ABOUT THE HOYAS

- Georgetown dropped a heartbreaking 21-19 contest to conference foe Lehigh on Saturday evening.
- Despite the loss, the Hoyas broke the 400-yard mark in total offense for the second-straight week with 422, splitting 309 yards through the air and 113 on the ground.
- Joshua Tomas picked up his sixth career Patriot League Honorable Mention after logging a personal-best 13 receptions for 124 yards and a touchdown.
- The Hoyas have been efficient through the air, ranking second in FCS behind Furman (80.3%) in completion percentage at 79.2%. Pierce Holley leads the nation in the category, completing 55-of-69 passes through two games for 79.7% efficiency.
- GU's secondary is tied with seven other teams for fourth in FCS with four interceptions this season. Fordham (3) is the only other Patriot League team with more than two.
- Newcomer Wedner Cadet earned his second pick in as many weeks against Lehigh and is one of five freshmen in FCS to have at least two interceptions through the first two weeks.

ABOUT THE HAWKS

- Monmouth faced Fordham last week in an offensive shootout as the Hawks fell 52-49 in their home opener.
- It was just the fourth loss at home for Monmouth since Kessler Stadium opened in 2017 and second-straight against a Patriot League opponent after winning 11 consecutive against the conference.
- Despite the loss, MU produced the most total yards in an FCS game this season (713) with a program-record 299 rushing yards by running back Jaden Shirden.
- The Hawks are very disciplined, ranking seventh in the nation in fewest penalty ypg (27.0) and ninth with four penalties per game.
- Monmouth Head Coach Kevin Callahan enters his 31st season as the only head coach in program history. He is one of two FCS coaches with more than 160 wins (173) and is a two-time finalist for the Eddie Robinson Award for the nation's top FCS Coach.

THE MATCHUP

- Georgetown and Monmouth will meet for just the third time in history with the Hawks picking up the first two wins.
- The Hoyas and the Hawks will face off in New Jersey since their last meeting on October 23, 2004.
- Against current CAA teams, GU holds an even 17-17 all-time record.

- **JOSHUA TOMAS** REGISTERED A TOUCHDOWN AND **124 YARDS** ON A **CAREER-HIGH 13 RECEPTIONS** AGAINST LEHIGH FOR HIS **SIXTH** CAREER HONORABLE MENTION. HE ALSO ADDED A 32-YARD PASS TO CAMERON CRAYTON AND A 10-YARD RUSH.



HOYA NOTES

PICKING AND BLOCKING

The Hoyas forced three interceptions and blocked a pair of punts against the Red Foxes, followed by another pick and a forced fumble and recovery against Lehigh.

GU's two blocked kicks are tied for second in FCS while the team's four picks are tied for fourth. The Hoyas have also managed the seventh-best turnover margin in FCS at +1.50.

RUNNING RAMPANT

The Hoyas rushed for 224 yards on Saturday against Marist, the most in a game since its 223-yard performance against Bucknell in 2021. Stakely's 123-yard showing was the most since teammate Tyler Knoop went off for 122 on the ground against Morgan State in the 2021 season finale.

JUSTIN FONTENEUX PICKED AS NO. 35 RECIPIENT

Fonteneux became the sixth linebacker to wear the No. 35 jersey when he was selected as the recipient of the Joe Eacobacci Memorial Jersey in August, joining Nicholas Umar (2008), Nick Parrish (2010), Sean Campbell (2013), Nick Alfieri (2014) and Wes Bowers (2019).

"I have had the honor to speak with the Eacobacci Family and past representatives of the No. 35 over the past year. This living memorial has evolved to embody Joe's incredible personality and spirit with the 4 for 40 journey of the 17 former No. 35's. These individuals have honored Joe's memory and added to what it means to wear the No. 35. Over the past four years, Justin Fonteneux has epitomized Magis. He is always looking to do more in the classroom, more on the field and more in the Georgetown Community. I am confident that Justin will represent the No. 35 with pride and continue to build on the lasting legacy of this special tradition." - Head Coach Rob Sgarlata.

"A lot of emotions and it's surreal," Fonteneux said. "It means the world to represent this program and what it means to be a Georgetown football player but it's not about me in this moment. It's about all the guys that decided to come back to build this program and to get where we want to be. We still have work to do but we have something special."

The Texas native has played in 30 games on the Hilltop, racking up 152 total tackles, 10 of which went for a combined loss of 31 yards. Fonteneux put forth a career year in 2021, posting 40 solo and 47 assisted tackles (87 in total). His 17 total tackles against Columbia (Sept. 25) were among the most in a single game at the FCS level last season, ranking inside the top 25 (T-24th).

OH CAPTAIN, MY CAPTAIN

In August, graduate students Neal Azar and Justin Fonteneux were named 2022 team captains. The duo has combined for nearly 60 games of experience since coming to the Hilltop in 2018.

BE THE MATCH

Georgetown's football team worked with Be The Match in the spring and helped run the campus-wide registry drive. Several GU teams alongside football helped reach a school record in signups with over 800 potential donors.

CAMPBELL TROPHY NOMINEE

During preseason camp, graduate offensive lineman Mac Hollensteiner was named a nominee for the William V. Campbell Trophy, one of the most prestigious awards in college football.

Hollensteiner has played in 19 games on the Hilltop and Head Coach Sgarlata said, "Mac is a leader in the classroom, currently pursuing his Masters in Management at one of the top institutions in the country. Mac has been a mainstay on our offensive line and plays a very important role with our Leadership Council. I am proud to have Mac as a representative of our Hoya Football Family. Georgetown Football and the University as a whole have benefited from Mac's journey and contributions."

The trophy, given out by the National Football Foundation, recognizes an individual as the absolute best in the country for his academic success, football performance and exemplary leadership.

CAN YOU SMELL WHAT TALATI IS COOKING?

Senior offensive lineman Talati Polamalu earned a tryout with the World Wrestling Entertainment (WWE) ahead of its SummerSlam event held in Nashville, Tennessee in late July.

"Having the tryout was something I never saw myself capable of doing. I had the opportunity to go out to Nashville and had a four-day tryout. It was a tough experience but learned a lot, met a lot of great people and it's something that I will cherish forever." - Talati Polamalu

UNICORN TOWN - NICK ALFIERI

Former No. 35 Joe Eacobacci Memorial Jersey Recipient Nick Alfieri '14 directed and starred in the hit documentary "Unicorn Town," which was released on Apple TV in August 2022 and had been ranked the No. 1 sports documentary on the streaming site.

Alfieri has been playing football in the German Football League with the Schwabisch Hall Unicorns since 2016, stringing together 364 tackles, 11 sacks, five interceptions and a pair of German Bowl Championships (2017, 18). Alfieri also plays alongside his brother, Michael, who was a running back for Oregon State.

COOPER FIELD DEDICATION CEREMONY

Nearly a year after the official opening of Cooper Field, the Hoyas will welcome the Cooper Family back to the Hilltop for the ceremonial ribbon cutting on Friday, Sept. 9 and opening celebration prior to the team's Sept. 10 contest when the team takes on Lehigh in its home opener.

Saturday, September 18, 2021 was Georgetown's first game in Cooper Field since it underwent several impressive renovations. The upgrades include: permanent football and field hockey locker rooms, game day locker rooms for men's and women's lacrosse, a visiting team locker room, west side stands seating for 3,000 people, north endzone hillside lawn seating for 750 people, permanent restrooms and a concessions area as well as a state-of-the-art press box.

HOYA NOTES

CATCH ME IF YOU CAN

The Hoyas will welcome back two of the conference's top receivers in Joshua Tomas and Cameron Crayton. The duo finished 2021 ranked second and third in receiving yards per game, averaging 76.7 and 75.6, respectively.

Tomas is coming off an All-Patriot League First Team selection in 2021 as a wideout and was named to the 2022 preseason team as a return specialist. He racked up 1,096 all-purpose yards last year, pushing his career total to 3,248 and ranking fifth in GU history.

The Illinois native is chasing program leader Luke McArdle with 4,629 (2000-03) while also looking to move up the receiver ranks with 128 receptions (T-6th), 1,639 receiving yards (7th) and 10 scores (T-9th).

Crayton can crack the program's top 10 this season, posting 1,139 receiving yards on 81 receptions and seven scores in his time on the Hilltop. The Texas native is coming off a career year in Blue & Gray, reeling in 45 catches for 756 yards and four touchdowns. Against Columbia (Sept. 25) last season, he cracked the program's top five for most receiving yards in a game when he racked up 190.

HONORING HONORÉ

Former Hoya defensive back and current Georgetown graduate student Jonathan Honoré (SSP'23) was named one of 42 student-athletes to earn the 2022-23 NCAA Fall Postgraduate Scholarship.

"This scholarship means a lot to me because I am given the opportunity to represent Georgetown nationally," Honoré said. "Georgetown student-athletes understand the importance of academic excellence and the need to serve our communities through volunteer work. I am grateful to the NCAA selection committee for acknowledging my achievements in these areas."

The St. Louis, Missouri native is actively enrolled in the Walsh School of Foreign Service's security studies program. The one-time non-renewable scholarships of \$10,000 are awarded three times a year corresponding to each sport season (fall, winter and spring). Each sports season there are 21 scholarships available for men and 21 scholarships available for women for use in an accredited graduate program.

HOYAS WITH NFL PEDIGREE

Three Hoyas own a slight edge over their teammates as they are related to current and former NFL players.

- Senior offensive lineman Talati Polamalu is the nephew of former Pittsburgh Steelers safety and NFL Hall of Famer Troy Polamalu.
- Freshman Max McCormick is the grandson of Len "Tuffy" McCormick, who played for Washington and the Baltimore Colts in the late 1940's
- Freshman Naiteitei Mose is the cousin of Tifa Galeai who played two seasons for the Green Bay Packers.

GEORGETOWN - OHANA

It is a family here on the Hilltop and lineage runs deeper than just on the field connection.

- Senior Sam Telesa is the cousin of Hoya volleyball player Vaughan Anoa'i.
- Will Kessler is the brother of former Hoya linebacker Owen Kessler.

USFL CHAMPIONSHIP - MICHAEL DEREUS

Former Hoya standout and current wide receiver of the Birmingham Stallions Michael Dereus helped hoist the 2022 USFL Championship following a 33-30 win over the Philadelphia Stars.

"Winning the USFL championship and my journey on the Stallions was an unforgettable experience. The bond of our team was very special in such a short amount of time. It was dope to be a part of the inaugural season and be the first-ever champions. I am definitely excited to go back to the wonderful fans of Birmingham and bring home another trophy but the ultimate goal is still the NFL for me and I am just embracing this part of my journey."

MEET THE NEW STAFF

The Hoyas brought in four new assistant coaches for the 2022 season in Corey Burns, Jack McDaniels, Kenneth Tinsley and Jameson Zacharias.

Burns comes to the Hilltop after serving as a graduate assistant coach at Temple University and Colorado State, assisting in defensive linemen development. With Colorado State, Burns helped the defensive line lead the FBS in team tackles for loss with 10.5, rank fourth with 4.0 team sacks and 12th in rushing defense, allowing 108.5 yards per game.

McDaniels will oversee GU's tight ends for the 2022 season. The Lorton, Virginia native comes to the Hilltop after a successful playing career at Delaware State and West Alabama, serving as a five-year starting quarterback.

Tinsley takes over as the team's running backs coach. He comes to the District after a full season with the University of Maine, guiding Freddie Brock to 5.45 yards per carry, ranking third in the CAA and 33rd in FCS. Prior to his time at Maine, Tinsley served assistant coaching stints at Union College, American International College, Morrisville State College and Bates College.

Zacharias spent four seasons with Patriot League-rival Fordham before coming to the Hilltop. He also had previous coaching stints at IUP, Central Michigan and Towson. In his time with the Rams, the Maryland native guided eight players to all-conference selections, including 2021 Patriot League Defensive Player of the Year Ryan Greenhagen.

Sgarlata has established a foundation for the program based on three principles ...

- **4 for 40** - a four-year commitment to Georgetown football leads to a 40-year relationship with special attention to their mind, body and spirit - Cura Personalis
- **Men for Others** - the Jesuit value of service to the community
- **SISU** - a Finnish phrase that translates into courage in the face of adversity

Rob Sgarlata (C'94, S'12) was named the 31st head football coach in GU program history in February 2014, becoming just the fourth person to have played football and graduated from Georgetown before earning the head coach title, joining Joe Reilly, Jack Hagerty and Maurice Dubofsky.

In his first eight years as head coach, Sgarlata has seen 46 student-athletes earn postseason All-Patriot League honors and 278 Georgetown football players have been named to the Patriot League Football Academic Honor Roll, including a program-record 51 student-athletes at the end of the 2020-21 school year.

In 2021, graduate student Ahmad Wilson became the first CoSIDA Academic All-American under Sgarlata's guidance.

In 2019, the Hoyas had a program-record nine players named to All-Patriot League teams. The GU defense finished the season ranked fourth in the country in scoring defense and pass efficiency defense, fifth in red zone defense, sixth in first down defense and seventh in total defense.

The Hoyas enjoyed one of the best improvement seasons in the country in 2018, finishing 5-6 overall and 4-2 in league play, the program's best Patriot League record since joining the conference in 2001. Georgetown enjoyed conference wins over Fordham, Lafayette, Lehigh and Bucknell. The double OT win over Lehigh was GU's first since 1925. Six Hoyas were named to All-Patriot League postseason teams.

Prior to being named head coach, Sgarlata had been on the Hoya coaching staff for 18 seasons, working with four different position groups and served as the assistant head coach and defensive coordinator for 10 seasons. During his tenure as defensive coordinator, he helped guide the Hoyas to the top-ranked scoring defense in the Patriot League in 2011 and the second-ranked scoring defense in 2012. The Hoyas featured four ECAC First Team selections and 20 All-Patriot League selections on defense.

Within the defense, Sgarlata coached All-Americans Michael Ononibaku (2005), Alex Buzbee (2006), Andrew Schaezke (2011) and Robert McCabe (2012). Both Schaezke and McCabe earned Patriot League Defensive Player of the year honors and Sgarlata also guided the 1996 Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference (MAAC) Defensive Player of the Year Janne Kouri.

Buzbee became the second Hoya in program history to make an NFL roster, suiting up for the Washington Redskins (2007-09). He also played for the Toronto Argonauts of the CFL from (2010-11).

A four-year letterwinner at Georgetown, Sgarlata is among the program's all-time leading rushers. He was a team captain as a senior in 1993 and received the John J. Hagerty Award. He excelled in the classroom, being named to the 1993 GTE District II Academic All-America Football Team and was also named to the MAAC Football League Academic All-Star Team.

Sgarlata graduated from Georgetown in 1994 from the College of Arts & Sciences with a degree in government and international relations. In May 2012, he completed his master's degree in sport industry management from Georgetown's School of Continuing Studies.

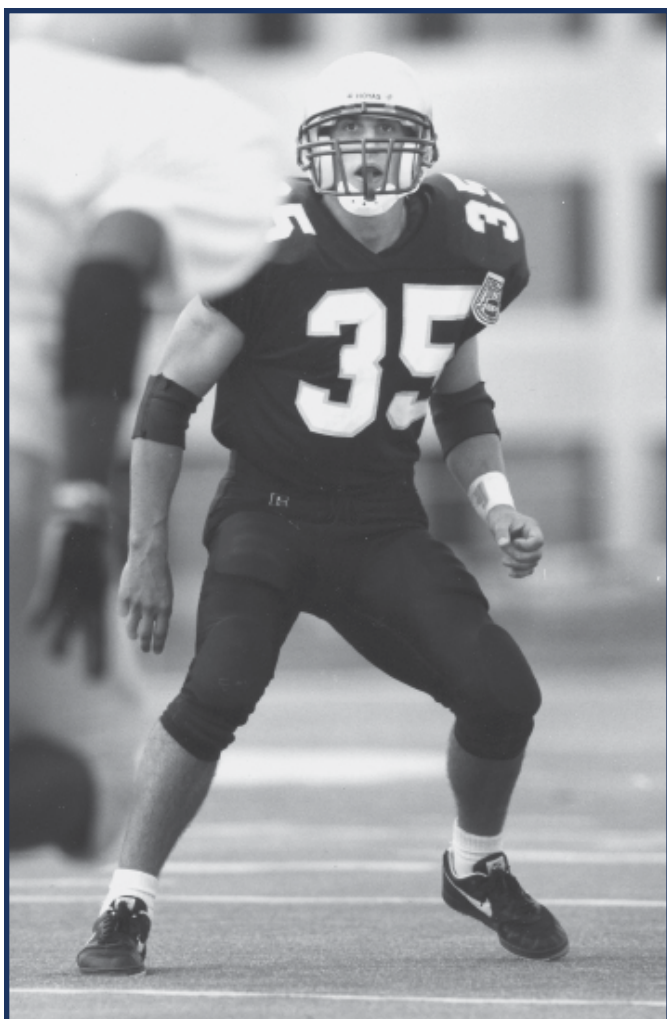

IN MEMORY OF JOE EACOBACCI

On September 11, 2001 the Georgetown community lost former Hoya football standout Joe Eacobacci. A 1996 graduate of the College of Arts and Sciences, he was an energy trader on the 105th floor of the North Tower of the World Trade Tower. Since the 2003 season, the No. 35 has been awarded as a living memorial to the spirit and memory of Joey.

Joe was a football student-athlete for former head coach Bob Benson between 1993 and 1995 and was the team's tri-captain his senior season. Benson believed that Eacobacci's mark on Georgetown was inked not only on the gridiron but also on the entire Georgetown campus.

"He had more friends than anybody, and that was what made him a beautiful person," Benson said in an interview with GU's student newspaper, The Hoya. "He would light up a room, he really could make people smile and bring enjoyment and pleasure to a room."

The student-athletes chosen to wear the No. 35 jersey have been selected based not only on on-field performance, but a combination of skills and intangibles that have cemented Eacobacci's place in Georgetown football history.
