## Blue & White Bits

- Monmouth (1-2) travels to Bethlehem, Pennsylvania to face Lehigh (1-2) in non-conference action, on Monday night, in Stabler Arena.

- Two seasons ago, the Hawks finished as the NEC leader in scoring defense, allowing just 67.1 points per game. Last season, Monmouth, which surrendered 70.6 ppg, ranked ninth in the conference.

- The Mountain Hawks opened their season with back-to-back road losses at Richmond and Rider, but rebounded with a home victory over Quinnipiac on Wednesday night.

- In 2008-09, Monmouth was without the services of guard Whitney Coleman, who averaged a team-best 11.9 points and 3.9 rebounds per game for the Hawks as a junior. The guard had 882 career points and 314 rebounds in three seasons, but suffered a season-ending knee injury in the opener at FAU. He had successful ACL surgery on Monday, January 5th, 2009, and is set to return to the lineup this year.

- 82.8% of Monmouth's points (51.4 ppg) and 79.0% of the Hawks' rebounding (25.6 rpg) were recorded by first and second year players.

# Dave Calloway

HEAD COACH • MONMOUTH, 1987 • 13TH SEASON • 158-189 OVERALL / NEC RECORD: 114-102



In his 13th season as head coach, Dave Calloway has registered a 158-189 overall record. Calloway became Monmouth's head coach in 1998 after serving as assistant coach for six-plus seasons. Calloway led Monmouth to a 21-10 season and an NCAA Tournament appearance in 2000-01, earning NEC Coach of the Year honors. In 2004, he led the Hawks back to the pinnacle of the NEC with a 21-12 mark and the school's third NCAA Tournament appearance and first NEC regular-season title. MU's climb continued in 2006, as the Hawks won the NEC Tournament for a fourth time and went on to defeat Hampton in the NCAA Opening Round, before falling to top-seeded Villanova in the first round. Calloway enjoyed a stellar playing career at Monmouth, logging 1,404 points and ranking 14th on MU's all-time scoring list. His point total ranks seventh in the Hawks' Division I era. During his playing career, MU compiled

a 67-48 record and posted a winning mark all four years. Calloway, who earned Academic All-American honors as a junior, still holds career and single-season three-point shooting records at Monmouth.

## CLIMBING UP

After starting his career 3-29, Calloway pushed his coaching record over the .500 mark, by recording six consecutive winning seasons from 2000-01 to 2005-06. That streak marked just the second time the Hawks have strung together five or more winning years since moving to Division I in the mid-80's.

## CAREER HAWK

Calloway has spent 23 years with the program (player, assistant and head coach).

## ALL OR NOTHING... ALMOST

For the most part, it has been all or nothing for Dave Calloway at the NEC Tournament. He owns a 10-6 record in the tournament, going 9-0 during MU's three NEC Championship runs (2001, 2004, 2006), but bowing out in the opening round in 1998, 2000, 2002, 2003 and 2008. 2005 was the first year Calloway recorded a win, but did not go on to win the championship, bowing out to Wagner, 63-60, in the semis.

## MONMOUTH MENTORSHIP

Calloway, who has led the Monmouth program to three NEC Championships as a head coach (and was an assistant coach during the 1996 title season), has guided the Hawks to three NCAA Tournament appearances. An Academic All-American during his playing days, Calloway has mentored two NEC Players of the Year (Rahsaan Johnson - 2001 and Blake Hamilton - 2005), two NEC Rookies of the Year (Alpha Bangura - 1999 and Jhamar Youngblood - 2006) and a Defensive Player of the Year (Kevin Owens - 2003).

## TOUGH STARTS

Under Calloway, MU annually plays a tough out-of-conference schedule. Since 1998-99, Calloway's first full season, the Hawks are 32-74 in non-conference games. Some impact wins: Princeton (3), Akron, Vanderbilt, Hofstra (2), Hampton, Southern Illinois, Loyola Marymount, Wichita State and Charlotte. Some high-profile defeats: Penn, Gonzaga, Boston College, Notre Dame, Miami, Nebraska, UNLV, Maryland, Seton Hall, South Carolina, Loyola Marymount, San Diego State, Clemson, Houston and Rutgers (in ot).

## AS A YOUNGSTER...

Calloway was one of former coach Wayne Szoke's prize recruits as a sharpshooting guard from St. Joseph's High School. He tallied 1,458 career points and had his jersey number retired by the school. His prep career included South Jersey Player of the Year honors, along with a Cape Atlantic League and South Jersey Parochial B title. In 2001, Calloway was inducted into the St. Joseph's High School Hall of Fame.

## HAWKS IN THE PRESEASON COACHES POLL

Monmouth was selected ninth, out of 12 teams, in the 2009-10 preseason NEC Coaches Poll. After making back-to-back postseason appearances, Mount St. Mary's was tabbed as the frontrunner to capture the 2009-10 NEC men's basketball championship, according to a vote of the league's head coaches. The Mountaineers received nine first-place votes from the league head coaches, who were not allowed to vote for their own team. Long Island was chosen second and earned a single first place vote. Defending NEC champion Robert Morris and Quinnipiac tied for third with the Colonials securing two first place nods.

Conducted annually, NEC coaches have failed to correctly forecast the eventual league champion since selecting Mount St. Mary's to win it all in 1998-99, and have proven inaccurate in 20 of the last 22 years.

Central Connecticut State was picked fifth, with Sacred Heart in sixth and St. Francis (N.Y.) in the seventh position. Fairleigh Dickinson landed in eighth place, followed by Monmouth in ninth, Wagner in tenth, Bryant in eleventh and Saint Francis (Pa.) in twelfth.

## BASEMENT DWELLER

In the last three seasons, Monmouth has been picked ninth or lower in the pre-season poll. In 2007-08, Monmouth was picked 10th in the NEC Preseason Poll, which was the lowest in the NEC preseason coaches poll since 1999-2000 when it was voted 11th in a 12-team league. That year, Monmouth was coming off a 5-21 season (5-15 in the NEC), when the Hawks held the nation's longest losing streak (19 games).

## FRESH FACES

In 2007-08, in its season-opener at Colgate, Monmouth started a freshman for the first time since November 21, 2000, when Jason Krayl earned a starting nod at Rider. That game also marked the first time since 1998, Dave Calloway's first full season as head coach, the Hawks gave the starting nod to multiple rookies. 2008-09 marked the second straight year in which the Hawks started a rookie in the opening game, as Mike Myers Keitt got the nod at forward against FAU (11/14).

## THE MATCHUP ZONE

Utilizing its trademark matchup zone, Monmouth annually ranks among the NEC leaders in scoring defense. In fact, MU has led the NEC in the category in 14 of the last 21 years, including two years ago (67.1 ppg).

## THE BEST THING ABOUT FRESHMEN...

Last season, Monmouth's freshman corp accounted for 48.9% of the Hawks' scoring and 36.0% of the minutes played.

## ON THE AIR

Hawk basketball games can be heard live on Hawks Radio. The flagship station is WMCX-FM (88.9) in West Long Branch. All games are broadcast by a corps of Monmouth University students.

## HAWKS GAMES ONLINE - AUDIO/VIDEO

Hawks' fans can listen to live audio of Monmouth basketball online. The radio broadcast of all Monmouth basketball games can be heard live on-line on the official website of Monmouth's student radio station WMCX, [www.wmcx.com](http://www.wmcx.com). Once again, in the 2009-10 season, all Monmouth men's and women's home basketball games (except televised contests) will be available on GoMUHawks.com, via web-streaming (fees apply).

## ONE-DAY'S PREP TIME

Last season, Monmouth was 2-12 in games in which its had only one day to prepare for the opposition. After Monmouth's test at Saint Peter's on Tuesday, the Hawks are 0-2 on the year.

## LEADING SCORERS

Whitney Coleman not only led the Hawks in scoring average as a junior, but also paces this squad in career points. Coleman, who has 40 double-digit outings to his credit, has 896 career points.

## BLACKJACK

On December 14, 2005, MU's vaunted matchup zone made national headlines, as the Hawks held Princeton to just 21 points in an MU victory. The 21 points equaled the lowest total by a Division I team since the introduction of the 3-point line for the 1986-87 season, until Saint Louis' 20-point outburst (1/10/08) against George Washington knocked MU off that pedestal. Coastal Carolina held Georgia Southern to just 21 points in a 61-21 win on January 2, 1997.

## MU vs. RANKED TEAMS

Monmouth's loss to No. 20 Villanova (11/25), dropped the Hawks' record to 0-16 all-time vs. Top 25 squads. Monmouth's last game versus a ranked-opponent came against No. 3 Villanova in the NCAA Tournament in 2006. In the 2004 NCAA Tournament first round, the Hawks lost 85-52 to then No. 9 Mississippi State in Orlando. In 2001-02, Monmouth hosted No. 22 Gonzaga, marking the first time that a team ranked in the top 25 had ever made an appearance at Boylan Gym. Monmouth lost the game, 79-54. That same season, Monmouth also lost to No. 2 Maryland, 91-55, at Cole Fieldhouse. At the 2001 NCAA East Regional, the Hawks dropped a 95-52 decision to No. 1 ranked Duke. During the 1999-2000 season, Monmouth lost to No. 25 Miami (Fla.), 67-46 and No. 20 DePaul, 69-62. In 1995-96, Monmouth lost to No. 20 Duke, 69-53, in the regular season and No. 20 Marquette, 68-44, in the NCAA Tournament. The Hawks have also lost to No. 25 St. John's (85-60 - 11/23/90), No. 18 Iowa (55-46 - 12/30/89), No. 18 North Carolina State (95-50 - 12/27/88), No. 11 St. John's (98-58 - 12/23/85), No. 17 Georgia Tech (96-66 - 1/17/85) and No. 6 Georgetown (75-54 - 1/9/84).

## MOVING UP THE NEC CHART

Dave Calloway last moved into sixth place on the Northeast Conference list of all-time regular-season league wins with 114, surpassing former Monmouth skipper Wayne Szoke (109). Next in Calloway's sights is Basketball Hall of Famer Jim Phelan, who had 116 career victories at Mount St. Mary's.

## SIX PACK OF WINS

The Hawks strung together six consecutive winning seasons from 2000-01 through 2005-06, winning three NEC titles. It marked the first time the Blue and White posted six straight winning marks since moving to D-I in 1983-84.

## IT'S CALLED CHARITY, CUZ THEY ARE "FREE" THROWS

The school season-record for free throw percentage is 77.1%, set during the 1990-91 and 2004-05 seasons. The Hawks ranked fifth in the league in foul shooting last year, hitting 70.06% from the line. After a pair of games this year, the Hawks are hitting just 60.0% (45-75) from the line.

## BLOWOUT WINS

Monmouth topped Lehigh and Loyola Marymount by 28 points each two seasons ago, marking the first time since the 2000-01 season the Hawks defeated consecutive opponents by 20 or more points.

## 70-BELOW

Monmouth, which prides itself on defense, maintains that it will always give itself a chance to win if it holds opponents to under 70 points. MU surrendered 70+ in 19 games last year, including nine 80+ outings. Monmouth allowed 80+ points to three consecutive opponents for the first time since the end of the 1997-98 season.

### THREE DECADES OF BRILLIANCE

Assistant coach Ron Krayl has been on the sidelines for the Hawks for 32 seasons. The mastermind behind the Hawks' matchup zone defense, Krayl scored over 2,300 points in his playing days at Sioux Falls. A draftee in both the ABA and the NBA (Philadelphia 76ers), Krayl also played during his service with the U.S. Army, with the likes of Mike Krzyzewski and Fran Dunphy.

### O-FER AGAINST THE BIG EAST

Monmouth is now 0-35 against teams from the BIG EAST Conference after its loss to Seton Hall (11/15) on Sunday. The Hawks gave themselves a chance to earn a victory in 2007-08, falling at Seton Hall in overtime. Monmouth took Rutgers to overtime during the 2003-04 season.

### IT ONLY TAKES ONE MORE POINT THAN YOU

MU finished 2008-09 with a 2-3 in games decided by five points or less. The two victories were over league-leading Robert Morris (2/19), and Long Island (1/22), both home wins.

### DEFENSIVE WOES

Monmouth allowed 35.5% from three-point range to its opponents last season. Seton Hall connected on a nine three-pointers against the Hawks last Sunday.

### MONMOUTH ALL-TIME 1,000-POINT SCORERS

While the Monmouth D-I basketball record books contain 17 members in its 1,000-point club, the all-time 1,000-point scorers include 13 more members that date back to the 50's. Led by Ron Kornegay's 2,526 points, MU now has 30 members in this club. Second to Kornegay, (Athletic Director at Manasquan H.S., and the only retired number at MU - #22) is Ed Halicki (1969-72), who threw a no-hitter for the San Francisco Giants in his Major League Baseball career.

### CLUTCH FROM THE LINE

Whitney Coleman led the NEC in free throw percentage, connecting on 89.6% (60-67) as a junior. That percentage currently ranks third in Monmouth single-season history. Dwayne Byfield's 91.1% success rate in 2002-03 tops the list.

### THE COACHING TREE...

Monmouth has the sons of three coaches or former coaches on its roster this year. Dutch Gaitley's mother is the head women's basketball coach at Monmouth. Nick DelTufo's father was an assistant coach at Montclair State and Caldwell, while R.J. Rutledge's father was an assistant coach at St. John's during the 1980's.

### STEALING THE SHOW...

Whitney Coleman, who has 126 career steals, became the 15th player in school history to collect 100 steals; Coleman is now 10th all-time. Next in Coleman's sights is Derric Thomas, who had 127 steals from 1984-88. John Giraldo (260) tops the list.

### PARADISE JAM

Monmouth has now made two trips to the Virgin Islands Paradise Jam in St. Thomas. In 2003, the Hawks finished in third place overall, behind Boston College and Wichita State. Monmouth defeated Appalachian State (69-65) in the opening round, before falling to eventual champion BC (60-50) in the second round. Monmouth then rallied from an 18-point deficit to defeat Hampton in the third place game. MU finished in fourth place in last year's field, ahead of Notre Dame, Charlotte, Wichita State and UIC.

### DISHING IT OUT

Point guard James Hett registered 105 assists as a rookie, which was the program's highest freshman total since 1992-93, when John Giraldo collected 109 assists as a rookie. The point, who dished out a career-best nine assists against FIU (11/13), now has 242 career assists.

## **OPENING WEEKEND**

After 44 years of calling Boylan Gymnasium the home of Monmouth University Basketball, the Hawks opened the 2009-10 campaign in the brand new, \$57-million Multipurpose Activity Center on November 13 and 15, when the Blue and White hosted FIU and Seton Hall. FIU and Seton Hall both made first-time appearances on the West Long Branch campus, while the Pirates' visit marked the first time the Hawks have played host to a BIG EAST program.

## **MONMOUTH VS. FIU**

In just the second all-time meeting between Monmouth and FIU on the hardwood, the Hawks topped the Golden Panthers 99-70 to open the new MAC on Friday night. In the victory, the Hawks hit 63.3% from the field.

## **MONMOUTH VS. THE HALL**

Monmouth is now 0-11 all-time against Seton Hall in basketball, in a series that dates back to 1993-94 season. In 2006, the Blue and White took Seton Hall to overtime before eventually falling by eight points, in the first-ever collegiate basketball game played in Prudential Center in Newark, New Jersey.

## **LEAVING BOYLAN**

Through the 2008-09 season, the Monmouth Basketball programs posted a combined 415-247 record in Boylan Gym. The Hawks called Alumni Memorial Gymnasium, later named William T. Boylan Gymnasium in 1992, for 44 seasons. Alumni Gymnasium opened on November 27, 1965, and opened its doors for regular season competition on December 1, 1965 when Monmouth defeated Saint Peter's 73-71, behind Ron Kornegay's team-high 24 points.

## **LAST "HOME" OPENER**

The last time Monmouth opened a season at home was when the Hawks hosted Rider University to open the 2001-02 campaign. On that night, the Hawks received their 2001 NEC Championship & NCAA Tournament rings and bested the Broncs by five.

## **TOURING THE GARDEN STATE**

This season, the Hawks will face six of the seven Garden State Division I Basketball programs - Fairleigh Dickinson, Princeton, Rider, Rutgers, Saint Peter's and Seton Hall. The last time the Hawks made that tour was during the 2003-04 season, as the Blue and White went 2-5 with victories over Rider and FDU.

## **WELCOMING BACK WHITNEY**

The only remaining player from the Hawks' 2006 NEC Championship squad, Whitney Coleman returns to the fold after missing last season with an ACL tear. The guard, who played just nine minutes in the Hawks' opener at FAU, has 896 career points for the Blue and White, while adding 322 rebounds.

## **FRESH FACES**

In 2007-08, in its season-opener at Colgate, Monmouth started a freshman for the first time since November 21, 2000, when Jason Krayl earned a starting nod at Rider. That game also marked the first time since 1998, Dave Calloway's first full season as head coach, the Hawks gave the starting nod to multiple rookies. 2008-09 marked the second straight year in which the Hawks started a rookie in the opening game, as Mike Myers Keitt got the nod at forward against FAU (11/14).

## **FRESHMAN TRIO**

Last season, Monmouth was led in scoring by a trio of freshmen for the first time in program history, as Travis Taylor, Will Campbell and Mike Myers Keitt paced the Hawks' offense. The trio combined for 30.4 points per game for the Hawks.

## **THE YOUNGSTERS**

82.8% of Monmouth's points (51.4 ppg) and 79.0% of the Hawks' rebounding (25.6 rpg) was recorded by first and second year players.

## **ALL-ROOKIE DUO**

Last season, forward Travis Taylor and guard Will Campbell both earned Northeast Conference All-Rookie Team honors, increasing the program-total to 14 players who have earned All-Newcomer/All-Rookie accolades.

## **OFF THE BENCH...**

Three of Monmouth's top-four scorers (after two games) came off the bench for the Hawks, as freshman Ed Waite leads the reserve scoring charge. Waite, who is averaging 17.5 minutes, is averaging 14.0 points, while sophomores Will Campbell (13.5 ppg) and Mike Myers Keitt (10.0 ppg) round out the double-digit scorers.

## **ONLY TWO YEARS OF HIGH SCHOOL BALL??**

Forward Travis Taylor, who only played two years of high school basketball (transferred into Union H.S.), led the Hawks in both scoring and rebounding as a rookie, and currently leads the squad in both yet again - 16.3 points, 6.3 rebounds per game.

Monmouth shot 63.3% from the field in defeating FIU and its head coach Isiah Thomas, 99-70 in the first game held in the brand-new \$57 million Multipurpose Activity Center on campus, on Friday night.

Monmouth, which won its season opener for the first time since the 2003-04 season, improve to 1-0, while the Golden Panthers fall to 0-2 on the season.

"Obviously, this is an exciting night for Monmouth University to open up a new facility," stated head coach Dave Calloway, whose troops last opened at home in November of 2001 (defeating Rider). "The players were great tonight and our student section was absolutely terrific. For our level of basketball, that is a great thing to see."

Sophomore Travis Taylor led five Hawks in double figures with 18 points on 8-of-12 shooting, adding five rebounds, four assists and two blocks. Freshman Ed Waite shined in his collegiate debut, scoring 15 points on 6-of-11 shooting, adding five boards and a pair of assists and steals in 18 minutes. Justin Sofman, who added three three-point field goals, and Will Campbell each scored 13 points, while James Hett scored 12 points and handed out a career-best and game-high nine assists.

"We need to better defensively for the future, we won't always score 99 points, but tonight we scored as a group," added Calloway.

The Hawks shot 63.3% for the game (38-for-60), and connected on 53.3% of their three-pointers (8-for-15). MU also handed out 31 assists on its 38 made field goals. Monmouth limited FIU to 44.6% shooting for the game, including 11.1% (2-of-18) on three-point field goals. The Hawks turned 21 Panther turnovers into 28 points, while outscoring the south Florida school 38-26 on points in the paint and 50-17 in bench scoring.

The Hawks, whose biggest lead was 31 points with two minutes to go in the game, led the entire contest from the 19:40 mark of the first half. MU raced out to a 15-4 lead at the first media timeout and watched its lead grow to 37-20 with six minutes left in the first half after a Hett three-pointer. FIU closed the halftime gap to 41-33, ending the opening half on a 7-0 scoring run.

That eight point lead quickly grew to 21 for the Blue and White, at 59-38, after Campbell converted a fast-break reverse layup with just over 14 minutes to go in the game. MU's largest lead was 97-66 with 2:01 left after Kevin Schaffer connected on a three-pointer.

FIU, whose head coach Isiah Thomas returned to the metropolitan area for the first time since leaving the New York Knicks, was paced by Marvin Roberts' 21 points, while Stephon Weaver added 16. Marlon Bright contributed 12 points and a team-high six boards for the Panthers, while J.C. Otero scored 11 points off the bench in 19 minutes of action.

Monmouth fell to visiting Seton Hall, 87-72, on Sunday afternoon, in the Multipurpose Activity Center. Monmouth, now 1-1, was paced by four players in double-figures, while the Pirates (2-0) connected on nine three-pointers en route to the win.

Monmouth jumped out to a 7-4 lead at the 15:10 mark on Ed Waite's putback, but three straight treys from Jamel Jackson pushed the Pirates in front 16-11 with 11:15 showing. The Hawks trimmed the lead to 16-15 on a Mike Myers Keitt offensive rebound and hoop, and knotted the score at 16-16, on a Will Campbell free throw with 10:00 remaining.

Playing in the 6:00 a.m. game of the ESPN Tip-Off Marathon, Monmouth fell in non-conference action at Saint Peter's, 58-34, on Tuesday morning at the Yanitelli Center.

Monmouth (1-2), playing its third game in five days to open the season, was led by sophomore Travis Taylor's 12 points and six rebounds, while off the bench, Will Campbell added nine points and Ed Waite corralled 10 rebounds.

After Whitney Coleman's drive tied the game at 2-2, Monmouth took its first lead of the contest at 7-6 behind a Taylor three-point play with 14:23 remaining until the break. Monmouth, which connected on just one field goal in the final 14:23 of the half, fell behind 27-16 at the break.

For the first six minutes out of the intermission, the Hawks and Peacocks traded baskets, as Monmouth climbed within 33-23 with 14:16 left on Sofman's three-pointer off an offensive rebound from Waite. SPC answered with a 12-2 run over the next six minutes to increase its lead to 45-25.

After a pair of Taylor free throws stopped a 7-0 run, SPC got consecutive three-pointers to fall and an offensive putback, to increase the lead to 53-27 with 3:47 on the board.

Monmouth, which ended with its lowest point total since November 16, 2007 (33 points against Notre Dame) connected on a season-low 21.3% from the field (10-of-47) and 57.1% from the free throw line (12-for-21) in the defeat.

Sofman chipped in seven points and a pair of assists for the Blue and White, while James Hett added five rebounds and three steals.
