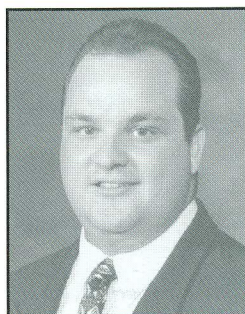
# MEDIA INFORMATION

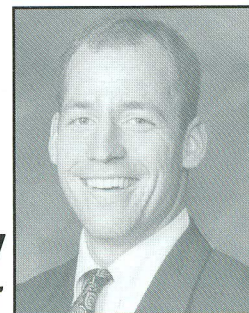

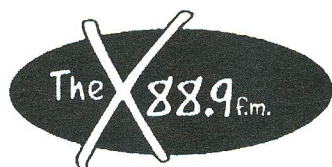

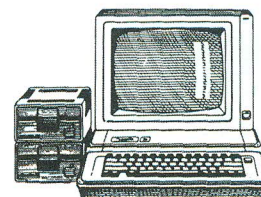
## HAWKS ON THE AIR

## DIRECTIONS TO KESSLER FIELD

**#1 FROM THE GARDEN STATE PARKWAY:** Take Exit 105. Follow Route 36 East to Route 71 South. Route 71 South becomes Cedar Avenue in West Long Branch. Follow Cedar Avenue to Larchwood Avenue and make a right-hand turn. The entrance is approximately one half mile on your left. Kessler Field will be on your left when you enter the parking lot.

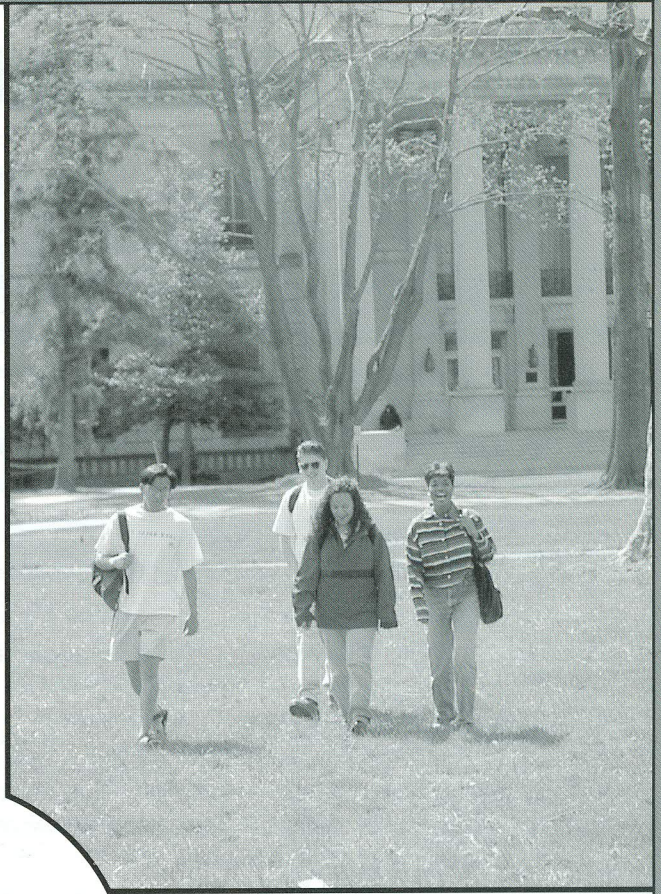
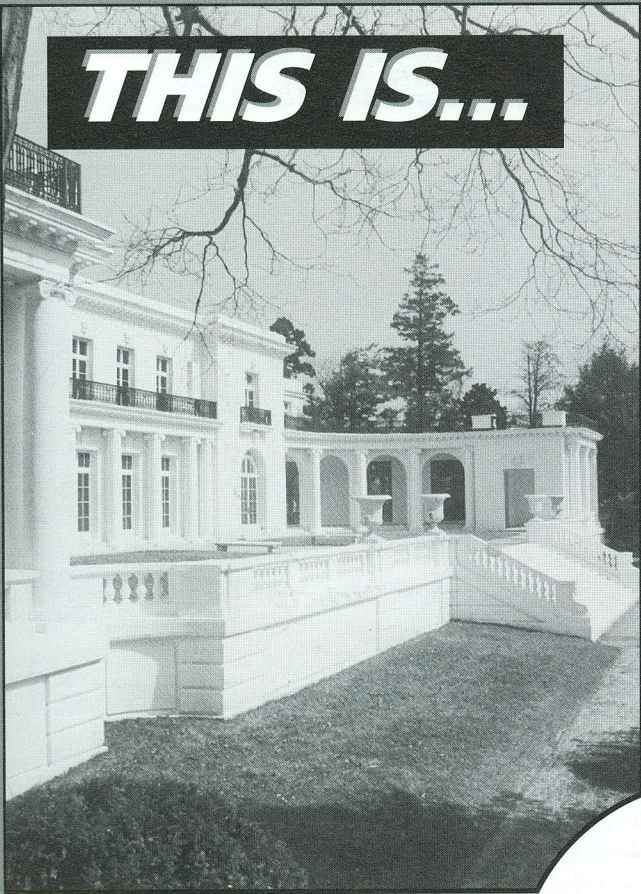
**#2 FROM THE N.J. TURNPIKE (South):** Take Turnpike North to Exit 7A. After toll plaza, take I-195 East to "Shore Points." Approaching Belmar, I-195 becomes Route 138. Take 138 East to Route 18 North, towards Eatontown. Take Deal Road exit and proceed to the intersection at Monmouth Road. Turn left and proceed to the third traffic light which is Cedar Avenue. Turn right

on Cedar (also labeled Route 71 South) and follow to Larchwood Avenue, where you will make a right-hand turn. The entrance is approximately one half mile on your left. Kessler Field will be on your left when you enter the parking lot.

**FROM THE N.J. TURNPIKE (From the North):** Take N.J. Turnpike South to Exit 11 (Garden State Parkway South). Take Exit 105 and follow directions outlined above in #1.

**FROM TRENTON AND POINTS WEST:** Take I-195 East to Route 18 North and follow directions outlined above in #2.

# MONMOUTH UNIVERSITY

If this sounds familiar, we invite you to discover what more than 3,400 full-time undergraduate students here already know. Monmouth University offers the opportunities of a large university and the personalized attention found at small private colleges.

## OVERVIEW

Located less than a mile from the ocean on the scenic Jersey Shore, Monmouth University is a private, comprehensive institution of higher learning committed to service in the public interest and to the enhancement of the quality of life. The University aims to provide a learning process and environment which enables men and women to pursue their educational goals, realize their full potential, contribute actively to their community and determine the direction of their lives.

Approximately 5,300 students, including 1,900 graduate students, are currently enrolled. They represent 19 states and 30 nations. Nearly 1,600 students live on campus in 11 residence halls and two garden apartment complexes.

## HISTORY

Founded in 1933 as Monmouth Junior College, the University acquired its core campus, the former Shadow Lawn estate, in 1956, and in the following year initiated its baccalaureate curricula.



The University's 149-acre campus, considered to be one of the most beautiful in New Jersey, includes 49 buildings which blend old and contemporary architectural styles. Among these buildings are Woodrow Wilson Hall (the centerpiece building) and the Murry and Leonie Guggenheim Library, which were added to the National Register of Historic Places in 1978, connecting Monmouth University with New Jersey's historic past.

## EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS

Monmouth University offers 43 undergraduate and graduate degree programs and concentrations in six distinct schools - the School of Business Administration, the Wayne D. McMurray School of Humanities and Social Sciences, the Edward G. Schlaefter School, the School of Education, the School of Nursing and the School of Graduate Studies.

## CAMPUS SERVICES

To ensure undergraduate success for students of all skill levels, Monmouth offers integrated advising services through the Life and Career Advising Center (LCAC). The Center provides a single, convenient location for comprehensive counseling in academic, career and personal matters. Monmouth places a high value on student retention, and in 1990 its programs received nationwide recognition at the National Conference on Student Retention.

Because the need for support is greatest during the freshman year, Monmouth provides a number of services to meet the special needs of new college students. Monmouth's "**Freshman Seminar**," for example, is a one-credit course designed to smooth the transition from high school to college. This elective course covers decision-making, academic and social opportunities and critical skills such as test-taking strategies, time management and study skills.

The **Monmouth Early Warning System** is a college-wide tracking system which monitors the progress of every new student at Monmouth. Selected faculty members act as first-year

advisors to groups of no more than 20 freshmen, providing a critical link between the student and the University's academic, personal and career resources.

## ACADEMIC SUPPORT

The Monmouth University Athletics Academic Support Services are designed to evaluate, guide and track the student-athletes' academic progress during their academic career at Monmouth. Directed by Patti Adoma, the main goal is to assist and counsel student-athletes in their efforts to make continual and satisfactory progress while pursuing their degree of choice.

Aside from monitoring the student-athletes' progress, the Academic Support Services provide the following services for all student-athletes:

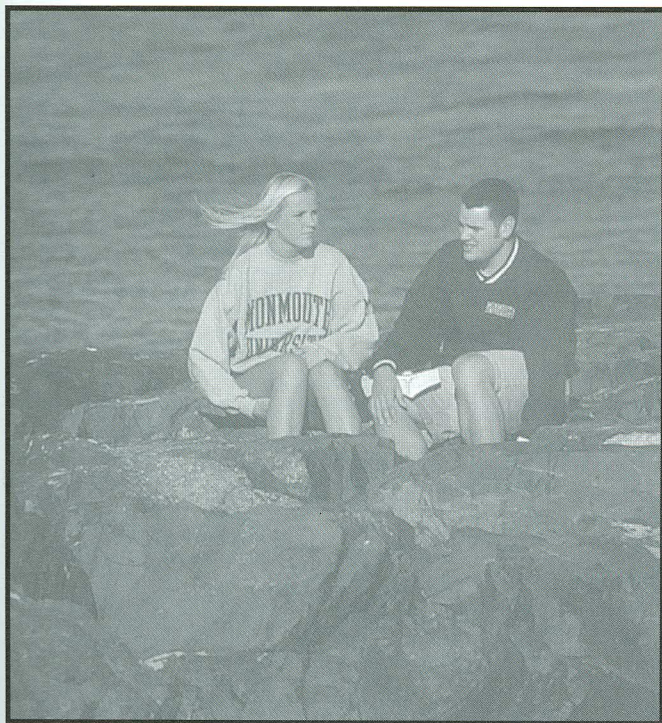

- **Mandatory Workshops** - A number of academic and educational workshops are offered to athletes covering such topics as study skills, time management, career planning and communication skills.
- **Study Tables** - These are designed to provide an environment conducive to studying. All freshmen and student-athletes with a GPA lower than 2.3 must attend.
- **Mandatory Meetings** - Student-athletes' prescribed meeting schedules will be determined by a counselor at the beginning of the semester.
- **Tutorial help** - In addition to campus tutorial services, the Academic Support Services provides additional help to all student-athletes.
- **Class scheduling and registration** - Student-athletes may change programs with the Academic Support Services once they are officially registered.

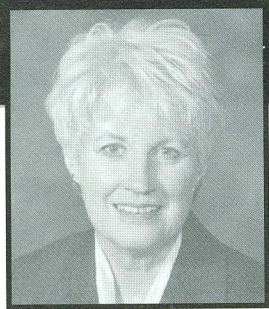
### MISSION STATEMENT

# ADMINISTRATION



**DR. REBECCA STAFFORD  
PRESIDENT**

Dr. Rebecca Stafford, who assumed the presidency of Monmouth University in 1993, is the first woman to head the 66-year-old private, comprehensive institution and the first to have served

as president of the Northeast Conference.

A native of Kansas, She has more than 30 years experience in both public and private higher education. From 1983 to 1991 she was president of Chatham College, a selective college for women in Pittsburgh. She had previously served as the president of Bemidji State University in Minnesota and as executive vice president of Colorado State University.

A 1958 magna cum laude graduate of Radcliffe, she earned both Master of Art and Doctor of Philosophy degrees from Harvard. She spent the year prior to arriving at Monmouth as a visiting scholar in the Harvard department of sociology.

Dr. Stafford began her career at Harvard, lecturing and doing research in sociology and directing special projects in the School of Education and for the University's Health Services. She left Harvard in 1970 to accept a faculty appointment at the University of Nevada in Reno, where she subsequently rose through the ranks to the post of Dean of the College of Arts and Sciences before leaving to become president at Bemidji State. At Bemidji State, and three other institutions at which she has held the senior administrative office, Stafford has initiated strategic planning and developed models which continue in use. She is a frequent speaker on education as well as on management-related topics, particularly as they pertain to women.

A contributor to the community, Dr. Stafford serves as a member of the First Union Five States Regional Board, and as a trustee of the Monmouth Medical Center. In 1994, she was named a Woman of Achievement in Education by the Monmouth County Advisory Commission and also received the Policymakers Award from the Executive Women of New Jersey.

President Stafford is married to Willard Van Hazel, a retired attorney and staunch supporter of the Hawks.



**DR. MARILYN McNEIL  
ATHLETICS DIRECTOR**

Dr. Marilyn McNeil was named the Director of Athletics at Monmouth University on April 15, 1994. The sixth person to hold this position at Monmouth, McNeil is one of just 13 female athletic directors on the

NCAA Division I level.

McNeil, who was honored at the NACWAA District II Administrator of the year in 1996, is a member of the NCAA Division I Management Council.

McNeil arrived at Monmouth from California Polytechnic State University, where she served as an Associate Athletics Director and Senior Woman Administrator since 1987. In addition to her duties as an administrator, McNeil also coached basketball from 1979-86.

A native of Canada, McNeil was awarded her bachelor's degree in physical education from the University of Calgary in 1968, master's degree in physical education from McGill University in 1974. She completed her education by earning a doctorate in higher education administration from Washington State University in 1993.

As an undergrad at the University of Calgary, she was a member of both the women's basketball and volleyball teams. She was head coach of women's basketball at the University of Calgary from 1975-79 and was honored as the Canadian Coach of the Year in 1979. Before her stint at Calgary, McNeil served as the volleyball coach at McGill University from 1968-71 and as basketball, volleyball, track and curling coach at Vanier College from 1971-75.

McNeil resides in West Long Branch with her husband, Henry Byzinski, and their children, Tasha (18) and Derek (14).

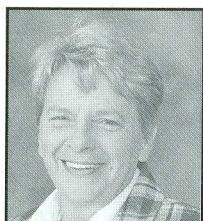

**KEVIN CALLAHAN**  
**HEAD COACH**

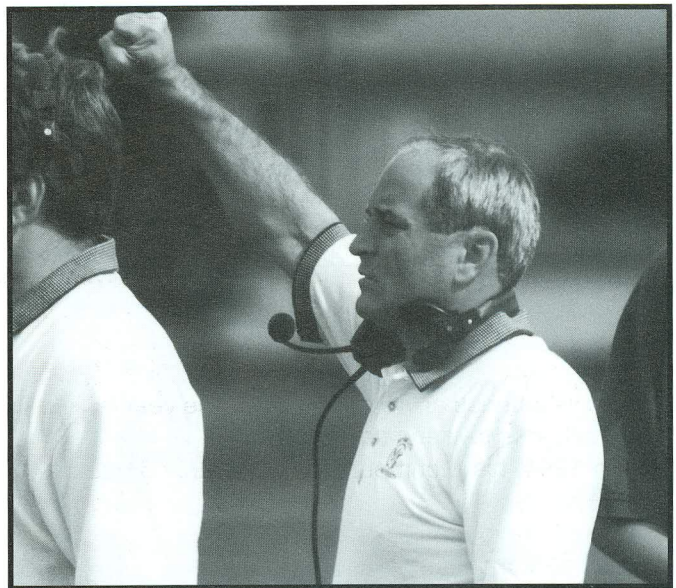
On the day he was named the first head football coach in the history of Monmouth University, Kevin Callahan was asked plenty of questions regarding his feelings toward starting a program from the ground floor.

"The whole thing is a risk," said Callahan on that August day in 1992. With what has happened to the Hawks' football program over the last seven years, Monmouth is sure glad it was a risk worth taking.

What he has accomplished during his tenure at the West Long Branch institution is nothing short of remarkable. Only once has a Monmouth team finished below .500 and that came during the Hawks' inaugural year of 1993. Since then there have been 31 victories, two conference co-championships and a program that has been rated among the top 10 in I-AA non-scholarship football in each of the last three seasons. Along the way, Monmouth has been ranked among the top 20 in total offense (1997, 1998) and defense (1994, 1995, 1998), while numerous players have earned both conference and regional accolades.

Last season, Callahan earned his own accolade as he was named the Northeast Conference's Coach of the Year after leading a young Monmouth squad to its second NEC co-championship in three years while establishing over 30 new school records. It's an honor he won't take much credit for, instead insisting it was his staff and players who were most responsible for the award.

Callahan arrived at Monmouth following eight seasons at Colgate University. While at the Patriot League school, he served as assistant head coach and defensive coordinator, while coaching the linebackers. He also served as Colgate's recruiting coordinator.



During his tenure as Colgate's defensive coordinator, he coached 11 All-Patriot League performers. In 1987, Colgate had the ninth-best rushing defense in the country, allowing just 111.9 yards per game. In 1990, the Red Raiders were the second best team in the Patriot League in total defense, setting a school record for fewest yards allowed in an 11-game season.

Prior to his arrival at Colgate, Callahan spent three years (1981-83) at Wagner College where he was the defensive coordinator, linebackers coach and recruiting coordinator. During his tenure at the Staten Island school, the Seahawks compiled a 25-4-2 record and were ranked in the top 10 in Division III in each of his three seasons.

In 1980, he served as an assistant coach at Syracuse University. At Syracuse, Callahan worked as the assistant offensive backfield coach.

Callahan began his coaching career in 1977 at the University at Albany as a graduate assistant. He spent his first campaign at Albany coaching the offensive backfield, and the next two years leading the outside linebackers.

A 1977 graduate of the University of Rochester with a degree in history, Callahan lettered four times for the Yellowjackets at defensive back. In his senior year, he was named the defensive MVP and earned honorable mention Associated Press Little All-American and ECAC All-East honors.

Back on that day in 1992, Callahan continued his thought saying, "you can go through life and never take a risk and never improve yourself. It's when you take a risk that you find out just how good you can be."

After all he's achieved, apparently real good.

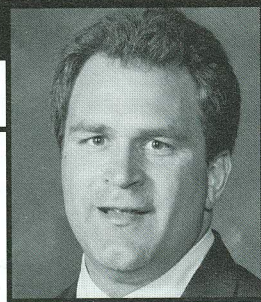

## **ANDY BOBIK**

### **DEF. COORDINATOR**

Andy Bobik is entering his fifth season in the defensive coordinator position.

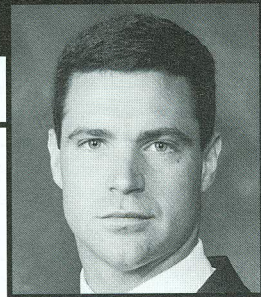
Bobik, the defensive coordinator for the first two seasons of MU football, returned in 1996

after spending a year as the coordinator at Wagner College. His defense at Wagner finished the year ranked fifth nationally in total defense.

In 1994, his Monmouth defense ranked nationally in scoring defense (4th), total defense (8th), rushing defense (9th) and shutout three teams. Last season, the Hawks ranked 12th in total defense.

Bobik arrived at Monmouth in 1993 after six years as the defensive line coach at his alma mater, Colgate. He also served as the scouting and audio-visual coordinator. Before his stint at Colgate, he spent one year as the linebackers coach at West Chester and three seasons as an assistant coach at Cornell.

Bobik, a native of Binghamton, NY, graduated from Colgate in 1982 with a mathematics degree.



## **SCOTT NEWBERT**

### **QUARTERBACKS**

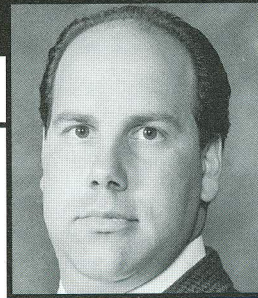
Another initial member of the Hawks staff, Scott Newbert is in his third year as the Hawks quarterbacks coach.

Newbert served the 1993 and 94 seasons as the receivers

coach before a two-year hiatus. He returned in 1997 as the quarterback coach. Under Newbert's tutelage, Monmouth's passing game has ranked among the top 25 nationally in each of the last three years, including a school-record 2,377 yards in 1998. One of the initial members of the Monmouth staff, Rich Skrosky will serve as the offensive coordinator and coach the offensive line.

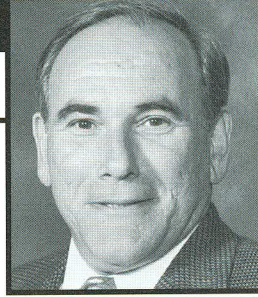
Skrosky's line and the offense have both excelled in his tenure as the Hawks ranked in the top 30 nationally in three categories last season.

and college level.

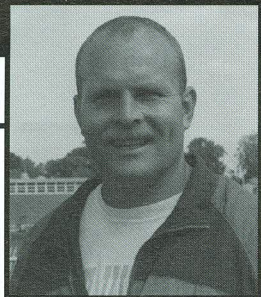
Before coming to Monmouth, he spent seven years as the head coach at Monmouth Regional High School, leading the team to its first winning record in 14 years.

**DEFENSIVE LINE**

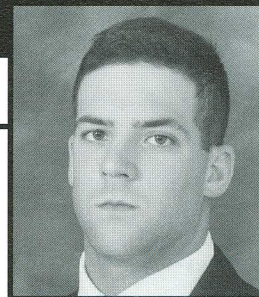
The newest addition to the Monmouth staff, Fred Sprengel will handle the Hawks' defensive lineman.

**RECEIVERS**

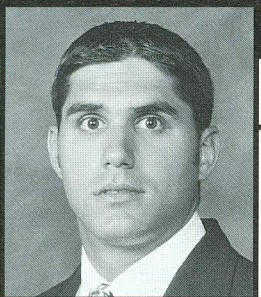
Mark Fabish returns for his second season on the Monmouth sidelines.

**DAVID LEWIS**

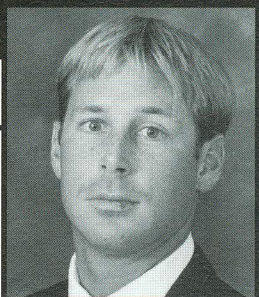
**DEFENSIVE BACKS**

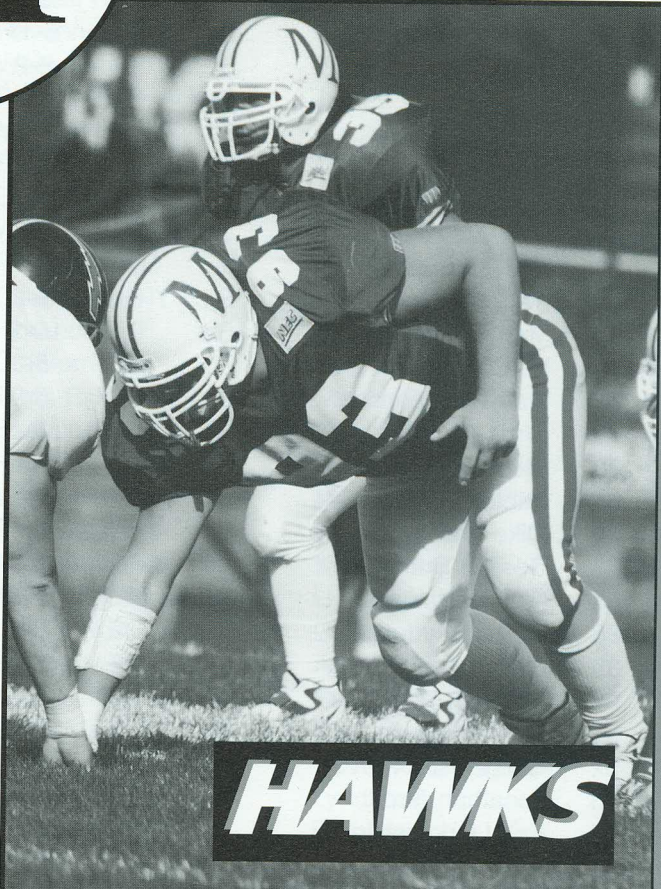
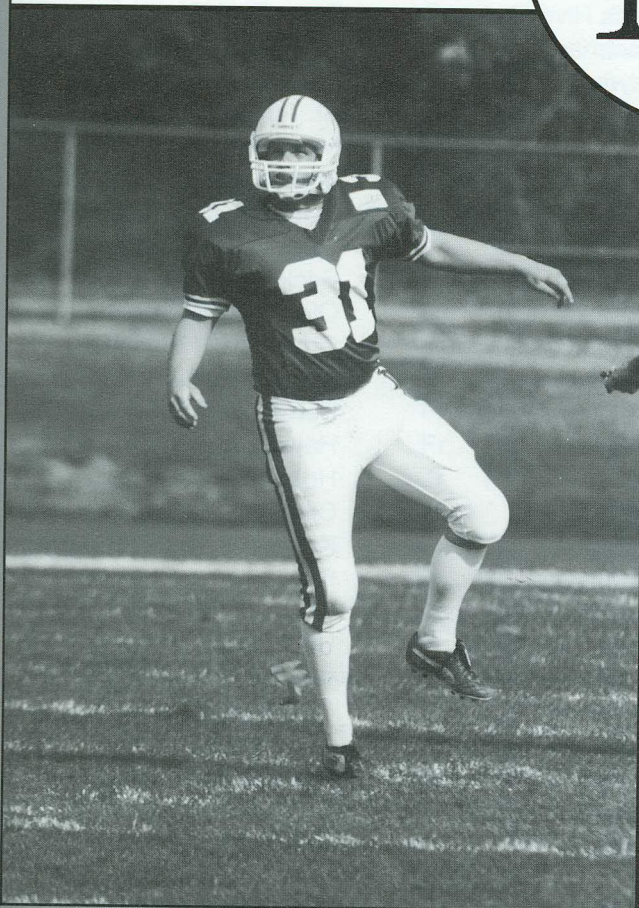
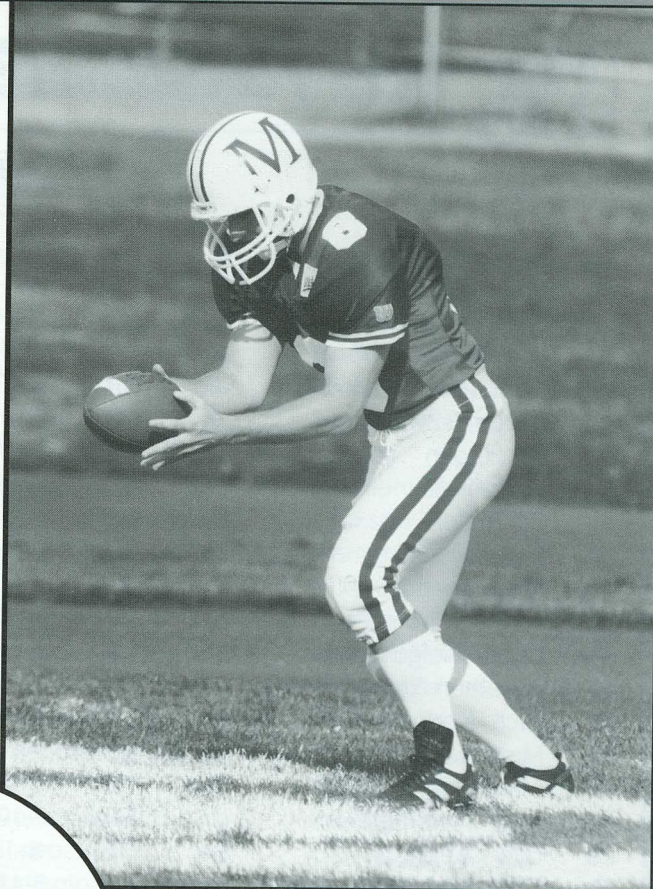
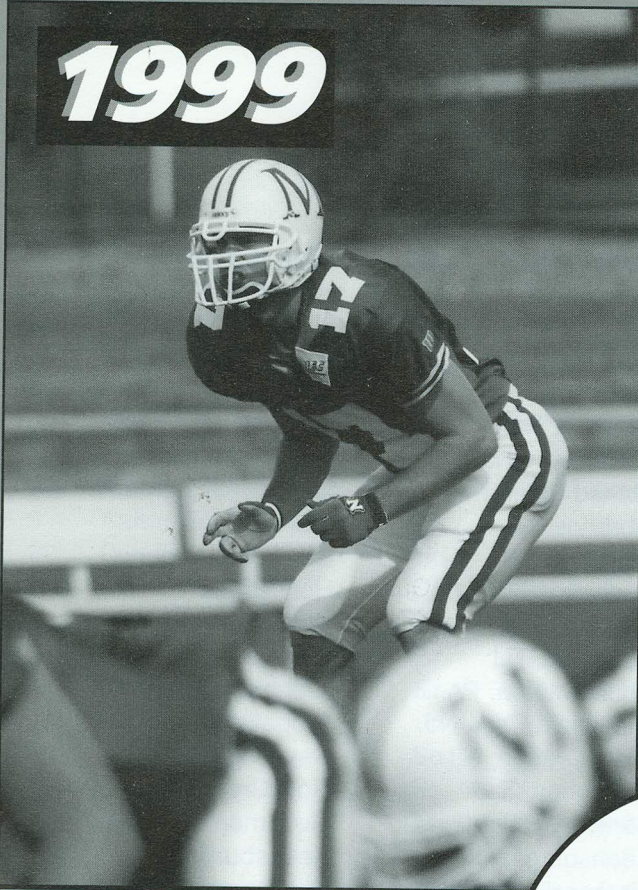
Returning for his second season, Don Toddings will again serve as the Hawks' tight ends coach.

In the six short years of Monmouth football, the Hawks have reached a level of success faster than anyone could have imagined. Two Northeast Conference titles, top-10 rankings in the annual Division I-AA non-scholarship polls and player accolades that run a mile long.

Last year, that list grew as the Hawks earned a share of the NEC crown and set over 30 school records in the process.

But with success comes higher expectations, and nowhere could that be more evident than at Monmouth, where winning has become commonplace. So with that in mind the Hawks will embark on the 1999 campaign looking to raise that bar of success just a little higher.

Sure, it will be tougher this season as Monmouth tries to find replacements for some of its graduated seniors. Gone is all-time leading rusher Chris Reed (2,278 yards/1,066 yds & 22 TD's in '98), the NEC's Offensive Player of the Year as well as All-American

wide Receiver Anthony Galella (61 receptions, 1,061 yds., 9 TD). However, losing talented players has never been an excuse for Kevin Callhan's team to not succeed on the field.

Also working against the Hawks is an extremely difficult schedule that in-

cludes Division I-AA quarterfinalist Lehigh and Patriot League foe Towson not to mention an NEC schedule that has added two new opponents in Albany and Stony Brook.

But Monmouth does have 12 starters returning and a cast of players who did see significant playing time, so the chances of adding to that list of success are very good.

## QUARTERBACK

The shoes he had to fill were certainly big, but by season's end senior **JOHN DIPASQUALE** fit quite well, in fact very well

into the role of field general. Faced with having to replace departed Dan Sabella, all the 6-3 signal caller did was throw for a single-season record 2,229 yards and 15 touchdowns passes while connecting on 57 percent of his passes. After an early-season adjustment period, DiPasquale, an All-NEC First-Team se-

lection, came into his own and had a memorable game against St. Francis (PA) in which he threw a school-record 15 consecutive completions. Freshman **CHRIS WIELGOSZ**, a strong-armed thrower, will move into the role as DiPasquale's backup.

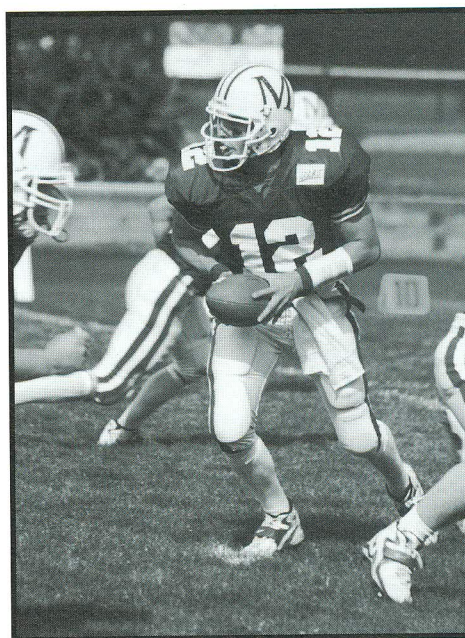

# 1999 OUTLOOK

## RUNNING BACK

Last year, Monmouth led the NEC and finished 27th in the nation in rushing, averaging over 190 yards per game on the ground. However 117 of those yards are gone with the departure of Chris Reed, who set just about every Hawk rushing mark imaginable in 1998. But despite the loss of Reed, the NEC Offensive Player of the Year, the stable of Monmouth backs is still plentiful and talented. Senior **JOE TRAMUTOLO** averaged 4.6 yards per carry (457 yards) as the blocking back for Reed while sophomores **MATT MERKLINGER** and **MIKE TROMBETTA** each showed flashes of brilliance in their reserve roles. Merklinger averaged nearly five yards per carry last season and scored three touchdowns, while Trombetta emerged following a 13-carry, 58-yard performance in the season opener against Dayton. Senior **ERIK MAZUR** adds depth and experience to the backfield. A powerful full-back, Mazur is a tremendous blocker, who can also carry the ball as evidenced by his 3.5 yards per carry average in 1998.

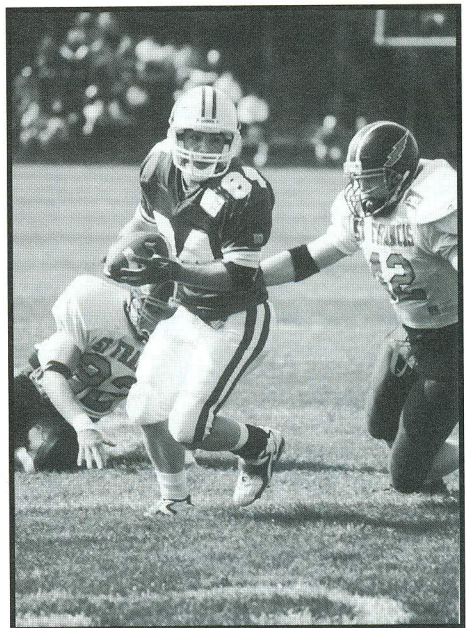

## TIGHT ENDS

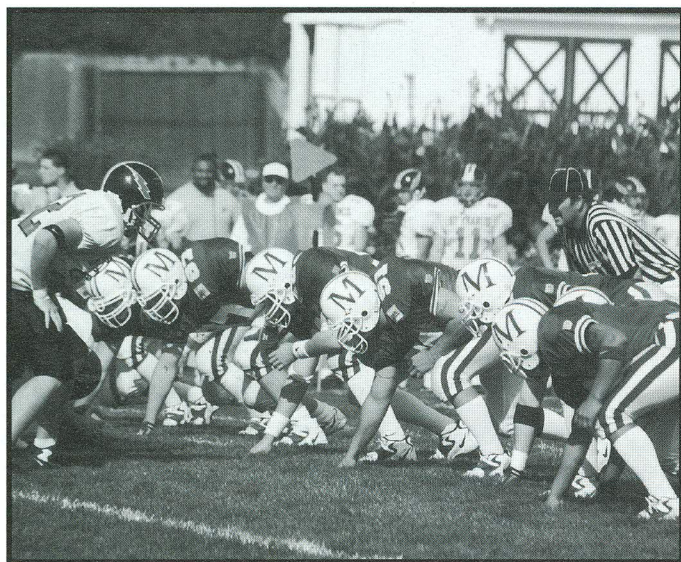

Perhaps the biggest reason for Monmouth's offensive success last year was its offensive line which provided the large running lanes for the backs and formed a virtual wall that allowed the passing game to amass nearly 2,400 yards while allowing just 12 sacks. However, the graduation of three starters -- Division I-AA All-American Doug Sterk, Nick Dalia and two-time All-NEC pick Anthony Verdi --- have left huge holes, ones that must be filled if the Hawks are to remain among the NEC's top offenses. Center **ERIC PLATT** is back for his third year and is the most experienced of the group having started his last 22 games. Senior **LIAM KLEIN**, who stepped in last year and had a solid season at guard, will move to tackle in 1999. Junior **MATT HERDMAN** and sophomores **ERIC BURASZESKI**, who moves over from the defensive side, and **ED O'NEIL** are among the top candidates for the open positions.

## KICKERS

It is an area that will definitely be a strong point for the Hawks this season -- literally. Punter **DARRELL NICK** averaged 38.9 yards per kick last season and set a Monmouth record with a 67 yard punt against St. Francis (PA). The junior also pinned opponents

inside their 20-yardline on 13 occasions. **CHRIS MANDELL**, a former soccer player with a powerful leg, will take over the full placekicking duties this year after serving as a long-kicking specialist last season.

## DEFENSIVE LINE

Defensive end **CORNELL KEY** returns for his senior season after a breakthrough junior campaign. Key earned All-NEC honors after collecting 31 tackles, including 12 for loss and two sacks. Senior tackle **MATT QUINN** was on his way to another solid season before suffering a torn knee ligament against La Salle. However Quinn will return giving the Hawks another talented and experienced player on the front line. Senior **BILL PULLEN**, who made the transition to linebacker last year, will return to his more familiar defensive end spot this season. Pullen registered 55 tackles and four sacks from that position in 1997. Pullen will be challenged for the spot by senior **MARKICE STEPHENS**, a converted linebacker, and sophomore **CHRIS AMMACHER**. Juniors **CJ EMSLIE** and **JONATHAN SCOTT** will battle for the open tackle spot along with senior **DOUG GILLESPIE**. All three saw limited action in 1998.

## LINEBACKERS

The strongest part of the defensive unit last season, may be even better this season. Junior **JOHN SCHULTZEL**, who earned All-NEC honors, stepped into the spotlight in '98 with a single-season record 96 tackles along with three sacks and two interceptions. He will return along the outside with senior **MIKE**

**NORMAND**, who moves over from the middle spot. Normand excelled in his first year as a starter racking up 55 tackles, including 10 for loss. With Normand's move, the middle position is wide open with returnees **JERRY VALERIUS** and **TERRY ARCHER** each vying for the spot along with **MATT DAVIS**, who comes to Monmouth after transferring from the University of West Virginia.

## DEFENSIVE BACKS

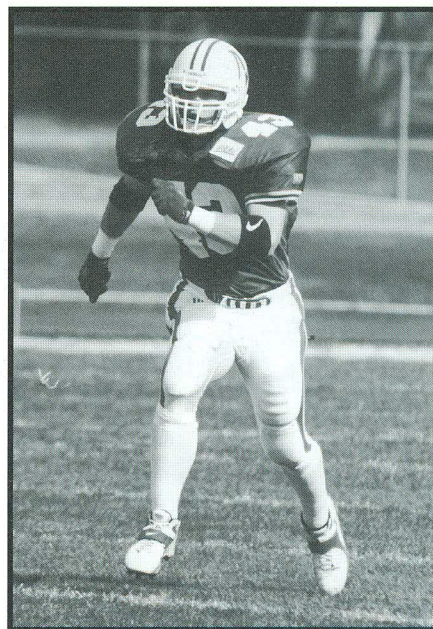
With several new faces and plenty of inexperience last year, the Hawks' secondary struggled at times. But with seven veterans returning this season, the unit should be quite improved in 1999. Leading that group is All-NEC pick **AARON EDWARDS** at free safety. Edwards made a smooth transition from cornerback and finished second on the team with 86 tackles while also picking off one pass and breaking up five others. Senior **BRIAN McALEENAN** is back for his third season at one corner. McAleenan led the team with three interceptions and seven breakups while usually drawing the assignment of the opposition's best receiver. The other corner position is up for grabs between sophomores **RICH**

**KENNY** and **JASON ROACH**.

Kenny, a special teams performer last year, had a tremendous spring practice breaking camp as a starter while Roach, who blocked two kicks in '98, possesses tremendous speed making it difficult for receivers to get much separation.

**PAT LANDIS**, **RICH GILDNER** and

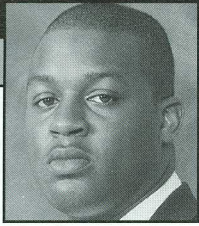

# NORTHEAST CONFERENCE

Proud of its history but with an eye toward the future, the Northeast Conference enters its 18th season with a renewed vigor. With the new millennium approaching, the NEC is poised to accept the latest challenges and move to the forefront in areas of athletic and academic excellence.

The league was strengthened in 1998-99 with the addition of the University of Maryland Baltimore County and Quinnipiac, and will complete its transition to 12 members with the addition of Sacred Heart this season. These institutions join Central Connecticut State, Monmouth, Mount St. Mary's as well as flagship members Fairleigh Dickinson, Long Island, Robert Morris, St. Francis (NY), St. Francis (PA) and Wagner. The new NEC membership, which represents the states of Connecticut, Maryland, New Jersey, New York and Pennsylvania, gives the league a strong base as it continues to grow and prosper.

With the addition of women's field hockey, women's golf and women's swimming last season, the 12 league members will now compete in 21 sports in 1999-2000: baseball, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's cross country, women's field hockey, football, men's and women's golf, men's and women's indoor track and field, women's lacrosse, men's and women's outdoor track and field, men's and women's soccer, softball, women's swimming, men's and women's tennis, and women's volleyball.

The NEC has come a long way since its inception in 1981 as the men's basketball only-ECAC-Metro Conference. Along with current members, Fairleigh Dickinson, Long Island, Robert Morris, St. Francis

(NY), St. Francis (PA) and Wagner, the other charter members included the University of Baltimore, Loyola (MD) College, Marist College, Siena College and Towson. Monmouth joined the league in 1985; Mount St. Mary's in 1989; Rider in 1992; Central Connecticut State in 1997; and UMBC and Quinnipiac in 1998. The league changed its name to the Northeast Conference in 1988.

John Iamarino became the NEC's second-full-time commissioner on April 7, 1997 and in a little over two years, has orchestrated the transition from nine league schools to 12; and sports sponsorship from 18 to 21.

In the spirit of growth and change, Iamarino also brought more recognition to the league with a new official logo which was unveiled on June 10, 1997. In 1999-2000, the evolution of the league will continue, with Iamarino spearheading the move of the NEC men's and women's basketball tournament to the Mercer County Arena in Trenton, New Jersey.

As the league has grown in membership and sports sponsorship, so has its recognition and exposure. For the second straight year, the NEC was featured as part of a 12 game basketball television package on MSG Network. MSG and its affiliates broadcasted 10 regular season games, a men's tournament semifinal contest and the women's championship game. ESPN televised the men's championship game for the 13th straight year.

On the national scene, the NEC received first-ever automatic bids to the NCAA Tournament in women's volleyball, women's tennis, men's tennis, baseball and softball. The league also sent teams to the men's and women's NCAA Basketball Championships and the women's preseason NIT.

A pair of 50-yard runs put MU behind 14-0 however Joe Tramutolo's 75-yard burst and Chris Reed's short run tied it at 14-14 heading into halftime.
