perez sored 12 straight points for the Saints, all on 3-pointers, the last of which made it a 78-56 game with just over 7 minutes to go.

Trey Williams, Palek and Epes would later close things out for Missouri State, each burying a triple over the next four minutes, while a rim-rattling dunk from Darrion Sutton added an exclamation point to the exhibition contest.

GAME 1

Nov. 4, 2025, Great Southern Bank Arena, Springfield Missouri State 88, Missouri Southern 70

Missouri State got 22 points from Michael Osei-Bonsu and 21 more from Keith Palek III to turn back visiting Missouri Southern, 88-70, in the season opener.

Osei-Bonsu also collected a career-high 14 rebounds, including 10 offensive boards, as part of his ninth double-double as a Bear. MSU also got 14 points from Kobi Williams and 10 more from freshman Trey Williams Jr.

Missouri Southern, coached by former MoState staffer Sam McMahon, was led by Tyrone Wright's 21 points with Jaden Taylor pitching in 14.

The Bears overcame a three-point halftime deficit with a 13-3 run to start the second half. Palek scored the go-ahead layup less than a minute into the period and then reeled off 9 points in five minutes to push the maroon side up 53-46 at the 14:56 mark.

MoState maintained that margin until the midway point of the second period when Cuonzo Martin's defense kicked things into high gear with 10 minutes to go. A 20-6 surge by the Bears over the next six minutes stretched their lead to 80-61 with 4:28 remaining as Osei-Bonsu registered 6 points in that span, while Trey Williams Jr. and Darrion Sutton added four apiece.

Sutton, who finished with 9 points and 8 rebounds off the bench, gave MSU its largest lead of the night, 84-63, with just over three minutes to play with a short jumper off the glass.

By the time the smoke cleared, the Bears held the Lions to just 28.2 percent shooting in the second period, including 1-of-12 from three-point range, while collecting 30 rebounds and allowing the Lions just 4 second-chance points.

Osei-Bonsu was Missouri State's top assist man with a game-high 5 dimes to go with an 11-for-15 shooting night, 3 blocks and a pair of steals.

The Bears finished 33-of-79 (.418) overall from the field, 5-of-31 (.161) from distance and 17-for-21 (.810) at the stripe with a 53-42 rebounding advantage. Martin's squad posted 52 points in the paint and exchanged 21 offensive caroms for 24 second-chance points. MSU also committed just 8 turnovers on the evening.

Missouri Southern sprinted to a 43-40 lead at the intermission, shooting 53 percent from the field in the opening half and capitalizing on 26 points in the paint to take the early advantage.

The Lions led by as many as 10 after a layup by Brayden Williams at the 6:15 mark made it a 34-24 game. But the Bears stormed back over the last six minutes of the stanza with Osei-Bonsu accounting for 6 points on a 16-9 run for MSU.

Osei-Bonsu had 14 points and 7 rebounds in the first half alone, while Wright's 17 points – on 8-of-9 shooting in the first half – kept the visitors ahead by a nose at the midway point.

Missouri State piled up the 12th-highest point total in school history in a 106-57 victory over Northwestern Oklahoma State at GSB Arena.

The Bears shot 41-for-68 from the floor, including 72 percent from two-point range while placing six scorers in double figures. MoState's 41 field goals were the team's most in at least a decade, while its 32 assists were just three shy of the school record.

Keith Palek III led all scorers with 20 points along with 8 assists, Darrion Sutton collected a double-double with 18 points and 11 rebounds, while Kobi Williams (12), Zaxton King (12), Amar Kuljuhovic (11) and Trey Williams Jr. (11) also reached double figures. All 10 Bears who saw playing time found the scoring column.

It wasn't until the 16:30 mark in the first half that the Bears knocked down their first field goal, beginning a 12-for-16 sequence that included eight straight points from King in a 65-second stretch, seven consecutive from Palek and six more mixed in from Sutton for a 32-8 lead with 7:43 to play before halftime.

The Bears added a 16-0 run late in the opening period to take a 55-21 lead into the break and continued to grow the lead to as many as 50 points late in the contest.

MoState knocked down 10 three-pointers led by Trey Williams with three and owned a 52-25 rebounding margin with 10 players collecting multiple boards. The Bears corralled 13 consecutive rebounds at one point during the game.

Kobi Williams had 6 assists as all 10 Bears tallied at least one helper as well in a balanced effort.
