Monmouth enters into the Sacred Heart game looking to avoid starting the season 0-5 for the second time in school history.

Monmouth is looking for its first win after facing No. 12 Delaware on the road last weekend. The Blue Hens downed the Hawks 42-7, scoring all of their points in the first half in front of 21,400 fans. Delaware's No. 12 ranking marked the highest ranked team MU has ever faced.

Before facing the Blue Hens, Monmouth had loss each of its games by seven points or less, including a three point last-minute loss to Robert Morris at home. David Sinisi's consecutive touchdown streak sits at 16 straight games, as he continues to be an important part of the Hawk offense. Defensively Monmouth is led by middle linebacker Matt Sterner who has 31 tackles.

Sacred Heart comes into today's game with a 2-3 record after losing their NEC opener to Wagner last weekend. The Pioneers are on a three game slide after starting the season with a pair of wins.

THE COACHING MATCHUP...

KEVIN CALLAHAN is in his 15th season at Monmouth as the Hawks' head coach. Callahan owns an 85-58 career coaching record, all with Monmouth. The only coach in Monmouth history has led the Blue & White to five Northeast Conference championships, in 1996, 1998, 2003, 2004 and 2006. He earned NEC Coach of the Year accolades in 1998, 2003 and 2006. Prior to arriving in West Long Branch, Callahan served as a defensive coordinator at Colgate for eight seasons and at Wagner for three years. He began his coaching career as an assistant coach at Albany (1977-79) and Syracuse (1980) before becoming a Seahawk assistant in 1981.

Sacred Heart is led by fourth year head coach **PAUL GORHAM**. After three seasons he owns an overall record of 14-22 and a Northeast Conference mark of 7-15. Gorham came to the Pioneers after spending five seasons as the recruiting coordinator and wide receivers coach at the University of Massachusetts, where he helped lead the program to a 10-3 record and a trip to the NCAA Division I-AA Playoffs in 2003. Before coaching at UMass, Gorham spent five seasons at Brown, serving as offensive coordinator. While serving as O-coordinator with the Bears, Gorham helped produce three first-team All-Ivy League offensive lineman. Before arriving at Brown, he spent six seasons at the University of New Haven as the recruiting coordinator and offensive line coach. Gorham is a 1984 graduate of the University of New Hampshire where he was an All-Yankee Conference tight end in 1983 for the Wildcats.

INSIDE THE MU-SACRED HEART SERIES...

Monmouth owns an 8-4 series advantage against the Pioneers. Last season the Hawks earned their first shutout of the year, blanking SHU 28-0 in West Long Branch. The Hawks scored 24 points in the first half, with Dave Sinisi carrying the ball 18 times for 85 yards. Boland had 118 yards and a TD pass to Shane Sharpley, while current MU QB Brett Burke was four-of-six for 35 yards. MU has won four straight meetings, but the Pioneers took three in a row from 2000 to 2002. The two teams first played on Sept. 25, 1993, with the Pioneers defeating the Hawks 12-0 at Kessler Field.

SINISI TALLIES 16th STRAIGHT SCORE ...

Monmouth University running back David Sinisi extended his current consecutive games with a touchdown streak to 16 after scoring on a eight yard run against Delaware. Sinisi, who is a redshirt sophomore, scored in every game last season, finishing with 14 total touchdowns. The first time he touched the ball in his college career he took a screen pass against Fordham for 71 yards and a touchdown. Sinisi was the only player in the FCS to score in every game in 2006, earning him NEC Offensive Rookie of the Year and ECAC Rookie of the Year.

SACRED HEART SCOUTING REPORT

Overall: The Pioneers come into today's game with a 2-3 record after dropping three straight, including their NEC opener against Wagner last weekend. Sacred Heart opened up the season with two wins, putting up a combined 95 points against Division II Assumption College and MAAC opponent La Salle.

Offense: The Sacred Heart offense ranks second in the Northeast Conference in total yards and scoring, averaging 368.4 yards and 28.6 points per game. The Pioneers are a very balanced team as they rank second in passing with 211.2 yards per game and are tied for second with 157.2 rushing yards per game. Their offense is led by redshirt freshman Dale Fink, who has completed 67.9 % of his passes on the season for 677 yards with 10 touchdowns and only two interceptions. His 173.9 passer efficiency rating ranks him fourth in the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS). His favorite target is receiver Steve Tedesco, who has 24 catches for 300 yards and three touchdowns. The Pioneers employ a running back - by - committee approach to running the football as six different players have carried the ball 10+ times on the season, with Evin Jones leading the way with 66 carries for 296 yards and three touchdowns. Jason has only 44 carries, but has comparable yards to Jones with 295 yards and four scores, leading the team with a 6.7 yards per carry average. The Pioneers rank first in the NEC in third down offense, as they convert 51.5 % of their third down chances.

Defense: The Sacred Heart defense ranks third in the NEC in yards allowed and points given up, as they surrender 324.6 yards and 23.2 points per game. They rank sixth in the seven-team league in pass defense, giving up 217.4 yards per game, but lead the NEC and rank 23rd in the FCS allowing only 107.2 yards on the ground per game. They have also recovered five fumbles, tied for second in the conference, but are tied for last in the league with only two interceptions. They are led defensively by Josh Wilson who leads the team, and ranks sixth in the NEC, with 43 tackles, including 21 solo tackles. They have 30 tackles for loss as a team, but only seven sacks, tied for last in the league. The Pioneers play team defense, as evidenced by the stat that seven players have at least two tackles for loss on the season. Rich Marrone is second on the team with 29 tackles, and Chansler Davis leads the team with 3.5 tackles for loss on the season.

Special Teams: The Pioneers rank first in the NEC and second in nation in punt returns, averaging 22.5 yards per punt return. John Wilson has returned four punts for 64 yards and a touchdown and Tedesco has brought back two punts for 71 yards. Conversely, they are last in the league and 111th in kickoff returns, averaging only 15.3 yards per kickoff return. The average 33.4 yards per punt and have struggled in the kicking game, as placekicker Joe Schroeder has gone only 2-for-5 on field goals this year. However, Sacred Heart has blocked two kicks on the year already.

MONMOUTH AGAINST THE NEC...

Today's game marks the second Northeast Conference contest of the year for MU. Monmouth owns a 46-29 (.613) record all-time against current members of the NEC. While a member of the NEC, the past 11 seasons, the Hawks own a 45-26 record. MU owns an 8-4 record against Sacred Heart, with Albany (4-5) and Robert Morris (6-7) being the only NEC team that the Hawks have a losing record against. Monmouth's best winning percentage comes against St. Francis (Pa.), whom the Hawks are 12-2 all-time against. Last season MU finished 6-1 in conference play. Head Coach Kevin Callahan has led the Hawks to a record-tying five Northeast Conference Championships, earning Co-Champion honors in 1996, 1998, 2003 and 2004 while taking winning the outright championship in 2006. Monmouth has never gone undefeated in the conference but has suffered just one loss in each of the those championship seasons.

KILEY SNAGS CAREER-HIGH EIGHT PASSES ...

MU redshirt senior Chris Kiley grabbed a career-high eight passes against Delaware. The Pt. Pleasant, N.J., native is second on the team in catches and yards, with 14 receptions for 114 yards. Kiley's eight catches for 43 yards against the Blue Hens led the Hawks, and his eight grabs is the most by any MU player in 2007.

Head Coach Callahan On ...

Playing Three Straight Road Games:

"Playing three consecutive road games is difficult on the players, the support personnel, as well as on the coaching staff. It is important however, that we do not get caught up in that. We have a very big game this weekend and we cannot worry about where it is being played."

THE BUTLER DID IT ...

Troy Butler logged his first career sacks against Delaware this past Saturday. The defensive lineman from Pennsauken, N.J. had two quarterback takedowns against the Blue Hens. On the season, the junior has three tackles in three games played, but leads the squad with those two sacks.

BURKE'S RIGHT ON TARGET ...

Monmouth quarterback Brett Burke has been very accurate in his first four games as the team's starting signal caller this season. Burke, who is fifth in the Northeast Conference in passing with 164 yards per game, ranks second in the league completing 61.3 % of his passes. Burke places third in the league in pass attempts with 119 and second in completions with 73, one behind Robert Morris quarterback Erik Cwalinski for the NEC lead at 74. In MU's last game, Burke completed 18-of-25 passes for 132 yards against nationally ranked #12 Delaware.

SINISI AMONG LEAGUE'S BEST ...

Redshirt sophomore running back David Sinisi again ranks among the leaders in the Northeast Conference in rushing, one year after being named NEC Offensive Rookie of the Year. Sinisi ranks second in the conference in rushing yards with 371 yards on 75 carries, good enough for a 4.9 yards per carry average and 92.8 yards per game. His five rushing touchdowns lead the conference and have him tied for most scores in the league. The Cedar Grove, N.J. native is also third in the NEC in all-purpose yards, averaging 128.8 yards from scrimmage per game. He ranks third on the team with 12 catches for 111 yards.

MATCHUP OF FORMER MID-MAJOR NATIONAL CHAMPIONS ...

This Saturday's game between Monmouth and Sacred Heart will feature two former Football Championship Subdivision Mid-Major National Champions, with the Hawks winning the crown in 2004 and the Pioneers in 2001. Monmouth went 10-1 the year they claimed the title, including a 6-1 mark in Northeast Conference play. The Pioneers went 11-0 in 2001 and defeated Duquesne 31-15 in the ECAC Classic to win their championship. That remains Sacred Heart's lone NEC title as well since entering the league back in 1998.

STOLARZ HAS CAREER DAY ...

Monmouth redshirt freshman safety Jon Stolarz led all defenders in the Delaware game with 10 tackles. The Andover, N.J., native had six solo tackles and recorded his first tackle-for-a-loss, dropping running back Omar Cuff for a three yard loss in the second quarter. Stolarz is second on the Hawks in tackles with 28 tackles, 13 of which are solo.

MU DEFENSIVE HIGHLIGHTS ...

Freshman Garrett Culloo recorded his first sack in his first game, dropping Delaware QB Sean Scanlon for a 12 yard loss, while tallying a forced fumble as well. Dereak Bischoff and Tom Larkin each had a fumble recovery. Monmouth had 10 total tackles-for-a-loss against the Blue Hens.

FALAE SECOND IN BREAK-UPS ...

Monmouth redshirt senior defensive back Ayo Falae is second in the NEC in pass breakups, batting away five passes in four games. His sixth breakup was an INT.

BACK TO BACK 100 YARD GAMES ...

Running back David Sinisi's 24 rushes for 115 yards against Stony Brook marked the first time in the redshirt sophomore's career that he has had back-to-back 100-yard rushing games. Sinisi had 120 yards on the ground in the Robert Morris game. His 24 rushing attempts were a career-high, eclipsing his old mark of 23 carries in one game (Wagner 10/14/2007).

ON THE HORIZON ...

After today's NEC game against Sacred Heart, the Hawks will return home for the first time in a month to host rival Wagner. The game against the Seahawks will be Monmouth's Homecoming. A second bye week follows, with the Blue & White facing two more NEC teams on the road in Central Connecticut St. and St. Francis (Pa.).

CATCH MU COACH CALLAHAN ON THE RADIO ...

Monmouth football coach Kevin Callahan will appear on The Shore Sports Network's AutoLenders High School Football Show every Thursday night in the fall. The two-hour show is co-hosted by six-time NJ Sports Broadcaster of the Year Kevin Williams, former Brick Memorial coach Ed Sarluca, Monmouth football alum and current MU adjunct professor Matt Harmon, the Asbury Park Press' Steve Falk and Shore Conference Sports.com's Scott Stump. Last week Monmouth's head coach traveled to Val's Tavern in Rumson to conduct the segment live, a photo gallery of the event is available at www.GoMUHawks.com. Local fans can hear the program every Thursday until late November on 1160 AM in Ocean County and 1310 AM in Monmouth County from 6 p.m. to 8 p.m.

♣ Monmouth led in time of possession for the second time this year, edging the Blue Hens 31:22 to 28:28.

♣ Dave Sinisi carried the ball 21 times for 69 yards, snapping his streak of back-to-back 100 yard games. In four games Sinisi has carried the ball more than 20 times in two games, a feat he did only three times in 12 games in 2006.

♣ Delaware entered into the game ranked 12th in the country, the highest ranked opponent that MU has ever faced.

♣ The 42 points against Delaware was the most surrendered by a MU defense since the 2005 season when Monmouth lost a 56-26 game to No. 14 Lehigh to start the season.

♣ True freshman Troy Yudin had career-highs in catches and yards against Delaware, finishing with four grabs for 40 yards.

♣ Sophomore running back Ryan Skorupka got his first carries of the season, running the ball five times for 15 yards.

HOME SWEET HOME...

Monmouth dropped its first home game of the season on Sept. 8, 2007 against Robert Morris. Traditionally, MU has been hard to beat at home, going 18-4 over the last four seasons at Kessler. Monmouth equaled a school-record with five wins at Kessler Field in 2004, logging a 5-1 mark on the year. RECYCLED FOOTBALL NOTES

HAWKS IN THE PROS ...

Monmouth currently has three players playing in the pros, former wide outs Miles Austin and Will Holder and defensive back Matt Hill. Austin was recently named to the Dallas Cowboys' 53 man roster, the second season in which he has made it. Austin is listed fifth on the depth chart but he made his mark on special teams, returning a kickoff for a touchdown in Dallas' playoff loss to Seattle. Holder is a five year veteran of the Arena Football League with the New York Dragons. In his career on Long Island he has amassed 54 touchdowns and has over 2,000 yards receiving while spending time at defensive back. Hill is the most recent of the three, signing on late with the AF2's Albany Conquest. Playing in the final two games, Hill recorded 10.5 tackles, one interception and two pass breakups.

SAN MIGUEL SETS RECORD ...

He only needed four going into the game but he came out with seven. Monmouth fifth-year senior wide receiver Adam San Miguel needed just four catches going into the Robert Morris game to set the record for most career catches as a Hawk, which he did in the second quarter. Current Dallas Cowboy Miles Austin had held the record at 150 catches, but after his seven-reception performance on Saturday San Miguel now owns the record at 154.

MONMOUTH ANNOUNCES 2007 CAPTAINS...

For the defense, seniors Ayo Falae and T.J. Cerezo were chosen while fifth-year seniors Jonathan Dunn and Adam San Miguel will serve as captains for the offense. Members of the team voted for the captains.

Falae and Cerezo are the only two returning starters from one of the nation's most dominant defenses of a year ago. Falae is slated to start for the second straight year at cornerback, where he recorded 48 tackles, a pass break up, an interception and a blocked kick. Cerezo, an outside linebacker, started in all 12 games last season for Monmouth, recording 32 tackles and a fumble recovery. The two players have a combined 42 games of playing experience, with 24 starts between them.

San Miguel returns as one of the conference's top receivers, one year after earning First Team All-NEC honors. The First Team All-League selection led the league in receptions (setting a new MU record) and receiving yards, while also tying the school record for punt return yardage in a season. Dunn, who returns for a fifth-year, will anchor an offensive line that lost just two starters from last year's NEC Championship squad. Dunn has 20 starts under his belt and 30 total games played for the Blue & White. The fifth year senior earned Football Gazette First Team All-Offense and First Team All-NEC honors after the Hawks allowed just 13 sacks in 12 games last season.

MU LANDS SEVEN ON PRESEASON ALL-NEC TEAM...

Monmouth garnered five of the 11 offensive slots, with NEC Offensive Rookie of the Year David Sinisi earning a nod at one of the two running back spots. Sinisi was the only player in the Football Championship Subdivision (formally I-AA) to score in every contest last year while racking up almost 1,000 total yards from scrimmage. Fifth-year senior wideout Adam San Miguel also made the list, one season after setting the MU record for receptions in a season.

Tight end John Nalbhone earns his first preseason honor after being named to the Second Team All-NEC in both of his first two seasons. Nalbhone already owns the MU mark for reception yardage for a tight end and he is primed to take over the rest of records in his third season. Two mainstays on the Hawk offensive line, Jonathan Dunn and Nick LoCastro, wrapped up the offensive players for Monmouth. Dunn and LoCastro have anchored the left side of the line for the last two seasons, earning the former a 2006 First Team All-NEC selection.

A pair of defensive linemen represented the Hawks on defense, with Chris Reed and Kevin Walsh each earning their first preseason honors. Reed, a senior, appeared in all 12 games last year while registering 13 tackles. Walsh finished 2006 with 13 tackles, including 4.5 for a loss in 10 games.

MONMOUTH CHOSEN 2nd IN NEC POLL ...

In late August the Blue & White was picked to finish second in the 2007 Northeast Conference Preseason Poll.

Monmouth garnered three first place votes, the same as top-picked Albany, but the Great Danes had more second place votes than the Hawks. Albany took the top spot, with Monmouth second, Central Connecticut and Robert Morris tying for third, followed by Wagner, Sacred Heart and St. Francis.

THE LAST TIME OUT

DELAWARE 42 MONMOUTH 7

Sept. 29, 2007 • Raymond Field • Newark, Del.

The Monmouth University football team fell to nationally ranked #12 Delaware 42-7 on September 29 in front of 21,431 at Delaware Stadium. The Blue Hens are the highest ranked team the Hawks have ever faced in 15 years of football.

All of the game's scoring was done in the first half, and the hosts scored 21 points in both the first and second quarters. Delaware took the game's first lead less than five minutes into the contest when Omar Cuff scored from two yards out to cap a nine-play, 61-yard drive to give the Blue Hens a 7-0 lead. Cuff scored again on their ensuing drive after Delaware stopped Monmouth to boost the lead to 14-0 at the 5:42 mark. The second scoring drive took 11 plays and encompassed 67 yards.

The Hawks responded to that drive by going on a 10-play, 74-yard march in less than three minutes to cut the lead to 14-7 as David Sinisi scored on an eight-yard run. The touchdown was Sinisi's 16th straight game with a score, keeping alive the longest streak in all of Division I. Phillip Thaxton responded for Delaware when he scored on a 14-yard run with 1:37 left in the first quarter to push the Blue Hens lead back to two touchdowns at 21-7.

The second quarter began the way the first one did when Cuff scored, this time on a seven yard pass from quarterback Joe Flacco to make the lead 28-7 with ten minutes left before halftime. Flacco fired another touchdown pass, this one an 11-yard scoring strike to tight end Robbie Agnone with 6:34 left in the second quarter. The final score of the game came when Monmouth quarterback Brett Burke threw an interception deep in Blue Hen territory and Delaware defensive back Fred Andrew returned it 78 yards for the game's last touchdown.

In the game, Delaware outgained Monmouth 393-234 in total offense, including holding a 157-46 advantage in rushing yards. Sinisi led Monmouth with 69 rushing yards on 21 carries, while Burke completed 18-of-25 passes for 132 yards. Chris Kiley caught eight passes for 43 yards, Adam San Miguel caught five for 36 yards and freshman Troy Yudin hauled in four passes for 40 yards. Andrew Mandeville came on in relief of Burke to complete all five of his passes for 43 yards.

Jon Stolarz led the Monmouth defense with 10 tackles, while Troy Butler added two sacks.

Cuff finished with 73 yards on 16 carries and Flacco completed 15-of-19 passes for 215 yards. The Delaware signal-caller set a new school record with his tenth straight game throwing for at least 200 yards. Kervin Michaud caught four passes for 51 yards, while Cuff caught three for 23 yards.

The loss drops Monmouth to 1-9 all-time against teams from current Colonial Athletic Association, formerly the Atlantic 10.

A LITTLE MORE TO PLAY FOR...

In May of 2006, the Northeast Conference (NEC) and Pioneer Football League (PFL) announced a two-year agreement to meet in the **Gridiron Classic**, an exempted postseason football game that will match the champions of the two I-AA football conferences.

The inaugural Gridiron Classic will take place on Saturday, December 2 with the NEC champion Monmouth Hawks serving as host to the San Diego Toreros. The PFL champion will host the 2007 event.

Set to begin its 15th season, the Pioneer Football League is one of three Division I football-only sport conferences, along with the Gateway Football Conference and Great West Football Conference. The PFL is comprised of eight members, including Butler University, the University of Dayton, Davidson University, Drake University, Jacksonville University, Morehead State University, San Diego and Valparaiso University.

Monmouth is 1-3 all-time against members of the PFL. The Hawks are 0-2 against Dayton, with a 51-16 loss in 1997 and a 27-14 defeat in 1998. The Blue and White posted a 32-28 victory over Jacksonville to cap the 2000 campaign.
