### Setting The Scene

The Morgan State University football team will travel to Houston, TX to face the Tigers of Texas Southern University. The Bears had its two-game win streak ended by South Carolina State in an overtime thriller in Orangeburg, SC. The Bears will look to end its season on a high note as they prepare to take on Southwestern Athletic Conference opponent Texas Southern. Kickoff from the Astrodome is set for 7:00 p.m. EDT and will be broadcast by WEAA Radio – 88.9 FM.

*Flashback to Sept. 20, 1997* - QB Willie McGirt threw three touchdown passes to help lead Morgan State to a 24-17 victory over Texas Southern at Hughes Stadium before 3,550 fans. MSU's receiver trio of Anthony Collins (6-106 yds), Na'im Greene (3-82 yds) and Fred Jenkins (1-14 yds) each collected a touchdown pass. TSU was led by QB Jarrett Harper who finished the game completing 11-of-32 passes for 187 yards with an interception. With the win Morgan State improved to 2-1, while the Tigers fell to 2-1.

Morgan State completed the game with 404 yards of total offense, while the Tigers racked up 266. TSU quarterbacks were sacked five times by the Bears defense.

## HEAD COACH STEVE WILSON

Steve Wilson (Howard, '79) former defensive coordinator at Bowie State University has been named the new head football coach for Texas Southern University. While at Bowie State, Coach Wilson's defensive squad ranked first in nine of the ten defensive superlatives in the Central Intercollegiate Athletic Association (CIAA), including ranked first in total defense. The Durham, NC native received his business degree from Howard University in marketing in 1979. Wilson played at the wide receiver position in college he was named All-MEAC and honorable-mention All-American. During his career, he held school records for receptions (94), receiving yards (1,339) and touchdown receptions (12). Wilson still holds records for kick-off returns (40) in a season. In 1979, Wilson signed as a free agent with the Dallas Cowboys. He played in 48 regular season games, and five playoff games including 1981 and 1982 NFC Championships. In 1982 he joined the Denver Broncos for seven seasons and was part of two AFC Championships and two Super Bowls. He posted 13 seasons with Howard University and turned the football program into one of the most respected in the country.

## SCOUTING TEXAS SOUTHERN

- The 'Dawgs are 0-10 (0-7 SWAC) after last weekend's 28-0 loss at Southern. The Tigers are ranked last in the SWAC.

- Texas Southern's last victory was October 25, 2003 when they defeated Mississippi Valley State 30-17 in overtime. The Tigers are currently on a 13-game losing streak.

- The Tigers are averaging 142.3 yards of offense per game and allowing 357.7 yards per game to its opposition. The one area the team has not struggled is in kickoff returns. The Tigers are averaging 18.0 yards per return. The Tigers are ranked last in the MEAC in scoring offense (6.1), last in scoring defense (31.8), last in rushing offense (63.6) and in rushing defense (215.7).

- The Tigers offense is led by QB Tino Edgecombe (118-45, 0 TDs, 11 INTs, 56.6 avg.), RB Raymond Gilmore (137-399, 2.9 avg., 1 TDs), RB Jason Walker (32-145, 4.5 avg., 0 TDs), WR Tyrone Reed (14-201, 14.4 avg., 0 TDs) and WR Raymond Gilmore (14-13, 1.3 avg., 0 TDs).

On defense, Texas Southern is led by DB Stacey Thomas (94 tackles (46 solo, 9.5 TFLs, 3 FR), LBs Robert Thomas (93 tackles (43 solo) 8.5 TFLs, 1.5 sacks, 1 INT), and Fredicc Brock (71 tackles (33 solo), 8.5 TFLs, 3 sacks, 6 QBH, 1 FR).

**...RETURNED KICKOFF FOR A TOUCHDOWN** was in 2004 when Rodrick Wolfe galloped for a score vs. Gardner-Webb.

**...RETURNED PUNT FOR A TOUCHDOWN** was in 2003 when William DeShazo took a Hampton punt 73 yards to paydirt.

**...RUSHED FOR MORE THAN 400 YARDS** was in 1996 against Virginia Union when the Bears compiled 447 yards.

**...RETURNED AN INTERCEPTION FOR A TOUCHDOWN** was on Nov. 6, 2004 against Norfolk State. Cornerback Keion Gray picked off a Dontrell Leonard pass and raced 81 yards untouched to paydirt.

**...SHUT OUT AN OPPONENT** was Oct 13, 2001 against Savannah State. The game was played before 14,801 fan for MSU's homecoming. The Bears 26-0 white washing was the first time they shut out an opponent since their 1996 contest against Cheney State. The was also their first on-campus victory since 1979 when MSU defeated the Aggies of North Carolina A&T.

**...PASSED FOR MORE THAN 500 YARDS** was on Oct. 6, 2001 against North Carolina A&T. LeJominick Washington had a sensational night when he passed for a school record 551 total yards and a record tying 4 touchdowns.

**...HAD A RUNNING BACK GAIN MORE THAN 200 YARDS IN A GAME** was on Sept. 19, 2002 against Howard

## **MORGAN STATE BEARS**

Football has been played in a structured form on the campus of Morgan State University since 1920. In one of its most successful periods, the Bears went 60-4-7 in its first nine seasons from 1930 to 1938. MSU also had a run from 1962 to 1968, in which it posted a 56-5 record and captured titles at the 1965 Orange Blossom Classic (36-7 - Florida A&M) and the 1966 Tangerine Bowl (14-6 - West Chester State). The Bears' other bowl appearance came at the 1970 Boardwalk Bowl in which they suffered a 38-23 defeat vs. Delaware. Morgan State's all-time football record stands at 372-306-33. Recently the Bears have struggled with their last winning season coming in 1979 when they posted a 9-2 record and made an appearance in the Division II playoffs. Famous former Morgan State football players include Pro Football Hall of Fame members **Roosevelt Brown, Len Ford, Leroy Kelly** and **Willie Lanier**. Another notable player from Morgan State's past is **John 'Frenchy' Fuqua**, the intended receiver on Franco Harris' Immaculate Reception.

## **HEAD COACH DONALD HILL-ELEY**

Donald Hill-Eley begins his 3rd season as Morgan State's head coach with a veteran offensive unit and a talented defensive squad with a solid starting lineup on both sides of the ball. In his first season the Bears fell one game shy of winning the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference Championship as they recorded their first winning season since 1979. Hill followed that season by placing another notch in his belt as the Bears completed the season with a 6-5 overall record. It marked the Bears' second straight winning season and its first-back-to-back winning seasons since 1970-71. In 2002, the Bears ranked 3rd in the MEAC in total offense with a 381.2 yards per game average. In 2003, 2nd in offense (198.7 ypg), ranked 3rd in rushing defense (119.1 ypg), ranked 4th in total offense (359 ypg), and 4th in scoring offense (28.9 ppg). Prior to arriving in Baltimore, Hill-Eley served as offensive coordinator for four seasons at Hampton University. During his stint at the Virginia-based institution, Hill-Eley was instrumental in the Pirates winning the mythical Black College National Championship, two MEAC titles and the 1999 McDonald's Heritage Bowl. Hill-Eley's coaching career took him on a pair of coaching stops in the Canadian Football League. During the 1996 and 1997 seasons, he assisted on a pair of Toronto Argonaut teams that captured Grey Cup Championships. In 1994 and 1995, he worked as a wide receiver coach for the Baltimore Stallions. In 1995, the Stallions captured the Grey Cup. Hill-Eley's coaching career began with a pair of graduate assistant jobs, first at his alma mater Virginia Union in 1991 and then at Hampton University in 1992 and 1993.

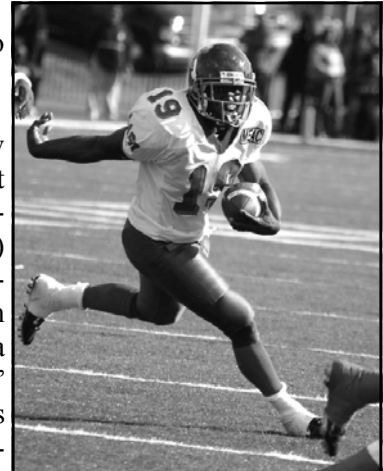
**...RETURNED A FUMBLE FOR A TOUCHDOWN** was Sept. 13, 2003 against South Carolina State. The Bears' Albert Gamble scooped up a Reese McCampbell fumble and raced 52-yards for a touchdown.

**...LAST TIME AN OPPONENT BLOCKED A PUNT AND SCORED** was on Nov. 3, 2001 against Norfolk State. The Spartans blocked a punt and Anthony Dillard fell on it in the end zone for a TD.

**...RETURNED A KICKOFF FOR A TOUCHDOWN** was on Sept. 4, 2001 against Bowie State when Isaac Redman a kickoff 85 yards for a score to end the 3rd quarter.

its overall record under Hill-Eley to 17-16.

· Morgan State wideout **Tommy Manus** has been productively quiet throughout the 2004 campaign. Manus (WR, 6-4, 210, Sr. Dallas, TX) tied a school record with a game-high 12 receptions for 109 yards in the Bears loss against South Carolina State and so far this season, "Taco" has collected a team-high 58 catches for 589 yards with five touchdowns...just five catches away from setting a new school record for most receptions in a single season. The senior is ranked No. 12 in 1-AA (1<sup>st</sup> in the MEAC) in receptions per game (5.8/game) and 7<sup>th</sup> in the MEAC in reception yards (53.9/avg). NFL.com has the senior wideout tabbed as one to watch when draft day comes around.

· A second look at the stat sheet for Morgan State's last game against Texas Southern shows that the Bears' defense held the Tigers ground game to just 79 yards and the offense finished with 266 total yards. RB Thomas Sieh finished with 77 yards on 9 carries with a touchdown and Leon Clark added 22 yards. The Tigers averaged 2.1 yards per carry.

· The Bears succeeded running against the Tigers in their own right, averaging 3.9 yards per carry and finished the game with 147 yards on the ground led by RB Fred Jenkins. Jenkins recorded a game-high 84 yards on 12 carries with a touchdown. QB Willie McGirt had a solid night as he completed 12-of-21 passes for 215 yards, including 3 TDs. WR Anthony Collins finished with a game-high 106 yards and a TD.

Morgan State enters the Texas Southern game averaging 36.6 points per game, while the Tigers are scoring 6.1 ppg.

· Through 10 games in '04, the Bears are averaging 218.3 yards per game on the ground and are ranked No. 4 in the MEAC in rushing offense. Rookie sensation **Jason Jackson (So., RB, 5'10, 200, Oxon Hill, Md., tr-Lacawanna CC/Oxon Hill HS)** is leading the way for the Bears ground attack. "Action" has recorded a whopping six 100-yard games and leads MSU with 172 carries for 972 yards including 7 touchdowns. He leads the MEAC in rushing by averaging an incredible 121.5 yards per game, ranking him No. 7 in 1-AA. Last week he recorded 145 yards on 14 carries against South Carolina State who entered the game with one of the best defenses in the na-

**... RETURNED AN INTERCEPTION FOR A TOUCHDOWN** was on Oct. 2, 2004 against Bethune-Cookman. Isaac Jackson collected a 53-yard interception return for a touchdown.

**...RETURNED A FUMBLE FOR A TOUCHDOWN** was on Sept. 5, 2002 against Towson. A fumble by MSU'S Jon Voroshilin was returned by TU'S Ben Wallace for a 30-yard touchdown.

**...SHUT OUT MORGAN STATE** was on Nov. 17, 1998 against Hampton. The Pirates handed the Bears their worst loss of the 1998 season with a 55-0 victory.

**...GAINED OVER 300 YARDS RUSHING** was on Oct. 2, 2004 vs. Bethune-Cookman. The 'Cats gained 455 rushing yards.

**...GAINED 300 YARDS PASSING** was Nov. 13, 2004 against S.C. State. The Bulldogs threw for 382 total yards.

**...HAD A RUNNING BACK RUSH FOR MORE THAN 100 YARDS IN A GAME** was Oct. 2, 2004 against Bethune-Cookman. Eric Weems (136 yds) and P.J. Smith (128 yds) both ran for over 100 yards.

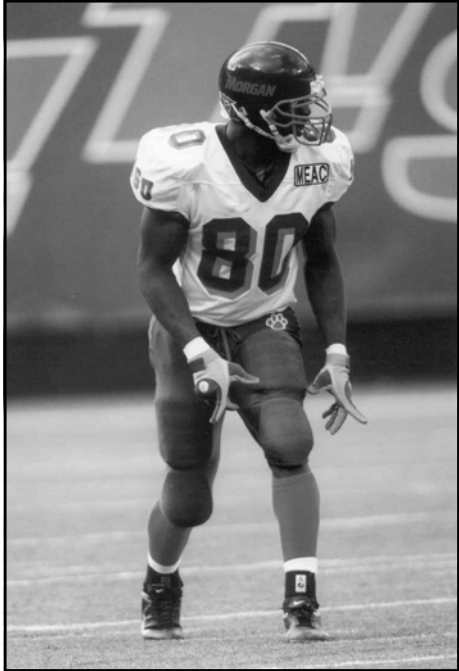
## MEAC MOVES TO THE TOP

**K.D. REWRITING THE RECORD BOOK**

Morgan State wideout Kelvin Dickens enjoyed another productive day, as he recorded 5 receptions for 65 yards to help lead the Bears in an overtime loss to South Carolina State. Much like QB Bradshaw Littlejohn, Dickens may well be on his way toward becoming an All-American selection. The speedster has been torching opponent secondary units all season and is currently ranked No. 11 in I-AA (#1 in the MEAC) in receiving yards per game (98.9/game). Through 10 games, Dickens has racked up 45 catches for 989 yards with 5 touchdowns. The junior just needs 11 yards to reach the 1,000 yard mark!

**...HELD MORGAN STATE TO LESS THAN 100 YARDS RUSHING** was Sept. 5, 2002 against Towson. The Tigers suffocated the Bears by holding Morgan State to 66 total rushing yards. Towson collected a whopping 7 quarterback sacks.

**THE JACKSON FIVE**

In just his first season at Morgan State, Jason “Action” Jackson has become one of the most exciting running backs in the MEAC and the nation. J.J. has rushed for 972 yards and is currently ranked 7th in rushing in 1-AA as he’s averaging 121.5 yards per game. But one thing is for sure, Jackson has had plenty of help as he prepares to break the 1,000 yard mark...and that’s been his five offensive linemen: Aaron Wiggins, Dunnielle Anderson, James Roberson, Chris Cousin, and Curtis Bradley. This O-Line has helped the Bears offense to a record year in rushing (2,183 & counting) as well as passing (2,364 & counting).

**THE SHOW**

MSU's **Bradshaw Littlejohn (6-3, 238, Sr., Gaffney, SC/tr-Michigan State/Gaffney HS)** improved upon his career highlight tape last week against South Carolina State. Bradshaw completed 32-of-58 passes for 392 yards and rushed for 88 yards. He accounted for three touchdowns (2 passing & a rushing), including a 6-yard touchdown run. He helped the Bears' offense finish with 625 yards as the Bears fell short in overtime to S.C. State 38-35. As a result of his performance Littlejohn earned **MEAC Player of the Week Honorable Mention**. Littlejohn remains atop the national rankings: scoring (4<sup>th</sup> 10.6/gm) and total offense (6<sup>th</sup> 314.7/gm); and atop the MEAC rankings: 1<sup>st</sup> passing 236.4/gm), 1<sup>st</sup> scoring, 1<sup>st</sup> scoring TDs (10.6), 1<sup>st</sup> total offense, rushing (6<sup>th</sup> 77.8/gm) and pass efficiency (5<sup>th</sup> 92.9). He continues to be a legitimate candidate for **MEAC Player of the Year** and **All-American** honors.
