Founded in 1867 as the Centenary Biblical Institute by the Baltimore Conference of the Methodist Episcopal Church, the institution's original mission was to train young men for the ministry. It subsequently broadened its mission to educate both men and women as teachers. It was renamed Morgan College in 1890 in honor of the Reverend Lyttleton Morgan, the first chairman of its Board of Trustees, who donated land to the college.

Morgan awarded its first baccalaureate degree to George F. McMechen in 1895. McMechen subsequently obtained a law degree from Yale and eventually returned to Baltimore, where he became an important civic leader and a strong financial supporter of the College.

The late Andrew Carnegie made an original conditional grant of \$50,000 for the central academic building in 1915. The conditions included the purchase of a new site for the College, payment of all outstanding obligations, and the construction of a building to be named after him. The College met all of the conditions by purchasing and moving to the present site in Northeast Baltimore in 1917 and erecting Carnegie Hall in 1919. Carnegie Hall is the oldest original building on the present MSU campus. Morgan remained a private institution until 1939. In that year, the state of Maryland purchased the institution in response to a study by a state commission that found that Maryland needed to provide more opportunities for its black citizens. From its beginnings as a public campus, Morgan was open to students of all races. By the time it became a public campus the College had become a relatively comprehensive institution. Until the mid-1960s, when the state's teachers colleges began their transition to liberal arts campuses, Morgan and the University of Maryland College Park were the only two public campuses in the state with comprehensive missions.

As Maryland's teachers colleges began to broaden their missions, they, including Morgan, were placed into a state college system governed by a Board of Trustees. However, in 1975 the State Legislature designated Morgan as a university, gave it the authority to offer doctorates, and provided for it to once again have its own governing board.

In 1988 Maryland reorganized its higher education structure. It strengthened its coordinating board, the Higher Education Commission. The campuses in the state college system became part of the University of Maryland System. Morgan and St. Mary's College of Maryland were the only public baccalaureate-granting institutions authorized to have their own governing boards. The 1988 legislation also strengthened Morgan's authority to offer advanced programs and designated the campus as Maryland's Public Urban University.



Season Outlook

It's that time of the year again when the Lady Bears softball team begins to stand at bat, load up the bases and bring another exciting season to Morgan State University grounds.

In the Hill field House, where the Lady Bears prepare for the upcoming season, they are eager to get down with business, making a routine run around the track with a serious and new attitude about the season to come. But, before we take a closer look at this year's team, let's go back to last year's season.

In the spring of 2006, the Lady Bears once again found themselves in need of a victory in the final week of the season to advance to the conference tournament. Morgan State went on to take the opening game of a doubleheader against the University of Maryland-Eastern Shore to earn the eighth and final spot in the MEAC Tournament. However, the gain over UMES would not linger for long.

The Lady Bears struggled in the MEAC Tournament opener, as they suffered a loss to top ranked Florida A&M. All in all, the Lady Rattlers out played Morgan. Although, last year's team had a bit of a struggle, the Lady Bears finished with an overall record of 10-29, 5-9 in the MEAC, including a regular season victory over powerhouse Bethune-Cookman at the Round-Up.

This season Morgan State is looking for a full turn around, as the softball program has upgraded in every single position. While the team is fairly new with eight newcomers, it does return six letterwinners from a season ago, including two seniors in Nastosha Johnson and Krystle Gaud.

Gaud and Johnson have both played softball all four years of their college careers. Gaud, who transferred from Monroe College as a junior fin-

ished fourth on the team in batting average and was named the team's most valuable player. The New York native has certainly done her share on the field and serves as captain along with Canadian sophomore Carolyn Howard. Both ladies are exceptional athletes on the field. Gaud is a vocal leader, while Howard is a silent, but effective when it comes to leading by example.

The Lady Bears begin their season on the road on February 17, 2007, against fellow MEAC member, South Carolina State, followed by a doubleheader against 2007 MEAC newcomer Winston Salem State on February 18, 2007. The Lady Bears will then take part in the George Mason Invitational (March 10-11). Morgan's home opener will be against Hampton on March 24. The Lady Bears will also host this year's conference championships, which will be held May 11-13 in Severn Park, Md.

Morgan's outstanding players to bear in mind for the 2007 season are California native, Porsche Boddicker, who is the team's lone freshman and will see time at pitcher and junior catcher Ashley Vasquez, a transfer out of Porterville College. Howard has the strongest pitch on the team and on the defensive end, Megan Jimenez is equipped to bring on the roar.

Foreseeing a new look for the women's softball team, Morgan is seeking the opportunity to display its array of talent and is set to go far with conference and non-conference play. The Morgan State community should be looking forward to a new and thrilling season with the 2007 Lady Bear softball team.

The Morgan State University Lady Bears take the field in 2007 under the dedicated leadership of 4th year Head Coach Jeff Bozier Sr. Coach Bozier has been a part of Morgan State softball for a total of 12 years, having served as an Assistant Coach for 9 seasons prior to assuming the mantle of Head Coach.

Coach Bozier has been responsible for the development of many All-MEAC performers during his tenure at Morgan State. Among the many talented All-Conference performers who have blossomed under his guidance are; Tanisha Kemp, Lavita Cunningham, Leone' Gilkey Harris, Ja Nina Lee, Chaundrisa Oyeisku, Grace Glenn, Aubrey Love and Aloise Shepherd.

Jeff was a member of the MSU coaching staff that posted a 25-9 record. That's the best single season record in the program's history. That team ripped off 19 consecutive wins in the middle of the season. That's the longest winning streak in the history of MSU softball. Coach Bozier was also a member of the coaching staff in 1999 when MSU advanced to the MEAC Championship game for the first and only time in the history of the program.

Coach Bozier has been in the trenches for a decade helping to build Morgan State softball. He has been instrumental in bringing some of the most talented players MSU has had on their roster.

Bozier has enjoyed another banner recruiting season, and is hoping the recruiting reaps immediate benefits.

The Lady Bears roster will have plenty of new faces this season, and Coach Bozier is going to be challenged with trying to mold those new faces into a cohesive and productive unity in 2006. His ability to put players in the best position to get the best of their abilities will be key as the Lady Bears try to make a run for the MEAC crown in 2007.

Coach Bozier brings a 33-86 record into his 4th season as the Head Coach of Lady Bear softball.

Bozier is married to Ramona Riley-Bozier, the Head Volleyball Coach at MSU. They have two children and reside in Harford County, MD.

Rodney Mays

Rodney Mays is in his third stint as an assistant coach with the Lady Bears softball team. Mays, considered a strong motivator, will be responsible for conducting morning conditioning with the team and will work with the outfielders. He will also serve at times as first base coach.

Mays, who brings a wealth of experience and knowledge to Morgan State, first came to MSU during the 1996 campaign and was part of the Lady Bears' 1999 squad which finished second in the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference.

Prior to joining the Lady Bear staff, Mays served 10 seasons as coach at Dulaney Valley from 1986-96. In 2005 he helped the Overlea football team capture the HBCL 2005 championship.

A native of Baltimore, Mays spent his prep days at nearby Dunbar High School. A 1984 graduate of Dunbar, Mays was a four-year letterwinner for the Poets' football team and was a member of the 1984 Baltimore City Championship team.



Assistant Coach
Aubrey Love

Aubrey Love enters her 4th season as an assistant coach for the Lady Bears. Aubrey brought her fire, drive and determination for Lady Bear softball to the dugout as a part of the coaching staff. Aubrey has been a valuable addition to the coaching staff after completing one of the most accomplished careers in the history of the program.

Aubrey finished her career as the consensus choice as the best catcher to ever put on the Morgan State uniform. Her command of the game, leadership skills and year to year consistency made her one of the best softball talents to ever play in the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference.

Love was a multi-dimensional player who had the ability to help the Lady Bears with her bat, her glove and her enthusiasm. She is an extremely competitive individual who is passionate about winning.

Aubrey will be continue to assume a key role on the coaching staff in 2006. Love will be the 1st base coach on game day, and will be active in assisting Head Coach Jeff Bozier with day to day operational duties.

MSU Director of Athletics



Morgan State University President Earl S. Richardson appointed Floyd Kerr as the university's new director of athletics.

Kerr takes over a revived athletics program at Morgan during a time of great progress toward returning the institution to the greatest it once enjoyed in college sports history.

"Our athletics program is an integral part of the 20 Year Morgan Renaissance that we so proudly celebrate this year," said Dr. Richardson. "We have made significant progress in many areas of the university and our athletic programs are no exception. With the wealth of knowledge and experience that Mr. Kerr brings to Morgan, we are convinced that he can help make the difference for our program and our student athletes."

Before coming to Morgan, Kerr was the athletic director at Southern University from 2000 to 2004. Kerr was instrumental in the expansion of Southern's A.W. Mumford Stadium, and spearheaded the \$2.5 million video spectator scoreboard project, giving Southern the largest I-AA scoreboard installation in the country. Kerr was also responsible for forming a partnership between the nationally recognized sports marketing firm, New Vision Sports Properties, LLC. This collaboration helped to increase corporate sales by more than 1,000 percent. Kerr also served as assistant Athletic Director at Youngstown State University from 1993 to 2000.

Ranked 75th on Sports Illustrated's 101 Most Important Minorities in Sports in June 2004, Kerr has served as a member of two of the NCAA's most prestigious committees, the Division I men's basketball tournament selection committee and the issues committee.

A graduate of Colorado State University, Kerr was an All-American Collegiate basketball player and was drafted by three professional sports teams, including the Phoenix Suns (NBA), Utah Stars (ABA) and Dallas Cowboys (NFL). He has coached high school basketball teams to state championships in New Jersey and Ohio.

He has been recognized for outstanding service as a member of the National Association of Basketball Coaches, the Youngstown-Warren Regional Chamber of Commerce as a mentor and received the Edna K. McDonald Cultural Awareness Award at Youngstown State University for his outstanding commitment to cultural diversity. He performed as a character actor in the motion picture One on One starring Robbie Benson.

Kerr is an accomplished public speaker, artist and sports color analyst. He has exhibited his works of art at the Butler Institution of American Art (Ohio), the Adolph Coor Company (Colorado), the Valley/Arts Guild (Pennsylvania), the Southern University Museum of Art and other galleries.

"I am very excited to be selected as the new Director of Athletics at Morgan State University," said Kerr. "The opportunity to serve in this capacity and in a leadership role for the Bears marks a commitment that my family and I appreciate. I look forward to the coming years to help take the program to the next level and build on the great reputation and mission of the University through athletics."

President of MSU



Dr. Earl S. Richardson was appointed the 11th president of Morgan State University on November 1, 1984, after serving eight months as interim president. He took the helm of the University at one of the most critical moments in history, a period of declining enrollment, fiscal uncertainty, a deteriorating physical plant and considerable anxiety both within and outside the institution about its future. The versatility and grace with which he has guided the University and the course on which he has led it since that time have distinguished his presidency as one of the great periods in the history of Morgan.

President Richardson joined the Morgan family as a forty-one-year-old scholar holding the Bachelor of Arts Degree in social science from the University of Maryland Eastern Shore (formerly Maryland State College) and both the Master of Science Degree and Doctor of Education Degree in education administration experience extending over a nineteen-year period: Assistant to the President, University of Maryland System and Assistant to the Chancellor, Director of Career Planning and acting Director of Admissions and Registration at the University of Maryland Eastern Shore. This administrative experience was buttressed by solution-oriented research as fellows for the Ford and Kellogg Foundations and the publication of several articles on the implications of proposals to merge historically Black institutions with white institutions and on inter-institutional cooperation in higher education, all combining to make him a recognized authority on problems in higher education relative to racial autonomy, desegregation and integration.

Since becoming president of Morgan State University, Dr. Richardson has fashioned an all-encompassing strategy for strengthening the University: a growing inventory of graduate and undergraduate programs aimed at new technology and the global community of the 21st century; enhancement of the credentials and scholarly profile of the faculty; the establishment of national centers of excellence in a number of critical fields; and variety of initiatives to increase minority representation in the professions and to ease the transition of students from high school and community colleges into four-year universities; a rapidly growing and greatly refurbished physical plant; burgeoning increases of over 75% in student enrollment, coupled with dramatic increases in the quality of students; sweeping improvements in external funding and government, corporate and foundation support. As a result of his leadership, Morgan has experienced noteworthy growth and improvement over the last two decades and is in the midst of the Renaissance that it is now celebrating.

Dr. Richardson is active in civic and community organizations. He is a member of the Board of Directors of LifeBridge, Good Samaritan Hospital, the Council for Higher Education on Accreditation and the Goldseker Foundation; serves on the advisory board or honorary board of the Maryland Education Coalition, Baltimore Neighborhoods, Inc. and the Quality Education for Minorities Network; and sits on the Board of Trustees of the Educational Testing Service.

Dr. Richardson is married to the former Sheila Bunting of Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, and they have a son, Eric.
