

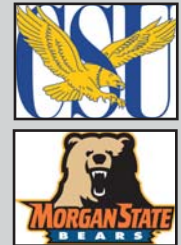

Men's Basketball Face Eagles in Conference-Opener at Hill Field House

The Morgan State men's basketball team returns to the hardwood on Wednesday, Dec. 6 when they prepare to host MEAC opponent Coppin State at Hill Field House. Morgan State came up just shy (71-80) of upsetting Big 10 foe Penn State last Saturday in University Park, Pa. Coppin State will enter Saturday's match-up attempting to bounce back from a 67-83 loss at Iowa. Coppin State had four players score in double-figures, but had a hard time containing Adam Haluska, who finished with a game-high 31 points, nine rebounds and nine assists. Coppin State holds a 45-11 series lead against Morgan State.

Storylines

• Morgan State is on track to score well above their average from last year. The Bears ranked last in the MEAC in scoring averaging 54.8 points per game, but with Todd Bozeman at the helm Morgan State is averaging 70.5 points per game...a +15.7 point increase. The Bears currently rank 3rd in the MEAC in scoring offense.

• Todd Bozeman will attempt to build a program and lead the Bears to the MEAC Championship -- something that has not been accomplished since 1976-77 under head coach Nathaniel Frazier.

• Bozeman was featured in November on ESPN's "Outside The Lines" and in *Sports Illustrated's* NBA Preview edition.

• Ron Timus is emerging as one of the Bears most consistent players. The 6-foot-6 senior forward is Morgan State's leading scorer and is currently averaging 14.2 points and 4.7 rebounds. Timus has had two 20-plus performances in six games. He led the Bears with a career-high 24 points at American (11/14) and scored 22 points against Seton Hall (11/25). The Washington, D.C. native is a talented player who will be a key component to the success of the Bears as they prepare for conference action against Coppin State.

• Xavier transfer Boubacar Coly has put together five solid efforts in his return to the hardwood. The Senegal native is averaging nearly a double-double (11 pts & 7 rebs) for the Bears. The 6-9 center posted a season-high 20 points and 14 boards at East Carolina (11/11) and posted 12 points and 9 boards against American (11/14). Coly is also leading the Bears in blocked shots...he's tallied eight in 6 games.

A Look Back at the 2005-06 Season:

• Joseph McLean tied MEAC season-high with 15 free throws made at North Carolina A&T (Jan. 23, 2006).
 • Timothy Berkley led the team in blocked shots (26) and rebounding (6.0 rpg), Berkley ranked 6th in MEAC in blocks and 10th in rebounding.

• Joseph McLean ranked 7th in the MEAC in minutes played (32.69). The senior scored in double-figures 22 times last season. He led the Bears in scoring in 17 of 29 games.

• The Morgan State Bears finished last in scoring offense (54.8), scoring margin (-19.6), field goal percentage (.375), 3-point field goal pct. defense (.362), steals (5.43), turnover margin (3.83) and assist/turnover ratio (0.52).

• MSU had MEAC team-high of 74 field goal attempts against George Washington (Dec. 10, 2005).

• The Bears shot 28.3 percent (313-of-504) from three-point range, while holding the opposition to 36.2 percent (169-of-467). On the year, Joseph McLean had 28 treys, while the Bears defense allowed 169 three-pointers.

• Morgan State's 94 points against MD-Eastern Shore (March 1, 2005) were the most in any game during the 2005-06 season. The last time Morgan State scored at least 90 points was during the 2003-04 season in a 106-72 win against Florida A&M.

• MSU led at halftime just four times during the season... The Bears held a 39-34 lead at halftime against Towson before the Tigers came back to defeat the Bears 71-66, led 29-27 at intermission before falling to Florida A&M in overtime 87-79 at Hill Field House...led 31-30 at the break before pulling out an exciting 81-78 2OT home victory, and most recently held a 32-29 halftime lead and beat Norfolk State 63-59.

On The Sideline: Head Coach Todd Bozeman takes over the Morgan State program in 2006-07 and becomes the 15th head coach in the Bears history. As the head coach of the University of California, Bozeman led the Golden Bears to three NCAA tournament bids in four years, and was the youngest coach to ever reach the NCAA "Sweet Sixteen". Within the Pac-10, Bozeman's Bears became the first school in conference history to win three straight games over UCLA in Pauley Pavilion, and was the first school to take back-to-back games over Arizona in McKale Center in more than a decade. In four seasons as a head coach, he led Cal to a 64-35 (pct.) record and guided the Golden Bears to three top 4 finishes in the Pac-10.

Bear Schedule

Morgan State's non-conference schedule for the 2006-07 season will once again be very challenging. The contest will include match-ups against East Carolina, Virginia, Penn State, LaSalle, Marquette and the Bears will tip-off with Seton Hall in their home-opener at Hill Field House. "The good thing is that there are teams that we should be able to compete with," said Coach Bozeman. "As far as the MEAC is considered, Delaware State is returning everybody from last year's team, and Hampton won the Tournament last year, so they'll be returning as the top dog and we'll be gunning for them."

Non-Conference Schedule Flashback

Morgan State played one of the toughest schedules in the history of the program last season. The Bears schedule featured games against: Washington, Miami, #5 Florida, Virginia Tech, Seton Hall, and they hosted #19 George Washington at Hill Field House.

Hill Field House

Morgan State's home venue, Hill Field House, is one of the best facilities in the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC). The Bears have posted a 15-10 record in Hill Field House since the 2003-04 season. The Bears finished off the 2004-05 regular season with an impressive 10-1 home record. The one blemish to its home record came in a loss against cross-town rival Coppin State. The Bears had a tough time protecting "The Cave" last season as the team dropped 9-of-11 home contests. The Bears notched its first two home victories against Howard (1/30/06) and Bethune-Cookman (2/6/06). MSU fell in its home-opener on Nov. 25 against Seton Hall.

Road Warrior vs. Road Kill

Morgan State is looking to change its road fortunes this season under new head coach Todd Bozeman. Dating back to the beginning of the 2003-04 season, the Bears have struggled to get a win on the road. The Bears only three victories away from Hill Field House were against Howard (1/10/04), Bethune-Cookman (2/17/04) and Coppin State (3/5/05). Morgan State finished with a 3-12 over road record. During the 2005-06 season MSU went 2-13 during their travels. The Bears recorded its first road win of the season when they stunned Norfolk State 63-59 (2/13/06).

Morgan State Gamenotes #7

The "Metropolitans"

Todd Bozeman's 2006-07 roster is comprised mostly of athletes from the Washington DC, Maryland and Virginia areas.

- Senior Timothy Berkley is from Richmond, Va. where he was a standout center for the Meadowbrook HS.
- JuCo transfer Jerrel Green and freshman guard Reggie Holmes are from Baltimore, Md. Green played his high school ball at Southern HS before playing point guard for Seward County C.C. Holmes, a 6-4, 180-pounder, was a standout at Saint Francis HS.
- Ronald Timus is a Washington, DC native who returns to the Bears after sitting out the 2005-06 season. Timus attended Woodrow Wilson HS where he averaged 24.6 ppg, 11 rpg and had two 40+ scoring performances.
- Freshmen forward Chris Moore, a native of Ellicott City, Md.) played for Howard HS where he played at the small and power forward position. Freshman guard Emmanuel Hightower and returning guard Rogers Barnes grew up in Fort Washington (Md.) and Columbia (Md.) respectively. Hightower is a walk-on from Westlake HS, while Barnes played at River Hill HS.

The Transfers

Morgan State's 2006-07 roster is a patchwork project, with transfers from Division I and JUCO programs providing the patches. Coach Bozeman has enlisted the services of three transfers who are expected to be impact players for the Bears rebuilding process. The transfers are as follows:

- Boubacar Coly (F/C, 6-9, 220) - Transfer from Xavier (Ohio) who joins the Bears as a graduate student.
- Jamar Smith (G, 6-3, 190) - Joins the Bears as a transfer from San Bernadino C.C. where he averaged 22.9 ppg.
- Jerrell Green averaged 13 ppg, 5 assists and 2 steals as the point guard at Seward County C.C.

Bear Bits

- The Bears hope to continue the hot shooting they displayed against UMBC...MSU shot 46.4 percent for the game and shot 51.9 percent (14-27 FG) in the first half.
- Morgan State shot 52.4 percent (33-63) from the field in the Bears loss against American (11/14)...it was the best shooting performance for the Bears since a January 30, 2006 meeting against conference opponent Howard. The Bears ended up shooting 51.9 percent from the field and ended up winning the contest 79-75.
- The Bears posted 84 points against American (11/14), it was the most points scored by Morgan State since an 81-76 overtime win against Bethune-Cookman on February 6, 2006.
- Tim Berkley had solid back-to-back games in limited minutes against Seton Hall and UMBC. The 6-foot-9 center was 4-for-4 from the floor for 8 points with six boards in 11 minutes against the Pirates, and had four blocks with 5 points and 4 boards in 15 minutes against the Retrievers.

Todd Bozeman

Head Coach • Rhode Island '86 • 4th season (1st season at MSU • 63-41 overall/0-6 at MSU)



Todd Bozeman takes over the Morgan State program in 2006-07 and becomes the 15th head coach in the Bears history.

Bozeman, widely regarded as one of the bright young minds in basketball, began his duties April 27, 2006.

The 42-year old possesses a dynamic basketball background that includes coaching at the highest levels as well as affiliations with some of the best team, coaches and players in the game's history.

Prior to joining the Morgan State Bears, Bozeman spent two seasons as a college basketball analyst and conducted camps and clinics in South America and Africa. Bozeman also spent three seasons in the NBA as the advance scout for the Toronto Raptors where he scouted upcoming opponents but also coordinated and oversaw the Summer Player development program. Prior to the Raptors, Bozeman spent a season scouting for the

Vancouver Grizzlies, who are now the Memphis Grizzlies.

Bozeman also spent time strengthening his ties with college coaches and familiarized himself with the top youth players as a coach at the AAU level.

Bozeman took the College basketball world by storm after taking over the Cal program in mid-season 1993; he led the Golden Bears to an 11-2 finish and a surprise berth in the NCAA tournament, including an upset of defending national champion Duke and a Sweet 16 berth to cap Cal's best NCAA tournament run since 1960.

As the head coach of the University of California, Bozeman led the Golden Bears to three NCAA tournament bids in four years, and was the youngest coach to ever reach the NCAA "Sweet Sixteen". Within the Pac-10, Bozeman's Bears became the first school in conference history to win three straight games over UCLA in Pauley Pavilion, and was the first school to take back-to-back games over Arizona in McKale Center in more than a decade.

In four seasons as a head coach, he led Cal to a 64-35 (pct.) record and guided the Golden Bears to three top 4 finishes in the Pac-10.

Bozeman was instrumental in building Cal into one of the elite programs in NCAA basketball and nurtured the development of future NBA stars Jason Kidd, Lamond Murray, Shareef Abdur-Rahim, Sean Marks, Ed Gray, Tremaine Fowlkes, Michael Stewart and the college basketball career of the NFL's Tony Gonzales.

Bozeman arrived at Cal in 1990 after spending two seasons as an assistant to Perry Clark at Tulane (1988-90). While a member of the Tulane staff Bozeman played a major role in the rebuilding of the Green Wave basketball program. He also served an assistant to Ernie Nestor at George Mason before taking the assistant job at Tulane.

Bozeman began his coaching career upon graduation from the University of Rhode Island in 1986.

Todd Bozeman was born December 5, 1963 in Washington, DC and was raised in Forestville, Maryland. He and his wife, TeLetha, have two children, Blake, 14, and Brianna, 13 and reside in Bowie, Md.

Scouting the Coppin State Eagles:



- Today's MSU vs. CSU game marks the start of both team's MEAC conference play. Coppin comes in with a 2-6 record with wins against Winston-Salem and most recently La Salle.
- Coppin State guard Tywain McKee was named the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) Player of the Week, the league announced Monday, Dec. 4, 2006. The 6-2, 182 junior guard from Philadelphia, Pa averaged 23.7 points in games against Missouri, La Salle and Iowa last week. He also averaged 6.7 rebounds, 3.7 assists and 2.3 steals per game while shooting 45.3 (24-of-53) percent from the floor and 42.1 (8-of-19) percent from beyond the three-point line.
- Coppin State is fresh off a 69-68 victory against La Salle. Coppin was led by Tywain McKee who scored a season high of 31 points, recorded 5 steals, 5 steals and rebounds before fouling out.
- Junior Darryl Roberts hit a three-pointer with 19 seconds remaining to lift Coppin State to a 69-68 victory over La Salle in the opening round of the Hawkeye Challenge at the University of Iowa.
- Coppin managed to turn 18 La Salle turnovers into 25 points by converting them into buckets through intense transition play .
- Coppin is currently ranked last in the MEAC in the assist column, relying heavily on one-on-one play to create buckets.
- Coppin State's roster features four players from the state of Maryland, but no players from the "Charm City" of Baltimore.
- Ron 'Fang' Mitchell has a share of nine of 10 MEAC regular-season titles during the '90s, equaling the most won by any NCAA Division I program the past decade - Three NCAA Tournament appearances - An upset of South Carolina in the first round of the 1997 NCAA Tournament - Two NIT bids, including a first-round win over St. Joseph's in 1995 - Six 20-win seasons over the past 14 years - Eleven straight winning seasons from 1988 to 2000 - The all-time winningest coach (318 career victories) at Coppin State - Six-time MEAC Coach of the Year.

GREENVILLE, N.C. --- The Morgan State men's basketball team opened the 2006-07 season with a hard-fought 86-67 loss to East Carolina on Saturday evening in Greenville, N.C.

Five players scored double figures to lead East Carolina to the win, extending the Pirates' streak of season-opening victories to seven.

Darrell Jenkins recorded a double-double in his first game as a Pirate, netting a game-high 22 points and dishing out 12 assists. Gabe Blair scored 13 points and grabbed a team-high eight rebounds, while Jeremy Ingram came off the bench to also score 13 points.

Head coach Todd Bozeman made quite an impression in his head coaching debut, as the Bears pestered the Pirates for most of the night, especially in the first half.

ECU (1-0) jumped out to an early 16-6 lead behind the strength of four 3-point field goals, three by Jenkins and one by Courtney Captain. Morgan State (0-1) answered with a 10-0 run of its own to tie the game before surging ahead by seven, 34-27, with under five minutes remaining in the first half.

Taylor Gagnon scored five straight points before Ingram drained a 3-point shot to put the Pirates on top at halftime, clinging to a 44-42 lead.

The Pirates clung to a slim lead through the first 5:39 of the second half before senior Joseph McLean gave the Bears a one-point lead, 54-53.

ECU then scored eight straight points

to build a seven-point lead and used a 24-8 run to build a 15-point lead, 77-62, with 4:48 remaining.

After yielding 42 first half points, the East Carolina held Morgan State to just 25 points after intermission and 38.1 percent shooting from the floor (8-of-21).

The Pirates shot 51.6 percent from the floor (32-of-62) and 42.9 percent from behind the arc (9-of-21).

Boubacar Coly recorded a double-double to lead Morgan State with 20 points (6-12 FG) and 14 rebounds. Reggie Holmes added 17 points (6-10 FG) and Ronald Timus netted 12 with five rebounds.

WASHINGTON, D.C. -- American put together one of their best shooting performances so far of the season, and it may end up being their best of the year, especially from three-point territory.

The Eagles blistered the nets by connecting on 18-of-24 (61.1%) three pointers led by standout shooter Andre Ingram who finished with a team-high 24 points to help the Eagles pull away in the second half to beat Morgan State 97-84 in front of a rowdy crowd of 1,772 at Bender Arena.

Ingram hit 7-of-8 three pointers and routinely shot from beyond the arc in rhythm and with minimal hands in his face as he led American to a 2-0 record for the season.

American got out of the gate early on and Derrick Mercer's touch pass to Brayden Billbe put the Bears in a 13-4 hole by the first media timeout. Mercer finished the contest with 13 points (6-7 3FG) and a game-high 11 assists, Billbe added 16 points (8-12 FG) with eight rebounds.

Ron Timus came out of the break and led the Bears with four points and Tim Berkley added a couple of rebounds and solid post play to help the Bears chop into AU's lead and eventually trail by six points following a conventional three-point play at the 11:40 mark of the 1st half.

AU answered with a short spurt and extended their lead to 31-18 with just under 9 minutes remaining, but the Bears began catching fire from the perimeter. Reggie Holmes nailed two

3-pointers and Jerrell Green pulled up for one during a fast break to spark a 12-4 run. Jamar Smith's jumper in the lane pulled the Bears to 35-31 with 5:40 minutes left in the half.

AU countered with a 10-3 run and pushed the lead back up to 50-38 following a putback basket by Paulius Joneliunas.

In the final 15 seconds of the half, Boubacar Coly rejected a shot that led to a fast break finished off with a Timus dunk as time expired. The Bears trailed 50-40.

Morgan State (0-2) struggled from the floor in the first half shooting just 41.2 percent (14-34), compared to the 2nd half where they shot 65.5 percent (19-29).

Unfortunately for the Bears they could not find a way to slow down American from scoring or getting second chance points. As a result, the Bears came no closer than 58-49 (16:52) in the 2nd half and saw the Eagles' lead balloon to as many as 19 points.

Timus kept the Bears close with a career-best 24 points, 11 in the first half. Coly completed the game one board shy of a double-double with 12 points, nine rebounds along with a game-high four blocks. Jamar Smith and Reggie Holmes chipped in 12 points each, while Joseph McLean scored 10.

The Bears (0-3) trailed by just 12 at halftime (42-30), but the Cavs (2-0) ended up shooting 56 percent (14-25 FG) in the second half as the Bears fell to Virginia in the first ever matchup between the schools.

BALTIMORE, Md. -- Eugene Harvey pointed by Jamar Smith with 14:41 re-scored 20 points and dished out six assists to lead the Seton Hall Pirates an 8-0 run and increased its lead to an 83-63 victory over Morgan State 27 points at the 7:25 mark and never at Hill Field House in front of 984 fans.

Ronald Timus scored a game-high 22 points and Reggie Holmes chipped in 12 points as the only Bears to score in double-figures.

BALTIMORE, Md. -- Brian Hodges scored a game-high 36 points leading UMBC to an 86-72 victory at Hill Field House. Joseph McLean led Morgan State with 14 points, but not enough to bring the Bears their first win of the season.

Morgan State (0-5) had a tough time slowing down Hodges who finished the game by shooting a sizzling 10-of-18 (56.5%) from the floor and 6-of-9 from beyond the arc.

The Bears also had a solid night of shooting and converted 14-of-27 (51.9%) field goals in the first half, and finished the contest by shooting 46.4 percent (12-29 FG).

Morgan State finished with four players scoring in double digits, led by McLean with 14 points. Jamar Smith and Ronald Timus added 13 points each, while Reggie Holmes contributed 11.

UMBC's (3-3) Jay Greene chipped in 15 points with seven assists and Mike Houseman tallied 10 points with eight boards.

The Retrievers shot 46.4 percent (26-56 FG) from the field and outrebounded the Bears by a slim 35-32 margin.

Morgan State used 52 percent shooting in the first half to build a nine-point lead at 33-24 with 4:14 to play in the

half. But Hodges nailed two three-pointers to help trim the Bears advantage to 38-36 at the intermission. It was MSU's first halftime lead of the season.

The Bears opened the second half sluggish and the Retrievers capitalized by racing out on an 11-2 run. Hodges pushed UMBC's lead to 50-41 when he scored a layup with 13:49 remaining.

The Bears answered with a 10-2 run of their own and a layup by Tim Berkley tied the ballgame at 62-62 at the 6:20 mark.

UMBC would go on to outscore the Bears by a 24-10 margin in the final six minutes of the contest.

"I thought we took positive steps as a program," said MSU head coach Todd Bozeman. "Our goal tonight was to start the game off better, and we did, but now we have to teach our team how to play when ahead."

"It's a building process," Bozeman added. "We are still having defensive lapses, but they are more glaring when you have a chance to win the game."

With the win, the Retrievers ended up knotting the all-time series record with Morgan State at 12 apiece.

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. -- Morgan State entered tonight's contest with hopes of catching Penn State cat-napping and collecting a historical win against its Big 10 host.

However, the Nittany Lions held on in the final minutes to escape with an 80-71 victory over Morgan State at Bryce Jordan Center before a crowd of 7,119. Jamelle Cornley led the way for Penn State with 18 points, while Brandon Hassell finished with 14 points and grabbed nine rebounds.

Freshman guard Reggie Holmes scored 11 of his 16 points in the second half and senior guard Joseph McLean added 15 to lead the Bears.

Morgan State (0-6) played multiple defenses and forced the Nittany Lions into 38.7% shooting and just 2-of-9 shooting (22.2%) from beyond the arc in the first half.

Junior guard Jamar Smith helped spark an 8-1 run and a three-pointer by Holmes gave the Bears a 20-14 advantage with 7:16 left in the half.

Brandon Hassle would go on to reel off the Lion's next seven points and junior guard Mike Walker's three-pointer gave Penn State a 28-27 lead with 2:12 to go. It was the Lions first lead in over 10 minutes.

McLean ended up dropping in his third

three-pointer of the half to help the Bears stay within striking distance as they went into the break trailing by a slim 33-30 margin.

Penn State (5-2) held a 46-42 lead following a putback dunk by Hassle, but again the Bears answered, this time with layups from both senior forward Ron Timus and Holmes to trim the Lions lead to 46-44 with 12:29 remaining.

Jamar Smith (6-14 FG) and Boubacar Coly (4-10 FG) chipped in 13 points each.

A critical moment in the game happened when Timus stepped out of bounds on a baseline move. The turnover led to a three-pointer by Walker to give the Lions their largest lead at 52-44 with just over 10 minutes left.

Penn State would once again see their lead evaporate following a Jerrel Green dish to Coly for a layup and a three-point bomb by Holmes cut the Lions' lead to 52-49 (9:03).

The Lions responded with a 14-4 run over the next 5 minutes to give them a 66-56 lead and maintained the cushion down the stretch by making the most of its trips to the charity stripe.

Penn State shot 23-for-33 (69.7%) from the line, while the Bears were 10-for-13 (76.9%). The Lions finished the game with a 39-30 advantage on the boards.

He scored a season-high 17 points at East Carolina and helped push Penn State to the limit as he led the Bears with 16 points in 'Happy Valley'. With additional experience Holmes will definitely be one to watch as the Bears prepare for conference play.

MSU vs. Coppin State Flashback (3/3/2006)

BALTIMORE, Md. – In overtime Coppin State knocked down enough free throws and made big plays down the stretch to pull away from the Bears for a 67-63 win in front of a packed house at the Coppin Center.

Coppin State (12-17, 12-6 MEAC), which ended a three-game losing streak, clinched the No. 2 seed in the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference tournament in Raleigh, N.C.

Despite a valiant effort in front of an intense crowd, Morgan State (4-25, 4-14 MEAC) collected its third consecutive loss.

Marcus Gomes, playing in his first game since suffering a groin injury two weeks ago, was the Bears leading scorer. The freshman hit four 3-pointers and led the Bears with 17 points. Senior Tyree Spinner added 13 points, seven

boards and three assists.

Joseph McLean recorded his second double-double of the season with 16 points and a game-high 13 rebounds.
