THE TEN COUNT

- ◆ Missouri State embarks on a key two-game road trip this week, starting Thursday evening with a 6:30 p.m. tipoff at Louisiana Tech. The Bears and Bulldogs squared off in Springfield less than two weeks ago, resulting in a memorable 79-78, double-overtime thriller.
- ◆ In two games last week, **Trey Williams Jr.** (Fr., Centralia, Ill.) led all CUSA freshman players in scoring, averaging **15.5** points per game, including a career-high **19** points vs. Kennesaw State. He was **8-for-14** (.571) from 3-point range on the week, matching the most triples by any CUSA player in that span and the second-most nationally by any DI freshman. He had a 3.0 assist-to-turnover ratio for the week and was 5-for-5 at the FT line.
- ◆ **Trey Williams Jr** ranks **15th** on MSU's freshman scoring list with **234** points (**8.7** ppg), while his **49** three-pointers sits **5th** on MSU's freshman chart. He is **50** points from breaking into Missouri State's freshman scoring top 10 and has scored in double figures in 3 straight games, averaging **14.7** points and **3.3** assists per game in that span.
- ◆ The Bears are the only Conference USA squad to boast three players in the top 10 in the league in scoring, including No. 4 **Keith Palek III** (17.6 ppg), No. 9 **Kobi Williams** (15.2) and No. 10 **Michael Osei-Bonsu** (14.3).
- ◆ **Kobi Williams** (Jr., St. Louis, Mo.) has made at least one 3-pointer in **22** consecutive games, dating back to Nov. 22. He ranks **4th** in CUSA in 3-point FG percentage (.369) and in threes per game (**2.8**) with at least one triple in 24-of-26 appearances this season and multiple threes in **20** ball games. He has been Missouri State's top scorer during its five-game losing streak (**19.6** ppg) with three 20-point efforts in the last four contests.
- ◆ **Keith Palek III** (Sr., Woodbine, N.J.) needs just **25** points to reach 500 for the season. He would become the **32nd** Missouri State player to reach that single-season scoring milestone. He also reached 100 assists for the season in Saturday's game at FIU, making him the first Bear taller than 6-foot-8 to reach 100 helpers.
- ◆ The Bears averaged **16.5** assists per game last week, which was **59th** nationally in that span (2nd in CUSA).
- ◆ **Michael Osei-Bonsu** (Sr., Bolingbrook, Ill.) needs **4** points to reach 700 for his MSU career (56 games) and would become the **82nd** Bear to reach that scoring milestone. On MSU's career scoring list, he is closing in on No. 82 Mert Bancroft (697), No. 81 Randy Stange (706), No. 80 Austin Ruder (707) and No's 78 Bobby Howard and Chris Hendrix (716). He remains CUSA's leader in FG percentage (.573) and offensive rebounding (**3.25**).
- ◆ MSU's scoring margin during its current five-game losing streak is **-4.0** with four one-possession losses.
- ◆ The Bears have eclipsed 200 threes for the 9th time in 10 years and for the 5th straight season. MSU's **207** 3-pointers on the season is just **45** shy of the club's all-time high under Cuonzo Martin of 252 set in 2009-10.
- ◆ **Zaxton King** (So., Lawrence, Kan.) needs **13** points to reach the 500 milestone for his career (**59** games).

INSIDE THE DEN RADIO SHOW

HEAD COACH CUONZO MARTIN

After an extensive national search, Missouri State University announced Cuonzo Martin as its men's basketball head coach on March 27, 2024. The man who orchestrated Missouri State's only MVC regular-season championship run during his first tenure in Springfield originally coached at Missouri State from 2008 to 2011.

Martin has a **286-235** (.549) career record in his 16th seasons as a Division I head coach with experience at MSU, Tennessee, California and Missouri. His teams have made 9 postseason appearances in that span, including 4 trips to the NCAA Tournament, 4 appearances in the NIT, and a CIT title with the Bears in 2010.

Coach Martin is **83-78** (.516) in his fifth season (and second stint) at Missouri State, including **61-25** at home, 17-47 on the road and 5-6 at neutral sites.

Martin also boasts 59 college graduates during his career with stints at MoState, Tennessee (2011-14), California (2014-17) and Missouri (2017-22).

A native of East St. Louis, Ill., Martin was a star player at Purdue from 1991-95 for coach Gene Keady and then played four years professionally. He was on the coaching staff at Purdue for eight years under Keady and Matt Painter before accepting his first head coaching position at MSU on March 26, 2008.

In Martin's first stint in Springfield (2008-11), he was named Missouri State's 16th head coach in time for the program's 100th anniversary season and its inaugural campaign at Great Southern Bank Arena. In his second season (2009-10), Martin guided MoState to a 24-12 overall ledger, a 19-2 home record, and an impressive run to the CIT Postseason Tournament title.

His third season at MSU (2010-11) was one of the program's most memorable, as the Bears finished 26-9 overall on the way to its first-ever MVC regular-season title with a 15-3 league record. The Bears fell to Indiana State in the finals of the MVC Tournament in St. Louis and capped an unforgettable campaign by advancing to the second round of the NIT. Martin was named 2011 MVC Coach of the Year and recipient of the Ben Jobe Award as the nation's top minority head coach. The Bears were 35-3 at home over Martin's final two seasons.

Martin's return to MoState in 2024-25 featured a roster packed with 15 newcomers for the Bears' final season in the Missouri Valley. MSU's 9-23 overall record was not a fair representation of the club's season performance which included 14 single-digit losses -- which was tied for the fourth-most in the nation.

He coached his **500th** career game on Nov. 24, 2025 at Great Southern Bank Arena vs. Long Island.

BEARS ON THE AIR

All Missouri State games air live on the Bears Radio Network with Springfield flagship station KWTO (93.3 FM) providing the feed to the five-station network and online at The Varsity Network and RadioSpringfield.com.

For the fourth straight season, Missouri State Director of Broadcasting **Corey Riggs** will coordinate play-by-play duties for the Bears Radio Network. Bears basketball legend **Mike Keltner** (1970-74) will provide color commentary for all broadcasts this season.

FROSH BEARS STEP UP IN KENNESAW REMATCH

The freshman combo of **Trey Williams Jr.** (Centralia, Ill.) and **Melakh Cunningham** (Gary, Ind.) combined for 30 points against Kennesaw State on Feb. 18, posting career highs with 19 and 11 points, respectively. The scoring surge was a season high for the Bears' freshman class.

OVERTIMES A PLENTY

Missouri State's 90-87 double-overtime loss at Middle Tennessee on Jan. 17 gave the Bears a multiple-OT game in each of the last three seasons. Last year in Cuonzo Martin's return to MSU, the Bears defeated Tulsa 111-106 in 3ot. In 2023-24, Missouri State defeated Drake at home, 83-80, in double-overtime.

The Bears doubled up on double OT games this season with a 79-78 home loss to LA Tech on Feb. 12.

OSEI-BONSU NAMED CUSA PLAYER OF THE WEEK ON JAN. 26

Michael Osei-Bonsu (Sr., Bolingbrook, Ill.) was named Conference USA Co-Player of the Week on Jan. 26 after he averaged 19.0 points, 9.0 rebounds, 2.0 assists and 1.5 steals in road wins at NM State and UTEP while shooting .636 (14/22) from the field. He had the game-winning layup at UTEP with 12 seconds left, while his 21-point outing at NM State marked his sixth 20-point game. He is MoState's first-ever CUSA Player of the Week.

ROAD SWING IS MISSOURI STATE'S LONGEST IN 40 YEARS

The Bears' four-game (2-2) Conference USA road swing (Jan. 14-24) was the squad's longest since a four-game away stretch in the Mid-Continent Conference during the 1984-85 season.

FOUR STRAIGHT 20-POINT GAMES FOR PALEK

Keith Palek III (Sr., Woodbine, N.J.) reeled off four straight 20-point scoring games (**23.0** ppg) from Jan. 10 to Jan. 22 with impressive efforts vs. FIU (22 points), at WKU (24), at Middle Tennessee (20) and at NM State (26). The last Bear to reach that scoring milestone was Gaike Prim who tallied 20+ points four straight games from 1/29/22 to 2/9/22.

TREY WILLIAMS NAMED CUSA FRESHMAN OF WEEK ON JAN. 5

Freshman guard **Trey Williams Jr.** (Centralia, Ill.) was named Conference USA Freshman of the Week, the league announced on Jan. 5. He averaged 12.7 points per game over the course of three straight Missouri State conference wins on the week, also logging 3.0 assists and 2.3 threes per contest in Bears wins over Delaware, UTEP and New Mexico State.

His best game of the week was a 15-point outing against UTEP on Jan. 2, draining 4-of-5 three-point attempts vs. the Miners. He also racked up 13 points, 3 triples and 4 assists in the home win over New Mexico State on Jan. 4 after starting the week with a 10-point effort at Delaware on Dec. 29 in addition to 3 assists.

KOBI HITS A THOUSAND

Kobi Williams (Jr., St. Louis, Mo.) eclipsed 1,000 career points on Jan. 14 at Western Kentucky. His 3-pointer from the left corner with 1:47 left in the first half put him at the milestone mark in his 75th career game. The Truman State transfer accounted for 772 points in 58 games in Kirksville before coming to MSU this season.

NINE BEARS ON AD HONOR ROLL

Nine current and former men's basketball players were named to the Missouri State Athletic Director's Honor Roll on Jan. 22 for having achieved a semester GPA of 3.0 or better for the Fall 2025 term. Current players honored were **Melakh Cunningham, Logan Epes, Amar Kuljuhovic, Michael Osei-Bonsu, Keith Palek II, Kobi Williams and Trey Williams Jr.**

KOBI DROPS 32 ON NEW MEXICO STATE TO SPARK 3-0 CUSA START

Kobi Williams (Jr., St. Louis, Mo.) scored a career-high 32 points in Missouri State's 89-82 home win over New Mexico State on Jan. 4 to push the Bears to their first 3-0 conference start since a 3-0 jump in the Missouri Valley in 2017-18. Williams went 7-for-9 from 3-point range in the victory, just one shy of a school record and tied for the fifth-most in club history. His 32 points was the most by a Bear since Alston Mason's 36-point game vs. Drake (1/24/24).

He posted **20.0** points per game over the Bears' first three CUSA contests, including the 32 points vs. New Mexico State, 20 points vs. UTEP (with 8 triples and 9-for-10 at the FT line) and 8 points at Delaware in the conference opener.

MORE ON KOBI'S GAME VS. AGGIES ...

Kobi Williams (Jr., St. Louis, Mo.) led the Bears in scoring (20.0 ppg) during its 3-0 conference start, including a career-high 32 points in the club's Jan. 4 win over New Mexico State. He was 7-for-9 from 3-point range against the Aggies -- just one triple shy of matching the school record -- and posted the squad's highest single-game point total since Alston Mason scored 36 points against Drake on Jan. 24, 2024.

BEARS WIN CUSA DEBUT WITH DOMINANT D

Missouri State's Dec. 29 win at Delaware in the Conference USA debut for both clubs marked the Bears' first road win of the season. The 61-43 victory was also memorable due to MoState's tremendous defensive milestones. The Bears held the Blue Hens to just 13 field goals, a .302 overall FG percentage and forced 15 turnovers. It marked the first time in 662 days, the Bears had held an opponent to under 13 FG and 43 points, after its dominant 60-35 win over Murray State at "Arch Madness" in St. Louis on 3/7/24, allowing just 12 field goals to the Racers.

PALEK TIP-IN SECURES WIN OVER ORU

Keith Palek's tip-in with 3.6 seconds remaining on Dec. 16 lifted Missouri State a 63-62 victory over visiting Oral Roberts. Palek poured in a game-high 27 points on 10-of-18 shooting, collecting his sixth 20-point game of the season to that point. Kobi Williams added 12 points and Trey Williams Jr. scored 10 in the dramatic home win.

PALEK HITS RARE COMBO WITH DOUBLE-DOUBLE AT XAVIER

Keith Palek's (Sr., Woodbine, N.J.) 23-point, 11-rebound, 5-assist effort against Xavier on Dec. 12 made him the first Bear since Gaige Prim (2/17/20 at Southern Illinois) to reach those milestones in a game.

REMARKABLE COMEBACK IN WIN OVER VAQUEROS

Behind 28 points from **Keith Palek III** and a closing 22-2 run over the game's final five minutes, Missouri State overcame a late 13-point deficit to top visiting UTRGV, 74-67, on Nov. 11. at Great Southern Bank Arena.

Down 65-52 with 5:19 remaining after an 8-0 Vaqueros run, the Bears responded with an 11-0 spurt over the next three minutes to close to 65-63 on a **Kobi Williams** 3-pointer with 2:23 on the clock. After **Michael Osei-Bonsu** grabbed an offensive rebound and scored to pull the Bears within a point, Williams hit a pair of free throws to give MoState a 68-67 lead with 1:09 left, beginning an 8-for-8 stretch at the foul line for the Bears over the final 69 seconds to seal the victory. Palek's 28 points all came in the final 24 minutes and adding 9 rebounds and 5 assists.

20-20 VISION ... PART II

Kobi Williams (Jr., St. Louis, Mo.) led the Bears with 24 points, while **Keith Palek III** (Sr., Woodbine, N.J.) racked up 20 points to help lead the Bears past visiting Northeastern (Okla.) State on 11/30/25. It marked the second 20-20 effort by the club this season after claiming a pair of 20-point scorers in the season opener against Missouri Southern (11/4/25). Williams was also 5-for-9 from beyond the arc and 5-for-5 at the line vs. NSU.

THIRTEEN THREES AT TULSA

The Bears knocked down a season-high 13 threes in their Dec. 6 road loss at Tulsa with six different players accounting for the baker's dozen. **Trey Williams Jr.** (Fr., Centralia, Ill.) logged a game-high 4 triples with **Kobi Williams** (Jr., St. Louis, Mo.) adding 3, while **Zaxton King** (So., Lawrence, Kan.) and **Darrion Sutton** (So., St. Charles, Mo.) scored two apiece. Ironically, Tulsa made 14 threes on the afternoon, just one shy of an MSU opponent record.

TRIPLING UP ON THE DOUBLE-DOUBLES

The Bears had double-doubles in each of their first three games to start the season with **Michael Osei-Bonsu** posting 22 points and a career-high 14 rebounds vs. Missouri Southern, **Darrion Sutton** notching 18 points and 11 rebounds (both career highs) against Northwestern Oklahoma State, and **Osei-Bonsu** bouncing back with 21 points and 10 rebounds at home game against Arkansas State.

KINGS OF PAINT

Missouri State's **60** points in the paint against Northwestern Oklahoma State (11/8/25) shattered the club record of 54, set vs. Illinois State on 2/5/20. Points in the paint first appeared on NCAA box scores in 2005.

SIX PLAYERS IN DOUBLE FIGURES IN GAME TWO

MSU had six players score in double figures against Northwestern Oklahoma on Nov. 8 in the Bears' second game of the season. Led by 20 points from **Keith Palek III**, the Bears also got double-figure scoring production from **Darrion Sutton** (18), **Kobi Williams** (12), **Zaxton King** (12), **Trey Williams Jr.** (11) and **Amar Kuljuhovic** (11) in the 106-57 win.

The half dozen players in double figures marked the squad's most since logging seven players with 10 or more points against William Woods at home on 12/30/18.

RECORD-BREAKING NIGHT AGAINST THE RANGERS

The Bears broke two Great Southern Bank Arena records in in the Nov. 8 home win over Northwestern Oklahoma State with 32 assists and 41 field goals. The assist record marked the most helpers by a Bears team since racking up 33 assists vs. Troy on 12/11/04 at Hammons Student Center and shattered the previous GSB record of 24 set three times previously (most recently by the Bears vs. Evangel on 12/30/21). The 41 field goals against NWOSU nipped MSU's 40 made baskets against Alabama A&M at the Vault on 11/11/16.

Missouri State piled up the 12th-highest point total ever in the 106-57 victory over the Rangers while hitting the century mark for the 44th time in the club's history.

20-20 VISION IN OPENER

Missouri State boasted two 20-point scorers in its win over Missouri Southern in the club's season opener (11/4/25) with **Michael Osei-Bonsu** posting a game-high **22** points and newcomer **Keith Palek III** scoring **21** for the home side. It marked the first time since 1/11/25 (at Southern Illinois) that MSU had a pair of 20-point scorers in the same game with **Zaxton King** (23) and Vincent Brady (24) holding the honors last season in Carbondale.

Osei-Bonsu also rang up a career-high **14** rebounds in the contest to give him his 9th career double-double as a Bear. The returning senior starter was also the game leader in assists (5) and blocks (3) to finish out a memorable opening-night victory in fashion. **Osei-Bonsu** and **Palek** also combined for **9** assists with just one turnover.

BEARS ON THE BOARDS

MoState's **53** rebounds in the season opener against Missouri Southern exceeded any single-game total from all of last season and marked the club's most since snagging 53 caroms in a double-overtime win at Drake (1/24/24). The Bears followed up that effort with **52** boards against Northwestern Oklahoma State four days later.

BEARS BASKETBALL HISTORY

The Bears have an all-time record of **1784-1096 (.619)**, now in their 114th season; a **799-578 (.580)** ledger in their 44th Division I season; and a **7-9** mark in their inaugural campaign in Conference USA. MSU is also **190-91 (.676)** in its 18th season at Great Southern Bank Arena.

During the Division I era, MSU has made NCAA Tournament appearances in 1987, 1988, 1989, 1990, 1992, and 1999. With NCAA Tournament wins over Wisconsin and Tennessee, the 1999 Bears advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16 for the first time in program history. The Bears have appeared in the National Invitation Tournament 10 times -- 1986, 1991, 1993, 1997, 2000, 2005, 2006, 2007, 2011 and 2022. The 1986, 1993 and 2006 squads all reached the NIT quarterfinals. MSU has also appeared in the CIT twice -- 2010 (champions) and 2014.

MSU won NAIA national championship titles in 1952 and 1953 under the late coach Bob Vanatta, while making six NAIA national tournament trips from 1939-1954. MSU also appeared in the NCAA Division II Tournament 10 times, finishing as national runners-up four times -- 1959, 1967, 1969 and 1974.

MSU has won 24 regular-season conference titles, including the 2010-11 Missouri Valley championship. The Bears have also recorded 28 seasons of 20 or more victories, including 15 in the Division I era.

MO STATE BEGINS CUSA ERA

On May 10, 2024 - Missouri State announced it had accepted an invitation to join Conference USA as a full-league member, effective July 1, 2025. Founded in 1995 and based in Dallas, CUSA's membership is 12 schools.

After an extensive national search, Missouri State University announced Cuonzo Martin as its next men's basketball head coach on March 27, 2024. The man who orchestrated Missouri State's only Missouri Valley Conference regular-season championship run during his first tenure in Springfield from 2008 to 2011 returned to the program in 2024-25.

Now in the second year of his second tenure at MoState -- and fifth season overall with the Bears -- Martin begins the 2025-26 season with a 273-221 (.553) career record in 15 seasons as a Division I head coach at MSU, Tennessee, California and Missouri. His teams have made nine postseason appearances in that span, including four trips to the NCAA Tournament, four appearances in the NIT, and a CIT title with the Bears in 2010. Martin also led the Bears to a 2011 Missouri Valley Conference regular-season championship and boasts 56 college graduates during his head coaching career.

Martin's Bears teams have combined for a total record of 70-64 (.522) in his previous five seasons at Missouri State.

A native of East St. Louis, Ill., Martin was a star player at Purdue from 1991-95 for coach Gene Keady and then played four years professionally. He was on the coaching staff at Purdue for eight years under Keady and Matt Painter before accepting his first head coaching position at Missouri State on March 26, 2008.

In Martin's first stint in Springfield (2008-11), he was named Missouri State's 16th head coach in time for the program's 100th anniversary year and the inaugural season of Great Southern Bank Arena in 2008-09. In his second season (2009-10), Martin guided MoState to a 24-12 overall ledger, a 19-2 home record, and an impressive run to the CollegeInsider.com Postseason Tournament title.

His third season at MSU in 2010-11 was one of the program's most memorable, as the Bears finished 26-9 overall on the way to the program's first-ever MVC regular-season title with a 15-3 league record. The Bears fell to Indiana State in the finals of the MVC Tournament in St. Louis and capped an unforgettable campaign by advancing to the second round of the National Invitation Tournament. Martin was named 2011 MVC Coach of the Year, making him the only MSU sideline boss to receive that honor, as well as claiming the 2011 Ben Jobe Award as the nation's top minority head coach. Over Martin's last two seasons in Springfield, the Bears were 36-3 at home and did not lose a non-conference home game during that span.

Martin made three head coaching stops after initially leaving Springfield with stints at Tennessee (2011-14), California (2014-17) and Missouri (2017-22).

In three seasons at Tennessee, Martin guided the Volunteers to a 63-41 (.606) overall record with three postseason appearances and three finishes in the top five in the SEC Standings. The Vols finished second in

the SEC in Martin's first season in Knoxville after being picked 11th in the SEC preseason poll. After back-to-back NIT appearances in his first two years as the Volunteers head coach, Martin led Tennessee to a 24-13 record in 2013-14 with an NCAA Sweet 16 trip and a No. 23 national ranking in the season-ending *USA Today* coaches poll. In the process, Tennessee matched the fourth-best win total in school history. After earning a berth in the NCAA's First Four, the Martin-led Volunteers captured victories over Iowa, UMass and Mercer to equal the most NCAA Tournament wins in program history.

At Cal, Martin led the Golden Bears to a 21-13 mark and NIT appearance in his final season, guiding the 2016-17 squad into the Associated Press Top 25 in the season's second poll while receiving votes in nearly every *USA Today* coaches poll that year. His squad boasted four All-Pac-12 players, including first-team selection Ivan Rabb. His 2015-16 club went 23-11 and tied for third in the Pac-12 en route to a No. 4 seed in the NCAA Tournament, the highest in program history. The Golden Bears parlayed a consensus top 10 recruiting class into an 18-0 record at Haas Pavilion as part of a school-record 27-game home win streak over Martin's last two campaigns in Berkeley with Cal leading the Pac-12 in both scoring defense (67.3 ppg) and field-goal percentage defense (.396) in year two. Martin was 62-39 (.614) during his three-year tenure at Cal.

At Missouri (2017-22), Martin took over a program that had won just 27 games in the previous three seasons. The Tigers went from eight wins before his arrival to 20 victories in Martin's first season at the helm (2017-18). His Columbia debut

season marked Martin's seventh 20-win season in a 10-season stretch and made him the 59th head coach in NCAA Tournament history to lead three different programs to the Big Dance. He later led the Tigers to a second NCAA Tournament run in 2021 as Mizzou spent 11 consecutive weeks in the AP Top 25, reaching as high as No. 10 nationally. The Tigers finished the season with three wins over Top 10 teams and seven Quad 1 victories. He was 78-77 (.503) in his five seasons in Columbia.

"Zo's" long-anticipated return to Missouri State in 2024-25 saw a complete overhaul of the Bears' roster with 15 newcomers on hand. The Bears finished 9-23 overall but 14 of MSU's losses were by less than 10 points, including nine games within two possessions and five games by three points or less. The club's 14 single-digit losses tied for the fourth-most in the nation. Martin's son, Chase, joined the Bears as a post-grad transfer from Purdue and was the squad's only MVC award winner, claiming a spot on the MVC Scholar-Athlete Team.

Martin also has experience as a coach with USA Basketball, serving on the USA Junior National Team staff at the 2011 FISU World University games in China.

As a student-athlete, Martin was a 1995 first-team All-Big Ten selection at Purdue when he averaged 18.4 ppg and sank 91 3-pointers. He graduated as one of the program's all-time leaders in 3-pointers (179) and among the Boilermakers' career scoring leaders (1,666). Playing under Keady and alongside All-American Glenn Robinson, Martin led Purdue to a pair of Big Ten titles and to a 90-37 four-year record. The Boilermakers went to the postseason each season with Martin, reaching the Elite Eight of the 1994 NCAA Tournament.

Following his collegiate playing career, Martin was selected by the Atlanta Hawks with the 57th

overall pick of the 1995 NBA Draft. He played professionally for four years with the NBA's Hawks, Milwaukee Bucks and Vancouver Grizzlies. In 1997, Martin was the leading scorer for Felize Scandone in Italy. He then returned to his alma mater where he earned his bachelor's degree in restaurant, hotel, institutional and tourism management from Purdue in 2000, and served one season as an assistant on the staff at West Lafayette High School. After earning his

degree, Martin joined Gene Keady's Purdue staff for the 2000-01 season as an assistant, and remained with the Boilermaker program when Painter took over as head coach. He served as the Boilermaker's associate during the 2007-08 season before taking the Missouri State post the following season. In his eight-year tenure at Purdue, he mentored several all-conference standouts, including All-American forward Robbie Hummel.

Martin has also served on the NABC Board of Directors, the NCAA Oversight Committee and the SEC's Council on Racial Equity and Social Justice.

He and his wife, Roberta, have two sons, Joshua and Chase, and a daughter, Addison.

Chase was a member of the 2024 NCAA national runner-up team at Purdue and is a graduate assistant on this year's Missouri State staff.



EXHIBITION GAME

Oct. 31, 2025, Great Southern Bank Arena, Springfield Missouri State 92, Maryville 67

Led by 30 points from Kobi Williams, Missouri State shot 48 percent from the field and knocked down 13 threes to dispatch visiting Maryville University, 92-67, in the Bears' only official exhibition game of the preseason.

Williams, a transfer from Truman State, was 7-of-12 from 3-point range and 9-of-15 overall to lead four MSU players in double figures. Seniors Michael Osei-Bonsu (13) and Logan Epes (11) also posted double digits in the scoring column with Keith Palek III adding 13 as well.

Palek and Osei-Bonsu shared the team lead with six rebounds apiece, with five other maroons snagging five caroms apiece. The Bears held a 52-38 rebounding advantage and racked up 20 second-chance points off 18 offensive boards.

Ten of the dozen players who saw action for Coach Cuonzo Martin's squad found the scoring column and all 12 snagged at least one rebound.

Missouri State finished 31-of-64 (.484) overall from the field, 13-of-33 (.394) from long range and 17-for-27 (.630) at the free throw line with 23 assists, 12 steals and 7 blocks.

Maryville was led by Evan Palmquist with 19 points, while Henry Sanchez Perez scored 13, including four consecutive 3-pointers midway through the second half.

In the first half, the Bears got 16 points from Kobi Williams to push ahead to a 48-24 advantage at the midway point.

After a slow start out of the gates, Williams broke the ice with MSU's first points of the night with a corner three, the first of four he would hit in the opening half. Maryville kept things close until the 9:20 mark when the Bears stretched a 20-13 lead into a 36-13 advantage with an impressive 16-0 surge.

Williams picked up where he left off to start the second half, knocking down three triples and 12 of the Bears' first 14 points of the period to extend the lead to 62-33 coming out of the under-16 timeout.

That would be the Missouri State's largest lead of the night with an 8-2 mini-run by Maryville trimming the visitors' deficit to 67-44 at the 11-minute mark. Later, Sanchez Perez sored 12 straight points for the Saints, all on 3-pointers, the last of which made it a 78-56 game with just over 7 minutes to go.

Trey Williams, Palek and Epes would later close things out for Missouri State, each burying a triple over the next four minutes, while a rim-rattling dunk from Darrion Sutton added an exclamation point to the exhibition contest.

GAME 1

Nov. 4, 2025, Great Southern Bank Arena, Springfield Missouri State 88, Missouri Southern 70

Missouri State got 22 points from Michael Osei-Bonsu and 21 more from Keith Palek III to turn back visiting Missouri Southern, 88-70, in the season opener.

Osei-Bonsu also collected a career-high 14 rebounds, including 10 offensive boards, as part of his ninth double-double as a Bear. MSU also got 14 points from Kobi Williams and 10 more from freshman Trey Williams Jr.

Missouri Southern, coached by former MoState staffer Sam McMahon, was led by Tyrone Wright's 21 points with Jaden Taylor pitching in 14.

The Bears overcame a three-point halftime deficit with a 13-3 run to start the second half. Palek scored the go-ahead layup less than a minute into the period and then reeled off 9 points in five minutes to push the maroon side up 53-46 at the 14:56 mark.

MoState maintained that margin until the midway point of the second period when Cuonzo Martin's defense kicked things into high gear with 10 minutes to go. A 20-6 surge by the Bears over the next six minutes stretched their lead to 80-61 with 4:28 remaining as Osei-Bonsu registered 6 points in that span, while Trey Williams Jr. and Darrion Sutton added four apiece.

Sutton, who finished with 9 points and 8 rebounds off the bench, gave MSU its largest lead of the night, 84-63, with just over three minutes to play with a short jumper off the glass.

By the time the smoke cleared, the Bears held the Lions to just 28.2 percent shooting in the second period, including 1-of-12 from three-point range, while collecting 30 rebounds and allowing the Lions just 4 second-chance points.

Osei-Bonsu was Missouri State's top assist man with a game-high 5 dimes to go with an 11-for-15 shooting night, 3 blocks and a pair of steals.

The Bears finished 33-of-79 (.418) overall from the field, 5-of-31 (.161) from distance and 17-for-21 (.810) at the stripe with a 53-42 rebounding advantage. Martin's squad posted 52 points in the paint and exchanged 21 offensive caroms for 24 second-chance points. MSU also committed just 8 turnovers on the evening.

Missouri Southern sprinted to a 43-40 lead at the intermission, shooting 53 percent from the field in the opening half and capitalizing on 26 points in the paint to take the early advantage.

The Lions led by as many as 10 after a layup by Brayden Williams at the 6:15 mark made it a 34-24 game. But the Bears stormed back over the last six minutes of the stanza with Osei-Bonsu accounting for 6 points on a 16-9 run for MSU.

Osei-Bonsu had 14 points and 7 rebounds in the first half alone, while Wright's 17 points – on 8-of-9 shooting in the first half – kept the visitors ahead by a nose at the midway point.

Missouri State piled up the 12th-highest point total in school history in a 106-57 victory over Northwestern Oklahoma State at GSB Arena.

The Bears shot 41-for-68 from the floor, including 72 percent from two-point range while placing six scorers in double figures. MoState's 41 field goals were the team's most in at least a decade, while its 32 assists were just three shy of the school record.

Keith Palek III led all scorers with 20 points along with 8 assists, Darrion Sutton collected a double-double with 18 points and 11 rebounds, while Kobi Williams (12), Zaxton King (12), Amar Kuljuhovic (11) and Trey Williams Jr. (11) also reached double figures. All 10 Bears who saw playing time found the scoring column.

It wasn't until the 16:30 mark in the first half that the Bears knocked down their first field goal, beginning a 12-for-16 sequence that included eight straight points from King in a 65-second stretch, seven consecutive from Palek and six more mixed in from Sutton for a 32-8 lead with 7:43 to play before halftime.

The Bears added a 16-0 run late in the opening period to take a 55-21 lead into the break and continued to grow the lead to as many as 50 points late in the contest.

MoState knocked down 10 three-pointers led by Trey Williams with three and owned a 52-25 rebounding margin with 10 players collecting multiple boards. The Bears corralled 13 consecutive rebounds at one point during the game.

Kobi Williams had 6 assists as all 10 Bears tallied at least one helper as well in a balanced effort.

Nov. 11, 2025, Great Southern Bank Arena, Springfield Arkansas State 86, Missouri State 85

Visiting Arkansas State hit two free throws with five seconds left to help the Red Wolves to an 86-85 comeback win.

The Bears were led by Michael Osei-Bonsu's 21 points, while Zaxton King pitched in 18, and freshman Trey Williams Jr. scored 14. Osei-Bonsu and Darrion Sutton each snagged 10 rebounds for Missouri State marking Osei-Bonsu's second double-double in three games.

Chandler Jackson tallied 33 points to lead A-State (2-1), including 26 in the second half, to lead the charge for the visitors, while T.J. Caldwell added 16.

There were just two ties and three lead changes in the nip-and-tuck battle with Missouri State leading for the first 33 minutes before Arkansas State rallied down the stretch. With 6:16 to go, MSU's Keith Palek III picked up his fifth foul on a corner 3-point attempt by Royal Blue-Smith. Blue-Smith made two-of-three free throws to give the Red Wolves their first lead of the night, 72-21.

After A-State's lead swelled to five, King put the Bears on his back, burying an elbow jumper to make it a one-possession game before returning the lead to the home club with a fast-break layup with 1:31 remaining that made it an 80-79 game.

MSU's lead was short-lived with Jackson scoring on back-to-back possessions after a Bears' turnover opened the door for Arkansas State to push ahead 83-80 with 26 seconds on the clock.

Down the stretch, the game came down to free throws with the teams combining for a dozen charity shots in less than 21 seconds. Osei-Bonsu made both ends at the line with 20.7 seconds showing to make it an 83-82 game. A-State answered with a Jackson free throw at the 16.5-second mark to stretch its lead to two. Osei-Bonsu then made one-of-two with 6.7 ticks to play before a pair of foul shots by ASU's Matt Hayman made it 86-83 with five seconds remaining.

On the ensuing play, Blue-Smith was whistled for an intentional foul on Osei-Bonsu, giving the Bears two shots and the ball with just 2.6 seconds left. The senior made the second free throw to make it a two-point game, and then got the ball back for a driving layup and the foul less than a second later. The layup was waived off, and Osei-Bonsu was awarded two shots instead of a chance for a three-point play. He made the front end and missed the second.

MSU's Logan Epes found the loose ball off the missed free throw but couldn't get off a shot in tall timber to the left of the basket as the buzzer sounded to dash the Bears' comeback hopes.

The Bears finished 27-of-37 (.730) at the free throw line on the night, while A-State was 23-of-29 (.793)

In the first half, the Bears shot 54 percent from the field and scored 18 points off 10 A-State turnovers to take a 46-33 lead at the intermission. King's 12 points led all players, while Sutton racked up 7 rebounds off the bench in the opening 20 minutes.

UT Arlington 67, Missouri State 49

UT Arlington used a 15-1 run at the end of the first half and start of the second half while holding visiting Missouri State to just 32 percent shooting in a 67-49 Mavericks win over the Bears in the first road test of the season for the MSU.

Michael Osei-Bonsu was the only Missouri State player to score in double figures with 22 points on 10-of-17 shooting, while Keith Palek III snagged 11 rebounds. Osei-Bonsu also grabbed 5 rebounds and accounted for 4 steals.

UTA was led by 18 points from Raysean Seamster while Marcell McCreary logged 14 points behind three triples.

Missouri State finished 1-for-14 (.071) from 3-point range with Trey Williams Jr. landing the only long-range shot of the game for the visitors. The Bears also had a rare 17-turnover night and were out-rebounded 42-35.

MoState jumped out to a 9-2 lead out of the gates before UTA stormed back. A pair of free throws by Zaxton King with 1:34 left in the opening stanza drew MSU within 27-25, but the Mavericks closed out the half with seven straight points, including a three by McCreary and dunk by Amari Reed, to make it 34-25 at the intermission.

In the second half, a Cameron Jackson layup pushed the home side up by double figures for the first time at the 18:40 mark and ignited an 8-0 run by the home side. The Mavericks' lead swelled to 42-27 at the first media timeout and ultimately swelled to 20 at the midway point in the half, 54-34, after a dunk by Casmir Chavis. UTA held that margin until the 7-minute mark before an alley-oop dunk by Seamster gave the Mavericks their largest lead of the night, 59-37.

To their credit, the Bears rallied down the stretch, cutting their deficit to 59-47 with 2:45 to go on Williams' 3-pointer to cap a 10-0 Missouri State surge.

Missouri State finished 16-of-50 (.320) from the field, 1-of-14 (.071) from distance and 16-for-24 (.667) at the line with 10 assists and a dozen steals.

UTA was 27-of-62 (.435) overall, 7-for-17 (.412) from downtown and 6-of-17 (.353) at the foul line with 21 assists, 15 turnovers and 38 points in the paint.

Behind 28 points from Keith Palek III and a closing 22-2 run over the game's final five minutes, Missouri State overcame a late 13-point deficit to top visiting University of Texas Rio Grande Valley, 74-67.

Down 65-52 with 5:19 remaining after an 8-0 UTRGV run, the Bears responded with an 11-0 spurt over the next three minutes to close to 65-63 on a Kobi Williams 3-pointer with 2:23 on the clock.

After Michael Osei-Bonsu grabbed an offensive rebound and scored to pull the Bears within a point, Williams hit a pair of free throws to give MoState a 68-67 lead with 1:09 left, beginning an 8-for-8 stretch at the foul line for MSU over the final 69 seconds to seal the victory.

Zaxton King was quickly in double figures with 10 of his 12 points coming during an 18-10 start for the Bears, but that was met by a 14-0 run by the Vaqueros over nearly seven minutes that helped the visitors take a 30-28 lead into intermission.

UTRGV slowly built its lead to 13 in the second half when Marvin McGhee III scored with 5:19 left to play, setting the stage for the Bears' dramatic comeback.

Palek's 28 points all came in the final 24 minutes of the game, while the senior also added game highs of nine rebounds and five assists, ultimately scoring or assisting on 40 of MSU's 74 points.

King finished with 12 points, Williams had 11 and Osei-Bonsu scored 10 to give the Bears four double-figure scorers.

MoState committed just six turnovers in the game, finishing plus eight in that category to help overcome a 36-26 rebounding deficit. The Bears shot 19-for-26 at the foul line and 9-for-32 from 3-point land, with Palek going 12-for-14 and 4-for-9 from those distances, respectively.

Visiting Long Island nearly doubled up Missouri State in the second half and shot better than 60 percent for the game to frustrate the home standing Bears in a 75-61 home loss.

Missouri State was led by Zaxton King's 15 points, while Keith Palek III added 13, Kobi Williams scored 12, and Michael Osei-Bonsu contributed 10 points and a team-high 7 rebounds.

Long Island got a game-high 18 points and 4 assists from Melachi Davis with Jamal Fuller pitching in 14, and Greg Gordon scoring 13 points for the visitors. Tre'shawn Sheppard added 8 points and a game-high 10 rebounds for the Sharks, who finished 29-of-48 (.604) from the field.

A double-digit loss was the farthest thing from Missouri State's mind in the first half. The Bears took a 40-35 lead into the intermission as King scored 11 points in the opening 20 minutes, while Palek and Williams added 8 points apiece for the home club which led by a dozen on five occasions.

The Bears' 31-19 advantage with 6:19 left in the opening half was a comfortable position before the tables turned. The visiting Sharks converted their last five field goal attempts to close out the stanza and got as close as 39-35 in the final minute.

That momentum continued in the second half with LIU scoring the first six points of the second period to briefly gain a 41-40 lead. From there, the advantage changed hands seven times before a decisive 14-1 surge by the Sharks over a 6-minute stretch put the Bears on the short end of a 64-49 score with just 5:46 left.

MSU would whittle away over the next couple of minutes to draw within 68-58 with just over three minutes remaining after a trey by Palek, a second-chance bucket and two free throws from Osei-Bonsu, and a slick layup from King.

But it was simply not Missouri State's night from the perimeter. The Bears made just one of their last 18 attempts from beyond the arc and could not get enough defensive stops down the stretch. The Bears were just 4-for-14 from the field over the game's final 11 minutes, while LIU was 11-for-13 in that same span, including seven buckets in the paint.

When the smoke cleared, Missouri State finished 22-of-55 (.400) shooting overall, 3-of-22 (.136) from long range, and 14-of-27 (.519) at the line. The Bears did rack up 34 points in the paint and 17 second-chance points off 13 offensive rebounds – including four offensive caroms by Darryon Sutton off the bench.

LIU finished at 60.4 percent from the field, 6-of-15 (.400) from long range and 11-of-18 (.611) at the foul line with a 33-27 rebounding advantage, and 6 blocks.

Led by 24 points from Kobi Williams and 20 from Keith Palek III, Missouri State rolled past visiting Northeastern (Okla.) State, 92-71, to wrap a three-game home stand.

The Bears also got big scoring games from Trey Williams Jr. with a career-high 15 points, Darrion Sutton with 13 off the bench, and Zaxton King with 10. Palek also snagged a game-high 12 rebounds for his first double-double of the season, while Trey Williams tacked on a game-high 6 assists.

Coach Cuonzo Martin's squad never trailed and shot 53.2 percent from the field overall with 11 three-pointers, including 5 by Kobi Williams.

Missouri State made a season-high 13 threes and converted 49 percent from the field, but home-standing Tulsa was equal to the task here Saturday with five players scoring in double figures to send the Bears home with a 98-74 setback.

Kobi Williams made 7-of-10 field goals and three triples to lead the Bears with 20 points, while Keith Palek III added 15. Trey Williams Jr. and Zaxton King also scored in double figures for Missouri State with 12 and 10 points, respectively.

David Green led Tulsa with 17 points.

The Bears were within 32-28 of the home club after a Trey Williams triple with 7:14 to go in the first half. But Tulsa (8-1) ended the half on a 16-4 surge to lead 48-32 at the intermission and stretched things out to 20 just a minute into the second half.

Despite shooting 58.3 percent from the field in the second half, Missouri State would get no closer than 19 the rest of the game. Tulsa took full advantage of its abundance of free throw opportunities during the second stanza, making 17-of-21 over the last 20 minutes, as part of a 50-point half.

The Bears finished 25-of-51 (.490) overall from the field, 13-for-26 (.500) from long range and 11-of-19 (.579) at the foul line with 26 rebounds and a dozen assists.

Tulsa was 30-for-63 (.476) overall, 14-for-33 (.424) from bonus distance and 24-for-30 (.800) at the line with 42 rebounds, 19 assists and 8 steals.

In the first half, Tulsa used an 11-1 surge over the last five minutes to lead 48-32 at the midway point. The Golden Hurricane made 9 triples by six different players and out-rebounded the Bears by a 23-14 margin in the half.

A fast-paced start favored the Golden Hurricane saw the home side bury three triples before the first media timeout to take a 13-6 advantage. MoState stayed in the hunt with a pair of treys by Trey Williams Jr. in that span.

Tulsa built its lead to seven on four occasions before Palek and Kobi Williams led the Bears' early resurgence. Kobi's transition layup drew the Bears within 17-16, and later a three by Darrion Sutton got MSU within 20-19.

A Green trey before the under-eight media timeout extended a 27-24 Tulsa lead to six. Trey Williams was able to get the Bears within 32-28 at the 7:14 mark but the rest of the period went to the home side which forced six MSU turnovers.

Xavier 75, Missouri State 57

Missouri State's Keith Palek III racked up game-highs 23 points and 11 rebounds to help the visiting Bears stay close, but a 17-0 run by home standing Xavier midway through the second half proved to be the difference in a 75-57 MoState loss.

Xavier shot 52 percent from the field in the second half and converted 6-of-7 attempts during the pivotal run over a six-and-a-half minute stretch in the final period. After Palek's layup at the 17-minute mark drew the Bears within 39-35, the Musketeers (8-3) used the strength of three 3-pointers and some key fast-break opportunities to push ahead 54-35 by the 11-minute mark.

Trey Williams Jr., who had 6 assists, broke the MSU slump with a triple with 10:37 to go – one of just three long-range buckets by the Bears on the night – to put the Bears back on track. But with the damage already done, Xavier pushed its advantage to 20 on three occasions down the stretch with Melakh Cunningham's layup in the final minute deciding the final margin.

For the game, the Bears were 21-of-53 (.396) from the field, 3-for-14 (.214) from downtown and 12-of-15 (.800) from the line with 15 assists, 13 turnovers and 36 points in the paint.

The Bears were narrowly out-rebounded by the larger Xavier squad, 37-36, but were limited to just six second-chance points.

Darrion Sutton was also in double-figures for the Bears with 12 points and 5 rebounds off the bench.

Xavier was led by Jovan Milicevic's 17 points, while Filip Borovicinan and Tre Carroll added 13 apiece, including three triples apiece.

The Musketeers finished 28-for-65 (.431) from the field, 12-of-30 (.400) from long range and 7-for-12 (.583) at the line with 15 fast-break points.

In the first half, Palek's 10 points and 7 rebounds paced the Bears to within three of the lead, 31-28, at the midway point. Palek and Sutton accounted for all of MSU's scoring during an 8-0 run to put the visitors ahead 17-13 less than nine minutes in.

The Musketeers were 1-for-11 from the field during a key seven-minute stretch while the Bears gained their footing.

Xavier answered MSU's early run with a 9-1 surge of its own over the next four minutes, capped on a traditional three-point play by Carroll to give the home club a 22-19 edge. The lead would change hands six more times over the final seven minutes of the stanza, including a go-ahead layup from Logan Epes with 93 seconds remaining to give the Bears a 28-27 lead. But the Musketeers ended the half on a 4-0 swing with Milicevic accounting for two of his game-high 12 points in the half with a layup at the seven-second mark.

Keith Palek III tipped in a missed shot with 3.6 seconds remaining to give Missouri State a 63-62 victory over visiting Oral Roberts at Great Southern Bank Arena.

Palek poured in a game-high 27 points on 10-of-18 shooting, collecting his sixth 20-point game of the season. Kobi Williams added 12 points and Trey Williams Jr. scored 10, while the defense allowed its second-lowest totals of the season in terms of points and field goal percentage (.362).

Neither team led by more than a possession until Palek's traditional 3-point play made it 22-18 Bears with 4:04 left in the opening half, and the senior closed the period on a personal 5-0 run for a 30-24 MSU lead at the break. On the Bears' final play, Palek getting the offensive rebound off a Zaxton King miss and tipped in the game-winner with 3.6 seconds to go.

ORU's desperation 3-point attempt at the buzzer was wide left.

Missouri State owned a 30-27 rebounding lead and outscored the Golden Eagles 13-2 in points off turnovers. The Bears allowed the Golden Eagles just 4 offensive rebounds and 5 second-chance points.

Missouri State got a game-high 19 points from Michael Osei-Bonsu in his return to action, while the home-standing Bears held off a late surge from visiting Lindenwood to capture a 70-65 victory.

The Bears also got 14 points and 8 rebounds from Keith Palek III who logged his 70th career double-figure scoring effort, while Kobi Williams dropped in a dozen points with 8 boards.

Lindenwood was led by Jadis Jones' 16 points, while Dontrez Williams scored 15. Anias Futrell tallied a game-high 15 rebounds for the Lions who shot 45.2 percent in the second half.

Missouri State extended a 12-point halftime advantage to 15 within the opening minute of the second stanza on Williams first of three triples. A minute later, the Lions responded with an 11-3 surge to climb back within 42-38 at the 15-minute mark.

But the Bears steadied the ship on a driving layup by Zaxton King at the 2:32 mark and then got a game-clinching triple from Kobi Williams from the right wing with 47 ticks remaining to stretch MSU's lead to 68-64.

Williams was also instrumental later in the game's final minute, gathering in a huge offensive rebound with 17.1 seconds to go to extend a key possession, while King sealed it with two free throws at the 15.6-second mark.

The Bears out-rebounded Lindenwood by a 44-41 margin and racked up 40 points in the paint and 17 second-chance points from 13 offensive caroms. Mo-State finished 26-of-62 (.419) overall, 6-for-27 (.222) from distance and 12-for-23 (.522) at the line with 11 assists.

The visitors from the Ohio Valley Conference were 22-of-59 (.373) overall from the field, 3-for-22 (.136) from downtown and 18-for-31 (.581) at the free throw line with 17 fast-break points and 6 blocks.

In the first half, the Bears used a 16-3 run over an eight-minute stretch to flip a three-point deficit into a 10-point lead. Osei-Bonsu's layup at the 3:21 mark pushed the home side up 27-17.

Missouri State used solid defense and a timely second-half run to cruise past Delaware, 61-43, in the Conference USA debut for both clubs.

Zaxton King led three Bears in double figures with 16 points, while Keith Palek III scored 14, and Trey Williams Jr. added 10. Antwan Burnett tallied a game-high 11 rebounds for the Bears off the bench.

The win gave the Bears their first road win of the season and first-ever CUSA victory.

Delaware got 12 points and 11 rebounds from Macon Emory whose 3-pointer early in the game tied things up 3-3. It proved to be the game's only tie as Delaware played catchup the rest of the contest with the Bears leading for more than 39 minutes.

A key 13-2 run by MoState early in the second half stretched a 10-point halftime lead to 21 with five different players factoring into the three-minute surge. Kobi Williams' free throws with 15:52 left in the game made it a 42-21 game and pushed the visitors ahead by 20 for the first time.

King's third 3-pointer of the game with 8:37 left in the contest gave the Bears their biggest lead of the afternoon, 55-31. Later, Palek's layup at the six-minute mark pushed the score to 57-33.

The Bears shot 48 percent in the second half (12 of 25) and converted 14-of-19 (.737) free throws for the game, while out-rebounding the Blue Hens, 35-30.

For the game, Missouri State was 20-for-50 (.400) from the field and 7-of-22 (.318) from bonus distance with 9 assists, 9 steals and 10 turnovers.

GAME 13

Jan. 2, 2026, Great Southern Bank Arena, Springfield Missouri State 79, UTEP 55

Missouri State shot 53 percent from the field and led by as many as 28 en route to a 79-55 home win over UTEP in a decisive Conference USA victory for the Bears. It marked MoState's fourth straight victory overall and the club's first 2-0 start in conference play since 2021-22.

Antwan Burnett was 4-for-4 from the field and accounted for 11 points off the bench for Missouri State, while Kobi Williams posted a game-high 20 points, including 9-of-10 from the free throw line. Freshman Trey Williams Jr. notched 15 points in the victory with four triples, and Keith Palek III scored 13 points while dishing out 5 assists. Michael Osei-Bonsu snagged a game-high 7 rebounds for the maroon side, scoring 8 points with 5 helpers and 3 steals.

UTEP got 12 points apiece from Elijah Jones and Trey Horton. Jones led the Miners with 5 rebounds, while Horton was 3-for-5 from long range, including a clutch triple with 10:16 remaining in the game to pull the visitors within 58-46 after an 11-3 surge.

The Bears rallied with a Burnett free throw, a three from Kobi and a dunk by Darrion Sutton to extend their lead to 64-46 at the under-eight media timeout.

From there, the Bears held UTEP to just one field goal the rest of the contest – a three by Horton with 90 seconds left in the game – while turning to Osei-Bonsu and Kobi Williams to secure the victory.

Osei-Bonsu's personal 4-0 surge stretched MSU's lead back to 20-plus points for the first time since the 14:22 mark of the second half. From there, Kobi went 4-for-4 at the line, scored on a stick-back from close range and knocked down a triple with a minute to play to put things out of reach.

For the game, the Bears were 26-of-49 (.531) overall, 8-for-19 (.421) from long distance and 19-of-26 (.731) at the line with a 31-25 rebounding advantage, including 20 second-chance points from 12 offensive caroms. MSU also racked up 16 assists on its 26 made baskets.

UTEP was 19-for-48 (.396) overall, 4-of-15 (.267) from downtown and 13-of-20 (.650) at the line with 11 turnovers. Horton accounted for 12 of the Miners' 14 bench points on the night.

In the first half, the Bears shot 66.7 percent and ended the period on a 13-0 run to lead 49-23 at the intermission. Trey Williams Jr. and Palek scored a dozen apiece in the opening 20 minutes with Burnett providing 10 points off the bench, including a personal 8-0 run midway through the half that extended MSU's lead from nine to 15. Likewise, MSU out-rebounded UTEP by an 18-10 margin in the opening stanza, boasted 20 points in the paint.

GAME 14

Jan. 4, 2026, Great Southern Bank Arena, Springfield Missouri State 89, New Mexico State 82

Kobi Williams scored a career-high 32 points, including 7-of-9 from 3-point range, to lead Missouri State past visiting New Mexico State, 89-82, here Sunday, as the Bears won their fifth in a row.

MoState also got 16 points from Keith Palek III, including 15 in the second half, while Trey Williams Jr. scored 13, and Michael Osei-Bonsu added 12. The Bears also got a team-high 9 rebounds from Darrion Sutton on his birthday.

New Mexico State was led by Julius Mims who had 22 points and 14 rebounds, while Jemel Jones contributed 18 off the bench for the Aggies.

The Bears led for nearly 39 minutes in the contest, but the outcome was far from one sided as New Mexico State whittled a 12-point halftime deficit down to one on a dunk by Mims with 10:22 to play. The Aggies then took the lead briefly on a pair of free throws from Anthony Wrzeszcz that made it a 67-66 game at 10:09.

That's when Palek took over for Missouri State. The senior poured in 13 straight Bears points over a key seven-minute stretch to keep things afloat. His traditional-three-point play with 9:50 to go, restored the lead to the home side, 69-67, and MSU would never trail again.

Sutton's offensive rebound and layup at the seven-minute mark ignited an 8-4 mini-run by MSU. Kobi Williams then scored six straight Bears points, the last of which was a driving layup to give the Bears a five-point lead at the four-minute mark.

One of the biggest shots of the night came from Antwan Burnett who buried a 3-pointer with just over two minutes remaining, then dove to the floor to force a NMSU turnover a minute later. The hustle play led to two free throws by Zaxton King moments later, putting MoState ahead 85-76.

New Mexico State's Elijah Elliott scored six points in the game's final minute, including an unusual four-point play. But the Bears were able to finish things out with Kobi and Burnett combining for four free throws down the stretch to seal it and give the Bears their first 3-0 start in conference play since 2017-18.

Williams' seven triples was just one shy of the MSU program record and matched the fifth-most in squad history. Likewise, his 32-point effort was the most points scored by a Bear since Alston Mason scored 36 on Drake on Jan. 24, 2024.

For the afternoon, Missouri State shot 46.3 percent overall on 25-of-54 field goals and shot lights out from beyond the arc, converting 10-of-21 (.476) from downtown. The Bears also finished 29-of-39 (.744) at the line with 34 rebounds 14 assists and 7 steals, including three by Burnett.

In the first half, Kobi went 6-for-7 from three – including five triples in the game's first five minutes -- as part of a 20-point period to push MoState ahead 53-41 at the break. Trey Williams also buried a pair of long shots, including a critical bucket from the left corner with 17 seconds left in the half to restore a double-figure lead.

Jan. 7, 2026, VyStar Arena, Kennesaw, Ga. Kennesaw State 90, Missouri State 80

A 19-0 run by Kennesaw State early in the second half flipped a one-point game into a 20-point contest as the home-standing Owls parlayed the five-minute surge into a 90-80 win over visiting Missouri State in Conference USA play.

The Owls made 8 of 10 field goals during the critical run before the Bears broke an 0-for-10 stretch of their own on a layup by Keith Palek II at the 12:03 mark to cut into a 63-43 deficit.

Kennesaw's lead would swell to 21 at the 9:26 mark on a three-point play by Simeon Cottle, but the visitors later embarked on a 17-2 run of their own and closed their deficit to 72-66 on a dunk by Cameron Boone with 4:30 remaining.

The Bears would make it a 75-69 game on a 3-pointer by Antwan Burnett – who made four triples on the night – but the Owls got 14 free throw attempts down the stretch and pulled away in the closing minutes.

Michael Osei-Bonsu racked up his third double-double of the year for MoState, scoring 20 points and 11 rebounds, while Palek was equal to the task with 17 points and 10 boards. The Bears also got 14 points from Kobi Williams and a dozen from Burnett off the bench.

The Bears out-rebounded the Owls by a 37-36 margin, compiling 19 offensive rebounds to account for 16 second-chance points. Likewise, MSU's 28 bench points was its second-highest total of the season.

Cottle led Kennesaw with 25 points, including at 15-of-16 at the foul line and a game-high 11 assists. The Owls also got 16 points from Trey Simpson.

The Bears finished 27-of-65 (.415) overall, 8-for-23 (.348) from distance and 18-of-31 (.581) at the stripe with 15 assists, including a team-high 5 from Palke.

Kennesaw finished 27-for-52 (.519) from the field, 11-of-27 (.407) from long range and 25-for-32 (.781) at the line with 19 assists, 18 turnovers and 10 blocks.

In the first half, Kennesaw State used a 10-0 run over a two-plus minute stretch to pull ahead and used that momentum to take a 42-37 lead at the intermission.

After Tyrique Brook's fast-break layup tied the game, 20-20, at the 9:42 mark, the Owls used four different players to reel off 10 unanswered points to lead 30-20 and force a Bears timeout with 7:40 left in the stanza.

KSU would lead by 10 twice more before the half, including a 35-25 lead at the four-minute mark. But the visitors used a 12-7 surge during the last segment to climb back into it with Kobi Williams scoring a three and a layup on the run.

The Bears shot 38.7 percent from the field in the first 20 minutes, but held a 20-17 rebounding edge and forced 8 turnovers. Kennesaw made 7 threes, including three from Trey Simpson who tallied 9 points early.

Missouri State 79, FIU 71

Missouri State got a game-high 22 points from Keith Palek III and 14 more from Zaxton King and Kobi Williams to help turn back visiting FIU, 79-71.

The Bears out-rebounded the Panthers by a 40-33 margin, including a game-high 11 caroms collected by sophomore Darrion Sutton. It marked the fourth time in five league games MSU had out-rebounded its opponent.

FIU got 18 points from Julian Mackey off the bench to lead five players in double figures, while Eric Dibami logged 10 points and a team-high 8 rebounds to go with 3 steals for the visitors.

After leading by five at the midway point, the Bears opened the second half with a quick 9-0 blitz in the first two minutes to force an FIU timeout. A pair of jump shots by Palek, a stick-back by Antwan Burnett and three free throws by Kobi Williams extend MSU's lead to 44-30, its largest of the game.

From there, the Bears seemed to have an answer for ever Panthers' run, usually from long range. Both of Trey Williams' second-half triples came at key points – first at 12:37 after FIU had closed the gap to eight, and later with 6:10 remaining after the Panthers had scratched their way back within 62-60.

In crunch time, it was King who delivered from downtown, burying a trey from the top of the key to extend a 71-67 advantage to seven with just under two minutes to go.

A minute later it was Sutton who elevated off a Kobi Williams miss and dunked it back to make it a 76-67 game with a minute to go. MoState was able to hold off the Panthers down the stretch and improved to 9-2 at Great Southern Bank Arena this season.

The Bears finished 25-of-53 (.472) from the field, 10-of-31 (.323) from 3-point range and 19-for-31 (.613) at the foul line with 18 assists and 18 second-chance points.

Trey Williams added 10 points for the home club, contributing 3 assists, 3 threes, and 2 steals to the winning cause.

FIU was 28-for-63 (.444) overall, 4-for-18 (.222) from distance and 11-of-19 (.579) at the stripe with 42 points in the paint, the second-most by a Bears opponent this season.

In the first half, the Bears held the Panthers to 35 percent shooting and used an early 15-0 run over a five-minute stretch to push ahead 17-6 by the under-12 media timeout. MoState's lead swelled to 19-7 on a second-chance bucket by Melakih Cunningham at the 11-minute mark before FIU ended a six-minute field goal draught and began chipping away.

Palek, who led all players with 10 first-half points, knocked down a 3-pointer at the five-minute mark to push MoState ahead 30-19 before the visitors ended the half on an 11-5 surge to make it a 35-30 game at the intermission.

Missouri State senior Keith Palek III scored a game-high 24 points to go with 5 rebounds and 5 assists, but it was not enough for the visiting Bears in an 87-72 loss to Western Kentucky.

The Bears attempted a season-high 35 three-point shots, but made just nine (25.7 percent) in their effort to cut into what was a double-figure deficit for most of the game's final 15 minutes.

Michael Osei-Bonsu added 13 points and 7 rebounds for the Bears, including 7-of-9 free throws.

WKU was led by Teagan Moore's 20 points, while Grant Newell scored 14, and LJ Hackman tallied 11.

After trailing by seven at the half, Missouri State closed the deficit to 43-40 on three quick field goals in the opening 90 seconds of the second period – two by Palek and one by Osei-Bonsu to force a Hilltoppers timeout. Palek's second bucket of the half made it a 43-40 game with 18:39 to play.

Later, Palek's traditional three-point play at the 16:12 mark drew the visitors within 50-44.

But WKU embarked on a decisive 11-2 run over the next three minutes to lead by 15, an advantage that swelled to as many 19 by the nine-minute mark.

MoState missed its first 10 three-point shots of the second half, but inched closer when it finally found its mark with Kobi Williams knocking down two, and Zaxton King hitting another to time WKU's advantage to 73-64 with just over six minutes remaining.

But Moore helped the home club finish things out, scoring 10 of his team-high 20 in the final five minutes.

For the game, the Bears were 24-of-57 (.421) from the field and 15-for-20 (.750) at the line with 30 rebounds 18 assists and 12 turnovers.

WKU finished 28-of-55 (.509) from the field, 7-for-16 (.438) from distance and 24-for-29 (.828) at the stripe with 34 caroms, 8 turnovers and 8 steals.

In the first half, a 10-0 WKU run late in the half broke up a 26-26 tie and pushed the Hilltoppers to a 41-34 lead at the intermission. Grant Newell scored 11 of his 14 first-half points in the last six minutes of the stanza to help ignite the run, including three triples.

The Bears got 7 points from Palek in the opening 20 minutes with MSU out-rebounding the Hilltoppers by an 18-15 margin in that stretch.

Kobi Williams' three-pointer from the left corner with 1:47 remaining in the first half drew the Bears within 38-32 at the time and pushed him to 1,000 career points.

Michael Osei-Bonsu and Keith Palek III scored 20 points apiece, while Kobi Williams added 19 for the visiting Bears, but Middle Tennessee scored seven points in the final two minutes of the second overtime to secure a 90-87 victory.

MoState had the ball at the end of regulation with a chance to win it, but Osei-Bonsu's rim-runner at the buzzer bounced out to force overtime. At the end of the first overtime, Palek's second three of the game knotted things up at 78 and ultimately pushed the game into the second overtime.

After Antwan Burnett's triple drew Missouri State within 88-87 with a minute to go in the second overtime, MSU forced a Middle Tennessee shot clock violation with 28 seconds remaining. Playing for the win again, the Bears turned to Palek whose mid-range jumper rimmed out, and he committed a foul trying to corral the miss. MTSU's Jahvin Carter subsequently made two free throws with eight seconds on the clock to put the Blue Raiders up by three. On their final possession of the game, the Bears got the ball in the hands of Trey Williams Jr. whose desperation three was off target to end the crazy back-and-forth battle.

The game included 12 ties and a dozen lead changes.

Missouri State finished the game 30-of-69 (.435) from the field, but outscored MTSU 32-30 in the second half while allowing the home club just eight field goals in the final 20 minutes of regulation. The Bears were also 11-for-25 (.440) and 16-for-26 (.615) at the line with 33 rebounds 16 assists and 10 steals.

Palek's 7 assists led all players, while his 8 rebounds was tops for MSU.

Middle Tennessee was 29-for-55 (.527) overall, including 63.6 percent in overtime. The home squad was 14-for-28 (.500) from beyond the arc and 18-of-23 (.783) at the line with 36 rebounds, 18 turnovers and 10 blocks.

The Blue Raiders, who took over sole possession of second place in CUSA, were 5-of-5 at the stripe in overtime and were led by Torey Alston's game-high 22 points with Kamari Lands scoring 21.

In the first half, Kobi Williams hit a pair of clutch threes, and Keith Palek had a timely steal, layup and free throw with less than a second to go in the period to draw the visitors within 38-36 at the intermission.

Cameron Boone eclipsed his career high with 7 first-half points, while Michael Osei-Bonsu was 4-of-7 from the field for 8 points.

Williams' first three knotted the score, 24-24, at the 9:07 mark before giving the Bears the lead on the very next possession with a short jumper. Later, his three ball ended a 12-4 MTSU run and pulled the visitors within 36-33 with less than two minutes to go before the break.

MTSU shot 61 percent from the field in the first half and made 7 threes while dishing out 10 assists.

Missouri State 84, New Mexico State 75**

Missouri State's Keith Palek scored 26 points and made 12-of-14 free throws to help lift the visiting Bears past New Mexico State, 84-75.

The Bears also got 21 points and a game-high 9 rebounds from Michael Osei-Bonsu, while Kobi Williams pitched in 13 points in the winning cause.

With the victory, MSU secured the season sweep over the Aggies and picked up its second CUSA road win of the campaign.

With the game tied, 64-64, with less than seven minutes to play, Tyrique Brooks began the Missouri State march to victory, converting a traditional three-point play to push the visitors up by three. Kobi Williams gave the Bears a six-point lead with his third triple of the game at the five-minute mark, and then Palek helped break the Aggies' backs with his second three of the game to make it 74-66 with just under four minutes to go.

A minute later, Antwan Burnett pushed the Bears ahead by double figures with a clutch three to make it 77-67. Down the stretch, Burnett converted a key layup, and Palek teamed up with Trey Williams Jr. to make 5-of-6 charity shots in the final two minutes to secure the win.

After trailing by as many as six in the second half, Missouri State outscored New Mexico State, 20-11, in the game's final six-and-a-half minutes of the game.

Palek finished 6-for-11 from the field with 6 rebounds and 3 assists in securing his fourth straight 20-point game and 10th of the season. Osei-Bonsu's 20-point effort was his sixth of the season and third in a five-game stretch.

For the game, the Bears finished 27-of-53 (.509) from the field, 8-of-23 (.348) from three and an impressive 22-of-27 (.815) at the line with a 41-27 rebounding advantage, 12 assists and 11 turnovers. It was MoState's fourth game of the season shooting better than 50 percent from the field but first on the road.

NMSU finished 27-of-62 (.435) overall from the field, 6-of-23 (.261) from three and 15-for-20 (.750) at the line with 10 assists and just 5 turnovers.

In the first half, the Bears sprinted out to a 23-6 lead in the opening 12 minutes and held that 17-point advantage after a Palek leaner off the glass with 6:23 left in the opening stanza made it 27-10.

But NMSU's Jemel Jones then took the momentum back for the home side, reeling off 12 of his team's points in a 14-0 Aggies run over the five minutes that whittled the Bears' lead to three. Jones racked up 17 points in the first half and finished with a game-high 28 points.

Osei-Bonsu and Palek got the Bears back on track in the final 90 seconds with three points apiece in that span, but Jones' 3-pointer just before the intermission made it a 33-31 game at the break.

Michael Osei-Bonsu scored 17 points, including a clutch layup with 12.3 seconds remaining to help secure a 62-57 Missouri State road win over UTEP.

Kobi Williams also logged a game-high 21 points to help the Bears behind four 3-pointers and 5-for-5 free throw attempts.

With the win, the Bears improved to 3-3 in CUSA road games to go with their 3-0 home record in league play.

The Bears trailed UTEP by as many as 11 in the first half and fell behind 31-21 at the intermission, but outscored the Miners 41-26 in the second half, holding the home club to just 28.6 percent shooting from the field over the last 20 minutes.

Elijah Jones' two free throws with 42 seconds remaining drew UTEP within 58-57, but Osei-Bonsu was up to the task, getting a close-range bucket to save the day with just over 12 seconds to go.

The Bears finished 20-for-45 (.444) from the field, 5-for-18 (.278) from long range, and 17-for-23 (.739) at the line with a 36-26 rebounding advantage, 10 assists and 15 turnovers.

UTEP was led by Jones' 16 points. They made 19-of-50 field goals attempts (.380), 8-for-19 (.421) from distance – including four by Jones. The Miners were also 11-of-15 (.733) at the line with 12 assists and 8 steals.

After a 3-pointer by Missouri State's Keith Palek III drew the Bears within 65-64 with 5:36 to play, visiting Sam Houston outscored the home club 15-7 down the stretch to escape Great Southern Bank Arena with an 80-71 victory.

Jacob Walker led four Bearkats in double figures with 16 points – including 10 in the final seven minutes – while Veljko Ilic scored 14 for the visitors.

Missouri State, which had reeled off six straight home victories coming into the game, was able to convert just two of its last seven field goal attempts in the final five-and-a-half minutes to let the visitors off the hook.

MSU's Michael Osei-Bonsu led all players with 22 points, converting 8-of-14 field goal attempts and 6-of-7 at the line, while Palek registered 17 points and 7 rebounds while eclipsing 1,500 career points.

The Bears were without the services of starting guard Kobi Williams who is listed as day-to-day with a shoulder injury.

After trailing 38-33 at the half, the Bears drew within one possession of the lead 14 times in the second half but were never able to push ahead. Darrion Sutton's alley-oop dunk on a great lob from Trey Williams Jr. with 8:40 to go seemed to ignite the home crowd and made it a 59-56 game at the time. Damon Nicholas Jr. answered with a close-range bucket for the Bearkats moments later.

After the under-eight media timeout, Palek buried a long corner jumper that was ruled a two-pointer, Osei-Bonsu converted a traditional three-point play, and Palek's second triple of the night sandwiched a pair of Walker free throws to make it a one-point game and force a Sam Houston timeout at the 5:27 mark.

The Bearkats responded with a 9-0 surge over the next three minutes to extend their advantage to double figures for the first time and never looked back.

Zaxton King's 3-pointer in the final minute shrunk the final deficit to single digits.

At 6-4 at the midway point in the conference season, the Bears are a half-game out of second place in the 12-team league.

Missouri State finished 27-of-56 (.482) from the field, 6-for-15 (.400) from long range and 11-of-18 (.611) from the free throw line with 12 assists and 10 steals.

In his return to the starting lineup, MSU's Antwan Burnett posted 6 points, a game-high 9 rebounds, 4 assists and 3 steals in 30 minutes.

Sam Houston was 31-for-57 (.544) overall, 4-of-13 (.308) from bonus distance and 14-for-19 (.737) at the foul line with 35 rebounds, 50 points in the paint and 16 fast-break points. The Bearkats committed 14 turnovers.

In the first half, the Bears shot 54 percent from the field and registered 24 points in the paint, but the Bearkats rang up 17 rebounds and shot 59 percent themselves to take a 38-33 advantage into the locker room. Osei-Bonsu posted 13 points for Missouri State, including five in the final three minutes of the half to help erase an early 33-24 Sam Houston advantage.

Missouri State 74, Jacksonville State 67

All five Missouri State starters scored in double figures, including five points by Antwan Burnett in the game's last two minutes, to push the Bears past visiting Jacksonville State, 74-67, in Conference USA play.

Keith Palek III led all players with 18 points and 6 assists for MSU, while Trey Williams Jr. added 14 points, Kobi Williams tallied 13, Burnett scored 11, and Michael Osei-Bonsu racked up 10 and a game-high 9 rebounds.

The Bears led for almost 37 minutes, but saw their advantage dwindle to one point late in the game on a pair of free throws by Jax State's Mostapha El Moutaouakkil with just over two minutes to go. His second shot made it a 65-64 contest, but Burnett stepped up for the home side, scoring a three-point play moments later to extend the Bears' lead to four.

After a turnover by the Gamecocks on their next possession, Kobi Williams drained a clutch three from the corner to stretch the Bears' lead to 71-64 with 53 seconds to play.

Burnett then helped put the game on ice with a layup on MSU's next trip down the floor. His fourth bucket of the game made it 73-64 with 22 seconds to go, helping the Bears pick up their 10th home victory of the season and improve to 8-1 in day contests.

Jax State was led by Jacoby Hill's 16 points, while Iaroslav Niagu contributed 13, and El Moutaouakkil snagged 9 rebounds.

The Bears shot 46.6 percent from the field on 27-of-58 field goal attempts, including 8-for-24 (.333) from long range. The home side also finished 12-for-21 (.571) at the foul line with 28 rebounds, 32 points in the paint and 15 second-chance points from 12 offensive boards.

Darrion Sutton posted 4 points and a pair of blocks off the bench, while Logan Epes also helped pace MSU's reserves with a pair of steals in a key stretch late in the first half.

Jax State was 22-of-54 (.407) overall from the field, 2-for-14 (.143) from distance and 21-of-27 (.778) at the line with 38 rebounds and 18 turnovers that led to 21 Missouri State points.

In the first half, the Bears used a 7-0 run before the first media timeout to gain a 7-4 advantage and never trailed again the rest of the afternoon. Later, a three by Williams Jr. and a pair of free throws from Palek pushed the Bears ahead by double-figures for the first time, 37-27, at the 1:35 mark.

A buzzer beater before the intermission by Kobi Williams, after an athletic rebound on the floor by Burnett, gave the Bears a 39-31 edge at the break. MoState earned 12 second-chance points off 9 offensive caroms in the opening 20 minutes.

Missouri State trailed by 20 points with 12 minutes remaining before mounting a furious comeback down the stretch and draw within two points of the lead in the final minute before succumbing to CUSA leader Liberty, 79-76.

The Bears got a game-high 25 points from Keith Palek, including three triples, to go with 9 rebounds. MSU also got 16 points and 9 boards from Michael Osei-Bonsu and 11 points from Kobi Williams.

Brett Decker paced four Liberty players in double figures with 20 points, while Zach Cleveland produced a triple-double with 19 points, 10 rebounds and 11 assists to become the first MSU foe since 2018 (Ja Morant) to achieve that rare feat.

Cleveland's dunk at the 12-minute mark of the second half gave the Flames a 66-46 lead at the time, their largest of the afternoon, but Missouri State would surrender just one field goal the rest of the game. The Bears' offense then began chipping away with Melakih Cunningham coming off the bench to tally six of MSU's next eight points and inch the visitors within 14 over the next five minutes.

A three by LU's Ryan Jones Jr. extended the Flames' advantage to 17 with 6:15 to play but Missouri State then embarked on a quick 9-0 outburst with Osei-Bonsu logging 5 points and Palek 4 in a three-minute stretch that made it 71-63.

Coming out of the final media timeout of the game, Colin Porter made two free throws for the home side before Palek responded with a long three for the Bears to make it a seven-point game. Before the minute mark, Palek knocked down another triple, and Osei-Bonsu made a pair of charity shots to close the gap to 75-71.

In the final 20 seconds, Palek made two more free throws to make it a two-point game before MSU was whistled for a foul with 10.8 ticks showing. Liberty's Porter made one-of-two to keep it a one-possession contest, but the Bears turned the ball over near mid-court moments later and had to foul again at the seven-second mark. With a fresh chance, Porter made both free throws to make it 78-73, before the Bears pushed it up the floor to Tyrique Brooks who answered the call with a clutch try to once again make it a two-point game at the 1.4-second mark.

Porter was sent back to the line, where he made one of two, and the visitors called a timeout to set up a potential game-tying play. The ball wound up in the hands of Kobi Williams beyond the top of the key, and his turn-around desperation shot sailed off target to dash Missouri State's hopes of forcing overtime.

The Bears outscored Liberty 30-13 in the game's final dozen minutes.

Early in the second half, it took MoState just over a minute into the period to erase a four-point halftime deficit with Kobi Williams and Osei-Bonsu scoring early to make it a 42-42 game at the 18:58 mark. But the Flames caught fire from beyond the arc over the next three minutes, ringing up four triples in that span as part of a 16-0 surge to take a 58-42 lead with 16 minutes to go.

In the first half, Liberty shot 65.4 percent from the field and needed a buzzer-beater from Cleveland to lead 42-38 at the intermission.

There were just six ties and four lead changes, but it would have been hard to imagine a closer contest as visiting Louisiana Tech edged Missouri State, 79-78, in double-overtime in a Conference USA thriller.

The Bears got a game-high 24 points from Kobi Williams behind six 3-pointers, with Michael Osei-Bonsu producing his fourth double-double of the season on 22 points and 13 rebounds. Keith Palek III also contributed 18 points for MSU.

The Bears had opportunities to finish off the visitors, leading by five with under three minutes to play in regulation; pushing ahead by five again with less than two minutes left in the first overtime; and having the ball on the game's final possession in the second overtime shooting for the win. Unfortunately, the Bulldogs had an answer at every turn.

AJ Bates' runner with 0.8 seconds left in regulation capped a 6-1 run by LA Tech to force extra time. Osei-Bonsu scored MSU's first five points in overtime before Palek's layup made it 75-70 on a layup with 1:59 remaining. Scotter Williams Jr. then led LTU back in the fray with five of his team's points in the extra period, including a layup with 22.9 seconds to go.

In the second overtime, DJ Dudley knocked down a pair of mid-range jumpers to push LA Tech up by four before Kobi Williams' clutch three with 42 seconds left drew Missouri State within one. Darrion Sutton then stood out on the defensive end for the Bears with a block and rebound that gave the home side a chance.

Coming out of their last timeout with 10.7 seconds to go in the second OT, the Bears turned to Osei-Bonsu who backed down his defender before drawing a triple team and pitching the ball to Palek whose jumper missed. Trey Williams Jr. gathered in the offensive board for Missouri State, but his shot before the buzzer also missed to end the two-and-a-half hour battle.

Trey Williams' late rebound was the 20th offensive carom of the night for MSU, a milestone it had not reached since the season opener against Missouri Southern.

Thomas scored 11 of his 19 points in the second half for the Bulldogs, but was shut out in overtime, while Cooper wrangled in 13 boards for the visitors to complete a double-double off the bench.

Missouri State trailed by as many as eight in the second half before starting their comeback climb just before the under-12 media timeout. A long two-pointer from Antwan Burnett started an 11-1 surge over a four-and-a-half minute stretch with Palek's jumper off the glass giving the Bears a 61-58 lead at the under-eight.

But down the stretch, the Bears converted just 2-of-7 field goals and a key video review went Louisiana Tech's way with 20 seconds left in regulation to further hinder Missouri State's victory plans.

Kobi Williams scored a game-high 25 points and buried five 3-pointers as one of four Missouri State starters in double figures, but the Bears could not overcome a hot-shooting Delaware team in a 76-67 home defeat.

The Blue Hens picked up their third straight Conference USA victory behind 23 points from Justyn Fernandez and 21 from Tyler Houser. Delaware also shot 53 percent from the field, and 94 percent from the free throw line in their first-ever visit to Great Southern Bank Arena.

The Bears trailed by 10 at the half before Delaware extended that lead to 14 early in the second period with back-to-back scores by Macon Emory. Missouri State responded with a quick 8-0 burst with Michael Osei-Bonsu and Trey Williams Jr. scoring four points apiece to make it a 42-36 game heading into the under-16 media timeout.

Missouri State dominated the next six minutes with Trey knocking down another triple, Keith Palek III finding his groove with a couple of jumpers, and Darrion Sutton converting a close-range bucket. Palek's lone three of the ball game came at the 10:25 mark and drew the Bears within 51-50 of the lead.

Less than a minute later, Zaxton King went to the line with a chance to tie the game or give MSU the lead. However, the career 78-percent free throw shooter missed both shots, and the Blue Hens capitalized with a 13-3 run over the next six minutes. Just after the under-four minute break, Delaware's lead swelled to 64-53, and possessions became even more valuable for the home squad.

UD's 11-point advantage held until the 2:17 mark when the Bears began chipping away. Kobi Williams made a couple free throws and a 3-pointer to trim the deficit to five with 1:23 to play. Delaware missed its only free throw of the afternoon on its next possession, which opened the door for MSU again. The Bears went to Kobi Williams again in the right corner, but the sharp shooter hit the deck after the shot and when no whistle came, the Blue Hens scored on a run-out layup to push ahead 70-62.

A Trey Williams three and Osei-Bonsu stick-back in the final minute both got the Bears back within five, but Fernandez sealed it for the visitors with four straight free throws in the last 30 seconds.

Trey Williams (13), Palek (11) and Osei-Bonsu (10) joined Kobi Williams in double figures for the maroon side with Trey knocking down four 3-pointers to go with 4 assists and 3 steals in a valiant 34-minute effort.

Delaware had just 3 offensive rebounds on the day, no second-chance points and no bench points.

In the first half, Kobi Williams' second triple of the game pulled the Bears within 23-21 with 7:19 to go. The Blue Hens then embarked on a 12-2 surge before the intermission to lead by as many as 12. Sutton's layup at the five-minute mark was the only bright spot in that stretch for the home side as the Bears ended the half on a 1-for-10 shooting slump to trail 35-25 at the break.

Later, it was freshman Melakih Cunningham who gave the Bears a spark off the bench with a 3-pointer and dunk before Darrion Sutton's layup on a pass from Keith Palek III made it 61-57 at the under-12 timeout.

Just before the eight-minute break, Cunningham's second three of the night made it a 66-65 game with the Great Southern Bank Arena gathering sensing a Bears comeback in the making.

Finally with 2:16 to play, it was fellow MSU freshman Trey Williams Jr. who got the Bears over the hump with his fifth triple of the game to give the home club an 83-82 edge. Johnson then buried a three for Kennesaw State to push the visitors ahead by two before free throws from Osei-Bonsu and Kobi Williams tied the game up again, 85-85, with 1:30 to go.

Johnson and Frankquon Sherman then did just enough for the Owls to steal the victory. The Kennesaw tandem combined to make 4-of-6 free throws in the final 80 seconds with Johnson hitting a key jumper with 40 seconds remaining.

Trey Williams kept Missouri State's hopes alive with a spinning jumper with just over 10 seconds showing on the clock to return it to a one-possession contest, but Johnson's final charity shot of the night put the game on ice.

Both Palek and Osei-Bonsu led Missouri State with 20 points apiece, with Palek contributing 6 rebounds, 7 assists and a pair of steals. Trey Williams added a career-high 19 for the Bears to go with 3 assists and no turnovers, and Kobi Williams scored 13. Cunningham also scored a career-high with 1 points and 5 rebounds.

The Bears registered 30 points in the paint and used a 55-percent shooting effort in the second half.

Home standing FIU made just four 3-pointers all day, but with the game on the line, Corey Stephenson's triple from the left wing with 3.5 seconds left decided Missouri State's fate in a 70-67 Conference USA setback.

The Bears had just tied the game moments earlier on a pair of clutch free throws from Keith Palek III that drew the visitors even, 67-67, after trailing by nine earlier in the half.

Kobi Williams, who tallied a game-high 25 points, knocked down two of his four threes in the last three minutes of the game to help the maroon side keep pace. He launched MSU's desperation 3-point attempt at the buzzer that drew iron but rimmed out.

The Bears also got 12 points from Trey Williams Jr. who helped MSU cut a six-point deficit in half with his three with 1:25 remaining, while Michael Osei-Bonsu posted a game-high 12 boards.

For its part, FIU made six of its last seven field goal attempts over the game's final five minutes -- all jumpers -- including three buckets from Julian Mackey who led the Panthers with 22 points.

The Bears committed just three turnovers in the second half and shot 50 percent from the field over the final 20 minutes after a slow start. Likewise, Missouri State was 7-of-14 from three down the stretch and converted 10-of-13 free throws in the second stanza.

The visiting squad out-rebounded FIU by a 38-30 margin with 13 offensive boards contributing to 10 second-chance points. MSU also collected 9 of its 14 bench points from Zaxton King who was 3-for-5 from the field off the pine.

Missouri State, which dropped its fifth straight, finished 22-of-56 (.393) overall from the field, 9-for-24 (.375) from long range and 14-for-21 (.667) at the stripe with 15 assists, including 4 from Palek.

FIU was 25-of-53 (.472) overall, 4-for-15 (.267) from downtown, and 16-of-24 (.667) from the line with 12 assists and 9 turnovers.

Stephenson finished with 17 points as one of four Panthers in double figures.

In the first half, the Bears committed 11 turnovers and could not find their rhythm on the offensive end to trail 29-22. Kobi Williams logged 14 points in the opening stanza, including a rare four-point play that cut an eight-point deficit in half at the 5:44 mark.

FIU led by as many as nine in the first period, using a 7-1 run in the final three minutes to log their biggest lead. Kobi Williams' two free throws in the final seven seconds made it a seven-point game at the break, despite MSU shooting just 28.6 percent in the half.


