OPENING KICKOFF

• Monmouth wraps up its non-conference schedule against Lehigh, coming off of its first CAA win last weekend against ninth-ranked Villanova. Lehigh continues its trend of playing challenging non-conference opponents in 2022, with four of its first five games coming against teams ranked or earning votes in the national polls.

A WIN WOULD

• A win would even Monmouth's record at Goodman Stadium at 3-3 and put the Hawks one-game back from being able to even up the series with the Mountain Hawks. A win would also give Monmouth a winning record against FCS non-conference opponents for the fifth time in the last six seasons.

COMMON OPPONENTS

• The two teams will share three opponents when the season is all said and done, with both teams securing wins over Georgetown. Lehigh dropped a 45-17 game against Villanova in Week 1 and will play Fordham next Saturday, a team that Monmouth dropped a 52-49 shootout to in the 2022 home opener.

HAWK HEADLINES

MONMOUTH IN THE RED ZONE

Monmouth's offense has been among the best in the country through four games when it enters its opponents' 20-yard line. The Hawks are sixth in the FCS in red zone offense, scoring on 94 percent of its drives. Monmouth has come away with points on 17 of its 18 red zone opportunities, highlighted by touchdowns on 16 trips. The Hawks were 5-for-5 on red zone chances at Villanova.

THE LAST THREE GAMES

Monmouth has scored at least 45 points in three consecutive games with 143 total points during the offensive hot streak. The last time the Hawks scored at least 45 in three straight games was the end of the 2019 regular season when they had four-straight 45-plus point performances en route to wrapping up the program's first Big South title. That season Monmouth had six games with at least 45 points.

CAA LEADERS

Monmouth has the top scoring offense in the CAA at 41 points per game. The Hawks also lead the conference with 23 total touchdowns, 16 rushing touchdowns, yards per rush (6.41), and in total offense at 501 yards per game.

Individually, Jaden Shirden is tops in rushing yards per game (166) and Owen Wright leads the conference in scoring (60) and total touchdowns (10).

FCS ELITE

Monmouth ranks in the top 10 in the FCS in three offensive categories. The Hawks are fifth in total offense (501 yards per game), ninth in rushing offense (243.8) and ninth in scoring offense (41 ppg),

Individually, Jaden Shirden is first in rush yards per carry (11.45), first in total rushing yards (664) and rushing yards per game (166), and fourth in all-purpose yards per game (169). Owen Wright leads the FCS in total touchdowns (10) and rushing touchdowns (9).

CAN'T CATCH SHIRDEN

As a rookie in 2021, Shirden had a pair of 75-yard touchdown runs against Holy Cross and Robert Morris and six of his eight career touchdown runs have been at least 55 yards in length after a 56-yarder against Villanova. Shirden's 649 rushing yards over the past three games are the most in a three-game span since Pete Guerriero ran for 697 yards in three games late in the 2019 season. Guerriero had games of 237 (Campbell), 240 (Hampton) and 200 (Holy Cross) to set the program's three-game record. Shirden's 649 ranks second only to Guerriero's 697. Shirden's three-straight 100-yard games are first for a Monmouth back since Juwon Farri did it during the Spring 2021 season. The last time a back had four straight 100-yard games was Guerriero to end the 2019 season, when he totaled 804 yards over the final four contests.

JADEN MAKES MORE HISTORY

Jaden Shirden became the 16th player in Monmouth history to rush for 1,000 career yards - achieving the feat in just 15 games with his 211-yard performance against Villanova. The sophomore's 211-yard effort was the 14th 200-yard game in Monmouth history and the first by a Villanova opponent since 1995 (Jerry Azumah). Shirden became the third Hawk with multiple 200-yard games, joining Pete Guerriero (five times) and David Sinisi (four times).

SHIRDEN RUNS PAST RAMS

Jaden Shirden was named the CAA Football Co-Offensive Player of the Week on September 12 after his scintillating effort on the ground against Fordham. The sophomore back set a program record with 299 rushing yards on 12 carries and scored a pair of touchdowns on runs of 80 and 95 yards, respectively. His 299 yards are the most rushing yards in an FCS game this season, they eclipsed the previous single-game record of 247 set by David Sinisi in 2008 and the 200+ yard performance was the most since Pete Guerriero ran for 220 against Holy Cross in 2019. Shirden averaged 24.9 yards per carry in the game, setting the program record for per game average with a minimum of 10 carries. Shirden had four explosive runs in the game, with carries of 35, 37, 80 and 95 yards, which is the longest run in an FCS game this season.

SHIRDEN'S RECORD RUN

Sophomore Jaden Shirden's 95-yard touchdown run in the first quarter against Fordham is the longest run in the FCS this season. Shirden's touchdown scamper also the third longest run in school history. Former backs David Sinisi (2007) and Jim Varick (1994) own the Monmouth record of 99-yard runs, each done against Sacred Heart. Pete Guerriero's 93-yard touchdown run in the 2019 NCAA Second Round against JMU was the most recent 90+ yard rush by a Hawk. Monmouth's defense has allowed just one 90+ yard run, in the 2013 opener against Montana State (90).

OWEN WRIGHT: TD MACHINE

Running back Owen Wright has been a touchdown machine through the first four games of 2022 with an FCS leading 10 total touchdowns. Wright scored twice at New Hampshire, had three rushing touchdowns against Fordham, two rushing and one receiving in the win over Georgetown and two more rushing scores at Villanova. His three rushing touchdowns against Fordham are the most for a Monmouth player in a game this season. Wright has 11 career rushing touchdowns at Monmouth after running for two in 2021.

MONMOUTH AGAINST THE PATRIOT LEAGUE

Monmouth has three Patriot League opponents on its 2022 schedule. The Hawks dropped a shootout with Fordham, 52-49, in their home opener and are 3-2 all-time against the Rams. Monmouth has won all three meetings against Georgetown after a 45-6 win this season, and the hawks are 3-5 all-time against Lehigh. In total, Monmouth owns an 18-13 record against the conference.

MUSKETT'S STREAK CONTINUES

Tony Muskett has thrown at least one touchdown pass in every game of his career dating back to the Spring 2021 season. He has at least two touchdown passes in 12 of his 19 career games and has 41 career touchdown passes to go along with just 12 career interceptions. Muskett ranks fourth among active FCS players in career passing efficiency (146.71) and seventh in total offense per game (247.9 yards). Muskett set a new career standard with 78 rushing yards at Villanova.

MUSKETT CLIMBING THE MONMOUTH RANKS

Tony Muskett, who has started 19 consecutive contests for the Blue & White will continue his assault on the Monmouth record books this season. The junior is sixth all-time in passing yards, career completions and total offense and fourth in passing touchdowns. His 41 touchdowns and 12 interceptions already ranks him top in passing efficiency and his 63.7 percent completion percentage is second all-time behind former Hawk Brett Burke (2005-08).

KEARNEY MAKING PLAYS

Wide receiver Assanti Kearney turned one of his best individual performances against Fordham. Kearney set new career highs with five catches for 121 yards, including three explosive plays. Kearney had receptions of 35, 28 and 25 yards against Fordham, all of which are the top three longest receptions of his career. In the win at Villanova, Kearney registered his first-career two-touchdown game with receiving touchdowns of 21 and 18 yards, respectively.

DO YOUR DANCE

Alex Bryant has made the most of his opportunities this season in the absence of Dymere Miller. Bryant had a career-high eight catches for 67 yards and registered his first-career touchdown reception in the season opener at UNH after Miller left the game. Bryant led Monmouth in every receiving category with 13 targets on the night. The junior followed that performance with a career-long 60-yard touchdown reception against Fordham and had a team-high five receptions against Georgetown. Miller returned to the Monmouth lineup in the Villanova win.

DEFENSE HUSHES HOYAS

Monmouth's defense bounced back in a big way in the win over Georgetown by limiting the Hoyas to six points. The six points were the lowest total since the Hawks held Presbyterian scoreless on Oct. 12, 2019. Monmouth's defense also smothered Georgetown on the ground by holding the Hoyas to 61 rushing yards. It was the first time the Hawks have held a team to less than 75 yards rushing since the matchup with Princeton in 2021. Monmouth's 39-point win was also its largest margin of victory since the 45-0 win over Presbyterian in 2019.

FROM THE JUMP

Only two players in the country have started at quarterback in every game of their careers and thrown at least 40 touchdowns. Monmouth's junior QB Tony Muskett has thrown 41 career touchdown passes in 19 starts over his three seasons. Jackson St. sophomore Shedeur Sanders started all 13 games as a freshman in 2021 and tossed 30 touchdown passes en route to winning the Stats Perform Jerry Rice Award as the nation's top freshman. Sanders has 44 passing TDs in 18 career games.

PUNTING WITH A PURPOSE

Ryan Kost holds Monmouth's all-time punt average record at 43.3 yards per punt across 103 career punts. Kost had three 50+ yard punts against Georgetown, including a career-best 67-yard boot. He has four 50+ yarders this season and is averaging 49.3 yards per punt this season.

DID YOU KNOW?

With his three touchdown passes against Villanova, Tony Muskett moved past Kyle Frazier for fourth most touchdown passes in school history with 41. Muskett has thrown those TDs in 19 games, while Frazier threw 38 touchdowns in 38 career games played. Muskett will need 12 more to move past Dan Sabella (51) for third place. Brian Boland sits in third (58) while Kenji Bahar - the last starting quarterback before Muskett - finished his storied carrier with the current school record of 70 touchdowns in 48 career games played.

HEAD COACH KEVIN CALLAHAN



The only head coach in the history of football at Monmouth, Kevin Callahan has developed a winning tradition in West Long Branch. Callahan, whose 175 career wins is sixth among active coaches at the FCS level, has guided a once fledgling non-scholarship program to a top-ten national ranking and multiple NCAA playoff berths. He is one of

two FCS coaches with 160+ wins all at one institution and his 29 years as a head coach is tied for the fourth-most among active coaches. In 2019 he was named AFCA Region II Coach of the Year and he is a two-time finalist for the Eddie Robinson Award, bestowed upon the nation's top FCS Coach.

In his 30th season at the helm of the Hawks in the fall of 2021, Callahan has amassed a 174-131 record while his teams have captured seven conference titles and three FCS playoff appearances. Along the way, Monmouth has been ranked among the top 20 in total offense on four occasions and in total defense five times. Meanwhile, over 170 players have earned conference recognition, while numerous Hawks have earned regional and national honors. Regarded as an outstanding coach by his peers, Callahan served as the President of the FCS Football Coaches Committee in 2007-08 and served a 10-year term as a member of the committee. Under his watch, 12 former Hawks have earned spots on NFL rosters, including Super Bowl Champion Chris Hogan and Miles Austin who was an All-Pro wide receiver for the Dallas Cowboys.

Academically, Callahan's squads have consistently performed at a high level. Fourteen players have been named to the prestigious FCS ADA Academic All-Star team (average of 55 FCS players selected per season) a total 19 times. Monmouth has had at least one representative on the Capital One Academic All-District Team in 18 of the last 20 seasons, with Justin Rosato and Justin Szuba earning Academic All-American honors.

Callahan and the Hawks closed out the Big South era in 2021 with a 6-1 league mark and a 7-4 overall record. Monmouth placed 16 players on All-Big South teams, including 11 first team selections. The Hawks featured the top scoring unit in the conference at 32.0 points per game and had eight of 11 starters earn all-league honors. AJ Farris, Juwon Farri and Tony Muskett earned All-America honors while Farris was named as the nation's top offensive center by winning the Rimington Award for the second straight season. Monmouth amassed a 23-3 conference record over the final five seasons they were a member of the Big South Conference. Wide receiver Lonnie Moore IV and tight end Gene Scott would earn tryouts with NFL teams at the conclusion of the season.

The Hawks continued their upward trajectory in the shorted 2020-21 campaign as they earned their second consecutive Big South Championship. Callahan was named conference Coach of the Year for the fifth time in his career as the program ended the season ranked 10th in both the American Football Coaches Association Poll (AFCA) and

the Athlon Sports Poll, while finishing 11th in the STATS Perform Media Poll. Monmouth was also the top-ranked private school in the FCS after a near-upset of eventual Sam Houston in the FCS Playoffs. The Hawks claimed two NCAA statistical champions in Juwon Farri (scoring) and the team on defense for most sacks (4.50 per game). Farri, the Big South Offensive Player of the Year, was a consensus Second Team All-America selection and was top-3 nationally in a number of rushing statistics. Freshman quarterback Tony Muskett earned Big South Offensive Freshman of the Year en route to a fifth-place finish for the Jerry Rice Award (FCS Freshman of the Year).

Monmouth football reached new heights in 2019, winning its first Big South Championship and first playoff game, en route to a No. 12 final ranking while setting a plethora of team and individual records. The Hawks set records for overall wins with 11, home wins (7) and put together a program record nine-game winning streak. Monmouth had a program-best 17 All-Big South selections led by fifth-year senior quarterback Kenji Bahar, who was also the Big South Offensive Player of the Year. Seven different Hawks took home All-American honors including running back Pete Guerriero who led the NCAA in rushing en route to consensus All-American status. Guerriero, who broke the Monmouth rushing and all-purpose yard records became Monmouth's first Walter Payton Award Finalist, finishing in third place. Callahan earned his first Big South Coach of the Year honor as voted on by his peers.

In 2018 Monmouth's offense was one of the top in all of the FCS setting over 15 individual and team records. The Hawks completed their second consecutive eight-win season while finishing second in the Big South. A Monmouth record 12 Hawks earned spots on the All-Big South Team while freshman running back Juwon Farri earned Big South Offensive Freshman of the Year and finished fifth in the Jerry Rice Award voting. Wideout Reggie White Jr. set almost every single-season and career receiving mark and his efforts were rewarded with numerous All-America nods and a free agent contract with the New York Giants.

Prior to accepting the head coaching position at Monmouth in August of 1992, Callahan served as assistant coach at Colgate University for eight seasons. While with the Raiders, Callahan served as assistant head coach and defensive coordinator, while tutoring the linebackers and secondary. Callahan groomed his defensive coordinating skills at Wagner College from 1981 to 1983. In 1980, Callahan served as an assistant coach under Frank Maloney at Syracuse as the assistant offensive backfield coach for the Orangemen.

A native of Elmira, N.Y., Callahan began his coaching career as a graduate assistant for three seasons at the University of Albany from 1977 to 1979. Callahan was a two-year standout defensive back at the University of Rochester. He earned a bachelor's degree in history from Rochester in 1977.

Callahan and his wife, Ann Marie, reside in Spring Lake Heights. They have two children, Kevin Jr. and Julia. His son Kevin Jr, a five-year veteran of collegiate coaching, recently joined the Hawk coaching staff mentoring the wideouts.

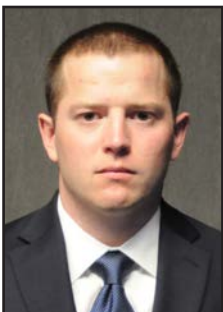

KESSLER STADIUM: HOME OF THE HAWKS

Monmouth University plays all of its home football and lacrosse games at Kessler Stadium on the school's beautiful 156-acre campus in West Long Branch, New Jersey. On September 2, 2017, the Hawks celebrated the start of the 25th year of football by cutting the ribbon on the 16 million dollar Kessler Stadium. The Hawks went on to defeat Lafayette 31-12 in the first contest in the new stadium en route to going 5-0 at home, one of four times in school history MU has gone unbeaten at home. Monmouth dominated in those five wins, outscoring opponents 216-113 while racking up 43.2 points per game. In all, over 16,000 fans came out to watch the Hawks in their new home, including a sellout of 4,235 on homecoming against Liberty. The 2019 season saw the Hawks set a record for home wins while going unbeaten for the fourth time in history at 7-0. Included in those wins was the program's first ever NCAA Playoff win, a 44-27 victory over Holy Cross on November 30, 2019.

The facility expanded seating to over 4,200, stretching from endzone to endzone. It also features a ticket booth, restroom facilities, concession stands and storage. The third floor of the stadium houses the press box, coaches booths, radio and broadcast booths and a replay booth. The second floor features a full donor deck, where members of the Blue/White Club can enjoy the game as well as pre and post game events. It was announced in July of 2017 that Alumni John and Henni Kantor Kessler, class of 1969 and 1968, respectively, gave a generous seven-figure gift to ensure that the Kessler name continues to be synonymous with Monmouth Athletics. In the summer of 2014, the playing surface was refitted with a state-of-the-art artificial surface by the FieldTurf Corporation.

For the opening of the Monmouth Hawks' first football season in 1993, a 3,000-seat grandstand with press box was built. It was the Kessler's who stepped up to the plate in 1993, donating \$250,000 toward construction of the original facility. On September 25, 1993, the first-ever game was played at Kessler Field as the Hawks hosted Sacred Heart University. Although the facility officially seats 4,600 fans, a record crowd of 6,233 packed Kessler Field on Homecoming Weekend in 1993.

Behind the east endzone of Kessler Stadium sits Monmouth's 57 million dollar OceanFirst Bank Center, which houses the football locker room. Opened in the Fall of 2009, the building's indoor arena and track provides a better training facility for the team's winter conditioning program as well as rehabilitation efforts. The building features meeting rooms that are large enough to accommodate the entire team but also areas small enough where individual positions can meet.

**Kenji Bahar '19 | 2015-19 | Quarterback**

Bahar became the first Monmouth QB to suit up in an NFL game when he was activated for Baltimore Ravens' 2021 Week 16 game at Cincinnati. Bahar was drafted by the USFL's Houston Gamblers and started three games, leading Houston to two wins to end the season.

Pete Guerriero | 2016-19 | Running Back

Guerriero has spent time with three NFL teams, including the New York Jets, Carolina Panthers and Pittsburgh Steelers. Most recently, Guerriero played in the USFL with the New Jersey Generals.

Reggie White Jr. '18 | 2015-19 | Wide Receiver

White Jr. signed with the New York Giants following the 2019 NFL Draft and then with the Montreal Alouettes in 2021. White Jr. scored two touchdowns in five games in 2021 and has 50 catches for 668 yards and two scores in 12 games this year.

Jake Powell '18 | 2015-19 | Tight End

Powell was signed by the New Orleans Saints as an undrafted free agent following the 2019 NFL Draft. Powell started at tight end for the New York Guardians in 2020 and was in training camp with the New York Giants in 2019.

Mike Basile '18 | 2014-17 | Safety

Basile was in training camp with the New York Giants in 2018.

Alex Thompson '17 | 2014-17 | Center

Thompson was signed by the Baltimore Ravens in 2018 and played with the Arizona Hotshots in the Alliance of American Football in 2019.

Matt White '18 | 2014-17 | Punter

White was signed by the Hamilton Tiger-Cats of the Canadian Football League in 2020 and appeared in the USFL with the New Orleans Breakers in 2022.

Darnell Leslie '17 | 2012-16 | Defensive End

Leslie played in training camp for the Dallas Cowboys in 2017 and also spent time with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers, Pittsburgh Steelers, BC Lions (CFL), San Antonio Commanders (AAF) and New York Guardians (XFL).

Hakeem Valles '15 | 2011-15 | Tight End

Valles was signed by the Arizona Cardinals as an undrafted free agent following the 2016 NFL Draft. He played 11 games with Arizona and made one start, before playing four games for Detroit in 2017 and 2018. Valles also spent time with the New York Giants.

Monmouth's first Super Bowl Champion, Hogan won two titles with the New England Patriots in 2016 and 2018. Monmouth's first – and highest – NFL draft pick, who was chosen by the Miami Dolphins in the fifth round of the 2009 NFL Draft. Nalbone spent time with seven different organizations over four NFL seasons.

Miles Austin '18 | 2002-05 | Wide Receiver

Austin played 10 NFL seasons with three teams, including eight with the Dallas Cowboys. Austin was a Pro Bowl selection in 2009 and 2010. Austin had 361 career receptions and 37 touchdowns, including 81 for 1,320 yards and 11 TDs in 2009.

Mike Castellano '06 | 2004-06 | Linebacker

Castellano signed a contract with Team Arkansas of the then-upstart All-American Football League in 2008.

Matt Hill '11 | 2003-06 | Safety

Hill became the first Hawk to sign a professional contract with a team from the Canadian Football League when he inked a deal with the Calgary Stampeders in 2007.

Will Holder '13 | 1993-97 | Wide Receiver

Holder is Monmouth's first professional football player when he joined the New Jersey Gladiators in 2002. Holder spent time on three Arena Football League teams from 2002-08 and was in training camp with the Oakland Raiders in 2005.

ADDITIONAL NOTES**FORDHAM SHOOTOUT**

Monmouth's game against Fordham was the definition of a shootout. The two teams combined for 101 total points, the most combined points in a Monmouth game since a 54-47 win over Wagner in 2018. Monmouth totaled 13 explosive plays (page 16) in the game, including seven in the passing game, five on the ground and one on special teams. On the other side, Fordham also had 13 explosive plays, including seven passing plays of 20 or more yards. As a team, Monmouth ran for 390 yards and racked up 713 yards of total offense, both totals rank as the second most in program history. The Hawks ran for 417 yards against La Salle in 1997 and had 790 yards of total offense opposite Gardner-Webb in 2018.

VINES OWNS THE HAWKS' LONGEST GAMES PLAYED STREAK

Senior long snapper Kent Vines has played in the last 44 games for the Hawks, the longest streak on the team. Vines served as the primary long snapper for every game since the 2018 season, earning All-Big South honors three consecutive seasons.

FARRI AND THE CENTURY MARK

Juwon Farri's success in reaching the 100-yard rushing mark is tied to Monmouth's success as a team. The Hawks' standout back had three 100-yard games in 2021, all in Monmouth victories. During Farri's career, Monmouth is 11-1 when he eclipses the 100-yard mark and the Hawks have won eleven straight games when he accomplishes the feat. His collegiate debut was the lone Monmouth loss, when he ran for 111 yards on 13 carries at Eastern Michigan in 2018.

LEADERSHIP ROLES

Five Hawks, three on defense and two on offense, will lead the Monmouth program this year as team captains. LB Da'Quan Grimes, DB/PR Eddie Morales III, QB Tony Muskett, OL Justin Szuba and DB Tyrese Wright will serve in leadership roles. Grimes and Szuba both missed the 2021 season with injuries. Muskett is Monmouth's three-year starter at quarterback who finished the 2021 season with 2,651 passing yards and 25 touchdowns. Morales III is a dual-threat defensive back and special teams' standout who was a First Team All-Big South honoree at both corner and punt returner. Wright has played in every game of his three-year career, including 23 starts in the secondary. He is coming off a 2021 Second Team All-Big South honor after leading the Hawks in tackles (71) and solo stops (49).

GOOD WORKS TEAM

Monmouth graduate student Justin Szuba was one of 114 nominees announced as nominees for the 2022 Allstate AFCA Good Works Team by Allstate and the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA). Szuba, an offensive lineman, was one of just 13 players from the FCS on the list of nominees and the only player from a CAA team. The former sophomore All-American missed last season with an injury but was a Preseason All-Big South selection prior to the year. The right tackle has a 4.0 grade point average in history and is a two-time Chi Alpha Sigma honor society member. Szuba is a two-time all-conference selection who started the first three games of 2022.

ALL-AMERICA STATUS

The Monmouth University football program had a pair of student-athletes named to the STATS Perform Preseason All-America Team. Senior running back Juwon Farri was a second team choice, while graduate student punter Ryan Kost earned a spot on the third team. Kost also earned a spot on the 2022 HERO Sports FCS Preseason All-America Third Team. Farri was a First Team All-Big South selection last season after he totaled 705 yards on the ground and eight rushing touchdowns despite missing three games due to injury. Kost was a First Team All-Big South choice as a senior in 2021 and claimed his second straight all-league award. He averaged 44.3 yards per punt which led the conference and ranked eighth in the NCAA.

SWEETNESS

Juwon Farri was named to the STATS Perform Walter Payton Award Preseason Watch List. The award is given annually to the top offensive player in the FCS following the regular season. Farri's inclusion is the second of his career and he is the fifth Hawk in program history to be named to the watch list, joining Monmouth greats David Sinisi (2008), Reggie White Jr. (2018), Pete Guerriero (2019) and Kenji Bahar (2019). Farri finished eighth in the voting during the Spring 2021 campaign.

MUSKETT'S WIDEOUT WEAPONS

Monmouth's top three wideouts from 2021 departed the program as Lonnie Moore IV (graduation), Terrance Greene Jr. (JMU graduate transfer) and Zach Tredway (graduation) left a void on the outside for Tony Muskett. Moore IV and Greene Jr. both occupy spots on the program's all-time top ten lists for receptions, yardage and touchdowns. The Hawks will look to fill that productivity with some familiar and new faces. Junior Dymere Miller had 20 catches for 267 yards and a TD last year, while graduate student Joey Aldarelli had five touchdown receptions and senior Assanti Kearney had one TD catch in 2021. A pair of transfers, Darrion Carrington from Yale, and Ugo Obasi from Virginia will bolster Monmouth's pass-catching corps.

RETURNING RUSHERS

Monmouth brought back its top three running backs from 2021 in Juwon Farri (705 yards – 8 TD), Jaden Shirden (497 yards – 3 TD) and Owen Wright (370 yards – 2 TD). As a team, Monmouth ran for 1,602 yards and 19 touchdowns a season ago. A total of 1,494 yards (93.2 percent) and 18 touchdowns (94.7 percent) returned to the backfield for the Hawks in 2022.

PRESEASON PREDICTIONS

Four Monmouth University football student-athletes were recognized with Colonial Athletic Association Football Preseason accolades. Eddie Morales III earned Preseason All-Conference Team recognition on special teams at punt returner, while Tony Muskett claimed the lone quarterback spot on offense. In addition, running back Juwon Farri and punter Ryan Kost were Honorable Mention choices. As a team, Monmouth was picked to finish 10th in the 13-team preseason poll.

ADDITIONAL NOTES**COACHING ADDITIONS**

Head Coach Kevin Callahan welcomed the addition of two new assistant coaches prior to the spring 2022 season, Jimmy Robertson (Quarterbacks/Pass Game Coordinator) and Bishop Neal (Defensive Backs).

Robertson came to Monmouth after five seasons at FDU Madison, including the final year when he served as Head Coach of the Devils. Robertson, the 2021 Middle Atlantic Conference (MAC) Football Coach of the Year, guided the Devils to a record of 7-4 in his first year as the head coach in Madison. The Devils won their first ECAC Bowl game in program history in 2021, with FDU counting an All-American, two all-region and six all-conference honorees among its ranks.

Neal arrived at Monmouth from Duquesne where he served as defensive backs coach and pass game coordinator for the 2021 season. Neal spent 2016 through 2020 at his alma mater, Saint Francis first as Defensive Backs Coach before earning the role of Defensive Coordinator prior to the 2019 season. As a player and a coach, Neal was involved in the most successful run in SFPA history, one which saw the Red Flash make its first appearance in the NCAA playoffs in 2016.

MONMOUTH AGAINST THE COLONIAL ATHLETIC ASSOCIATION

Monmouth is one of 13 current members of the CAA in football, with the addition of Campbell and North Carolina A&T set for 2023. The Hawks are 17-29 all-time against current CAA opponents. Monmouth has never played three teams in the conference; Elon, Richmond and William & Mary. The Hawks' wins over Hampton (3-0) came as a member of the Big South Conference, while UAlbany (5-12) and Stony Brook (5-4) were foes at times during Monmouth's time as a member of the Northeast Conference. Prior meetings with Delaware (0-1), Maine (0-3), Rhode Island (1-1) and Towson (1-7) were non-conference contests. Monmouth opened its 2022 season with a loss at New Hampshire (0-1) and improved to 2-0 all-time against Villanova with a thrilling 49-42 victory on September 24.
