GAME TIME

Morgan State (2-2, 1-0 MEAC) continues Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference play with a matchup at Savannah State on Saturday at 7 p.m. ET at Theodore Wright Stadium and will be broadcast live by WEAA, 88.9 FM. The game will mark the fourth consecutive road contest for the Bears. The Tigers enter the 2012 season under the leadership of second-year head coach Steve Davenport. The Tigers (0-4, 0-2) are coming off a 56-9 loss at Howard. The Bears stunned N.C. A&T with a 21-18 win in a game that was televised live by ESPN.

THE BEARS-TIGERS MATCHUP

- The Bears and Tigers will meet for the 7th time in history. Morgan State leads the series 6-0 since 2000.
- Savannah State fell 44-17 at Hughes Stadium during Morgan State's Homecoming last season. Morgan State's **Seth Higgins** completed 14-of-24 passes for 239 yards and tossed four touchdowns, while backup redshirt-freshman quarterback **Robert Council** took his first pass of the day and delivered a 52-yard touchdown strike to tight end Lamont Bryant.
- Last year's game also marked the first time **Donald Hill-Eley** coached from the pressbox.

QUICK HITS

- Morgan State's win at N.C. A&T snapped a 2-game losing streak and the Bears racked up 373 yards of total offense, including 251 passing yards.
- **Travis Davidson** currently leads the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) in rushing with 389 yards (97.2 avg/g). He also ranks No. 5 the MEAC in scoring (30 Pts/G).
- QBs **Seth Higgins** and **Robert Council** have combined for 1,262 passing yards (99-of-159) and four touchdowns.
- Cornerback **Joe Rankin** registered his 8th interception of his career, picking off N.C. A&T quarterback Lewis Kindle in the 2nd quarter...The pick gives him sole possession of first place in the MEAC in INTs with three in four games.
- The MSU defense has collected seven (7) interceptions (FCS T-12th) through the first four games of 2012.
- The Bears continue to be among the top scoring offenses in the league, entering Saturday's contest as the MEAC's No. 5 ranked scoring offense (22.8 avg/g).
- True freshman LB **Elandon Roberts** recorded a season-high 14 tackles and a tackle for a loss against N.C. A&T...he was recently named MEAC Rookie of the Week.
- Redshirt freshman DL **Damarco Bisbee** posted five tackles, two tackles for loss and a sack at N.C. A&T.
- Punter **Earvin Gonzalez** registered his longest punt of the season, covering 65 yards.

BEARS OPEN 114th SEASON OF FOOTBALL SINCE 1898

Morgan State enters its 114th season of football, and the 11th under head coach Donald Hill-Eley.

NON-CONFERENCE GRADE ... The Bears are **14-20 (.411)** overall in non-conference play under Donald Hill-Eley. The Bears will open the 2012 campaign with three consecutive games against non-conference opponents, starting with Sacred Heart (9/1), followed by road trips to Buffalo (9/8) and Akron (9/15).

HOME NUMBERS ... Morgan State has been tough to beat in the friendly confines of renovated Hughes Stadium since the start of the 2001 season. The Bears are currently **25-25 (.500)** at home since 2002.

CAMPAIGNING FOR SUCCESS ... The Bears enter 2012 looking to post their fourth winning season, all under Donald Hill-Eley, the most in over 30 years since Earl C. Banks posted 11 straight winning season from 1961-1971.

MORGAN ALUMS ... It speaks well of a program when former players return to their alma mater after they have graduated to fill a role within the athletics department and Morgan State has benefitted from an influx of recent returnees. In addition to assistant coaches **Earl C. Davis** and **B.T. Sherman**, the Bears have four former players on staff in various capacities. Former standout safety **Chris Williams** begins his third season and receiver **Edwin Baptiste** begins his second year as one of Morgan's graduate assistant coaches, in addition, former lineman **Eric Fair** and running back **Keith Lee** have returned as football interns. Former fullback **Jephte Cherenfant** joined the strength & conditioning staff.

TV APPEARANCES ... Morgan State will be making three national television appearances this fall. ESPNU is scheduled to broadcast the Bears' Sept. 29th matchup at N.C. A&T (Aggies Stadium), followed by MSU's home contest against Delaware State on Oct. 25th. Both games are set to kickoff at 7:30 p.m. (ET). The Bears also faced Akron on Sept. 8th in an ESPN3 televised contest.

TRIAL BY FIRE ... Head coach **Donald Hill-Eley** has often professed to incoming freshman that they come to camp ready to play during their first season. That could be no more true than this year as a number of newcomers have been identified as possibilities to take the field as first-year freshman before 2012 is over. Heading into the season-opener, six of them graced Morgan State's two-deep -- WR **Tubotien Taylor**, WR **Broderick Gager**, DE **Lamar Montgomery**, LB **Bill Hill**, LB **Ta'Quon Robinson**, DB **Fonyi Agendia**, and DB **Deshawn Summers**.

PRESEASON PICKED 7TH

Morgan State was picked seventh to MEAC defending champion and Preseason #1 Norfolk State and #2 S.C. State.

GREENSBORO, N.C. – Robert Council tossed a 32-yard pass to Andrew King on Thursday night to lift Morgan State to a 21-18 win over North Carolina A&T in a Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference upset.

The Bears' (2-2, 1-0 MEAC) defense stepped up and forced the Aggies to punt, leaving the Bears with 1:54 seconds and 78 yards to go to win the game.

Council hit Tyrone Hendrix on the sideline, but it was ruled out of bounds. Upon further review, the officials ruled that Hendrix successfully made the catch in bounds.

On the very next play, Council hit Travis Davidson over the middle for a 35-yard gain before going out of bounds at the 14. Following an incompleton and an intentional grounding call, the Bears had 3rd and 28 with 18 seconds left.

Council took the snap out of shotgun, bought time in the pocket while avoiding Aggie defenders, and threw a 32-yard strike to Andrew King for the game-winner with 10 seconds to go.

The Aggies' (2-1, 0-1) hailmary on the final play of the night was intercepted by Deshaun Summers to seal the Bears' victory.

Council finished the night by completing 14-of-29 passes for a career-high 251 yards and two touchdowns.

Council threw to tight end Kristian Johnson for a 34-yard race to paydirt to help lift the Bears to a 14-6 lead with 13:05 left in the ballgame.

But the Aggies responded with an 8-play, 84 yard drive, capped by a 19-yard touchdown run by Mike Mayhew at the 9:52 mark. A two-point conversion pass was caught out of bounds, as the Bears held a 14-12 lead.

On MSU's next possession, on 3rd and 10, center Jerry Evans' snap to Council was fumbled and recovered by Chris Neal deep in Bears territory. Four plays later, Mayhew lit up the scoreboard for his second touchdown of the night when he crossed the endzone from 7 yards out. The Aggies held an 18-14 lead with 6:43 left and seemed to have all the momentum.

Kindle connected with wideout Larry Raper for a 55-yard bomb that helped setup a 1-yard plunge by Dominique Drake to put the Aggies ahead 6-0 with 6:42 left in the first quarter. Zach Cimaglia missed the extra point wide left.

Travis Davidson broke four tackles during a 45-yard touchdown run late in the second quarter. The score marked the first touchdown scored against the Aggies' defense in 10 quarters.

MORGAN STATE VS. SAVANNAH STATE THUMBNAILS

• Savannah State **Steve Davenport** enters his second season as head football coach at Savannah State. The Decatur, Ga., native comes to SSU from the University of Alabama-Birmingham where he served as the Blazers running back coach since December 2006. While at UAB he also



served as the Director of Community Relations, where he organized and facilitated all community service programs. Davenport, 43, spent two years (2005-06) as the offensive coordinator at Rockdale County High School in Conyers, Ga. At Rockdale County, he joined a staff that previously went 1-9 in 2004 and finished runner-up in Region 8-AAAA, and advanced into the second round of the state playoffs.

• Savannah State finished the 2011 season with a 1-10 overall record and 1-7 in the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC).

• The Tigers have employed the services of both **Antonio Bostick** and **Victorian Hardison** at the quarterback position. Bostick has completed 33-of-89 passes for 451 yards with two touchdowns, while Hardison has thrown for 137 yards on 12-of-26 passes with a touchdown. So far this season, Bostick holds a 4-to-2 margin with Hardison in games played.

• Howard scored three touchdowns in the second quarter and added four more in the third quarter in a 59-9 win over Savannah State before a crowd of 2,955 at Greene Stadium.

• The loss dropped the Tigers to 0-4 overall and 0-2 in conference play.

• Freshman RB **Sheldon Barnes** currently leads the Tigers with 140 yards (3.0 avg) on 47 carries and has scored a touchdown.

• Junior DB **John Wilson** leads the Tigers defensive unit has recorded 28

tackles (19 solo), to go along with a tackle for loss and an interception. The Athens (Ga.) native also leads the team with five pass breakups.

• Through the first four games, **Simon Heyward** has been the Tigers go-to receiver on offense. The Savannah product has recorded 14 catches for 267 yards (19.1 avg), including 2 TDs.

COACHING CONTINUITY ... An overlooked facet of Morgan State's success has been the continuity of its coaching staff. **Donald Hill-Eley** enters his 11th season as the Bears' head coach. Running backs coach **Earl Davis** begins his 24th year on the Morgan State staff, which equals the longest tenure of any Morgan State assistant football coach in school history. In addition, special teams coach and special teams coordinator **Harold 'Sport' Benton** begins his 13th year on the Bears' coaching staff, offensive line coach **Joseph Wright** is in his 10th season, while defensive line/assistant head coach **Herbert Parham** begins his 11th season at Morgan State.

PRESEASON ALL-MEAC PLAYERS ... Three Morgan State University football players have been singled out for Preseason All-MEAC honors during the 2012 Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference Football Press Luncheon. MSU linebacker **Richard Ndubueze** earned first-team honors. Representing Morgan State on the second-team was senior running back **Travis Davidson** and redshirt junior cornerback **Kenneth Ridley**.

Ndubueze started in nine games last season and finished with 32 tackles, 8.5 tackles for a loss of 44 yards, and ranked 2nd on the team with four sacks. The 6-foot-2, 240-pounder is among the league's most consistent linemen and will once again be in the mix for postseason honors.

Davidson, also known as "Juice", enters his second year as the Bears' starting running back. He emerged from the 2011 campaign as one of the league's top talents. He ran for 732 yards and posted seven touchdowns in 10 games and ranked No. 4 in the MEAC in rushing.

Ridley, who was named to the 2012 CFPA Preseason Watchlist, returns as one of the top cornerbacks in the league. He saw action in every game last season and recorded 42 tackles (20 solo) with 10 passes defended. He also ranked No. 2 in the MEAC with four pass interceptions and ranked T-6th with six pass breakups.

RETURN MEN ... The 2012 Morgan State return 63 letterwinners, including 14 starters - seven on offense and six on defense. MSU also welcomes back every specialist with the exception of punter Nicholas Adams.

BEARS NAME LEADERSHIP COMMITTEE

The MSU has turned away from naming captains this season in favor of what has been named The Leadership Committee.

The committee is comprised of two seniors, LB **Tierney Yates**, OL **Karim Barton**; two juniors, CB **Joe Rankin**, WR **Chris Flowers**; two sophomores, SS **Nate Ayers** and QB **Seth Higgins**; along with freshmen LB **Elandon Roberts** and DL **Tyrell Okoro**.

KICKIN' SPECIALTY ... Losing one of the league's top punters is never a good thing,

but the Bears have an ideal replacement for Nicholas Adams in **Earvin Gonzalez**. Gonzalez (Visalia, Calif.) will handle the field goal and punting chores for the Bears this fall. In Week 1 against Sacred Heart, he connected on three field goals and was 3-of-3 on PATs. The senior booted in field goals from 32, 21 and hit a 20-yard field goal in the fourth overtime to give the Bears a season-opening victory. **Gonzalez currently ranks No. 1 in the MEAC** by connecting on 7-of-11 field goals and is a perfect 10-of-10 on PATs.

PUNT RETURN TEAM ... Morgan State's punt return unit did not allow a yard off any returns at Buffalo (9/8)...in fact the Bulls finished with -3 yards on two returns. So far this season, the Bears have allowed just 48 punt return yards, or an average of 3.7 yards per return per game.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR THIS WEEK ...

- The Bears rushing for 100 yards or more for the fifth consecutive game and for the 11th straight time since their October 8, 2011 game versus Savannah State.

- The Bears having a 300-yard passing game for the first time since October 8, 2011. In Week 6, Morgan State defeated Savannah State 44-17 and **Seth Higgins**, Nate Furrha and **Robert Council** combined for 16-of-26 passes for 318 yards and five TDs.

- Cornerback **Joe Rankin** registering an interception would mark his fourth of the season and the ninth of his career. He would need to collect seven more to pass Joe Fowlkes for the school record. Fowlkes posted 15 INTs during his career (1975-78).

- Running back **Travis Davidson** rushing for 100 yards or more for the fifth time in his career.

- The Bears forcing two of more turnovers for the third consecutive game and the fourth time in five contests.

Yankee Stadium will once again play host to a classic college football matchup, as Hampton University and Morgan State University will meet in the New York Urban League Football Classic on November 17, 2012, at the home of the Yankees. The two-year agreement calls for the two schools to play at Yankee Stadium again in 2013 as well.

The original Yankee Stadium was host to the annual New York Urban League football game from 1968-73 and '76-87. Morgan State played 11 times in the contest, going 1-10 as they faced off against Grambling and head coach Eddie Robinson each time. For Hampton, it will mark their first football game at Yankee Stadium (original or current).

TAKING FLIGHT ... MSU's success starts with sophomore **Seth Higgins**. Higgins played in eight games as a true freshman last season and started in seven games. He completed 97-of-186 passes for 1,116 yards, including nine touchdowns. The Edgewood (Md.) native is expected to pick up where he left off and become one of the top young quarterbacks in the league.

He opened the season by throwing for 153 yards on 14-of-31 passes with one pick.

Senior RB **Travis Davidson** (Redford, Mich.) made the most of his opportunity on Sept. 10, 2011 when the Bears took on Bowling Green State. On MSU's second possession of the game, Davidson mishandled a handoff and proceeded to scoop it off the turf and dash 61-yards to paydirt. The 6-foot, 180-pounder finished as the Bears leading rusher and is expected to be one of the top performers in the league. "Juice" rushed for a team-high 732 yards (5.1 ypc) and seven touchdowns last

year. He ranked No. 4 in the MEAC in rushing by averaging 73.2 yards per game. Davidson ran for a career-high 136 yards on 26 carries and had two TDs at Buffalo and finished with 77 yards.

He posted six tackles and had a 70 yard interception return in the season-opener against Sacred Heart ... and recorded five tackles and an interception at N.C. A&T marking the 8th pick of his career. averages a massive 315 pounds and returns four starters, including Taylor Pass who moves to left tackle. Davidson currently leads the MEAC in rushing averaging 97.2 yards per game.

On October 8, 2011 during the Bears Homecoming against Savannah State, **Donald Hill-Eley** did something he hasn't done since he took the helm as MSU's head coach in 2002 -- he moved from the sideline to the pressbox where he called the offensive plays. The Bears posted an impressive 44-17 victory.

Said Hill, "You miss a little bit of getting close and personal with the players and working the officials some, but we'd really been struggling offensively and had to do something different." Hill will once again be coaching from the pressbox this season.

HONOR ROLL ... Four (4) Morgan State football players were named to the 2012 MEAC Commissioner's All-Academic Team, which requires a grade-point average of 3.00 or better for the past academic year. The seven members included: WR **Yusuf Dosu**, OL **Clarence Swain**, along with former Bears OL Lawrence Brewer and PK Abraham Mercado.

WE R' THE LITTLES ... The Bears receiving corps is one of the shortest in the league. MSU has seven receivers who stand under 6-feet tall. "The Seven" includes: **Broderick Gager** (5-11), **Tubotein Taylor** (5-11), **Malcom Sumlin** (5-11), **Chris Flowers** (5-10), **Thomas Martin** (5-10), **Andrew King** (5-9), and **Darrell Green** (5-7).

The only two receivers who stand above 6-feet are **Tyrone Hendrix** (6-1), Yusuf Dosu (6-1) and **Montrel Church** (6-0).

WER' NOT SO LITTLE ... The loss of TE Lamont Bryant to the NFL's Carolina Panthers is huge, but so is the return of seniors **Jorge Young** (6-2,285) and **Kristian Johnson** (6-3,255), along with a couple of talented newcomers. Young will give the Bears extra punch in the ground attack, while Johnson will be a big target for QB **Seth Higgins** in the middle of the field. **Eme Akonawe** (6-3,215), **Nate Ingram** (6-3, 245) **Heleaince Gates** (6-5,240) and **Willie Gillus** (6-1,265) will also play a role in the Bears passing attack.

MANNING-UP ... Senior RB **Brian Mann** returns to the Bears after suffering an ACL injury after playing in four games last season. The 5-7, 190-pounder has big-play potential and will be a change of pace back when starting RB Travis Davidson is not on the field. Mann's 4.7 ypc in 2010 ranked third among MSU backs. His elusiveness will also be used on special teams where he averaged 12.1 yards per punt return (No. 4 in MEAC) in 2010. He posted a career-high 74 yards on 17 carries and scored a touchdown at Buffalo.

GOOD COUNCIL ... QB **Robert Council** came off the bench and connected on 14-of-29 passes for 251 yards and threw two touchdowns, including the gamewinner to Andrew King with 10 seconds on the clock to beat N.C A&T (9/27) on the road.

LOOKING FOR MORE PASS RUSH ... MSU has been having trouble getting to the quarterback in its last three games, including being shut out getting to the QB in the last two games. And while there are some extenuating circumstances in each case -- Buffalo and Akron got rid of the ball quickly. To review the stats, MSU has five sacks in 158 passing attempts by opponents (or .03 percent of attempts) compared to 26 in 278 opponent passing attempts last year (or .09). The Bears posted a season-high three sacks last week at N.C. A&T and should be able to post more when they face a Savannah State offense that has allowed seven sacks in its first four games.

A WIN WOULD ...

... improve the Bears to 3-2 this season.

... make the Bears 3-2 for the first time during the Donald Hill-Eley era.

... be the Bears second road win of the season, and mark its first back-to-back road wins since beating North Carolina Central on Oct. 15, 2011 and Delaware State on October 24, 2011.

... improve Coach Hill's record against Savannah State to 4-0 since 2003, and 2-0 at Theodore Wright Stadium.

CBS SPORTS NETWORK AIRED DOCUMENTARY ABOUT FIRST HISTORICALLY BLACK COLLEGE FOOTBALL GAME PLAYED IN NEW YORK CITY

Last year CBS Sports Network presented 1ST & GOAL IN THE BRONX: GRAMBLING VS. MORGAN STATE 1968, a documentary about the monumental game played between Grambling and Morgan State, the first historically black college football game played in New York City. The one-hour documentary airs on Wednesday, Sept. 28 (7:00 PM, ET), exactly 43 years after the game was played at Yankee Stadium in front of more than 60,000 fans. Actor Keith David narrates the program.

Through the lens of this historic game, this documentary explores the history of black college football and its struggles in segregated America, as well as the political and cultural subtext surrounding this match-up. The show features numerous interviews with players from Grambling and Morgan State including Shack Harris and Raymond Chester, as well as current Grambling coach Doug Williams, Willie Brown, Willie Lanier, Eddie Robinson's widow Doris Robinson and veteran sports columnist Jerry Izenberg, among others. Overall, 31 players involved in the game were drafted to the NFL or AFL.

It was the first time in two years that the Bears had a player return an interception for a score. Ridley, a redshirt junior from Hillside, N.J., collected eight tackles and had an interception in the first of four overtimes as the Bears went through four overtimes before pulling out a 30-27 victory at Hughes Stadium.

DAVIDSON AND FLOWERS RECEIVE CFPA HONORABLE MENTION ACCOLADES

Running back **Travis Davidson** and kick returner **Chris Flowers**, were acknowledged for their individual performances against Buffalo on Sept. 8. Davidson and Flowers received honorable mention accolades by the College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) as All-Purpose and Kick Returner of the Week, respectively. Davidson ran for a career-high 136 yards and accounted for two touchdowns in a 56-34 loss against BCS member Buffalo on Saturday night at UB Stadium.
