### BEARS PREPARES TO FACE WESTERN ILLINOIS IN THE CANCUN CHALLENGE ON TUESDAY



- Tip-off is set for 1:30 p.m. on Tuesday, Nov. 22 at Adventura Palace in Cancun, Mexico. Western Illinois (2-2) fell to Missouri, 66-61, on the road on Thursday night. Morgan State (1-2) will look to rebound from a 79-74 loss at LaSalle. The loss dropped Coach Todd Bozeman's record to 95-53 in his 5th season at MSU.
- Following their matchup with Western Illinois, the Bears will face either North Florida or Prairie View A&M on Wednesday to wrapup the 2010 Cancun Challenge in Cancun, Mexico.
- Morgan State completed the 2009-10 season as the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference champs, it marked the Bears second consecutive MEAC Title and they also captured their third consecutive regular season title.
- The No. 15 seeded Bears lost to the No. 2 seed West Virginia 77-50 at the HSBC Arena in Buffalo in the First Round of the NCAA Tournament. The game was broadcast by CBS Sports and it was the Bears second consecutive appearance in the 'Big Dance'.
- MSU junior Kevin Thompson is set to lead the Bears this season...the 6-foot-9 forward was the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference Defensive Player of the Year and was the league's most dominant post player during the 2009-10 season ... As a sophomore, Thompson averaged 12.7 points per game, 11.9 rebounds (4th best in the nation) and completed the season with 22 double-doubles (pts & rebs).
- Todd Bozeman made his fifth NCAA appearance in eight years as a Division I coach ... his record in the Tournament is 2-5.

### WESTERN ILLINOIS' LAST GAME:

COLUMBIA, Mo. - Western Illinois made it a one possession game with 11 seconds left, but would come up short in its upset bid at 14th-ranked Missouri losing 66-61. The Leathernecks dropped to 2-1 while Missouri won its season debut in the opening game for both teams in the 2010 Cancun Challenge. Senior **Matt Lander** scored a game- and career-high 24 points, 14 coming in the second half. His two free throws with 17 seconds remaining cut the deficit to two. Michael Dixon hit just one of two free throws, but the Tigers got the ball back following a turnover. Dixon was immediately fouled and converted both attempts for the final margin.

### WESTERN ILLINOIS NOTES

> Last season junior guard **Ceola Clark III** was among the Summit League's top 10 in scoring (15.0 points per game), assists (3.2 per game), field goal percentage (.484), steals (league-leading 2.8 per game), 3-point percentage (league-leading .448), assists-to-turnover ratio (1.9) and minutes played (36.4 per game) in conference play. He also was the **Summit League Defensive Player of the Year**.

> The Leathernecks closed out the 2009-10 regular season with a defense that ranked No. 10 nationally, holding opponents to 59.6 points per game.

> **Western Illinois** is a part of the Summit League Conference whose members include: Centenary, IPFW, IUPUI, UMKC, North Dakota State, Oakland, Oral Roberts, South Dakota State and Southern Utah.

> Junior transfer **Kaimarr Price** received word prior to the exhibition game that he is eligible immediately. The 6-foot-8, 235-pound forward grabbed recorded a double-double with 15 points/12 rebounds in the Leathernecks close loss against Missouri.

> Western Illinois was picked to finish seventh in the preseason poll, as announced by the league office. Defending regular season champion Oakland was picked to win again, receiving 29 first place votes and 504 points.

### BEAR SCHEDULE

- The Bears once again have an ambitious non-conference schedule this season.
- MSU's non-conference schedule sends the Bears to Loyola Marymount, Providence, Syracuse, Louisville, and Baylor.
- This year's home-opener at Hill Field House will be against Loyola, and they will also host UMBC and Robert Morris.

### HOME SWEET HOME

- **Todd Bozeman** has coached the Bears to a terrific home record since joining Morgan State.
- Bozeman has led the Bears to a **35-6 (.854)** current home record inside the confines of Hill Field House, including wins over Towson on December 22, Delaware State (Jan. 23), UMES (Jan. 25), FAMU (Feb. 7), Bethune-Cookman (Feb. 8), Winston-Salem State (Feb. 13), Norfolk State (Feb. 27), N.C. A&T (March 1) and Coppin State (March 4).
- S.C. State's 71-68 win at Hill Field House on Feb. 15th handed the Bears its first home loss since Feb. 23, 2009 in a 49-47 loss against Hampton.
- The average margin of loss at home in the past three seasons is 8.6 pts, including a 83-63 loss vs. Seton Hall on Nov. 26, 2006 at Hill Field House.

### TRANSFERS

- Last season, the Bears welcomed two JUCO transfers to the team. This season Coach Bozeman has gone back out and recruited three new transfers to join the 2010-11 roster.
- **Larry Bastfield** (G/5-11/175) - Transfer from Toledo University ... He is a native of Baltimore, Md. ... Solid prep career at Towson Catholic ... Joins the team as a junior.
- **Tola Lawal** (G/6-3/200) - Transfer from Erie Community College ... JuCo All-american and scored 1,104 points in two seasons ... Product of Brooklyn, New York ... Also joins the team as a junior.
- **Aric Brooks** (G/F/6-6/210) - Transfer from Jacksonville State ... All-Metro selection at St. Frances HS ... He is a native of Baltimore, Md. ... Also joins team as a junior.

### BEAR NEWS & NOTES

- Morgan State completed the 2009-10 season ranked 18th in the CollegeInsider.com Mid-Major Poll.
- Morgan State swept the top individual awards for the 2009-10 season in the MEAC. **Reggie Holmes** was named Player of the Year, **Kevin Thompson** earned Defensive Player of the Year and freshman **DeWayne Jackson** was selected as Rookie of the Year. **Todd Bozeman** also was named Coach of the Year for the third straight season.
- Morgan State had an 11-game winning streak snapped by S.C. State on Feb. 15 and bounced back with a win against the MEAC's No. 2 ranked Delaware State on Feb. 17 ... The Bears have won 19 of its last 21 games.
- **Kevin Thompson** recorded his 22nd double-double of the season (18 pts/10 rebs) and Morgan State claimed its second consecutive NCAA tournament berth by beating South Carolina State 68-61 on Saturday in the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference title game in Winston-Salem, NC.
- Morgan State became the first repeat MEAC champion since the Hampton Pirates in 2001 and '02.
- Morgan State captured its 3rd straight MEAC

regular season title in after a 65-61 victory during Senior Night at MD-Eastern Shore.

- **DeWayne Jackson** was MSU's 3rd leading scorer as a true freshman by averaging 10.1 ppg thru 37 games...became the school's first MEAC Rookie of the Year selection.
- As a sophomore forward **Kevin Thompson** ranked 4th among the nation's leading rebounders by averaging 11.9 boards per contest.
- **Kevin Thompson** finished with a game-high 20 points and 16 rebounds in the MEAC quarterfinals vs. No. 9 N.C. A&T.
- The Bears started the Minnesota game by missing their first nine shots of the ball game ... MSU finished the game by shooting 29.6 percent (21-71) from the field and 3-for-20 from beyond the arc.
- MSU averaged a MEAC best 77 points per game during the 2009-10 season and has posted 90 or more points six times, including a 100-point outing at Norfolk State (Jan. 31, 2010).
- Morgan State's win against Albany during the 2009-10 season was the Bears first season-opener win since dropping Lincoln (91-50) in 1988.

### LOSSES AND RETURNS

- The Bears lost seven letterwinners from last year's 27-10 MEAC championship team.
- The Bears lost their leading scorer and MEAC Player of the Year in Reggie Holmes and their leading assist artist in Sean Thomas, as well as their top on-the-ball defender in Troy Smith.
- The three returning starters are 2010 MEAC tournament MVP and 2009-10 Defensive Player of the Year **Kevin Thompson**, and 2010 MEAC All-Rookie Team selection **Kevin Thompson** and center **Rodney Stokes**.

## DEDICATED LAST SEASON TO A TEAMMATE



• The Bears dedicated last season to their own, 6-foot-10 **Anthony Anderson**, who was diagnosed with leukemia in October, 2009.

• Anderson, who was a redshirt freshman from St. Charles, Md. was expected to contribute off the bench last year, but instead underwent chemotherapy treatment at Johns Hopkins Hospital.

• "The whole team went to the hospital and stood in his room as the doctor explained how he was going to treat him," said **Todd Bozeman**. "Everybody loves 'Big Ant.'"

• Players wore a patch with Anderson's number (4) on their jerseys last season.

• Rodney Stokes had his game sneakers autographed by Anderson, right across the toe.

• Morgan State will continue to show their support for Anderson this season by donning the No. 4 patch on their jerseys.

## MORGAN PICKED TO REPEAT AS MEAC CHAMPS

• Morgan State received 20 first place votes and totaled 476 points to garner the league's top position for the second year in a row.

• Led by the conference's back-to-back Coach of the Year **Todd Bozeman**, the Bears were crowned tournament champions and earned their second straight regular season title last year with a 13-3 MEAC record and 23-12 overall mark.

• MSU recorded several notable wins last season including victories over Marshall (72-67), DePaul (79-75), and Maryland (66-65). The Bears also knocked off the Towson Tigers in their first-ever appearance in ESPN's BracketBusters.

## FORMER BEAR BROKE RECORDS

• Former Bears standout **Reggie Holmes** was named to the 2009-10 Preseason All-MEAC first team.

• Last season he was selected to the All-MEAC first team and was awarded the honor of 2009 MEAC Tournament MVP.

• Holmes placed his stamp in the Morgan State record books in a number of categories:

- **Ranks No. 1 in career 3-pointer field goal made (305).**
- **Ranks No. 1 in most points scored in a single season (784; 2009-10), surpassing Marvin Webster's single season record of 707 points (1973-74).**
- **Ranks 1st on the school's all-time scoring list (2,049).**
- **Ranks No. 1 in 3-pointers (99) made in a single season.**

## THOMPSON'S HOSPITALITY

• Morgan State sophomore forward **Kevin Thompson** was named to the Freshmen Mid-Major All-America team by Collegeinsider.com at the end of the last season. Thompson became the first Bear ever to be selected to the team.

• Thompson was a key contributor as a redshirt freshman and helped the Bears capture their first Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference Championship in three decades and earned the program's second consecutive postseason appearance and the first-ever NCAA tournament.

• The Walbrook High product averaged 8.9 points per game and was one of the top rebounders in the MEAC averaging 7.1 boards per game.

• He recorded 15 double-figure games and posted 7 double-doubles (points & rebounds) on the season and was selected to the 2009 MEAC Rookie Team.

• He posted a season-high of 23 points and 25 rebounds

and was selected as the MEAC Player of the Week (12/27/09).

• **Kevin Thompson** recorded his 22nd double-double of the season (18 pts/10 rebs) to lead MSU to its second consecutive MEAC title ... He was selected as the Tournament MVP.

• Thompson posted a game-high 20 points and 16 rebounds in the MEAC quarterfinals vs. No. 9 N.C. A&T.

• Thompson led Morgan State in rebounding 29 times in 2009-10

• During the 2009-10 season, he was selected 7x as the MEAC Defensive Player of the Week, twice as the Player of the Week and became the second Bear player under Coach Bozeman to be selected MEAC Defensive Player of the Year ... MSU's Boubacar Coly was the 2008 Defensive Player of the Year.

• "Big Baby" ranked No. 4 in the nation in rebounds (11.9 rpg) last season.

• Thompson has posted double-doubles in his first three games of the season ... he had 17 points and 11 rebounds at Loyola Marymount, posted 14 points and 10 boards at Providence and finished with a career-high 25 points with 10 boards at LaSalle.

• He has led the Bears in rebounding **49 times** in his career and has accounted for **719 rebounds**.

## MID-MAJOR COACH OF THE YEAR

• Less than three weeks after taking the Bears to their first Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference Championship in three decades and earning the program's second consecutive postseason appearance and the first-ever NCAA tournament appearance, **Todd Bozeman** received the Hugh Durham Award, which recognizes the outstanding coach at the mid-major level.

• The award, which is voted on by a 20-member selection panel that includes current and former head coaches and is chaired by Hugh Durham, is presented annually at the Final Four to the top Mid-Major Coach in America.

• Surprisingly Morgan State was picked to finish first in the MEAC's preseason vote, despite losing the league's Player of the Year, Defensive Player of the Year and starting point guard to graduation. The League's coaches and sports information directors were right on target with their vote, as the Bears captured their second consecutive regular season title, won the MEAC Championship, and finished with a 13-3 conference record and a 23-12 overall mark.

• In just three seasons, Bozeman has already won the most Division I games in school history.

• Bozeman, who was named the MEAC Coach of the Year for the second consecutive season, was a finalist for the 2009 award along with Duggar Baucom (VMI), Randy Bennett (St. Mary's), Ed Conroy (The Citadel), Brad Greenberg (Radford), Ben Jacobson (Northern Iowa), Saul Phillips (North Dakota State), J.P. Piper (Nicholls St.), Randy Rahe (Weber St.), and Brad Stevens (Butler).

• In 2005 the CollegeInsider.com Mid-Major Coach of the Year award was renamed in honor of Hugh Durham who retired at the end of the 2004-05 season. Durham is one of just twelve coaches to have led two different programs to the NCAA Final Four (Florida State, 1972 & Georgia, 1983). He is the only coach to lead both teams to their only Final Four appearance.

• **Bozeman was one of the fifteen finalists for the 2010 Hugh Durham Mid-Major Coach of the Year Award.**

## MEAC TOURNAMENT RETURNS TO WINSTON-SALEM

• The Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) 2011 Men's and Women's Basketball Tournament is scheduled for March 9-13 at the Lawrence Joel Veterans Memorial Coliseum in Winston-Salem, North Carolina.

• Ticket books can be purchased at all MEAC university ticket offices, Joel Coliseum Box Office, Ticketmaster outlets, the MEAC Administrative

Office and online at Ticketmaster.com. Tickets are also available by calling the MEAC at 757-416-7100 or Ticketmaster at (800) 745-3000.

• The annual MEAC Basketball Tournament moved to Winston-Salem, North Carolina two years ago and will continue to call the city home through 2011.

• The tournament is played at the Lawrence Joel Veterans Memorial Coliseum. Both the men's and women's champion will receive an automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament.

## MSU LEGEND DIES - THE HUMAN ERASER

• Last year **Marvin Webster**, a fierce shot-blocking center who helped lead the Seattle SuperSonics to the 1978 NBA Finals, was found dead in Tulsa, Okla. He was 56.

• Known as "The Human Eraser," Webster spent nine seasons in the NBA. He averaged 16.1 points during the SuperSonics' playoff run in 1978. He signed with the Knicks the following season and played six years in New York.

• After playing 333 consecutive games, Webster missed the next two seasons because of hepatitis before making a failed comeback with Milwaukee during the 1986-87 season. He played in 15 games as a Bucks reserve before retiring.

• He played in college at Morgan State where he averaged eight blocked shots a game while taking the Bears to the 1974 N.C.A.A. Division II championship as a junior. He averaged 21 points and 22.4 rebounds a game and was named Division II player of the year.

• His first pro season was with Denver of the ABA in 1975. He also played with the Nuggets after they joined the NBA the following year.

• His best statistical year came with Seattle in 1977-78, when he averaged 14 points and finished ninth in the NBA with 12.6 rebounds and 1.9 blocks a game. The Sonics lost the finals to Washington in seven games that year, one season before winning their only NBA title.

• His son, **Marvin Webster Jr.**, played college basketball at Temple but died during his sophomore year at 18 after a heart attack.

• MSU's retired Marvin Webster's number and his jersey is hanging in Hill Field House.

• Redshirt freshman **Ian Chiles** (7-foot-2) is the first 7-footer since Marvin Webster to grace the campus of Morgan State University.

### WHAT TURNOVER PROBLEM

- The Bears have started the 2010-11 season by posting 49 turnovers (16.3/g) thru its first three games.
- During the 2009-10 season, Morgan State had 499 turnovers through 367 games (13.5 per game). The Bears averaged 13.0 turnovers en route to a 27-10 season.
- MSU had a season-low with six turnovers during a home win against Bethune-Cookman on Feb. 8 ... they had 7 turnovers against Robert Morris.
- The Bears were among the MEAC leaders in turnover margin ranked No. 3 (+0.8) and ranked No. 1 in assist/turnover ratio (0.9).
- MSU posted a season-high 22 turnovers in a double-overtime win vs. Norfolk State, recorded a historical win at Arkansas with 18 miscues, and posted 20 against S.C. State in the MEAC Finals last Saturday.
- Oddly enough, the Bears posted a 12-3 record when posting more turnovers than their opponent.

### WINNING THE BOARD GAMES

- The Bears have been outrebounded in two of their first three games on the 2010-11 season by a 98-77 margin.
- The Bears hold a -3 rebounding margin so far this season.
- MSU outrebounded 20 of its first 37 opponents in 2009-10.
- The Bears posted an 18-3 mark when outrebounding its opponents (UMBC, Arkansas, Coppin State, Manhattan, Towson, Howard, Hampton, Delaware State, UMES, Norfolk State, N.C. A&T, Florida A&M and Bethune-Cookman).
- MSU ranked No. 1 in the MEAC in rebounding margin and by holding a 1488-1351 total rebound advantage over its opponents in 2009-10.
- MSU dominated SEC opponent Arkansas 40-26 on the glass during the Bears 97-94 upset victory on Nov. 24, 2009.
- Delaware State was crushed on the glass by a 40-21 margin during the Bears 68-65 win in Dover.
- The last team to rebound the Bears was against West Virginia in the First Round of the NCAA Tournament in Buffalo, NY... the Mountaineers held a 49-38 advantage.

### ONE TWO PUNCH

- Thru three games this season, **Kevin Thompson** leads the Bears in scoring (18.7 ppg) followed by **DeWayne Jackson** (14.7 ppg).
- Maryland products Thompson (Baltimore) and Jackson (Bowie) combined to average 23 points per game or 30 percent of Morgan State's scoring from the 2009-10 season.
- Thompson was the Bears second leading scorer last season by averaging 12.7 ppg., while Jackson ranked third by averaging 10.1 ppg.
- Thompson was selected MEAC Defensive Player of the Year, while Jackson was selected MEAC Rookie Player of the Year.

### ALI NAMED TEAM CAPTAIN

- Junior forward **Ameer Ali** has been selected as the 2010-11 team captain for the Morgan State men's basketball team. The Philly native is a first-time captain for the Bears.

### BENCH BOMB SQUAD

- Todd Bozeman had significant contributions from his bench during the course of the 2009-10 season.
- MSU's bench posted a season-high by outscoring Howard's bench 38-2 during the Bears win at Howard on Jan. 9, 2010.
- MSU's bench outscored Delaware State's bench 32-6 during the Bears home win on Jan. 23, 2010.
- The Bears outscored Norfolk State's bench by a 40-16 margin in an overtime win against the Spartans.
- **DeWayne Jackson** led the Bears efforts off the bench as a true freshman and averaged 10.1 ppg.

### FREQUENT FLYER MILES

- Morgan State starts the season off with a couple of non-conference games located nowhere near 1700 East Cold Spring Lane.

## MSU'S LAST GAME -- LASALLE 79, MSU 74 (11/20/2010 - PHILADELPHIA, PA)

PHILADELPHIA -- Aaric Murray had 20 points, 11 rebounds and a school-record nine blocks as La Salle held off Morgan State 79-74 on Saturday in the second game of the Cancun Challenge.

The Explorers (3-1) took a 39-22 halftime lead after shooting a blistering 59.3 percent from the field (16 of 27) compared to 27.8 percent (10 of 36) for the Bears (1-2).

Morgan State opened the second half on a 22-5 run, with Aric Brooks making a layup to tie the score at 44 with 12:48 to go. The Bears extended their lead to three points and were ahead 52-49 when the Explorers used a 14-3 run to take the lead for good.

Ruben Guillandeaux scored 16 points for La Salle and Tyreck Duren added 14.

Kevin Thompson collected his third double-double of the season by posting a career-high 25 points with 10 rebounds and three blocked shots to lead Morgan State and Justin Black had 20 points off the bench for the Bears. Ameer Ali also added seven rebounds



- The Cancun Challenge features eight men's DI college basketball teams and includes eight games played in the U.S., and eight games played at the all-inclusive Aventura Palace Resort.

- LaSalle, Missouri, Providence, and Wyoming, headline the host teams field and are joined by Morgan State, North Florida, Prairie View A&M, and Western Illinois.

- This exclusive tournament is comprised of four host teams (LaSalle, Missouri, Providence, and Wyoming) who will host two games each in their home arenas, then play each other for two games in Cancun on Nov. 23-24. The four visiting teams will travel to U.S. games, then play two games against each other in Cancun.

## ESPN's BRACKETBUSTERS TO TELECAST BEARS IN FEBRUARY

The Morgan State men's basketball team will play in the 2011 BracketBusters. It will mark the third straight season the Bears have participated in the event. The game is slated for either Feb. 18th or 19th.

- The ninth annual BracketBusters event, a two-day men's college basketball extravaganza pitting potential NCAA Tournament hopefuls against each other Feb. 18-19, will feature 11 nationally televised games – on either ESPN2 or ESPNU.

- For the fifth straight year, ESPNU, the 24-hour college sports network, will televise five BracketBusters games while ESPN2 will televise six contests. The 11 BracketBusters matchups will be announced Feb. 1, while game time and network assignments will be announced Feb. 8.

- BracketBusters, named because of the success of the teams in NCAA Tournament play, will provide the 22 televised teams an opportunity to play other top non-conference opponents three weeks before Selection Sunday. The 76 teams not selected for BracketBusters will compete against each other through the same two days.

- The 98-team field will feature 12 teams from the Mid-American and Colonial Athletic; 11 from the Ohio Valley, 10 from the Missouri Valley, Horizon League and Metro Atlantic Athletic; nine from the Western Athletic and Big West; four from the Big South and Southern; three from the America East; two from the MEAC; and one from the Big Sky and Summit League.

### BEWARE THE BEAR!

• NEC member Long Island felt a "Bear Attack" on December 29, 2009 when they were routed 87-70 during the consolation game of the Dr Pepper Classic hosted by the University of Chattanooga. Holmes led the way with 23 points and **Kevin Thompson** added a game-high 17 rebounds.

• MAAC opponent Manhattan fell at Morgan State on December 12, 2009 at Hill Field House in Baltimore, Maryland. Reggie Holmes posted his fourth 30-point performance of the season by lighting the Jaspers up for 31 points.

• SEC opponent Arkansas suffered a shocking loss to the Bears on November 22, 2009 at Bud Walton Arena in Fayetteville, Arkansas. **Reggie Holmes** exploded for a career-high 34 points to help MSU snap the Razorbacks' 45-game winning streak at Bud Walton Arena against nonconference opponents. That was the second-longest streak in the nation.

• BIG EAST opponent #22 Louisville had their hands full with a tough Morgan State team before pulling out a 90-81 victory at Freedom Hall on Nov. 22, 2009...The Bears trailed 65-60 midway through the second half, with its best player strapped in foul trouble.

• The Bears' victory over DePaul Dec. 10 was their first against a BIG EAST school in history, 79-75 in Rosemont, Illinois December 10, 2008.

• The Bears' 66-65 victory over Maryland at the Comcast Center (1/7/09) was their first against an ACC school in history. In fact, Maryland had been undefeated against in-state competition since a 70-63 loss to Coppin State on Dec. 12, 1989 at Cole Field House.

### BOZEMAN'S BROTHER AT GW

• Todd Bozeman's younger brother, Mike, enters his third season as head coach of the George Washington's women's basketball program.

• In his first season as head coach, Bozeman guided the Colonials to the Postseason WNIT for their 10th consecutive postseason tournament appearance.

• The Lady Colonials finished the season with a 6-22 (3-11 A-10) record.

• Prior to taking the head coaching job, Bozeman was the assistant coach at GW for three seasons.

• As a player, he led Fairleigh Dickinson University to a conference title and the NCAA Tournament his senior season.

• The 2010-11 Lady Colonials are currently 1-2.

### THE "BALTIMORE BULLIES"

There's no doubt Morgan State is aggressive when it come down to rebounding the basketball and putting up numbers inside the painted area. The "Baltimore Bullies" led the MEAC in rebounding and really controlled the offensive glass, gaining opportunity after opportunity. The Bears developed a knack for creating multiple shot opportunities during a single offensive possession. This season the Bears will once again be led on the boards by MEAC Defensive Player of the Year **Kevin Thompson** who is currently averaging 10.3 rebounds per game.

### D. JACKSON

**DeWayne Jackson** enters the 2010-11 season as a true sophomore. The young forward from Bowie (Md.) became Morgan State's first MEAC Rookie of the Year selection as a result of a sensational freshman campaign.

• Jackson started in the Bears first 11 games of the season, becoming the first freshman under head coach Todd Bozeman to have started from the beginning of the season.

• Jackson finished as the third leading scorer on the squad averaging 10.1 ppg, 4.4 rpg, 22.9 mpg, and ranked No. 2 in the MEAC in 3-point shooting (43%).

• He's as good as anybody on the team in terms of perimeter defense and is a match-up problem for most teams due to his length and his ability to shoot the 3-ball.

• Jackson scored a career-high 31 points in the Bears' season-opener against Loyola Marymount. He has scored in double-figures 20 times during his career.

**HIGHEST REBOUNDING AVERAGE IN 34 YEARS**

**Kevin Thompson** is one of the top rebounding forces in the nation and as a sophomore he achieved something that had not happened in over 30 years ... The Baltimore product completed the season with 438 rebounds and is averaging 11.9 rebounds per game ... The last time Morgan State had a player putting up numbers like that was during the 1976-77 season when Eric Evans recorded 350 rebounds and averaged 13 boards per game.

**ALI SHUFFLE**

Junior **Ameer Ali** may not float like a butterfly or sting like a bee, but this young man can surely rumble! The 6-foot-4 forward from the City of Brotherly Love, comes in weighing a solid 230 pounds, with a 7-foot wing span, and has catcher's mitts for hands. Ali averaged 4.4 points per game, 4 rebounds per game last season and shot 54 percent (60-110 FG) from the field. The Progressive HS product started in 21 of 35 games played and is averaging 13.3 minutes per game. He posted 10 points (5-7 FG) and hauled down three boards in 20 minutes in a win at MD-Eastern Shore to help secure the Bears' third consecutive MEAC regular season title. He posted a career-high three blocks with 6 rebounds and 4 points in 14 minutes in the regular season-finale against Coppin State and scored 12 of his team-high 14 points in the second half in a win against Hampton in the MEAC semifinals.

## BOZEMAN IN CONFERENCE

Head coach **Todd Bozeman** has tasted success in his non-conference schedule, but his conference resume is just as impressive.

- Bozeman had an 11-game winning streak ended on Feb. 15th by South Carolina State.

- The Bethune-Cookman win extended Bozeman's regular season conference win streak to 12-straight games since last season, a school record for longest regular-season conference win streak.

- Bozeman has posted an impressive 56-14 (.800) conference record since joining the Bears in 2006.

- Bozeman has led the Bears to a 30-4 (.882) conference record in two seasons.

- Morgan State won eight straight conference games during Bozeman's second season with the Bears (2007-08).

## **MORGAN STATE BASKETBALL 2010-11 SEASON OUTLOOK**

Morgan State – one of the top Mid-Major programs over the past four seasons – will vie again as the favorite for the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference title in 2010-11 and its third straight NCAA Tournament berth.

The school's head coach, Todd Bozeman, states, "Our goal is always to take positive steps and continue to improve. We want to build on that and not base anything we look at on anyone else's expectations or predictions. We just want to go out and improve and be consistent every night out."

Coach Bozeman enters his fifth season with reason for optimism, despite the loss of several key players from last season's second MEAC Championship title. Two All-Conference selections, Kevin Thompson and DeWayne Jackson return, as do two seniors with significant experience and four other lettermen. Thompson and Jackson, the reigning MEAC Defensive Player of the Year and Rookie of the Year, respectively, headline a talented roster that loses Reggie Holmes -- the Bears all-time leading scorer. Added firepower will be provided by 7-foot-2 center Ian Chiles and junior college transfer Aric Brooks. Thus, the Bears third straight MEAC title and fourth Division I postseason berth in the history of the program is within reach.

### **Star Power**

Morgan State returns two of the top players in the conference in junior forward Kevin Thompson and sophomore swingman DeWayne Jackson. Both are expected to provide leadership for this upcoming season.

Thompson, the MEAC's Defensive Player of the Year recipient, was the league's most dominant post player throughout the 2009-10 season. Only a sophomore, Thompson led the MEAC with 11.9 rebounds per game (4th best in the nation), and completed the season with 22 double-doubles (points & rebounds), third best in the NCAA Division I.

To add to his trophy case in 2010, the seven-time MEAC Player of the Week honoree was also named to the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) All-District First Team. He completed the season by averaging 12.7 points and shot 52 percent from the field (186-357). Last season he held the nation's best rebounding performance with a career-high 25 boards against non-conference foe Towson. Thompson was also selected the MVP of the MEAC Tournament as he helped lead the Bears to their second consecutive

conference championship.

### **On Kevin Thompson ...**

"He has been the anchor in our post going on his third year. He will be MEAC Preseason Player of the Year, and rightfully so, coming off being the MEAC Defensive Player of the Year and MVP of the MEAC Tournament. Kevin is a tenacious rebounder and is a tremendous presence in the paint. He has a high basketball IQ, understands the game, and a good teammate on the court. He is an unselfish player and will be counted on a lot more for scoring this year. He didn't have to last year, but to still average a double-double and be one of the leading rebounders in the country is significant. He is the best post-player in the conference and one of the best in the country."

The Baltimore, Md., native will look to become just the first player under Coach Bozeman to repeat as a recipient of one of the league's top awards. "Big Baby" ranks 5th in Morgan State history with 748 career rebounds and 93 blocked shots and should challenge Boubacar Coly's record of 120 blocks.

DeWayne Jackson was named the 2010 MEAC Rookie of the Year, becoming the first Bear to earn that honor in school history. In addition, Jackson earned Second Team NABC All-District honors and was honored four times as the MEAC Player of the Week.

Jackson, a deadeye shooter, spent the summer working on improving his game. The 6-8 forward from Bowie, Md., completed the season by averaging 10.1 points, 4.3 rebounds and tallied 30 steals, 28 blocks, and 26 assists in 37 games. Jackson led the MEAC in 3-point field goal percentage (.458) and scored in double-digits 21 times this season. Jackson was selected the MEAC's Rookie of the Week four times. While he was an excellent offensive player, Jackson was also a tremendous defender for the Bears. He tallied 30 steals and had 28 blocks off of the bench and was usually matched-up against the opponent's best player.

### **On DeWayne Jackson ...**

"He is our first rookie of the year here since we've been at Morgan and that's significant in itself. To be a 50 percent 3-point shooter, he will be called upon to score more this year and to pick up some of the slack after losing Reggie Holmes. I think he's up for the task. He has grown a lot as a person and a player and his leadership definitely stands out. A lot of that comes from him being more comfortable, and more confident after having

played a season of Division I basketball. He has a tenacity and a will to win, so we expect a lot from Jackson this year."

Both Thompson and Jackson will be ones to watch as the Bears prepare to defend their MEAC crown.

### **Two Seniors**

Joining Thompson and Jackson are seniors Rodney Stokes and Gene Johnson.

Stokes is one of the most underrated centers in the MEAC. The Glen Burnie, Md., native has seen action in 82 career games, including 41 starts. He is coming off a solid junior season in which he averaged 3.0 points, 2.7 rebounds and 1.0 blocks per game. He's a veteran who played significant minutes as a post defender year ago and has shot 50 percent or better from the field during his career.

Johnson returns for his fifth year at Morgan State (fourth in athletic eligibility) as a commendable post player. The 6-7, 220-pounder has improved steadily throughout his career. He averaged 1.0 point, 1.0 rebound and saw action in 27 games last season.

### **Five Letterwinners Return Overall**

Overall, five letterwinners return to Morgan State in 2010-11, all of which have earned starts during the course of their respective careers. Junior forward Ameer Ali returns for the Bears.

After working diligently on his shot in the off-season, Ali figures to improve upon his sophomore numbers as he returns as a veteran of Coach Bozeman's program. Ali is a hard-nosed and versatile athlete who has the ability to cause matchup problems in the post and can also play on the perimeter. He does not shy away from contact around the basket and he has proven to be one of the team's better rebounders. He started 21 of 35 games last year and averaged 4.4 points and 4.0 rebounds per game.

### **Bozeman On Ameer Ali ...**

"He is kind of like our blue-collar worker, a leader, a guy who brings toughness and rebounding to our program as his role of scoring increases each year. He's an intangible guy and a very important piece to the puzzle."

### **The Seven Newcomers**

Morgan State recruited what may be the most interesting crop of talent in recent years. Tola Lawal, Larry Bastfield, Justin Jackson, Aric Brooks, Justin Black, Jake Lockhart and Ian Childs form the incoming class.

Redshirt-freshman Ian Chiles, a 7-2, 270-pound center from Cliffside Park, N.J. will certainly give the Bears a presence inside.

A 6-6, 210-pound combo forward, Brooks joins the Bears as a transfer from Jacksonville State.

"Aric will play a significant role for us, he has a great demeanor and is a great teammate," said Bozeman. "He reminds us of Marquise Kately, one of our former players, with his versatility in addition to having a great mid-range game." Brooks was an All-Metro selection when he led St. Frances to a 24-10 record in 2007.

Freshman Justin Black a 6-2, 210-pound guard from DeMatha High in Washington, D.C. is a combo-guard and will be a very exciting young player. Jake Lockhart, a native of London, spent two years in Michigan at Country Day High, and two years in Boca Raton (Fla.). The coaching staff feels he will play like former Bear contributors Troy Smith and Rogers Barnes. In addition he can play multiple positions on the wing and will be a tough perimeter defender.

Tola Lawal, a native of Brooklyn, N.Y., starred at Erie C.C. where he was a two-time JuCO All-American and led his team to a 27-2 record and a No. 1 national ranking. He shot 52 percent from the field and scored 1,104 points in two seasons.

The 5-10, 185-pound junior guard Larry Bastfield played at Towson Catholic in Baltimore (Md.) and transferred from Toledo University. He will provide stability and leadership for the Bears young backcourt.

In addition, Justin Jackson, a 5-10, 175-pound point guard joins the squad. Jackson was a local prep standout at Digital Harbor where he led the Rams to an 18-5 record and finished as an All-Metro selection. "He's a tough kid that will add value to the team," Bozeman said.

#### **Bozeman talk about reloading from season-to-season ...**

"We really try hard to let our guy's personalities come out on the court. Just like when we won the 2007-08 regular season and we lost the starting point guard (Jerell Green) and MEAC Player of the Year (Jamar Smith), and Defensive Player of the Year (Boubacar Coly). We just look for other guys to step up and shine, and lead the program, and in stepped Jermaine "Itchy" Bolden, Rogers Barnes and Marquise Kately. And last year it was Reggie's (Holmes) turn, even though he

had really started to make his mark a little bit earlier, but he really made his mark last year. Reggie and Troy (Smith) put their imprint on the program last year. I try not to get into that sort of thing, to look to replace people. I just want guys to continue to improve themselves and stay in their own lanes and we work the rest of it out as we go."

#### **On loss of Reggie Holmes ...**

"The loss of Reggie Holmes is obviously significant. He was a great young man and a model student-athlete. He grew into the type of guy that would do whatever was asked of him. You don't replace a Reggie Holmes; other guys just have to step up and play a role. Reggie scored a lot for us and made big plays, but one of the things we've been able to do as a program is sustain the loss of significant contributors and come back and win more games the following year. That's the significant sign of a program, and not a team."

#### **Returning Production Numbers**

Morgan State returns 40 percent of its scoring, 65 percent of its rebounding and 40 percent of its minutes played totals from last year's team. The team leaders in field goal percentage (Thompson - .521), three-point percentage (Jackson - .419), free throw percentage (Jackson - .681), rebounding (Thompson - 11.8), blocked shots (Thompson - 1.4), and minutes played (Thompson - 31.0) are back in 2010-11. Three players who started at least 20 games a year ago also return - Thompson (34), Jackson (26) and Ali (21).

#### **Who's Gone**

Morgan State lost seven letterwinners from last year's 27-10 MEAC championship team. Guards Reggie Holmes (21.5 ppg/4.3 rpg/1.5 spg), Troy Smith (9.3 ppg/3.8 rpg/1.2 spg/1.7 apg) and Sean Thomas (4.6 ppg/3.1 apg/23.5 mpg) are the three starters gone. Holmes was the 2010 MEAC Player of the Year, he was a NABC All-Region First Team selection and was also named to the CollegeInsider.com Lou Henson (Mid-Major) All-America Team. Holmes also finished his career as the leading scorer in MSU men's basketball history with 2,051 career points. Sixth-man specialist Joe Davis (7.2 ppg/1.0 apg), along with John Long, Buford Foote, Danny Smith (2.8 ppg/2.8 apg) have also departed from the team.

#### **The Schedule**

Morgan State will face its usual demanding schedule in 2010-11 and will open the season in Los Angeles on Nov. 12 against Loyola Marymount. The Bears' non-conference schedule includes Providence, La Salle,

UMBC, Syracuse, Louisville and Robert Morris. The Bears will also participate in the Cancun Challenge on Nov. 23-24.

"I always try to plan a schedule that can help prepare the team for post-season play," explained Bozeman. "Every year we try to travel somewhere far away, so this year we'll be playing in Cancun."

Morgan State's home opener will be on Nov. 29 against Loyola University, followed by a Dec. 4 showdown at Hill Field House against cross-town rival Coppin State.

In addition to its non-conference schedule, Morgan State will face another rigorous MEAC slate in 2010-11, a season that will include the team's third straight appearance in an ESPN Bracketbuster game scheduled for February 18th or 19th.

**LOS ANGELES, Calif.** - In a game that felt more like a late season showdown between a pair of teams with high expectations in 2010-11, saw Morgan State erase a 15-point second half deficit to earn an 81-79 win over Loyola Marymount in front of 2,933 at Gersten Pavilion on Friday in the season opener for both teams.

DeWayne Jackson hit 7-for-11 from the three-point line and finished 10-for-18 from the field for a game high 31 points. Kevin Thompson added a double-double with 17 points and 11 rebounds.

Drew Viney led the Lions with 27 points, while Vernon Teel added 15 points and nine rebounds. Junior Jarred DuBois added 13 points and seven rebounds while freshman Godwin Okonji had a stellar debut with seven points, eight rebounds, four blocks and three steals in 27 minutes.

The Lions used their defense to earn offense early to build a 58-43 lead with 13:19 to play in the second half thanks to an Ashley Hamilton putback. However, trailing by 11, Morgan State went on a 7-0 run to cut the lead to four, 72-68, on five straight points by Black with 6:43 to play.

Viney answered the run with just under five minutes to play, making the score 74-68. The teams traded baskets before DeWayne Jackson hit his sixth three-pointer of the game to make it 76-73.

The teams traded a pair of free throws - two from Thompson and two from Viney - before DeWayne Jackson's seventh three-pointer made it 79-78 with 2:48 to play.

Morgan State would then take their first lead of the game since leading 3-0, this time on Brooks floater with 1:58 to play to make it 80-79. The Lions forced two Morgan State misses and had chances at fast break opportunities but would turn the ball over twice.

**PROVIDENCE, R.I.** - Morgan State played throughout most of tonight's game with their leading scorer having a trouble putting the ball in the basket.

Sophomore guard DeWayne Jackson, who entered the game fresh off a career-high 31-point performance against Loyola Marymount on Saturday night, scored 6 points (0-5 3FG) before fouling out against the BIG EAST member.

Despite missing Jackson's offensive production, the Bears fought hard before eventually falling to the Friars 77-55 at Duncan Donuts Center on Thursday night. It marked MSU's first loss of the season.

Junior forward Kevin Thompson led Morgan State (1-1) and notched his second double-double of the season with 14 points, and junior Aric Brooks added 13 points and 8 rebounds for the defending MEAC champions, who kept things interesting until midway through the second half.

MSU trailed 29-25 at halftime, but chipped into the lead during the opening minutes of the second half. The Bears tied the ballgame at 42-42 with 10:21 left in the game when Ameer Ali converted two free throws.

The Friars answered with a 13-4 run and a Marshall Brooks basket in the lane gave his team a 55-46 lead with just over 7 minutes remaining in the game. Providence rolled from that point forward.

Brooks scored 16 of his game-high 22 points in the second half. The senior guard also pulled down a game-high 12 rebounds, to go along with six assists, three blocks and two steals. Vincent Council added 14 points and five assists, and Kadeem Batts had 14 points and eight boards for the Friars (3-0), who struggled to put away the Bears.
